THE DEVELOPMENT LEADER

Though the name has changed since the precursor to the United Soccer Leagues – the Southwest Indoor Soccer League – was founded in 1986, the focus on the developmental side of the game has remained a constant for United Soccer Leagues during its first quarter century. The original vision for USL's system of leagues was eventually to provide teams with the opportunity to create a true soccer pyramid. That vision has become a reality with USL clubs now able to field teams starting at the youth level (Next Generation Series, Super Y League & Super-20 League), through the amateur level (PDL & W-League) and ultimately the professional level (USL PRO & MISL).

In 2013 USL PRO embarks on an exciting partnership with Major League Soccer that will see MLS clubs form direct affiliations with USL PRO clubs and MLS Reserve teams competing against USL PRO teams. Additional details will be announced during 2013.

With soccer's momentum growing at all levels throughout North America and the Caribbean, USL will continue to explore growth opportunities and set the standard for the quality of the action on the field and the level of service provided to clubs by the dedicated staff at USL's league headquarters in Tampa, Fla.

GROWING THE GAME

When USL launched its outdoor program in 1989, there were only 19 professional soccer teams in the country and no organized lower divisions for the sport. That eight-team USL outdoor league has grown into the 65-team Premier Development League while USL has developed into one of the most sophisticated sports organizations in the U.S. and Canada. Today, USL oversees the development of players, coaches, referees and administrators that participate in six different leagues that encompass more than 100 men's and women's franchises and more than 500 youth teams.



Always a pioneer in the sport, USL launched the W-League in 1995 - long

before women's professional soccer was born - and created the first national youth league with the Super Y-League in 1999. In 2013 USL will, through a partnership with IMG Academy, set a new standard for youth soccer with the debut of the Next Generation Series, which will change the way players, coaches, parents and clubs view youth development.

USL has seen many of its players go on to represent their countries in international competition. During the current 2014 World Cup qualifying tournament, the U.S. Men's National Team will feature many players who have developed through the USL system including Tim Howard, Jozy Altidore, Geoff Cameron, Graham Zusi and Sacha Kljestan. Canada continues to be led by 2011MLS Most Valuable Player Dwayne De Rosario. The list includes veterans who got their break in the professional game in the USL First Division, such as De Rosario with the Richmond Kickers, to Premier Development League products like Cameron, Zusi and Kljestan.

Leading the charge as the first generation of Super Y-League alums to reach the world stage was Altidore. The vertically-integrated structure of USL has been in place for a decade and the dividends of the early years are already beginning to show. With USL and Major League Soccer teams focused on growing the game through a dedicated pyramid of soccer leagues from the youth ranks to the pros, future generations will continue to improve, year after year and tournament after tournament.

The dedication USL has shown to the women's game through the W-League has paid off for not only the U.S. and Canadian Women's National Teams, but also for players from other countries. At the 2011 Women's World Cup in Germany, 62 former W-League players took to the field, including the United States' Abby Wambach, Christie Rampone and Alex Morgan, Canada's Christine Sinclair and Japan's Homare Sawa, who was named the FIFA Women's World Player of the Year after leading her nation to victory.

In January of 2013, the Major League Soccer SuperDraft saw 27 former PDL and super-20 League players selected, including No. 1 selection Andrew Farrell of the River City Rovers and IMG Academy Bradenton, and the NWSL Draft featured 17 former W-League players, including No. 1 selection Zakiya Bywaters of the LA Strikers.

EXPANDING INTERNATIONAL HORIZONS


USL has long been a leader when it comes to international influence of players, clubs, and executives in North America. Given the organization's unique landscape of clubs from the youth to professional ranks, USL provides many opportunities for foreign clubs to develop affiliations and partnerships with its franchises.

Identifying talented players and creating new commercial opportunities is a priority for clubs around the world, and USL provides clubs the best platform to connect these opportunities with clubs that desire to have a presence in North America.

In 2008, USL embarked on an international development initiative to connect USL clubs with foreign counterparts. As part of this initiative, USL partnered with Beswicks Sports, the specialist sports division of the United Kingdom-based legal group Beswicks. As USL's representative in the UK to broker partnerships between British football clubs and USL franchises, Beswicks Sports has been able to open up new avenues for clubs from across the Atlantic to make new professional partnerships.

The partnership with Beswicks Sports paid immediate dividends for USL, formalizing affiliations with English clubs such as Burnley and Stoke City FC. In addition, Beswicks was integral to the hiring of former West Ham United player Anthony Hudson when he took the coaching reins at Real Maryland FC of the USL Second Division for the 2009 season.





More recently, Beswicks helped broker the deal that led to UK-based VisionPro Sports Institute's 2011 partnership with USL, resulting in plans for a boys academy and the announcement of new teams in USL PRO, the PDL, the W-League and the Super-20 League.

"Forming strategic partnerships with European professional clubs is something we recognize is vital to our growth in the future, at the league and club level," USL Senior Director of International Development Francisco Marcos said.

"The interest levels in USL and its various leagues have never been higher throughout Europe," said Gary Mellor, partner at Beswicks. "European clubs recognize that USL provides them with unequalled access to North American young talent as well as the opportunity to forge strategic partnerships and the commercial opportunities that follow."

Now in its third decade of operation, USL continues to be a driving force in the growth of soccer in the United States, Canada and Caribbean. USL provides a clearly defined path for the progression of male and female soccer players beginning at the youth level (Super Y-League/Super-20 League/NGS), continuing through the amateur level (PDL/W-League) and up to the professional level, both outdoor and indoor (USL PRO/MISL). A platform for countless players to reach for their dreams each year, USL is devoted to developing the sport at the grassroots level in every community across the region.



USL PRO

USL PRO is the strongest, best operated and most experienced North American men's professional soccer league below MLS, both on and off the field. In 2013 USL PRO begins a groundbreaking, multi-year

partnership with MLS that will enhance the development of professional players in North America, strengthen the competition in both leagues, and establish a solid foundation for future collaboration. Focused on franchise stability and longevity, USL PRO will feature 13 teams participating in the 2013 season, including expansion teams in Phoenix and Tampa. The league is focused on aggressive but deliberate growth by adding teams fully capable of meeting USL and US Soccer standards, which are located in markets that further promote regional league play. In addition to league play, USL PRO teams will compete in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup as well as various domestic and international exhibitions. USL PRO is the longest-standing pro league affiliate member of US Soccer.



MISL

USL acquired the Major Indoor Soccer League (MISL) in May, 2011 and began operating North America's most storied and tradition-rich professional indoor soccer league for the 2011-12 season. The MISL represents the top level of professional

indoor soccer in North America and currently consists of seven franchises. The league roster includes franchises in Baltimore, Chicago, Kansas City, Milwaukee, Rochester, Syracuse and Wichita.



PDL

The top developmental men's league in North America, the 2013 PDL features 65 teams within four conferences throughout the United States and Canada. The PDL season consists of 14 regular season matches for each team, seven home and seven away, and provides elite collegiate players the opportunity to taste a higher

level of competition while maintaining their eligibility. In addition to league play, PDL teams compete in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup as well as various exhibitions. The PDL has proven to be an important stepping-stone for top professionals now playing throughout the world.



W-LEAGUE

The W-League is the first and longest-standing women's soccer league in North America. The 2013 W-League campaign will feature 25 teams in three

regional conferences playing 10-12 regular season matches. Featuring current and former international and professional stars, the W-League also provides elite amateurs the opportunity to compete while maintaining their eligibility as college student-athletes. The league is recognized throughout the world for providing superior competition for female players, while offering affordable family entertainment for fans throughout North America.



SUPER-20 LEAGUE

As the longest standing and most sophisticated U20 men's and women's North American amateur league, the Super-20 League provides the platform for top 17- to 20-year-olds in the United States and Canada to compete at the elite level. While serving as a reserve team system for many W-League and PDL teams, the USL Super-20 League features teams competing in regional divisions, playing in 8-10 regular season matches throughout the summer months.



