RANCHO CUCAMONGA QUAKES (22-15) AT Lancaster JetHawks (21-16)



RHP Gerardo Carrillo (1-2, 4.30 ERA) vs. LHP Lucas Gilbreath (2-0, 3.18 ERA)

TODAY'S GAME: Today is the opening game of a four-game road series between the Quakes and the Colorado Rockies Cal League affiliate, the Lancaster JetHawks. On Friday, the Quakes will head back home, opening a three-game set against the Modesto Nuts, as part of a six-game, seven-day home stand.

VS LANCASTER: This is the fifth of 28 total meetings between the Quakes and the JetHawks this season and the first of 14 games to be played at The Hangar. The JetHawks swept a four-game series at LoanMart Field. In the regular season last year, Rancho posted a 17-11 record against the JetHawks, going 11-2 on their home turf and 6-9 at Lancaster. However, so far this season, the JetHawks have the Quakes number. In their first three matchups, the JetHawks have won all three by final scores of 9-8, 8-4, and 7-6, respectively.

TOUGH NINTH ON SUNDAY: The Quakes roared back from a 6-1 deficit, only to give up four in the ninth inning, as the Visalia Rawhide pulled out an 11-7 win over Rancho on Sunday afternoon at LoanMart Field. The Rawhide capitalized on an error in the eighth to tie the game, then utilized two ninth-inning Quake errors to score four times and take the lead for good, giving them two of three in the series. Rancho reliever Max Gamboa (2-1) suffered the tough-luck loss, while Visalia reliever Breckin Williams (1-0). Rancho got two RBIs each from Brayan Morales and Donovan Casey. Jordan Procyshen had two hits, including his first homer in a Rancho uniform.

SERIES STREAK OVER: The Visalia win yesterday gave them two of three in the series and stopped Rancho's streak of four straight series win. The Quakes have only lost two series this year, both at home (Lancaster and Visalia). They have split one road series (Inland Empire), but have won every other series so far this year, giving them a series-record of 8-2-1.

TRUST THE PROCYS-HEN: Catcher Jordan Procyshen has been with the team all year, but has been on the Injured List and primarily acted as the bullpen catcher. That all changed on Saturday, when he was activated for the first time this year and immediately got in the act, going 2-for-3 with an RBI. On Sunday, he belted his first home run of the year and had two more hits, making him 4-for-7 with two RBIs in two games. Procyshen only had 11 homers in his five-year pro-career prior to yesterday.

BLUE CHIPS IN RANCHO: Andrew Friedman and the rest of the Dodgers' braintrust made a "blockbuster" trade this past December by sending four players, including the beloved former Quake, Yasiel Puig, to the Cincinnati Reds for RHP Homer Bailey and two blue chip prospects. Bailey has since been released and now those two blue chip prospects call Rancho Cucamonga their home for the time being. With the official promotion of RHP Josiah Gray on Saturday, both Gray (No. 17 Dodgers' prospect) and Jeter Downs (No. 7 Dodgers' prospect) reside on the same roster as they try to prove why the Dodgers' brass traded for them just a few months ago.

JETHAWKS HOVERING: After a loss on April 14th to Lancaster in what completed a four-game sweep, the Quakes stood at a 5-6 record. Since that defeat, Rancho has won 16 out of its last 24 games, holding a first-place standing in the Cal League South Division since April 18th. However, the Quakes are 3-4 in their last seven games. And now the JetHawks, winners of five of their last six, are just one game back of the Quakes' South Division lead. The recent trends for both Rancho and Lancaster are setting up the four-game series at The Hangar, to be the biggest series of the first half so far. The Quakes will come back to Lancaster next week for a three-game set, then will host the JetHawks in June, in an important three-game set at LoanMart Field.

GERARDO CARRILLO: Right-hander Gerardo Carrillo will make his seventh appearance and sixth start of the year, his second against the JetHawks. In his only start against Lancaster, he took the loss, allowing three runs on three hits over 1.2 innings on April 12th. In his last start overall, allowed just one unearned run on one hit over four innings with four walks and five strikeouts in a no-decision against Inland Empire on May 8th. Last season, Carrillo went 2-1 with a 1.65 ERA over nine starts at Great Lakes and 2-0 in four games (one start) with an ERA of just 0.82 for the Arizona League Dodgers. Carrillo signed with the Dodgers in 2016.

LUCAS GILBREATH: Lefty Lucas Gilbreath will toe the rubber for his eighth start of the year and second against the Quakes. In his only outing against Rancho, he allowed two runs on three hits with four walks and seven punches over 3.2 innings in a no-decision on April 12th. In his last start overall, allowed three runs (two earned) on eight hits over seven innings in a no-decision versus Stockton on May 8th. Last year, he went 7-8 with a 5.04 ERA in 26 games (21 starts) for Asheville of the Sally League. Gilbreath was drafted in the seventh round out of the University of Minnesota in 2017.

ROSTER MOVES: Earlier today, lefty Justin Bruhl was transferred to Extended Spring Training. Right-hander Sven Schueller was activated from the Injured List. Yesterday, Rancho activated Sunday's starting pitcher, LHP Bryan Warzek, off the Extended Spring Training roster, transferring Saturday's standout reliever, LHP Victor Gonzalez, to the Extended Spring Training roster.
