LHP Leo Crawford (1-0, 3.18 ERA) vs. RHP Logan Webb (1-2, 1.94 ERA)

TODAY'S GAME: The Quakes head on the road to begin a five-game series with the San Jose Giants (San Francisco Giants) in the first trip of the year to Municipal Stadium. Today begins the first of three series to be played in San Jose between the Quakes and the Giants. Upon completing this series, the Quakes will return home on Monday, July 9th to face Lancaster for four straight.

VS SAN JOSE: Today is the fifth of 18 total meetings between the Quakes and Giants and the first of 11 games to be played at Municipal Stadium. In Rancho's last series against San Jose, the Quakes took three of four games over the North Division opponents at LoanMart Field.

LAST TIME OUT: Quakes fans packed LoanMart Field on Tuesday night as a sell-out crowd watched the Quakes win their eighth straight and clinch a five-game series-sweep over the 66ers with a 4-1 victory. Dodgers RHP Walker Buehler joined the Quakes on a major league rehab assignment and worked into the fourth inning, allowing one run on two hits while striking out five. Gavin Lux homered and drove in two runs, while the Rancho bullpen fired six innings of scoreless baseball. Austin Hamilton (1-0) recorded the victory in his California League debut while Michael Boyle tossed a scoreless ninth for his third save. Inland Empire starter Jeremy Beasley was saddled with the loss for Inland Empire (3-2). The win keeps the Quakes with the best second-half record (11-2).

STREAK STUFF: The Quakes enter Wednesday on a season-long eight-game winning streak, following three wins on the road at Lake Elsinore and five at home over Inland Empire. Prior to this run, the longest winning streak of the year was five games. Over the current stretch, the Quakes are outscoring their opponents 46-13. The last time they won eight straight was back in 2015 (May 9-18). The last time they won nine straight was in 2014 (June 25 - July 4). The longest winning streak in franchise history is 11 straight, accomplished back in 1999 (June 1-12). Rancho has also won eight straight at LoanMart Field, a season-high.

CONQUERING THE GIANTS: Over the first series of the season Rylan Bannon and Cody Thomas showcased early success against the Giants pitching staff. Bannon batted .643 over four games with two home runs and two doubles while slugging 1.214. Thomas slugged four home runs over the recent series and finished 6-16 at the plate with a .474 on-base percentage.

D-LUX: Since missing two weeks (including the All-Star Game) with a hamstring injury, Gavin Lux has hit in six of seven games, including six in a row. The last three games, Lux has recorded two hits in each and smacked his first round-tripper since coming off the DL in last night's 4-1 win over Inland Empire.

COOLING OFF: Since an 11-game hitting streak, Cody Thomas has gone 0-for-8 over his last two games. During the streak, he batted .364 (16-of-44). The former Oklahoma QB has slugged six of his nine homers in the second half, including four against San Jose.

HEATING UP: After going 0-for-17 in June, Nick Yarnall has hit safely in all three July games, going 6-for-11 with a home run. Yarnall hit just one homer for the Quakes (in just his third game on May 12) after being called up from Great Lakes, where he slugged six.

BANNON'S BIG WEEKS: INF Rylan Bannon was named the California League Player of the Week last Monday for the second time in the month of June. Following the all-star break, Bannon batted .643 with two doubles, two HR's, 5 RBI and 4 runs over a four-game series against San Jose. Bannon received league honors in the first week of June as well when he hit .458 with two doubles, four HR's, eight RBI, and six runs scored. Two other Quakes have received league honors this season as Gavin Lux was named Player of the Week in late April and Dustin May received pitcher of the week honors in May.

RECENT ROSTER MOVES: On Monday, RHP Tony Gonsolin was placed on the Disabled List. Parker Curry was transferred from Rancho Cucamonga to Double-A Tulsa of the Texas League. LHP Leo Crawford and LHP Austin Hamilton have been transferred from Low-A Great Lakes of the Midwest League to Rancho Cucamonga.

