**TODAY'S GAME:** The Quakes continue a four-game series on the road in San Bernardino taking on the Inland Empire 66ers (Los Angeles Angels Affiliate) in game three of the set. This is the first of two road trips to San Manuel Stadium during the second half for the Quakes.

**VS INLAND EMPIRE:** Today is the 21st of 30 total meetings between the Quakes and 66ers and the ninth of 14 games to be played at San Manuel Stadium. The Quakes enter Sunday evening leading the season series 14-games-to-six. The Quakes swept the 66ers in the previous series played, a five-game set at LoanMart Field (6/28-7/3) and have won six of the last seven games against IE.

**LAST TIME OUT:** The Quakes fell on the wrong side of a low-scoring affair Saturday night and were shutout for the sixth time on the season as the 66ers walked off in the ninth, defeating Rancho 1-0. The Quakes had a chance to break the scoreless tie with two runners in scoring position and no outs in the eighth. Logan Landon flew out to left field and Cody Thomas was thrown out at home attempting to score. Leo Crawford allowed just two hits and struck out four over seven innings and was replaced by Connor Strain to open the eighth. Strain wrapped up the inning on a 4-6-3 double-play but ran into trouble during the final frame. Strain (0-1) allowed three consecutive singles to begin the ninth and Marshall Kasowski inherited the bases loaded from the pen. Kasowski punched out David MacKinnon swinging, but Jonah Todd followed with the game-winning single to walk Inland Empire off at 1-0. Jorge Tavarez (1-0) covered the final three innings for Inland Empire behind starting pitcher Nate Bertness and was positioned for the win on Saturday night.

**STREAK STUFF:** With their 6-2 loss on Wednesday, the Quakes franchise-record 15-game winning streak ended. The streak started on June 26th at Lake Elsinore with three straight shut-out wins, a franchise-first. The Quakes went on to sweep consecutive five-games series, at home against Inland Empire and on the road in San Jose. Prior to the run, the longest winning streak of the year was five games. Over the stretch, the Quakes outscored their opponents 92-33. The Quakes passed the previous franchise record of 11 straight wins on Saturday, July 7th, accomplished back in 1999 (June 1-12) as a San Diego Padres affiliate. Rancho had won ten straight at LoanMart Field, a season-high. Following Wednesday's loss the Quakes have won two of their last four games and have taken the upper hand in 17 of their last 19 games played. Saturday's loss to the 66ers ended a 9-game road winning streak.

**D-LUX:** Gavin Lux carries a season-high 16-game hitting streak into tonight's game (26-for-69, .376 avg). Lux has eight multi-hit games during what is the longest active hitting streak in the league. The longest hitting streak this season was a 19-game stretch by Stockton's Jonah Heim (4/20-5/12). Lux also owns the second longest hitting streak of the year for the Quakes at 12 games.

**TROPHY CASE:** The Quakes swept the California League weekly honors to open July as INF Omar Estevez and LHP Leo Crawford received Player and Pitcher of the Week nods, respectively. Estevez batted .370 (10-for-27) over seven games, homering four times and driving in 10. Crawford received the honors after tossing seven shutout innings and allowing just one hit over a start on July 4th in San Jose. This marks the first time in the Dodger era that the Quakes have swept the league's weekly awards. Rancho set a franchise record with seven league honorees in 2017 and now hold six distinctions this year (Lux, Bannon (2), Estevez, May, Crawford).

**RECENT ROSTER MOVES:** Today, LHP Jason Richman has been transferred from Rancho Cucamonga to triple-A Oklahoma City of the Pacific Coast League. RHP Elio Serrano has been transferred from Rookie-Level Ogden of the Pioneer League to Rancho Cucamonga. On Saturday, RHP Tony Gonsolin was transferred from Rancho Cucamonga to double-A Tulsa of the Texas League. RHP Isaac Anderson was transferred from double-A Tulsa to Rancho Cucamonga.

**HAMILTON'S HILL:** RHP Austin Hamilton is scheduled to make his second start and fourth overall appearance on the hill tonight for the Quakes. Hamilton faced Lancaster in his first start of the season on 7/11 and allowed three runs on five hits over four complete innings in a loss. The second year farmhand joined the Quakes on July 2nd from Low-A Great Lakes and debuted in the Cal League on July 3rd against Inland Empire. Hamilton tossed three perfect innings against the 66ers in relief behind Dodgers rehabber Walker Buehler. An Okeechobee, FL native, Hamilton was signed by the Dodgers in 2017 as a non-drafted free agent out of Valdosta State University in Valdosta, GA.

