GROWING THE GAME

When USL launched its outdoor program in 1989, there were only 19 professional soccer teams in the country and no organized lower divisions for the sport. That eight-team USL outdoor league has grown into the 73-team Premier Development League while USL has developed into one of the most sophisticated sports organizations in the U.S. and Canada.

Always a pioneer in the sport, USL launched the W-League in 1995 - long before women's professional soccer was born - and created the first national youth league with the Super Y-League in 1999. Today, USL oversees the development of players, coaches, referees and administrators that participate in six different leagues that encompass more than 120 men's and women's franchises and more than 500 youth teams.



USL has also seen its players go on to represent their countries in international competition. This summer the U.S. Men's National Team will begin qualifying for the 2014 World Cup with players who have developed through the USL system such as Tim Howard, Jozy Altidore, Juan Agudelo, Teal Bunbury, C.J. Sapong and Tim Ream likely to play key roles, as will Canada with players such as 2011 MLS Most Valuable Player Dwayne De Rosario. The list includes veterans who got their break in the professional game in the USL First Division, such as De Rosario with the Richmond Kickers, to Premier Development League products like Ream, Bunbury and Sapong.

Leading the charge as the first generation of Super Y-League alums to reach the world stage was Altidore, and he has now been joined by Agudelo. The vertically-integrated structure of USL has been in place for a decade and the dividends of the early years are already beginning to show. With USL and Major League Soccer teams focused on growing the game through a dedicated pyramid of soccer leagues from the youth ranks to the pros, future generations will continue to improve, year after year and tournament after tournament.

The dedication USL has shown to the women's game through the W-League has paid off for not only the U.S. and Canadian Women's National Teams, but also for players from other countries. At the 2011 Women's World Cup in Germany, 62 former W-League players took to the field, including the United States' Abby Wambach, Christie Rampone and Alex Morgan, Canada's Christine Sinclair and Japan's Homare Sawa, who was named the FIFA Women's World Player of the Year after leading her nation to victory.



In January of 2012, the Major League Soccer SuperDraft saw 26 PDL players selected, including No.1 selection Andrew Wenger of Reading United and the Carolina Dynamo, and the WPS Draft featured 11 former W-League players, including No.1 selection Sydney Leroux, who was the W-League's Rookie of the Year in 2011, and will return to the league this summer as a member of the Seattle Sounders Women and a fully-fledged member of the U.S. Women's National Team.

EXPANDING INTERNATIONAL HORIZONS

USL has long been a leader when it comes to international influence of players, clubs, and executives in North America. Given the organization's unique landscape of clubs from the youth to professional ranks, USL provides many opportunities for foreign clubs to develop affiliations and partnerships with its franchises.

Identifying talented players and creating new commercial opportunities is a priority for clubs around the world, and USL provides clubs the best platform to connect these opportunities with clubs that desire to have a presence in North America.

In 2008, USL embarked on an international development initiative to connect USL clubs with foreign counterparts. As part of this initiative, USL partnered with Beswicks Sports, the specialist sports division of the United Kingdom-based legal group Beswicks. As USL's representative in the UK to broker partnerships between British football clubs and USL franchises, Beswicks Sports has been able to open up new avenues for clubs from across the Atlantic to make new professional partnerships.

The partnership with Beswicks Sports paid immediate dividends for USL, formalizing affiliations with English clubs such as Burnley and Stoke City FC. In addition, Beswicks was integral to the hiring of former West Ham United player Anthony Hudson when he took the coaching reins at Real Maryland FC of the USL Second Division for the 2009 season.



More recently, Beswicks helped broker the deal that led to UK-based VisionPro Sports Institute's 2011 partnership with USL and the Brandon, Fla. Flames, resulting in the creation of a boys academy in Brandon and the announcement of new teams in USL PRO, the PDL, the W-League and the Super-20 League.

"The interest levels in USL and its various leagues have never been higher throughout Europe," said Gary Mellor, partner at Beswicks. "European clubs recognize that USL provides them with unequalled access to North American young talent as well as the opportunity to forge strategic partnerships and the commercial opportunities that follow."

USL provides a clearly defined path for the progression of male and female soccer players beginning at the youth level (Super Y-League/Super-20 League), continuing through the amateur level (PDL/W-League) and up to the professional level, both outdoor and indoor (USL PRO/MISL). PROFESSIONAL LEAGUES



USL PRO

USL PRO is the strongest, best operated and most experienced North American men's professional soccer league below MLS, both on and off the field. Focused on franchise stability and longevity, USL PRO features 11 teams in 2012 and an unprecedented six teams with more than a decade of operational experience. The league is focused on aggressive but deliberate growth by adding teams fully capable of meeting USL and USSF standards, which are located in markets that further promote regional league play. In addition to league play, USL PRO teams will compete in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup as well as various domestic and international exhibitions. USL PRO is affiliated with the U.S. Soccer Federation.



MISL

USL acquired the Major Indoor Soccer League (MISL) in May, 2011 and began operating North America's most storied and tradition-rich professional indoor soccer for the 2011-12 season. The MISL represents the top level of professional indoor soccer in North America and currently consists of seven franchises. The league roster includes franchises in Baltimore, Kansas City, Milwaukee, Norfolk, Rochester, Syracuse and Wichita.

SENIOR DEVELOPMENT LEAGUES



PDL

The top developmental men's league in North America, the PDL features 73 teams within four conferences across the United States and Canada. The PDL season consists of 16 regular season matches for each team, eight home and eight away, and provides elite collegiate players the opportunity to taste a higher level of competition while maintaining their eligibility. In addition to league play, PDL teams compete in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup as well as various exhibitions. The PDL has proven to be an important stepping-stone for top professionals now playing throughout the world.



W-LEAGUE

The first and longest-standing women's league in North America, the W-League represents the highest level of women's soccer in the United States and Canada. The 2012 W-League campaign features 30 teams in three regional conferences playing 12-14 regular season matches. In addition to featuring international and professional stars, elite amateur players have the opportunity to compete in the W-League while maintaining their collegiate eligibility. The league is recognized throughout the world for providing superior competition for female players, while offering affordable family entertainment for fans across North America.

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT LEAGUES



SUPER-20 LEAGUE

As the longest standing and most sophisticated U20 men's and women's North American amateur league, the Super-20 League provides the platform for top 17- to 20-year-olds in the United States and Canada to compete at the elite level. While serving as a reserve team system for many W-League and PDL teams, the USL Super-20 League features teams competing in regional divisions, consisting of 8-10 regular season matches throughout the summer months.



