#### Last game:

MANCHESTER, NH --- One night after being held to just three hits, the Thunder (12-9) offense matched their season-high for runs in a game in their 10-6 victory over the New Hampshire Fisher Cats (13-7) on Saturday night at Northeast Delta Dental Stadium.

Eight of the nine batters for the Thunder recorded a hit in the game, six of them reached twice.

New Hampshire scored first with an RBI double by Vladimir Guerrero Jr. in the first inning, however, the Thunder offense wouldn't be held down for long. In the third inning, Vince Conde hammered a two-run home run into left-center to take a 2-1 lead for the Thunder and the offense chased the Fisher Cats starter from the game in the fourth inning with a seven-run frame.

The Thunder scored a season-high seven runs in an inning on six hits in the fourth to take a 9-1 advantage. Back-to-back singles from Bruce Caldwell and Mandy Alvarez started the inning and Cesar Diaz scored Caldwell with a double. After a walk by Chace Numata, Vince Conde singled in a pair. The Fisher Cats starter came back to get Rashad Crawford, but, served up a two-run double to Chris Gittens to finish his outing. After the pitching change, Jhalan Jackson knocked his league-leading seventh home run of the season over the wall in left.

New Hampshire's offense rallied for five runs in the fifth inning, after Will Carter appeared to be cruising to his first victory of the season. Carter completed his outing after 4.2 innings allowing six runs (two earned) on six hits and three walks on Saturday night. Stephen Tarpley, Caleb Frare and Jordan Foley kept New Hampshire scoreless after the fifth to hold down the victory for the Thunder. Gosuke Katoh, Chace Numata and Vince Conde led the Thunder offensive attack with two-hit games. Chris Gittens walked twice and drove in a pair with a double to supplement the offensive attack. Numata recorded his first multi-hit game of the season.

#### THUNDER CLAPS:

2017: NEVER A BETTER SEASON: The 2017 Thunder set the franchise record for best record and win percentage (.657) with a 92-48 record. This came on the heels of a 2016 campaign in which the Thunder finished with the second-best record in franchise history at 87-55 (.613). The Thunder held a lead at some point in 121-of-140 (86.4%) regular season games. The team set multiple franchise records on the mound with marks in ERA (2.83) and shutouts (20). With a sub-3.00 ERA the Thunder became the 32nd team in Eastern League history (since 1957) and the first since Harrisburg in 1991 (2.97 ERA). A 2.83 ERA was the lowest in the Eastern League since West Haven in 1976 posted a 2.82 mark.

GET 'EM EARLY: Since Saturday April, 21st, (7 Games) the Thunder bullpen has gotten tough. In their last 23.2 IP they've allowed just two earned runs (0.76 ERA) and limited opponents to just 15 hits and 13 walks (1.18 WHIP) with 27 strikeouts.

IWANT CONDE: Vince Conde hit his first home run of the season, a go-ahead two-run homer, and went 2-for-4 with a season-high 4 RBI in Saturday's win. The two hits were Conde's first since his three-hit game on April 20 against Portland. Conde's 4 RBI were one short of his career high 5 (8/13/15 vs Lexington).

THUNDER AND LIGHTNING: Trenton matched season-highs with 10 runs and 11 hits in Saturday's win, and also set a new season-best mark for runs scored in an inning (7) and hits in an inning (6), doing both in the fourth.

STRANGE BUT TRUE: The Thunder have scored 10 runs in both of their victories over the Fisher Cats this season (4/10 and 4/28), but in their three losses thus far to New Hampshire, have been shut out twice (4/11 and 4/27) and limited to one run once (4/9).

BARE MINIMUM: Six of the team's 12 wins have come by scoring three or fewer runs, and eight of the 12 victories have come by margins of

ROOT FOR BEN: Ben Ruta has collected at least one hit in 13 of his 16 games played. His .382 batting average ranks second in the Eastern League, and his 21 hits lead the Thunder. He also boasts the club's longest hitting streak of the season, hitting safely in nine straight games from April 10 to 24.

BEING EXTRA: All but three of Jhalan Jackson's 12 hits this season have been extra-base hits; the Thunder right fielder has a double, a triple and an Eastern League-leading 7 home runs, which is also tied for third across all of Minor League Baseball.

EASTERN LEAGUE ALL-STAR CLASSIC RETURNS TO TRENTON: The 25th season in franchise history will be punctuated with ARM & HAMMER Park hosting an All-Star game for the third time in franchise history. Tuesday, July 10 will feature a special baseball game between the New York and Philadelphia Police Departments and the Case's Pork Roll Home Run Derby.
