# Inland Empire 66ers (32-35)





RHP Dustin May (2-3, 4.42 ERA) vs. LHP Nate Bertness (1-4, 5.14 ERA)

TODAY'S GAME: The Quakes begin the final series of the first-half schedule today on the road at San Manuel Stadium for a threegame set against the Inland Empire 66ers (Los Angeles Angels affiliate). This is the second and final trip the Quakes will make to San Bernardino over the first half and begins the fourth series between the two clubs this season.

VS INLAND EMPIRE: This is the 11th of 30 overall meetings between the two clubs and the fourth of 14 games at San Manuel Stadium. The Quakes last met with the 66ers in a three-game series at LoanMart Field 5/8-5/10 and lost two-of-three against the South Division opponents. Relief pitcher Logan Salow was the lone man to record a win, doing so out of the bullpen in game three of the series. The Quakes enter Friday leading the season series over Inland Empire six-games-to-four.

LAST TIME OUT: Despite putting the tying run on second base in the final inning, the Quakes impressive string of comeback victories ended with a 2-0 loss to the Storm at The Diamond in Lake Elsinore. The offense struggled on Thursday night behind Dodgers starting pitcher Rich Hill, who joined the Quakes on a major league rehab assignment. Hill looked big league efficient over his outing, which lasted 4.2 innings and 75 total pitches. Over the stretch, Hill tied a single-game high for the Quakes with ten strikeouts while not allowing a walk and giving up four hits. Behind Hill, Rancho committed a pair of costly fielding errors that led to both unearned Storm runs. Trailing by two in the ninth inning, Rancho loaded the bases with a pair of walks and a Logan Landon infield single. Landon's base hit was the second and final knock of the game for the Quakes. Estevez would fly out to center to end the game as Lawson (5-2) secured the win. Even with a strong rehab outing, the two unearned runs against Hill (0-1) were enough to saddle him with the loss in the final game of the series.

COLLISION ON THE 66: On the offensive end, Rylan Bannon and Logan Landon have shown the most success against Inland Empire pitching this season. Bannon is batting .333 (12-for-36) with three doubles, a triple and six RBI's to go along with an on-base percentage of .429. Landon, is batting .323 (10-for-31), with a team-high nine runs scored and a home run.

ALL-STAR QUAKES: The Rancho Cucamonga Quakes will be represented quite well in this year's edition of the All-Star Game, as six players will head to Lancaster for the annual event. Of the six players, four of them will be in the starting lineup, as Gavin Lux will start at shortstop, Rylan Bannon will start at third base, Connor Wong will be the starting catcher and Logan Landon will man one of the starting outfield spots. In addition, pitchers Dean Kremer and Tony Gonsolin have also been named to the South Division squad. FIRST PLACE QUAKES: The Quakes are rumbling at the right time, winners of eleven of their last 16 games, while taking the upper hand in five of the last six series played. With three games left to play in the first-half schedule, Rancho enters Friday in a tie for first place in the south division with Lake Elsinore, one game ahead of the 66ers.

RECENT ROSTER MOVES: Today, INF Gavin Lux has been placed on the Disabled List with a hamstring strain, retroactive to 6/13/18. INF Connor Heady has been transferred to Rancho Cucamonga from Ogden of the short season-A Pioneer League. On Thursday, LHP Rich Hill was added to the Rancho roster as part of a rehab assignment. INF Zach McKinstry was placed on the Temporary Inactive List. Catcher Steve Berman joined Rancho from Extended Spring Training. On Monday, RHP Parker Curry was activated from the temporarily inactive list. LHP Jason Richman was transferred from triple-A Oklahoma City to Rancho Cucamonga. LHP Michael Boyle was transferred from double-A Tulsa to Rancho Cucamonga. RHP Evy Ruibal and C Steve Berman were transferred from Rancho Cucamonga to Extended Spring Training. RHP Andrew Istler was transferred to double-A Tulsa of the

**MAY DAY:** RHP Dustin May takes the ball today for the Quakes in his ninth start of the season and third against Inland Empire. May pitched against the 66ers his last time out on 6/10 and surrendered just three hits over five total inning, allowing one unearned run in a no-decision. The 66ers offense has struggled to figure out May over two starts, as opposing hitters are batting just .135 off him this season with five hits across 37 at bats. The Justin, TX native was a third round draft pick by the Dodgers in 2016 out of Northwest HS (Justin, TX) and currently ranks as the #10 prospect in the Dodgers system by MLBPipeline.com