SUPER Y-LEAGUE

Founded in 1999, the Super Y-League is dedicated to the progression of future professional players. Averaging 700 teams since 2004, the Super Y-League has steered the course for development of elite clubs, players, and coaches. Affiliated with U.S. Soccer, the Super Y-League ODP Program has opened countless doors for players to be identified for U.S. National Team programs. The Super Y-League contains the youth academies of Major League Soccer clubs, USL PRO clubs, PDL and W-League clubs. The league also serves clubs looking to develop the game from the ground up. Top youth academies such as the Chicago Magic, Mass Premier Soccer and TSF Academy have been members of the league for several seasons. USL's Super Y-League has revolutionized youth player development in North America.

ALEC PAPADAKIS – CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

As Chief Executive Officer of USL, Papadakis serves as USL's top executive as well as an owner. Also the Chief Executive Officer and Managing Partner of NuRock Soccer Holdings, Papadakis has 35 years of domestic and international experience as a franchise attorney.

As a player in the North American Soccer League for the Atlanta Chiefs and the Boston Minutemen, Papadakis had a long, successful career in the United States at the collegiate and professional level, earning numerous accolades. He played in Atlanta for three seasons, the first two with the Chiefs and the third with the Apollos, appearing in 39 games. He finished his career with the Boston Minutemen in 1974. His teams captured conference regular season championships in 1971 and 1974.

Papadakis attended Hartwick College (New York) where he was a three-time First Team All-American. He received his law degree in 1976 at the University of Akron, where he also served as an assistant soccer coach.



TIM HOLT – PRESIDENT

Tim Holt joined USL in 1999 originally serving as the A-League & Super Y-League Operations Director. He added the responsibilities of overseeing the operations of all USL senior leagues in 2002 and was named Vice President in 2004. Holt became President following the acquisition of USL by NuRock Soccer Holdings in 2009.

Holt's numerous responsibilities include the day-to-day management of USL business operations, developing and implementing the strategic plan for all USL leagues, the supervision of compliance with league regulations and policies, franchise relations, personnel management and regular communication with the leadership of the US, Canada, Bermuda and Antigua & Barbuda Federations. During his period of leadership with USL, the organization has become the largest system of elite soccer leagues in North America.

Holt served on the US Soccer Federation (USSF) Board of Directors from 2003-06, and is currently Co-Chairman of the Lamar Hunt US Open Cup Committee. Holt also serves USSF as a member of its Professional Council and has been a member of its Credentials and Open Cup Disciplinary Committees. From 2005-09,

he was the Men's Professional Representative on the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Board of Directors. In 2006, Holt was named one of Soccer America's 'Rising Stars,' recognizing the top American soccer executives under the age of 35, and has an extensive network of relationships at all levels of American soccer.



A native of suburban Philadelphia and product of the respected FC DELCO youth club in eastern Pennsylvania, Holt is a member of the Radnor (PA) High School Soccer Hall of Fame and still ranks amongst the school's all-time top leading scorers. Marcos joined the Tampa Bay Rowdies in 1974 as director of public relations and director of soccer operations and development, and shifted to the NASL's Dallas Tornado in 1979, where he served as vice president of player personnel. In 1980 he joined the Calgary Boomers before returning to Tampa in 1981 as executive VP of the Rowdies.



Marcos' greatest soccer vision – a group of national leagues blanketing the United States - took off in 1986 with the birth of USL. In 2007 Marcos was honored with the U.S. Soccer Werner Fricker Builder Award, the greatest recognition bestowed by U.S. Soccer upon members. The award is presented annually to an individual who has worked tirelessly in furthering the interest of the sport of soccer without regard to personal recognition or advancement. Adding to his list of honors, Marcos was nominated for Induction into the U.S. Soccer Hall of Fame in 2011 and 2012.

PETER MELLOR – NATIONAL TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

A former professional goalkeeper and longtime member of the U.S. National Team coaching staff, Mellor became USL's first national technical director in February of 2010. A staff coach with the United States Soccer Federation since 1992, Mellor manages the technical aspects of USL's player development programs and assists USL teams in scouting, development and advancement of players. A professional goalkeeper for two decades, Mellor played 17 years in the top three tiers of English professional soccer with Manchester City, Burnley, Fulham, Hereford United and Portsmouth, as well as a stint playing in the NASL in 1981 for the Edmonton Drillers. He also served as the England U-23 National Team goalkeeper from 1969-70. Mellor also played for Fulham against West Ham in the prestigious 1975 FA Cup Final at Wembley stadium in London England.



Mellor's acclaim in the USA, however, is for his coaching. He joined the U.S. National Team staff in 1992 and became one of the foremost goalkeeping instructors in the United States. He has worked with every level of the US Men's National Team program and was an assistant and goalkeeping coach with the U17 residency program from 1999-2003, and was an assistant coach for the 2000 USA Men's Olympic Team which finished fourth in Australia. In 2003 Mellor then moved on to an assistant coach position with Real Salt Lake (MLS).

NICHOLAS MURRAY – COORDINATOR, COMMUNICATIONS

Murray joined USL in 2010 from The Tampa Tribune, where he spent eight years as both a freelance sports reporter and staff member. He also has served as an English FA Staff Coach, a Canadian Soccer Association Staff Coach, a coaching director at the Liverpool Youth Development Program, a member of the FIFA Panel of Instructors and a member of the CONCACAF Coaching Commission. He was inducted into the Canadian Soccer Hall of Fame as a builder in 2001.

Waiters is best known as the only coach to lead Canada to the World Cup Finals, accomplishing the feat in 1986. He also led the Vancouver Whitecaps to the 1979 title in the now-defunct North American Soccer League.

SIGGI NAGELE – SUPER Y-LEAGUE LEARNING LAB REPRESENTATIVE

Siggi Nagele assists USL as its Super Y-League Learning Lab Representative, assisting players, coaches, teams and clubs through promotions and live presentations. The USL Super Y-League College Learning Center is focused on providing student-athletes the opportunity to obtain a quality education and play soccer at the next level. Nagele is a Region III Olympic Development Program (ODP) coach and a coach for the Clearwater (Fla.) Soccer Club. A former college soccer player, Nagele was the head women's soccer coach at Eckerd College and has been a committee member for both the NCAA and the NSCAA.



The launch of the USL Super Y-League College Learning Center and the hiring of Nagele provides new levels of support for young athletes, their parents, and USL clubs. While players are able to purchase access to the USL Super Y-League College Learning Center now, Nagele's services are offered to USL clubs at all levels throughout North America. Upon request, Nagele is available to provide college preparation presentations for young athletes.





U.S. SOCCER FEDERATION



ABOUT THE U.S. SOCCER FEDERATION

As the governing body of soccer in all its forms in the United States, U.S. Soccer has played an integral part in charting the course for the sport in the USA for almost 100 years. In that time, the Federation's mission statement has been very simple and very clear: to make soccer, in all its forms, a preeminent sport in the United States and to continue the development of soccer at all recreational and competitive levels.

