Michael Huyghue led the UFL through its Premiere Season in 2009 and his vision and leadership sees the league attracting new investment and securing a foothold in new permanent homes and expansion cities for its franchises for future seasons.

With more than two decades of experience in the professional football and sports industries, Huyghue brings expertise in the areas of legal, operations, front office management and player representation.

Huyghue began his career as a legal intern for the NFL's Players Association and was then an attorney with the NFL's Management Council in 1987, handling arbitration hearings. At the age of 29, he became the youngest general manger in professional football when he joined the NFL's World League in 1989.

Huyghue joined the Detroit Lions as Vice President and General Counsel, before becoming Senior Vice President of Football Operations for the Jacksonville

Jaguars in the team's inaugural NFL season. During Huyghue's tenure with the Jaguars, the team became the winningest franchise in expansion history, achieving two AFC Central Division Championships and an unprecedented two AFC Championship appearances.

Huyghue has served on many of the NFL Commissioner's prominent committees, including the NFL Management Council, the Executive Working Group Committee, the NFL College Advisory Committee, the NFL Europe League, and as a Trustee of the NFL Players Insurance Trust. Prior to joining the UFL, Huyghue was CEO and founder of Axcess Sports & Entertainment, where he represented a number of NFL, NBA and PGA TOUR players. The Sports Business Journal has twice named Huyghue to the "Forty Under 40" Top Sports Business Executives.

Huyghue earned his undergraduate degree from Cornell University, where he starred as a football and baseball player, and earned his law degree from the University of Michigan. He currently resides in Jacksonville, FL with his wife and three children.



Bill Peterson

Chief Operating Officer

Peterson oversees all facets of UFL business with overall responsibility for marketing, ticket sales, sponsorship, operations and public relations and will govern the organization in the absence of Commissioner Huyghue.

He was formerly Executive Vice President for Centerplate, a hospitality company with more than \$800,000,000 in

annual revenues. He was also a former senior vice president with Anschutz Entertainment Group in Los Angeles, where he developed and managed many of its sports properties in soccer, tennis, cycling and track and field, including the David Beckham Academy and The Amgen Tour of California. He was also Managing Director of the Home Depot Center in Los Angeles.

Peterson spent more than 10 years with NFL Europe, becoming the league's President in 1999, having served as Managing Director for the UK, Holland and Spain and spent three seasons as general manager of the of the Amsterdam Admirals. Peterson was one of the original employees of the World League, working in Frankfurt and London between 1991 and 1995.

He also serves as President of the USA Cycling Board of Directors, the national governing body for cycling in the United States.

A former college football player and coach, Peterson graduated from Lock Haven University in Pennsylvania, where he was a two-year all-conference selection and two-time MVP. He finished his playing career as a free agent linebacker for the Los Angeles Raiders, being released during training camp in 1987. Born in Smithfield, North Carolina, Peterson and his wife Lisa live in Florida and have two daughters.

In his second season with the league, Matthew Couloute will advance to the position of Vice President and General Counsel. Couloute supplies a vast knowledge of legal affairs in sports and entertainment to the UFL.

Couloute was a NCAA Division III basketball player at Clark

University in Worchester, Mass. He has held full time positions as a prosecutor for the state of Connecticut and at both the National Football League and the National Football League Players Association. A law school graduate, he is admitted to practice in New York and Connecticut and is now Vice President of Football Administration & Legal Affairs for the UFL.

Couloute was hired as the youngest and first minority Assistant States Attorney in Norwalk, Connecticut. He was promoted to Bridgeport Connecticut's High Court as the State's Attorney.

While serving as legal counsel for the NFL, Couloute designed and ran a proactive program focusing on educating players and coaches on league policies and off-field issues. He presented league policies and educational information at both the NFL Rookie Symposium and the National Football League Mothers Association. Couloute then moved to the other side of the gridiron where handled player/agent grievances and player/team grievances for the NFL Players Association. He counseled prospective professional athletes regarding amateurism and turning professional, worked with the NCAA assisting in investigating agent misconduct and handled NFL player fine appeals. Couloute also revamped the NFLPA Agent Admission Policy, creating background check and requirement, while assisting in creation of a more difficult agent exam.

In addition to his work in football law, Couloute negotiated professional boxing contracts and racecar driver agreements, modeling contracts and music agreements and most recently, served as in-house counsel for an e-commerce company.



Tomas Llibre

Vice President of Information Technology

A 17-year Information Technology professional, Tomás Llibre's vast computer knowledge and experience ranges from instructor and PC repairs to enterprise wide implementation of sophisticated information systems.

Since 1999, Llibre played an integral part of the National Football League's Application Development group where he grew into a Senior Project Manager and helped implement solutions for the Football Operations, Officiating, Security and Management Council departments. In addition, Llibre created technological solutions for an officiating website, college medical, substance abuse program, Pro Bowl balloting, security case management and tracking of players' fines. One of the highlights of Llibre's NFL career is the design and implementation of the hardware architecture and enterprise search strategy behind the first Enterprise Portal rollout at the league office using Microsoft technologies. Prior to joining the NFL, Llibre worked at the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) where he quickly advanced from a Programmer Analyst to a Senior Network Administrator. Ed Reynolds enters his second season with the UFL in a new role as President of the UFL expansion Virginia team.

The Virginia native previously served as Vice President, Administration & Special Assistant to the Commissioner and oversaw UFL security matters and the general direction of all

staff as it pertains to the administration of security for the Commissioner and the UFL.

Prior to joining the UFL, Reynolds worked for twelve seasons with the National Football League in football operations and security. In Football Operations he developed, implemented and administered the On-field / Pro-Line policies for all 32 teams. He was also responsible for all associated violation fines for players, coaches and teams. Reynolds developed and implemented the College Relations programs and the NFL high school coaches of the week programs in all 32 markets.

In Security, he was responsible for the 32 Commissioner-mandated NFL security presentations given to all players and coaches and the video shown at all presentations. He oversaw the security for the draftees selected to attend the NFL Draft each year. Reynolds assisted in the development of NFL best practices for stadium security and worked closely with NFL security representatives to ensure NFL players use them for the services provided to them by NFL Security at no cost to the players. He also produced the NFL security guide booklet for

NFL players and coaches to use as a resource to better protect themselves from issues like identity theft and fraud.

Reynolds began his career with the NFL as a free agent with the New England Patriots in 1983. After being the last player released after training camp, he was resigned after four games and continued his career for the next eleven years. Following the 1989 season, he was named team MVP. He also led the team in tackles for three seasons. In 1992, he signed with the New York Giants for two years.

