**TODAY'S GAME:** The Quakes continue the California League Championship Series today, facing the Visalia Rawhide (Arizona Diamondbacks Affiliate) in game three of the best-of-five series. The Quakes lead the Championship series 2-0 and have the chance to clinch their third California League title in franchise history tonight. The Quakes 2018 playoff runs is sponsored by U.S. Bank.

**VS VISALIA:** The Quakes and Rawhide square off for their first ever Cal League Championship Series with the remaining three games of the series to take place at LoanMart Field if necessary. Rancho pulled out a come-from-behind 5-4 win in the opener of the series and pulled away convincingly with a 9-3 victory in game two. During the regular season, the Quakes were 1-3 against the Rawhide at LoanMart Field and went 5-6 overall in the season series.

**LAST TIME OUT:** The Quakes took care of business on the road in Visalia locking up a 2-0 Championship Series lead, as Cody Thomas highlighted a 9-3 victory with a go-ahead grand slam at Recreation Park on Wednesday night. The Quakes offense struck for nine runs over a three-inning span after Visalia starter Matt Peacock was removed from the game due to injury. Thomas clubbed the go-ahead grand-slam in the fifth and Cristian Santana scored in the sixth after a lead-off double. The contest was put out of reach in the seventh as Rancho piled on four more runs with a Connor Wong double and a Santana three-run home run to make it 9-1. Will's Montgomerie (1-0) tossed 2.2 scoreless innings behind Dennis Santana and was positioned for the win with the Thomas slam. Logan Salow and Connor Strain combined for 3.1 shutout frames and Austin Hamilton closed the game in the ninth, allowing a pair of runs.

**TITLE DREAMS:** The Quakes are in the California League Championship Series for the fifth time in 26 years, chasing their third league title in franchise history. Rancho's two previous titles were in 1994 over the Modesto A's and in 2015, sweeping the San Jose Giants. The Quakes won their 2015 title on the road in San Jose and have not celebrated a championship on home turf since the 94' season. Visalia has not won a league title since 1978 (40 years) when the Visalia Oaks defeated the Lodi Dodgers, since falling in ten straight championship series. The Rawhide are 2-13 in the Championship Series over their history.

**POST-SEASON AWARDS:** California League Post-Season Awards were announced by the league office on August 21st and for the fourth time in team history, the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes are sporting the league's MVP, as former Quake Rylan Bannon has been voted as the 2018 California League Most Valuable Player. Bannon was also named the league's Rookie of the Year, an award given to a Cal League Player in his first "full" year in pro baseball. It's the second time in as many years that the Quakes have swept both the MVP and ROY awards, as DJ Peters nailed down both those honors in 2017. Over 89 games with the Quakes in 2018, Bannon, the former eighth-round pick out of Xavier in 2017, hit .296 with a league-high 20 homers and 61 RBIs. Gavin Lux (SS), Cody Thomas (OF) and Dustin May (P) were also recognized as Cal League post-season All-Stars.

**SINGLE SEASON WINS RECORD:** Following a 16-5 win over Inland Empire on August 26th, the Quakes secured their 81st win of the season and set the franchise's single season wins record. The 2018 Quakes surpass the 2011 ball club that finished the year 80-60. Rancho ended the year 34-games over the .500 mark (87-53), the third best overall winning percentage in minor league baseball behind only the Bowling Green Hot Rods (90-49, Midwest League) and Lakewood BlueClaws (87-51, South Atlantic League).

**BULLPEN GOT YOUR BACK:** The Quakes bullpen has been at its best during the postseason and tonight, Dodgers relievers John Axford and Tony Cingrani are scheduled to join the Quakes on major league rehab assignment. Rancho's bullpen closed out the South Division finals with 17.1 scoreless innings and in the Championship Series, have allowed three runs and struck out 21 batters over 11 innings. Axford is working back from a right fibula fracture and Cingrani is coming back from a shoulder strain.