To that end, the sports exponential growth in the past two decades has been nothing short of remarkable. Multiple soccer-specific stadiums have opened their doors to resounding success, and new arenas around the country are currently being planned and built. The National Training Center in Carson, California is entering its seventh year of existence, and in 2007 the U.S. Soccer Development Academy kicked off with much fanfare at the state of the art facility.

The progress of soccer in the United States has been astounding and is all the more astonishing when one considers where the sport was a mere 20 years ago. In 1989, the U.S. Men's National Team hadn't played in a World Cup in 40 years and the U.S. Women's program was just four-years old. U.S. Soccer was playing games in small stadiums that were rarely filled to capacity. There were few games being televised (and none without commercials during play). There were no soccer-specific stadiums, and there were no high-level professional outdoor leagues of which to speak.

US OPEN CUP

Dating back to 1914, the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup is the oldest cup competition in United States soccer and is among the oldest in the world. Open to all affiliated amateur and professional teams in the United States, the annual U.S. Open Cup is a single-elimination tournament.

NATIONAL TEAMS

The U.S. Soccer Federation is charged with the responsibility of managing the senior and youth national teams that participate in official FIFA competitions.

FIFA WORLD CUP

In addition to the U.S. men competing in their sixth consecutive World Cup, the US Soccer Federation has played host to three FIFA World Cup events. The U.S. hosted the 1994 Men's World Cup and the FIFA Women's World Cup of 1999 and 2003.

Since that time, the state of U.S. Soccer has evolved significantly. The U.S. MNT has played in six consecutive World Cups, and advanced to the quarterfinals at the 2002 event. U.S. Soccer is a world leader in women's soccer at every level, and the team has won two Women's World Cups, along with three Olympic Gold Medals. The United States has also hosted three World Cups with the support of its members and strong organizational abilities.

Coaching continues to get bigger in the United States, and with more classes being offered around the country, the number of licensed, well-educated trainers and managers is larger than ever. As soccer continues to grow, the education level amongst coaches has been tailored to match the expanding pool of talent in the United States, and in 2006 the U.S. Soccer offered its first ever Goalkeeper Coaching License.

In 2007, full-time officials were hired for the first time in the federation's history, and more programs are being planned as U.S. Soccer continues to set positive trends for referees in CONCACAF to help improve referee development across the spectrum of all grades and at all ages.

U.S. OPEN CUP



The Dewar Cup is awarded to the tournament champion

Dating back to 1914, the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup is the oldest cup competition in United States soccer and is among the oldest in the world. Open to all affiliated amateur and professional teams in the United States, the annual U.S. Open Cup is a single-elimination tournament.

A total of 64 professional and amateur teams will compete in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup when it kicks off in May. The tournament will feature all 16 U.S.-based MLS clubs, the 10 U.S.-based USL PRO teams, six additional professional clubs, 16 qualifiers from the PDL and 16 amateur qualifiers.

Although the tournament proper, conducted by the USSF, only consists of 64 teams, qualifying for the event includes nearly 100 clubs total from United Soccer Leagues and Major League Soccer alone. The USASA's National Open tournament provides hundreds of other teams from around the country the opportunity to qualify for the honor of competing in the event.

The U.S. Open Cup is a single-elimination tournament, with games tied after regulation being decided in two 15-minute overtime halves. If neither team scores during the overtime period, the winner is decided on penalty kicks. The team that advances the furthest from each level except Division 1 earns a \$10,000 cash prize. The runner-up takes home \$50,000, while the champion collects \$100,000. The winner also will have the team's name engraved on the historic Dewar Challenge Trophy, the oldest trophy in American team sports.

US OPEN CUP REVIEW

The Richmond Kickers carried the USL flag in the 2011 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, making their deepest run in the tournament since their victory in 1995 as they reached the semifinals while creating a new piece of history along the way.

Led by David Bulow, who finished the tournament as its top scorer with six goals, the Kickers became the first lower division team in the tournament's history to win a pair of road games against MLS opposition. After taking victories against USL PRO's Dayton Dutch Lions and Pittsburgh Riverhounds in the opening two rounds, Richmond went on the road and stunned the Columbus Crew 2-1, Matt Delicâte's goal with five minutes to play proving the game-winner.

Two weeks later in the quarterfinals, the Kickers did it against Sporting Kansas City, as second-half goals by Shaka Bangura and Bulow gave them a 2-0 victory. In addition to their second win on the road against MLS opposition, the Kickers also became the first visiting team to earn victory at SKC's LiveStrong Sporting Park, a venue where Sporting only lost twice in MLS play all season while finishing top of the Eastern Division regular season standings.

Richmond's run came to an end at the hands of the Chicago Fire, who claimed a 2-1 victory against Leigh Cowlishaw's side at Toyota Park. After falling behind 2-0 midway through the second half, William Yomby pulled a goal back for the Kickers, but while their rally came up short, the poise and quality of play they displayed throughout their run impressed all who saw them.

Elsewhere, USL PRO teams gave their MLS counterparts a run for their money, but were unable to find a way through into the later stages of the tournament. USL PRO champion Orlando City came close to forcing overtime against FC Dallas, only to see a stoppage time goal eliminate them 3-2, while the Los Angeles Blues fell 2-1 to eventual MLS Cup champions the Los Angeles Galaxy.

The PDL saw two teams reach the third round, with 2011 champion Kitsap Pumas giving the Seattle Sounders a test in their meeting at the Starfire Sports Complex. The Chicago Fire Premier, who saw a record 11 players selected in the MLS SuperDraft this past January, also made it to the third round before falling to Sporting Kansas City.

With the expansion of the Open Cup to 64 teams this season, allowing 16 members of the PDL and all 10 of USL PRO's U.S.-based teams to participate, the tournament appears set to take an even larger place in the U.S. Soccer community in the coming year and beyond.

2011 CHAMPIONSHIP

Orlando City goalkeeper Sean Kelley wasn't expecting to play much of a role in the USL PRO Championship Game.

"In a game like that, if I were to have to come in, something would have had to go wrong," he said.

Something went wrong for Orlando City, with starting goalkeeper Miguel Gallardo being sent off just after the halftime break, but Kelley turned in an MVP performance as the Lions capped an outstanding season by defeating the Harrisburg City Islanders 3-2 in a penalty shootout after the two teams had played to a 2-2 draw through regulation and overtime.

"He comes in every day, trains so hard and at times it must be hard for him when he's behind Miguel," Orlando coach Adrian Heath said. "Tonight it was strange; I said to him before the penalties that I had a feeling he was going to be big."

Kelley saved the City Islanders' first two penalties in the shootout, denying Nelson Becerra and Jose Angulo with saves to his right, and the Lions held a 2-0 advantage after Lewis Neal and Yordany Alvarez both scored. But Harrisburg got back on even terms as J.T. Noone and Stephen Basso each scored and Orlando's Charlie Campbell and Luke Boden both skied their shots, leaving the teams tied 2-2 entering the final round of shots.

