## GROWING THE GAME

When USL launched its outdoor program in 1989, there were only 19 professional soccer teams in the country and no organized lower divisions for the sport. That eight-team USL outdoor league has grown into the 64-team Premier Development League while USL has developed into one of the most sophisticated sports organizations in the U.S. and Canada.

Always a pioneer in the sport, USL launched the W-League in 1995 - long before women's professional soccer was born - and created the first national youth league with the Super Y-League in 1999. Today, USL oversees the development of players, coaches, referees and administrators that participate in six different leagues that encompass more than 120 men's and women's franchises and more than 500 youth teams.

All eyes this past summer were focused on South Africa, host of the 2010 FIFA World Cup. Those eyes saw several players developed through the USL system such as Tim Howard, Jozy Altidore, Jay DeMerit, Marcus Hahnemann and Herculez Gomez. The list includes U.S. veterans who broke into the professional game in the USL First Division, such as Hahnemann, to Premier Development League products (Gomez). Leading the charge as the first generation of Super Y-League alums to reach the world stage is Altidore.

The vertically-integrated structure of USL has been in place for a decade and the dividends of the early years are already beginning to show. With USL, Major League Soccer and Women's Professional Soccer teams focused on growing the game through a dedicated pyramid of soccer leagues from the youth ranks to the pros, future generations will continue to improve, year after year and tournament after tournament.

At the launch of WPS, 88 former W-League players were among those allocated or selected for the inaugural seven teams in 2009. It was no surprise as 54 current or former W-League players had participated in the 2007 FIFA Women's World Cup. In January of 2011, the Major League Soccer SuperDraft saw 37 PDL players selected and the WPS Draft featured 13 former W-League players.

The five stand-alone sites feature USL PRO, the I-League, the Premier Development League, the W-League and USL Youth Development. An easy-to-use drop down box allows fans to navigate back and forth between the various league sites on the USL Soccer Network.

Fans visiting the USL PRO, I-League, PDL, W-League and Youth Development sites will receive the latest news and notes regarding each league as well as team and player information, schedules, stats and standings. The addition of a "News" tab on each site offers fans access to a variety of new USL features such as the "Technical Edge" series of training tips offered by USL National Technical Director Peter Mellor and the "USL Success Stories" series highlighting some of the many national and international



stars who have developed their careers in USL leagues. The "News" tab also offers fans access to all the scores and highlights from national and international events featuring USL clubs, such as the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup and the CONCACAF Champions League.

Another new addition to the sites is an "Events" tab where fans can go for features and info about annual USL events such as USL SoccerFest, men's and women's player combines and the Super Y-League ODP showcases.

## EXPANDING INTERNATIONAL HORIZONS

USL has become the place to be when it comes to an international influence of players, clubs, and executives in North America. Given the organization's unique landscape of clubs from the youth to professional ranks, USL provides many opportunities for foreign clubs to develop affiliations and partnerships with its franchises. Identifying talented players and creating new commercial opportunities is a priority for clubs around the world, and USL provides clubs the best platform to connect these opportunities with clubs that desire to have a presence in North America.

In 2008, USL embarked on an international development initiative to connect USL clubs with foreign counterparts. As part of this initiative, USL partnered with Beswicks Sports, the specialist sports division of the United Kingdom-based legal group Beswicks. As USL's representative in the UK to broker partnerships between British football clubs and USL franchises, Beswicks Sports has been able to open up new avenues for clubs from across the Atlantic to make new professional partnerships.

The partnership with Beswicks Sports paid immediate dividends for USL, formalizing affiliations with English clubs such as Burnley and Stoke City FC. In addition, Beswicks was integral to the hiring of former West Ham United player

Anthony Hudson when he took the coaching reins at Real Maryland FC of the USL Second Division for the 2009 season.

"Forming strategic partnerships with European professional clubs is something we recognize is vital to our growth in the future, at the league and club level," USL Senior Director of International Development Francisco Marcos said.

"The interest levels in USL and its various leagues have never been higher throughout Europe," said Gary Mellor, partner at Beswicks. "European clubs recognize that USL provides them with unequalled access to North American young talent as well as the opportunity to forge strategic partnerships and the commercial opportunities that follow."

## USL PRO

USL PRO is the strongest, best operated and most sophisticated North American men's professional soccer league below MLS, both on and off the field. In addition to league play, USL PRO teams will compete in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup as well as various domestic and international exhibitions. ## USL I-LEAGUE

The I-League is a national indoor soccer league that features an economically viable model for team owners. Set to debut in 2011, the I-League will offer high-level professional indoor soccer in regionalized divisions. The launch of the I-League is the initial phase of USL's efforts to build the soccer pyramid to meet the growing demands of the indoor game.

## SENIOR DEVELOPMENT LEAGUES



### PREMIER DEVELOPMENT LEAGUE

The top U23 men's league in North America, the USL Premier Development League (PDL) features 64 teams within four conferences across the United States and Canada. The PDL season consists of 16 regular season matches for each team, eight home and eight away, and provides elite collegiate players the opportunity to taste a higher level of competition while maintaining their eligibility. In addition to league play, PDL teams compete in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup as well as various exhibitions. The USL Premier Development League has proven to be an important stepping-stone for top professionals now playing throughout the world.



### W-LEAGUE

The first and longest-standing women's league in North America, the W-League is USL's highest level of women's soccer in the United States and Canada. The 2011 USL W-League campaign will feature 27 teams in three regional conferences playing 10-14 regular season matches. In addition to featuring international and professional stars, elite amateur players have the opportunity to compete on amateur teams in the league while maintaining their collegiate eligibility. The league is recognized throughout the world for providing superior competition for female players, while offering affordable family entertainment for fans across North America.

## YOUTH DEVELOPMENT LEAGUES



### SUPER-20 LEAGUE

As the only U20 men's and women's North American amateur league, the USL Super-20 League provides the platform for top 17- to 20-year-olds in the United States and Canada to compete at the elite level. While serving as a reserve team system for many W-League and Premier Development League teams, the USL Super-20 League features teams competing in regional divisions, consisting of 8-10 regular season matches throughout the summer months.



### SUPER Y-LEAGUE

Founded in 1999, the Super Y-League is dedicated to the progression of future professional players. Averaging 700 teams since 2004, the Super Y-League has steered the course for development of elite clubs, players, and coaches. Affiliated with U.S. Soccer, the Super Y-League ODP Program has opened countless doors for players to be identified for U.S. National Team programs. The Super Y-League contains the youth academies of Major League Soccer clubs, USL PRO clubs, Premier Development League and W-League clubs.

The league also serves clubs looking to develop the game from the ground up. Top youth academies such as the Chicago Magic, Mass Premier Soccer and TSF Academy have been members of the league for several seasons. USL's Super Y-League has revolutionized youth player development in North America.

## ALEC PAPADAKIS – CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

As Chief Executive Officer of USL, Papadakis serves as USL's top executive as well as an owner. Also the Chief Executive Officer and Managing Partner of NuRock Soccer Holdings, Papadakis has 35 years of domestic and international experience as a franchise attorney.

