Lake Elsinore Storm (25-26) AT RANCHO CUCAMONGA QUAKES (22-29)

TODAY'S GAME: The Quakes continue a four-game series hosting the Lake Elsinore Storm (San Diego Padres affiliate) at LoanMart Field. Tuesday's game is the second outing of a seven-game home stand for the Quakes over seven days. Today is Healthy RC Recycle Tuesday at the ballpark. Fans who bring 10 recyclable bottles or cans will receive a free club section ticket to tonight's game, thanks to Healthy RC.

VS LAKE ELSINORE: This is the 12th of 31 overall meetings between the two clubs and the ninth of 17 games at LoanMart Field. The Quakes last played the Storm in a three-game series at LoanMart Field and lost two of three against the South Division opponents. Starting pitcher Tony Gonsolin was credited with the lone win in the final game of the series with the Quakes facing a sweep. Following an 8-5 loss on Monday, the Quakes now trail the season series six-games-to-five to the Storm.

LAST TIME OUT: The Quakes were unable to recover after surrendering a two-run lead over the Storm on Monday, falling in the opener of a four-game series, 8-5. Rylan Bannon's two-run home run put the Quakes in front 2-0 in the third, but starting pitcher Chris Mathewson lost hold of the advantage in the following inning. Following an out to open the fourth, the Storm struck for four consecutive hits, three which drove in a run, and chased Mathewson from the game after he issued a pair of walks. A Buddy Reed single against reliever Isaac Anderson scored two more inherited runners to the record of Mathewson and the Storm led 5-2. The Quakes trailed throughout following the five run inning for Lake Elsinore and Mathewson (1-1) was ultimately charged with the loss.

STORM CHASERS: On the offensive end, Connor Wong and Cristian Santana have shown the most success against Lake Elsinore pitching this season. Wong is batting .321 (9-for-28) with four home runs and nine RBI's. Santana is batting .308 (12-for-39) and has a .386 OBP with three doubles, a home run and six runs batted in.

ONE RUN NO FUN: The Quakes have struggled in one-run games this season. Of the 51 total games played, 17 of those contests have been decided by a run, where the Quakes have just a 4-13 record. The Quakes have dropped the last five one-run games and have battled in a one-run affair in seven of their last 16 games.

2013: The worst first-half record for the Quakes in the Dodger era was in 2013 when the club finished 31-39, eight games below the five-hundred mark. The Quakes currently sit seven games below the five-hundred mark with 19 games left to play on the first half schedule.

THIRD WEEK OF MAY: Dustin May was named California League Pitcher of the Week on May 29th following six shut out innings in which he surrendered just two hits and struck out five against Inland Empire on 5/25. May is the first Quakes pitcher to receive Pitcher of the Week honors and is the second player to be recognized by the league after Gavin Lux was named Player of the Week on 4/30.

CURRENT STREAKS: Cody Thomas currently leads the Quakes on a five-game hitting streak while Logan Landon is close behind with a hit in each of his last four games. Gavin Lux has secured a hit in six of his last eight games with five multi-hit games over the stretch. Cristian Santana has reached on a hit in seven of his last nine. Rylan Bannon has a found the hit column in nine of his last eleven games.

SOPKO WITH A "K": Andrew Sopko (2-3) will make his eleventh start of the season for the Quakes and fourth start against the Storm. Sopko last pitched against Lake Elsinore at LoanMart Field on 5/18 against Chris Paddock and allowed three runs over six innings in his third loss of the season. Over three previous starts against the Storm this season, Lake Elsinore hitters are batting a combined .233 against Spoko with 14 hits (2 doubles, 2 triples, 2 home runs) across 60 at-bats. The Missoula, MT native was a former player at Gonzaga and was drafted by the Dodgers in the 7th round of the 2015 draft.