Harrisburg's Sainey Touray missed that shot wide left to open the fifth round, opening the door for Devorn Jorsling to give the Lions the championship, and he obliged, shooting low into the left corner of the net to beat the majority of the crowd of 11,220 at the Florida Citrus Bowl into massive celebrations.

"I don't know if I've ever been in a game that crazy before," Lions midfielder Jamie Watson said. "It's an unbelievable feeling right now."

While both teams had chances in the first half - the best falling to Harrisburg's Brian Schofield, who shot over the crossbar from 15 yards after beating Orlando's offside trap - the game didn't come alive properly until the second half. Four minutes after the break Touray was played in down the left channel and was brought down outside the penalty area by Gallardo, who was shown a red card for preventing a goal-scoring opportunity.

That gave the City Islanders the upper hand, and they tried to take advantage with Touray proving a constant menace, knifing past his marker in the 62nd minute only for Kelley to smother his shot as he closed down on the attacker.

But while they were down to 10 men, Orlando continued to push men forward at every opportunity, taking the game to the City Islanders as the half wore on. Watson had a glorious opportunity in the 70th minute as he broke through on goal and rounded Harrisburg goalkeeper Chase Harrison, only for a heavy touch to allow defender Geoff Bloes to recover and clear to safety.

The Lions' pressure paid off in the 89th minute, though, when Lawrence Olum appeared to have given his side a dramatic victory after arriving late at the top of the



penalty area to be found by a pass from Lewis Neal and rifling a shot home from 15 yards into the right side of the net.

But the drama was just beginning. Harrisburg threw everything forward in stoppage time, and off a third consecutive corner the City Islanders found their reward. Kelley came for the cross, but couldn't gather, and Noone was on hand to poke the ball home from six yards out with what proved to be the final kick of regulation.

Harrisburg then took the lead five minutes into overtime, Touray heading home a near-post corner from Jason Pelletier to give his side the lead. The City Islanders almost added to their lead in the 110th minute, with Angulo's header coming back off the post and being scrambled to safety by Orlando's defense.

Five minutes after Langley's header almost sealed the City Islanders' second USL Championship, the Lions gave themselves a chance at their first. A good ball into the penalty area found Dennis Chin, and he was brought down by Bloes, earning the defender a red card and Orlando a penalty kick and a chance to tie. Neal calmly slotted home from the spot to tie the game.

Either side could have won the game at the death, with Touray's header with a minute to go flashing just wide of Orlando's right post and Harrison saving brilliantly from Chin to deny the Lions, but Orlando wouldn't be denied in the shootout, with Kelley proving the hero. After a season that saw the side win both the regular season title and the league championship, the victory was a sweet one.



MISL indoor soccer was developed to appeal to sports fans around the world. The fast-paced, fiercely competitive game is played on artificial turf on a hockey-rink-sized field surrounded by dasher boards and Plexiglas with eight-foot high by 14-foot wide goals recessed into the end boards. Creative dribbling, pinpoint passing, acrobatic goalkeeping and rugged defensive play are all skills demonstrated by MISL players.

A typical MISL game features end-to-end-action resulting in approximately 60 shots and 11 goals per game. Each game includes four 15-minute quarters and a popular feature is multi-point scoring, with goals from long distance worth more. Other unique characteristics of the MISL include action-packed power plays and free substitution of players while play continues.

2011 PDL CHAMPIONSHIP

PUMAS CLAIM FIRST PDL CHAMPIONSHIP

According to Kitsap Pumas captain Daniel Scott, sacrifice was at the heart of his side's success this past season.

That dedication paid off as the club claimed its first USL PDL Championship with a hard-fought 1-0 victory against the Laredo Heat at Bremerton Memorial Stadium on July 6.

"I don't think words can really describe it," Scott said. "I mean, if I think if we look back to the beginning of the season there was so much sacrifice that goes into this team. A good amount of us live over in the Seattle area and have to make the commute over here three, four days a week, sometimes five times on the weekend, so there's a lot of personal sacrifice that we put in, but it paid off and it was worth every minute of it."

The Pumas opened strongly, pinning the Heat back in their own half as the Southern Conference champion struggled to find any rhythm. After a pair of shots by Elliott Fauske and Robby Christner had challenged the Heat's defense early, Christner was on hand in the 11th minute to put away what would prove to be the only goal of the game. With Laredo unable to clear its lines properly, the ball came to Bryan Burke on the left side of the penalty area and his low cross was tapped into the back of the net by Christner from six yards out.

"We wanted to come out strong," Burke said. "We knew they knew we were going to bring it, but once we got that goal, we were all pretty tired from last night so we just made sure we'd hold that lead."

Burke's energy epitomized the Pumas' performance, and he took MVP honors after a strong effort that saw him consistently harry the Heat's defense.

"Bryan Burke is a tireless worker, and that's one thing I think that we really respect about him," Scott said. "You're going to get the same out of him day in and day out, in training sessions and in games. He definitely deserved the MVP of the game today, I mean he worked his rear off for us today and it paid dividends in the end."

Laredo eventually settled, but it took a poor clearance to give them their closest opportunity of the half. After goalkeeper Bryan Meredith's low clearance was controlled by Heat forward Esteban Bayona, the striker took a look up from 40 yards and fired an audacious chip that went just over the crossbar. For the most-part, though, the Heat weren't able to challenge Meredith until second-half stoppage time,



when Gregory Mulamba fired a blistering shot that came off the left post on almost the final kick of the game.

"I kind of just stretched out, got a little tip to it, not much, turned back and saw it hit the post, and luckily Dan Scott was right there to clear it out," Meredith said.

"Coach Pete [Fewing] says this all the time, but you have to earn your luck," Scott said. "I think that's something that's stuck with us throughout this year. Against Thunder Bay they had a shot off a free kick and Bryan Meredith makes a great save and it hits the post in the last couple of minutes of the game. We've dodged bullets, but I think sometimes you have to bend without breaking, and I think that's a testament to our work ethic defensively as a team."

Moments later the final whistle blew, sending the team and the packed home crowd into celebration while putting a broad smile on Fewing's face.

"They're a very remarkable group of guys, and that's why they win," Fewing said. "You have to give all the credit to these players. They've stuck together, been very committed and they've been very disciplined. I do not think we would have the team that we have without the discipline that the guys have and the commitment they have for each other. It's a special group."

"It's special, we're a special group," Scott said. "The cohesion on this team didn't happen overnight, and I think that's something that we all recognize is that it takes time, and I think in the long run when we look back on all of it, we're going to be friends for a long time going forward. This is a special group and if there's a team out there that deserves it, we do. I really personally feel like we do deserve this."





ABOUT SUPER Y

USL SUPER Y-LEAGUE (BOYS/GIRLS U12-U17)

Since founding the Super Y-League in 1999, USL has seen the limitless growth potential in soccer beginning at the youth levels and advancing through the professional ranks. By establishing a concrete soccer foundation through highly competitive and developmental youth programs such as the SYL, USL allows male and female players to develop and compete with one club through the duration of their careers.