Reynolds was born in Stuttgart, Germany. He is a graduate of the University of Virginia. He has been married to Pamela Dudley for 22 years and they have four outstanding sons: Ed, Joseph, Ethan and Jason.



Larry Upson

Vice President of Officiating Operations

Upson joined the UFL in 2007 and serves as the Vice President of Officiating Operations.

Upson began officiating football with the Eastern Board of Officials of Washington, DC in 1981, and worked primarily as a Line Judge. Upson was selected to the staff of the Mid-Eastern

Athletic Conference (MEAC) in 1984 and was selected to work in six NCAA Division I-AA playoff games.

Upson joined the staff of the World League of American Football as a Back Judge in 1991. In his first year, he was selected to work in the inaugural World Bowl championship game played at Wembley Stadium in London, England. In addition, in 1991 Upson joined the staff of the National Football League (NFL) as a Line Judge and worked the 1992 and 1993 season as a Field Judge. In 1994, Upson worked his first NFL Playoff game (Chicago at Minnesota). In 1996, worked the AFC Championship game (Jacksonville at New England).

In June 1997, Upson was promoted to the position of Supervisor of Officials for the NFL. In March of 2001, Upson was promoted to Director of Officiating Operations. His responsibilities included overseeing important officiating aspects such as the evaluation of game tapes, assisting in the development of weekly training tapes and assisting in the selection process for hiring NFL officials. Vice President of Football Administration

Brendan Rowe enters his second season with the UFL in a new role as Executive Director of Football Administration.

Following the success of the Premiere season, Rowe oversees all the logistical operations for the League including training camp, team travel, rosters and game operations. He will

supervise UFL's Training Camp Facilities including all staff communications and scheduling. In addition, Rowe will direct the league office in the overall management of the Football Operations Department.

Rowe joined the league in 2009, after spending 10 years with the Cleveland Browns in various roles. He began in 1999 as a Personnel Assistant, before joining the Operations Department in 2000 as Manager of Operations. In 2005, Rowe was promoted to Director of Team Operations. Twitter, blogs for the UFL Web site, drafts original content and works with the UFL digital team to provide additional content and interactive features on UFL-

Football.com. In his short time with the league, followers/fans have grown from 6,000 to more than 40,000 cumulatively.

Among Hahn's other league-wide tasks are working with league communications director Michael Preston on content production for UFL-Football.com, working with the vice president of internet technologies on the Web site, helping manage Flip Cam program, helping coordinate launch of team fan clubs and continuing to explore future uses of digital media for both the league as a whole and its teams.

Hahn also negotiated deals with digital partners, including Boxee.tv, and helped coordinate the online aspect of the "name the team" campaigns for the Hartford Colonials, Omaha Nighthawks and Sacramento Mountain Lions.

Prior to his time in the UFL, Hahn started UFLAccess.com, the top fan site for the league, in 2007. He also worked for the Sierra Club, in fundraising for the John Edwards for President campaign and the Linda Ketner for Congress campaign and mentored elementary school children for a reading program.

Hahn graduated from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and resides in North Carolina with his wife, Jamie.



Peter Eiges

Director of Ticket Operations

Peter Eiges is now in his 30th year of Professional Football. He started with the Oakland Raiders in 1980 as the Executive Assistant to Head Coach Tom Flores and after being awarded a Super Bowl ring in 1980-81, moved to the ticketing department and eventually became the youngest Ticket Manager in the NFL at age 22. In 1983, he was awarded the second of his two Super Bowl rings as the Raiders

defeated the Washington Redskins in Super Bowl XVIII. Peter was a member of NFL Ticket Operations Committee, NFL Playoff Preparation Committee and NFL Cost Analysis Committee. Many of the recommendations suggested by each of these committees have resulted in substantial league wide operational improvement as well as substantial cost savings and improved efficiency.

Peter started with the United Football League in March of 2010 as the Director of Ticket Operations. He oversees UFL ticket operations, structure and philosophy. Peter is also extensively involved in collateral production and creative design and content.

Peter grew up in North Woodmere, New York. He attended American University in Washington, D.C. He and his wife Vickie have two children, Brandon (17) and Melanie (15). They reside in San Ramon, California.




The Beginning of the **UNITED**

UNITED FOOTBALL LEAGUE

In the mid-1990s when the Los Angeles Rams moved to St. Louis and the Houston Oilers relocated to Nashville, Bill Hambrecht was mystified. It seemed illogical that National Football League teams would leave two of the largest and best potential growth markets in the country. From a marketing angle, he knew there was room for more football teams around the United States. In conversations during this same period with coaching legend Bill Walsh, Hambrecht realized that there were many good football players who were on the verge of making NFL rosters, but often missed out due to the numbers game.

Fast forward a little more than 10 years, and Hambrecht's vision of expanding the football landscape beyond NFL markets and providing a platform for those promising players now has become a reality. The United Football League played its "Premiere" season during the fall of 2009 and is preparing for a second season set to kickoff in September of 2010.





Michael Huyghue

Although the UFL first piqued the public's interest in an article in The New York Times Magazine on June 3, 2007, Hambrecht by then already was several years into planning his disruptive business model for a professional football league that would complement the NFL. Many, if not all, of the core tenets on which the league was conceived still remain today. The basic principles of the Hambrecht model were to provide

quality football at affordable prices in underserved markets. In staying true to that goal, the UFL ensured the average ticket price for a UFL game is \$20.

Early on, Hambrecht partnered with smart business people to develop the plan and then sought top-notch football experts to execute. Hambrecht had established a relationship with former Google executive Tim Armstrong, now CEO of AOL, and together they invested the seed money to launch the league. Sports team owner and investor Mark Cuban showed early support of the league, and he subsequently came on board offering his television network, HDNet, to broadcast some of the games. Hambrecht conducted his due diligence on the past failures of other professional leagues and took calculated measures not to repeat those enterprises' past mistakes. First and foremost, Hambrecht sought personnel who have worked in the trenches, or in this case the sidelines/front offices of the NFL, to oversee the football operations. In September of 2008, former Senior Vice President of Football Operations of the Jacksonville Jaguars Michael Huyghue was named the first Commissioner of the UFL.

Hambrecht commented on the Commissioner's hiring: "Michael possesses the perfect combination of firsthand

experience in the football industry with the strategic vision necessary to shape and launch the UFL."

Commissioner Huyghue was familiar with start-up operations, having been a primary architect behind the Jaguars' roster and helping the team to become the winnngest franchise in expansion history. During Huyghue's tenure with the team, the Jaguars won two AFC Central Division championships and made an unprecedented two AFC Championship Game appearances.

The initial plan was to launch the UFL in the fall of 2008. While many debate the merits of playing at the same time as the NFL and college football, research indicated that the fall is when fans are most interested in watching football and attending games.

