Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the Great Lakes Loons (affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers) in the second game of a three-game series.

Season Series to Date: Dayton 4, Great Lakes 1 (all at Dayton). Current Series to Date: Dayton 1, Great Lakes 0.

Last Game: <u>Monday</u>: Dayton 4, Great Lakes 1. The Dragons snapped an eight-game losing streak in the first game of the series with the Loons. Dayton scored single runs in each of the first three innings to take an early 3-1 lead. Starting pitcher Adrian Rodriguez struck out eight and allowed just four hits over six good innings for the win, and John Ghyzel pitched a perfect ninth inning for the save. Dragons pitchers struck out 14 batters, matching the team season high. Andy Sugilio had his third straight two-hit game for Dayton. J.D. Williams also had two hits.

2018 Team Notes

- The Dragons have been the streakiest team in professional baseball in 2018. They started the year with a three-game losing streak, won the next nine games, lost the next eight, won nine of 10, lost the next eight, won seven of eight, lost the next three, won four of six, lost the next seven, won two, lost the next eight, and won last night.
- The Dragons are 3-15 since June 3 when their record stood at 29-26. Six of the 15 losses have come by one run. Over the last 18 games, the team batting average is .224 (133-594) while the club has averaged 3.00 runs per game (54 R/18 G). The team ERA is 5.12 (156.1 IP, 89 ER).
- The Dragons have committed just six errors in their last 16 games.
- The Dragons have scored four runs or less in 16 consecutive games (last scored more than four in a game on June 6).
- The Dragons threatened to tie the franchise record for most home wins in a half (25) in the First Half, but came up short. They entered their final series, a four-game series with Bowling Green, with 22 home wins in the first half, but they were swept in the series.
- Meanwhile, the Dragons broke the club record for fewest road wins in a half. The club record was 10 road wins, and the Dragons finished with nine. The Dragons played three fewer road games in the first half than the scheduled number of 35 due to three postponements at Great Lakes in April.
- The Dragons team ERA in their 32 wins is 3.14 (287 IP, 100 ER). The ERA in the 41 losses is 6.94 (346.1 IP, 267 ER).
- The Dragons are 17-16 in one-run games, with 33 of their 72 games decided by one run. They are 23-1 when leading after eight innings (the only loss came June 5 at Lake County).
- The Dragons have come back to win four games in which they trailed by at least three runs including two in which they trailed by six runs. However they have also lost six games in which they led by at least three runs.
- The Dragons finished the First Half with a record of 31-37, in sixth place in the East Division.

2018 Individual Notes

- Hunter Greene over his last six starts: 30.1 IP, 25 H, 9 R, 8 ER, 7 BB, 34 SO, 2.37 ERA.
- Leandro Santana is batting .342 (13 for 38) over his last 10 games.
- Andy Sugilio has three straight two-hit games and is batting .333 (7 for 21) in the second half.
- Jeter Downs is batting .294 (5 for 17) in the five games in the second half, with one home run.
- Cory Thompson has posted a 1.67 ERA in 27 relief appearances. He has not allowed a run over his last six outings covering 10 innings (he also struck out the only batter he faced in the MWL All-Star Game on June 19 at Lansing).
- John Ghyzel is tied for first in the MWL lead in saves with 13. Ghyzel was the winning pitcher in the MWL All-Star Game on June 19.
- Montrell Marshall was selected as the MVP the MWL All-Star Game on June 19. Marshall drove in the winning run in the bottom of the 10th inning to give the East Division team a 3-2 victory. Dragons reliever John Ghyzel pitched a scoreless top of the 10th for the East despite starting the inning with the mandatory runner at second base.

- Five members of the Dragons played in the Midwest League All-Star Game in Lansing on June 19. They are C Hendrik Clementina (started as the DH), OF Stuart Fairchild (since promoted to Daytona), 1B Montrell Marshall, RHP John Ghyzel, RHP Cory Thompson.
- Four current members of the Dragons are rated among the Reds top 30 prospects (*Baseball America*). They are RHP Hunter Greene (#2); INF Jeter Downs (#11); INF Jose Garcia (#12); and LHP Packy Naughton (#28).
- RHP Hunter Greene is one of 16 first round draft picks to play for the Dragons. He was the second overall pick in the 2017 draft out of Notre Dame High School in Sherman Oaks, California.
- Dragons catcher Mark Kolozsvary was a member of the 2017 NCAA national championship team at the University of Florida.

The Dragons MVP Program

The Dragons expanded elementary school MVP Program reaches five counties and more than 1,100 classrooms. Schools in Montgomery, Greene, Clark, Miami and Warren counties are part of the program that includes 1,116 fourth and fifth grade classrooms in 183 schools over 48 school districts. About 34,000 children will participate. The program is in its 13th year in 2018.