SUPER Y-LEAGUE

Founded in 1999, the Super Y-League is dedicated to the progression of future professional players. Averaging 700 teams since 2004, the Super Y-League has steered the course for development of elite clubs, players, and coaches. Affiliated with U.S. Soccer, the Super Y-League ODP Program has opened countless doors for players to be identified for U.S. National Team programs. The Super Y-League contains the youth academies of Major League Soccer clubs, USL PRO clubs, PDL

and W-League clubs. The league also serves clubs looking to develop the game from the ground up. Top youth academies such as the Chicago Magic, Mass Premier Soccer and TSF Academy have been members of the league for several seasons. USL's Super Y-League has revolutionized youth player development in North America.

NEXTGEN

The NGS is an exciting, new youth soccer initiative undertaken by USL and IMG Academy, established to provide clubs the opportunity to take part in an elite-level league for U12 and U14 boys and girls. The NGS will take a developmental approach which engages the player, coach, and parent, while facilitating player growth across 10 important disciplines. These disciplines will be conducted by world-renowned experts in their respective areas of performance, and will include Ignite360 athletic assessment, physical and mental conditioning, technical skill development, tactical development, and vision development; as well as instruction about nutrition, leadership, on-field communication, and injury prevention. Teams will participate in an eight-month season featuring two evaluation/competition events at IMG, and top players will be identified through the NGS Player Tracking Program and invited to attend the NGS ID Training Camp at IMG.



ALEC PAPADAKIS - CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

As Chief Executive Officer of USL, Papadakis serves as USL's top executive as well as a managing owner. Also the Chief Executive Officer and Managing Partner of NuRock Soccer Holdings, Papadakis has 35 years of domestic and international experience as a franchise attorney.

As a player in the North American Soccer League for the Atlanta Chiefs and the Boston Minutemen, Papadakis had a long, successful career in the United States at the collegiate and professional level, earning numerous accolades. He played in Atlanta for three seasons, the first two with the Chiefs and the third with the Apollos, appearing in 39 games. He finished his career with the Boston Minutemen in 1974. His teams captured conference regular season championships in 1971 and 1974.





TIM HOLT - PRESIDENT

Tim Holt joined USL in 1999 originally serving as the A-League & Super Y-League Operations Director. He added the responsibilities of overseeing the operations of all USL senior leagues in 2002 and was named Vice President in 2004. Holt became President following the acquisition of USL by NuRock Soccer Holdings in 2009.

Holt's numerous responsibilities include the day-to-day management of USL business operations, developing and implementing the strategic plan for all USL leagues, the supervision of compliance with league regulations and policies, franchise relations, personnel management and regular communication with the leadership of the US, Canada, Bermuda and Antigua & Barbuda Federations. During his period of leadership with USL, the organization has become the largest system of elite soccer leagues in North America.



Holt served on the US Soccer Federation (USSF) Board of Directors from 2003-06, and is currently Co-Chairman of the Lamar Hunt US Open Cup Committee. Holt also serves USSF as a member of its Professional Council and has been a member of its Credentials and Open Cup Disciplinary Committees. From 2005-09, he was the Men's Professional Representative on the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Board of Directors. In 2006, Holt was named one of Soccer America's 'Rising Stars,' recognizing the top American soccer executives under the age of 35, and has an extensive network of relationships at all levels of American soccer.

A native of suburban Philadelphia and product of the respected FC DELCO youth club in eastern Pennsylvania, Holt is a member of the Radnor (PA) High School Soccer Hall of Fame and still ranks amongst the school's all-time top leading scorers. Holt graduated from Penn State University with a BS in Management and went on to earn his Masters Degree in Sport Administration at Florida State University.

LEAGUE DIRECTORS

CHRIS ECONOMIDES - SENIOR DIRECTOR, USL PRO AND MISL

A member of the USL Hall of Fame as a Builder, the former co-owner and co-founder of both the Rochester Rhinos and Carolina RailHawks joined USL in November of 2008. He was a regular member of the USL-1 Executive Committee and helped guide the Rhinos to four league and Open Cup championships. His success helped earn recognition on Street & Smith's Sports Business Journal's Top 40 Under 40 list of sports executives in 1999 and the 2001 USL-1 Executive of the Year honor.



AMANDA DUFFY - SENIOR DIRECTOR, W-LEAGUE

Duffy took over as senior director of the W-League in September of 2010 after three seasons managing the operations of USL Second Division while also overseeing the operations of USL First Division in 2008. The former W-League player helped guide the Hampton Roads Piranhas to their only league championship as well as 21-game undefeated and 23-game unbeaten streaks. She also played with the Raleigh Wings and Central Florida Krush, and amassed an overall 51-7-3 W-League. Duffy also spent time with the Carolina Courage of WUSA before ending her playing career after one season with Danmarks IF in Sweden. An East Carolina University graduate, Duffy concluded her college career as the leader in career goals and single-season goals as well as career points, and received honors from NSCAA, Soccerbuzz and Conference USA before serving as a graduate assistant coach for the program and earning her Masters Degree in Sports Management. In 2012 she became the first women's soccer player inducted into the ECU Athletics Hall of Fame.



JASON ARNOLD – SENIOR DIRECTOR, USL YOUTH LEAGUES

ABOUT THE U.S. SOCCER FEDERATION

As the governing body of soccer in all its forms in the United States, U.S. Soccer has played an integral part in charting the course for the sport in the USA for 100 years. In that time, the Federation's mission statement has been clear and simple: to make soccer, in all its forms, a preeminent sport in the United States and to continue the development of soccer at all recreational and competitive levels.

U.S. Soccer is celebrating its Centennial in 2013, and over the course of a century the sport's exponential growth has been nothing short of remarkable.

From a viewership standpoint, nearly 20 million Americans watched the Round of 16 match at the 2010 FIFA World Cup on television. Soccerspecific stadiums have opened their doors to resounding success. The National Training Center in Carson, Calif., in its 10th year of existence, has been a valuable facility for all levels, including the U.S. Soccer Development Academy, which kicked off at the state-of-the-art complex with much fanfare in 2007.

In 1989, the U.S. Men's National Team had not played in a World Cup in 40 years and the U.S. Women's program was in its early stages. U.S. Soccer was playing games in small stadiums that did not reach capacity, few matches were televised, soccer-specific stadiums were yet to be created and there were no high-level professional outdoor leagues.

Since that time, the state of U.S. Soccer has evolved significantly. Entering 2013, the U.S. MNT played in six consecutive FIFA World Cups and advanced to the quarterfinals at the 2002 event. U.S. Soccer is a world leader in women's soccer at every level, and the U.S. WNT has won two FIFA Women's World Cups and four Olympic Gold Medals – an accomplishment that no other country on the men's and women's side has reached in Olympic competition. The United States has also hosted three World Cups with the support of its members and strong organizational abilities.

Professionally, Major League Soccer continues to grow in popularity and prestige with 19 teams throughout North

America, as well as increasing attendance and viewership. Also of significant importance, MLS features 14 clubs competing in 13 soccer-specific stadiums. On the women's side, the U.S. Soccer Federation is administering the launch of the National Women's Soccer League in 2013. U.S. Soccer is subsidizing the salaries of up to 24 U.S. WNT players while the Canadian Soccer Association and Federation of Mexican Football are doing the same for up to 16 players.

From a coaching standpoint in the United States, more classes are continually being offered around the country, and the number of licensed, well-educated trainers and managers is larger than ever. The education level among coaches has been tailored to match the expanding pool of talent in the U.S.

U.S. Soccer continues to set positive trends for referees in CONCACAF, with reinvigorated focus on education and training, including the realm of professional referees. In 2012, U.S. Soccer and MLS created the Professional Referee Organization (PRO) to manage the referee program in professional soccer leagues in the U.S. and Canada. The creation of PRO has been designed to increase the quality of officiating in U.S. and Canadian professional leagues, develop more professional quality officials at a younger age and develop officials who will represent the United States and Canada in FIFA competitions.

