TODAY'S GAMES: It's Thirsty Thursday at LoanMart Field, with unbeatable drink specials around the ballpark, for the series finale of the three-game set with the Lancaster JetHawks (Colorado Rockies affiliate). Up next for Rancho on the schedule is the first of two five-game sets. Rancho will head to San Bernardino on Friday to face Inland Empire before they finish off the first-half with another five-gamer against Lake Elsinore, starting on Wednesday, June 12th at home.

VS LANCASTER: This is the 14th of 28 total matchups between the Quakes and the JetHawks in 2019. Thursday night's game is the seventh of 14 games to be played at LoanMart Field. In the regular season last year, Rancho posted a 17-11 record against the JetHawks, going 11-2 at home and 6-9 at Lancaster. So far on the current campaign, the JetHawks hold a three-game advantage over Rancho, winning eight out of the 13 games. On top of that, Lancaster has gathered a dominating 5-1 record at LoanMart Field.

GARRETT "CURT" SCHILLING: The Quakes (34-23) were stymied by JetHawks' (28-29) SP Garrett Schilling on Wednesday night, falling by a final score of 3-1, to force a rubber match on Thursday evening. With no relation to Curt Schilling, the Lancaster right-hander sure pitched like him. Schilling (3-2) pieced together his best start of the '19 season with six scoreless innings, tacking on 10 strikeouts for the second time against Rancho this year. Cal League newcomer and Quakes' SP, Andre Jackson (0-1) pitched well in his debut, but ended up taking the loss. He produced a solid start of six innings of two-run baseball with nine strikeouts of his own. JetHawks' RP Tommy Doyle returned from the Injured List in emphatic fashion, grabbing his eighth save of the year, with a perfect 1.1 innings and four punchouts. Connor Wong (11) provided the only bit of offense for Rancho, blasting a solo shot in the seventh.

WHO WANTS THE CROWN?: With 11 games left in the first half of '19, Rancho holds a five-game lead in the South Division over the Lake Elsinore Storm. Right behind the Storm is Thursday night's opponent, the JetHawks, at six games back. The Quakes' magic number over the Storm is seven, while the magic number over Lancaster is six. The earliest possible date that Rancho could clinch a birth in their fifth-straight postseason is Sunday, June 9th.

HEATIN' UP: As the weather finally starts to feel like summer, the Quakes are playing some of their best baseball entering into the month of June. They have won three out of their first four games this month, smashing eight home runs in those four games. To kick off '19, Rancho posted back-to-back winning months with first-year manager, Mark Kertenian, at the helm. In 26 games in April, the Quakes posted a 16-10 record, while in 27 games in May, the Quakes finished just a tick below at 15-12. Rancho has never lost, nor won, more than four games in a row this season. Furthermore, the Boys in Blue are 17-5 following a loss.

FUTURE-FUTURE DODGERS: On day one of the MLB Draft on Monday, June 3rd, the Dodgers selected three names that could once don the Rancho uni. With a pair of first round selections, the Dodgers selected INF Kody Hoese (Tulane) at No. 25 and INF Michael Busch (North Carolina) at No. 31. Their final choice on day one was RHP Jimmy Lewis out of Lake Travis High School (TX). Hoese (Hose-ee), the Griffith, IN native and first pick by Los Angeles, hit .391 in his junior year at Tulane, with 23 HRs and 61 RBI.

GERARDO CARRILLO: The Mexico native, RHP Gerardo Carrillo, will take the ball for Rancho in the series finale for his 10th start of '19. Carrillo has posted a 2-3 record, accompanied by a 5.88 ERA so far in his third pro season. The last appearance for Carrillo, on May 31st, resulted in a loss, as he surrendered five runs (four earned) in 4.1 innings in an eventual 6-2 defeat to Inland. The right-hander has faced the JetHawks three times this year, surrendering a combined 12 earned runs in a combined 11.2 innings. Struggling with command this year, Carrillo has walked 29 batters in a 41.1 total innings. The Dodgers inked Carrillo as an IFA on July 5, 2016.

ANTONIO SANTOS: The DR native, RHP Antonio Santos, picks up the start for Lancaster for his 11th nod of 2019. Santos has recorded a 4.59 ERA with a 1-3 record in 51 innings, giving up 31 runs (26 earned) on 68 hits. The right-hander's last start came on May 31st against Stockton, where he posted a final line of 1.2 innings that featured six runs (three earned) on six hits. The JetHawks' pitching staff allowed a plethora of runs in that game, as Lancaster fell by a final score of 13-8. Santos will toe the slab against the Quakes for the fourth time tonight. The Rockies signed Santos as an International Free Agent on July 2, 2015.

REHAB STINT COMPLETE: On Tuesday, Dodgers' catcher, Austin Barnes, was officially added to the Rancho roster on a Major League Rehab Assignment, presented by San Manuel Casino. He went 2-for-5 with an RBI, a walk and a run scored in the brief two games he spent with the Quakes. Barnes caught five innings on Tuesday and seven innings on Wednesday, and is set to join the Dodgers in San Francisco on Friday. The Riverside, CA native has caught in the last two World Series for Los Angeles.

ROSTER MOVES: On Wednesday, RHP Michael Grove was transferred to XST in Arizona as RHP Sven Schueller was brought back from XST. On Tuesday, RHP Edwin Uceta was promoted to AA Tulsa, as RHP Andre Jackson was promoted from Great Lakes.
