**TODAY'S GAME:** Tonight is the third game of a seven-game home stand and game three of a four-game set against the Colorado Rockies' affiliate, the Lancaster JetHawks. Tonight is U.S. Bank Hat Giveaway, as 1,500 fans through the gates take home a nifty grey Quakes cap, thanks to U.S. Bank. Everyone will also enjoy a spectacular Fireworks Display after the game, also thanks to U.S. Bank. The Quakes finish the series on Sunday, but continue their home stand against Lake Elsinore Storm on Monday for three more games.

**VS LANCASTER:** This is the 10th of 14 meetings at LoanMart Field and the 21st of 28 total head-to-head meetings. Times have been tough here at home against the JetHawks, as the Quakes got swept in early-April in a four-game set, but hopefully Thursday and Friday night's wins continues to set the tone and they can improve upon their 3-6 mark here at home.

**WIN IN FRONT OF SELLOUT CROWD:** For the first time in the second half, the Quakes (45-32, 4-5) recorded back-to-back wins, thanks to a 5-2 victory over the JetHawks (39-38, 5-4) on Friday night. Andre Jackson (1-1) was tabbed for his first career California League win, as he tossed 5.1 innings, with one earned run and nine strikeouts. Ryan Rolison (2-4) shouldered the loss, as he gave up six runs (five earned) on seven hits. Three out of those seven hits left the yard, as Deacon Liput (1st), Jeter Downs (13th) and Niko Hulsizer (2nd) all took Rolison deep. Sven Schueller excelled out of the Rancho bullpen in a scoreless 1.2 innings to finish the game, recording his second save of the year.

**CENTURY MARK IN DINGERS:** Deacon Liput, who collected three hits on Thursday night, gave a sellout crowd something to cheer for early by smashing a two-run shot, two batters into the bottom of the first. That long ball was No. 99 for the team on the 2019 campaign. Just two innings later, Jeter Downs sent a ball into orbit for home run No. 100 on the year, as the Quakes found the century mark. With Hulsizer's additional long ball, Rancho now has 101 on the year and 303 homers in the last two seasons.

**"HULK SMASH" AT HOME:** For the first time in Rancho blue on Monday, Niko Hulsizer hit his first "hulk smash" of the year. The six-foot-two, 225-pounder scorched a pitch over the The Diamond's left-field wall for three runs on one swing, highlighting a Quakes' four-run top of the fifth. Hulsizer made his LoanMart Field debut on Thursday, collecting three hits, only to back that up on Friday with his first long ball in front of the LoanMart faithful. Hulsizer's solo shot in the sixth on Friday left his bat at 111 mph and traveled 427 feet to straight-away center field.

**MULTIPLE MULTI-HOMERS:** On Thursday, Jeren Kendall became the third Quake in the last week to record a multi-homer game, joining Devin Mann (June 23rd) and Donovan Casey (June 21st), who also did it versus Lancaster last week at The Hangar.

**DE-LUX AND D-MAY:** Gavin Lux and Dustin May, who both played for Rancho's 2018 championship team, were both recently promoted to Triple-A this week. Today they received more good news, as they were both selected to play in the annual SiriusXM Futures Game, to be held on Sunday, July 7th in Cleveland. Congrats to two future Dodgers!

**LEO CRAWFORD:** The Puerto Cabezas, Nicaragua native, LHP Leo Crawford toes the slab for Rancho on Saturday night, making his 10th start and 13th overall appearance on the year. In 2019, Crawford has pitched to a 2-3 record with a 4.01 ERA. Crawford's first start of the second half came on June 24th against Lake Elsinore, as he tossed seven innings with four runs (three earned) and three strikeouts. In an eventual 10-6 victory for the Quakes, the southpaw earned the win and finished his start with four scoreless frames. Crawford, in two previous appearances against Lancaster (one start, one relief) has allowed three earned runs in eight innings. The Los Angeles Dodgers inked Crawford as an international free agent on December 15, 2014.

**ANTONIO SANTOS:** The Villa Gonzalez, DR native, RHP Antonio Santos will hurl the baseball tonight for the JetHawks for his 15th start of 2019. In his 14 starts this season, Santos has an even 3-3 record with a 4.32 ERA. The right-hander's last appearance came on June 24th against Inland Empire, where he took a no-decision in six innings, surrendering five earned runs on five hits. Lancaster eventually won that contest, thanks to a six-run top of the ninth inning, by a final score of 8-7. Santos start against Rancho tonight marks his fifth outing against the Boys in Blue. His record against the Quakes is 1-0, while he sports a 3.57 ERA. The Colorado Rockies signed Santos as an international free agent on July 2, 2015.

**ROSTER MOVES:** The Quakes made six total transactions on Friday. Leaving Rancho for Double-A Tulsa is bullpen ace and Cal League All-Star Logan Salow, which is no surprise. Salow was 2-0 in 27 games with a miniscule ERA of just 1.47, collecting 71 strikeouts in just 43 innings. Also heading out is catcher Jordan Procyshen, who joins Salow in Tulsa. Hitting the Injured List for the Quakes is lefty Connor Mitchell. Joining the Rancho roster is catcher Ramon Rodriguez and LHP Darien Nunez, who both join the team from Ogden of the Pioneer League. RHP Brett de Geus also joins the club from Great Lakes of the Midwest League.
