TODAY'S GAME: The Quakes continue the final home stand of the regular season with game three of a four-game series against the south division's Inland Empire 66ers (Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim affiliate). The Quakes transform into Los Temblores as part of Copa de la Division, for the final time this season featuring pre-game fun and festivities, including music, food, kids activities and player appearances! Kids can run the bases post-game thanks to Smile Generation.

VS INLAND EMPIRE: Today is the 29th of 30 overall meetings between the two clubs and the 15th of 16 contests at LoanMart Field. Rancho has recorded sweeps in two of the last three series against Inland Empire, a five-gamer the last time the 66ers visited LoanMart Field between 6/29-7/3, and the other, last week in San Bernardino over four games. Rancho is 12-2 against Inland Empire over their last 14 meetings and have not fallen to the 66ers at home since June 9th.

LAST TIME OUT: The Quakes put up 16 runs on Inland Empire for the second time in the last seven days, this time at a 16-2 final. After Cristian Santana and Connor Wong both knocked in runs to start off the first inning, Jared Walker gave Rancho a commanding 6-0 lead with the Quakes' fifth grand slam of the season. Inland Empire crossed a run in both the second and third innings, but that was all the scoring Rancho would allow. Rancho put the game out of reach with four runs in the third and five more in the fourth as Isaac Anderson (10-6) earned the win with five strong innings, allowing two runs (one earned) and striking out eight. Rancho set season-highs with 12 team walks and Jeren Kendall walked in all five plate appearances, one shy of the Cal League record.

ADIOS PELOTA: Carlos Rincon became the second Quake this year to tie the franchise record of three homers in a game, as he blasted a trio in Lancaster on Thursday night. Rylan Bannon hit three in one game (April 18th) this year, also in Lancaster.

POST-SEASON AWARDS: California League Post-Season Awards were announced by the league office on August 21st and for the fourth time in team history, the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes are sporting the league's MVP, as former Quake Rylan Bannon has been voted as the 2018 California League Most Valuable Player. Bannon was also named the league's Rookie of the Year, an award given to a Cal League Player in his first "full" year in pro baseball. It's the second time in as many years that the Quakes have swept both the MVP and ROY awards, as DJ Peters nailed down both those honors in 2017. Over 89 games with the Quakes in 2018, Bannon, the former eighth-round pick out of Xavier in 2017, hit .296 with a league-high 20 homers (at the time of the trade) and 61 RBIs. He also led the league in walks (59) and had an on-base percentage of .402. Gavin Lux (SS), Cody Thomas (OF) and Dustin May (P) were also recognized as Cal League post-season All-Stars.

SECOND HALF CHAMPIONS: With last Thursday's 5-4 win over Lancaster at LoanMart Field, the Quakes clinched the second half championship with an 11-game lead over Lancaster and Inland Empire in the south division. The second half championship is Rancho's first since 2011. This 2018 club is also the first to win back-to-back 1st and 2nd half titles since the 2011 season.

SINGLE SEASON WINS RECORD: With last Sunday's 16-5 win over Inland Empire, the Quakes secured their 81st win of the season and set the franchise's single season wins record. The 2018 Quakes surpass the 2011 ball club that finished the year 80-60. Rancho enters tonight 32 games over the .500 mark (85-53), the third best overall record in minor league baseball behind only the Bowling Green Hot Rods (88-49, Midwest League) and Lakewood BlueClaws (86-50, South Atlantic League).

FINISH STRONG: INF Omar Estevez enters tonight on a 23-game hitting streak, the longest streak in the California League this season, besting JetHawk Colton Welker's previous best 20-game streak. Over the stretch, Estevez is batting .333 (33-for-99) with 20 RBI's and eight multi-hit games. The longest hitting streak by a Quake this season prior to Estevez was Gavin Lux (19 games).

RECENT ROSTER MOVES: On Saturday, LHP Michael Boyle was transferred to Double-A Tulsa of the Texas League and RHP Yimi Garcia was optioned from the Los Angeles Dodgers to Rancho Cucamonga.

MAD MAX: RHP Max Gamboa is scheduled to take the ball for Rancho in his ninth start and first against Inland Empire. He took the loss in his last start on 8/28 in Lancaster, throwing five innings with six runs on ten hits, three of them home runs. Four of his last five starts have been against the playoff-bound JetHawks, faring 1-1 with two no-decisions. The 22-year-old was drafted by the Dodgers in the 18th round out of Pepperdine in 2017 and spent the 2018 season with Single-A Great Lakes where he had a 3-4 record with a 4.22 ERA over 17 appearances until being promoted to Rancho mid-July.