**OPPOSING PITCHER**: LHP Nate Bertness is scheduled to make his 12th start on the season for the 66ers and second this season against the Quakes. Bertness pitched against Rancho his last time out on 6/10 and tossed five shutout innings while allowing just two hits in a no-decision. Bertness and Dustin May will square off for the second time in a row tonight from San Manuel Stadium. The Houston, TX native was a 16th round draft pick by the Angels in 2015 out of McLennan Community College in Texas.

**REHABBERS:** The Quakes have had three different Dodgers join the club as apart of major league rehab assignment this season. Dodgers INF Justin Turner joined the Quakes along with INF Logan Forsythe in a weekend series vs. Visalia. Turner was 0-for-6 at the plate while Forsythe finished 1-for-10 with a double during their time in Rancho. Yasiel Puig joined the club on rehab assignment Tuesday (5/8) in Lake Elsinore. Puig was 0-for-4 at the plate and was removed from the game in the seventh inning.

**EAMILIAR FACES ON THE FARM:** A total of 16 former Quakes returned to Rancho Cucamonga to start the 2018 campaign, including 12 of the 14 original pitchers on the roster. Jordan Sheffield and Tony Gonsolin, ranked 17th and 23rd in the Dodgers' system, by MLBPipeline.com, return to the Quakes to help anchor the rotation. Former Quakes Dean Kremer, Issac Anderson and Andrew Sopko will also pitch out of the rotation. The bullpen began the year made up entirely of former Quakes, with Stetson Allie, Chris Matthewson, Parker Curry, Andrew Istler, Nolan Long, Ryan Moseley and Jason Richman making up the relief core. California League 2017 All-Star Ibandel Isabel, who mashed 28 home runs for last year's club, returned to the Quakes for a second year but was traded to the Cincinnati Reds. He was joined by returning infielder Omar Estevez and outfielder Logan Landon.

SAME SKIPPER, NEW STAFF: The skipper of the Quakes for a third consecutive year is Manager Drew Saylor, who has led the team to the Cal League Playoffs in each of the last two seasons. Saylor, whose team went 76-64 last season, is just the third manager in team history to lead the team for three seasons (Mike Basso 1996-1998, Bobby Meacham 2002-2004). The hitting coach is Justin Viele, a Fullerton native who enters his second year with the Dodgers. In 2017, the former Santa Clara Bronco was the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors of the Pioneer League. Taking over pitching coach duties is Connor McGuiness who also enters his second year in the Dodgers' system. Last season, the Arlington, Virginia native worked in the same role for the Great Lakes Loons of the Midwest League, after spending three of the four previous years working for his alma mater, Emory University. The final member of Saylor's staff is assistant coach Petie Montero, another second-year member of the Dodgers' system, who coached in the DSL last year.

**NINE & ON TIME:** The Quakes are the only team in the California League that have yet to play an extra-inning game under the new MilB rules this season. As a result, Rancho has completed all games in under four hours with the longest contest clocking in at 3:49 vs. Inland Empire on April 14th. April 14th marked the closest the Quakes have come to playing extras, tied at 6-6 in the ninth inning, Rancho scored the game-winning run in the bottom half and secured their first walk-off win of the season.

# BY THE NUMBERS

Gavin Lux's 12-game hitting streak was the longest by any Quake this season. Lux passed Rylan Bannon who held the previous season long streak of eleven games. Over the stretch (Apr 26-5/11), Lux was 23-for-51 at the plate with six-multi hit games during the streak.

Starting pitcher **Dean Kremer** currrently leads the California League with 99 strikeouts over his first 14 starts of the season. Kremer set a career high with ten strikeouts in a start against Inland Empire on 5/27. The UNLV product totaled 46 strikeouts across 29.2 total innings pitched in the month of May.

The Quakes RBI-Leader **Cristian Santana** has been one of the most effective hitters with runner in scoring position this season. 31 of his 42 RBI's have come with RISP where he is batting at a .263 clip over those situations. With the bases loaded, Santana's average jumps to .300 where he is 3-for-10 with 9 RBI's.
