LHP Mac Marshall (0-0, 1.25 ERA) vs. RHP Dustin May (2-3, 3.83 ERA)

TODAY'S GAME: The Quakes continue the four-game homestand hosting the San Jose Giants (San Francisco Giants affiliate) in game two of a four-game set. Today is Family RV \$1 Feast Night at the ballpark! Enjoy \$1 hot dogs, Pepsi products and ice cream sandwiches all thanks to Family RV.

VS SAN JOSE: Today is the second of 18 total meetings between the Quakes and Giants over the second-half schedule and second of seven games to be played at LoanMart Field. In 2017, the Quakes went 13-5 against the Giants to win the season series. Following a 6-5 loss on Thursday for Rancho, the Giants hold the early upper hand in the season series.

LAST TIME OUT: Opening the second-half schedule in front of a Thursday night crowd at LoanMart Field, the Quakes twice surrendered the lead to the San Jose Giants, who rallied in the late innings to defeat Rancho 6-5. Rancho's offensive effort was highlighted by a three-run comeback in the middle innings of the series opener. Trailing 4-1 heading into the fifth, Rylan Bannon helped inch the Quakes back within a run with a two-RBI single that scored Steve Berman and Zach McKinstry. Cody Thomas tied the game in the sixth with a solo home run and Jared Walker followed with a blast in his 2018 Quakes debut to put Rancho back on top 5-4. Ryan Moseley, who settled out of the Quakes bullpen in the seventh striking out the side, allowed the game to slip away in the eighth. Gio Brusa walked to begin the inning and advanced to third on an errant throw to center field following a Sandro Fabian bunt. Brusa promptly scored the tying run on a wild pitch and Brandon Van Horn doubled home Fabian to put San Jose up 6-5. The Quakes left runners stranded on first and second in the bottom of the ninth, as Frank Rubio secured the save and Moseley (2-2) was saddled with the loss.

STAT STUFFERS: The Quakes finished near the top in a number of primary offensive categories during the first-half schedule. Rancho slugged a league-leading 81 home runs while scoring 354 total runs and amassing 324 RBI, second among the field. Third baseman Rylan Bannon finished second in the league with 15 total home runs and Cristian Santana drove in a league-leading 44 RBI.

ALL-STAR QUAKES: The Rancho Cucamonga Quakes were represented quite well in this year's edition of the All-Star Game, as seven players headed to Lancaster for the annual event. Of the seven players, three of them were in the starting lineup as Rylan Bannon started at third base, Connor Wong started at catcher and Logan Landon covered right field. Gavin Lux was also named a starter to the team but due to injury was unable to play. Omar Estevez was a late addition to the All-Star team, filling the spot of Lux. In addition, pitchers Dean Kremer and Tony Gonsolin were also named to the South Division squad.

FIRST-HALF CHAMPS: The Quakes put together an impressive stretch of winning over the final three weeks of the season en route to their first-half championship. Winners of 13 of their final 19 games played while also taking the upper hand in six of the last seven series, Rancho also held the best division record in the league over the first half at 26-17. The first-half championship is the third in the Dodger era (2011, 2015, 2018) and first under manager Drew Saylor, sending the Quakes to the California League Playoffs for the fourth consecutive season.

RECENT ROSTER MOVES: On Thursday, INF Jared Walker and RHP Andre Scrubb were transferred from Low-A Great Lakes of the Midwest League to Rancho Cucamonga. RHP Nathan Witt and INF Nick Yarnall were both placed on the Disabled List. On Tuesday, RHP Stetson Allie was transferred from Rancho Cucamonga to Double-A Tulsa of the Texas League. RHP Nathan Witt was transferred from Extended Spring Training in Arizona to Rancho Cucamonga.