The Super Y-League added the U12 boys and girls age groups for the 2011 season, giving the league six age groups for the first time. In conjunction with the other SYL age divisions, the U12 division also offers an Olympic Development Program.

Created in 1999 with 12 teams, the USL Super Y-League now includes nearly 75 clubs from throughout the United States and Canada with an average of 500 teams competing in the league every summer. The U12 divisions maintain the same rules and regulations of the league's U13-U17 age groups, and its first season concluded at the 2011 USL Super Y-League North American Finals in Tampa, Florida.

Many of the clubs participating in the league are now affiliated with the top professional and amateur men's and women's sides of USL and Major League Soccer, providing a true pyramid of development that mirrors those in "soccer nations" around the globe.

In its first few years, the league was primarily a vehicle for the top players to come together and face higher-level competition at a regional and/or national level on a regular basis. Now, the Super Y-League's fully operational ODP system helps propel the careers of elite players to the upper levels of the professional game in North America.

The Super Y-League North American Finals was the first step in the implementation of ODP status. Making the finals an official scouting event for identifying players for national team pools was just a starting point, however.

Part of the mission was to impress upon the senior clubs in North America the importance of playing a significant role in player development. Many professional teams in the U.S. and Canada



have used the league to begin their process of establishing academy programs that link the player development system from youth to pro.



ABOUT SUPER-20

USL SUPER-20 LEAGUE (MEN/WOMEN U-20)

United Soccer Leagues announced the creation of the USL Super-20 League in early 2006. The league is designed as a graduating youth league for elite players from 17-20 as they advance beyond the traditional youth bracket to the senior professional and amateur development leagues.

The Super-20 League, for men and women, replaced the U19 age bracket of the Super Y-League, creating a wider range for players on the cusp of playing for PDL or W-League teams. The league was designed to cater to the top of the youth ranks in the U.S. and Canada for players aspiring to play professionally. It also serves as a reserve division for USL's Premier Development League and W-League teams, which have increasingly taken youth development of this age range under their auspices. PDL and W-League teams are able to add USL Super-20 teams to expand their development goals as well as their player pool for the senior team.

In addition to the USL Super-20 League completing the model for club building and vertical integration, aids U.S. Soccer and the Canadian Soccer Association in identifying the top players for international competition ranging from U17 to U20.

Recent Super-20 expansion has included the additions of Rocky Mountain and Pacific Northwest Divisions, with a new Mid-South Division set to kick off in 2012.

THE SUPER Y-LEAGUE ODP

PHILOSOPHY

To identify players for U.S. National Team Programs, within their natural environment during competition on their club team during the Super Y-League season.

PURPOSE

The Super Y-League ODP system was started in 2003 to recognize a pool of players in each age group for identification to U.S. National Team Programs; and to utilize the clubs system in the United States to identify players.

HOW DO I PARTICIPATE?

Contact a local Super Y-League club in order to become a part of the Super Y-League ODP system. Players will be scouted during league play by the national scouting system of the Super Y-League, which is comprised of all of the coaches within the clubs of the league.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION HISTORY

In 2002, the Super Y-League, through US Soccer and the United States Olympic Committee, was granted ODP programs to identify players for U.S. National Team Programs. The first selection process began during the 2003 season to identify players for Regional Team selection events, where U.S. National Staff Coaches scouted players for National Team Programs. In addition to many players being identified for U.S. National Team Programs, top players are identified by leading college and university soccer programs throughout the United States.

RECENT PROGRAM ENHANCEMENTS

- World-class facilities - Train on the same fields as MLS players, U.S. National Team players, and other top players from around the world at IMG Academies in Bradenton, Florida
- USL National Technical Director Peter Mellor to oversee ODP sessions (former English player with Burnley, Fulham, longtime U.S. Soccer Staff Coach)
- Wholistic program featuring mental and physical conditioning
- Nutrition session
- Movement session
- Playing analysis

THE SUPER Y-LEAGUE ODP

SELECTION PROCESS

During the regular season players are evaluated during their games by the opposing team coaches for tactical, physical and psychological characteristics that will determine their ability to attend the ODP National Camp typically held in February and March. Through the scouting system, the combined nominations will be used, along with proportional allocation in conjunction with Director of Coaching recommendations, to determine invitations to the ODP camps. The overall number of games and teams will also be factored into this process.

WHAT ARE SYL ODP NATIONAL CAMPS?

The top players chosen by the scouting system in each age group per geographic division of the Super Y-League will attend the ODP National Camp. These camps are attended by U.S. National Staff Coaches to identify players for U.S. National Team Programs, as well as many of the nation's top collegiate coaches. The camps are held in Bradenton, Florida during February and March.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF THE SYL ODP SYSTEM?

- The selection of players within their natural environment on their club teams within league play, as opposed to an open-tryout system. Many players do not participate in the open-tryout ODP system operated by state associations, and other players do not perform well in the open tryout process.
- Exposure to the U.S. National Staff and Team Coaches
- Exposure to professional and collegiate scouts
- There is no cost to be scouted or to try out. The scouting system is built into league play and contains no additional ODP fees. Only those selected to attend ODP camps will incur camp fees.

Then with 24 minutes to go Ironbound was reduced to 10 men as Evan Marques was sent off for a dangerous challenge. That allowed Kalamazoo to push more players forward, and Nick Wysong almost found an equalizer soon

after, his sliding effort to get to a low cross going wide. Wysong also hit a rising shot that went just over the bar from 20 yards, but then with seven minutes to go Kalamazoo was awarded a penalty for a foul in the area and Suarez made no mistake from the spot, shooting high into the left corner.

Suarez went close to winning the game in regulation, a low shot from the left side of the penalty area finding the side-netting, but with fatigue setting in neither side was able to muster much in the way of opportunities in the two overtime sessions.

So the game went to a shootout, with each side exchanging goals and misses in the first four rounds to leave things tied 2-2 entering the fifth. Each side then reeled off five consecutive makes, until Baird finally stopped Strait in the 10th round to give his side victory.

"It's always tough," Ironbound coach Agostinho Freitas said. "They're a very good side, they beat us heavily during the group stages 4-0, they play us well. They're hard, they run, they're a very good team, very well coached, they stay centralized, it's hard for us. For the boys, it was great, coming back and winning it again was the best thing that could have happened to us."

CREW JRS. TAKE BACK-TO-BACK TITLES

Columbus Crew Jrs. coach Brian Bliss said after his side's victory in the USL Super-20 championship game against the Toronto Lynx that he felt winning the title as defending champions was more difficult than doing so for the first time.

"I said to the guys, 'you come in as defending champion, you come in with the MLS label,' so there's extra motivation [for opponents] any time we play a game," Bliss said.

