RANCHO CUCAMONGA QUAKES (52-37, 17-2)

RHP Brandon Gold (6-5, 5.79 ERA) vs. RHP Tony Gonsolin (3-2, 2.75 ERA)

TODAY'S GAME: The Quakes resume a four-game series hosting the south division rival Lancaster JetHawks (Colorado Rockies affiliate). Tuesday is game two of the second of four trips the Jethawks will make to LoanMart Field during the 2018 season. This series is the first time these clubs have met since the second week in June (6/5-6/7) prior to the All-Star break. Tonight is a Healthy RC Recycle Tuesday, as fans can bring 10 recyclable bottles or cans and receive a free club section ticket, thanks to Healthy RC.

VS LANCASTER: Today is the 14th of 29 total meetings between the Quakes and JetHawks and the fifth of 13 games to be played at LoanMart Field. The Quakes enter Tuesday night leading the season series eight-games-to-five.

LAST TIME OUT: The Quakes hailed victorious yet again, defeating Lancaster 5-4 in the series opener for their 14th straight win. Cody Thomas and Connor Wong opened the scoring up early with solo shots in the first and second innings, respectively. The JetHawks took brief lead as they scored once in the third and twice in the fourth, but Jared Walker put Rancho ahead for good in the bottom half of the fourth with a three-run home run. Lancaster cut the lead to 5-4 with a RBI single in the fifth, which chased starter Leo Crawford. Ryan Moseley, Logan Salow, and Andre Scrubb combined for 4.2 scoreless innings of relief to close it out with Moseley (3-2) recording his third win and Scrubb recording a six-out save, his first of the year. Crawford lasted four and one-third innings, allowing four runs on nine hits while striking out six in his second start for the Quakes. All five Rancho runs came from the long ball and all nine runs were scored off of starting pitching.

STREAK STUFF: The Quakes enter Tuesday on a franchise-record 14-game winning streak, putting their record at a season-best, 15 games over the .500 mark at 17-2 in the second half and 52-37 overall. The streak started on June 26th at Lake Elsinore with three straight shut-out wins, a franchise-first. The Quakes went on to sweep consecutive five-games series, home against Inland Empire and on the road in San Jose. Prior to this run, the longest winning streak of the year was five games. Over the current stretch, the Quakes are outscoring their opponents 86-32. The Quakes passed the previous franchise record of 11 straight wins on Saturday, accomplished back in 1999 (June 1-12) as a San Diego Padres affiliate. Rancho has also won nine straight at LoanMart Field, a season-high, and eight in a row on the road, also a season-best. Rancho's 14-game winning is currently the longest in all of major league and minor league baseball with the next closest streaks belonging to the Boston Red Sox (W7), DSL Rays2 (W7), AZL Dodgers (W7), and the Dunedin Blue Jays (W7). The all-time Cal League record for consecutive wins is 26, held by the Stockton Ports in 1947.

TROPHY CASE: The Quakes swept the California League weekly honors to open July as INF Omar Estevez and LHP Leo Crawford received Player and Pitcher of the Week nods respectively. Estevez batted .370 (10-for-27) over seven games, homering four times and driving in ten. Crawford received the honors after tossing seven shutout innings and allowing just a single hit over a start on July 4th in San Jose. This marks the first time in the Dodger era that the Quakes have swept the league's weekly awards. Rancho set a franchise record with seven league honorees in 2017 and now hold six distinctions this year (Lux, Bannon (2), Estevez, May, Crawford).

RECENT ROSTER MOVES: Earlier today, RHP Tony Gonsolin was activated from the DL, while LHP Logan Salow was placed on the DL. On Sunday, RHP Orlando Navarro was transferred from Rancho Cucamonga to the Arizona League Dodgers. RHP Parker Curry was transferred from Double-A Tulsa to Rancho Cucamonga. INF Nick Yarnall was placed on the Disabled List and OF Saige Jenco was activated from the DL.

FEAR THE MUSTACHE: Right-hander Tony Gonsolin is scheduled to make his 17th start and fourth against the JetHawks tonight. In three starts versus Lancaster, Gonsolin has an 0-1 record and has given up eight earned runs, the most he has allowed against any team in 2018. His last outing at Lancaster was on June 6th, when he pitched five innings, giving up four runs in a loss. Gonsolin's last trip to the mound was on June 29th, when he threw four innings, giving up four hits and two runs, one earned, in a no decision against Inland Empire. With today's start, Gonsolin will pass Dean Kremer for most starts and most innings pitched for the Quakes in 2018. Gonsolin was selected by the Dodgers in the ninth round of the 2016 draft out of Saint Mary's.