The onset of the largest economic downturn since the Great Depression reduced the number of initial investors and delayed the league's debut. It also reinforced the overall premise of the league, which is to provide quality sports entertainment at affordable prices during a time when fans are seeking less expensive leisure time activities. The "Premiere" season validated the UFL belief that even in a tough economic environment, fans will invest in entertainment and few options are greeted with more passion than quality football.

One of the primary goals of the UFL was to carve out a presence in markets void of professional football. Commissioner Huyghue visited numerous cities, some of which previously had housed alternate league teams. After numerous meetings with investors, stadium representatives and government officials, the inaugural cities were selected.

LEAGUE HISTORY

The 2009 "Premiere" season

The 2009 United Football League "Premiere

Season" was a success for the mere fact that it was played, given that it had been more than three decades since a professional football league played its games during the traditional fall football season.

But the inaugural UFL campaign gave fans exactly what the league said it would - high-quality professional football during a traditional fall season while embracing innovation and fan interaction.

In 2009, the UFL fielded four teams - the California Redwoods, Florida Tuskers, Las Vegas Locomotives and New York Sentinels. Florida quickly established itself as a dominant team, and ran the table during the regular season. Las Vegas lost twice to the Tuskers in a 16-day period, but finished the regular season on a three-game winning streak to reach the championship game.

As it turned out, the initial UFL Championship Game was the most competitive game of the "Premiere Season." It also was the first game where the league's unique overtime rules - where both teams are guaranteed at least one possession - were implemented. When the dust settled at Sam Boyd Stadium, nearly 15,000 fans saw Locos kicker Graham Gano, who had also scored the first points in league history, end the inaugural UFL season with a 33-yard field goal 1:43 into overtime.

After the game, Las Vegas head coach Jim Fassel was carried off the field after winning his first professional championship, and he and his Locos were awarded the William Hambrecht Trophy as the first-ever UFL champions.

The Locos and Tuskers saved the best for last, as 27 of the game's 37 points were scored in the fourth guarter and overtime, and the lead changed hands three times in a matter of 7 minutes.

The championship game illustrated how the guality of play and competitiveness of the UFL games improved as the season went along. Of the final eight games in the regular season and the championship game, five were decided by a touchdown or less.

The "Premiere Season" featured many names familiar to professional football fans. From head coaches like Fassel, Florida's Jim Haslett and California's Dennis Green to players such as Las Vegas quarterback J.P. Losman, Locos linebacker Teddy Lehman and Florida running backs Tatum Bell and Michael Pittman, the UFL proved it could stock its teams with the best available talent. Meanwhile, the league also was adept

at making its own stars in California running back Cory Ross and New York wide receiver Craphonso Thorpe.

After the championship game, Florida guarterback Brooks Bollinger was named the UFL's Motorola Most Valuable Player, and Haslett earned the league's Men's Wearhouse Coach of the Year award. In leading the Tuskers' highpowered offense, Bollinger was the UFL's leading passer with a 112.8 passer rating, 1,518 yards and 14 touchdowns. Haslett guided Florida to a perfect 6-0 regular season, as the Tuskers won those games by an average of 15.2 points per contest.



LEAGUE HISTORY



The United Football League in 2010

In February and early March of 2010, the UFL featured a series of major announcements that would help shape the future of the league.

The first announcement came in Orlando, Florida, as Florida Tuskers offensive coordinator Jay Gruden was elevated to the position of head coach after the Washington Redskins of the NFL hired Jim Haslett. One week later, Hartford, Connecticut, became the new home of the New York Sentinels, and former NFL head coach and coordinator Chris Palmer was announced as the team's head coach and general manager. The Hartford franchise launched a "Name the Team" contest that resulted in the birth of the Hartford Colonials after thousands of fans suggested potential names.

In early March, the city of Sacramento was announced as the permanent home of the California franchise of the UFL that had played games in San Jose and San Francisco during the "Premiere"

season. The Sacramento team also launched a "Name the Team" contest to find a name that best represented Sacramento and the surrounding region. Ultimately, Mountain Lions was selected by fans.

Expansion came by the way of the Omaha Nighthawks, who introduced head coach Jeff Jagodzinski, formerly of Boston College in April 2010, and the new team enjoyed an instant rapport with the passionate football fans of Nebraska. Nighthawks season tickets were snapped up in the thousands as a wave of excitement engulfed the news that Omaha's professional football team would play at the historic Rosenblatt Stadium as the league's fifth team in 2010.

In July, the UFL announced its first expansion team for the 2011 season, to be placed in the Norfolk-Tidewater-Hampton Roads region of Virginia.

Color Analyst

A phenomenal college football player who rose to prominence during his playing days at Boston College, Doug Flutie is probably best remembered for his 1984 "Hail Mary" touchdown pass that defeated Miami as time expired.

A Heisman Trophy and Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award winner, Flutie has had experience playing at all levels of professional football including the USFL, NFL and CFL. Flutie led the CFL Toronto Argonauts to back-to-back Grey Cup victories and was named CFL Most Outstanding Player a record six times and MVP honors in all of his three Grey Cup victories.

As a member of the NFL's Buffalo Bills, he earned Pro Bowl and NFL Comeback Player of the Year honors. In 2007, Flutie was named to the College Football Hall of Fame and to Canada's Sports Hall of Fame as the first American born player to be inducted. In combining his CFL, NFL and USFL statistics, Flutie ranks sixth among the all-time pro football passing leaders in attempts, completions and touchdowns. He also played with the San Diego Chargers and New England Patriots in the NFL.



Ryan Nece Sideline Reporter

Nece played in the NFL for seven years, six with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers including their Super Bowl Championship team and one with the Detroit Lions. Ryan's interest in a broadcasting career led him to the NFL Films Broadcaster Boot Camp. It is from this experience that he comes highly recommended.

For the past seven years, Nece's primary focus has been on football, which has provided him with a platform to impact others and has opened doors to new and exciting opportunities. In addition to his work on the football field and in the community, Nece has spent the last several years honing his business acumen. As co-founder of DERY Realty, his primary focus has been buying, renovating, and selling single-family homes.

Son of NFL Hall of Fame safety Ronnie Lott, Nece splits his time between his homes in Tampa and Los Angeles.

Jay Gruden

Head Coach

One of the top young coaches in all of professional football, Jay Gruden is in his first season as head coach of the Florida Tuskers of the United Football League.

Gruden began his UFL tenure in 2009 when then-head coach Jim Haslett named him offensive coordinator. Under Gruden's direction, the Tuskers offense averaged a league-best 30.5 points per game and finished the

season with a perfect 6-0 record.