While the Crew Jrs. were made to work harder than the final score of 4-1 would make it appear against the Toronto Junior Lynx on Sunday morning at J.C. Handley Field in Brandon, Florida, their quality of play, especially in the attacking third of the field, proved the difference as they won their second consecutive Super-20 championship.

As in prior games in the tournament, the Crew Jrs. were able to take the lead early as Toronto appeared tentative facing a side that had handed it a convincing defeat during the Midwest Division regular season. Ben Speas almost took advantage within the first five minute, a fierce volley flying just wide of the right post, but another miscue led to the opening goal as Eriq Zavaleta's shot after a poor clearance took a wicked deflection into the left corner of the net, leaving Lynx goalkeeper Matt Silva unable to recover.

The advantage was doubled shortly after as a fine driven cross from the right by A.J. Corrado was met by the head of Nick Haggland, who arrived late at the far post for an unmarked header.

Toronto was able to settle down as the half wore on and even had some good spells of possession

and pressure in the Columbus half. However, the Lynx were unable to find a telling cross, with the deliveries more often than not ending up behind the goal line instead of in the penalty area.

"I think our final balls were poor today, they're usually better quality," Toronto coach Duncan Wilde said. "I think that's part of the fatigue, I'm not sure they were quite as challenged in the group stage, looking at their scores, while we've been in a dogfight every game. I think we spent a lot of energy, but having said that I think they were the superior team when it came to quality and their composure, their build-up play and their patience. Their organization is very good, which is what I'd expect, I just hope we can learn from them and come back next year."

Columbus' Matt Walker had already had one opportunity saved by Silva as he knifed into the penalty area from the left midway through the second half, but he found the back of the net for the Crew Jrs. third after showing great composure to finish from a tight angle after beating Silva to a through-ball on the left side of the penalty area. And while Toronto was able to find the back of the net, Cameron Eisses' header from a corner the only goal the Crew Jrs. would concede for the tournament, Columbus restored their three-goal advantage shortly after as Speas scored his fifth goal of the tournament to cap the victory.

The victory, completing a season that saw the side go undefeated and draw just once in the regular season, was a satisfying one for Bliss, who said the commitment his players had shown was the key to their success this summer.

"When we started this in mid-May, we set the tone early, but they delivered it," Bliss said. "We set the environment for them. To me, [it was] the overall seriousness that the players approached the game with and the commitment they showed over the two-and-a-half month period."

CLARK GIVES TRIANGLE SUPER-20 TITLE

Ashley Clark's overtime goal gave Triangle FC a thrilling 4-3 victory against Reading United AC and the USL Women's Super-20 North American championship at J.C. Handley Park in Brandon, Florida.

Clark's goal came midway through the second half of overtime. Capping an incredible tournament, Clark made a late run into the penalty area, was picked out by Samantha Burch, and guided the ball into the upper corner with a fantastic side-footed finish. In a thrilling game, Triangle kept

Reading at bay for the rest of overtime to capture the USL Women's Super-20 Championship.

"Big time players step up in big time moments," Triangle coach Pete Sardin said. "She scored a fantastic free kick and the winner in overtime, which was when we needed her to be at her best and she was fantastic."

The first half saw both teams share possession, with Reading claiming the majority of scoring chances. But Clark was a threat all tournament with three goals entering the match, and she turned provider as Triangle opened the scoring. Beating a defender out on the right flank, Clark cut inside and beat a Reading center back. The ball fell to Burch, who slotted the ball into the lower right corner of the net.

Within two minutes, Reading brought itself level. Madison Clemens found herself free at the corner of the penalty area, unleashing a low drive inside the near post. But while Reading continued to see more of the ball, Triangle still found a way to carve out chances. The constant pressure from Triangle put Reading on its heels and Clark nearly put her team ahead midway through the first half, after a rebound fell to her feet at the edge of the six-yard box. The shot went just wide of the target, much to the relief of the Reading defenders.

Triangle found its second goal just minutes later as Burch's first touch just outside the penalty area took her away from the Reading defenders. A great dipping strike sunk under the crossbar for her second goal of the game, giving Triangle a 2-1 halftime lead.

Reading got back on even terms early in the second half when Regina Stump was brought down inside the penalty area. A composed spot kick to the lower right corner leveled the score.

Soon after, Clark found herself back on the score sheet. A well-driven free kick was deflected at the top of the penalty area, but found its way to the corner of the goal for Clark's fourth goal of the tournament. Triangle then looked to apply the knockout blow to Reading and build on their 3-2 lead. Burch lifted ball over her marker and found herself in on a breakaway, but the goalkeeper saved for Reading.

As the game went from one end to the other, Reading's Melissa Rowan found another equalizer from the left side of the box. After a good first touch toward goal, she struck a low drive just inside the far post, leveling the score at 3-3. This thrilling contest continued to open up late in the match as both sets of players faced fatigue and intense heat.

Reading's late goal sent the game to overtime, but there Triangle which had defeated Reading 2-1 in the opening group game of the tournament for both teams, proved to have too much as Clark's goal gave Triangle its third Women's title in four years after taking victory in 2008 and 2009.

Having adorned the beaches of Florida for the past 21 years, beach soccer events feature small-sided games (5v5) on a smaller pitch. Major Beach Soccer provides social and promotional activities to players and fans of all ages during the multi-day events.

2012 MBS SCHEDULE

The 2012 Major Beach Soccer season features three tournaments throughout the state of Florida.

- Daytona Beach, June 8-10
- Clearwater Beach, July 13-15
- Ft. Myers Beach, August 4-5

The 2011 Major Beach Soccer season set the standard for beach soccer in North America with USL hosting two inaugural events, the Major Beach Soccer National Championship and the FIFA Beach Soccer Coaching and Refereeing symposium.

SEASON IN REVIEW

Twelve teams qualified through multiple events for the opportunity to compete for the national championship in the first Major Beach Soccer



National Championship. Teams from the men's and women's open divisions competed on Clearwater Beach for the ultimate beach soccer title.



Simultaneously, Major Beach Soccer, along with US Soccer and USL, hosted the first FIFA Beach Soccer Coaching and Referring Symposium in North America. With 30 participants in attendance, FIFA officials conducted a week-long course educating referees and coaches about the tactics, technical aspect and philosophy found within beach soccer.

FIFA officially recognized beach soccer in 2005 by hosting the first FIFA Beach Soccer World Cup in Rio de Janeiro.



GENERAL INFORMATION





RULES

AFFILIATIONS

USL is directly affiliated with the United States Soccer Federation (USSF), United States Adult Soccer Association (USASA), the Canadian Soccer Association (CSA), the Bermudan Football Association (BFA) and the Antigua & Barbuda Football Association (ABFA).