As a player in the North American Soccer League for the Atlanta Chiefs and the Boston Minutemen, Papadakis had a long, successful career in the United States at the collegiate and professional level, earning numerous accolades. He played in Atlanta for three seasons, the first two with the Chiefs and the third with the Apollos, appearing in 39 games.

He finished his career with the Boston Minutemen in 1974. His teams captured conference

regular season championships in 1971 and 1974.

Papadakis attended Hartwick College (New York) where he was a three-time First Team All-American. He received his law degree in 1976 at the University of Akron, where he also served as an assistant soccer coach.



## TIM HOLT – PRESIDENT

Tim Holt joined USL as director. USL First Division operations in April 1999, added the responsibility of overseeing the operations of all USL senior leagues in November of 2002, and was named vice president in 2004. He was promoted to his current position and named to the United Soccer Leagues Board of Directors in the fall of 2009 after serving as the executive vice president and COO since the beginning of 2007.

Holt served on the US Soccer Federation (USSF) Board of Directors from 2003-06, is currently the Men's Professional Representative on the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Board of Directors, and has been co-chair of the Lamar Hunt US Open Cup Committee after previously serving on the USSF Disciplinary Committee. In 2006, Holt was named one of Soccer America's 'Rising Stars,' recognizing the top American soccer executives under the age of 35.

Prior to joining USL, Holt was the Facility Manager for SoccerZone in Lansing (Mich.), where he was responsible for the operation of

a multi-million dollar indoor sports complex. A product of the respected FC DELCO youth club in suburban Philadelphia, Holt also served as its Director of Tournaments in 1995 & 1996 organizing and operating a 200+ team national youth soccer tournament.

Holt graduated "With Distinction" from Penn State in 1994 with a BS in Management. He went on to earn his Masters in Sport Administration at Florida State in 1998. A native of suburban Philadelphia, Holt is a member of the Radnor HS Soccer Hall of Fame. He holds a USSF coaching license and has coached at both the elite youth club and scholastic levels.





## FRANCISCO MARCOS – SENIOR DIRECTOR OF INTL. DEVELOPMENT

Francisco Marcos began his path toward becoming a prominent figure in U.S. soccer by launching the magazine Soccer Monthly, which eventually became the official magazine of the U.S. Soccer Federation, while playing collegiately at Hartwick College in upstate New York.

Following graduation in 1968, Marcos created American International Sports Exchange, the first American company to develop soccer tours for teams in the US. He was responsible for recruiting the foreign contingency that became the Philadelphia Atoms championship team of 1973, leading to his position with the Tampa Bay Rowdies in 1974.

As the director of public relations and director of soccer operations and development, he and the Rowdies led a Tampa edition of a nationwide movement to teach Americans soccer. Marcos shifted to the NASL's Dallas Tornado in 1979, where he served as vice president of player personnel, joining his former coach, Al Miller. In 1980 he ignited a third soccer community in the Calgary Boomers before returning to

Tampa in 1981 as executive VP of the Rowdies.

Marcos' greatest soccer vision – a group of national leagues blanketing the United States - took off in 1986 with the birth of USL.



In 2007 Marcos was honored with the U.S. Soccer Werner Fricker Builder Award, the greatest recognition bestowed by U.S. Soccer upon members. The award is presented annually to an individual who has worked tirelessly in furthering the interest of the sport of soccer without regard to personal recognition or advancement.

Adding to his list of honors, Marcos was nominated for Induction into the U.S. Soccer Hall of Fame in 2011

## PETER MELLOR – NATIONAL TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

A former professional goalkeeper and longtime member of the U.S. National Team coaching staff, Mellor became USL's first national technical director in February of 2010. A staff coach with the United States Soccer Federation since 1992, Mellor manages the technical aspects of USL's player development programs and assists USL teams in scouting, development and advancement of players.

A professional goalkeeper for two decades, Mellor played 17 years in the top three tiers of English professional soccer with Burnley, Fulham, Hereford United and Portsmouth. He also served as the English U-23 National Team goalkeeper from 1969-70. Mellor's acclaim, however, is for his coaching. He joined the U.S. National Team staff in 1992 and became one of the foremost goalkeeping instructors in the United States.

Among the players Mellor has identified or coached are Kasey Keller, Marcus Hahnemann, Brad Friedel, Landon Donovan, DaMarcus

Beasley, Freddy Adu, Oguchi Onyewu, Michael Bradley, Bobby Convey and Tim Howard, whom he originally identified at age 14 and placed into the ODP program.



Mellor has also worked with numerous players on the women's side of the game, including starting U.S. Women's National Team goalkeeper Hope Solo. He will be equally involved with the development of women's players in USL's W-League, Super-20 League and Super Y-League. Mellor designed and authored the curriculum for the first U.S. Soccer National Goalkeeping License for coaches.

### **CHRIS ECONOMIDES – SENIOR DIRECTOR, USL PRO & I-LEAGUE**

A member of the USL Hall of Fame as a Builder, the former co-owner and co-founder of both the Rochester Rhinos and Carolina RailHawks joined USL in November of 2008. He was a regular member of the USL-1 Executive Committee and helped guide the Rhinos to four league and Open Cup championships. His success helped earn recognition on Street & Smith's Sports Business Journal's Top 40 Under 40 list of sports executives in 1999 and the 2001 USL-1 Executive of the Year honor.



### **AMANDA DUFFY – SENIOR DIRECTOR, W-LEAGUE**

After two seasons as operations director for USL-2, Duffy took over as senior director of the W-League in 2010. Duffy joined USL full time as league operations administrator in March of 2008 and spent the 2008 season overseeing operations for USL-1 and USL-2. The former W-League player helped guide the Hampton Roads Piranhas to their league championship in 2003, and has played for the Central Florida Krush and Danmarks IF (Sweden). The East Carolina University masters graduate also serves as a girls youth soccer coach.



### **JEFF MCRANEY – SENIOR DIRECTOR, PDL**

McRaney was named senior director of the Premier Development League in 2010 and oversees operations and administration for USL's most successful brand. He joined the USL staff as senior director of youth development in May, 2007. McRaney's extensive background includes serving on the staff for the various U.S. National Teams, and his responsibilities took him to the 1998 World Cup in France, the 1998 U.S. Women's Cup and the 1998 Goodwill Games. In 1999, he helped implement and manage the first U.S. Under-17 National Team Residency Program in Bradenton, Fla. # US SOCCER FEDERATION



## ABOUT US SOCCER FEDERATION

Founded in 1913, U.S. Soccer is one of the world's first organizations to be affiliated with FIFA, the Federation Internationale de Football Association, soccer's world governing body. U.S. Soccer has continued to grow in the 90-plus years since, and now has the largest membership among U.S. Olympic Committee national governing bodies.

