

Inland Empire 66ers (37-44, 4-7)

RANCHO CUCAMONGA QUAKES (44-37, 9-2)



TODAY'S GAME: The Quakes continue the five-game series hosting the Inland Empire 66ers (Los Angeles Angels affiliate) in game three of the set. The five-game series is the longest played in the Dodger era. Following wins in each of the first three meetings, the Quakes enter Monday with a chance to set up a series sweep scenario over Inland Empire on Tuesday.

VS INLAND EMPIRE: Today is the 17th of 30 total meetings between the Quakes and 66ers and the eleventh of 16 games to be played at LoanMart Field. In Rancho's last series against Inland Empire, the Quakes took two-of-three games and clinched a first-half championship on 6/16 in San Bernardino. Relievers Michael Boyle and Jason Richman secured victories out of the bullpen in games one and two of the set. Rancho leads the overall season series eleven games to five over the south-division rivals.

LAST TIME OUT: Rancho Cucamonga earned a season-high sixth straight win on Sunday afternoon, blowing out Inland Empire by a final of 10-2. Playing as Los Temblores de Rancho Cucamonga as part of Minor League Baseball's "Copa de la Diversion" initiative, Rancho backed another strong start from pitcher Isaac Anderson with a ten-run explosion, their biggest offensive output of the second half. In the sixth, los Temblores blew the game wide open, as Hamlet Marte cracked a two-run homer, his eighth, while Santana capped the six-run frame with a three-run double, making it 9-1. A Logan Landon double plated Santana in the last of the eighth, before Inland Empire finished the scoring with a run in the ninth. On the hill, Anderson (3-5) earned his second straight win, scattering four hits over five innings, while striking out six to earn his second straight win.

WINNING WAYS: The Quakes enter Monday on a season-long six-game winning streak, following three wins on the road at Lake Elsinore and three at home over Inland Empire. During the first-half schedule Rancho strung together a five-game winnings streak and a pair of four gamers. Over the current stretch, the Quakes are outscoring opponents 35-9.

OLE RELIABLE: Cody Thomas has reached base safely in every game of the second half so far, resulting in an eleven-game hitting streak. Thomas has an extra-base hit in nine of the eleven games, including six home runs, which accounts for two-thirds of his season total (nine). He has accumulated 13 RBI as well during the streak, over one-third of his season total (38).

SHUTOUT STREAK: After tossing three straight shutouts in Lake Elsinore, the Quakes entered Friday with a season-long 32.2 consecutive shutout innings before Angels rehabber Jefry Marte ended the streak in the third at 35.1 innings. The Quakes fell twothirds of an inning shy of tying the Cal League scoreless inning record set by the Redwood Pioneers in 1984. Rancho surpassed their previous shutout high of 28.1 innings (5/30-6/2) following a third straight shutout victory over Lake Elsinore on Thursday. Twice this season the Quakes have won consecutive games via shutout, a feat that had not been achieved since the Angels affiliation in 2010. BANNON'S BIG WEEKS: INF Rylan Bannon was named the California League Player of the Week last Monday for the second time in the month of June. Following the all-star break, Bannon batted .643 with two doubles, two HR's, 5 RBI and 4 runs over a four game series against San Jose. Bannon received league honors in the first week of June as well when he hit .458 with two doubles, four HR's, eight RBI, and six runs scored. Two other Quakes have received league honors this season as Gavin Lux was named Player of

RECENT ROSTER MOVES: Today, RHP Tony Gonsolin has been placed on the Disabled List. Parker Curry has been transferred from Rancho Cucamonga to Double-A Tulsa of the Texas League. LHP Leo Crawford and LHP Austin Hamilton have been transferred from Low-A Great Lakes of the Midwest League to Rancho Cucamonga.

the Week in late April and Dustin May received pitcher of the week honors in May.