Participation in soccer continues at high levels among both youth and adults, with more than 4.3 million registered players among the 24 million participants in the sport, according to the FIFA Big Count.

2012 U.S. OPEN CUP REVIEW

Both the Charlotte Eagles and Dayton Dutch Lions made club history in the 2012 U.S. Open Cup, joining the Harrisburg City Islanders in the quarterfinals of the competition in another outstanding year for USL clubs in the historic competition's 99th edition.

The Eagles, celebrating their 20th season in 2012, had never advanced beyond the third round in their history, nor defeated MLS opposition. That changed when goals by Daryl Roberts and Nate Thornton earned their side a 2-0 victory against FC Dallas in the third round. That victory was the second of three consecutive in the Lone Star State for the Eagles, who defeated the El Paso Patriots in the second round before beating the San Antonio Scorpions in the fourth round to reach the quarterfinals.

Dayton also had never defeated MLS opposition, and the Dutch Lions were up against it trailing the Columbus Crew by a goal in their third-round contest at Crew Stadium entering the final 15 minutes. The introduction of Kyle Knotek off the bench made the difference, however, as the winger assisted on goals by Jan-Gerrit Bartels and Gibson Bardsley to earn a 2-1 victory, delighting the traveling support at Crew Stadium.



Dayton went on to end the Cup dreams of the PDL's standard-bearer in the tournament, the Michigan Bucks, who had sprung a surprise of their own as they took a dramatic 3-2 victory against the Chicago Fire in the third round. Hosting the MLS club at Ultimate Soccer Arenas, Nate Boyden tied the game with 11 minutes remaining before Nermin Crnkic scored in extra time to give his side its second victory against an MLS club in the competition.

Michigan appeared to have a chance for more drama when it faced Dayton in the fourth round, with Anthony Grant's goal tying Eli Garner's opener for the Dutch Lions. Joel DeLass scored what proved to be the gamewinner for the Dutch Lions from the penalty spot, however, sending his side to its first quarterfinal appearance.

Harrisburg reached the quarterfinals for the third time in the club's history, earning a thrilling penalty shootout victory against the New England Revolution in the third round after playing to a 3-3 draw after extra time. The Revolution appeared to have clinched the tie at the midway point of extra time, taking a three-goal lead in the opening 15 minutes, but Harrisburg roared back, Brian Ombiji getting the first goal before Sainey Touray made it 3-2 in the 117th minute. J.T. Noone was then on hand in the final minute to tie the game, and when New England's Benny Feilhaber had his effort saved by Nick Noble in the fifth round of the shootout, the City Islanders advanced.

Harrisburg's extra time magic continued in the fourth round against the New York Red Bulls, with Touray and Lucky Mkosana each scoring to give their side a 3-1 victory. The run came to an end against the Philadelphia Union, however, as did Charlotte's against Chivas USA and Dayton's against eventual champion Sporting Kansas City.

2012 CHAMPIONSHIP

CHARLESTON CLAIMS USL PRO TITLE

The Charleston Battery kept their perfect record in championship games intact at Blackbaud Stadium, capturing the 2012 USL PRO Championship with a 1-0 win against the Wilmington Hammerheads.

Game MVP Jose Cuevas created the only goal the Battery would need to send the crowd of 4,963 home happy, threading a pass through the Wilmington defense in the 74th minute to Mike Azira, who hit a first-time left-footed shot into the far corner from the left side of the penalty area, giving Wilmington keeper Alex Horwath no chance.

It was the fourth title in four trips to the final for Charleston, which also captured championships in 1996, 2003 and 2010. The Battery entered the post-season as the No. 3 seed, and took out No. 6 Harrisburg and No. 2 Rochester to advance to the title game. However, Battery Head Coach Mike Anhaeuser said it was a regular-season contest in Rochester on August 11 that put his squad on track for the title.

"In the beginning of the season after the first three or four games, I really felt like we had a team that could win it," Anhaeuser said. "We had a little hesitation or hiccup in the middle of the season, but when we won that game in Rochester 4-0, and I saw the guys play the way they did, I knew that we could beat anybody."

The No. 5-seed Hammerheads, who reached the championship game after upsetting top-seeded Orlando City in the semifinals, fell just short of capturing their second title.

"I thought [Charleston] deserved to win," Wilmington Head Coach David Irving said. "The occasion may have gotten to us a little bit, but just to get here and the way we played the past few games is a credit to the boys. We just weren't ourselves tonight and we definitely didn't play the way I know we can play."

The teams spent most of the first half feeling each other out through hard tackles and physical play, as both felt the weight of the evening's proceedings. A steady rain and blustery wind hurt both teams' possession for much of the half, and Charleston midfielder Ryan Richter had the first good look at goal in the ninth minute, bending a left-footed shot from the top of box just wide of the far post.

It wasn't until the 40th minute that the first true scoring chance came courtesy of Cuevas – named USL PRO Rookie of the Year on Friday – who flicked a strong header toward the top left corner that was tipped over the bar by Horwath to keep the game scoreless at the half.



Wilmington brought on All-USL PRO Second Team midfielder Bryce Taylor to start the second half to try to boost its offense. It appeared to work as the Hammerheads began to press into the Charleston end more down the left wing, but the Battery soon went back on the attack. They came close once again in the 62nd minute, when Amadou Sanyang met Nicki Paterson's corner perfectly in the Wilmington penalty area, only to see his uncontested header trickle wide of the left post.

After Azira put Charleston into the lead, Wilmington pushed everyone forward and sent ball after ball in the Battery's penalty area, but the veteran defense led by John Wilson and Colin Falvey and backed up by 'keeper Andrew Dykstra, was able to hold tight.

USL PRO. MLS ENTER INTO GROUNDBREAKING PARTNERSHIP

Major League Soccer and USL PRO announced a groundbreaking, multi-year partnership in early 2013 that will enhance the development of professional players in North America, strengthen the competition in both leagues, and establish a solid foundation for future collaboration.

For 2013, the partnership will include interleague play between USL PRO and MLS Reserve League teams, and the establishment of several exclusive team affiliations. The first MLS-USL PRO affiliations will see direct working relationships between D.C. United and the Richmond Kickers, the New England Revolution and the Rochester Rhinos, the Philadelphia Union and Harrisburg City Islanders, and Sporting Kansas City and Orlando City.

These initial programs will immediately improve professional player development in the United States and Canada. Additional technical and commercial initiatives between the two leagues will be announced as they are finalized in the coming months.

"This partnership represents the first step in a long-term alliance between MLS and USL PRO to connect domestic professional soccer through a system that benefits player development, competition and the overall business of our sport," MLS Executive Vice President of Player Relations & Competition Todd Durbin said. "Over the past several years, USL PRO has made great strides in restructuring in a manner that serves to complement the objectives of MLS. This is a win-win for all involved and it demonstrates our strong commitment to growing North American professional soccer at all levels."

Each club affiliation will be customized to meet the needs of the respective teams, but all will include at least four players on long-term loan from the MLS parent club to its USL PRO affiliate. Those MLS teams with formal USL PRO affiliates will not participate in the 2013 MLS Reserve League. Neither MLS nor USL PRO clubs are required to enter into an affiliation, and specific affiliations will be announced in the coming days.

Each of the 13 USL PRO teams will compete in two interleague games against MLS Reserve teams. With the exception of Antigua, which will play both of its games at MLS Reserve teams, USL PRO teams have been paired with a single MLS team to play a home and home series. All interleague games will count in both the official USL PRO and MLS Reserve League standings. Details of the fixtures will be announced in conjunction with the forthcoming release of the official 2013 USL PRO schedule.