As the governing body of soccer in all its forms in the United States, U.S. Soccer has helped chart the course for the sport in the USA for more than 90 years. In this time, the Federation's mission statement has been very simple and very clear: to make soccer, in all its forms, a preeminent sport in the United States and to continue the development of soccer at all recreational and competitive levels.

To that end, the sports growth in the past two decades has been nothing short of remarkable. In 1989, the U.S. Men's National Team hadn't played in a World Cup in 40 years and the U.S. Women's program was just four years old. U.S. Soccer was playing games in small stadiums that were rarely filled to capacity. There were few

games being televised (and none without commercials during play). There were no soccer-specific stadiums, and there were no high-level professional outdoor leagues of which to speak.

Since that time, things have evolved significantly. The U.S. MNT recently competed in its fifth consecutive World Cup, and advanced to the quarterfinals at the 2002 event. U.S. Soccer is a world leader in women's soccer at every level, and the team has won two Women's World Cups, along with two Olympic Gold Medals. The United States has also hosted three World Cups with the support of its members and strong organizational abilities.

Professionally, Major League Soccer recently celebrated its 16th season of play and continues to further the development of the American player, along with the three-tiered developmental system, United Soccer Leagues. Perhaps most importantly of all, though, no fewer than five major soccer specific stadiums are in place now coast-to-coast with more facilities en route.

## US OPEN CUP

Dating back to 1914, the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup is the oldest cup competition in United States soccer and is among the oldest in the world. Open to all affiliated amateur and professional teams in the United States, the annual U.S. Open Cup is a single-elimination tournament.

## NATIONAL TEAMS

The U.S. Soccer Federation is charged with the responsibility of managing the senior and youth national teams that participate in official FIFA competitions.

## FIFA WORLD CUP

In addition to the U.S. men competing in their sixth consecutive World Cup, the US Soccer Federation has played host to three FIFA World Cup events. The U.S. hosted the 1994 Men's World Cup and the FIFA Women's World Cup of 1999 and 2003.

# US OPEN CUP



The Dewar Cup is awarded to the tournament champion

Dating back to 1914, the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup is the oldest cup competition in United States soccer and is among the oldest in the world. Open to all affiliated amateur and professional teams in the United States, the annual U.S. Open Cup is a single-elimination tournament.

A total of 40 professional and amateur teams will compete in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup when it kicks off in June. The tournament will feature eight MLS clubs, the 11 U.S.-based USL PRO teams, nine qualifiers from the Premier Development League and 12 USASA qualifiers.

Although the tournament proper, conducted by the USSF, only consists of 40 teams, qualifying for the event includes nearly 100 clubs total from United Soccer Leagues and Major League Soccer alone. The USASA's National Open tournament provides hundreds of other teams from around the country the opportunity to qualify for the honor of competing in the event.

The U.S. Open Cup is a single-elimination tournament, with games tied after regulation being decided in two 15-minute overtime halves. If neither team scores during the overtime period, the winner is decided on penalty kicks. The team that advances the furthest from each level except Division 1 earns a \$10,000 cash prize. The runner-up takes home \$50,000, while the champion collects \$100,000. The winner also will have the team's name engraved on the historic Dewar Challenge Trophy, the oldest trophy in American team sports.

## US OPEN CUP REVIEW

The Charleston Battery and Harrisburg City Islanders carried the USL flag proudly in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup as both pulled upsets of Major League Soccer opposition to reach the quarterfinals of the 2010 competition.

Charleston had already defeated its rival, the Carolina RailHawks, 2-1 in the second round of the competition when it travelled to face the Chicago Fire at Toyota Park in the Round of 16. After 120 scoreless minutes, the Battery's Lamar Neagle, Mike Zaher and Ian Fuller all kept their cool from the penalty spot to give the club a 3-0 shootout victory and passage into the quarterfinals.

Harrisburg also scored a dramatic victory against the New York Red Bulls. Hosting the soon-to-be Eastern Conference regular season champions, the City Islanders more than held their own into overtime, and with three minutes remaining substitute Dominic Oppong scored on the rebound of Geoff Bloes' shot.

Neither side was able to recreate its performance in the quarterfinals, the Battery falling 3-0 to the Columbus Crew and the Islanders falling 2-0 to D.C. United.

Other USL clubs that had a good year included the Portland Timbers, who in their final season before making the move to MLS were edged out by regional rival the Seattle Sounders on penalties in the Round of 16. Orlando City, the Richmond Kickers and Rochester Rhinos also came up narrowly short against MLS competition.

# 2010 CHAMPIONSHIP

## CHARLESTON HOLDS OFF RICHMOND

It took a spectacular finish, but the Charleston Battery held on to defeat the Richmond Kickers, 2-1, to capture the 2010 United Soccer Leagues Second Division Championship in front of 4,523 on August 28 at Blackbaud Stadium. If not for a pair of clutch saves and a little bit of luck, the ending could have been much different.

"It was exciting for all the fans but not for a coach," Battery Head Coach Mike Anhaeuser said of a final five minutes that saw Richmond skim one off the crossbar and have the potential tying goal headed off the line by a defender. "It made it exciting for everyone here and made for a great finish, and it showed what this team is all about."

Goals from Lamar Neagle and Ian Fuller staked Charleston to a 2-0 lead, but the Kickers fought back and pulled within one after a tally in the 73rd minute by Edson Elcock. With Charleston playing a man down for the final hour, Richmond turned on the heat and the national television audience watching on Fox Soccer Channel was treated to a heart-stopping finish. Elcock skipped one off the crossbar in the 89th minute, and Fuller came to the rescue to head away a Matt Delicâte shot ticketed for the top corner in the final seconds.

"[Delicâte] had a great strike on it and it just came right to me and I reacted," said Fuller, who also had a hand in the first Charleston goal. "That's the kind of team they are; they're going to fight through everything. They're a quality side."

"Once they got a goal, it's in the back of your mind that it may not happen, but at that point we were still a goal up and we were fighting through it. Tim [Melia] made some great saves and our back line was superb."

Richmond Head Coach Leigh Cowlshaw believed his squad had a great chance to win in extra time if it had found the second goal.

"We thought we had a good chance to tie the game and then go on to win it, no question," Cowlshaw said. "When you play against a team that goes down to 10 men you expect that you can go out and find a way to win it. Charleston showed that they are true champions. They got that second goal and they hung in there."

The title was Charleston's third since the team was founded in 1993, the second in USL-2. The Battery captured the 1996 title before moving up to the A-League, where they took home the 2003 championship.

The regular season champions threatened first 15 minutes in when a long ball from midfield forced Richmond keeper Ronnie Pascale just outside his box where he managed to disrupt the play against a hard-charging Alioune Gueye. Pascale barely managed to avoid a hand ball on the play.

A short time later Charleston threatened again, with league scoring champion and MVP Neagle flicking a header to the far post that fellow striker and game MVP Tom Heinemann just couldn't get to. On Charleston's next attack it broke through, with Mike Zaher's corner in the 26th minute finding Fuller, who turned and fired low. Heinemann used a deft back-heel to redirect the ball to Neagle, who slotted it home to give the hosts the lead.

