TODAY'S GAME: Tonight is the second game of a seven-game home stand and game two of a four-game set against the Colorado Rockies' affiliate, the Lancaster JetHawks. Tonight is Cody Bellinger Bobblehead Giveaway, as 1,500 fans through the gates take home a Cody Bellinger Bobblehead, thanks to Smile Generation. Tonight's game is SOLD OUT!...thank you Quakes fans!

VS LANCASTER: This is the ninth of 14 meetings at LoanMart Field and the 20th of 28 total head-to-head meetings. Times have been tough here at home against the JetHawks, as the Quakes got swept in early-April in a four-game set, but hopefully last night's win continues to set the tone and they can improve upon their 2-6 mark here at home. Last weekend, Rancho dropped three of four at Lancaster and are just 5-6 at The Hangar this year.

BACK IN THE WIN COLUMN: After getting shut down for 22 straight innings, the Quakes' offense rebounded nicely in the third inning of last night's game, smashing three homers, scoring five times and then going on the rest of the way to post 10 total runs and 13 hits in a convincing 10-2 win over the Lancaster JetHawks in the opening game of the four-game set. Devin Mann (16) and Jeren Kendall opened the third with back-to-back home runs, with Kendall popping two on the night (7,8). Jordan Procyshen (3) also went deep for Rancho. Deacon Liput and Niko Hulsizer each had three hits on the night. Josiah Gray (5-0) impressed on the mound, allowing just one run (solo homer to Luis Castro) on four hits over seven innings, with eight strikeouts and no walks. Lancaster starter Garrett Schilling (4-4) took the loss for the JetHawks, allowing six runs (five earned) on eight hits over five innings.

MULTIPLE MULTI-HOMERS: Jeren Kendall became the third Quake in the last week to record a multi-homer game, joining Devin Mann (June 23rd) and Donovan Casey (June 21st) who also did it versus Lancaster last week at The Hangar. Rancho continues to lead the league in round-trippers, smashing 98 in just 76 games. Lancaster is second in the league, with 83 in 76 games.

LIPUT REAL GOOD: Deacon Liput collected three hits last night, giving him a pair of three-hit games this week (Monday in Lake Elsinore). Liput is enjoying his best month of the year (.313, 20-for-86) and is hitting .371 since the All-Star Break.

KENDALL COMIN' ROUND: Jeren Kendall's multi-homer game last night was his first of the year, but he's been putting the ball in play much better over recent weeks. Despite hitting just .215 overall, his on-base percentage is .328, as he's walked 25 times in 174 plate appearances.

"HULK"-SIZER: For the first time in Rancho blue on Monday, Niko Hulsizer hit his first "hulk smash" of the year. The six-foot-two, 225-pounder scorched an Elliot Ashbeck pitch over the left-field wall for three runs on one swing, highlighting the Quakes' four-run top of the fifth. The swat not only served as the game-winning hit in game one, but also as Hulsizer's 16th total HR of the season.

Hulsizer made his LoanMart Field debut last night and collected three hits, his first three-hit game and just his second multi-hit game as a Quake. He's now batting .320 over his first six games since coming up from Great Lakes.

FUTURE'S BRIGHT: Gavin Lux and Dustin May, who both played for Rancho's 2018 championship team, were both recently promoted to Triple-A this week. Today they received more good news, as they were both selected to play in the annual SiriusXM Futures Game, to be held on Sunday, July 7th in Cleveland. Congrats to two future Dodgers!

ANDRE JACKSON: Making his fifth start in a Rancho uniform and already his third against Lancaster. Against the JetHawks in two prior appearances, Jackson is 0-1 with a 6.52 ERA, allowing seven runs on eight hits over 9.2 innings. In last outing overall, took a no-decision at Lancaster, allowing five earned runs on four hits over 3.2 innings on June 23rd. Opened the year in Great Lakes and was named a Midwest League mid-season All-Star, going 4-1 with a 2.23 ERA over ten starts. In 2018, made 14 starts for Great Lakes, going 1-5 with a 4.35 ERA. Played collegiately at Utah and was drafted by the Dodgers in the 12th round of the 2017 draft.

RYAN ROLISON: Making his 12th start of the season for Lancaster and his fifth against Rancho. In four prior starts vs the Quakes, is 0-1 with a 5.32 ERA, allowing 14 runs (13 earned) on 22 hits over 22 innings. Opened 2019 in the South Atlantic League and went 2-1 with a 0.61 ERA in three starts. In 2018, went 0-1 with a 1.86 ERA over nine starts (29 innings) for Grand Junction of the Pioneer League. Was drafted out of the University of Mississippi in the first round in 2018 by Colorado.

ROSTER MOVES: The Quakes made six total transactions on Friday. Leaving Rancho for Double-A Tulsa is bullpen ace and Cal League All-Star Logan Salow, which is no surprise. Salow was 2-0 in 27 games with a miniscule ERA of just 1.47, collecting 71 strikeouts in just 43 innings. Also heading out is catcher Jordan Procyshen, who joins Salow in Tulsa. Hitting the Injured List for the Quakes is lefty Connor Mitchell. Joining the Rancho roster is catcher Ramon Rodriguez and LHP Darien Nunez, who both join the team from Ogden of the Pioneer League. RHP Brett de Geus also joins the club from Great Lakes of the Midwest League.
