-Jorge Alcala suffered his first loss of the season after the #16 prospect was tagged for 7 runs (6ER) on 6 hits. After trailing at one point 9-3, the Wahoos cut the deficit to 9-7, but in the bottom of the 8th inning, Jackson rattled off 5 runs to put the game away 12-7.

-Jaylin Davis became the 1st Blue Wahoo this season to record a four-hit game going 4-for-5 with 2 doubles, 2RBI and 2R scored. He is now hitting .700 in the series against the Generals, and over his last 10 the Wahoos outfielder is hitting .450. He now leads the team with a .351 batting average.

-Friday's defeat for the Wahoos set new highs for Pensacola this season including most runs allowed in a game (12) most hits in a game (11) and largest margin of defeat (5).

The 2018 Florida State League Home Run Derby winner, Blankenhorn has hit double-digit home runs each of the past three seasons.

Starting Success:

-Through 22 games, Blue Wahoos starting pitchers have been brilliant. As a staff, Pensacola starters hold a 2.35 ERA and have struck out 127 batters in 114.2 IP (10.0 K/9) while allowing just 30 earned runs on 88 hits.

Providing Relief:

-Complementing Pensacola's starting pitching has been a strong bullpen. Over 76.1 IP, Wahoos relievers hold a 2.35 ERA with 111 strikeouts (13.1 K/9). Pensacola leads the Southern League with 9 saves and is tied for the league lead with 7 holds.

League Leaders:

- Luis Arraez is **first** in the Southern League in hits (27).
- Jordan Gore is **fourth** in the league in runs scored (15) while Tanner English is **T-6th** (13).
- Brian Schales is tied for **third** in the lead league in walks (14).
- Pensacola's staff has the **lowest** team ERA in the league (2.17).
- Pensacola pitchers have the **most** strikeouts in the league (238).
- Pensacola's staff has the league's best WHIP (1.12) and the most saves (10).
- Devin Smeltzer leads the league with 30 strikeouts and is tied for the lead in WHIP (0.72).
- Jorge Alcala leads the league with four wins.
- Dusten Knight and Ryan Mason are tied for second in the league lead in saves (4).

Striking First:

-The Blue Wahoos have scored first in 17 of 21 games this season. Pensacola has scored in the first or second inning 12 times this season. They have lost four of the five games the opponent has scored first in.

Hot Start:

-Pensacola's 15-6 start is the best in franchise history, edging out the 2017 season when they started 14-7 on their way to a league co-championship.

Reinforcements:

-The addition of Travis Blankenhorn to Pensacola's roster may be the first of many high profile prospect promotions from Fort Myers to the Blue Wahoos this season. In addition to Blankenhorn, seven of the Twins top prospects are currently with the Miracle, including #1 prospect Royce Lewis. Other top prospects include OF Trevor Larnach, OF Akil Baddoo, 1B Lewin Diaz, SP Jhoan Duran, C Ben Rortved, and 3B Jose Miranda.

Grzelakowski Ends Skid With Walk-Off:

-After a tough 3-for-30 stretch, Taylor Grzelakowski has hits in five of his last six games and has driven in at least run in four of those five.

 -Excelled as a high-end starting pitching prospect early in his career before thoracic outlet syndrome forced a move to the bullpen. Pitched in the Southern League in 2015, 2016, 2017, posting a 1.95 ERA in 101.1 IP with Montgomery and Biloxi.
 -Made 49 appearances at the AAA level in 2017 and 2018, throwing 64.0 IP, striking out 79, and holding a 4.50 ERA.