A straight red in the 29th for Charleston's Colin Falvey quickly changed the tone and renewed the defending champions' hopes. Falvey was whistled for tripping up Richmond striker Delicâte, who broke through the defense and was headed to goal. Richmond, which defeated Pittsburgh, 2-0, in the Semifinal, failed to capitalize on the ensuing free kick. With Falvey off Charleston dropped into a more defensive formation, moving Neagle into the midfield and leaving Heinemann alone up top.

Delicâte had Richmond's best chance of the first half on a header from 10 yards in stoppage time, but the ball fell into the hands of Battery keeper Tim Melia and the half ended 1-0.

It only took six minutes in the second half for Charleston to extend the lead, with Fuller burying a volley off Pascale's fingertips after Heinemann out-jumped a pair of Richmond defenders to win the ball.

Richmond came close to pulling one back soon after, with Melia getting a hand Elcock's header to preserve the lead. The Battery dropped into a defensive shell the rest of the way, giving up the majority of the possession to Richmond but keeping most of the action away from their goal until the final minutes.

The Kickers finally broke through when second team All-League defender Sascha Gorres fed Elcock in the box and he made no mistake, burying a low shot inside the far post to make the score 2-1.



# USL I-LEAGUE

The I-League is a national indoor soccer league that features an economically viable model for team owners. Set to debut in November, the I-League will offer high-level professional indoor soccer in regionalized divisions. The launch of the I-League is the initial phase of USL's efforts to build the soccer pyramid to meet the growing demands of the indoor game

Short-term plans for the league include regional divisions in the Northeast, Midwest, Mid-Atlantic, Mid-South and Southeast.

The establishment of the I-League fills a marketplace need for a professional indoor soccer league model that is economically viable for team owners. The I-League is scheduled to kick off in November, 2011 and conclude with its inaugural championship in February/March, 2012.

Consistent with the model that has properly served USL for the past quarter-century, competition will be regionally based in order to contain travel expenses, and culminate with a national championship. USL intends to affiliate the I-League directly with the U.S. Soccer Federation, which is currently without a sanctioned professional indoor soccer league.

"One of the most exciting aspects of the I-League is that it will provide existing USL professional outdoor teams with the ability to operate on a year-round basis," USL President Tim Holt said. "Additionally, the teams would have the opportunity to retain many of their established players for the entire year."

While indoor soccer is often thought of as a modern creation, the rich history of the game dates as far back as 1885, when a Canadian side faced a team from New Jersey in a series of games. Professional indoor soccer of today is a fast-paced, fiercely competitive game that features creative dribbling, pinpoint passing and acrobatic goalkeeping.

Timbers' All-Conference defenseman Ryan Kawoluk provided the long ball that helped pad the lead 61 minutes in. Again pulling Paterson out of his area, Richards rose above the Chill players and neatly headed into the open net. Up 3-1, there was no looking back as the always vociferous Timbers Army upped the volume a notch.

Thunder Bay couldn't find any room and each run into the Portland half was snuffed out. Fourteen minutes from time the Timbers iced the game as Sergio Vallalva's foul on Jordan Crasilnek in the box left referee Laudani pointing at the spot. Braun's cool finish down the middle put the Timbers up, 4-1. With the final whistle history was made as the Portland Timbers U23s ran the gauntlet untouched and ended the season 20-0-0.





# 2010 W-LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP

## FLASH TAKE 2010 W-LEAGUE TITLE

On a clear, warm evening at Harry Welch Stadium in Santa Clarita, California, the Buffalo Flash met the Vancouver Whitecaps in a battle of undefeated teams for 2010 W-League Championship Presented by Umbro. In the end it was the Flash who were too much, defeating Vancouver, 3-1, to claim the 2010 W-League Championship.

Kelly Parker and Veronica Boquete led Buffalo all season and the 2010 Championship match was no different. Despite being down 1-0 in the second half, the Flash responded with three goals - two from Boquete - to take the Championship.

The first half started tentatively, with both sides looking nervous to take too many risks. In the 10th minute Buffalo began to fall into a rhythm, controlling possession and sending prodding balls through Vancouver's back line. The Flash seemed unable to make the last touch to set up a chance on goal.

Vancouver did well to smother W-League MVP Parker early, not allowing her to make the runs and passes she is accustomed to. After withstanding a wave of Flash pressure, the Whitecaps began to turn the tide midway through the first half.

Vancouver showed their strength on set plays, orchestrating a number of dangerous throw-ins by Robyn Gayle. The Whitecaps thought they had taken a 1-0 lead as they buried a ball in the net off a throw in, but the goal was called back for a shirt tug on an opposing player.

The teams continued to trade possession for the remainder of the half, but neither could break through and the half ended scoreless.

The second half began with Melanie Booth coming on for Vancouver. Booth had scored a second-half goal for the Whitecaps in the semi-final and Vancouver was hoping for the same effort.

In the 57th minute, the Whitecaps had their response, as the midfield played a ball forward



and Buffalo defender Eartha Pond took a poor touch at the top of the box. Whitecaps midfielder Amy Vermeulan first-timed the poor touch into the back of net, making the Flash pay for their mistake. The 20-yard rocket caught Buffalo keeper Pamela Tajonar off her line, as the ball sailed over her head.

The high-scoring Flash responded quickly. In the 61st minute Parker finally broke free of the Vancouver defense, raced into the box, and laid the ball off to her right to Gemma Davison, who tied the match at 1-1.

Buffalo was not complacent with a tie, as it took the lead in the 64th minute. Boquete received a ball from Mele French, turned and raced at the Vancouver goal. Boquete cut through two Whitecap defenders and smashed the ball into the net to give Buffalo a 2-1 lead.

The Whitecaps refused to lie down and began to send players forward in an attempt to tie the match. Vancouver was able to draw fouls to set themselves up for a number of set plays, but they could not convert.

Having pushed many of their players forward, the Whitecaps became vulnerable to the counterattack late. In the 87th minute Parker pushed the ball forward on a breakaway and shot just wide. Parker broke free again a minute later and slipped the ball behind the Whitecap line to Boquete, who took the ball to the net and slammed it home for a 3-1 lead, sealing the championship for the Flash.

Four minutes later the referee blew the whistle and the Buffalo Flash were officially the 2010 W-League Champions. Boquete was named the Championship Game MVP on the back of her two-goal performance.

### Hudson Valley Takes Consolation

In the 2010 W-League Championship consolation match, the Hudson Valley Quickstrike Lady Blues faced the Atlanta Silverbacks. Coming off a disappointing performance Thursday, the W-League regular season champions rebounded to take out the Silverbacks, 3-0.

Gabriela Demoner had a superb match, scoring two goals and controlling the run of play.





### USL SUPER Y-LEAGUE (BOYS/GIRLS U12-U17)

Since founding the Super Y-League in 1999, United Soccer Leagues has seen the limitless growth potential in soccer beginning at the youth levels and advancing through the professional ranks. By establishing a concrete soccer foundation through highly competitive and developmental youth programs such as the SYL, USL allows players to develop and compete with one club through the duration of their careers.