When Haslett resigned to join the staff of the Washington Redskins, the UFL named Gruden head coach on Feb. 9, 2010.

Gruden brings a wealth of professional football experience to his post. From 2002-2008, he served as an offensive assistant with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. During his tenure, the Bucs won three divisional titles and collected a Super Bowl Championship.

A long-time head coach in the Arena Football League, Gruden served two separate stints (2004-08 and 1998-2001) as head coach and general manager of the Orlando Predators. During his nine-season reign, Gruden led the Predators to four ArenaBowl appearances and a pair of championships. Under Gruden, Orlando never failed to make the playoffs and posted an overall record of 93-61 (.604 winning percentage).

Gruden continues to rank in the top 10 in AFL history in wins, post-season wins and winning percentage.

Prior to being named head coach of the Predators, Gruden served one season as offensive coordinator of the Nashville Kats, where he was credited with developing Andy Kelly into one of the AFL's top quarterbacks. With the help of Gruden, the expansion Kats won 10 games and earned a playoff spot.

An accomplished AFL player, Gruden quarterbacked the Tampa Bay Storm from 1991-96, winning four championships in six years. Gruden was a first-team All-Arena selection twice and was the league's MVP in 1992. After coaching the Predators for four seasons, he abruptly resigned to return to the playing field as quarterback of the Predators. In two seasons, Gruden threw for 5,900 yards and 117 touchdowns.

In 2003, Gruden was compiling his finest season as a pro. Completing 62% of his passes, he threw for 49 touchdowns and just two interceptions. After being injured late in the season, it was later learned that Gruden had played his final regular season games and two playoff games on a broken leg and ankle.

For his AFL career, Gruden passed for more than 21,000 yards and 398 touchdowns in the regular season and added more than 4,700 yards and 77 touchdowns in the post-season. As a playoff quarterback, Gruden won 15 of 19 starts. For league's 20th anniversary, the AFL named Gruden number four on its list of the 20 Greatest Players in AFL history.

In his professional football career covering 24 seasons as either a player, assistant coach or head coach, Gruden's teams have made the playoffs 20 times and have won seven championships.

A three-year starter at Louisville (1985-88), Gruden passed for more than 7,000 yards and 44 touchdowns under head coach Howard Schnellenberger. A two-time team MVP, Gruden still ranks in the top five in most passing categories in Cardinal history. After graduating with BS degree, Gruden spent one season as a graduate assistant on Schnellenberger's staff – helping Louisville to an appearance in the Fiesta Bowl.

Gruden hails from a football family. His father Jim is a long-time college and NFL assistant coach and scout, while his brother Jon is a former NFL head coach with the Raiders and Buccaneers. Gruden, 43, and his wife Sherry are the parents of three sons, JJ, Joey and Jack.



Chuck Bresnahan Defensive Coordinator/

Linebackers Coach

Chuck Bresnahan, who coached the Florida Tuskers linebackers last season, was elevated to the position of Defensive Coordinator by first-year head coach Jay Gruden.

Under Bresnahan, the Tuskers had one of the UFL's top linebacker corps last season. The defense allowed a league-low 15.3 points per game in helping

Florida to a perfect 6-0 regular season record.

Bresnahan joined the Tuskers coaching staff after spending four seasons on the Cincinnati Bengals coaching staff, including the final three as defensive coordinator. In his first two seasons as coordinator, the Bengals finished second in the NFL in takeaways and also captured their first division title in 17 years.

His NFL experience dates back to 1994, where he spent two seasons with Cleveland as linebackers/quality control coach and two seasons with Indianapolis as linebackers coach. Bresnahan joined the Oakland Raiders in 1998 as defensive backs coach before being promoted to defensive coordinator in 2000. In his three seasons as defensive coordinator, the Raiders won three consecutive AFC West titles. His defense helped carry Oakland to an AFC Championship and a berth in Super Bowl XXXVI.

A graduate of the United States Naval Academy, Bresnahan played linebacker for Navy from 1979-82 and served as a commissioned officer from 1984-86. Prior to his 1983 assignment to military duty, he launched his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Navy. Following completion of his service, he coached at Navy, Georgia Tech and Maine. With the Yellow Jackets, he coached inside linebackers and was part of the staff that led Georgia Tech to the 1990 National Championship.



Kurt Beatherd Running Backs Coach

The son of legendary NFL General Manager Bobby Beathard (Washington, San Diego), Kurt Beatherd joins the Florida Tuskers as running backs coach after spending three years on Ron Zook's staff at the University of Illinois.

At Illinois, Beatherd coached outside receivers (2007-08) and quarterbacks (2009). Beathard's previous coaching experience includes four seasons as offensive coordinator at Eastern Kentucky (2003-06) and six years as

quarterback coach and offensive coordinator at Western Carolina (1996-2001). Additional college coaching stops included stints with Bucknell, Pacific, Towson State, Bloomsburg, James Madison, and Louisville.

A former college quarterback, Beatherd started his collegiate playing career at Cal Poly- San Luis Obispo before transferring to Saddleback Junior College for his sophomore season. He then moved on to Towson State (now Towson) for the final three seasons of his career, setting several school records along the way.

During his two-year stint at Towson, Beathard passed for 4,768 yards and 38 touchdowns. In a game against Lafayette, Beathard was 40-of-51 passing for 466 yards and four scores. His effort in the game still ranks among the top passing performances in NCAA Division II history. His leadership under center also helped lead the Tigers to the 1984 Division II playoffs.



Ike Hilliard

Wide Receivers Coach

After serving as a volunteer with the Tuskers last season, former University of Florida standout lke Hillard was elevated to the position of receivers coach for 2010.

A first round selection in the 1997 NFL Draft (7th pick overall), Hilliard played 12 seasons in the National Football League for the New York Giants (1997-2004) and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2005-08). In 161 career games (106

starts), Hilliard caught 546 passes for 6,387 yards and 35 touchdowns.

With the University of Florida, Hilliard played three seasons (1994-96), catching 126 passes for 2,214 yards and 26 touchdowns. In his junior year, Hilliard earned first-team All-SEC and All-America honors. He capped the season with seven catches for 150 yards and three touchdowns in leading Florida to a 52-20 Sugar Bowl win over Florida State as the Gators captured their first national championship. He gave up his senior year to enter the NFL draft.

Hilliard is a native of Patterson, La. and is the nephew of former New Orleans Saints running back Dalton Hilliard.



Bill Laveroni

Offensive Line Coach

Bill Laveroni begins his second season on the Tuskers staff as the team's offensive line coach. A long-time football coach, Laveroni has more than 40 years of coaching experience including stops in the high school, college and professional ranks.