"USL PRO has for the past several years been the most sophisticated and competitive professional soccer league under MLS," USL CEO Alec Papadakis said. "This new partnership with MLS will elevate and strengthen the level of competition for domestic professional soccer while simultaneously creating a more sustainable financial model for team owners. As a result, we expect this partnership will forge a seamless system for the development of players and coaches, and promote the expansion of professional soccer into new North American markets."

STABILIZING FORCE

Holt: MLS partnership strengthens USL PRO on and off the field

Professional soccer in the United States, especially in lower level leagues, has always lacked stability. USL PRO is hoping to change that thanks to a new agreement with Major League Soccer.

"Not only do we think that this partnership will elevate and strengthen the level of competition on the field for USL PRO, but we also think off the field it helps create a more sustainable financial model for our team owners," said Tim Holt, President of United Soccer Leagues.

"I think we have created an attractive option for players," said Holt. "I think it's one that will help both immediately help boost the level of play and the product that we put on the field, and I think it's also a step in the right direction towards creating a sustainable vibrant business model for professional soccer below MLS--- lower division professional soccer in this country."

The partnership, unveiled in January, calls for a variety of initiatives. MLS teams can directly affiliate with USL PRO clubs, which four already have done, and supply at least four players on long term loan to their affiliate. Those MLS teams with formal USL PRO affiliates will not participate in the 2013 MLS Reserve League. Teams without affiliates will have their reserve teams play against USL PRO teams as part of the regular league schedule.

"What we had announced to date as the initiatives, which tangibly are the interleague play component and the affiliations, it's just the first step or phase in a long term relationship with MLS that beginning in 2014 is going to expand further and become more and more integrated in the years to come," Holt said of the groundbreaking deal.



Holt said the affiliate model is in some ways a hybrid of what sports fans may be familiar with in baseball, where major league teams have minor league affiliates, but also incorporating a European element where top flight clubs have reserve teams playing in a lower division.

"What we are trying to do is borrow models from lower level professional leagues in sports that have worked in the United States and what's worked in soccer abroad and combining those into a new model which can be beneficial to MLS in terms of supporting its player and market development initiatives but also be very positive for USL PRO in terms of further developing its niche in this country's soccer market," said Holt.

The future plan calls for fully integrating MLS Reserve teams into USL PRO.

"It could be in the very same market in the same stadium (as the MLS team), it could be in the same market in a different slightly smaller venue, but one that still meets the minimum standards of USL PRO. It could be in a satellite market," Holt said of how the reserve team integration might work.

While the agreement helps to provide a clear path to MLS from the lower divisions, it also helps the USL PRO teams stabilize, since some salaries will be borne by the MLS team.

"There is some increased profile and awareness that may come with being a formal affiliate of a Major League Soccer team," Holt said of some initial benefits.

Beyond that, things still need to shake out, but could include MLS and Soccer United Marketing helping with generating revenue for USL PRO.

"We don't know exactly how that could be monetized in terms of revenue generation, with sponsors, with fans, that will be one of the things that we learn a little bit, but I think that's something that we work with," Holt said.

USL PRO has all 11 of the teams that played last year returning for the 2013 season, plus the league has added a team in Phoenix and one in Sacramento that starts play in 2014.

"With our teams it's just a matter of continuing to find ways to generate new revenue and have a model for professional soccer that doesn't require expenses that are out of whack with what can be generated on the revenue side each and every year.

"I think that's been lower division professional soccer's problem over the last 20 years. Those two things aren't synched. When we restructured USL PRO 2-3 years ago, that was part and parcel of what we were doing, where the league model allowed them to achieve profitability on an annual operating basis, provided they were able to maximize those opportunities — ticket sales, youth programs, sponsorship, etc. — in their markets. We feel like we are getting there each year with more and more teams."

Holt says part of the process included jettisoning teams that could not meet the new standards, while also being more stringent about who was allowed to join the league.

"We've stabilized and now we are starting to experience some growth, and we've added this (MLS) partnership, so there's a lot of momentum going on. The teams feel very positive about the current and future of the league."









MISL

USL entered into an agreement with the Major Indoor Soccer League in 2011 and began operating North America's most storied and tradition-rich professional indoor soccer league beginning with the 2011-12 season.

The MISL represents the top level of professional indoor soccer in North America and consisted of seven teams in 2012-13, including a new franchise in the Chicago Soul.

The MISL enjoyed fantastic growth in 2012-13, both in attendance and attention. More than 350,000 fans filled arenas during the regular season for the second consecutive year, and more than 100,000 watched games online. All MISL games are available online at MISLNation.com.

MISL indoor soccer was developed to appeal to sports fans around the world. The fast-paced,

fiercely competitive game is played on artificial turf on a hockey-rink-sized field surrounded by dasher boards and Plexiglas with eightfoot high by 14-foot wide goals receded into the end boards. Creative dribbling, pinpoint passing, acrobatic goalkeeping and rugged defensive play are all skills demonstrated by MISL players.

A typical MISL game features end-to-end-action resulting in approximately 60 shots and 11 goals per game. Each game includes four 15-minute quarters and a popular feature is multi-point scoring, with goals from long distance worth more. Other unique characteristics of the MISL include action-packed power plays and free substitution of players while play continues.

FC LONDON CLAIMS PDL CHAMPIONSHIP



Forest City London claimed its first PDL Championship as Jordan Ayris scored a second-half goal to lift his side to a 2-1 victory against the Carolina Dynamo at Macpherson Stadium in Greensboro, N.C. . Ayris, an All-Central Conference selection, used his quick feet to capitalize on a scramble in the Dynamo penalty area to score the game-winning goal.

The victory capped a remarkable run by London through the playoffs that saw the club not only win its first playoff game, but defeat the Thunder Bay Chill, Michigan Bucks and Sounders FC U23 on the way to the championship game.

"It's been great, all the boys are great on the pitch, off the pitch we're good friends, they couldn't be more welcoming," Ayris said. "Coming in with the boys who had been here last year, or for two or three years, made it easy for me to come in."

FC London opened nervously, with goalkeeper Reece Richardson almost being made to pay for a poor clearance by Hakan Ilhan in the third minute, the UNC-Greensboro forward's chip going just over the empty goal. FC London settled soon, though, and was able to hold possession better than the Dynamo in the first 20 minutes.

Carolina that took the lead in the 26th minute, however, as it sprang forward on a counter-attack after a turnover in midfield, and Ilhan's pass split the defense to find Donnie Smith, who timed his run perfectly as London's back four looked for an offside flag. The UNC-Charlotte standout easily rounded Richardson and tucked his finish into the back of the net

London was able to get back on even terms quickly, as the Dynamo's goal spurred it forward

in greater numbers. They were rewarded for their pressure as Bryan Da Cruz sent in a good cross from the left that was flicked goalward by Ayris. A Dynamo defender headed away, but the ball came to Carl Haworth as he cut through the penalty area and hit a perfect right-footed volley into the right corner of the net.

The Dynamo almost retook the lead through Smith moments later, but his volleyed effort went high and wide of the goal off Shane Malcolm's cross, leaving the game tied 1-1 at the break. The Dynamo continued to have most of the play to start the second half, with Ilhan and Smith trying to combine with Malcolm on the right side, but it was Haworth who produced the first big save as his rifled shot from 25 yards out was parried away by Peyton Ford.

The decisive moment came with 14 minutes to go as London got a free kick about 35 yards from goal. The Dynamo were able to clear the initial free kick, but Tyler Hemming picked up possession on the right side and cut back onto his left foot. The center back floated a cross into the penalty area, and the ball landed at the feet of Ayris, who flicked the ball quickly onto his left foot and finished tidily.

The Dynamo threw everything forward in the closing stages, and almost grabbed a late equalizer when substitute Mamadee Nyepon broke into the left side of the penalty area, only for Richardson to make an outstanding save with his left foot. Despite Carolina's pressure, FC London was able to hold on and claim a remarkable victory.

"It's unbelievable," FC London coach Martin Painter said. "I'm so proud of the players and what we've accomplished. It's been a challenging season, we've had our ups and downs, and we came together and fought through adversity and put in strong performances these last four games, tonight especially because Carolina's a great team, it's fantastic."

