RANCHO CUCAMONGA QUAKES (23-15)

AT

Lancaster JetHawks (21-17)

LHP Leo Crawford (0-2, 6.11 ERA) vs. RHP Ryan Rolison (2-0, 1.52 ERA)

TONIGHT'S GAME: Tonight's tilt between the Quakes and the Lancaster JetHawks (Colorado Rockies affiliate) marks the 39th game of 2019 and the second of the current four-game series, set for a 7:05PM first pitch. Rancho and Lancaster will see one another next weekend for another series at The Hangar, this time a three-game set. Up next for the Quakes is a three-gamer at LoanMart Field against the North Division Modesto Nuts for their second meeting of the year.

VS LANCASTER: This is the sixth of 28 total meetings between the Quakes and the JetHawks this season and the second of 14 games to be played at The Hangar. In the regular season last year, Rancho posted a 17-11 record against the JetHawks, going 11-2 on their home turf and 6-9 at Lancaster. However, so far this season, the JetHawks have the Quakes number, winning the first four out of five matchups. Rancho got their first victory of 2019 over the JetHawks in Monday night's contest.

PIVOTAL VICTORY: The Quakes (23-15) notched a pivotal win over the JetHawks (21-17) by a final score of 7-3 on Monday night to extend their lead in the South Division standings to two games. Offensively, Nick Yarnall led the charge for Rancho as he filled the stat sheet. The former Pitt Panther went 2-for-3 with three RBI, a two-run homer, a walk and a triple. On the mound, Quakes' SP Gerardo Carrillo (2-2) racked up his second win with one of his better performances on the 2019 campaign. Carrillo finished a season-high six innings of work, working around six hits and three earned runs, tallying seven strikeouts. JetHawks' SP Lucas Gilbreath (2-1) shouldered his first defeat of 2019 as the Rancho offense tagged the lefty for six earned runs across 5.2 innings. Wes Helsabeck hurled the final three innings, following Carrillo's six frames, recording the rare three-inning save for his second of the year. The southpaw impressed by keeping Lancaster off the scoreboard, allowing just two hits and punching out five batters.

TRUST THE PROCYS-HEN: Catcher Jordan Procysen has been with the team all year, but has been on the Injured List and primarily acted as the bullpen catcher. That all changed on Saturday, when he was activated for the first time this year and immediately got in the act, going 2-for-3 with an RBI. On Sunday, he belted his first home run of the year and had two more hits, making him 4-for-7 with two RBIs in two games. Procysen only had 11 homers in his five-year pro-career prior to yesterday.

BLUE CHIPS IN RANCHO: Andrew Friedman and the rest of the Dodgers' braintrust made a "blockbuster" trade this past December by sending four players, including the beloved former Quake, Yasiel Puig, to the Cincinnati Reds for RHP Homer Bailey and two blue chip prospects. Bailey has since been released and now those two blue chip prospects call Rancho Cucamonga their home for the time being. With the official promotion of RHP Josiah Gray on Saturday, both Gray (No. 17 Dodgers' prospect) and Jeter Downs (No. 7 Dodgers' prospect) reside on the same roster as they try to prove why the Dodgers' brass traded for them just a few months ago.

JETHAWKS HOVERING: After a loss on April 14th to Lancaster in what completed a four-game sweep, the Quakes stood at a 5-6 record. Since that defeat, Rancho has won 17 out of its last 25 games, holding a first-place standing in the Cal League South Division since April 18th. However, the Quakes are 4-4 in their last eight games. And now the JetHawks, winners of five of their last seven, are just two games back of the Quakes' South Division lead. The recent trends for both Rancho and Lancaster are setting up the current four-game series at The Hangar to be the biggest series of the first half so far. The Quakes will come back to Lancaster next week for a three-game set, then will host the JetHawks in June, in another important three-game set at LoanMart Field.

LEO CRAWFORD: The Puerto Cabezas, Nicaragua native, LHP Leo Crawford, makes his fifth start of 2019 on Tuesday night. The last start for Crawford came in a no-decision in a 1-0 loss against the Inland Empire 66ers for the Rancho ballclub. He tossed five innings of scoreless baseball, with one hit, one walk and four strikeouts. As Crawford is set to make his sixth career start against Lancaster, he brings in a 6.11 ERA in 2019 with 12 earned in 17.2 innings of work. The southpaw has been up and down this year, yet, he is amidst his best stretch of pitching, not allowing a run in his last three appearances. The Dodgers signed Crawford as an International Free Agent on December 15, 2014.

RYAN ROLISON: The Jackson, TN native, RHP Ryan Rolison receives the nod for Lancaster for his eighth overall start of the year. Rolison has been spectacular in four starts for the JetHawks in 2019, recording a 1.52 ERA in 23.2 innings with four earned runs on 22 hits. The right-hander also made three starts for Class A Asheville, notching a 0.61 ERA in 14.2 innings of work. The Colorado Rockies used their first round draft pick on Rolison in last year's draft.

ROSTER MOVES: On Monday, May 10th, lefty Justin Bruihl was transferred to Extended Spring Training as the right-hander, Sven Schueller, was activated from the Injured List.