MAY DAY: RHP Dustin May (2-3) is scheduled to make his tenth start on the season for the Quakes today. May last pitched at Inland Empire on June 15th and tossed six shutout innings, walking two and striking out four in a no-decision. The right hander has not allowed an earned run over his last two starts which spans 11 total innings, the longest stretch for May this season. A Justin, TX native, May was drafted out of Northwest HS by the Dodgers in the third round of the 2016 draft and currently ranks as the #10 prospect in the system by MLPPipeline.com

OPPOSING PITCHER: LHP Mac Marshall (0-0) is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season for the Giants and first against the Quakes. Marshall last pitched on 6/16 vs. Visalia and allowed just one hit over three shutout innings in a no-decision. Marshall has not pitched past the third inning in any of his starts this season after he underwent nerve transposition surgery in his left elbow last year. The 22 year old has been especially dominant against left-handed hitters this season, holding lefties to a .048 batting average (1-for-21, 12 K's). The Athens, GA native was drafted in the 4th round of the 2015 draft by the Giants out of Chipola Junior College (Marianna, FL).

REHABBERS: The Quakes have had four Dodgers join the club as apart of major league rehab assignment this season. Rich Hill joi Dodgers INF Justin Turner joined the Quakes along with INF Logan Forsythe in a weekend series vs. Visalia (5/12-5/13). Turner was 0-for-6 at the plate while Forsythe finished 1-for-10 with a double during their time in Rancho. Yasiel Puig joined the club on rehab assignment Tuesday (5/8) in Lake Elsinore. Puig was 0-for-4 at the plate and was removed from the game in the seventh inning.

FAMILIAR FACES ON THE FARM: A total of 16 former Quakes returned to Rancho Cucamonga to start the 2018 campaign, including 12 of the 14 original pitchers on the roster. Jordan Sheffield and Tony Gonsolin, ranked 17th and 23rd in the Dodgers' system, by MLB Pipeline.com, return to the Quakes to help anchor the rotation. Former Quakes Dean Kremer, Issac Anderson and Andrew Sopko will also pitch out of the rotation. The bullpen began the year made up entirely of former Quakes, with Stetson Allie, Chris Matthewson, Parker Curry, Andrew Istler, Nolan Long, Ryan Moseley and Jason Richman making up the relief core. California League 2017 All-Star Ibandel Isabel, who mashed 28 home runs for last year's club, returned to the Quakes for a second year but was traded to the Cincinnati Reds. He was joined by returning infielder Omar Estevez and outfielder Logan Landon.

SAME SKIPPER, NEW STAFF: The skipper of the Quakes for a third consecutive year is Manager Drew Saylor, who has led the team to the Cal League Playoffs in each of the last two seasons. Saylor, whose team went 76-64 last season, is just the third manager in team history to lead the team for three seasons (Mike Basso 1996-1998, Bobby Meacham 2002-2004). The hitting coach is Justin Viele, a Fullerton native who enters his second year with the Dodgers. In 2017, the former Santa Clara Bronco was the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors of the Pioneer League. Taking over pitching coach duties is Connor McGuinness who also enters his second year in the Dodgers' system. Last season, the Arlington, Virginia native worked in the same role for the Great Lakes Loons of the Midwest League, after spending three of the four previous years working for his alma mater, Emory University. The final member of Saylor's staff is assistant coach Petie Montero, another second-year member of the Dodgers' system, who coached in the DSL last year.

NINE & ON TIME: The Quakes played just one extra-inning game over the first-half on June 15th against the Inland Empire 66ers. The Quakes completed their first 67 games of the year in nine innings and were the final team in the California League to play an extra innings game this year. Racho came out on top in the first extra inning game of the season as Rylan Bannon delivered a three-run triple in the top of the tenth inning to defeat the 66ers 3-0.

Gavin Lux's 12-game hitting streak was the longest by any Quake this season. Lux passed Rylan Bannon who held the previous season long streak of eleven games. Over the stretch (Apr 26-5/11), Lux was 23-for-51 at the plate with six-multi hit games during the streak.

Starting pitcher Dean Kremer currently leads the California League with 99 strikeouts over his first 14 starts of the season. Kremer set a career high with ten strikeouts in a start against Inland Empire on 5/27. The UNLV product totaled 46 strikeouts across 29.2 total innings pitched in the month of May.

The Quakes RBI-Leader Cristian Santana has been one of the most effective hitters with runner in scoring position this season. 31 of his 44 RBI's have come with RISP where he is batting at a .247 clip over those situations. With the bases loaded, Santana's average jumps to .300 where he is 3-for-10 with 9 RBI's.
