### Saturday Recap: Flying Squirrels halt RubberDucks' winning streak

**(Richmond 5, Akron 2):** After the RubberDucks scored twice on first baseman **Wilson Garcia**'s first-inning single, Flying Squirrels pitching combined to hold them to three hits and no runs over the final eight innings of a 5-2 victory that snapped Akron's three-game winning streak and Richmond's four-game losing streak at The Diamond in Richmond, Virginia, on Saturday night. Akron can clinch the series with a win Sunday.

**Ducks flying out of the park:** The RubberDucks had four straight multi-homer games May 9-13 and have eight such games overall. Of Akron's 33 home runs (tied with Richmond for third in the Eastern League), 24 have come in eight games, including 13 in four games May 9-13:  
April 5 vs. Altoona (4 – T. Krieger, W. Garcia, M. Longo, D. Johnson)  
April 13 (2) at Altoona (3 – Daniel Johnson, Tyler Krieger, Ka'ai Tom)  
April 28 at Bowie (2 – Daniel Salters, Tyler Krieger)  
May 2 vs. Reading (2 – Wilson Garcia, Logan Ice)  
May 9 at Erie (2 – Ernie Clement, Daniel Johnson)  
May 10 at Reading (3 – Wilson Garcia, Daniel Johnson-2)  
May 11 at Reading (6 – Marabell, Tom-2, Ice, Garcia, N. Rodriguez)  
May 13 vs. Bowie (2 – Ka'ai Tom, Daniel Johnson)  
The six home runs on Saturday were the most for Akron since hitting seven on July 2, 2008, in a 10-6 win at Erie.

**Strong starts:** In each of the last 11 games (since May 7), the RubberDucks starting pitcher has pitched at least five innings and allowed two earned runs or fewer. Included are five quality starts (6+ IP, 3 ER or fewer). The RubberDucks are 6-5 in that span (2-3 in the quality starts).

**Johnson's hot bat:** Outfielder **Daniel Johnson** has a RubberDucks season-long (and longest active in the Eastern League) 11-game hitting streak (16-for-45, 14 runs, 2 doubles, triple, .356 AVG, .431 OBP) with six homers in seven games May 9-16. He also had an RBI in eight of nine games May 8-17 (16 RBI). His .279 average, nine home runs (tied for third in the Eastern League), 31 RBI (tied for second), 74 total bases (fifth), 24 runs, .369 OBP, .574 SLG, and .973 OPS all lead Akron. He has matched his RBI and surpassed his home run total from his Eastern League time in 2018, when he played 89 games with the Washington Nationals' Double-A affiliate, Harrisburg, and hit .267 with six home runs and 31 RBI. He finished this April 19-for-69 (.275) with five doubles and three home runs, leading Akron with 35 total bases, 11 walks, a .507 slugging percentage and .885 OPS. He had back-to-back four-RBI games April 13 and 15.

**Marabell is a mainstay:** Third-year RubberDuck **Connor Marabell** has a season-long 10-game hitting streak (12-for-37, double, home run, three runs, six RBI, .324 AVG, .395 OBP), raising his average from .209 to .237. He has played in each of Akron's first 41 games (starting the last 37). He leads the team in at-bats (152) and plate appearances (170), is tied for second in hits (36) and is tied for third in runs scored (19). He has made four starts at first base, 13 in left field, four in center field, 15 in right field, and four as a DH. In 2018, he had 64 RBI in 89 games with Akron.

**Ducks visit Flying Squirrels:** The RubberDucks and Flying Squirrels are playing the first of three scheduled intradivision four-game series this season, with eight games at Canal Park and four at The Diamond. Last season, Akron went 11-5 against Richmond, including 5-3 at The Diamond. In 2018, the Flying Squirrels finished in sixth place in the Western Division, at 62-76 overall. Since Richmond joined the league in 2010, Akron leads the series, 54-52.

**Garcia finds a groove in Double-A:** In his first season with the Indians organization and first in Double-A, first baseman **Wilson Garcia** leads the team with 37 hits and 11 doubles. He is second on the club with five home runs, 29 RBI, 63 total bases, .417 SLG and .705 OPS. Garcia homered on May 10th and 11th in Reading, joining **Daniel Johnson** as RubberDucks to homer in consecutive games this season. On May 3, he matched a career high with four hits - his first four-hit game since May 23, 2018, while with the Frederick (A-Adv) Keys. He began the season with 28 straight error-free games at first base. In the first six games against his former organization, the Philadelphia Phillies Double-A affiliate, Reading, Garcia was 8-for-23 (.348) with four runs, three home runs and six RBI.

