**TODAY'S GAME:** Today's contest is Game No. 39 of the second half and the series opener of a three-game series with the Colorado Rockies' Cal League affiliate, the Lancaster JetHawks. Following this set, the Quakes will continue their six-game, six-day road trip, opening a three-game set against the Visalia Rawhide for their first meeting since May.

**VS LANCASTER:** This is the 12th of 14 meetings at The Hangar and the 23rd of 28 total head-to-head meetings. Times have been tough against the JetHawks in 2019, as the Quakes are just 8-14 versus their South Division foe. In the last meeting between these two ball clubs, Lancaster took three out of four from Rancho.

**CHALK UP A SERIES VICTORY:** In game one of the previous set, the Quakes dominated the Ports with a shutout victory. In game two, Stockton did the dominating with a convincing 7-3 win, forcing a rubber match. In game three of the series, Rancho (63-43, 22-16) erased an early deficit, defeating the Ports (51-55, 18-20) by a final score of 5-2 to take the series. Deacon Liput propelled the offense with a career-best day at the plate, hitting a go-ahead three-run homer in the third and adding another RBI bunt single in the seventh. John Rooney (2-1) headlined the Quakes' solid pitching efforts with a career-best day of his own on the mound, grabbing the win in six innings of work and striking out eight batters. Stockton SP, Brady Feigl (5-7), shouldered the loss, allowing three earned runs in four frames. Melvin Jimenez closed the game out for Rancho, tallying his first save with a scoreless top of the ninth.

**HOW THEY LOOKIN'?:** The Boys in Blue come into this series having taken the aforementioned two out of three from Stockton. However, in their last 14 games, the Quakes have just a 6-8 record. As for Lancaster, after taking game one of their three-game series at Visalia, they were drubbed in game two (14-0) and were edged out in a close game three (4-1). In their last two tilts, the JetHawks were outscored by the Rawhide at 18-1. The back-to-back losses came off of a five-game win streak from Monday to Friday of last week (SJ, LE x3, VIS).

**THOSE PESKY BIRDS:** Rancho has had a tough go with Lancaster in the 2019 campaign, posting an 8-14 record in their first 22 battles. At LoanMart Field, the JetHawks have dominated the Quakes, snatching eight out of the 11 contests. At The Hangar, the competition has been tighter, but Lancaster still leads the charge with six wins in 11 games.

**SIX HEAD-TO-HEADS LEFT:** The Quakes and the JetHawks are set to square off six more times in the regular season with the current three-game series and then another three-game set in Rancho from Tuesday to Thursday of next week.

**NIGHTMARE ON ROCHESTER AVENUE:** The last time these two squads took the field came at LoanMart Field on Sunday, June 30th, as the Quakes were looking for a series win and the JetHawks and were hoping for a series split. Rancho thought they were well on their way to taking three out of four games, due to their 9-3 lead heading into the top of the eighth. Lightning apparently struck the Lancaster offense as they rallied off a nine-run top of the eighth, capped off by a Todd Czinege go-ahead grand slam. The Quakes ended up losing that contest by a final score of 13-9, having to settle for a split.

**DOWN THE STRETCH:** As the Cal League finds itself in the second half of the second half, the standings in both divisions are neck-and-neck. Coming into play on Tuesday, San Jose (20-18), who is 8-2 in their last 10 games, is just one game back of the Rawhide (21-17). In the South, due to a win by both Rancho (22-16) and a loss by Lancaster (21-17) on Sunday, first place is separated by just one game. That fact alone sets up a crucial series between the Quakes and the JetHawks, starting at The Hangar on Tuesday.

**ANDRE JACKSON:** Right-hander Andre Jackson looks to continue his solid run, as he makes his 11th start with the Quakes and fourth start against Lancaster. Jackson has allowed a combined seven earned runs over his last six starts, spanning a total of 30.2 innings. In his last outing, versus Inland Empire, the right-hander allowed one earned run on two hits over five innings, taking his fourth-straight no-decision. The Vail, AZ native struck out six Sixers' hitters, but ended up walking four on the night. He opened the year in Great Lakes of the Midwest League and was named a mid-season All-Star, after going 4-1 with a 2.23 ERA in 10 starts. Last season, Jackson split time between the Arizona League Dodgers (2-0, 3.44 ERA, 4 G) and Great Lakes (1-5, 4.35 ERA, 14 GS). Jackson was selected in the 12th round of the 2017 June Draft out of the University of Utah.

**GARRETT SCHILLING:** The Clawson, MI native, RHP Garrett Schilling, picks up the start for his 19th nod of '19. Schilling has recorded a 8-5 record, accompanied by a 4.20 ERA, that has remained roughly the same since the beginning of June. The right-hander's last start came on July 24th, where he posted a final line of six innings, featuring one earned run on nine hits, with three strikeouts and one freebie. In that start against Lancaster, Schilling corralled the win, as the JetHawks won by a final score of 4-3. Tuesday's start is his seventh start against the Quakes this season. The Rockies drafted Schilling in the 18th round of the 2018 draft.
