

# TRENTON THUNDER GAME NOTES

## New Hampshire Fisher Cats ((Blue Jays)) vs. Thunder Thunder ((Yankees))

### LAST GAME:

MANCHESTER, N.H. - A leadoff homer by Gosuke Katoh provided a promising start for the Thunder in Game 2 of the Eastern League Division Series, but the lead quickly disappeared as the New Hampshire Fisher Cats piled up 12 hits to hand the Thunder a 10-4 loss at Northeast Delta Dental Stadium.

With the Thunder loss, the Fisher Cats took a two-games-to-none lead in the best-of-five series.

After Katoh homered on the game's second pitch off Fisher Cats starter Hector Perez, New Hampshire responded immediately in the bottom half. Bo Bichette and Harold Ramirez hit back-to-back one-out singles and after a groundout, Max Pentecost put the home team in front with a three-run homer to right field.

Thunder starter Nick Green lasted just an inning and two-thirds, also surrendering a two-run triple to Ramirez in the second.

Left-hander Phillip Diehl kept the game close with two and one-third scoreless relief innings for Trenton, getting support from a two-run homer by Dom Thompson-Williams in the fourth that brought the score to 5-3. But Jordan Foley followed Diehl in relief and after holding New Hampshire scoreless in the fifth, yielded a two-run double to Cavan Biggio in the sixth that re-extended the Fisher Cats' lead to four.

In the eighth, New Hampshire padded its lead again, loading the bases on three walks before Josh Palacios lined a triple to right-center, clearing the bases.

The Thunder managed four hits over their final five innings at the plate but plated just one more run on a sacrifice fly by pinch-hitter Jeff Hendrix in the ninth.

Taylor Saucedo recorded the win in relief, tossing three and two-third scoreless innings.

All 10 New Hampshire runs in the game scored with two outs, while the Thunder went 0-for-6 with runners in scoring position.

### THUNDER CLAPS:

**HOW THEY GOT HERE:** The Thunder's 8-3 win in Hartford on August 26 clinched the team's third consecutive trip to the Eastern League playoffs. It marks the second time in franchise history that the team has strung together three consecutive postseason appearances, having also done so from 2005 to 2007. Since April 11, the Thunder sat in either first or second place in the Eastern Division standings. This past Sunday's win over Reading clinched the Eastern Division title, marking the Thunder's 10<sup>th</sup> division title in 25 seasons of play.

The Fisher Cats stood in first place for most of the regular season but fell in the standings after losing three of their last four games against Hartford in the season's final series. New Hampshire clinched its playoff berth the night before the Thunder did so, defeating Binghamton, 9-7, at home on August 25.

**HEAD-TO-HEAD:** The Thunder won the season series against the Fisher Cats, nine games to eight. This was despite a considerably lower team batting average (.214 vs New Hampshire's .245) in the head-to-head matchup, as well as a higher ERA (3.92 vs New Hampshire's 3.25). The Thunder won seven of the 12 games played at ARM & HAMMER Park during the regular season.

**IT'S BEEN AWHILE:** This series marks just the second time the Thunder have met the Fisher Cats in postseason play; they previously squared off in 2010, with Trenton sweeping New Hampshire prior to falling to the Altoona Curve in the Eastern League Championship Series.

**DOWN IN A HOLE:** The Thunder have started 0-2 in a postseason series five previous times in franchise history: twice in the divisional round, and three times in the Eastern League Championship Series. In each instance, the Thunder went on to lose the series, but came closest in the 2005 Northern Division Championship Series. After dropping the first two games to the Portland Sea Dogs, Trenton tied the series at two games apiece before falling in Game 5 at Hadlock Field.

**DUCKS LEFT ON THE POND:** In the first two games of the Eastern League Division Series, the Thunder went 0-for-11 with runners in scoring position and stranded a total of 17 baserunners.

**LET'S GET IT STARTED:** Nick Nelson did not face New Hampshire in any of his three regular-season starts for the Thunder, but faced the Dunedin Blue Jays while in the Florida State League on May 17. He faced just one current Fisher Cats player, Josh Palacios (results: strikeout, walk, groundout).
