**ABOUT LAST WEEK:** Dunedin played seven games in five days and finished the week 4-3 overall. Dunedin maintained their lead over second place Daytona in the Florida State League North Division standings.

**VIEW FROM THE TOP:** The D-Jays come into play today holding a game and a half lead over second place Daytona in the FSL North Division standings. Coming into play tonight, the Blue Jays hold the third best winning percentage in all of the FSL and the best overall winning percentage in all of the Toronto Organization.

**EMBRACE THE GRIND:** The Blue Jays just completed playing four games over a 24 hour time frame. This morning's game marks the first game in a stretch of 22 games being played over a 23 day span heading into the Florida State League All-Star break. Over the next four weeks, 12 games will be played at Jack Russell Memorial Stadium, 11 on the road and one game played in Bradenton against the Marauders considered a home game for the Blue Jays.

**DOMINATING ON THE HILL:** The pitching staff of the Blue Jays has notched top five rankings in key statistics in 2019. Coming into play today, the Blue Jays staff has posted the second best ERA (3.01), second lowest amount earned runs allowed (127), and walks surrendered (114) allowed in the Florida State League.

**CLUTCH WAYS:** During this modest three game winning streak, the Blue Jays have delivered with runners in scoring position. Dating back to the second game of Sunday's doubleheader, the Blue Jays have gone 15-31 (.483) in the aforementioned situation including 5-11 combined in yesterday's doubleheader.

**HOME SWEET HOME...SORTA:** After a month filled with 18 official road games and 20 games played outside of the Dunedin/Clearwater area in total, the May schedule features 18 official home games that will be played at Jack Russell Memorial Stadium in Clearwater, FL. Additionally, the schedule includes a six game homestand (5/9-16) and a seven game home swing (5/23-30).

**PUSH FOR 2,500:** The Dunedin Blue Jays organization is closing in on 2,500 wins in franchise history. The Blue Jays have won 17 games through the first month of this 2019 campaign and now need just 28 wins to reach the 2,500 mark combined between regular and post-season play. Additionally, Dunedin is just 42 regular season wins away from 2,500 regular season victories in franchise history.

**CAPTAIN KIRK:** Since being promoted to the Dunedin roster from Class-A-Lansing, Catcher Alejandro Kirk has hit safely in nine of the 11 games he's played in a D-Jays uniform (12-35 .343 BA, 6 RBI). The Toronto Blue Jays 29th ranked prospect drove in the winning runs on May 6th and scored the winning tally on May 8th in games against the Tampa Tarpons.

**LARGE AND IN CHARGE:** Infielder Cullen Large continues to open eyes in 2019. Cullen's name is scattered all over the Florida State League Leaderboard. Large ranks Runs (30)-1st, Doubles (13)-1st, XBH (19)-2nd, OBP (.395)-3rd, BABIP (.400)-T-3rd, wRC+ (162)-4th, wOBA (.406)-4th, OPS (.902)-4th, Total Bases (71)-5th, Slg (.507)-5th, BA (.307)-6th, ISO (.200)-7th. Additionally, Large has hit safely in eight of 10, 15 of 18, and 22 of last 27 games played and has reached base safely in 36 of the last 38 games dating back to April 5th.

**A WORD FROM THE SKIPPER:** Field Manager Cesar Martin-in his first season as the skipper for the Blue Jays, spoke about the team's performance from this past week---

*\* "Weather has been a factor this week and has pushed back some games, but our guys have played hard and have taken the games in a short time in stride."*

## THE WEEK THAT WAS-May 13th-May 19th (4-3)

### MAY 15TH GAMES ONE AND TWO VS. JUPITER (L, 5-1, W, 8-4)

Dunedin fell to Jupiter in game one of the doubleheader by the final of 5-1. LHP Trevor Rogers picked up the win, tossing 5.2 innings, giving up just one earned run and striking out nine. Connor Grant, B.J. Lopez and Riley Mahan each drove in runs for the Hammerheads. Dunedin defeated Jupiter with a thrilling come from behind victory 8-4 in extra innings in the second game of the twin bill. Down 4-1 heading into their final three outs, the Blue Jays rallied with three runs scored with one out. Kacy Clemens started the rally with a double to the corner in right. Norberto Obeso drove in Clemens with a single, and three batters later with the bases loaded, Cal Stevenson walked followed by a Chavez Young walk to tie the game. Ryan Noda stepped to the plate in the bottom of the ninth with the bags juiced again and drilled a homer over the wall in left to win it for Dunedin.

### MAY 16TH GAME THREE VS. JUPITER (W, 1-0)

Kacy Clemens drove in the winning run for the Blue Jays with a walk-off single in the bottom of the ninth to give Dunedin the series win. RHP Dany Jimenez tossed a scoreless inning out of the pen for the victory.

### MAY 17TH GAME FOUR AT. LAKELAND (L, 3-1)

Lakeland set the tone early with two runs in the bottom of the first off RHP Maximo Castillo. Castillo tossed a quality outing (6.0 Inn, 2 ER, 7 H, 4 SO) but was outdueled by RHP Elvin Rodriguez of Lakeland who surrendered just three hits and struck out five on the way to his first quality start and fourth win of the year for the Flying Tigers.

### MAY 18TH GAME FIVE AT. LAKELAND (W, 3-2)

Dunedin returned the favor with a win on Saturday night in Lakeland. The two teams went into extra and in the 11th, Christopher Bec hammered a triple to the alley in left center to score the go-ahead run and give the Blue Jays the lead and eventual win. LHP Nick Allgeyer started and went six innings, giving up a run on just four hits.

### MAY 19TH GAME SIX AND SEVEN VS. LAKELAND (L, 9-1, W, 16-4)

Dunedin and Lakeland played a doubleheader with Lakeland winning game one and Dunedin stealing a victory in game two. In game one, Lakeland scored seven unanswered runs and banged out 15 hits on their way to a 9-1 win. RHP Jesus Rodriguez picked up the win, throwing 6.1 innings, and fanning six. In game two, the Blue Jays' bats came alive and scored 16 runs on 17 hits. Dunedin scored six runs in the second and fourth innings, and four in the sixth. Norberto Obeso and Cullen Large each registered three RBI in the game.