In addition to working with the Tuskers, Laveroni spent six years in the National Football League with the Seattle Seahawks, serving as assistant

offensive line coach (2002-03) and offensive line coach (2004-07). Laveroni also spent one season (1995) in the Arena Football League as a line coach with the San Jose SaberCats.

His college career includes two separate stints as California, along with stops at San Jose State, Rutgers, and Utah State. In five season at Rutgers, Laveroni coached the offensive line and also held the title of running game coordinator.

As a player, Laveroni was a three-year starter at center for California (1967-69).



Robert McFarland Tight Ends Coach

After coaching more than 20 years in the collegiate ranks, Robert McFarland has joined the Florida Tuskers as tight ends coach. McFarland most recently served as offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at Iowa State.

McFarland's previous experience includes two seasons as Head Coach at Stephen F. Austin (2005-06), a year as offensive line coach at East Carolina (2004) and four seasons as offensive coordinator and offensive line coach

at the UCF (2000-03). Central Florida finished ninth in the nation among I-A teams in passing offense in 2001 and was 12th in the nation in passing offense in 2000. During his stay in Orlando, McFarland coached six student-athletes who went on to the NFL.

Prior to that, McFarland spent nine years as an assistant at Stephen F. Austin, where his teams qualified for the NCAA playoffs twice, captured a conference title and established numerous offensive records. Other coaching assignments for McFarland included stops at East Carolina, Kent State, Notre Dame and Clemson.



Jerry Sisemore

Offensive Line Assistant

Assisting Bill Laveroni this season with the offensive line will be former NFL player Jerry Sisemore. An All-American at the University of Texas, Sisemore was a first round NFL draft pick (number three overall) of the Philadelphia Eagles in 1973.

Sisemore would go on to play 12 seasons in the NFL, earning Pro Bowl honors in 1979 and 1981. He helped the Eagles to an appearance in Super Bowl XV. Overall, he played in 156 games, started 155 and is still considered one of the greatest offensive linemen in franchise history.

Sisemore was a regular on the 1970 Longhorn team that built an unbeaten streak to 31 games. The next year Sisemore blossomed into one of the nation's best linemen as he had the first of two consecutive seasons (1971 and 1972) where he was both an all-conference and unanimous All-America selection. In his 1972 senior year, Texas won its third consecutive Southwest Conference title and gained its third straight Cotton Bowl Classic bid. He was inducted to the College Football Hall of Fame in 2002.



James MacPherson


Quality Control Coach/Offense

A former standout at Wake Forest University, James MacPherson was begins his coaching career as an Offensive Quality Control Coach for head coach Jay Gruden.

A former quarterback, MacPherson played two seasons in the Arena Football League for Georgia (2007) and Grand Rapids (2008). As a starter for Grand

Rapids, MacPherson threw for 3,970 yards and 87 touchdowns in 16 games. He also played one season for Green Bay in afl2 and went to camp with the Indianapolis Colts in 2003.

A four-year letterman at Wake, MacPherson became the Deacons full-time starter as a junior. He capped his college career by hitting nine of 16 passes for 241 yards and a pair of touchdowns against Oregon to earn MVP honors in the 2002 Seattle Bowl.



Bill Bradley

Defensive Backs Coach

A former standout with the Philadelphia Eagles, Bill Bradley returns for his second season on the Florida Tuskers staff as defensive backs coach.

Bradley coached the secondary of the UFL's top-rated defense last season under then-head coach Jim Haslett. Prior to his arrival in Orlando, he coached in the NFL with the San Diego Chargers (2007-08), New York Jets (2001-03) and Buffalo Bills (1998-2000). He also served as Defensive

Coordinator at Baylor (2004-06) for three seasons and coached in the USFL for the San Antonio Gunslingers.

A former third-round NFL draft pick in 1969, Bradley had a stellar nine-year career with the Philadelphia Eagles (1969-76) and St. Louis Cardinals (1977). He led the NFL interceptions in both 1971 and 1972, becoming the first player to lead the league in consecutive seasons. One

of the most versatile NFL players of his time, Bradley had 34 career interceptions, averaged 39.0 yards on 129 career punts, and was also used as both a punt and kickoff return man early in his pro career. He was named to three pro bowls.

Prior to his professional career, Bradley was a standout defensive back for the Texas Longhorns. A three-year starter, Bradley still holds the Texas record for most interceptions in a single game, recording four picks against arch-rival Texas A&M during his senior season.

Bradley is a member of the Texas High School, University of Texas, Philadelphia Eagles and Texas Sports Halls of Fame.



Kerry Locklin Defensive Line Coach

A former NFL player, Kerry Locklin joins Jay Gruden's staff this season as the Tuskers defensive line coach. A former 6th round pick, Locklin played three seasons in the NFL for the Los Angeles Rams (1982-83) and Denver Broncos (1987). In addition, Locklin played two years in the United States Football League for Arizona (1984-85).

He began his coaching career with Western New Mexico as a running backs coach in 1988. He spent eight years as defensive line coach with Fresno State (2000-08). At Fresno State, Locklin coached two different Western Athletic Conference Defensive Players of the Year in Garrett McIntyre and Alan Harper. Most-recently, Kerry served as defensive line coach for Rex Ryan and the New York Jets (2009).

Locklin played college football at New Mexico State University, where he earned both a bachelors and masters degree. On the field, he was named an All-WAC tight end, earning UPI and AP All-America honorable mention honors, and was also an All-Missouri Valley Conference first-team and Academic All-MVC first-team selection in 1980 and 1981.



Bret Munsey

Player Personnel Director/ Assistant Defensive Backs Coach

After spending one year working at the league level, Bret Munsey has joined the Florida Tuskers as Director of Player Personnel. In addition, Munsey will also assist in coaching the Tuskers' secondary.

A native of Winter Park, Munsey spent last season as a player personnel assistant with the UFL. Prior to that, he spent three years as Head Coach of

the Philadelphia Soul of the Arena Football League. In that capacity, Munsey recorded a 35-20 overall record (.636 winning percentage). His 2008 team went 13-3 in the regular season and swept through the playoffs to capture that city's first AFL championship.



Munsey spent three seasons with the AFL's Orlando Predators (2003-05), where he filled the role of secondary coach and player personnel director. Previous AFL coaching experience included one year as an assistant coach with the Carolina Cobras (2001). He also coached in the arenafootball2 league as an assistant with Augusta (2000) and head coach of the Tennessee Vipers (2002).

A former three-sport star at Winter Park High School, Munsey played college football at Concord College (WV) and was a member of the Orlando Predators football team from 1991-95.