MAY DAY: RHP Dustin May (3-3) is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season for the Quakes and fourth against Inland Empire. May last pitched against the 66ers on 6/15 and tossed six shutout innings, allowing three hits and striking out four. In three previous meetings, 66ers hitters are batting just .143 (8-for-56) against May and have not tallied an extra-base hit against the right-hander. May has been pitching some of his best baseball to date, with scoreless outing in three of his last four (3 ER over 23.1 innings). The Justin, TX native was drafted by the Dodgers in the third round of the 2016 draft out of Northwest High School (Justin, TX) and currently ranks as the number ten prospect in the Dodgers system by MLBPipeline.com.

OPPOSING PITCHER: LHP Nate Bertness gets the start today for Inland Empire, his 15th on the season and third against the Quakes. The south paw last saw Rancho Cucamonga on 6/15 and tossed six shutout innings and surrendered just one hit in a matchup against Dustin May The Quakes have scuffled over two prior meetings with Bertness, batting just .083 (3-for-38) without scoring a run over 11 total innings. A Houston, TX native, was drafted by the Angels in the 16th round of the 2015 draft out of McLennan Community College.

REHABBERS: The Quakes have had four Dodgers join the club as apart of major league rehab assignment this season. Rich Hill joined the Quakes for a start in Lake Elsinore on 6/14, striking out ten over 4.1 innings. Dodgers INF Justin Turner joined the Quakes along with INF Logan Forsythe in a weekend series vs. Visalia (5/12-5/13). Turner was 0-for-6 at the plate while Forsythe finished 1-for-10 with a double during the time in Rancho. Yasiel Puig joined the club on rehab assignment Tuesday (5/8) in Lake Elsinore. Puig was 0-for-4 at the plate and was removed from the game in the seventh inning.

FIRST-HALF CHAMPS: The Quakes put together an impressive stretch of winning over the final three weeks of the season en route to their first-half championship. Winners of 13 of their final 19 games played while also taking the upper hand in six of the last seven series, Rancho also held the best divisional record in the league over the first half at 26-17. The first-half championship is the third in the Dodger era (2011, 2015, 2018) and first under manager Drew Saylor, sending the Quakes to the California League Playoffs for the fourth consecutive

SAYLOR & THE STAFF: The skipper of the Quakes for a third consecutive year is Manager Drew Saylor, who has led the team to the Cal League Playoffs in each of his three seasons. Saylor, whose team went 76-64 last season, is just the third manager in team history to lead the team for three seasons (Mike Basso 1996-1998, Bobby Meacham 2002-2004). The hitting coach is Justin Viele, a Fullerton native who enters his second year with the Dodgers. In 2017, the former Santa Clara Bronco was the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors of the Pioneer League. Taking over pitching coach duties is Connor McGuiness who also enters his second year in the Dodgers' system. Last season, the Arlington, Virginia native worked in the same role for the Great Lakes Loons of the Midwest League, after spending three of the four previous years working for his alma mater, Emory University. The final member of Saylor's staff is assistant coach Petie Montero, another second-year member of the Dodgers' system, who coached in the Dominican Summer League last year.

NINE AND ON TIME: The Quakes completed 69 of their 70 first-half games in nine innings. The first and only extra inning game played this season was during the 68th contest of the year on June 15th at Inland Empire. The Quakes were the last team in the California League to play a game under the new MiLB extra-innings rules and pulled out a 3-0 victory over the 66ers on the road.

BY THE NUMBERS

Gavin Lux's 12-game hitting streak was the longest by any Quake this season. Lux passed Rylan Bannon who held the previous season long streak of eleven games. Over the stretch (Apr 26-5/11), Lux was 23-for-51 at the plate with six-multi hit games during the streak.

Starting pitcher Dean Kremer currrently leads the California League with 110 strikeouts over his first 15 starts of the season. Kremer set a career high with eleven strikeouts in a start against Lake Elsinore on 6/25. The UNLV product totaled 46 strikeouts across 29.2 total innings pitched in the month of May and has 36 K's over 23 IP in June.



Cody Thomas has began the second-half on a tear homering in six of the first 11 games of the schedule. Thomas hit just three home runs over the first half and now sits at nine total on the season. Thomas became the first Quake to homer 5 times over a six-game span, bettering Gavin Lux who homer five times over seven games in early June.
