




Lake Elsinore Storm (58-62, 24-26)



RANCHO CUCAMONGA QUAKES (71-49 36-14)





VS LAKE ELSINORE: Today is the 26th of 31 overall matchups between the two clubs and 15th of 17 games at LoanMart Field. The Quakes swept the Storm last time out (7/31-8/2), taking all three games at home over the south division rivals. Max Gamboa, Andre Scrubb and Isaac Anderson all recorded wins on the mound while the offense outscored the Storm 38-13. Entering Tuesday, the Quakes have already clinched the overall season series, leading 17-8.

LAST TIME OUT: The Quakes swept Lancaster on Sunday afternoon, scoring five unanswered runs in a 5-2 victory at LoanMart Field. Leo Crawford tied a season-long outing with seven strong innings and held Lancaster in check after surrendering two runs in the first. Cody Thomas came home on a wild pitch in the fourth and Crisitan Santana's sacrifice fly to right tied the game at two. Donovan Casey drove home Santana with a go-ahead RBI-single in the sixth to make it 3-2. Brandon Gold (9-7) was lifted from the game after six complete innings and saddled with the loss. Crawford (5-0) completed a scoreless seventh and was replaced by Dan Jagiello who struck out the side in the eighth. Jeren Kendall connected with an RBI-single in the eighth and Casey drove in his second run of the game with a ground-out. Casey finished the afternoon 2-for-4 with two RBI in his return from the disabled list. Isaac Anderson came on in the ninth, leading 5-2 and was tasked with his first save opportunity of the season. The right-hander loaded the bases before throwing out Alan Trejo at third and getting Carlos Herrera to ground out and end the game.

CONGRATS, DREW!: With Friday night's 7-4 victory over Lancaster, Quakes manager Drew Saylor broke a 20-year record to become the all-time winningest manager in franchise history. Saylor bested former manager Mike Basso who compiled 223 wins over the 1996, 1997 & 1998 seasons. With 71 wins to his line this year, Saylor has led the Quakes to the best second-half record in all of Minor League Baseball (36-14) and owns 226 career victories during his tenure in Rancho. Saylor has led the Quakes to the California League playoffs in each of his three seasons and is nine wins away from recording just the second 80-win season in franchise history. RINCON'S BIG WEEK: On Monday, outfielder Carlos Rincon was named California League Player of the Week for his offensive onslaught at the plate. Over a six-game stretch (8/6-8/12) Rincon batted .364 with eight hits, six home runs, eight RBI, eight runs and slugged 1.182. The Quakes have locked up three straight league honors with Cody Thomas, Jared Walker and Rincon pulling in player of the week awards over the last three weeks. Rincon's award is Rancho's franchise-best ninth league honor of the season.

SLUGGIN' SANTANA: Infielder Cristian Santana enters Tuesday on a seven-game hitting streak. The Dominican Republic native is also the active team leader with 20 home runs on the season and leads the circuit with 89 runs driven in. Santana is the only player in the California League on pace to finish with over 100 RBI by the end of the season. Santana has homered in five of his last eleven games including a pair in the last home series against Lake Elsinore.

HOME COOKIN': Entering tonight, Rancho has ripped off six wins in a row at home including back-to-back series sweeps of Lake Elsinore and Lancaster. The offense has generated 53 runs over the last six home games, outscoring the opposition 53-20. RECENT ROSTER MOVES: Yesterday RHP Jordan Sheffield was activated from the Disabled List putting Rancho back to 25 active players. Sheffield's last outing for the Quakes was on May 12th. On Saturday, OF Donovan Casey was activated from the DL (wrist). Casey hit just .228 with 3 homers and 14 RBIs in 45 games prior to the injury. On Friday, LHP Julio Urias was added to the Quakes roster on Minor League rehab assignment, while RHP Andre Scrubb was promoted to Double-A Tulsa of the Texas League. UCETA ON THE BUMP: RHP Edwin Uceta is scheduled to make his second start of the season tonight and first against the Storm. Uceta joined the Quakes from Low-A Great Lakes on August 6th and made his Cal League debut August 7th in San Jose. Uceta hurled 98 total pitches and allowed five runs on five hits over 5.2 innings and settled with a no-decision. A native of the Dominican Republic, Uceta signed with the Dodgers as an International Free Agent in the 2016 at the age of 18.

