Tonight's Game: The San Jose Giants begin a six-game homestand this evening with the first of three straight contests against the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes (Dodgers affiliate). Jake Wong (2-1, 4.53 ERA) is scheduled to make the start on the mound.

Road Trip Review: The Giants posted a 3-3 record during their Southern California road trip. San Jose dropped two of three games at Rancho Cucamonga to begin the trip before they won two of three at Lancaster – their first road series victory since May 21-23. The Giants scored 27 runs during the three-game set against the JetHawks.

Hector Borg Named Manager: Hector Borg was named manager of the San Jose Giants earlier today. Borg replaced Bill Hayes, who resigned last Saturday (Gary Davenport served as interim manager over the last three games). Borg, 34, had been serving as the fundamentals coach for the Giants' Dominican Summer League team this season prior to his appointment in San Jose. Last year, Borg was the manager for the Salem-Keizer Volcanoes (Giants Short-Season affiliate). He also managed the Giants' Arizona Rookie League team in 2017. Borg played three seasons in the San Francisco farm system from 2004-06. See page 6 for more info on Borg.

The Giants: San Jose is looking to win back-to-back series' for the first time since they won three straight series from May 13-23 (vs. Inland Empire, vs. Lake Elsinore, at Modesto). The Giants are 17-15 (.531) against South Division opponents this season, but only 24-39 (.381) versus the North.

Ramos Surging: Heliot Ramos has homered in back-to-back games having gone deep last Sunday and Monday at Lancaster. The Giants have not had a player homer in three straight games this season. Ramos leads the Giants with 12 home runs this year to go with a .302 batting average and a .904 OPS. He's hit 12 homers in 59 games with San Jose this season (222 at-bats) after hitting 11 home runs in 124 games with Class-A Augusta in 2018 (485 at-bats). Over his last 17 games, Ramos is batting .371 (26-for-70) with four home runs and 13 RBI's.

Trouble With The Quakes: Over the last three seasons (2017-19), the Giants are only 13-32 against Rancho Cucamonga, including a 7-17 mark at Excite Ballpark. San Jose has lost all three of their previous' series versus the Quakes this season (3-6 record).

Bart Breaks Out: Joey Bart is 9-for-16 with three doubles and one home run in his last three games following a 3-for-27 slump. The former first round draft pick has raised his season batting average 33 points from .234 to .267 over the last three games.

Roster Moves: The Giants made three roster moves today. Outfielder Heath Quinn was placed on the injured list while pitcher Olbis Parra has been activated from the IL (last pitched on June 29). Pitcher Jamie Callahan also joined San Jose after completing a rehab assignment in the Arizona Rookie League. Callahan, who signed a free agent deal with San Francisco in January, has made nine career major league relief appearances – all with the Mets in 2017.

Tonight's Start: 22-year old right-hander is scheduled to make his 11th start with San Jose this season in tonight's game against Rancho Cucamonga.

San Jose Notes: Is 2-1 with a 4.53 ERA in 10 starts for San Jose ... Has struck out 40 and walked 19 in 47 2/3 innings ... Has a .275 opponents batting average (.235 vs. right, .325 vs. left) ... Has allowed only two home runs ... Surrendered two earned runs or fewer in five of ten starts ... Has allowed more than three earned runs only twice in ten starts ... Was added to the Giants roster from Class-A Augusta on May 20.

Last Time Out: Faced Rancho Cucamonga in his most recent start on July 11 at LoanMart Field ... Pitched 4 2/3 innings with three runs (all earned) allowed ... Gave up only three hits, walked a career-high tying four and struck out four ... Surrendered all three runs in the bottom of the third ... Threw 91 pitches ... Received a no-decision (Giants lost game 8-4).

Back-To-Back Wins: Won consecutive starts for the Giants on May 27 against Lancaster (6 IP, 1 R, 4 SO) and June 1 at Lake Elsinore (6 IP, 2 R, 6 SO) ... Has not won since June 1 (no-decisions in his last seven starts).

In The Yard: Has allowed only five home runs in 115 2/3 career innings pitched.

Top Prospect: Currently ranked the #6 prospect in the San Francisco Giants organization by *MLB.com* ... Is the third-highest rated pitcher on the list.

With Augusta: Began this season with Augusta ... Made eight starts for the GreenJackets and was 2-1 with a 1.99 ERA ... Allowed only 26 hits in 40 2/3 innings pitched ... Struck out 34 and walked 11 ... Limited the opposition to a .186 batting average.

Pitcher Of The Week: Was named South Atlantic League Pitcher of the Week for the week of April 29-May 5 ... Fired 12 hitless innings over two starts during the week ... Pitched six innings with no runs and no hits allowed on April 30 against Lexington (2 BB, 6 SO) ... Did not give up any runs or hits over six innings in his next start on May 5 versus Hagerstown (0 BB, 2 SO) ... Streak of hitless innings was snapped at 12 in the bottom of the first in his following start on May 11 at Lexington.

Draft Day: Was selected in the third round by the San Francisco Giants in the 2018 draft (80th overall pick).

Grand Canyon: Pitched three years at Grand Canyon University from 2016-18 ... Finished three-year collegiate career ranked fourth in school history in wins (16), fourth in innings pitched (223) and third in strikeouts (168) ... Became Grand Canyon's highest draft pick since Tim Salmon in 1989.

All-Conference: Earned Second Team All-WAC honors as a junior in 2018 ... Posted a 9-3 record and a 2.81 ERA in 15 starts ... Struck out 89 and walked 29 over 89 2/3 innings ... Single-season rankings in GCU Division I history: third in ERA, tied for third in wins and tied for second in strikeouts.

High School: Attended Hamilton High School (Chandler, AZ) ... Helped lead Hamilton to an Arizona state championship as a junior in 2014.

In The Family: Father, Pete, played soccer at Kent State and worked in the front offices of the Phoenix Suns and Arizona Diamondbacks ... Mother, Amy, played basketball at Northern Arizona ... Younger sister, Jessica, is currently a member of Grand Canyon's women's soccer team.