The Super Y-League is excited about the addition of U12 boys and girls age groups for the 2011 season, giving the league six age groups for the first time. In conjunction with the other SYL age divisions, the U12 division will also offer an Olympic Development Program.

Created in 1999 with 12 teams, the USL Super Y-League now includes 88 club programs across the United States and Canada with an average of 500 teams competing in the league every summer. The U12 divisions will maintain the same rules and regulations of the league's U13-U17 age groups, with its first season concluding at the 2011 USL Super Y-League North American Finals.

Many of the clubs participating in the league are now affiliated with the top professional and amateur men's and women's sides of USL and Major League Soccer, providing a true pyramid of development that mirrors those in "soccer nations" around the globe.

In its first few years, the league was primarily a vehicle for the top players to come together and face higher-level competition at a regional and/or national level on a regular basis. Now, the Super Y-League's fully operational ODP system helps propel the careers of elite players to the upper levels of the professional game in North America.

The Super Y-League North American Finals was the first step in the implementation of ODP status. Making the finals an official scouting event for identifying players for national team pools was just a starting point, however.

Part of the mission was to impress upon the senior clubs in North America the importance of playing a significant role in player development. Many professional teams in the U.S. and Canada have used the league to begin their process of establishing academy programs that link the player development system from youth to pro.





# ABOUT SUPER-20

## USL SUPER-20 LEAGUE (MEN/WOMEN U-20)

United Soccer Leagues announced the creation of the USL Super-20 League in early 2006. The league is designed as a graduating youth league for elite players from 17-20 as they advance beyond the traditional youth bracket to the senior professional and amateur development leagues. The Super-20 League, for men and women, replaced the U19 age bracket of the Super Y-League, creating a wider range for players on the cusp of playing for PDL or W-League teams.

The league was designed to cater to the top of the youth ranks in the U.S. and Canada for players aspiring to play professionally. It also serves as a reserve division for USL's Premier Development League and W-League teams, which have increasingly taken youth development of this age range under their auspices. PDL and W-League teams are able to add USL Super-20 teams to expand their development goals as well as their player pool for the senior team.

In addition to the USL Super-20 League completing the model for club building and vertical integration, it will aid U.S. Soccer and the Canadian Soccer Association in identifying the top players for international competition ranging from U17 to U20.

Recent Super-20 expansion has included the additions of Rock Mountain and Pacific Northwest divisions.

United Soccer Leagues announced the Super-20 League First 11 and Second 11 club rankings for the 2010 season, recognizing the league's top clubs on a competitive and administrative basis. Sharing the honors as the top overall club in the Super-20 League this season were Mid Atlantic Division rivals Princeton Soccer and the Brooklyn Knights, who performed equally well on and off the field in 2010.

## THE SUPER Y-LEAGUE ODP PHILOSOPHY

To identify players for U.S. National Team programs within their natural environment during competition on their club team during the Super Y-League season.

## PURPOSE

The Super Y-League ODP system was started in 2003 to recognize a pool of players in each age group for identification to U.S. National Team programs and to utilize the clubs system in the United States to identify players.

## ENHANCEMENTS FOR 2011

1. World-class facility: train at IMG Soccer Academy in Bradenton, Fla. on the same fields used by MLS players, U.S. National Team players, and other top players from around the world.
2. USL National Technical Director Peter Mellor to oversee ODP sessions (former English professional player with Burnley, Fulham, Portsmouth etc.)
3. Holistic program featuring mental and physical conditioning
4. Nutrition session
5. Movement session
6. Playing analysis

## HOW DO I PARTICIPATE?

Contact a local Super Y-League club in order to become a part of the Super Y-League ODP system. Players will be scouted during league play by the national scouting system of the Super Y-League, which is comprised of all of the coaches within the clubs of the league.

## PROGRAM DESCRIPTION HISTORY

In 2002, the Super Y-League, through US Soccer and the United States Olympic Committee, was granted ODP programs to identify players for U.S. National Team Programs. The first selection process began during the 2003 season to identify players for Regional Team selection events, where U.S. National Staff Coaches scouted players for National Team Programs. In addition to many players being identified for U.S. National Team Programs, top players are identified by leading college and university soccer programs throughout the United States.

## THE SUPER Y-LEAGUE ODP SELECTION PROCESS

During the regular season players are evaluated during their games by the opposing team coaches for tactical, physical and psychological characteristics that will determine their ability to attend the ODP National Camp typically held in February and March. Through the scouting system, the combined nominations will be used, along with proportional allocation in conjunction with Director of Coaching

recommendations, to determine invitations to the ODP camps. The overall number of games and teams will also be factored into this process.

## WHAT ARE SYL ODP NATIONAL CAMPS?

The top players chosen by the scouting system in each age group per geographic division of the Super Y-League will attend the ODP National Camp. These camps are attended by U.S. National Staff Coaches to identify players for U.S. National Team Programs, as well as many of the nation's top collegiate coaches. The camps are typically held in Florida during February and March.

## WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF THE SYL ODP SYSTEM?

1. The selection of players within their natural environment on their club teams within league play, as opposed to an open-tryout system. Many players do not participate in the open-tryout ODP system operated by state associations, and other players do not perform well in the open tryout process.
2. Exposure to the U.S. National Staff and team coaches
3. Exposure to professional and collegiate scouts
4. There is no cost to be scouted or to try out. The scouting system is built into league play and contains no additional ODP fees. Only those selected to attend ODP camps will incur camp fees.

## SELECTION PROCESS

**STEP 1:** Players will be evaluated over the course of the Super Y-League season by the coaches of opposing teams as well as their own club. Nominations from score sheets will be tallied each week and a midseason report will be sent to each Club.

**STEP 2:** At the completion of the season, or specified time, the combined nominations will be used, along with proportional allocation in conjunction with Director of Coaching recommendations, to determine invitations to the 2009-2010 ODP camps. The overall number of games and teams will also be factored into this process.

**STEP 3:** The selected ODP players will attend the ODP National Camp held on their corresponding age group date.

**STEP 4:** Once at the ODP Select Camp, players will be evaluated over intense competition and training by the ODP Staff. At the completion of the event a final selection for the ODP Select Team will be made recognizing the top players in the Super Y-League. Once this selection has been made, certain ODP Select Teams may be invited to participate in events beyond the camps.

The Majestics finished group play without giving up a goal and continued their tournament shutout downing Coastal WFC, 3-0, in the semifinal match.


### U13 BOYS CHAMPIONSHIP

"After the [Ranger's] goal we started playing our style," Valle said. "Our style of play, the type of soccer we believe in, did not change."

## CREW JR.'S TAKE MEN'S CROWN

Winning cup finals has become a habit for the Columbus Crew Juniors.

A week after their triumph in the McGuire Cup at the United States Youth Soccer National Championships, in which the Crew became the first Major League Soccer side to win the trophy, the Crew Juniors defeated the Los Angeles Galaxy, 2-1, to claim the 2010 Super-20 Men's title.