**N-Rod rejoins Akron:** First baseman and designated hitter **Nellie Rodriguez** has begun his season with a seven-game hitting streak (10-for-31, double, two home runs, five RBI, seven runs, .323 AVG, .364 OBP). He joined Akron May 11 to begin his eighth minor league season in the Indians organization (and fourth season he has played with Akron in five years). Rodriguez, 24, first reached Akron in August 2015, after having posted numbers that earned him Carolina League MVP honors. In 195 games with Akron, he has 37 home runs (his most at any level).

**Clement's return:** Infielder **Ernie Clement** has reached base in his last 10 games since April 7. After he was on the Injured List with a right adductor strain April 16-May 8, Clement had an outstanding return to the lineup on Thursday, May 9. Batting leadoff as the designated hitter, Clement reached base on a first-inning error, then drove in a run each of his next three plate appearances, with a sacrifice fly, RBI single and solo home run – his first in Double-A. His three RBI were the first three of his season. In six games prior to going on the IL, the Indians No. 15 (MLB.com)/No. 18 (*Baseball America*) prospect was 3-for-25 (.120). He played his first full game back at shortstop Saturday after playing six innings May 11, five innings May 13, and seven innings May 15 and 16.

**Ka'ai on the ball:** Outfielder **Ka'ai Tom** had a season-long seven-game hitting streak May 10-17, going 10-for-26 (.385) with two doubles, three home runs (two in Reading May 11 and one May 13 against Bowie), seven runs, four RBI and a .484 OBP, raising his average from .191 to .228. His three home runs in two games May 11th and 13th made him the third RubberDuck to homer in back-to-back games this season, joining **Daniel Johnson** (May 9-10) and **Wilson Garcia** (May 10-11). After no 2019 RubberDuck homered in consecutive games through 33 games, a player accomplished the feat in three straight games Akron played.

### LAST OUTING (Tuesday, May 14, at Bowie, L in 2-0 loss)

He kept the Baysox off the board until the fifth inning, when he walked Bowie's Martin Cervenka and gave up consecutive singles to Brett Cumberland and Preston Palmeiro to score the first run. After a strikeout and error, Ryan McKenna hit an RBI single, before Paulson induced an inning-ending double play. He departed after six innings, and left-hander Ben Krauth (one inning) and right-hander Argenis Angulo (two innings) combined for scoreless relief in the 2-0 loss.

### 2018

- Began the season with Lynchburg (A-Adv), making four starts in April.
- Earned his first promotion to Double-A on May 3, joining the RubberDucks.
- Pitched the rest of the season with Akron and led the EL in ERA (3.04) and was 2nd in WHIP (1.18).
- Named Eastern League Mid-Season All-Star, the first All-Star selection of his pro career.
- Finished the year tied for the team lead in wins (8) and was second on the team in innings pitched (115.1) and strikeouts (91).
- Started Game 2 of the Eastern League Western Division Series against Altoona (ND, 7.0 IP, 5 H, 1 ER, 1 HR, 2 BB, 4 K), which the RubberDucks won on a 10th-inning walk-off home run by Nellie Rodriguez at Canal Park. Akron went on to win the series, 3-1.
- In Game 1 of the Eastern League Championship Series against New Hampshire, he took over with two outs in the first inning from Indians rehabbing right-hander Cody Anderson and worked 7 innings (3 H, 1 ER, 0 BB, 4 K), departing in a 1-1 tie in the eighth inning. The Fisher Cats won, 3-1 in 10 innings, before going on to a sweep of the RubberDucks.

### 2016

- Went on the Daytona Injured List on May 1 with right shoulder inflammation and was activated May 24.
- Spent three separate stints on the Injured List (also June 1-July 5 and July 16 through the end of the season).

