LAST GAME:

Ryan Bollinger carried a no-hitter into the sixth inning for the Thunder, who defeated the Harrisburg Senators, 4-0, on Sunday afternoon at ARM & HAMMER Park.

Bollinger retired 10 of the first 11 batters he faced in his Thunder (18-10) debut, and did not allow a hit until Yadiel Hernandez and Kelvin Gutierrez hit back-to-back singles with two out in the sixth inning.

Rehabbing Yankees third baseman Brandon Drury went 2-for-3 in the game with a third-inning solo homer to left-center field off Senators (10-18) starter Luis Reyes.

The Thunder took a first-inning lead on a RBI-infield single by Trey Amburgey, and on the play, a throwing error by Harrisburg third baseman Drew Ward allowed an additional run to score. Abiatel Avelino capped the afternoon's scoring by racing in from third on a wild pitch by Reyes in the fifth inning.

Stephen Tarpley held Harrisburg scoreless in the seventh and eighth innings, and Andrew Schwaab worked around two baserunners in the ninth to end the game.

The win gave the Thunder their season-high fifth straight win, and their first series sweep of the season.

THUNDER CLAPS:

CHASING THE NO-NO: Ryan Bollinger took a no-hitter into the sixth inning in his Thunder debut Sunday, losing the bid on a two-out single by Yadiel Hernandez. The left-hander's performance was Trenton's longest no-hit bid of the season, and still spearheaded the club's fourth shutout of the year.

WALK IT OFF: Chris Gittens helped produce the Thunder's first walk-off victory of the season on his 10th-inning sacrifice fly to center on Saturday night. Previously, Trenton had seen neither a walk-off win nor a walk-off loss this season. The team is now 2-1 in extra-inning games.

NEVER TELL ME THE ODDS: After two innings in Wednesday's game, the Thunder trailed the Sea Dogs 6-0, but rallied back to win, marking the largest deficit from which Trenton has come back this season. Additionally, after trailing 8-7 entering the 8th inning, the Thunder plated two runs on a wind-blown popup to spark the 9-8 win, the team's first victory when trailing after seven innings.

HOME SWEET HOME: The Thunder are in the midst of a seven-game homestand, their second of the season. Trenton has won its last four series at ARM & HAMMER Park, and has won eight of the last nine home games.

TROUBLE IN THE SENATE: The Thunder have taken five of six games from Harrisburg thus far, holding the Senators to a total of just six runs, plus a .155 batting average, across the six matchups.

GITTIN' ON BASE: With a double on Sunday, Chris Gittens extended his hitting and on-base streaks to season-highs of seven and 10 games, respectively. Gittens leads the Thunder with 16 walks, and is tied for second on the team with 22 hits.

CALL HIM ACE: Erik Swanson owns the best ERA in the Eastern League at 0.65. The right-hander's seven innings of work Friday night matched his career-high as he held Harrisburg scoreless. Swanson is now 2-0 against the Senators, allowing just seven hits over 14 innings while striking out 16.

GREATEST HITS: The Thunder rapped out a season-high 12 hits in Friday's victory, including three by Abiatel Avelino, who homered in the first inning. Bruce Caldwell, Cesar Diaz and Jhalan Jackson all collected two hits each to lead the effort, as each of the nine Thunder batters reached base via a hit or a walk.

EASTERN LEAGUE ALL-STAR CLASSIC RETURNS TO TRENTON: The 25th season in franchise history will be punctuated with ARM & HAMMER Park hosting an All-Star game for the third time in franchise history. Tuesday, July 10 will feature a special baseball game between the New York and Philadelphia Police Departments and the Case's Pork Roll Home Run Derby.