OPPOSING PITCHER: LHP Reggie Lawson is scheduled to make his 19th start of the season for Lake Elsinore tonight and fourth against Rancho Cucamonga. The Quakes routed Lawson his last time at LoanMart Field for a career-worst 11 earned runs on ten hits over 2.1 innings. Over three prior starts and four appearances, Rancho is batting .315 off Lawson with 23 hits and 17 runs scored. The Victorville native was drafted by the Padres with the 71st overall pick in 2016 out of Adelanto High School.

REHABBERS: After Julio Urias's start on Friday, the Quakes have had eight Dodgers join the club as apart of major league rehab assignment this season. LHP Hyun-Jin Ryu and RHP Zac Rosscup both joined the Quakes on August 2nd and combined for five shutout innings. RHP Walker Buehler joined the Quakes for a rehab start on July 3rd. Rich Hill joined the Quakes for a start in Lake Elsinore on 6/14, striking out ten over 4.1 innings. Dodgers INF Justin Turner put on the uniform along with INF Logan Forsythe in a weekend series vs. Visalia (5/12-5/13). Turner was 0-for-6 at the plate while Forsythe finished 1-for-10 with a double during the time in Rancho. Yasiel Puig joined the club on rehab assignment for one game (5/8) in Lake Elsinore. Puig was 0-for-4 at the plate and was removed from the game in the seventh inning.

FIRST-HALF CHAMPS: The Quakes put together an impressive winning stretch over the final three weeks of the first half en route to their first-half championship. Winners of 13 of their final 19 games heading into the All-Star Break while also taking the upper hand in six of the last seven series, Rancho also held the best divisional record in the league over the first half at 26-17. The first-half championship is the third in the Dodger era (2011, 2015, 2018) and first under manager Drew Saylor, sending the Quakes to the California League Playoffs for the fourth consecutive season.

SAYLOR & THE STAFF: The skipper of the Quakes for a third consecutive year is Manager Drew Saylor, who has led the team to the Cal League Playoffs in each of his three seasons. Saylor, whose team went 76-64 last season, is just the third manager in team history to lead the team for three seasons (Mike Basso 1996-1998, Bobby Meacham 2002-2004). The hitting coach is Justin Viele, a Fullerton native who enters his second year with the Dodgers. In 2017, the former Santa Clara Bronco was the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors of the Pioneer League. Taking over pitching coach duties is Connor McGuiness who also enters his second year in the Dodgers' system. Last season, the Arlington, Virginia native worked in the same role for the Great Lakes Loons of the Midwest League, after spending three of the four previous years working for his alma mater, Emory University. The final member of Saylor's staff is assistant coach Petie Montero, another second-year member of the Dodgers' system, who coached in the Dominican Summer League last year.

NINE AND ON TIME: The Quakes completed 69 of their 70 first-half games in nine innings and have played just three extended games all season. The Quakes first needed extras in the 68th contest of the year on June 15th at Inland Empire. The Quakes pulled out a 3-0 victory over the 66ers and are 2-1 in extra inning games after an 8-3 defeat of the Giants in ten innings on July 5th. Rancho is outscoring opponents 9-2 in extra innings this season.

BY THE NUMBERS

The Quakes have homered **27** times over eleven games in the month of August, 14 more than Lancaster (13) for most in the league over the stretch. Rancho has increased their mothly home run totals over all four months of the season: April (29), May (33), June (35), July (43). The club is on pace for over 70 home runs in the month of August. **Multi HR's in Aug:** Estevez (2), Marte (2), Montgomery (2), Yarnall (2), Wong (3), Santana (4), Walker (4), Rincon (6).

Following the strong start to the second-half, the Quakes are within striking distance of just their second **80-win** season in franchise history. Rancho needs to finish 9-11 over the remaining 20 games of the regular season to secure an 80-win season for the first time since 2011. In 2011, the Quakes finished the year 80-60. Rancho has never recorded more than 80 wins in a single season.

Rancho INF **Cristian Santana** leads the California League with **89 RBI** on the season. Santana has brought home 11 runs over his last ten games and driven in a team-leading 22 runs against the Storm this season. Santana has 17 more RBI than Lancaster's Colton Welker who is second in the League with 71.