Fred Pagac

Quality Control Coach/Defense

Former Ohio State standout Fred Pagac will serve as defensive quality control coach for the Tuskers in 2010.

Pagac was a four-year letter winner for Ohio State from 1999-2003, playing in 39 games and making 10 starts at middle linebacker as a senior when he posted career highs with 36 tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss and one quarterback sack. During the Buckeyes' 2002 national championship season, he played

in nine games and collected 11 tackles, including two behind the line of scrimmage before missing the end of the season with shoulder surgery.

Pagac graduated from Ohio State in 2004 with a degree in real estate management and was signed as a free agent by the St. Louis Rams in June of that year. After he was released by the Rams he played with the Frankfurt Galaxy of NFL Europe in 2005 before an injury ended his playing days. He is the son of former NFL player and long-time NFL coach Fred Pagac Sr.



Al Roberts

Special Teams Coach

A veteran coach with more than 40 years experience in the high school, college and professional ranks, Al Roberts returns to the Tuskers for a second season as special teams coach. Under Roberts' guidance, the Tuskers ranked among the UFL's best in practically every special teams category.

Prior to joining the Tuskers, Roberts served as special teams coach for the Los Angeles Rams (2007-08), Cincinnati Bengals (1997-2002), Philadelphia

Eagles (1988-90) New York Jets (1991-93) and Arizona Cardinals (1994-95). Roberts also served as a running backs coach with the Houston Oilers (1984-85) and with the Washington Redskins (1996).

College stops for Roberts include stints with Purdue (1986) and Wyoming (1987); as well as five seasons as running backs coach under Don James at the University of Washington (1997-2002).

A native of Fresno, Calif., Roberts played college football at the University of Washington (1964-65) and the University of Puget Sound (1964-65).



Jim Lanford

Special Teams Assistant

A long time consultant to several NFL teams, Jim Lanford is in his second season as special teams assistant for the Florida Tuskers. In his current position, Lanford assists with all aspects of the Tuskers kicking game – which ranked among the league's best in several categories.

Prior to joining the Tuskers, Lanford served as a consultant with the Philadelphia Eagles, Tennessee Titans, and Chicago Bears, where he assisted

in mini-camps, training camps and off-season workouts.

Lanford served two stints as a special teams coach at University of West Georgia (1994-98 and 2000-03). During that time, he helped the school to three Gulf South Conference championships and four NCAA Division II playoff berths. In addition, Lanford has and continues to work as an individual kicking coach/consultant for several outstanding collegiate players.

Chris Palmer

Head Coach and General Manager

Chris Palmer joined the United Football League as Head Coach and General Manager of the new Hartford franchise and brings 38 years of coaching experience, including 20 consecutive years in the NFL.

Palmer is a native of Brewster, New York, but has strong links to Connecticut. He played football at Immaculate High School in Danbury and was a guarterback at Southern Connecticut State University from 1968 to 1971.

Following graduation, he coached at the University of Connecticut and prior to entering the NFL, he enjoyed a successful spell coaching at the University of New Haven from 1986 to 1987, posting consecutive 8-2 records.

Palmer has been a head coach and offensive coordinator in the NFL and has coached NFL Pro Bowl quarterbacks Drew Bledsoe, Mark Brunell, Tony Romo, Eli Manning and Doug Flutie.

Most recently, Palmer tutored Eli Manning at the New York Giants from 2007 to 2009, and ultimately won a Super Bowl ring when the Giants defeated the New England Patriots, 17-14, in Super Bowl XLII in Glendale, Ariz. Under Palmer, Manning completed three stellar seasons and became the first Giants quarterback to throw for more than 3,000 yards in four consecutive seasons.

Palmer was the Head Coach of the Cleveland Browns from 1999 to 2000, taking on the challenge of an expansion team, and posted a 5-27 record in two seasons. He was the Offensive Coordinator of the Jacksonville Jaguars from 1997 to 1998 and the Houston Texans from 2001 to 2005. During his time with the Texans, Palmer helped develop quarterback David Carr, who completed 61.2 percent of passes and threw for 3,531 yards in 2004.

Before joining the Giants, Palmer was the Dallas Cowboys quarterbacks coach and helped current Pro Bowl selection Tony Romo emerge as the team's undisputed starter to win five of his six starts and lead the Cowboys to an NFC Wild Card berth in 2007.

As quarterbacks coach, Palmer helped the New England Patriots to the AFC title and a berth at Super Bowl XXXI, while his signal caller, Drew Bledsoe, led the NFL in passing attempts (623) and completions (373) and was third in passing yards (4,086) and touchdowns (27).

In addition to his successful spell at New Haven, Palmer was the Head Coach of Boston University from 1988-89 and was the Offensive Coordinator at Colgate from 1976 to 1982. Palmer also coached the offensive line of the Montreal Concordes in the Canadian Football League in 1983, and was with the New Jersey Generals in the USFL from 1984 to 1985. While with the Generals as wide receivers coach and then quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator, he coached standout quarterbacks Flutie and Brian Sipe and running back Herschel Walker.

Palmer and his wife Donna have two children, Mark and Kristin, a daughter-in-law Heather and two grandchildren, Casey and Annie Grace.



Osia D. Lewis Defensive Coordinator

Lewis came to the Colonials after having been defensive coordinator at UTEP and coaching previously at New Mexico and the University of Illinois.

His coaching career began when he was a graduate assistant at Oregon State from 1987 to 1988 before moving to Western Oregon State as an assistant football coach in 1989 and 1990. He returned to Oregon State as a member of the coaching staff in 1991. Lewis went on to spend six years on

the staff at Illinois, winning the Pac 10 title in 2001. He coached the defensive line from 1997 to 2000, and the linebackers from 2001 to 2002.

Following Illinois, Lewis led the defensive efforts at New Mexico. He guided the Lobos defensive line from 2003 to 2005 and the linebackers from 2006 to 2007. Lewis also helped the Lobos to bowl appearances in 2003, 2004 and 2006. In 2008, Lewis led one of the nation's top defenses as defensive coordinator at UTEP.

The Anchorage, Alaska native began his football career as a four-year letterman and a standout linebacker at Oregon State from 1982 to 1985. While at OSU, he played quarterback, safety and wide receiver for the Beavers. As a senior, he was named the team's Most Inspirational Player, served as team captain and earned All-Pac-10 and honorable mention All-America honors by the Associated Press. Lewis still holds school records for single-season defensive points, season fumble recoveries (four) and career fumble recoveries (eight). Lewis earned both his bachelor's degree in Social Science Education and Master's in Education from OSU.

After college, Lewis played for the Toronto Argonauts of the Canadian Football League and the Chicago Bruisers and Albany Firebirds of the Arena Football League. In 1988, he was named All-Arena League and participated in the Arena Bowl.