**CLUTCH HOME RUNS:** Three key home runs in Visalia pushed the Quakes out to a 2-0 series lead. INF Nick Yarnall clubbed a three-run shot in Game 1 to tie the game on Tuesday night before Jared Walker won the game with a solo homer in the ninth inning. Cody Thomas was the Game 2 hero with a go-ahead grand slam that put Rancho in front 4-1 during the eventual 9-3 victory.

**ANDERSON THE ACE:** RHP Isaac Anderson is scheduled to start game three of the Championship Series for the Quakes, his second appearance of the postseason. Anderson last pitched on 9/6 on the road in the South Division Finals against the Lancaster JetHawks and allowed three runs on seven hits over 4.1 innings in a no-decision. The 25-year-old faced Visalia three times out of the bullpen during the regular season and allowed 14 runs over 6.2 innings with an opponent batting average of .290. The Dodgers picked up Anderson in the 40th round of the 2015 draft out of Wichita State.

**OPPOSING PITCHER:** RHP Connor Grey is scheduled to start game three for the Rawhide, his second appearance of the post-season. Grey pitched on 9/7 in the North Division Finals against Stockton and allowed three runs on six hits over six innings to earn the win. Grey finished the regular season strong, recording a 2.45 ERA in August over five starts and tossing seven shutout innings in September. The 24-year-old squared off with Rancho twice during the regular season and allowed seven runs over nine innings and struck out ten. The Frewsburg, NY native was drafted by the Diamondback in the 20th round of the 2016 draft out of St. Bonaventure.

**REHABBERS:** After Dennis Santana rehab outing on Friday night, the Quakes have had nine Dodgers join the club as apart of major league rehab assignment this season. Julio Urias made three rehab starts with the Quakes towards the end of the regular season. LHP Hyun-Jin Ryu and RHP Zac Rosscup both joined the Quakes on August 2nd and combined for five shutout innings. RHP Walker Buehler joined the Quakes for a rehab start on July 3rd. Rich Hill joined the Quakes for a start in Lake Elsinore on 6/14, striking out ten over 4.1 innings. Dodgers INF Justin Turner put on the uniform along with INF Logan Forsythe in a weekend series vs. Visalia (5/12-5/13). Turner was 0-for-6 at the plate while Forsythe finished 1-for-10 with a double during the time in Rancho. Yasiel Puig joined the club on rehab assignment for one game (5/8) in Lake Elsinore. Puig was 0-for-4 at the plate and was removed from the game in the seventh inning.

**FIRST-HALF CHAMPS:** The Quakes put together an impressive winning stretch over the final three weeks of the first half en route to their first-half championship. Winners of 13 of their final 19 games heading into the All-Star Break while also taking the upper hand in six of the last seven series, Rancho also held the best divisional record in the league over the first half at 26-17. The first-half championship is the third in the Dodger era (2011, 2015, 2018) and first under manager Drew Saylor, sending the Quakes to the California League Playoffs for the fourth consecutive season.

**SAYLOR & THE STAFF:** The skipper of the Quakes for a third consecutive year is Manager Drew Saylor, who has led the team to the Cal League Playoffs in each of his three seasons. Saylor, whose team went 76-64 last season, is just the third manager in team history to lead the team for three seasons (Mike Basso 1996-1998, Bobby Meacham 2002-2004). The hitting coach is Justin Viele, a Fullerton native who enters his second year with the Dodgers. In 2017, the former Santa Clara Bronco was the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors of the Pioneer League. Taking over pitching coach duties is Connor McGuinness who also enters his second year in the Dodgers' system. Last season, the Arlington, Virginia native worked in the same role for the Great Lakes Loons of the Midwest League, after spending three of the four previous years working for his alma mater, Emory University. The final member of Saylor's staff is assistant coach Petie Montero, another second-year member of the Dodgers' system, who coached in the Dominican Summer League last year.

**NINE AND ON TIME:** The Quakes completed 69 of their 70 first-half games in nine innings and have played just four extended games all season. The Quakes first needed extras in the 68th contest of the year on June 15th at Inland Empire. The Quakes pulled out a 3-0 victory over the 66ers. The Quakes are 2-2 in extra inning games after an 8-3 defeat of the Giants in ten innings on July 5th. Rancho is outscored opponents 9-2 in extra innings this season.