ROSTERS

USL rosters may consist of a maximum of 26 players, with 18 designated for each game. In the PDL, a maximum of eight (8) players may be over the age of 23. In USL PRO, each team is permitted a maximum of seven (7) foreign players on its active game-day roster and on its master roster. The PDL and W-League are permitted a maximum of eight (8) foreign players on rosters.

ROSTER FREEZE

Each USL league has a Roster Freeze Date after which no team may register any new players. For 2012, those dates are:

W-League: July 11

PDL: July 11

USL Super-20 League: July 13

USL PRO: July 20

Super Y-League: November 10

TRANSFER WINDOWS

From the 2011 season and until further notice, FIFA will not register player transfers that take place outside of the following transfer windows:

- January 15 through April 15 (primary window)
- July 15 through August 14 (secondary window)

AMATEUR PLAYER DEFINITION

An amateur player is defined by the following: A player who does not receive payment for playing soccer and who has signed an amateur registration form with U.S. Soccer or Canadian Soccer Association. Amateur players may be reimbursed for certain expenses as allowed by USSF/CSA/NCAA rules.

POINT SYSTEM

The standard FIFA (3-1-0) system awards three points for a regulation or overtime victory. In the case of a tie, each team will be awarded one point.

GAME CLOCK

All games are comprised of 90 minutes (two 45-minute halves). No overtime is utilized.

LAWS OF THE GAME

USL adheres to all the Laws of the Game as dictated by FIFA, soccer's international governing body.

SUBSTITUTIONS

Five (5) substitutions are allowed per league game with no re-entry permitted in USL PRO. Six (6) will be allowed in the PDL and W-League with no re-entry.

STANDINGS TIEBREAKERS

The breaking of ties in the final league standings, playoffs and finals is accomplished by applying the following criteria, listed in order of importance:

The following two guidelines will be followed during the implementation of USL tiebreakers for all ties involving three or more teams:

- 1) The tiebreaker will determine the winner first.
- 2) The tiebreaker will continue to be followed in order to determine the ranking of the remaining teams without restarting from the beginning.

1) Head-to-head record based on total points in league games

2) Total wins in league games

3) Goal difference in league games

4) Goals scored in league games

5) Total points within smallest grouping. If number of games is unequal, then point percentage will be used.

6) Ranking based on points earned against top four group finishers. This tiebreaker will not be used if four or fewer teams comprise the group. If number of games is unequal, then point percentage applies.

7) Point percentage outside/smallest division or conference in League games

8) Total points in all regular season and Open Cup Qualifying games combined. If number of games is unequal, then point percentage applies

9) FIFA Fair Play – Team with fewest disciplinary points in League games. (If number of games is unequal, points will be divided by games played to arrive at a common basis for comparison.)

10) Lottery conducted by USL at league office
Point Percentage: number of total points earned /

maximum possible points (3 per game)

* Should more than two teams involved have played each other an UNEQUAL number of times, this tiebreaker will be skipped.

*Group: term used to describe the primary unit in which a team competes (i.e. PDL – Southwest Division)

*Point Percentage: number of total points earned / maximum possible points (3 per game)

SCHEDULES

USL PRO: Teams will once again play 24 games in the 2012 season with a maximum of four games played against any single opponent.

PDL: Each team plays 16 games during the regular season.

W-League: Each team plays 12-14 games during the regular season.

PLAYOFFS

Each league in USL has its own distinct playoff system that will determine the league champion.

USL PRO: The 2012 USL PRO Playoffs will include the top six finishers in the single-table format, with the No. 1 and No. 2 seeds receiving a first-round bye the weekend of August 24-26. The semifinals featuring the four remaining teams will be played the following weekend, with the 2012 USL PRO Championship set for the weekend of September 7-9. All playoff rounds feature a single-game knockout format.

PDL: Four berths from each conference will be available for 16 total across the league. Due to the Eastern Conference having three divisions, a bye and play-in format will be used to determine the four conference representatives that will move on to the Conference Semifinals.

The 16 playoff teams will meet for Conference Semifinal tournaments the weekend after the season concludes. The four conference champions will advance to National Semifinals the following weekend, hosted by two of the participants. The PDL Championship will be held the weekend of August 3-5 hosted by one of the participants.

W-League: The Ottawa Fury will host the 2012 USL W-League Championship presented by UMBRO, welcoming the three W-League conference champions July 27-29 to the Algonquin College Soccer Complex for the semifinals and final.

Eleven teams will advance to the postseason with one champion advancing from each conference. The three conference champions will join the Fury in Ottawa in a 'final four' format championship. The semifinals will be played on Friday, July 27 with the winners meeting for the 2012 W-League Championship on Sunday, July 29.

Central Conference Playoffs: The top four seeds from the Central Conference will advance to the Central Conference Championship.

Eastern Conference Playoffs: The top seed and the second-place team from the top seed's division advance to the Eastern Conference Championship, as do the division winners from the other two divisions.

Western Conference Playoffs: The top two teams meet in a conference championship match.

SINGLE PLAYOFF MATCHES

During postseason play, single games tied after regulation will be followed by two 15-minute overtime periods played in their entirety. If still tied, FIFA kicks from the penalty mark are used to determine the winner.

USL HALL OF FAME

NINE SELECTED FOR USL HALL OF FAME

MEN'S, WOMEN'S AND MISL WINGS CREATED

Nine men and women who have proven to be highly influential in North American soccer were chosen for induction into the United Soccer Leagues Hall of Fame in 2011. For the first time, the USL HOF was divided into three distinct wings to increase the recognition for those who have helped make USL a success through the years because of their tremendous efforts and personal sacrifices made on behalf of the sport of soccer in North America.

The USL Hall of Fame Class of 2011 was inducted at the USL Hall of Fame Banquet Presented by Demosphere on Friday, December 16, 2011 at the Hilton Clearwater Beach. Honorees were chosen through a vote of current Hall of Fame members and USL teams.

2011 USL MEN'S HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

Builder – Kyle Krause, Des Moines Menace

Krause acquired majority ownership of the Menace in 1998 and created a dynamic, growing club that is one of the most successful soccer franchises in the country. He has expanded the youth side, essentially developing an entire program from beginner to professional. Average home game attendance hovers near 3,500 for the Menace, setting a PDL record in 2004. Krause's dedication can be seen by the continued success of PDL team and its players. The 2011 season marked the Menace's sixth trip to the US Open Cup and 11th to the playoffs. More than 50 Menace alums have gone on to careers in the ranks of USL PRO, MLS and other professional leagues.



Coach – David Irving, Wilmington Hammerheads

The face of the Wilmington franchise, Irving has led the Hammerheads to two championship games, winning the USL Second Division title in 2003, the same year that the Hammerheads reached the quarterfinals of the U.S. Open Cup after defeating Major League Soccer's FC Dallas 4-1 in the fourth round. The Englishman was also pivotal in securing the return of the Hammerheads to Wilmington after hiatus in 2010, upon which he then led the side to second place in the USL PRO regular season standings.



