RANCHO CUCAMONGA QUAKES (59-42, 24-7)



RHP Ljay Newsome (5-7, 4.92 ERA) vs. RHP Dustin May (6-3, 3.33 ERA)

TODAY'S GAME: The Quakes host the Modesto Nuts (Seattle Mariners affiliate) in the conclusion of a three-game series. This series marks the second trip to Rancho Cucamonga for the Nuts and closes the back half of Rancho's six-game home stand.

VS MODESTO: This is the sixth of ten total meetings between the Quakes and Nuts and the sixth of seven games to be played at LoanMart Field. The Quakes last squared off with the Nuts at home (4/30-5/3) and dropped three of four games to the north division opponents. RHP Dean Kremer recorded the only winning decision against Modesto following his start in game two of the set. The Quakes will conclude the season series with the Nuts at John Thurman Field (7/27-7/29) in the only road trip to Modesto this year.

LAST TIME OUT: Los Temblores de Rancho Cucamonga took to the field on Sunday afternoon and were halted offensively as the Modesto Nuts evened the series with a 3-1 win over Rancho. Modesto pitching retired 16 in a row to close out the game as Los Temblores struggled to get a base runner. Cristian Santana supplied the only run of the day with a 457 foot solo-home run to center that gave Rancho a 1-zip lead in the second. Starting pitcher Isaac Anderson allowed the only run of his outing when Louis Boyd tied the game with a RBI-groundout in the fourth. Anderson lasted a season-long six innings and delivered his first quality start of the year in a no-decision. Austin Hamilton recorded two outs in the seventh and worked out of the bullpen with a man on third. Joe Rizzo popped into shallow left and Santana had the ball slip in and out of his glove, scoring the go-ahead run. Leading 2-1 in the eighth, Modesto added insurance against Hamilton (1-2) with an RBI-single to cap the score at 3-1. Jeffeson Medina (4-2) recorded the win out of the bullpen as he, J.T Salter and Wyatt Mills combined for four perfect innings to lock down the game. Mills pitched the ninth and recorded his tenth save on the year.

D-LUX: Gavin Lux saw a season-long 19-game hitting streak come to a close on Friday after going 0-for-4 at the plate with a walk. Lux had nine multi-hit games during the stretch that tied Stockton's Jonah Heim for the longest streak in the California League this year. The Dodgers first-round draft pick in 2016 finished 30-for-82 (.365) over the span. Since halting the streak, Lux has recovered with back-to-back multi-hit games and a home run in the series opener with Modesto. Lux also owns the second longest hitting streak of the year for the Quakes at 12 games.

HOME SWEET HOME: After recording a sub-.500 record (16-19) at home over the first-half of play, the Quakes are 14-4 at LoanMart Field following the All-Star break. Rancho has taken the upper hand in all four series played at LoanMart Field during the second-half and are outscoring opponents 112-66 at home.

MANNYWOOD: On Wednesday, the Dodgers fostered a blockbuster trade to bring Baltimore Orioles slugger Manny Machado to Los Angeles. In doing so, the Dodgers sent a five-prospect package to the Orioles that included four former Quakes, including three from this season's club: Cal League MVP candidate Rylan Bannon, Cal League strikeout leader Dean Kremer, and stingy reliever Zach Pop. 2017 Quake Yusniel Diaz and Breyvic Valera, who was acquired from the Cardinals earlier this season, were the other two prospects involved. Bannon, Kremer, and Pop all played large roles in the Quakes 2018 first half title and historic 15-game winning streak.

NUT CRACKERS: Jeren Kendall and Hamlet Marte are coming off a strong series last time out against Modesto. Kendall was 4-for-10 at the plate with a double and four runs scored while also stealing five bases on the series. Marte batted .429 (3-for-7) and was the only Quake to homer against the Nuts last time out.

RECENT ROSTER MOVES: Today, RHP Marshall Kasowski has been promoted to Double-A Tulsa of the Texas League. RHP Nolan Long returns to Rancho Cucamonga from Double-A Tulsa. On Saturday LHP Antonio Hernandez was transferred to rookie-league Ogden of the Pioneer League. Taking his spot on the roster is RHP Yeison Cespedes, promoted to Rancho Cucamonga from Ogden. On Thursday, RHP Parker Curry was transferred to Double-A Tulsa of the Texas League. Taking his spot on the roster was 18-year-old LHP Antonio Hernandez.