**OPPOSING PITCHER:** RHP Luis Madero will start tonight for the 66ers in his 2nd start of the season and first against the Quakes. Madero was assigned to the 66ers on July 6th from the Burlington Bee's and debuted in the Cal League with six shutout innings against Lake Elsinore on July 10th. Originally signed by the Diamondback as an International free agent in 2014, the 21-year-old was traded to the Angels in 2017 in exchange for RHP David Hernandez of Los Angeles.

**REHABBERS:** The Quakes have had five Dodgers join the club as apart of major league rehab assignment this season. RHP Walker Buehler joined the Quakes most recently from a rehab start on July 3rd. Rich Hill joined the Quakes for a start in Lake Elsinore on 6/14, striking out ten over 4.1 innings. Dodgers INF Justin Turner joined the Quakes along with INF Logan Forsythe in a weekend series vs. Visalia (5/12-5/13). Turner was 0-for-6 at the plate while Forsythe finished 1-for-10 with a double during the time in Rancho. Yasiel Puig joined the club on rehab assignment Tuesday (5/8) in Lake Elsinore. Puig was 0-for-4 at the plate and was removed from the game in the seventh inning.

**FIRST-HALF CHAMPS:** The Quakes put together an impressive stretch of winning over the final three weeks of the season en route to their first-half championship. Winners of 13 of their final 19 games played while also taking the upper hand in six of the last seven series, Rancho also held the best divisional record in the league over the first half at 26-17. The first-half championship is the third in the Dodger era (2011, 2015, 2018) and first under manager Drew Saylor, sending the Quakes to the California League Playoffs for the fourth consecutive season.

**SAYLOR & THE STAFF:** The skipper of the Quakes for a third consecutive year is Manager Drew Saylor, who has led the team to the Cal League Playoffs in each of his three seasons. Saylor, whose team went 76-64 last season, is just the third manager in team history to lead the team for three seasons (Mike Basso 1996-1998, Bobby Meacham 2002-2004). The hitting coach is Justin Viele, a Fullerton native who enters his second year with the Dodgers. In 2017, the former Santa Clara Bronco was the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors of the Pioneer League. Taking over pitching coach duties is Connor McGuinness who also enters his second year in the Dodgers' system. Last season, the Arlington, Virginia native worked in the same role for the Great Lakes Loons of the Midwest League, after spending three of the four previous years working for his alma mater, Emory University. The final member of Saylor's staff is assistant coach Petie Montero, another second-year member of the Dodgers' system, who coached in the Dominican Summer League last year.

**NINE AND ON TIME:** The Quakes completed 69 of their 70 first-half games in nine innings and have played just two extended games all season. The Quakes first needed extras in the 68th contest of the year on June 15th at Inland Empire. The Quakes pulled out a 3-0 victory over the 66ers and are 2-0 in extra inning games after an 8-3 of the Giants in ten innings on July 5th. Rancho is outscoring opponents 8-0 in extra innings this season.

Gavin Lux has set a new team-high mark, currently on a **16-game** hitting streak. Lux also had a 12-game hitting streak earlier in the season (Apr 26-5/11), and was 23-for-51 at the plate with six-multi hit games during the streak. On the current run (June 27-Pres) Lux is 26-for-69 with two home runs and eight multi-hit games.

Before his promotion to double-A Tulsa, **Dean Kremer** led the California League with **114** strikeouts over 16 starts. Kremer set a career high with eleven strikeouts in a start against Lake Elsinore on 6/25. Kremer earned Pitcher of the Week honors in the Texas League after seven shutout innings and 11 K's in his first start with the Drillers.

The Quakes have homered a league leading **22** times in the month of July, five ahead of the San Jose Giants (17). ## 3 Jeren Kendall OF \ L/R \ 6-0 \ 190 \ Clearwater, FL \ Round 1 (2017, LAD) \ Vanderbilt \ @JerenKendall

-Playing in his second season in the Dodgers organization, batted .221 over 35 games with Low-A Great Lakes in 2017  
 -Started as a freshman at Vanderbilt on the 2015 NCAA national runner-up team, was a .309 career hitter with 32 HR's and 152 RBI's  
 -Hit first Grand-Slam of the season for the Quakes on 5/10 at Lake Elsinore...grand slam was also Kendall's first home run of the season.  
 -Picked with the 23rd overall pick by the Dodgers in 2017 and is ranked as the #7 prospect in the Dodgers system by MLB Pipeline.com  
 -Father, Jeremy Kendall played minor league baseball in the Phillies organization.

## 5 Cristian Santana INF \ R/R \ 6-2 \ 175 \ San Cristobal, DR \ International Free Agent, 2014

-Playing in his fourth season in the Dodgers organization, split time in 2017 between short-season Ogden (.537, 10 G) and Great Lakes (.322, 44G)

 -Ranked as the #16 overall pre-season prospect in Dodgers system by Baseball America
