Great Lakes Loons (12-25) at Dayton Dragons (18-19)

RH Riley Ottesen (0-3, 8.18) & LH Leo Crawford (0-1, 1.93) vs. RH Hunter Greene (0-2, 9.88) & RH Tyler Mondile (0-3, 9.19)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the Great Lakes Loons (affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers) in a make-up doubleheader. These are the first two games of a four-game series. **Season Series to Date:** First meeting between the teams tonight.

Streaks: The Dragons have lost their last seven games after winning nine of the previous 10.

Standings: The Dragons are in fourth place, seven and one-half games behind first place Lansing, and five games behind second place Bowling Green.

Last Game: Thursday: Lansing 4, Dayton 1. Lansing pitchers Turner Larkins and Brody Rodning combined to allow only one runner past second base as the Lugnuts completed a sweep of the four-game series. The Lugnuts scored three runs with two outs in the third inning and added one more in the seventh to build a 4-0 lead, then held the Dragons scoreless until Stuart Fairchild's two-out RBI single in the ninth inning.

2018 Team Notes

- The Dragons have been the streakiest team in professional baseball in 2018. They started the year with a three-game losing streak, won the next nine games, lost the next eight, won nine of 10, and have lost the last seven.
- The Dragons hit .262 as a team with 12 extra base hits in the Lansing series after posting their lowest batting average in a series (.172) and their lowest batting average with men in scoring position in a series (.111, 2 for 18) in the previous three-game set with Peoria.
- The Dragons have hit 19 home runs in the last 16 games after hitting 10 homers in their first 21 games of the season.
- The Dragons team ERA in their 18 wins is 3.62 (164 IP, 66 ER). The ERA in the 19 losses is 7.03 (161.1 IP, 126 ER).
- The Dragons have come back to win four games in which they trailed by at least three runs including two in which they trailed by six runs. However they have also lost five games in which they led by at least three runs (including Friday and Saturday nights).
- Fourteen (14) of the 18 Dragons wins have been come-from-behind wins. Ten (10) of their 19 losses have involved blown leads.
- The Dragons are 12-6 at home; 6-13 on the road.
- The Dragons are 0-8 this season vs. Lansing; 18-11 vs. the rest of the league.

2018 Individual Notes

- Hendrik Clementina** over his last 12 games: six home runs, one triple, 15 RBI, and nine walks. Clementina is hitting .341 on the year with a .720 slugging percentage. He is tied for second in the MWL in home runs with eight and tied for fifth in RBI with 26 despite being three plate appearances short of qualifying for the batting lead. He would rank seventh in the league in batting average and first in slugging percentage (by 58 points).
- Miles Gordon** over his last nine games: 13 for 33, .394 to raise his average from .132 to .202.
- Michael Beltre** over his last six games: 9 for 25, .360. Beltre has a 31-game on-base streak that is the longest active streak in the league.
- Jeter Downs** has a five-game hitting streak, going 6 for 22, .273, with two home runs, two doubles, and a triple.
- Stuart Fairchild** has a four-game hitting streak, going 7 for 18 (.389) with three doubles.
- John Ghyzel** is second in the MWL lead in saves with six. In 14 appearances, he has a 1.93 ERA.
- Cory Thompson** has allowed earned runs in just one of his 15 relief appearances, posting a 1.40 ERA.
- Ryan Nutof** has allowed earned runs in just two of his 14 relief appearances, posting a 1.54 ERA.

General Player/Team Notes

- Six members of the Dragons are rated among the Reds top 30 prospects (*Baseball America*). They are RHP **Hunter Greene** (#2); INF **Jeter Downs** (#11); INF **Jose Garcia** (#12); OF **Stuart Fairchild** (#16); OF **Miles Gordon** (#26), and LHP **Packy Naughton** (#28).
- RHP **Hunter Greene** is one of 16 first round draft picks to play for the Dragons. He was the second overall pick in the 2017 draft out of Notre Dame High School in Sherman Oaks, California.
- OF **Stuart Fairchild** was a 2017 NCAA First Team All-American at Wake Forest, when he batted .360 with 17 HR and 21 SB, leading the ACC in hits and total bases. Fairchild was also one of three outfielders in the nation selected to the ABCA/Rawlings Gold Glove team.
- Dragons catcher **Mark Kolozsvary** was a member of the 2017 NCAA national championship team at the University of Florida. Four other Dragons players also played in the 64-team 2017 tournament: **Stuart Fairchild** (Wake Forest); **Connor Ryan** (Illinois-Chicago); **Tyler Buffett** (Oklahoma State); **Ryan Nutof** (Michigan). **John Sansone** (Florida State) and **Austin Orewiler** (Rice) played in the tournament in previous years.
- The Dragons roster includes five players taken within the first five rounds of the 40-round amateur draft, including **Hunter Greene**, #1 (2nd overall, 2017); INF **Jeter Downs**, #S1, 2017; **Stuart Fairchild**, #2, 2017; **Miles Gordon**, #4, 2015; **Cory Thompson**, #5, 2013.

Dragons Manager/Coaches:

The Dragons MVP Program

The Dragons expanded elementary school MVP Program reaches five counties and more than 1,100 classrooms. Schools in Montgomery, Greene, Clark, Miami and Warren counties are part of the program that includes 1,116 fourth and fifth grade classrooms in 183 schools over 48 school districts. About 34,000 children will participate. The program is in its 13th year in 2018.