MAY DAY: Dustin May steps to the mound today in his 16th start of the year and second against the Modesto Nuts. May made his 2018 season debut against Modesto on May 3rd and worked 3.2 innings, allowing four runs on six hits and was saddled with a loss. The right-hander salvaged a win his last time out despite allowing five runs over five innings to San Jose. The Justin, TX native was picked up by the Dodgers in the 3rd round of the 2016 draft out of Northwest High School and currently ranks as the ninth overall prospect in the Dodgers system and third best pitching prospect by MLBPipeline.com

OPPOSING PITCHER: Ljay Newsome takes the ball today for the Modesto Nuts in his 19th start of the season and second against Rancho. Newsome last squared off against the Quakes on May 2nd and allowed four runs on nine hits over six innings in a win. The right-handers enters today following a loss to Lake Elsinore his last time out where he allowed four runs over 5.1 innings. A La Plata, MD native, Newsome was drafted by the Mariners in the 26th round of the 2015 draft out of Chopticon High School.

REHABBERS: The Quakes have had five Dodgers join the club as apart of major league rehab assignment this season. RHP Walker Buehler joined the Quakes most recently from a rehab start on July 3rd. Rich Hill joined the Quakes for a start in Lake Elsinore on 6/14, striking out ten over 4.1 innings. Dodgers INF Justin Turner joined the Quakes along with INF Logan Forsythe in a weekend series vs. Visalia (5/12-5/13). Turner was 0-for-6 at the plate while Forsythe finished 1-for-10 with a double during the time in Rancho. Yasiel Puig joined the club on rehab assignment Tuesday (5/8) in Lake Elsinore. Puig was 0-for-4 at the plate and was removed from the game in the seventh inning.

FIRST-HALF CHAMPS: The Quakes put together an impressive stretch of winning over the final three weeks of the season en route to their first-half championship. Winners of 13 of their final 19 games played while also taking the upper hand in six of the last seven series, Rancho also held the best divisional record in the league over the first half at 26-17. The first-half championship is the third in the Dodger era (2011, 2015, 2018) and first under manager Drew Saylor, sending the Quakes to the California League Playoffs for the fourth consecutive season.

SAYLOR & THE STAFF: The skipper of the Quakes for a third consecutive year is Manager Drew Saylor, who has led the team to the Cal League Playoffs in each of his three seasons. Saylor, whose team went 76-64 last season, is just the third manager in team history to lead the team for three seasons (Mike Basso 1996-1998, Bobby Meacham 2002-2004). The hitting coach is Justin Viele, a Fullerton native who enters his second year with the Dodgers. In 2017, the former Santa Clara Bronco was the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors of the Pioneer League. Taking over pitching coach duties is Connor McGuiness who also enters his second year in the Dodgers' system. Last season, the Arlington, Virginia native worked in the same role for the Great Lakes Loons of the Midwest League, after spending three of the four previous years working for his alma mater, Emory University. The final member of Saylor's staff is assistant coach Petie Montero, another second-year member of the Dodgers' system, who coached in the Dominican Summer League last year.

NINE AND ON TIME: The Quakes completed 69 of their 70 first-half games in nine innings and have played just three extended games all season. The Quakes first needed extras in the 68th contest of the year on June 15th at Inland Empire. The Quakes pulled out a 3-0 victory over the 66ers and are 2-1 in extra inning games after an 8-3 defeat of the Giants in ten innings on July 5th. Rancho is outscoring opponents 9-2 in extra innings this season.

BY THE NUMBERS

70	Cristian Santana is the active RBI leader in the California League with 70 runs driven in on the season. Following the trade of Rylan Bannon to Baltimore and the promotion to Double-A Midland for Stockton's Nate Mondou, Santana has a sizable lead over the rest of the field. The next closest active run producer in the league is now Visalia's Drew Ellis (60).
80	Following the strong start to the second-half, the Quakes are within striking distance of just their second 80-win season in franchise history. Rancho needs to finish 21-18 over the remaining 39 games of the regular season to secure an 80-win season for the first time since 2011. In 2011, the Quakes finished the year 80-60. Rancho has never recorded more than 80 wins in a single season.
28	The Quakes have homered a league leading 28 times in the month of July, four ahead of the San Jose Giants (24). Rancho has continued to up the home run totals over the first three months of the season: April (29), May (33), June (35) and are on pace for 40+ homers in July. Multi-HR games in July: Estevez (5), Thomas (3), Kendall (3), Landon (4), Wong (2), Lux (2), Marte (2), Walker (3).