OPPOSING PITCHER: RHP Travis Herrin is scheduled to make his first start this season and third appearance for Inland Empire. He has had one relief appearance against the Quakes on August 24th when he gave up one hit over two innings. The 23-year-old from Indianapolis did not pitch in a game until August of this season because of an injury and. Herrin threw six scoreless innings over four rehab appearances in the Arizona League in August before being assigned to the 66ers on August 24th.

REHABBERS: After Julio Urias's trio of outings, the Quakes have had eight Dodgers join the club as apart of major league rehab assignment this season. LHP Hyun-Jin Ryu and RHP Zac Rosscup both joined the Quakes on August 2nd and combined for five shutout innings. RHP Walker Buehler joined the Quakes for a rehab start on July 3rd. Rich Hill joined the Quakes for a start in Lake Elsinore on 6/14, striking out ten over 4.1 innings. Dodgers INF Justin Turner put on the uniform along with INF Logan Forsythe in a weekend series vs. Visalia (5/12-5/13). Turner was 0-for-6 at the plate while Forsythe finished 1-for-10 with a double during the time in Rancho. Yasiel Puig joined the club on rehab assignment for one game (5/8) in Lake Elsinore. Puig was 0-for-4 at the plate and was removed from the game in the seventh inning.

FIRST-HALF CHAMPS: The Quakes put together an impressive winning stretch over the final three weeks of the first half en route to their first-half championship. Winners of 13 of their final 19 games heading into the All-Star Break while also taking the upper hand in six of the last seven series, Rancho also held the best divisional record in the league over the first half at 26-17. The first-half championship is the third in the Dodger era (2011, 2015, 2018) and first under manager Drew Saylor, sending the Quakes to the California League Playoffs for the fourth consecutive season.

SAYLOR & THE STAFF: The skipper of the Quakes for a third consecutive year is Manager Drew Saylor, who has led the team to the Cal League Playoffs in each of his three seasons. Saylor, whose team went 76-64 last season, is just the third manager in team history to lead the team for three seasons (Mike Basso 1996-1998, Bobby Meacham 2002-2004). The hitting coach is Justin Viele, a Fullerton native who enters his second year with the Dodgers. In 2017, the former Santa Clara Bronco was the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors of the Pioneer League. Taking over pitching coach duties is Connor McGuinness who also enters his second year in the Dodgers' system. Last season, the Arlington, Virginia native worked in the same role for the Great Lakes Loons of the Midwest League, after spending three of the four previous years working for his alma mater, Emory University. The final member of Saylor's staff is assistant coach Petie Montero, another second-year member of the Dodgers' system, who coached in the Dominican Summer League last year.

NINE AND ON TIME: The Quakes completed 69 of their 70 first-half games in nine innings and have played just three extended games all season. The Quakes first needed extras in the 68th contest of the year on June 15th at Inland Empire. The Quakes pulled out a 3-0 victory over the 66ers and are 2-1 in extra inning games after an 8-3 defeat of the Giants in ten innings on July 5th. Rancho is outscoring opponents 9-2 in extra innings this season.

BY THE NUMBERS

53	The Quakes homered 57 times over 28 games in the month of August, 26 more than Lancaster (31) for most in the league. Rancho has increased their monthly home run totals over all four months of the season: April (29), May (33), June (35), July (43). The club is on pace for nearly 60 home runs in the month of August. Multi HR's in Aug: Estevez (5), Marte (2), Casey (3) Thomas (3), Montgomery (4), Yarnall (5), Wong (4), Santana (8), Walker (7), Rincon (14).
83	During his 22-game hitting streak, INF Omar Estevez has been scoring at an exceptional rate and is now holds the league lead in runs scored, surpassing Lancaster's Vince Fernandez with 83 . During his hitting streak, Estevez has scored 21 runs over 22 games since Aug. 7, second most during that stretch only behind fellow teammate Carlos Rincon (26).
31	INF Cristian Santana has excelled this season at the plate against 66ers pitching. Over 23 games against the Hawks, Santana has worked 31 base hits and leads the team with a .310 batting average during the season series. Santana has also knocked in a team-leading 18 runs on the season and also clubbed two home runs against Inland Empire.