CRAWFORD ON CALL: LHP Leo Crawford (1-0) is scheduled to make his first career start and third overall appearance for the Quakes today. Crawford last pitch for the Quakes with the club in April, earning a victory his last time out on 4/13, allowing two runs over 2.2 innings of work against Inland Empire. Crawford was later sent to Low-A Great Lakes in the Midwest League where he has pitched primarily this season (0-5, 4.12 ERA, 14G, 9GS). The Dodgers signed the 21-year-old Crawford as an International Free Agent in 2015 out of Puerto Cabezas, Nicaragua.

OPPOSING PITCHER: RHP Logan Webb will start today for the Giants in his 16th start and second outing against Rancho Cucamonga. Webb last faced the Quakes in the final game of the recent series on 6/24 and allowed just two hits over four innings of shutout baseball in a no-decision. Although Webb commands a sub-two ERA (1.94) the right-hander has not pitched past the fourth inning this season, recording a win in his one relief appearance on 4/16. A Rocklin, CA native, Webb was drafted by the Giants in the fourth round of the 2014 draft out of Rocklin High School.

REHABBERS: The Quakes have had four Dodgers join the club as apart of major league rehab assignment this season. Rich Hill joined the Quakes for a start in Lake Elsinore on 6/14, striking out ten over 4.1 innings. Dodgers INF Justin Turner joined the Quakes along with INF Logan Forsythe in a weekend series vs. Visalia (5/12-5/13). Turner was 0-for-6 at the plate while Forsythe finished 1-for-10 with a double during the time in Rancho. Yasiel Puig joined the club on rehab assignment Tuesday (5/8) in Lake Elsinore. Puig was 0-for-4 at the plate and was removed from the game in the seventh inning.

FIRST-HALF CHAMPS: The Quakes put together an impressive stretch of winning over the final three weeks of the season en route to their first-half championship. Winners of 13 of their final 19 games played while also taking the upper hand in six of the last seven series, Rancho also held the best divisional record in the league over the first half at 26-17. The first-half championship is the third in the Dodger era (2011, 2015, 2018) and first under manager Drew Saylor, sending the Quakes to the California League Playoffs for the fourth consecutive season.

SAYLOR & THE STAFF: The skipper of the Quakes for a third consecutive year is Manager Drew Saylor, who has led the team to the Cal League Playoffs in each of his three seasons. Saylor, whose team went 76-64 last season, is just the third manager in team history to lead the team for three seasons (Mike Basso 1996-1998, Bobby Meacham 2002-2004). The hitting coach is Justin Viele, a Fullerton native who enters his second year with the Dodgers. In 2017, the former Santa Clara Bronco was the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors of the Pioneer League. Taking over pitching coach duties is Connor McGuinness who also enters his second year in the Dodgers' system. Last season, the Arlington, Virginia native worked in the same role for the Great Lakes Loons of the Midwest League, after spending three of the four previous years working for his alma mater, Emory University. The final member of Saylor's staff is assistant coach Petie Montero, another second-year member of the Dodgers' system, who coached in the Dominican Summer League last year.

NINE AND ON TIME: The Quakes completed 69 of their 70 first-half games in nine innings. The first and only extra inning game played this season was during the 68th contest of the year on June 15th at Inland Empire. The Quakes were the last team in the California League to play a game under the new MiLB extra-innings rules and pulled out a 3-0 victory over the 66ers on the road.

BY THE NUMBERS

Gavin Lux's 12-game hitting streak was the longest by any Quake this season. Lux passed Rylan Bannon who held the previous season long streak of eleven games. Over the stretch (Apr 26-5/11), Lux was 23-for-51 at the plate with six-multi hit games during the streak.

Starting pitcher **Dean Kremer** currently leads the California League with 114 strikeouts over his first 16 starts of the season. Kremer set a career high with eleven strikeouts in a start against Lake Elsinore on 6/25. The UNLV product totaled 46 strikeouts across 29.2 total innings pitched in the month of May and had 40 K's over 28.2 IP in June.

Cody Thomas has began the second-half on a tear homering in six of the first 13 games of the schedule. Thomas hit just three home runs over the first half and now sits at nine total on the season. Thomas became the first Quake to homer 5 times over a six-game span, bettering Gavin Lux who homer five times over seven games in early June.