OPPOSING PITCHER: Michael Baez(1-4) is scheduled to make his seventh start of the year for the Storm and first against the Quakes. In Baez's last outing, the Cuban native did not allow a run on four total hits across six innings of work against Lancaster in his first win of the season. Baez is in his second professional season in the Padres organization and made ten starts with Low-A Fort Wayne of the Midwest League in 2017 going 6-2 with a 2.45 ERA while walking eight and striking out 82. Originally from the capitol city of Havana, Baez was signed as an International Free Agent in 2016 and ranks as the #3 prospect in the Padres system by Baseball America and MLB Pipeline.com

REHABBERS: The Quakes have had three different Dodgers join the club as apart of major league rehab assignment this season. Dodgers INF Justin Turner joined the Quakes along with INF Logan Forsythe in a weekend series vs. Visalia. Turner was 0-for-6 at the plate while Forsythe finished 1-for-10 with a double during their time in Rancho. Yasiel Puig joined the club on rehab assignment Tuesday (5/8) in Lake Elsinore. Puig was 0-for-4 at the plate and was removed from the game in the seventh inning.

FAMILIAR FACES ON THE FARM: A total of 16 former Quakes returned to Rancho Cucamonga to start the 2018 campaign, including 12 of the 14 original pitchers on the roster. Jordan Sheffield and Tony Gonsolin, ranked 18th and 24th in the Dodgers' system, by MLB Pipeline.com, return to the Quakes to help anchor the rotation. Former Quakes Dean Kremer, Issac Anderson and Andrew Sopko will also pitch out of the rotation. The bullpen began the year made up entirely of former Quakes, with Stetson Allie, Chris Matthewson, Parker Curry, Andrew Istler, Nolan Long, Ryan Moseley and Jason Richman making up the relief core. California League 2017 All-Star Ibandel Isabel, who mashed 28 home runs for last year's club, returned to the Quakes for a second year but was traded to the Cincinnati Reds. He was joined by returning infielder Omar Estevez and outfielder Logan Landon.

SAME SKIPPER, NEW STAFF: The skipper of the Quakes for a third consecutive year is Manager Drew Saylor, who has led the team to the Cal League Playoffs in each of the last two seasons. Saylor, whose team went 76-64 last season, is just the third manager in team history to lead the team for three seasons (Mike Basso 1996-1998, Bobby Meacham 2002-2004). The hitting coach is Justin Viele, a Fullerton native who enters his second year with the Dodgers. In 2017, the former Santa Clara Bronco was the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors of the Pioneer League. Taking over pitching coach duties is Connor McGuiness who also enters his second year in the Dodgers' system. Last season, the Arlington, Virginia native worked in the same role for the Great Lakes Loons of the Midwest League, after spending three of the four previous years working for his alma mater, Emory University. The final member of Saylor's staff is assistant coach Petie Montero, another second-year member of the Dodgers' system, who coached in the DSL last year.

NINE & ON TIME: The Quakes are the only team in the California League that have yet to play an extra-inning game under the new MiLB rules this season. As a result, Rancho has completed all games in under four hours with the longest contest clocking in at 3:49 vs. Inland Empire on April 14th. April 14th marked the closest the Quakes have come to playing extras, tied at 6-6 in the ninth inning, Rancho scored the game-winning run in the bottom half and secured their first walk-off win of the season.

BY THE NUMBERS

Gavin Lux's 12-game hitting streak was the longest by any Quake this season. Lux passed Rylan Bannon who held the previous season long streak of eleven games. Over the stretch (Apr 26-5/11), Lux was 23-for-51 at the plate with six-multi hit games during the streak.

Out of the bullpen, Parker Curry has added stability to the Quakes in the middle and late innings, allowing only two runs over his last nine appearances. Curry's only runs allowed in the month of May were on 5/11 vs. Visalia and 5/25 at Inland Empire. Curry also has compiled two wins out of the bullpen over his last nine games.

The Quakes RBI-Leader Cristian Santana has been one of the most effective hitters with runner in scoring position this season. 25 of his 33 RBI's have come with RISP and he is batting at a .246 clip over those situations. With the bases loaded, Santana's average sky rockets to .375 where he is 3-for-8 with 9 RBI's.

3 Jeren Kendall OF \ L/R \ 6-0 \ 190 \ Clearwater, FL \ Round 1 (2017, LAD) \ Vanderbilt \ @JerenKendall

-Playing in his second season in the Dodgers organization, batted .221 over 35 games with Low-A Great Lakes in 2017
 -Started as a freshman at Vanderbilt on the 2015 NCAA national runner-up team, was a .309 career hitter with 32 HR's and 152 RBI's
 -Hit only Grand-Slam of the season for the Quakes on 5/10 at Lake Elsinore...grand slam was also Kendall's first home run of the season.
