**Lake Elsinore Storm (34-33)**

**RANCHO CUCAMONGA QUAKES (41-26)**

**RHP Elliot Ashbeck (2-0, 2.31 ERA) vs. RHP Gerardo Carrillo (2-4, 6.38 ERA)**

**TODAY'S GAME:** Today's matchup with the Lake Elsinore Storm (San Diego Padres affiliate) represents the fifth and final game of the series as well as the end of the first half, with first pitch set for 2:05 PM. Happy Father's Day to all the dads! 1,500 fans through the gates will take home a free set of Quakes Baseball Cards and Kids will "Run the Bases" after the game, thanks to Smile Generation!

**VS LAKE ELSINORE:** This is the 15th of 30 total meetings between the Quakes and the Storm this season and the ninth of 15 games to be played at LoanMart Field. In the regular season last year, Rancho posted a 21-10 record against the Storm, going 11-6 at home and 10-4 at Lake Elsinore. The prowess has continued into 2019, as the Quakes have snatched 10 wins out of the 14 total tilts.

**BACK-TO-BACK W'S:** In front of roughly 4,400 fans, the Quakes (40-26) defeated the Storm (34-33) by the final score of 8-3 on Saturday night. Coming off a walk-off win on Friday night, Rancho used that momentum, paired with early-and-often offense and solid pitching throughout the game, to move their record to 10-4 against the Storm in 2019. The Rancho offense produced at least one run in their first five offensive frames, throwing up a two-spot in three out of those five innings. After Lake Elsinore made it a 3-2 ballgame in the third via a pair of RBI doubles, the bats managed to go on a 5-1 run the rest of the way to put the comeback effort at bay. Andre Jackson made his third start, fighting through 4.1 innings, as he surrendered two earned runs with six strikeouts. Grabbing the win on Saturday night via official scorer's decision was Connor Mitchell (2-1), who threw two scoreless innings, giving up just one hit. Taking the loss for Lake Elsinore was starter, Reiss Knehr (0-1), as he walked four batters in just one inning of work.

**LONG BALL, WE MISSED YOU:** After failing to homer in Friday night's win, snapping a 12-game streak, Rancho got back to their home run hitting ways in Saturday's victory. Jeren Kendall (5), Jeter Downs (12) and Nick Yarnall (7) all left the yard in the solo home run variety. During their 14 games in June, the Quakes have hit 24 jacks.

**KINGS OF THE SOUTH:** Rancho grabbed the South Division's crown on the strength of a 39-24 (now 40-26) record through their first 63 games of the season, clinching this past Tuesday. First year skipper, Mark Kertenian, led the ball club to back-to-back winning months in April (16-10) and May (15-12), and is now off to a 10-4 start in the month of June. The Quakes need just four more victories in their final 12 games of this month to clinch their third straight winning month.

**STARS OF THE SHOW:** On Friday, June 7th, the California League announced All-Stars for the North and South Division, with seven Rancho Cucamonga Quakes voted to the mid-season squad. Starting will be Jeter Downs (SS) and Devin Mann (3B), while Connor Wong (C), Donovan Casey (OF), Logan Salow (RP) and Wills Montgomerie (RP) are expected to come off the bench. Edwin Uceta, who was promoted to AA Tulsa in May, was named to the team, but will not play due to the promotion. The 2019 All-Star Game will be held at San Manuel Stadium in San Bernardino on Tuesday, June 18th. Tickets are available at IE66ers.com.

**REPPIN' RC IN THE DERBY:** It was officially announced on Friday that Connor Wong, one of six Quakes set to play in the All-Star Game on Tuesday, June 18th, will participate in the Home Run Derby. Wong is tied for second in the Cal League with 12 home runs.

**GERARDO CARRILLO:** RHP Gerardo Carrillo takes the mound on Sunday for his 12th career start in Rancho uniform. Carrillo comes into this start with an 2-4 record and a 6.38 ERA so far. The right-hander's last appearance came on June 11th, where Rancho topped the Inland Empire 66ers, winning by a final score of 7-5. Carrillo, in one of his better outings of the campaign, went four innings, surrendering two runs on six hits, with six strikeouts and two free-passes. Sunday evening's start for the Guadalajara, Jalisco, Mexico native marks his first career start against the Storm. In his only appearance against Lake Elsinore, Carrillo piggy-backed rehabber Rich Hill at The Diamond on April 17th, going 4.2 innings in long relief for his first win of the season. Carrillo was signed by the Dodgers as an International Free Agent at the age of 17.

**ELLIOT ASHBECK:** As for the Storm, RHP Elliot Ashbeck makes just his his third start, but his 19th overall appearance of the season on Sunday. With a 2-0 record and a 2.31 ERA, the right-hander has been one of the more reliable arms for the Storm. The normal bullpenner's last outing was his second start of the year, coming on June 9th, where he threw 4.1 innings, surrendering three earned runs to the Lancaster JetHawks' offense. Ashbeck's only other start of the year came on May 15th at Stockton, as he tossed two scoreless innings, paired with four punchouts. The Quakes have seen Ashbeck a hand-full of times out of the pen, as this outing will mark the fourth time they have seen him in '19. Ashbeck was selected out of Bradley University in the 16th round of the 2015 draft.

**ROSTER MOVES:** On Thursday, the Quakes placed LHP Leo Crawford, who threw four innings on Wednesday, on the Injured List. Taking Crawford's spot on the active roster was Thursday's starting pitcher Michael Grove, who has been on the Extended Spring Training roster for the last few weeks.