OPPOSING PITCHER: Right-hander Brandon Gold toes the rubber tonight in his 18th start of the season for Lancaster and fourth against the Quakes. Gold earned a win when he last faced Rancho on June 6th, throwing six innings for one-run ball while giving up six hits. Over three previous starts, Gold has given up eleven runs, resulting in a 1-1 record with a no-decision. His last outing was on June 5th, when he pitched a six inning, two-run gem to earn the win against Modesto. Gold has given up the most earned runs out of any JetHawks pitcher in 2018 (60). This is Gold's first full season with Lancaster after being called up the club mid-way through the 2017 campaign from the Low-A Asheville Tourists. The Rockies drafted Gold in the 12th round of the 2016 draft out of Georgia Tech.

REHABBERS: The Quakes have had five Dodgers join the club as apart of major league rehab assignment this season. RHP Walker Buehler joined the Quakes most recently from a rehab start on June 3rd. Rich Hill joined the Quakes for a start in Lake Elsinore on 6/14, striking out ten over 4.1 innings. Dodgers INF Justin Turner joined the Quakes along with INF Logan Forsythe in a weekend series vs. Visalia (5/12-5/13). Turner was 0-for-6 at the plate while Forsythe finished 1-for-10 with a double during the time in Rancho. Yasiel Puig joined the club on rehab assignment Tuesday (5/8) in Lake Elsinore. Puig was 0-for-4 at the plate and was removed from the game in the seventh inning.

FIRST-HALF CHAMPS: The Quakes put together an impressive stretch of winning over the final three weeks of the season en route to their first-half championship. Winners of 13 of their final 19 games played while also taking the upper hand in six of the last seven series, Rancho also held the best divisional record in the league over the first half at 26-17. The first-half championship is the third in the Dodger era (2011, 2015, 2018) and first under manager Drew Saylor, sending the Quakes to the California League Playoffs for the fourth consecutive season.

SAYLOR & THE STAFF: The skipper of the Quakes for a third consecutive year is Manager Drew Saylor, who has led the team to the Cal League Playoffs in each of his three seasons. Saylor, whose team went 76-64 last season, is just the third manager in team history to lead the team for three seasons (Mike Basso 1996-1998, Bobby Meacham 2002-2004). The hitting coach is Justin Viele, a Fullerton native who enters his second year with the Dodgers. In 2017, the former Santa Clara Bronco was the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors of the Pioneer League. Taking over pitching coach duties is Connor McGuiness who also enters his second year in the Dodgers' system. Last season, the Arlington, Virginia native worked in the same role for the Great Lakes Loons of the Midwest League, after spending three of the four previous years working for his alma mater, Emory University. The final member of Saylor's staff is assistant coach Petie Montero, another second-year member of the Dodgers' system, who coached in the Dominican Summer League last year.

NINE AND ON TIME: The Quakes completed 69 of their 70 first-half games in nine innings and have played just two extended games all season. The Quakes first needed extras in the 68th contest of the year on June 15th at Inland Empire. The Quakes pulled out a 3-0 victory over the 66ers and are 2-0 in extra inning games after an 8-3 of the Giants in ten innings on July 5th. Rancho is outscoring opponents 8-0 in extra innings this season.

BY THE NUMBERS

12	Gavin Lux's 12-game hitting streak was the longest by any Quake this season. Lux passed Rylan Bannon who held the previous season long streak of eleven games. Over the stretch (Apr 26-5/11), Lux was 23-for-51 at the plate with six-multi hit games during the streak.
114	Before his promotion to double-A Tulsa, Dean Kremer led the California League with 114 strikeouts over 16 starts . Kremer set a career high with eleven strikeouts in a start against Lake Elsinore on 6/25. Kremer earned Pitcher of the Week honors in the Texas League after seven shutout innings and 11 K's in his first start with the Drillers.
16	The Quakes have homered a league leading 16 times in the month of July, five ahead of the San Jose Giants (11). Rancho has continued to up the home run totals over the first three months of the season: April (29), May (33), June (35) and are on pace for 40+ homers in July. Multi-HR games in July: Estevez (4), Thomas (3), Kendall (2), Walker (2).

-Playing in his second season in the Dodgers organization, batted .221 over 35 games with Low-A Great Lakes in 2017
 -Started as a freshman at Vanderbilt on the 2015 NCAA national runner-up team, was a .309 career hitter with 32 HR's and 152 RBI's
 -Hit first Grand-Slam of the season for the Quakes on 5/10 at Lake Elsinore...grand slam was also Kendall's first home run of the season.
 -Picked with the 23rd overall pick by the Dodgers in 2017 and is ranked as the #7 prospect in the Dodgers system by MLBPipeline.com
