Lake Elsinore Storm (24-26) AT RANCHO CUCAMONGA QUAKES (22-28)



RHP Ronald Bolanos (0-3, 7.28 ERA) vs. RHP Chris Mathewson (1-0, 4.24 ERA)

TODAY'S GAME: The Quakes begin a four game series hosting the Lake Elsinore Storm (San Diego Padres affiliate) at LoanMart Field. Monday's game is the start of a seven game home stand for the Quakes over the next seven days. Today is a pet friendly day thanks to Blue Buffalo. Today's game begins the fourth series this year between the Quakes and the Storm.

VS LAKE ELSINORE: This is the eleventh of 31 overall meetings between the two clubs and the eighth of 17 games at LoanMart Field. The Quakes last played the Storm in a three-game series at LoanMart Field and lost two of three against the South Division opponents. Starting pitcher Tony Gonsolin was credited with the lone win in the final game of the series with the Quakes facing a sweep. Entering Monday, the season series is currently tied at five game apiece between the two clubs.

LAST TIME OUT: The Quakes fell an out shy of the first ever combined nine-inning no-hitter in franchise history on Sunday, but showcased a dominant display of pitching and offense in a 8-2 victory over the Inland Empire 66ers. With Jason Richman on the mound for Rancho and Inland Empire down to their final out, Jo Adell managed to punch a two-run home run over the right-field wall for the first 66ers' hit on the game. Richman retired the following hitter, Brandon Marsh, to close the game and pull Rancho to three games out of first with 20 to play. Offensively, the Quakes got home runs from Connor Wong (11), Gavin Lux (4) and Cody Thomas (3). Rancho also knocked two triples in the game and totaled ten hits in the win over the 66ers.

STORM CHASERS: On the offensive end against the Storm, Connor Wong and Cristian Santana have shown the most success against Lake Elsinore pitching this season. Wong is batting .333 (8-for-24) with four doubles and nine RBI's. Santana is batting .308 (12-for-39) and has a .386 OBP with three doubles, a home run and six runs batted in.

ONE RUN NO FUN: The Quakes have struggled in one-run games this season. Of the 50 total games played, 17 of those contests have been decided by a run, where the Quakes have just a 4-13 record. The Quakes have dropped the last five one-run games and have battled in a one-run affair over six of their last thirteen games played.

2013: The worst first half record for the Quakes in the Dodger era was in 2013 when the club finished 31-39, eight games below the five-hundred mark. The Quakes currently sit six games below the five-hundred mark with 21 games left to play on the first half schedule.

KEEP ON SWINGIN: Collectively, the Quakes offense is hitting .259 against the Storm this season. Rancho has totaled 88 hits across 340 at bats vs. Storm pitching this season and drawn 38 walks, good for a .335 on-base percentage.

CURRENT STREAKS: Despite being on a short two game hitting streak, Gavin Lux has a hit in six of his last eight games and a multi-hit game in five of his last eight. OF Cody Thomas has ramped up the power with a home run in each of his last two games. Jeren Kendall had a season-high seven game hitting streak come to a close after going 0-for-3 on Thursday against Stockton. Connor Wong saw a season-high hitting streak of eight games come to a close on Wednesday going 0-for-4 against the Ports. Cristian Santana also lost a short four-game hitting streak yesterday but following a walk, has reached safely in five straight games.

RECENT ROSTER MOVES: Friday, catcher Steve Berman was placed on the Disabled List. Catcher Hamlet Marte was transferred to Rancho Cucamonga from Double-A Tulsa of the Texas League. Marte started the 2018 season with Rancho and played in 19 games (.286, 2 HR, 10 RBI).

MATHEWSON THE STARTER: Chris Mathewson (1-0) will make his third start of the season for the Quakes and first start against the Storm. Mathewson last pitched against Stockton at LoanMart Field on 5/23 and pitch four shutout innings while allowing just two hits and striking out four in a no decision. Mathewson was slotted into the starting rotation after Jordan Sheffield was placed on the Disabled List with right forearm tightness. Since entering the starting rotation, Mathewson has allowed just one run over eight innings and has completed four total innings in each of his first two starts. The Fontana, CA native was a former player at Long Beach State and was drafted by the Dodgers in the 19th round of the 2016 draft.