### 2014

- Originally drafted by the Cincinnati Reds in the 27th round of the June, 2014 draft, out of Oakland University in Rochester, Michigan.
- Was one of two players drafted (both by the Indians) from Oakland University. The other was catcher Jake Morton, who was a 39<sup>th</sup>-round pick but did not sign. Morton returned to Oakland for his senior season but did not play professionally.
- Only one player who attended Oakland University (MI) has reached the major leagues. Right-hander Don Kirkwood (at Oakland 1969-71) pitched five seasons with the California Angels (1974-77), Chicago White Sox (1977) and Toronto Blue Jays (1978).

## 2019 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

**#24 Rouglas Odor, Manager (First Season)** — Odor, 51, is the 18th manager in club history. He follows Tony Mansolino, who was promoted to Triple-A Columbus after guiding Akron to a 78-62 record and finish as runner-up in the 2018 Eastern League Championship Series against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Last season, Odor managed the Class-A Advanced Lynchburg Hillcats to their fourth consecutive postseason. After posting the Carolina League's worst first-half record of 29-38, the Hillcats rebounded to go 42-28 in the second half, claiming the Northern Division title. They fell to Potomac in the semifinals, three games to two. Odor has a 361-363 (.499) career managing record in 11 seasons.

When Odor was the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2019 season is Odor's 32nd in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (19th as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. Last season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League for two seasons in 1999-2000, the Burlington Indians for four seasons from 2001-04, the Mahoning Valley Scrappers for two seasons in 2005-06, and the Gulf Coast League Indians for two seasons in 2007-08. Since then, Odor has moved up the ranks as a hitting coach, starting with Class-A Kinston in 2009-10, Akron in 2011-12 and 2014, the High-A Carolina Mudcats in 2013, and Triple-A Columbus in 2015-17.

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

**#27 Tony Arnold, Pitching Coach (10th Season, not consecutive)** — Arnold, 59, rejoins the RubberDucks for his fifth time in Akron after spending last season with Lynchburg. In 2018, the Hillcats pitching staff finished fifth in the Carolina League with a 3.76 ERA, ranked second with 1,190 strikeouts and the 12 team shutouts ranked fourth. Arnold last was with the RubberDucks in 2016-17, helping lead the 2016 team to an Eastern League championship. He previously served in the same capacity in Akron from 1996-99, 2008, and 2011-12. Arnold's 2012 Akron Aeros staff crafted a franchise-record 3.03 ERA and went on to claim the EL championship. In 2016, Arnold became the second man to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and Akron RubberDucks, joining Rouglas Odor in that exclusive group.

In 2015, Arnold began as the pitching coach at Lynchburg and finished at Triple-A Columbus, helping the Clippers to the International League title. A former All-American at the University of Texas, Arnold pitched in the major leagues with the Baltimore Orioles in 1986 and 1987.

**#2 Justin Toole, Hitting Coach (First Season)** — Toole, 32, spent the 2018 season as Lynchburg's hitting coach. This is fourth season coaching in the Indians' organization, serving as the hitting coach for Mahoning Valley in 2016, Lake County in 2017, and Lynchburg. Toole was signed as a minor league free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent parts of seven seasons with Cleveland from 2009-15. He spent parts of 2010, 2012-15 with Akron, hitting .259 in 180 games, including .275 in 77 games under Odor's hitting-coach tutelage in 2014. The Council Bluffs, Iowa, native played at the University of Iowa and has authored a children's book called "9 in 9," chronicling the lessons he learned while playing all nine positions in a game for the Carolina Mudcats on Aug. 25, 2012. **Twitter: @Tooleyj24, Instagram: @tooleyj24**

**#28 Juan De La Cruz, Bench Coach (First Season)** — De La Cruz, 25, is in his second season coaching with the Indians after serving as the hitting coach for the rookie-level Arizona League Indians in 2018. Primarily a catcher in his playing days, De La Cruz was signed as a free agent by the Indians in 2009 and spent eight seasons in the system, reaching as high as Akron in 2017, when he played 12 games as a catcher and first baseman. He was a .216 career hitter in 281 games.

**Bobby Ruiz, Athletic Trainer (First Season)** — Ruiz spent the past four seasons (2015-18) with Lynchburg. This is his ninth with the Indians.

**Paul Synenkyj, Strength and Conditioning Coach (Third Season)** — Synenkyj is the lone returning field staff member from 2018. He is in his ninth season in the Indians organization. He holds degrees in physical education from Cleveland State and the University of Akron. **Twitter: @PaulSynenkyj**