The tournament was hosted by the Chicago Fire at the Sportscore Complexes in Rockford, Illinois.

With a roster that contained 13 of the 19 players from the previous week's cup-winning squad, the Crew took awhile to get settled on this hot and sunny afternoon at Wedgbury Stadium.

Early on, the battle of possession was a stalemate between the two MLS junior sides. Both defenses soaked up the pressure being applied by the respective offenses.

The best chance in the first half hour was the left goalpost that was hit by the Crew in the 27th minute. Eight minutes later, Columbus was the first to get on the board.

Crew midfielder Travis Wall collected the ball inside the Galaxy half and dribbled his way into an opening where he released a hard, low shot. The ball took a deflection off a Galaxy defender and went past wrong-footed goalkeeper Earl Edwards, putting the home side up, 1-0.

Reeling from the unfortunate goal, the Galaxy turned their attention to grabbing an equalizer. Their answer came a mere three minutes later.

In a flash, forward Gyasi Zardes weaved his way through the Crew defense on the left flank, holding off a defender before finishing past the outstretched fingertips of Justin Luthy. That brought the score line to 1-1 in the 38th minute. The intensity level ratcheted up shortly after, but the game remained deadlocked at the halftime interval.

The second half saw each team resume the entertaining brand of attacking soccer. In the 72nd minute, the Galaxy had their best chance to take the lead. On a set piece just outside of the Crew's penalty area, LA midfielder Eder Arreola put a free kick on net that bended to the back left post. Luthy jumped to grab the ball out of the air, but pulled back at the last second, thinking Arreola's shot would fly over the top.

At the last moment, the ball dipped down and careened off the post, sparing the blushes of the Columbus goalkeeper and leaving LA in agony.

With the game time temperature hanging around the low 80s, the heat, as well as the three days of previous tournament action, began to take its toll in the legs of the players. It seemed as though the game was heading to extra time.

With 10 minutes remaining in regulation, a penalty was awarded to Columbus after an Everett Pitts foul inside of the LA box. The Crew's Ben Speas stepped up to take the spot kick, burying it past Edwards' left as the goalkeeper guessed the wrong direction.

With the 2-1 lead, the Crew dealt with the onslaught of Galaxy pressure as the west coast squad looked for the crucial equalizer. On this day, it was not meant to be.

"It was a hard fought game," Crew Head Coach Brian Bliss said. "The Galaxy had the better of it in the first half and were coming in waves. We bent, but did not break. I think we played much better in the second half."

"Most of these guys played in a very tough tournament last week in the McGuire Cup," said Bliss. "To come here with two-thirds of that roster and grind it out over four days to win the championship, that sort of thing will not be repeated again. I am extremely proud of my team."

Crew forward Aaron Horton was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player following the match.

# RULES

## AFFILIATIONS

USL is directly affiliated with the United States Soccer Federation (USSF), United States Adult Soccer Association (USASA), the Canadian Soccer Association (CSA), the Puerto Rican Football Federation (PRFF) and the Bermudan Football Association (BFA).

## ROSTERS

USL rosters may consist of a maximum of 26 players, with 18 designated for each game. In the PDL, a maximum of eight (8) players may be over the age of 23. In USL PRO, each team is permitted a maximum of seven (7) foreign players on its active game-day roster and on its master roster. The PDL and W-League are permitted a maximum of eight (8) foreign players on both rosters.

## ROSTER FREEZE

Each USL league has a Roster Freeze Date after which no team may register any new players. For 2011, those dates are:

W-League: July 6  
PDL: July 20  
USL Super-20 League: July 15  
USL PRO: July 29  
USL Super Y-League: October 14

## TRANSFER WINDOWS

From the 2011 season and until further notice, FIFA will not register player transfers that take place outside of the following transfer windows:

- January 15 through April 15 (primary window)
- July 15 through August 14 (secondary window)

## AMATEUR PLAYER DEFINITION

An amateur player is defined by the following: A player who does not receive payment for playing soccer and who has signed an amateur registration form with U.S. Soccer or Canadian Soccer Association. Amateur players may be reimbursed for certain expenses as allowed by USSF/CSA/NCAA rules.

## POINT SYSTEM

The standard FIFA (3-1-0) system awards three points for a regulation or overtime victory. In the case of a tie, each team will be awarded one point.

## GAME CLOCK

All games are comprised of 90 minutes (two 45-minute halves). No overtime is utilized.

## LAWS OF THE GAME

USL adheres to all the Laws of the Game as dictated by FIFA, soccer's international governing body.

## SUBSTITUTIONS

Five (5) substitutions are allowed per league game with no re-entry permitted in USL PRO. Six (6) will be allowed in the PDL and W-League with no re-entry.

## STANDINGS TIEBREAKERS

The breaking of ties in the final league standings, playoffs and finals is accomplished by applying the following criteria, listed in order of importance:

The following two guidelines will be followed during the implementation of USL tiebreakers for all ties involving three or more teams:

- 1) The tiebreaker will determine the winner first.
- 2) The tiebreaker will continue to be followed in order to determine the ranking of the remaining teams without restarting from the beginning.
- 1) Head-to-head record based on total points in league games
- 2) Total wins in league games
- 3) Goal difference in league games
- 4) Goals scored in league games
- 5) Total points within smallest grouping. If number of games is unequal, then point percentage will be used.
- 6) Ranking based on points earned against top four group finishers. This tiebreaker will not be used if four or fewer teams comprise the group. If number of games is unequal, then point percentage applies.
- 7) Point percentage outside/smallest division or conference in League games
- 8) Total points in all regular season and Open Cup Qualifying games combined. If number of games is unequal, then point percentage applies
- 9) FIFA Fair Play – Team with fewest disciplinary points in League games. (If number of games is unequal, points will be divided by games played to arrive at a common basis for comparison.)
- 10) Lottery conducted by USL at league office

Point Percentage: number of total points earned / maximum possible points (3 per game)

\* Should more than two teams involved have played each other an UNEQUAL number of times, this tiebreaker will be skipped.

Group: term used to describe the primary unit in which a team competes (i.e. PDL – Southwest Division)

Point Percentage: number of total points earned / maximum possible points (3 per game)



# RULES

## SCHEDULES

**USL PRO:** Teams will play 24 games in the 2011 season, facing each team in their division at least once at home and once on the road. The schedule for teams in the American and National Divisions sees each of the 10 teams play a home-and-home series with the other. In addition, each team also makes one trip to either the Caribbean or Los Angeles for a pair of games, and each team will host two games against competition from the International Division. The final two games that complete the schedule will match traditional rivals. For the five teams in the International Division, each team will play each other four times, twice home and twice away, with four games apiece at home and away against competition from the American and National Divisions.

**PDL:** Each team plays 16 games during the regular season.

**W-League:** Each team plays 10-14 games during the regular season.

## PLAYOFFS

Each league in USL has its own distinct playoff system that will determine the league champion.