2011 USL WOMEN'S HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

Builder – Tim Schweitzer, Northern Virginia Majestics

The longtime general manager of Northern Virginia FC has spearheaded the development of thousands of players during the past 13 years. Not only is Northern Virginia one of the top youth clubs in the country with teams competing for regional and national titles, but the club has operated the W-League's Majestics since 1999. Northern Virginia FC is a full-service club dedicated to the USL vision of North American soccer development.



Coach – Lee Horton, Charlotte Lady Eagles

As the only head coach in the history of the Lady Eagles, Horton has been a model of consistency through the past 10 seasons. With an overall record of 107 wins, 31 losses and 9 ties, Horton has guided the team to eight playoff appearances including a W-League championship (2001), two championship game defeats (2000 and 2002), as well as conference championships (2000, 2001, 2002, 2006). Horton is a member of the North Carolina Soccer Coaches Hall of Fame and has been the head boys and girls soccer coach at Charlotte Latin School for more than 20 years, winning 11 NC State Championships during that time.





USL HALL OF FAME

Player – Florence Omagbemi, Hampton Roads Piranhas

Omagbemi was a key figure for the Hampton Roads Piranhas for seven seasons, helping the club capture the 2003 W-League Championship. Omagbemi appeared 76 times for the Piranhas as they won a pair of division titles in 2003 and 2004. Internationally, Omagbemi joined the Nigerian national team at age 16 and became captain at 17, playing at the 1991, 1995, 1999 and 2003 World Cups. She is Nigeria's most-capped player, and played in the 2000 Olympic Games in Australia. Omagbemi finished fourth in the voting for the top African women's player of the 20th Century by the Confederation of African Football.



Player – Christine Sinclair, Vancouver Breakers, Vancouver Whitecaps Women

The leading goal-scorer in the history of the Canadian Women's National Team, Sinclair played four seasons in the W-League for the Vancouver Breakers and the Vancouver Whitecaps Women. The dominant forward scored 23 goals and added 10 assists for the Whitecaps during her three-year spell with the club, and has been named the Canadian Soccer Association Women's Player of the Year each of the past six years (2005-2010), while also being nominated by FIFA for the World Player of the Year award five times.



2011 MISL HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

Builder – Edwin Hale Sr., Baltimore Blast

Edwin Hale Sr. has twice been the principal owner of the Baltimore Blast, first owning the club from 1989-92 before re-purchasing the club in 1998. During Hale's second stint, the Blast have become a league power, winning their first league championship in almost two decades in 2003. That victory triggered a remarkable run of success that saw the Blast win another five championships, the most recent coming in 2009. In addition to his work with the Blast, Hale has also been a respected member of the Baltimore business community, and is currently the CEO of Visit Baltimore, formerly the Baltimore Area Visitors and Convention Association.



Coach – Keith Tozer, Milwaukee Wave

Keith Tozer has become an indoor soccer icon as the coach of the Milwaukee Wave, a position he has held since 1992. A former player, Tozer began his coaching career with the Louisville Thunder in 1984, winning a championship in 1987. Since becoming the Wave's coach, Tozer has won five championships while appearing in another four finals, claiming the club's first title in six seasons with victory in the 2010-11 MISL Championship.



Player – Tatu, Dallas Sidekicks, Wichita Wings

Tatu was one of the most accomplished players in the MISL's history, scoring 857 goals during his 19-year career, the second most in indoor soccer history. A dominant force for the Dallas Sidekicks, with whom he won four championships, Tatu won the league MVP award six times. Later in his career, he also acted as the player/coach for the Sidekicks, winning Coach of the Year honors in the 2003-04 season, one season after his retirement from the field.

1997-98 - Last season of I-League
1998 - W-League splits into two levels, W-1 and W-2
1999 - Name changed to United Soccer Leagues (USL)

2002 - W-League re-unified into one league
2003 - D3 Pro League renamed USL Pro Select League (USL-PSL)



PDL & W-LEAGUE PLAYERS SELECTED IN PRO DRAFTS

MAJOR LEAGUE SOCCER

Led by No. 1 overall selection Andrew Wenger, the PDL saw 26 players move into the professional ranks at the 2012 Major League Soccer SuperDraft in January, continuing the league's success in helping develop young professionals for the next level.

Wenger, who played for Reading United in 2010 and the Carolina Dynamo in 2011, was selected by expansion franchise the Montreal Impact. Six PDL players were selected in the Top 10, with Wenger being joined by former Washington Crossfire standout Kelyn Rowe selected third by the New England Revolution and Orange County Blue Star's Luis Silva fourth by Toronto FC.

The standout franchise of the SuperDraft was the Chicago Fire's PDL side, which produced a record 11 selections overall. Led by Austin Berry, who was selected by the Fire's senior side, the Fire also saw Aaron Maund (Toronto), Andrew Duran (Seattle), Tommy Meyer (L.A. Galaxy), Calum Mallace (Montreal), Chris Etridge (Vancouver), Tyler Polak (New England), Brendan King (Portland), Greg Jordan (Philadelphia) and Kenney Walker (L.A. Galaxy) taken in the first two rounds.

In addition to Wenger, Reading also saw Matt Hedges selected by FC Dallas and Raymon Gaddis join United's MLS affiliate the Philadelphia Union. Silva was joined in being selected by Blue Star All-League selection Chandler Hoffman, now with the Philadelphia Union, while Southwest Division rivals the Ventura County Fusion saw alumni Sam Garza and Jacob Hustedt both selected by San Jose.

All of this year's selections are hoping to follow in the footsteps of Reading United alum C.J. Sapong, who had a stellar rookie season for Sporting Kansas City to earn MLS Rookie of the Year honors. With 111 alumni selected in the past three seasons - more than 70 percent of the players selected - the PDL continues to act as a proving ground for future professionals.

WOMEN'S PROFESSIONAL SOCCER

2011 W-League Rookie of the Year Sydney Leroux led the W-League alumni as the No. 1 selection in the Women's Professional Soccer Draft, with 11 of the 23 selections having previously played in the league.

Leroux was the third consecutive W-League alum taken with the No. 1 pick, following the Pali Blues duo of Tobin Heath and Alex Morgan. She was set to be joined on the Atlanta Beat by the Atlanta Silverback's Katy Frierson, and Seattle Sounders Women's Kate Deines.

The trio, and other drafted players such as Camille Levin (Pali Blues), Ingrid Wells (New Jersey Rangers) and Tori Huster (Colorado Rush), were left without a team in late January, however, as WPS cancelled its 2012 season.

Leroux and Deines will be teammates this summer, along with U.S. Women's National Team members Morgan and Hope Solo, with the Seattle Sounders Women for the upcoming W-League season as the longest continually operated women's league in North America assumed the mantle of the top competitive women's league on the continent.