That followed two seasons as the assistant special teams coach for the Chicago Bears. While in Chicago, he helped the Bears lead the NFL in overall special teams rankings.

O'Dea spent two years with the Arizona Cardinals, where kicker Neil Rackers

set the NFL record for most field goals in a season (40). Before that, O'Dea was a special teams assistant for the Detroit Lions. He spent six seasons with Tampa Bay, serving as an offensive and defensive assistant, a role he also held with the San Diego Chargers.

The final three years of his eight-year college football coaching stint came at Penn State where,



as a graduate assistant, O'Dea worked with the wide receivers, then was named assistant strength coach/defensive line/linebackers coach. Prior to that, he spent three years at the University of Virginia, as a graduate assistant and assistant strength coach having began his coaching career in 1987 as freshman defensive backs coach at Cornell.

O'Dea earned his bachelor's degree from Lock Haven University, where he played wide receiver and line backer from 1985 to 1986 after spending four years in the Coast Guard. He later earned his master's in Education from the University of Virginia.

Oji Fagan is new to the Hartford Colonials, but is no stranger to Chris Palmer. In 2008, Fagan served an internship with the New York Giants, where he attracted Coach Palmer's attention. He spent the last four years as head coach of Hudson Valley Community College. In 2008, he earned the title of Northeast Conference Co-Coach of the Year.

Before HVCC, Fagan was the offensive line coach and academic coordinator

at Stonehill College. Prior to taking the position at Stonehill, Fagan was an assistant coach at HVCC from 2001 to 2003. He helped Hudson Valley to two Northeast Football Conference championships, two Region III titles and a spot in the 2003 Graphic Edge Bowl.

Originally from Brooklyn, Fagan received his bachelor's degree from the University at Albany in 2000. He was a four-year letter winner for the Great Danes.



Dave Ragone

Quarterbacks Coach

A former standout quarterback at the University of Louisville, Dave Ragone hails from Middleburg Heights, Ohio, and went 27-11 as a starter for Louisville, including an 11-1 mark in 2001. He finished his collegiate career as Louisville's second all time leading passer and was a three-time All-American Honorable Mention and three-time Conference USA Offensive Player of the Year.

Ragone was selected in the third round of the 2003 NFL draft by the Houston, and in 2004, started two games at quarterback. He was allocated to the Berlin Thunder of NFL Europe in 2005 and earned the league's Offensive MVP title, while leading the Thunder to a World Bowl berth. He signed with the Cincinnati Bengals and the St Louis Rams before finishing his playing career in 2006.

Ragone switched gears and hosted a morning sports TV show and became Vice President of The Corporate Playbook, a company that helps athletes prepare and find jobs.



Shane Waldron

Wide Receivers Coach

A native of Portland, Oregon, Waldron attended De La Salle North Catholic High School before playing tight end and long snapper at Tufts University from 1999 to 2002.

He began his professional coaching career on the staff of the New England Patriots as a football operations assistant under head coach Bill Belichick. In 2005, Waldron followed Patriots offensive coordinator Charlie Weis to the

University of Notre Dame, where he spent three years as an offensive graduate assistant.

He returned to the Patriots in 2008 as offensive coaching assistant and was promoted to tight ends coach following the 2008 season.



Michael Jenkins Running Backs Coach

Jenkins is back in professional football after a stint as a running back in the Canadian Football League. He played three seasons with the Toronto Argonauts (2000-01, 2003), including a 1,484-yard rushing season in 2001. In between stints in Toronto, he spent time with the National Football League's Houston Texans in 2002. He also played with the Edmonton Eskimos in 2005, and won a Grey Cup championship.

Todd Washington Offensive Line Coach

Washington was a four-year starter at center and guard at Virginia Tech, helping the Hokies average almost 200 yards per game during his junior and senior seasons. At center his senior year, he earned first team All-Big East honors having made more than 80 knockdown blocks.

Todd was drafted in the fourth round of the 1998 NFL Draft by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, where he spent five seasons, winning a Super Bowl ring

with the Bucs at Super Bowl XXXVII, before moving on to the Houston Texans, where he played until 2005.

Todd took the offensive line coaching position at the University of San Diego in 2007. The Toreros' offense was ranked first in the Pioneer Football League in scoring, total offense, pass offense and pass efficiency. part of an Albany defense that held six opponents under 100 yards rushing, leading them to be ranked 19th nationally among FCS schools in that category.

His father is Miami Dolphins head coach Tony Sparano.

Mandigo begins his first season as a professional football coach with the Colonials. He has a varied coaching background at the college and high school levels, most recently as the defensive coordinator at Wesleyan University. He also has been a defensive coordinator at Middlebury College, and a defensive coordinator/secondary coach at St. Anslem College. Jim Fassel

Head Coach & General Manager

In his first season as Head Coach of the Las Vegas Locos, former NFL Coach of the Year Jim Fassel successfully led the Locos to the first UFL Championship title. Under his guidance, the Locos finished with a 5-2 record in the Premiere season and defeated the Florida Tuskers 20-17 in the championship game.

As head coach of the New York Giants, Fassel resurrected the career of quarterback Kerry Collins and received acclaim for his playoff guarantee in the 2000 season, during which he led the Giants to an improbable Super Bowl appearance.

Fassel has a long record of offensive successes and has tutored other prominent quarterbacks including Phil Simms, Boomer Esiason, Jeff Hoestetler and John Elway. Prior to becoming the Giants head coach, Fassel was the team's offensive coordinator and served in the same capacity with the Arizona Cardinals, Denver Broncos and Oakland Raiders. Fassel was also the offensive coordinator to the Baltimore Ravens for the 2004 and 2005 seasons.

He began his coaching career as an offensive coordinator at the University of Utah and Stanford University before being elevated to head coach at Utah.

Fassel played quarterback at USC and later transferred to Long Beach State. He was selected in the 7th round of the 1972 NFL Draft by the Chicago Bears and also played with the San Diego Chargers, Houston Oilers and the Hawaiians of the WFL.

Fassel took a break from coaching when he was hired as color commentator on NFL Sunday Night Game broadcasts for the Westwood One Radio Network and also served as a color analyst on ESPN.

The recipient of numerous awards including the 2000 NFL Coach of the Year by the Sporting News, NJ Sports Writers Association and the Victor Awards Pro Football Coach of the Year, Fassel has also been honored for his work off of the field. He received the Catholic Big Brothers of the Year Award (1998), the Fresh Air Fund Man of the Year (1999) and the Long Beach State University Distinguished Alumnus Award (2001).