**USL PRO:** Eight clubs advance to the postseason, including the top three finishers in the American Division and National Division and the top two in the International Division.

The first round of the 2011 USL PRO Playoffs will feature four single-game quarterfinals taking place Friday-Sunday, August 19-21. The semifinals will be played a week later, with the 2011 USL PRO Championship, hosted by the highest remaining seed, to be played between September 2-4. Remaining teams will be re-seeded following the quarterfinals.

**USL PDL:** Four berths from each conference will be available for 16 total across the league. Due to the Eastern Conference having three divisions, a bye and play-in format will be used to determine the four conference representatives that will move on to the Conference Semifinals.

Additionally, due to the Great Lakes Division having nine teams, that division will be allocated three playoff spots requiring a play-in game between the second and third divisionally seeded Great Lakes Division teams. The winner will join the top seeded Great Lakes Division team at the Conference Semifinals.

The 16 remaining teams will meet for Conference

Semifinal tournaments the weekend after the season concludes with the top seed from each division playing the runners-up from the opposite division. The four conference champions will advance to a Final Four championship tournament the following weekend hosted by one of the four participants.

**W-League:** Ten teams will qualify for the postseason. The top teams from each conference/division will play in either a conference final four or conference single-game match. The three Conference winners will advance to W-League Championship presented by UMBRO held in one location determined prior to the start of the season. The W-League Championship host will be granted the fourth spot in the W-League Championship Final Four.

**Central Conference Playoffs:** The top four seeds from the Central Conference will advance to the Central Conference Championship.

**Eastern Conference Playoffs:** The top two seeds from the Atlantic Division and the top two seeds from the Northeast Division will advance to the Eastern Conference Championship.

**Western Conference Playoffs:** The top two teams meet in a conference championship match.

## SINGLE PLAYOFF MATCHES

During postseason play, single games tied after regulation will be followed by two 15-minute overtime periods played in their entirety. If still tied, FIFA kicks from the penalty mark are used to determine the winner.

## TWO-LEG, AGGREGATE SCORE SERIES

**Playoffs:** Each team will host a regulation 90-minute match. If the series score is tied at the conclusion of the second game (180 minutes total), two 15-minute overtime periods are played in their entirety to determine the series winner. If neither team scores, the series is then decided via FIFA kicks from the penalty mark. Rules governing the play of overtime and penalty kicks are extended from the second match. The higher seed holds the privilege of selecting to host first or second leg unless otherwise noted.

# SOCCERFEST



Tampa once again became “Soccer City” from November 18-23, 2010 when the USL SoccerFest took over the town for the sixth consecutive year. Centered on the USL Super Y-League’s 12th Annual North American Finals, USL SoccerFest is the annual destination for the players, coaches, executives and fans that have made USL the largest organization of elite-level leagues in North America and the Caribbean.

Other components of USL SoccerFest 2010, presented in conjunction with the Tampa Bay Sports Commission, included the popular Five-A-Side Frenzy small-sided tournament at Tampa’s Ed Radice Soccer Complex and USL Annual General Meeting (AGM) at the Hyatt Regency Tampa.

The USL AGM drew hundreds of owners and executives from USL’s professional and amateur teams, as well as other influential figures in the soccer community. The annual gathering featured operations and strategic planning meetings, as well as annual team and executive awards presentations and the USL Hall of Fame dinner.

With the past year’s addition of experienced team services staff to assist all USL teams, the 2010 AGM took on a revitalized feel with many more best practices and team operations seminars available for all USL clubs to attend.

At the Hall of Fame dinner, longtime USL corporate partner UMBRO announced it will provide a comprehensive team kit and apparel package to all USL PRO members, and will actively support all USL PRO initiatives including the Championship, All-Star Game, Men’s Player Combine, and other special events. As a result, the majority of USL PRO teams will feature UMBRO’s double diamond logo and be associated with the brand that has built a strong reputation as supplier to the world’s best soccer teams and the leading grassroots sponsor of the game in the United States.

Former Maccabi Haifa F.C. defender Alon Harazi, now the chief scout for the Israeli Premier League club, was the keynote speaker at the USL AGM and spent time scouting players at the USL Super Y-League North American Finals for his former club.

Harazi joined a large list of coaches that were present at the finals, including U.S. Men’s and Women’s Youth National Team coaches and numerous college coaches looking for future prospects.

The 2010 USL SoccerFest drew more than 10,000 participants, family members, and spectators from throughout the world, with guests filling more than 8,500 hotel room nights, consuming more than 75,000 meals and using more than 800 rental cars.



# SOCCERFEST

The 12th Annual Super Y-League North American Finals featured 140 boys and girls teams and nearly 3,000 players from throughout the U.S. and Canada competing for the right to be called national champions in the U-13 through U-17 age groups. Teams qualified from their respective regions (Mid Atlantic, Midwest, New England, Pacific Northwest, South Atlantic and Southeast) and competed for national titles November 19-23 at Tampa's Ed Radice Soccer Complex and the Land O' Lakes Recreation Center in Pasco County.

The SYL North American Finals once again featured an interactive Player's Village, home to players, families and members of the Tampa soccer community, and a fully enclosed small-sided field, which served as the feature field for the local Five-A-Side Frenzy tournament.

# USL HALL OF FAME

## MCADAMS, LILLEY & MILLER JOIN USL HALL

The late Betsy McAdams, veteran coach Bob Lilley and former Rochester star Doug Miller were chosen for induction into the United Soccer Leagues Hall of Fame in 2010. McAdams was voted in as a Builder, Lilley as a Coach and Miller as a Player, and the trio will be inducted at the USL Hall of Fame Banquet at the Hyatt Regency Tampa on Friday, November 19, 2010. Honorees were chosen through a vote of the USL Hall of Fame Committee, which consists of current Hall of Fame members.

Also inducted into the USL Hall of Fame as 10+ Clubs were the Chicago Fire (PDL), Orange County Blue Star (PDL), Pittsburgh Riverhounds (USL PRO), Seattle Sounders (W-League), Southern California Seahorses (PDL) and Vancouver Whitecaps (W-League).

## CHICAGO FIRE (PDL)

Founded in 2001, the Fire have enjoyed amazing levels of success in the PDL, capturing seven division titles in 10 seasons of existence. A title has eluded the Fire as of yet, as the squad came



up short after advancing to both the 2003 and 2009 championships. The Fire are tough to beat in the regular season, amassing a 124-24-22 record.

## ORANGE COUNTY BLUE STAR (PDL)

Orange County played its first PDL season in 2001 and has won three division titles in 10 seasons. The club has enjoyed a winning tradition on the field, but it is also well known for the talent it has

developed. Stars such as Sacha Kljestan, Sal Zizzo, Kamani Hill, Brad Evans, Robbie Rogers, Kei Kamara, and Jürgen Klinsmann have all suited up for the Blue Star.

