TODAY'S GAME: The Quakes begin a three-game series at Municipal Stadium, taking on the San Jose Giants (San Francisco Giants affiliate). This is the fifth and final series between the two clubs in the second half and the third on the road in San Jose. Today is game four of a six-game road trip, as Rancho was swept by the Lancaster JetHawks in a series that wrapped up yesterday.

VS SAN JOSE: Tonight is the 16th of 18 games to be played between these two clubs during the regular season and ninth of 11 contests at Municipal. After taking three-of-four over San Jose last time out, the Quakes lead the season series 12-3 with a record of 7-1 at Municipal Stadium.

LAST TIME OUT: The Quakes were swept for just the second time this year, as the Lancaster JetHawks dropped Rancho on Sunday evening, 10-9. A Manny Melendez RBI single off of Michael Boyle (1-1) was the difference, as his eighth-inning hit broke a 9-9 tie and put the JetHawks ahead to stay for good. Early on, Rancho jumped all over Lancaster starter Matt Dennis. Omar Estevez doubled home Cody Thomas to tie the game at 1-1. Jeren Kendall followed with an RBI single, scoring Estevez to give Rancho a 2-1 lead. Three batters later, Brandon Montgomery homered to right field, his first in a Rancho uniform this season, as the Quakes built a 5-1 lead. Rancho added one final run when Cristian Santana doubled home Connor Wong to make it 6-1. Lancaster bounced back with six unanswered and retook a 7-6 lead by the end of the fifth inning. Rancho evened the game back at 9-9 in the top of the eighth before the JetHawks delivered the game-winning blow.

SAYLOR APPROACHING HISTORY: Quakes manager Drew Saylor is two wins shy of surpassing a 20-year record to become the all-time winningest manager in franchise history. The third-year skipper is chasing former manager Mike Basso who compiled 223 wins over the 1996, 1997 & 1998 seasons. With 67 wins to his line this year, Saylor has led the Quakes to the best second-half record in all of minor league baseball (32-12) and owns 222 career victories during his tenure in Rancho. Saylor has led the Quakes to the California League playoffs in each of his three seasons and is 13 wins away from recording just the second 80-win season in franchise history.

ONE TO FORGET: The Quakes are coming off a three-game sweep at the hands of the Lancaster JetHawks, just the second time Rancho has been swept in a series this season. The Quakes had not been swept by an opponent since the season opening road trip when the club lost three straight in Stockton (4/9-4/11), beginning the season to a sluggish 2-5 start over the first week. On Friday night, Rancho tied a franchise worst margin of defeat in a 21-1 loss to Lancaster. Rancho had not lost a game by 20 runs since the JetHawks topped the Quakes at The Hangar in 2003.

WALKER'S WEEK: The Quakes reeled in a pair of league honors today as INF Jared Walker was named California League Player of the week. Over a six-game stretch (7/30-8/5), Walker batted .409 with nine hits, four home runs, eight RBI and nine runs scored. Walker is the eighth Quake to receive league honors this season (Bannon (2), Lux, Estevez, Thomas, Crawford, May), setting a new-franchise best mark for most weekly awards in a single season.

LUX POTM: Former Quakes INF and Dodgers 2016 first-round pick Gavin Lux enjoyed an incredibly productive month of July before his promotion to Double-A Tulsa on August 1st. On Monday, Lux was named California League Player of the Month by MiLB, the first Quake to receive the honor this season. Over 26 games, Lux batted .360 with 41 hits, 23 runs, 3 HR, 13 RBI and 64 TB. During the month Lux also strung together a 19-game hitting streak and 26-game on-base streak.

RECENT ROSTER MOVES: Yesterday RHP Elio Serrano was transferred to Rancho Cucamonga from short-season Ogden of the Pioneer League. RHP Ryan Moseley was placed on the temporarily inactive list. On Friday, RHP Wills Montgomerie and RHP Sven Schueller were transferred to Rancho Cucamonga from Low-A Great Lakes.

LEO THE LEFTY: LHP Leo Crawford is scheduled to take the ball tonight for the Quakes in his seventh start of the season and third against the Giants. Crawford has excelled over two prior starts at Municipal Stadium in San Jose, tossing 12 combined shutout innings and allowing five hits in a pair of winning decisions. Over his two prior starts, Crawford has held Giants hitters to a .125 average while walking one and striking out 11. The Nicaragua native signed with the Dodgers as an International Free Agent in 2015 at the age of 18.