OPPOSING PITCHER: Ronald Bolanos (0-3) is scheduled to make his eighth start of the year for the Storm and third against the Quakes. Bolanos's last meeting with Rancho was on 5/10 and the right-hander struggled allowing five runs over 2.2 innings in a loss. Bolanos first pitched against the Quakes on 4/21 and allowed four runs over five innings in a no-decision. The Cuban native was signed as an International Free Agent by the Padres in 2017.

Tuesday's game will be the second of a seven game home stand for the Quakes who host the Lancaster Jet-Hawks following the conclusion of the set with Lake Elsinore.

REHABBERS: The Quakes have had three different Dodgers join the club as apart of major league rehab assignment this season. Dodgers INF Justin Turner joined the Quakes along with INF Logan Forsythe in a weekend series vs. Visalia. Turner was 0-for-6 at the plate while Forsythe finished 1-for-10 with a double during their time in Rancho. Yasiel Puig joined the club on rehab assignment Tuesday (5/8) in Lake Elsinore. Puig was 0-for-4 at the plate and was removed from the game in the seventh inning.

FAMILIAR FACES ON THE FARM: A total of 16 former Quakes returned to Rancho Cucamonga to start the 2018 campaign, including 12 of the 14 original pitchers on the roster. Jordan Sheffield and Tony Gonsolin, ranked 18th and 24th in the Dodgers' system, by MLBPipeline.com, return to the Quakes to help anchor the rotation. Former Quakes Dean Kremer, Issac Anderson and Andrew Sopko will also pitch out of the rotation. The bullpen began the year made up entirely of former Quakes, with Stetson Allie, Chris Mathewson, Parker Curry, Andrew Istler, Nolan Long, Ryan Moseley and Jason Richman making up the relief core. California League 2017 All-Star Ibandel Isabel, who mashed 28 home runs for last year's club, returned to the Quakes for a second year but was traded to the Cincinnati Reds. He was joined by returning infielder Omar Estevez and outfielder Logan Landon.

SAME SKIPPER, NEW STAFF: The skipper of the Quakes for a third consecutive year is Manager Drew Saylor, who has led the team to the Cal League Playoffs in each of the last two seasons. Saylor, whose team went 76-64 last season, is just the third manager in team history to lead the team for three seasons (Mike Basso 1996-1998, Bobby Meacham 2002-2004). The hitting coach is Justin Viele, a Fullerton native who enters his second year with the Dodgers. In 2017, the former Santa Clara Bronco was the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors of the Pioneer League. Taking over pitching coach duties is Connor McGuiness who also enters his second year in the Dodgers' system. Last season, the Arlington, Virginia native worked in the same role for the Great Lakes Loons of the Midwest League, after spending three of the four previous years working for his alma mater, Emory University. The final member of Saylor's staff is assistant coach Petie Montero, another second-year member of the Dodgers' system, who coached in the DSL last year.

NINE & ON TIME: The Quakes are the only team in the California League that have yet to play an extra-inning game under the new MilB rules this season. As a result, Rancho has completed all games in under four hours with the longest contest clocking in at 3:49 vs. Inland Empire on April 14th. April 14th marked the closest the Quakes have come to playing extras, tied at 6-6 in the ninth inning, Rancho scored the game-winning run in the bottom half and secured their first walk-off win of the season.

BY THE NUMBERS

Gavin Lux's 12-game hitting streak was the longest by any Quake this season. Lux passed Rylan Bannon who held the previous season long streak of eleven games. Over the stretch (Apr 26-5/11), Lux was 23-for-51 at the plate with six-multi hit games during the streak.

Out of the bullpen, Parker Curry has added stability to the Quakes in the middle and late innings, allowing only two runs over his last nine appearances. Curry's only runs allowed in the month of May were on 5/11 vs. Visalia and 5/25 at Inland Empire. Curry also has compiled two wins out of the bullpen over his last nine games.

The Quakes RBI-Leader Cristian Santana has been one of the most effective hitters with runner in scoring position this season. 25 of his 33 RBI's have come with RISP and he is batting at a .246 clip over those situations. With the bases loaded, Santana's average sky rockets to .375 where he is 3-for-8 with 9 RBI's.
