RANCHO CUCAMONGA QUAKES (28-19) AT Lancaster JetHawks (25-22)

TODAY'S GAME: Today is the final game of a three-game road series between the Quakes and the Colorado Rockies Cal League affiliate, the Lancaster JetHawks. Following an off-day on Monday, the Quakes will continue their road trip, opening a three-game set with a doubleheader matchup on Tuesday versus the Lake Elsinore Storm at The Diamond.

VS LANCASTER: This is the 11th of 28 total meetings between the Quakes and the JetHawks this season and the seventh of 14 games to be played at The Hangar. Despite winning three out of four in their last series (5/13-5/16), the Quakes are just 4-6 against Lancaster this year, as the JetHawks got off to a quick start, sweeping a four-game series at LoanMart Field in early-April. In the regular season last year, Rancho posted a 17-11 record against the JetHawks, going 11-2 on their home turf and 6-9 at Lancaster.

NAIL-BITER GOES QUAKES WAY: The Quakes (28-19) edged the JetHawks (25-22) by a final score of 4-3 on Saturday night to force a rubber-game on Sunday afternoon. The game was won in the bottom of the ninth inning when Rancho's closer for the night, Logan Salow, stranded Lancaster's Matt Hearn at third base with no outs. With the Quakes leading by the slimmest of margins at 4-3 entering the bottom of the ninth, Hearn began the inning with a double, advancing to third on a wild pitch a few pitches later. Salow bared down, inducing back-to-back groundouts on a brought-in Rancho infield and then punched out Casey Golden to finish the ballgame off. Offensively, Donovan Casey and Starling Heredia led the way. Casey hit a solo shot in the fourth, his sixth of the year, while Heredia notched two run-scoring doubles, including the game-winner in the top of the eighth inning.

BACK UP TO THREE: The dramatic and pivotal victory on Saturday night for the Quakes bumped their divisional lead back up to three games. Lancaster has been hovering in second place for quite some time now, never holding a share of first place at any point in 2019. Rancho moved into a first-place tie on April 17th and has been alone in first since they were 10-8 on April 18th. Following this three-game set, the Quakes will welcome the JetHawks to LoanMart Field from June 4th to June 6th for another pivotal three-gamer just prior to the end of the first half. Also within striking distance is Lake Elsinore, who are just 3.5 games back of first, having won four games in a row and eight of their last 10 games. The Quakes' next opponent just so happens to be the Storm, starting on Tuesday.

SHOOTING STARLING: For a guy who had not recorded a hit since May 16th, Starling Heredia broke out in a big way on Saturday night, going 3-for-4 with two doubles and two RBI. Even though Heredia had been desperate for a hit in the last week-plus, the DR native has been productive as of late with seven RBI in his last eight games.

STARTING ARMS STREAKING: Over their last ten games, the Rancho starting pitching staff has recorded a 3.00 ERA (15 ER in 51 innings). During this stretch, not one Quakes' starter has allowed more than three earned runs in an outing.

BYE BYE BASEBALL: The Quakes have smashed 52 homers in 47 games this season, the best mark in all of the Cal League by 12. Next on that list is Lancaster (40), who leads the league in hitting at .270. Rancho has blasted eight home runs in their five games at The Hangar, homering in four out of those five games. They clubbed a franchise-best 202 last season.

LOOKING TO STRING SOME TOGETHER: After posting a 16-10 record in the month of April, with two different win streaks of four games, the Quakes are playing to a 12-9 record so far in the month of May. Rancho has yet to win more than two games in a row in this current month, playing to a 4-3 record in their last 7 games.

GERARDO CARRILLO: The Mexico native, RHP Gerardo Carrillo, will take the ball for Rancho in the series finale for his eighth start of 2019. Carrillo has posted a 2-2 record accompanied by a 4.64 ERA so far in his third professional season. The last appearance for Carrillo, on May 18th, resulted in a no-decision, as he surrendered four runs (three earned) in four innings in an eventual 9-4 victory over Modesto. The right-hander faced the JetHawks on May 13th in what proved to be his best start of the campaign, tossing six innings of three-run baseball with seven strikeouts and one walk. The Dodgers inked Carrillo as an IFA on July 5, 2016.

ANTONIO SANTOS: The DR native, RHP Antonio Santos, picks up the start for Lancaster for his ninth nod of 2019. Santos has recorded a 3.65 ERA with a 1-2 record in 44.1 innings, giving up 19 runs (18 earned) on 53 hits. The right-hander's last start came on May 16th against the Quakes, where he posted a final line of six innings that featured just one earned run on eight hits, with three strikeouts and no freebies. The JetHawks' bullpen and defense faltered late, ridding Santos' chance of grabbing a win, as the Quakes scored six runs in the final three innings to win 7-2. The Rockies signed Santos as an International Free Agent on July 2, 2015.

ROSTER MOVES: On Friday, May 24th, C Jordan Procyshen was activated off the Injured List, with C Ramon Rodriguez sent back to XST in AZ. On Thursday, May 23rd, RHP Ryan Moseley was promoted to AA Tulsa as OF Jeren Kendall was activated from the IL. On Wednesday, May 22nd, INF Brandon Montgomery was placed on the IL as INF Deacon Liput was activated from the IL.