2012 CHAMPIONSHIP

OTTAWA CAPTURES FIRST W-LEAGUE TITLE

The Ottawa Fury gave up a second-minute goal and then spent all of 88 minutes searching for the equalizer in the 2012 W-League Championship.

They found it at the death. Ashley Seal pounced on the rebound as Pali Blues goalkeeper Anna Maria Picarelli could only parry away Katrina-Lee Gorry's free kick, and Seal made no mistake from close range, tying the game at 1-1 moments before the final whistle. After overtime, Ottawa goalkeeper Jasmine Phillips made two diving saves during the penalty kicks to lift the Fury to their first W-League title.

The W-League Championship kicked off on a sunny Sunday afternoon at Algonquin College Soccer Complex and it didn't take long for Pali to edge its way in front as Nikki Washington fired from long range to put the Blues up 1-0 in just the second minute of play. Washington was held out of action during Friday's semifinal and she made an immediate impact on Sunday afternoon. Sarah Huffman played Washington down the right side and she struck a brilliant shot from distance, beating Phillips and into the far netting.

The Blues came into the game searching for their third W-League title while the perennial power Fury were back in the championship game for the second consecutive season.

The Blues continued to press forward early, picking out 2012 Rookie of the Year Lynn Williams at every opportunity. Williams was a constant threat to the Fury back line in the first half with her size and speed despite recovering from a pulled hamstring. Less than 15 minutes into the first half and down a goal, Fury head coach Dom Oliveri brought on 2011 W-League MVP Mallory Outerbridge to boost the attack.

"We felt that we played ourself into the game," Oliveri said. "I think we were very, very nervous and it showed in the first 15 minutes. The message was keep going, keep going. We knew we could break them down if we kept playing. All credit to the players. They gave a great performance."

Ottawa settled nicely with the change and came close to knotting the game at 1-1 as Leni Kaurin played Outerbridge through but couldn't quite keep the ball from going beyond the touch line and the threat came to that

Continuing to press forward, Outerbridge came close for the Fury in the 27th minute. Tina Romagnuolo found Outerbridge with a lovely weighted through-ball behind the Pali defense only to have Cammi Levin come across to break up the shot.

Seven minutes before the halftime whistle Outerbridge had the best chance for the Fury in the first half. Lisa-Marie Woods worked her way into the box and squared across frame past Picarelli to Outerbridge. With an open net in front of her, she couldn't redirect on frame and hit the post, leaving the Pali back line free to breathe a sigh of relief.

Two minutes into the second half Washington almost doubled the Blues' advantage. Elizabeth Eddy played across the box with the ball somehow finding its way

through to Washington on the opposite side. Firing low on frame the Ottawa defense cleared off the line to safety.

As in the first half, Pali came out on the front foot with the Fury weathering the storm

weathering the storm to hit back with their own wave of pressure. Woods had the first chance as Kelly Conheeney laid it off to her just outside the box but the shot sailed over Picarelli's crossbar. Moments later, Outerbridge was again at the center of the action, chesting down Woods' cross only to volley over the goal.

Ottawa pushed forward at every opportunity yet couldn't create clear scoring opportunities as the Pali back line was organized and incisive. With the Fury committing so many players forward Pali found space in the counterattack and in the 81st minute Eddy found space in the box but neither Bogus nor Tangorra could get a touch and Phillips saved.

With moments remaining in regulation Woods stepped up to take the free kick just outside the box. Her shot fired past the wall and through to Picarelli who palmed away. Seal collected and fired home to knot the game at the death, sending the W-League Championship into extra time.

Riding the wave of momentum the Fury crashed forward in the first 15 minutes. Gorry almost put the Fury up in the 96th minute with a shot from 30 yards out rattling the crossbar. Pali held firm, though, and snuffed out the Fury attack taking the game to the short intermission. After the break Pali came out on the front foot with Andrews and Lytle both testing Phillips. After 120 minutes, however, the game remained 1-1 and headed to penalty kicks.

Fury youth product Jasmine Phillips made two diving saves and closed out the game 2-1 (4-3) as the Fury won their first W-League Championship in front of their home fans. It was the perfect ending to the script, which began 13 years ago for Fury owner John Pugh.

"It's been a long run," Pugh said. "This is the fourth time [in the championship game] and to do it in front of our own fans and to do it in the manner that we did where we had to come from behind after giving up the early goal... it's unbelievable. It's something this club has strived to do for 10 seasons and finally it's all come true."

"This just means a ton and so much for the club," Oliveri added. "We've had such a great program for so long. We've been in the finals four times and managed to win one. This is great for the club and John Pugh, who's given a great opportunity here to do so many things."

After coming so close for so long the Ottawa Fury have now etched their name in the history books in what was a thrilling finish to a fantastic 2012 W-League season.

ABOUT SUPER-Y LEAGUE

USL SUPER Y-LEAGUE (BOY5/GIRLS U12-U17)

Since founding the Super Y-League in 1999, USL has seen the limitless growth potential in soccer beginning at the youth levels and advancing through the professional ranks. By establishing a concrete soccer foundation through highly competitive and developmental youth programs such as the SYL, USL allows male and female players to develop and compete with one club through the duration of their careers.

The Super Y-League added the U12 boys and girls age groups for the 2011 season, giving the league six age groups for the first time. In conjunction with the other SYL age divisions, the U12 division also offers an Olympic Development Program.

Created in 1999 with 12 teams, the USL Super Y-League now includes nearly 80 clubs from throughout the United States and Canada with an average of 500 teams competing in the league every summer. The U12 divisions maintain the same rules and regulations of the league's U13-U17 age groups, and its first season concluded at the 2011 USL Super Y-League North American Finals in Tampa, Florida.

Many of the clubs participating in the league are now affiliated with the top professional and amateur men's and women's sides of USL and Major League Soccer, providing a true pyramid of development that mirrors those in traditional soccer nations around the globe.

In its first few years, the league was primarily a vehicle for the top players to come together and face higher-level competition at a regional and/or national level on a regular basis. Now, the Super Y-League's fully operational ODP system helps propel the careers of elite players to the upper levels of the professional game in North America.

The Super Y-League North American Finals was the first step in the implementation of ODP status. Making the finals an official scouting event for identifying players for national team pools was just a starting point, however.

Part of the mission was to impress upon the senior clubs in North America the importance of playing a significant role in player development.





Many professional teams in the U.S. and Canada have used the league to begin their process of establishing academy programs that link the player development system from youth to pro.



ABOUT SUPER-20 LEAGUE

USL SUPER-20 LEAGUE (MEN/WOMEN U-20)

United Soccer Leagues announced the creation of the USL Super-20 League in early 2006. The league is designed as a graduating youth league for elite players from 17-20 as they advance beyond the traditional youth bracket to the senior professional and amateur development leagues.

The Super-20 League, for men and women, replaced the U19 age bracket of the Super Y-League, creating a wider range for players on the cusp of playing for PDL or W-League teams. The league was designed to cater to the top of the youth ranks in the U.S. and Canada for players aspiring to play professionally. It also serves as a reserve division for USL's Premier Development League and W-League teams, which have increasingly taken youth development of this age range under their auspices. PDL and W-League teams are able to add USL Super-20 teams to expand their development goals as well as their player pool for the senior team.

In addition to the USL Super-20 League completing the model for club building and vertical integration, it aids U.S. Soccer and the Canadian Soccer Association in identifying the top players for international competition ranging from U17 to U20.

Recent Super-20 League expansion has included the addition of the Mid-South Division, which kicked off in 2012.

ABOUT THE SYL FIRST 11 CLUB RANKINGS

The Super Y-League launched a new club ranking system in 2005 with the top clubs ranked from 1-11. This system publicizes the top clubs in both the boys and girls categories as well as overall. The rankings are based primarily upon the on-field results - winning percentage accounting for 70 percent of the score. Minimum standards and operations complete the other 30 percent.