## PITTSBURGH RIVERHOUNDS (USL PRO)

Founded in 1999 as part of the A-League, the Riverhounds are always a tough opponent. In 2004 they suffered only two losses and captured the Pro League Atlantic Division title, making a

deep playoff run. The Riverhounds joined USL PRO in 2010 and look to build on their past tradition.

## SEATTLE SOUNDERS (W-LEAGUE)

Founded in 2001, Seattle has been a stalwart among the W-League's Western Conference teams. The Sounders have earned a trip to the playoffs in six of their 10 seasons, making it to

the final four on five occasions. Seattle has also featured the likes of current and former U.S. National Team standouts Tina Ellertson, Justi Baumgardt-Yamada and Michelle French.

## SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA SEAHORSES (PDL)

The Seahorses made their PDL debut during the 2001 season and instantly started one of the league's top rivalries with their neighbors, the

Orange County Blue Star. The Seahorses have enjoyed several playoff appearances and took home the 2006 Southwest Division title.

## VANCOUVER WHITECAPS (W-LEAGUE)

Since joining the W-League in 2001, the Whitecaps have been one of the most successful teams in league history. Vancouver has won three W-League Championships and seven division

titles, and has reached the finals five times. Vancouver has also been a hotbed of talent with many internationals playing for the side.



# USL HALL OF FAME

## BETSY MCADAMS, BUILDER

McAdams, who passed away in 2009, served as the inspirational leader of the Charleston Battery from the team's inception in 1993. She filled many roles during her years with the Battery, including director of operations and director of finance and business administration. McAdams was named chief operating officer in May 2008. In 2009 USL honored her by introducing the newly-renamed Betsy McAdams Key Grip Award, which recognizes an excellent member of a club's staff that is not an executive with the team.

Prior to joining the Battery, McAdams was the purchasing agent at Blackbaud until 1996 and the executive assistant to former Blackbaud CEO and Battery majority owner, Tony Bakker. She is the 46th person to be inducted in the USL Hall of Fame as a Builder.



## BOB LILLEY, COACH

Lilley ranks as one of the most successful coaches in USL history, having patrolled the sidelines in Hershey, Montreal, and Vancouver prior to his current role with USL PRO's Rochester Rhinos. His first coaching experience came with the Hershey Wildcats in 1997, and he subsequently led Hershey to the playoffs in each of his five seasons. Named A-League Coach of the Year in his rookie season, Lilley guided Hershey to a Northern Conference and three Atlantic Division titles as well as the 2001 A-League National Championship final.

In 2002 Lilley was appointed head coach of Montreal, leading the team to the 2003 Eastern Conference title and once again being named A-League Coach of the Year. He joined Vancouver in 2004 and led the 2006 Whitecaps to the title, defeating Rochester. Hired by Rochester last November, he guided the Rhinos to the top record in the USSF Division-2 League. He was once again named Coach of the Year.



## DOUG MILLER, PLAYER

A star in Rochester for eight seasons, Miller was an all-league selection three times in his career (1996, 1997, 2003) with a highlight year in 1997 in which he also won the scoring and goal scoring races as well as the league MVP honor. He helped the Rhinos to two league title games and also reached the final with Hershey Wildcats. Miller helped guide Rochester to a pair of U.S. Open Cup finals, capturing one of the most memorable championships in modern U.S. soccer history in 1999. Miller's goal proved to be the game winner in Rochester's 2-0 victory against the Colorado Rapids.

Miller began his career with 18 goals in his first season in 1996 and struck for 23 in his award-winning campaign of 1997. After a short stint with the Hershey Wildcats, Miller made a triumphant return to Rochester in 2003, scoring 17 goals. He ranks as the club's all-time leading scorer and was a two-time MVP (1997, 2003). Miller, who currently owns the Rochester Ravens of the USL W-League as well as Doug Miller Soccer, is the 22nd Player inducted into the USL Hall of Fame.



# MLS/WPS DRAFTS

## PDL & W-LEAGUE PLAYERS SELECTED IN PRO DRAFTS

### MLS

The USL Premier Development League saw another large group of its alumni make the move into professional soccer with 37 of the 54 players selected in the 2011 Major League Soccer SuperDraft having previously played in the PDL.

A remarkable eight of the first 10 selections in the draft had PDL experience including No.2 selection and Hermann Trophy winner Darlington Nagbe, formerly of the Cleveland Internationals, who will head to the Portland Timbers. No.3 selection Perry Kitchen, who spent the 2010 season with the Chicago Fire Premier and was considered by many the best overall prospect in this year's draft, was then taken by D.C. United.

Nagbe was also one of two former Internationals taken in the top 10 with midfielder Michael Nanchoff going to the Vancouver Whitecaps with the eighth pick.

The Michigan Bucks also had a pair of players selected in the top 10 with Zarek Valentin heading to Chivas USA with the fourth selection and Kofi Sarkodie going to the Houston Dynamo with the seventh selection.

Also selected in the top 10 were AJ Soares of the Orange County Blue Star, taken with the No.6 pick by the New England Revolution, former Carolina Dynamo standout Jalil Anibaba, selected by the Chicago Fire with the ninth pick, and former Reading United AC forward CJ Sapong, selected by Sporting Kansas City with the 10th pick.

Others taken in the first round were former Chicago Fire Premier defender Rich Balchan, taken by the Columbus Crew with the 12th selection, Reading United AC forward Corey Hertzog, taken with the 13th pick by the New York Red Bulls, and former Carolina Dynamo defender Eddie Abadio, taken with the 18th pick by the reigning MLS champion Colorado Rapids.

### WPS

The USL W-League saw four of its alumni selected in the opening five selections and had 13 players taken overall as Women's Professional Soccer held its 2011 Draft in Baltimore.

Leading the way was a trio of outstanding players from the Pali Blues, with U.S. Women's National Team member Alex Morgan being the top pick overall by expansion franchise the

Western New York Flash. Joining Morgan in the top five selections were former Richmond Kickers Destiny standout Sinead Farrelly, taken by the Philadelphia Independence with the second selection. Then came Morgan's Pali Blues teammates Christen Press, the Mac Hermann Trophy-winner being selected by the Washington Freedom with the No.4 pick, and Lauren Fowlke, picked fifth by the Independence.

Keelin Winters of the Real Colorado Cougars was also taken in the first round, selected with the No.6 pick by the Boston Breakers. The W-League also saw players taken in each of the other three rounds, including the Washington Freedom Futures duo of Omolyn Davis and Meghan Lenczyk, taken by the Freedom and the Atlanta Beat respectively.

The Hudson Valley Quickstrike also had a pair of players selected with Whitney Palmer and Amanda Da Costa being selected by the Breakers and Freedom respectively. Others taken included former Cleveland Internationals player Rose Augustin, who along with Fowlkes helped Notre Dame win the NCAA Championship last month, who will join Morgan with the Flash.

Also selected were former Carolina Dynamo standout Caitlin Farrell and former Cary Clarets standout Bianca D'Agostino, both headed to join the Independence, and former Tampa Bay Hellenic goalkeeper Katie Fraine, who is headed to join the Freedom.