## BY THE NUMBERS

<b>57</b>	The Quakes homered <b>57</b> times over 28 games in the month of August, 26 more than Lancaster (31) for most in the league. Rancho has increased their monthly home run totals over all four months of the season: April (29), May (33), June (35), July (43). <b>Multi HR's in Aug:</b> Estevez (5), Marte (2), Casey (3) Thomas (3), Montgomery (4), Yarnall (5), Wong (4), Santana (8), Walker (7), Rincon (14).
<b>23</b>	Rancho pulled in <b>23 road wins</b> during the second half schedule, an improvement over their first-half road record of 19-16. The Quakes won six of ten road series during the second half and went 7-3 over their final ten road contests prior to the postseason.
<b>4</b>	The Quakes finished the regular season 34-games over the .500 mark, clinching the <b>4th</b> consecutive winning season for the franchise and the third straight under manager Drew Saylor. The stretch began with the 2015 Quakes who won a California League Championship and finished the regular season 78-62 under former skipper Bill Hasselman.
<b>25</b>	INF Omar Estevez closed the regular season on a 25-game hitting streak, the longest streak in the California League this season, besting JetHawk Colton Welker's previous best 20-game streak. Over the stretch, Estevez batted .354 (39-for-110) with 24 RBI's and ten multi-hit games. Estevez tied the longest Rancho hitting streak since the turn of the decade when Roberto Lopez hit in 25 straight games during the 2010 season under Angels affiliation.

**3 Jeren Kendall** OF \ L/R \ 6-0 \ 190 \ Clearwater, FL \ Round 1 (2017, LAD) \ Vanderbilt \ @JerenKendall

-Playing in his second season in the Dodgers organization, batted .221 over 35 games with Low-A Great Lakes in 2017  
 -Started as a freshman at Vanderbilt on the 2015 NCAA national runner-up team, was a .309 career hitter with 32 HR's and 152 RBI's  
 -Hit first Grand-Slam of the season for the Quakes on 5/10 at Lake Elsinore...grand slam was also Kendall's first home run of the season.  
 -Picked with the 23rd overall pick by the Dodgers in 2017 and is ranked as the #7 prospect in the Dodgers system by MLB Pipeline.com  
 -Father, Jeremy Kendall played minor league baseball in the Phillies organization.

**5 Cristian Santana** INF \ R/R \ 6-2 \ 175 \ San Cristobal, DR \ International Free Agent, 2014

-Playing in his fourth season in the Dodgers organization, split time in 2017 between short-season Ogden (.537, 10 G) and Great Lakes (.322, 44G)  
 -After being signed, spent three seasons in rookie ball before breakout 2017 earned him off-season promotion to Rancho Cucamonga  
 -Ranked as the #16 overall pre-season prospect in Dodgers system by Baseball America  
 -Named California League Player of the Week on August 20th...over six game stretch (8/13-8/19) batted .429, 3HR's, 12 H, 11 RBI, 5 R.

**6 Brandon Montgomery** INF \ R/R \ 6-0 \ 180 \ Houston, TX \ Round 26 (2016, LAD) \ San Jacinto College \ @BrandonMonty6

-In his third professional season with the Dodgers...began 2018 season with Low-A Great Lakes (.251 avg, 9 HR, 40 RBI, 92 games)...was promoted to Rancho Cucamonga on August 1st.  
 -Spent time with Rancho Cucamonga during the 2017 season (98 games, .252 avg, 87 H, 2 HR, 45 RBI)...voted as Best Teammate of the club.

 -Was a career .302 hitter over three seasons at the University of Pittsburgh...was named Third-Team All-ACC as a Junior

-In his third professional season in the Dodgers system, spent 2017 with Low-A Great Lakes (.242, 71 hits, 53 runs, 4 HR, 28 RBI, 90 games)  
 -Added to the Quakes temporary inactive list on Friday, April 27 then reactivated on April 30th.  
 -Was a .319 career hitter at Virginia Tech...started in all but two games during his time with the Hokies...drafted by Red Sox in 27th round in 2015, did not sign.