The Super Y-League ODP system was started in 2003 to recognize a pool of players in each age group for identification to U.S. National Team Programs; and to utilize the clubs system in the United States to identify players.

HOW DO I PARTICIPATE?

Contact a local Super Y-League club in order to become a part of the Super Y-League ODP system. Players will be scouted during league play by the national scouting system of the Super Y-League, which is comprised of all of the coaches within the clubs of the league.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION HISTORY

In 2002, the Super Y-League, through US Soccer and the United States Olympic Committee, was granted ODP programs to identify players for U.S. National Team Programs. The first selection process began during the 2003 season to identify players for Regional Team selection events, where U.S. National Staff Coaches scouted players for National Team Programs. In addition to many players being identified for U.S. National Team Programs, top players are identified by leading college and university soccer programs throughout the United States.

THE SUPER Y-LEAGUE ODP SELECTION PROCESS

During the regular season players are evaluated during their games by the opposing team coaches for tactical, physical and psychological characteristics that will determine their ability to attend the ODP National Camp typically held in February and March. Through the scouting system, the combined nominations will be used, along with proportional allocation in conjunction with Director of Coaching recommendations, to determine invitations to the ODP camps. The overall number of games and teams will also be factored into this process.

WHAT ARE SYL ODP NATIONAL CAMPS?

The top players chosen by the scouting system in each age group per geographic division of the Super Y-League will attend the ODP National Camp. These camps are attended by U.S. National Staff Coaches to identify players for U.S. National Team programs, as well as many of the nation's top collegiate coaches. The camps are held at IMG Academy in Bradenton, Florida during February and March.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF THE SYL ODP SYSTEM?

- The selection of players within their natural environment on their club teams within league play, as opposed to an open-tryout system. Many players do not participate in the open-tryout ODP system operated by state associations, and other players do not perform well in the open tryout process.
- Exposure to the U.S. National Staff and Team Coaches
- Exposure to professional and collegiate scouts
- There is no cost to be scouted or to try out.
 The scouting system is built into league play and contains no additional ODP fees. Only those selected to attend ODP camps will incur camp fees.

I thought they did well considering it wasn't a situation they had been in."

The Crew came out with greater urgency to start the second half, with Walker and Bryce Rockwell combining well up front as the Fire began the second half on the front foot. Eventually, though, Arturo Garza and Luis Barajas allowed the Fire to regain control in the midfield. At the midway point of the second half, Chicago would regain the lead after being awarded a penalty just outside the penalty area to the right of the arc, and Cortez

sent his curling shot into the top-left corner of the net, appearing to catch Gal off balance.

"I had really good confidence in myself, when I saw there was a free kick on top of the box, I raised my hand for Coach Steve to allow me [to take it]," Cortez said. "I went up there and shot it with really great confidence, and gladly it went in."

"I looked down the bench and I actually said to my assistant coach Chris Brisson, 'this is his moment, this is one he's probably going to put away'," Morris said. "It couldn't have fallen for a better guy."

Cortez was selected as the Tournament's MVP after the game, and being able share the experience with his cousin Medina, who he grew up playing with in the Chicago area, and their teammates was a special moment.

"We've been playing together since we were little kids, and we have a really good chemistry," Cortez said of his relationship with Medina. "As an organization, we're really happy with where we've gone with it, and the opportunities we have with the Fire, it's really great. Being from Chicago, we're really happy with that."

Columbus was then forced to chase the game, and Woods had a well-struck effort saved by Chicago goalkeeper Sam Euler. As the Crew pushed forward, however, gaps started to open up for the Fire at the other end, and in the 84th minute Mark Prince was able to cap the victory as he finished off a good move that also included Medina and Barajas, shooting high into the right corner off the net to seal victory.


Changing their philosophy from previous seasons, the Fire are now using solely the club's academy players in both their Super-20 and PDL teams, and Morris said he believed their victory on Sunday was a validation that the club was making the right moves in its player development program.

RAPIDS TAKE WOMEN'S 520 TITLE

The Colorado Rapids advanced from Group A by scoring three goals per game, but managed to win the 2012 Super-20 League North American Finals championship with a 1-0 win against D.C. United Women at IMG Academy.

The Rocky Mountain Division club kept its second clean sheet of the tournament in defeating D.C. United, thanks in part to strong performances by tournament Most Valuable Player Karisa Price and Safe Hands Award-winner Hannah Clark, the top goalkeeper.

The early morning start did not seem to faze either side. The Rapids were on the front foot early on and D.C. United held well. In only the first minute, Price earned a corner. She then attempted a bicycle kick when the service came her way, but misfired and D.C. cleared.

United did not have many chances in the opening 20 minutes. Price drew a foul not far from the area in the 13th minute and was one of three players to be denied on a rebound by the D.C. United goalkeeper after she fumbled the attempted free kirk

Price was willing to shoot from just about anywhere, it seemed, and for good reason. Her four goals going into Sunday's game were tied for the tournament lead along with D.C. United's Stephanie Hamilton. Price's shot from distance in the 17th minute went just wide of the post, giving the 'keeper something to think about.

Price's next effort came in the 25th minute. She received a pass out wide on the right side of the field and cut inside to unleash a fierce shot that missed the top of the crossbar by less than a foot.

In the 26th minute, Price and Anna Evans combined in the DC box with a neat passing play and Evans found the time to put a shot on net. Despite the United goalkeeper getting a hand to it, the effort reached the back of the net and the Rapids had the desired lead.

It did not take long for the Mid Atlantic Division club to get their next opportunity. Jenna Shaddock sent a cross into the box after the restart that was bungled into the Colorado goalkeeper by her own defender. It was eventually cleared. Evans had a chance much like the one that led to

Evans had a chance much like the one that led to her goal to extend her team's lead, but her shot from the top of the box missed the net.

The Rapids could not sit on their lead against a team that advanced out of Group B with all nine points from three games. Price pounced on a loose, bouncing ball 35 yards from goal and struck a menacing volley that dipped and was earmarked for the back of the net before the United goalkeeper jumped to push it over the crossbar.

DC United had the last opportunity of the half from a corner, but Colorado dealt with it and took the 1-0 lead into the locker room.

Lindsey Lane, wearing the number 10 shirt for DC United, attempted to get her side back into the contest in the 53rd minute with a shot from outside the box that narrowly missed the net. In the 58th minute, United defender Mónica Mendes stood over a free kick and assessed her options. Instead of playing a ball into the box for one of her teammates, she took the opportunity to shoot. Unfortunately, her shot was not on goal, but it did graze the top of the net.

The Finals MVP was everywhere on Sunday, much like her performances in group play. Price ran down every loose ball in the attacking third and used her skill to keep possession when closed down by multiple opponents. In one instance, she flicked the ball over her head and ran around her defender at midfield. The play did not lead to a scoring opportunity, but it showed the little things that she could do on the field.

"I've been watching her all week," USL National Technical Director Peter Mellor said. "I expected her to fall over when the whistle blew at the end of the game, but here she is dancing around."

DC United failed to create any concrete openings in the final quarter of an hour, and the Rapids held on for the win and the championship.

"We've got a lot of character and spirit and never quit," Colorado Rapids Coach Daniel Clitnovici said of his team after the game. "We knew it wasn't going to be an easy game. They're a tough team with a big club and you're always going to expect quality.

"[Karisa Price is] a fantastic player. She's got a lot of heart and she's exactly the type of player that's going to be successful."

After the game, both teams were awarded their medals and the Rapids were given their championship trophy. Price and Clark were given their respective awards, as well, and D.C.'s Hamilton was awarded the Golden Boot Award as top scorer in the Finals. Her hat trick and one assist against TSF Academy on Saturday brought her total to four goals and two assists.

