South Bend Cubs (6-4) at Dayton Dragons (7-3)

RH Erich Uelmen (0-1, 23.14) vs. LH Packy Naughton (0-0, 2.38)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the South Bend Cubs (affiliate of the Chicago Cubs) in the last game of a three-game series. **Series to Date/Streaks:** The Dragons have won the first two games of this series, prevailing Tuesday 3-2 and winning last night 4-1. Overall, the Dragons have won seven straight games (they have not lost a game since April 7).

Last Game: Wednesday: Dayton 4, South Bend 1. The Dragons scored three runs in the first inning, keyed by a two-run home run by John Sansone, and four Dragons pitchers combined to allow just five hits. Austin Orewiler earned the win with four and two-thirds innings of long relief after a one hour, 33 minute rain delay. Sarkis Ohanian pitched a perfect ninth inning for his second save. Hunter Green started for Dayton and went two and one-third innings before the rain delay, allowing no runs on three hits with one walk and three strikeouts.

South Bend as an Opponent: With wins in the first two games of this series with South Bend, the Dragons have clinched their first series win against South Bend since May of 2015. In the last 14 sets with South Bend prior to this series, the Cubs had won 13 and one series ended with a split. The Dragons were 8-30 vs. South Bend in 2016-17.

2018 Team Notes

- The Dragons have won seven straight games. Their longest winning streak in 2017 was seven (two times; most recent: August 19-25). The Dragons have not won eight straight games since July 17-25, 2011 (team featured Billy Hamilton, Tucker Barnhart, Donald Lutz).
- Five of the seven Dragons wins in the winning streak have been come-from-behind wins. In four of the seven wins, they scored the tie-breaking run in their final at-bat of the game (bottom of the 8th or bottom of the 9th).
- The Dragons have outscored their opponents 37-20 in the seven wins.
- Dragons relievers have allowed just two earned runs during the seven-game winning streak covering 31.2 innings (0.57 ERA).
- Since starting the season with seven errors in the first three games (all losses), the Dragons have committed just four errors in the last seven games.

2018 Individual Notes

- **Hendrik Clementina** is batting .429 on the year, going 9 for 21 with 2 HR and 3 doubles. His slugging percentage of .857 would rank second in the league if he had enough plate appearances to qualify. His OPS is 1.292.
- **Miles Gordon** and **Stuart Fairchild** are tied for the league lead in runs with 11.
- **John Sansone** and **Stuart Fairchild** enter tonight's game with five-game hitting streaks. Fairchild has hit in nine of the 10 games he has played in.
- Reliever **Ryan Nutof** has not allowed a run in five relief appearances covering 7.1 innings. He has allowed just two hits, no walks, with 11 strikeouts.
- Reliever **John Ghyzel** has not allowed a run in four relief appearances covering 4.0 innings. He has two saves. He has struck out eight.

General Player/Team Notes

- Six members of the Dragons are rated among the Reds top 30 prospects (*Baseball America*). They are RHP **Hunter Greene** (#2); INF **Jeter Downs** (#11); INF **Jose Garcia** (#12); OF **Stuart Fairchild** (#16); OF **Miles Gordon** (#26), and LHP **Packy Naughton** (#28).
- RHP **Hunter Greene** is one of 16 first round draft picks to play for the Dragons. He was the second overall pick in the 2017 draft out of Notre Dame High School in Sherman Oaks, California.
- OF **Stuart Fairchild** was a 2017 NCAA First Team All-American at Wake Forest, when he batted .360 with 17 HR and 21 SB, leading the ACC in hits and total bases. Fairchild was also one of three outfielders in the nation selected to the ABCA/Rawlings Gold Glove team. Following his first season of professional baseball, Fairchild was named by Baseball America as the "Best Defensive Outfielder" in the Reds organization.
- Dragons catcher **Mark Kolozsvary** was a member of the 2017 NCAA national championship team at the University of Florida. Five other Dragons players also played in the 64-team 2017 tournament, including OF **Stuart Fairchild** (Wake Forest); RHP **Connor Ryan** (Illinois-Chicago); RHP **Tyler Buffett** (Oklahoma State); RHP **Ryan Nutof** (Michigan); RHP **Mac Sceroler** (Southeastern Louisiana). INF **John Sansone** (Florida State) and RHP **Austin Orewiler** (Rice) played in the tournament in previous years.
- The Dragons roster includes six players taken within the first five rounds of the 40-round amateur draft, including **Hunter Greene**, #1 (2nd overall, 2017); INF **Jeter Downs**, #S1, 2017; **Stuart Fairchild**, #2, 2017; **Miles Gordon**, #4, 2015; **Cory Thompson**, #5, 2013; **Mac Sceroler**, #5, 2017.
- The Dragons roster includes 10 players from NCAA Division I programs, one player from an NCAA Division III school, one player from a junior college program, seven players signed out of high school, six players signed as international free agents, and one player acquired in a trade.

The Dragons MVP Program

The Dragons expanded elementary school MVP Program reaches five counties and more than 1,100 classrooms. Schools in Montgomery, Greene, Clark, Miami and Warren counties are part of the program that includes 1,116 fourth and fifth grade classrooms in 183 schools over 48 school districts. About 34,000 children will participate. The program is in its 13th year in 2018.