OPPOSING PITCHER: RHP Carlos Sano is scheduled to make his 15th overall appearance and seventh start of the season tonight for the Giants. Sano has faced the Quakes in a pair of rehab appearances this season, most recently on July 6th where he tossed 3.2 scoreless and hitless frames, walking two and striking out three. Rancho had better success against Sano on June 21st, crossing four runs on six hits over 1.1 innings. A native of the Dominican Republic, Sano signed as a free agent with the Giants in November of 2017 and is in his first full season apart of the San Francisco system.

REHABBERS: The Quakes have had seven Dodgers join the club as apart of major league rehab assignment this season. LHP Hyun-Jin Ryu and RHP Zac Rosscup both joined the Quakes on Thursday and combined for five shutout innings in a win over Lake Elsinore. RHP Walker Buehler joined the Quakes for a rehab start on July 3rd. Rich Hill joined the Quakes for a start in Lake Elsinore on 6/14, striking out ten over 4.1 innings. Dodgers INF Justin Turner put on the uniform along with INF Logan Forsythe in a weekend series vs. Visalia (5/12-5/13). Turner was 0-for-6 at the plate while Forsythe finished 1-for-10 with a double during the time in Rancho. Yasiel Puig joined the club on rehab assignment for one game (5/8) in Lake Elsinore. Puig was 0-for-4 at the plate and was removed from the game in the seventh inning.

FIRST-HALF CHAMPS: The Quakes put together an impressive winning stretch over the final three weeks of the first half en route to their first-half championship. Winners of 13 of their final 19 games heading into the All-Star Break while also taking the upper hand in six of the last seven series, Rancho also held the best divisional record in the league over the first half at 26-17. The first-half championship is the third in the Dodger era (2011, 2015, 2018) and first under manager Drew Saylor, sending the Quakes to the California League Playoffs for the fourth consecutive season.

SAYLOR & THE STAFF: The skipper of the Quakes for a third consecutive year is Manager Drew Saylor, who has led the team to the Cal League Playoffs in each of his three seasons. Saylor, whose team went 76-64 last season, is just the third manager in team history to lead the team for three seasons (Mike Basso 1996-1998, Bobby Meacham 2002-2004). The hitting coach is Justin Viele, a Fullerton native who enters his second year with the Dodgers. In 2017, the former Santa Clara Bronco was the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors of the Pioneer League. Taking over pitching coach duties is Connor McGuinness who also enters his second year in the Dodgers' system. Last season, the Arlington, Virginia native worked in the same role for the Great Lakes Loons of the Midwest League, after spending three of the four previous years working for his alma mater, Emory University. The final member of Saylor's staff is assistant coach Petie Montero, another second-year member of the Dodgers' system, who coached in the Dominican Summer League last year.

NINE AND ON TIME: The Quakes completed 69 of their 70 first-half games in nine innings and have played just three extended games all season. The Quakes first needed extras in the 68th contest of the year on June 15th at Inland Empire. The Quakes pulled out a 3-0 victory over the 66ers and are 2-1 in extra inning games after an 8-3 defeat of the Giants in ten innings on July 5th. Rancho is outscoring opponents 9-2 in extra innings this season.

BY THE NUMBERS

9	INF Jared Walker has caught a recent power surge at the plate with 9 HR's over his last 16 games. Walker is the only Quake to homer in five consecutive games this season, a stretch that game to an end during Rancho's recent road trip to San Jose. The left-handed hitter has set a new career high with 18 home runs this season between time in Great Lakes and Rancho.
80	Following the strong start to the second-half, the Quakes are within striking distance of just their second 80-win season in franchise history. Rancho needs to finish 13-14 over the remaining 27 games of the regular season to secure an 80-win season for the first time since 2011. In 2011, the Quakes finished the year 80-60. Rancho has never recorded more than 80 wins in a single season.
58	The Quakes have piled on 58 runs over 8 games at Municipal Stadium (7.25 per game) and have sailed to a 7-1 record in the Bay Area this season. The Quakes have put up a pair of double didget performances on the road against the Giants this season including a 10-0 shutout last time out.

-Playing in his second season in the Dodgers organization, batted .221 over 35 games with Low-A Great Lakes in 2017
 -Started as a freshman at Vanderbilt on the 2015 NCAA national runner-up team, was a .309 career hitter with 32 HR's and 152 RBI's
 -Hit first Grand-Slam of the season for the Quakes on 5/10 at Lake Elsinore...grand slam was also Kendall's first home run of the season.