ABOUT MBS

Created by USL Technical Director Peter Mellor, Major Beach Soccer joined the USL ranks in 2010. Having adorned the beaches of Florida for the past 21 years, beach soccer events feature small-sided games (5v5) on a smaller pitch. Major Beach Soccer provides social and promotional activities to players and fans of all ages during the multi-day events.

2013 MB5 SCHEDULE

The 2013 Major Beach Soccer season features three tournaments throughout the state of Florida.

- Daytona Beach, June 14-16
- Clearwater Beach, July 12-14
- Ft. Myers Beach, July 27-28

Major Beach Soccer is in its 23rd year of bringing the top beach soccer tournament action to Florida's shores. Registration is open at www.majorbeachsoccer.com for this year's tournaments in Daytona Beach, Clearwater Beach and Fort Myers Beach, and the 2013 Major Beach Soccer National Championships will once again take place on Clearwater Beach in December.



The 2012 Major Beach Soccer season continued to set the standard for beach soccer in North America with an expanded version of the Major Beach Soccer National Championship. The 2012 championship weekend saw more

than 40 teams compete on Clearwater Beach, with seven teams taking home championships.

Major Beach Soccer events feature teams competing in 30-minute games with prizes for champions in and runners-up age groups. Flicks and acrobatic bicycle kicks are the norm in beach soccer, where the fields and goals are small but the action is nonstop. FIFA officially recognized beach soccer in 2005 by hosting the first FIFA Beach Soccer World Cup in Rio de Janeiro.





GENERAL INFORMATION



AFFILIATIONS

USL is directly affiliated with the United States Soccer Federation (USSF), United States Adult Soccer Association (USASA), the Canadian Soccer Association (CSA), the Antigua & Barbuda Football Association (ABFA) and the Bermudan Football Association (BFA).

ROSTERS

PDL and W-League rosters may consist of a maximum of 26 players, with 18 designated for each game. In the PDL, a maximum of eight (8) players may be over the age of 23. The PDL and W-League are permitted a maximum of eight (8) foreign players on rosters.

In USL PRO rosters also consist of 26 players with 18 designated for each game. In addition to the 26 players allowed on the master roster, a team may register as many as 5 academy players. Academy players do not count against the 26 players on the master roster and are allowed to participate in all competitions.

To be considered an academy player, all of the following must be in place: a) player is younger than 21 as of the official start date of the current season, b) player cannot compete (or have ever previously have competed) in any NCAA or NAIA university or college soccer program, and c) player has never been signed or registered as a professional soccer player as recognized by FIFA. The academy player must play for a club which conducts its activities within the team's franchise territory or play for a club which has a documented affiliation with the team. Additionally, teams with MLS affiliations may use the academy players of their MLS affiliate. Academy players do count against a team's maximum of seven foreign players.

ROSTER FREEZE

Each USL senior league has a Roster Freeze Date after which no team may register any new players. For 2013, those dates are:

W-League: July 10 PDL: July 17 USL PRO: July 30

TRANSFER WINDOWS

From the 2011 season and until further notice, FIFA will not register player transfers that take place outside of the following transfer windows:

- January 15 through April 15 (primary window)July 15 through August 14 (secondary
- July 15 through August 14 (secondary window)

AMATEUR PLAYER DEFINITION

An amateur player is defined by the following: A player who does not receive payment for playing soccer and who has signed an amateur registration form with U.S. Soccer or Canadian Soccer Association. Amateur players may be reimbursed for certain expenses as allowed by USSF/CSA/NCAA rules.

POINT SYSTEM

The standard FIFA (3-1-0) system awards three points for a regulation or overtime victory. In the case of a tie, each team will be awarded one point.

GAME CLOCK

All games are comprised of 90 minutes (two 45-minute halves). No overtime is utilized.

LAWS OF THE GAME

USL adheres to all the Laws of the Game as dictated by FIFA, soccer's international governing body.

SUBSTITUTIONS

Five (5) substitutions are allowed per league game with no re-entry permitted in USL PRO. Six (6) will be allowed in the PDL and W-League with no re-entry.

STANDINGS TIEBREAKERS

The breaking of ties in the final league standings, playoffs and finals is accomplished by applying the following criteria, listed in order of importance:

The following two guidelines will be followed during the implementation of USL tiebreakers for all ties involving three or more teams:

- 1) The tiebreaker will determine the winner first.
- The tiebreaker will continue to be followed in order to determine the ranking of the remaining teams without restarting from the beginning.
- 1) Head-to-head record based on total points in league games
- 2) Total wins in league games
- 3) Goal difference in league games
- 4) Goals scored in league games
- 5) Total points within smallest grouping. If number of games is unequal, then point percentage will be used.



- 6) Ranking based on points earned against top four group finishers. This tiebreaker will not be used if four or fewer teams comprise the group. If number of games is unequal, then point percentage applies.
- 7) Point percentage outside/smallest division or conference in League games
- 8) Total points in all regular season and Open Cup Qualifying games combined. If number of games is unequal, then point percentage applies
- 9) FIFA Fair Play Team with fewest disciplinary points in League games. (If number of games is unequal, points will be divided by games played to arrive at a common basis for comparison.)
- 10) Lottery conducted by USL at league office Point Percentage: number of total points earned / maximum possible points (3 per game)
- * Should more than two teams involved have played each other an UNEQUAL number of times, this tiebreaker will be skipped.
- *Group: term used to describe the primary unit in which a team competes (i.e. PDL – Southwest Division)
- *Point Percentage: number of total points earned / maximum possible points (3 per game)

SCHEDULES

USL PRO: Teams will play 26 games in the 2013 season, including a pair of interleague games against MLS Reserve League teams.

PDL: Each team plays 14 games during the regular season.

W-League: Each team plays 10-12 games during the regular season.

PLAYOFF5

Each league in USL has its own distinct playoff system that will determine the league champion.

USL PRO: The 2013 USL PRO Playoffs will include the top eight finishers in the table, with the quarterfinals (No. 1 vs. No. 8, No. 2 vs. No. 7, etc.) set for the weekend of August 23-25. The semifinals featuring the four remaining teams will be played the following weekend, with the 2013 USL PRO Championship set for the weekend of September 6-8. All playoff

rounds feature a single-game knockout format and teams will not be re-seeded following each round

PDL: The 2013 PDL postseason will see four berths from each conference. Due to the Eastern Conference having three divisions, a bye and play-in format will be used to determine the four conference representatives that will move on to the Conference Semifinals.

The 16 playoff teams will meet for Conference Semifinal tournaments and the four conference champions will advance to the PDL Championship weekend at a site to be determined.

W-League: The 2013 W-League season will see 10 teams advance to the postseason with one champion advancing from each conference to the 2013 W-League Championship presented by Nike. The three conference champions will meet July 26-28 in a 'final four' format championship, which will also include a yet-to-be-determined host team. The semifinals will be played on Friday, July 26 with the winners meeting for the 2013 W-League Championship on Sunday, July 28.

- Central Conference Playoffs: The top three seeds from the Central Conference will advance to the Central Conference Championship.
- Eastern Conference Playoffs: The top two seeds from each division advance to the Eastern Conference Championship.
- Western Conference Playoffs: The top two teams meet in a conference championship match.

SINGLE PLAYOFF MATCHES

During postseason play, single games tied after regulation will be followed by two 15-minute overtime periods played in their entirety. If still tied, FIFA kicks from the penalty mark are used to determine the winner

TEN SELECTED FOR USL HALL OF FAME THREE CLUBS ALSO HONORED


Ten men and women who have proven to be highly influential in North American soccer were chosen for induction into the USL Men's, Women's and MISL Hall of Fame wings in 2012. These individuals were recognized for helping to make USL and the MISL a success through the years because of their tremendous efforts and personal sacrifices made on behalf of the sport of soccer in North America. Additionally, three USL clubs were honored as 10+ Clubs after having completed 10 years in the PDL.

Honorees were chosen through a vote of current Hall of Fame members, USL teams and the USL Hall of Fame Committee.

