HARTFORD, CT --- Mandy Alvarez's second home run of the day, a two-run shot in the 11th inning, pushed the Thunder to a 4-2, series-winning, victory over the Hartford Yard Goats on Sunday night at Dunkin Donuts Park.

With the International Tie Breaker runner aboard and one away, Alvarez crushed a 1-2 offering from Matt Pierpont over the wall in left-center to complete a comeback victory. David Sosebee worked a scoreless 11th to secure the extra inning victory, Trenton's eighth in 11 games that have gone longer than the allotted amount.

The Yard Goats grabbed the first two runs in the game against Thunder starter Alexander Vargas in the fourth. With men on the corners and one out, Brian Mundell lifted a sacrifice fly to right to score Drew Weeks. Later in the frame, Ryan Metzler doubled in Omar Carrizales to take a 2-0 lead.

Vargas was lifted following Mezler's double and James Reeves entered to keep it a 2-0 game. Reeves all seven batters he faced while the Thunder offense mounted a rally to tie the game.

Mandy Alvarez smacked a solo home run in the sixth, his 11th of the year, and Rashad Crawford tied the game in the seventh with a single scoring Jhalan Jackson. The rally ruined a strong start from Hartford's Ryan Castellani who went a season-high seven innings but took a no-decision. The Thunder bullpen turned in a brilliant day after Vargas as Reeves, Matt Wivinis and Sosebee combined on 7.1 scoreless allowing just one hit and one walk with ten strikeouts.

Sunday was Alvarez's second multi-homerun game of the season and his career. He led the Thunder offense with three hits. The Thunder improved to 8-3 in extra inning games this season, 4-1 on the road.

2018 EASTERN LEAGUE STANDINGS

THUNDER CLAPS:

THE HOME STRETCH: Including today, the Thunder have just 28 games remaining in the regular season. Eighteen of those are against the Eastern Division, while Trenton will still face Harrisburg once more and Altoona twice more to round out its slate of games against the Western Division.

FLYING HIGH: Trenton has won seven of its last 10 games, each of which have come against Eastern Division rivals. With the past three-game series win over Hartford, the Thunder have now won four consecutive series over Eastern Division teams, and Sunday's win over the Yard Goats brought the club back to 14 games over .500, matching a season-high. Additionally, the Thunder have not lost back-to-back games since July 18-19, when they dropped the final two games of a series in New Hampshire.

KINGS OF THE HILL: The Thunder have used 36 different pitchers this season, more than any other Eastern League team. In spite of this, Trenton leads the league in numerous pitching categories, including ERA (3.20), WHIP (1.21), and strikeouts (1,004). The team has also allowed the fewest hits (809), fewest runs (402), and fewest home runs (68) in the league.

EN FUEGO: Over his last six games, Mandy Alvarez is batting .417 (10-for-24) with three home runs and seven RBI. The streak features a trio of three-hit performances, including a two-homer game Sunday in Hartford that was Alvarez's second multi-home run game of the season and of his career. Between Trenton (91 games) and high-A Tampa (9 games) this season, Alvarez has set career-highs in hits (92), doubles (24), triples (3), home runs (12), RBI (51), and walks (26).

THE JOURNEYMAN: Catcher Ryan Lidge has reached base safely in six straight games (one shy of his season-long onbase streak) and is batting .353 (6-for-17) during those. six games. He also had a four-game hitting streak (his longest at double-A) come to an end Saturday after going 0-for-1 with a walk as a mid-game substitute. This is Lidge's fourth stint at double-A this season; the Illinois native has also spent time with high-A Tampa, low-A Charleston, and short-season Staten Island.

THINKING POSTSEASON: Since April 11, the Thunder have sat in either first or second place in the Eastern Division standings. Currently just two games behind first-place New Hampshire and 10.5 games ahead of third-place Hartford, Trenton is seeking its third consecutive trip to the EL playoffs, a streak that has been achieved just once in franchise history (2005-2007).