2012 USL MEN'S HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

Builder - Bill Rudisill, Wilmington Hammerheads

Rudisill oversaw some of the greatest successes in the Hammerheads' history as the club's owner, with Wilmington winning the USL Second Division championship in 2003, a year that also saw it reach the quarterfinals of the U.S. Open Cup. After the Hammerheads went on hiatus in 2010, he then returned to lead the club into USL PRO in 2011, which saw the Hammerheads average more than 4,000 fans a game, continuing his outstanding commitment to soccer in the Wilmington area. The success continued in 2012 as the Hammerheads reached the USL PRO Championship, falling against the Charleston Battery.



Calloway, the all-time wins leader for the Des Moines Menace, found success as a manager in USL at both the professional and PDL levels. The PDL Coach of the Year in 2002 when he led the Menace to an undefeated regular season, Calloway won an APSL title with San Francisco Bay in 1991 and also took the USL First Division's Syracuse Salty Dogs and Rochester Rhinos to the verge of championships in his time in the professional ranks. He spent 1996-97 in MLS as coach of the San Jose Clash.

Player – Dustin Swinehart, Charlotte Eagles, Hampton Roads Mariners, Indiana Blast

One of the most enduring players in USL's professional divisions, Swinehart joined the Charlotte Eagles in 1998 after a season each with the Hampton Roads Mariners (1996) and the Indiana Blast (1997), and remained in Charlotte for 12 seasons, calling it quits in 2009. With the exception of two brief loans to the Richmond Kickers, Swinehart spent his entire professional career with the Eagles, tallying 125 career goals in 228 appearances. The Eagles reached the playoffs in all but one of Swinehart's seasons, capturing USL Second Division titles in 2000 and 2005 and reaching the final on four other occasions. Swinehart was named the MVP of the 2000 championship game, and in 2001, after the Eagles moved up to the USL First Division, he was named to the All-League First Team. He was named to the USL-2 All-League First Team in 2005, 2006 and 2008, and in 2008 he was also named the USL-2 MVP.







2012 USL WOMEN'S HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

Builder - John Pugh, Ottawa Fury

In July 2002, Pugh acquired the Ottawa Fury Soccer Club and transformed a single W-League franchise into a club that boasts W-League, PDL, Super Y-League and academy teams along with several grassroots programs. Since Pugh took over the Fury, the W-League team has captured nine consecutive division titles, five conference championships and has made seven Final Four appearances with four trips to the Championship Game. The club captured its first championship at home in 2012. Internationally, more than 50 Fury players have been capped by their respective countries. In 2010, the Fury U17 Girls captured the Super Y-League North American Championship, highlighting the success of the Club's Youth Academy which has seen more than 85 players earn NCAA scholarships. Pugh is currently a member of the USL W-League Executive Committee, the OSA Technical Committee and was a member of the Site Organizing Committee for the Ottawa portion of the 2007 FIFA U20 World Cup.



Coach - Nino DePasquali, New York Magic

The man behind the bench for all 16 of the Magic's W-League seasons, DePasquali has led the club to the conference quarterfinals in 2002 and 2003 and the final four in 1998, and 1999. The Magic were division champions in 1998. A native of Roma, Italy, his professional career spanned more than 15 years having played for Roma and and Brescia in Italy, Cologne in Germany, San Gallo in Switzerland and Real Betis in Spain. In 2005, he was inducted into the Hall of Fame for the Eastern New York State Amateur Soccer Association.



Coach – Charlie Naimo, Pali Blues, Central Jersey, Jersey Sky Blue, New Brunswick, NJ Wildcats

Head coach of the Pali Blues, Naimo directed his squad to yet another title game in 2012, falling against Ottawa in the final. Naimo spearheaded the Blues to a cumulative 21-0-3 record in 2008 and 2009, capturing a pair of titles in the club's first two years without experiencing defeat. Naimo spent the 2007 season coaching Jersey Sky Blue of the W-League with the team finishing 12-2 in the regular season before falling to the Ottawa Fury in the conference semifinal. Naimo first put on the head coaching hat in 1998 with the New Jersey Splash, receiving W-League Coach of the Year accolades in 1999. After a stop with the New Brunswick Power, he took over a struggling New Jersey Wildcats club and orchestrated an entire reconstruction of the organization. In his three seasons with the team, Naimo compiled a 41-1 regular season record, leading the club to regular season titles in 2004 and 2006 while winning the W-League championship in 2005. In 2005 the Wildcats were named the USL Franchise of the Year, and Naimo won the W-League Coach of the Year award in 2006.



2012 MISL HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

Builder - Earl Foreman

The driving force behind the creation of the MISL in 1977, Foreman served as the league's commissioner from 1978-85 and again from 1989-92. Along with Ed Tepper, Foreman introduced a league that featured six teams that played a 24-game schedule from December, 1978 to March of the following year. Under Foreman's leadership the MISL blossomed into a 14-team league averaging 9,000 a game with nationally televised games on ESPN and CBS.



Coach - Ron Newman, San Diego Sockers

A member of the National Soccer Hall of Fame, Newman led the Sockers to eight MISL titles in nine years, posting a career regular season record of 286-158. His teams only lost one playoff series in nine years and carried an 80-37 playoff record. Newman won the 1987-88 MISL Coach of the Year award, and is credited with revolutionizing how the game was played.



Marinaro began his MISL career as a sparingly used defender for the Cleveland Force in 1983, and after brief stops with the Minnesota Strikers and Los Angeles Lazers, he became one of the MISL's great scoring stars upon his return to Cleveland in 1989. With the Crunch (renamed the Force in 2002), Marinaro tallied an amazing 1,099 goals in 533 games from 1989-2004. He led the MISL in scoring during the 1987-88 and 1991-92 seasons.

Player - Slavisa "Steve" Zungul, New York Arrows, San Diego Sockers, Golden Bay Earthquakes, Tacoma Stars

The owner of nearly every MISL record thanks to a memorable 11-year career, Zungul, known as "The Lord of All Indoors," scored 652 goals and added 471 assists for a total of 1,123 points in 423 games. He added another 189 points in 77 playoff games while winning eight championships with the New York Arrows and San Diego Sockers. Named MISL MVP six times, Zungul also captured the championship series MVP nod four times. Amongst his most impressive feats are his 108-goal season in 1980-81, a 76-game point scoring streak from 1978-81, and scoring three goals in 37 seconds in a game in 1982.







2012 USL 10+ CLUBS

BYU Cougars

The BYU Cougars were a unique addition to the PDL in 2003, becoming the first team owned and operated by a university to join the league. BYU entered the PDL with a strong pedigree, having already dominated the Collegiate Club Soccer Championships for a decade, winning national championships in 1993, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, and 2001. The team enjoyed its best PDL season in 2007, posting a 13-1-2 record to claim the Northwest Division title before falling to Fresno in the Western Conference Final.

Fresno Fuego

The Fuego have been one of the PDL's great success stories since joining the league in 2003, routinely packing thousands of fans into Chukchansi Park to always be at the top of the league's attendance rankings. On the field, the Fuego have never endured a losing season, compiling an impressive 96-45-23 mark, three division titles and a trip to the conference final in 2011.

West Virginia Chaos

Founded in 2003, the West Virginia Chaos have provided West Virginia soccer talent with an opportunity for advancement for the past 10 seasons. Among the chaos alums who have moved on to play professionally is West Virginia native Chase Harrison of the Philadelphia Union. - 1997 Premier League renamed Premier Development Soccer League (PDSL)
- 1997-98 Last season of I-League
- 1998 W-League splits into two levels, W-1 and W-2

- 1999 PDSL renamed Premier Development League (PDL)
- 1999 Super Y-League created
- 2002 W-League re-unified into one league
- 2003 D3 Pro League renamed USL Pro Select League (USL-PSL)

- 2011 USL purchases the Major Indoor Soccer League, begins operating league with 2011-12 season