Fassel is a proud father of four boys and one girl and in 2001 he received the National Father's Day Father of the Year Award.



Larry MacDuff

Defensive Coordinator & Special Teams Coordinator

MacDuff returns to the Las Vegas Locomotives as the Defensive Coordinator and Special Teams Coach for a second season in the UFL. With more than 35 years of coaching experience, MacDuff has coordinated successful defenses and special team units at both the professional and collegiate level.

Most recently, Mac Duff served as Co-Defensive Coordinator, Assistant Head Coach and Linebackers Coach for the University of Texas. The Longhorns were the top team in the Big 12 Conference for rushing defense, ranked sixth nationally and defeated Arizona State in the Holiday Bowl.

MacDuff spent four seasons as Special Teams Coordinator for the San Francisco 49ers. During that time, his special teams achieved top four rankings in the NFL for takeaways, kickoff coverage and kickoff returns.

MacDuff first came to the NFL as Special Teams Coach for the New York Giants, working under Locos Head Coach Jim Fassel. During his tenure with the team, the Giants won two NFC East titles and advanced to the Super Bowl in 2000.

At the University of Arizona his Desert Swarm Defense finished in the top 10 nationally in total defense for four consecutive years (1992-95). Arizona led the nation in scoring defense in 1992 and in rushing defense in 1993. Under MacDuff's guidance, five players were named Consensus 1st Team All-Americans, five players were named Pac 10 Defensive Players of the Year and 24 defensive players were drafted or made NFL rosters.

An All-America defensive end on Fullerton Junior College's 12-0 National Championship team, MacDuff continued his college playing career at the University of Oklahoma. An effective leader and teacher, MacDuff and his wife Barbie have one son, Justin.

Wilson returns to the Las Vegas Locomotives as wide receivers coach for a second season. Affiliated with the NFL for more than 25 years as a coach and a player, Wilson won Super Bowls XVI, XIX, XXIII and XXIV as a member of the San Francisco 49ers. He most recently served as assistant wide receivers coach for the Arizona Cardinals.

During his four years with the Cardinals (2003-07), Wilson was instrumental in developing Anguan Boldin and Larry Fitzgerald into 2006 Pro-Bowl receivers with both players totaling more than 100 receptions for more than 1,400 yards apiece.

As part of the NFL's Minority Internship program, in 2003, Wilson worked with the Washington Redskins during the team's training camp. As assistant wide receivers coach at the University of Southern California from 1997-2001, he assisted in game plan preparation and coordination of passing game along with video breakdowns.

Wilson began coaching in the NFL during the 1995-96 season where he developed the wide



receiver corps for the Los Angeles/Oakland Raiders. He also mentored Pro-Bowl player Tim Brown during that time.

Wilson's first coaching job came in 1992 at Stanford University where he served as assistant wide receivers and tight ends coach.

Following his successful collegiate football career at Washington State, Wilson was selected by the Dallas Cowboys in the ninth round of the 1981 NFL Draft. Upon his release by the Cowboys during the preseason, he joined the 49ers where he was mentored by several accomplished coaches in Dennis Green, Bill Walsh, George Seifert, Sam Wyche, and Mike Holmgren. Wilson and the 49ers won four Super Bowls, appeared in six NFC title games, and won eight NFC West crowns. He is one of only three wide receivers in NFL history to own four Super Bowl rings. In addition, Wilson was honored as San Francisco's 1987 Ed Block Courage award winner. A native of Los Angeles, Wilson was an all-city and all-American football and basketball standout at Carson High School leading his team to the city title as a senior in basketball.

In 2001, Wilson was inducted into the North-South Shiners All-Star Game's "Hall of Fame." He still holds the record for the longest touchdown reception in the history of the game with his 97-yard reception in the 1978 contest. While in private business from 2001-2003, he served as an assistant for the annual East-West College All-Star game.

A member of the Board of Directors of the Champs Foundation, Wilson also serves on the boards of the Family House of San Francisco (Children with Cancer) and the Los Angeles Blazers Youth Organization Academic Center. Wilson also serves as the honorary chairman for the National Kidney Foundation Golf Tournament. He graduated from Washington State with a communications degree.

Wilson resides in Chandler, Arizona and has two daughters in college; Samantha (Yale University) and Emma (DePaul University).



Kevin Wolthausen

Wolthausen returns to the Las Vegas Locomotives as Defensive Line Coach. Prior to coming to the UFL, Wolthausen was the Associate Head Coach/ Linebackers at Eastern Michigan University. He also served as the Atlanta Falcons Defensive Line Coach for the 2007 season.

Wolthausen spent four seasons coaching at the University of Louisville, culminating in his role as Co-Defensive Coordinator and Defensive Line

1992 to 2000, and his best year as a professional came during the 1995 season as a member of the Minnesota Vikings when he caught 71 receptions. Tight Ends Coach

In 2008 Brandon was named offensive coordinator at Virginia following six seasons as head coach at Bowling Green, where he compiled a 44-30 record and led the Falcons to three bowl appearances.

Bowling Green featured one of the nation's leading offenses under Brandon. In four of his six seasons as head coach his teams averaged more than 400 yards of offense per game. His 2004 Falcon squad was one of the most





Jeff Jagodzinski Head Coach

Jeff Jagodzinski was named Head Coach of the Omaha Nighthawks on April 15, 2010. He served as Boston College's head football coach for two seasons (2007-2008) and left Boston College after leading the Eagles to a cumulative 20-8 record. The 2008 Eagles finished the regular season with a record of 9-3 and advanced to the Atlantic Coast Conference Championship Game for the second consecutive year as the league's Atlantic Division champion.

Following the 2008 season, he was named New England Coach of the Year.

In his first season leading the Eagles in 2007, the team began the season 8-0, the third-best start in school history. After their win over No. 8 Virginia Tech, the Eagles climbed to No. 2 in both major polls, their highest ranking since being ranked No. 1 in 1942, as the squad became the first BC football team to win 10 or more games in consecutive seasons. The team won the ACC Atlantic Division that season and advanced to the ACC Championship Game for the first time and finished 10th in the final AP college football poll and 11th in the USA Today poll, their highest final ranking since the 1984 season.

During the 2007 season, he tutored ACC Player of the Year, QB Matt Ryan, who went on to become the 2008 NFL AP Offensive Rookie of the Year after being drafted third overall by the Atlanta Falcons. T Gosder Cherilus was also a first-round draft selection (17th pick, Detroit Lions) and S Jamie Silva became a consensus All-America first-team selection under Jagodzinski.

Prior to his stint at Boston College, Jagodzinski served as the offensive coordinator for the Green Bay Packers in 2006, leading an offense that featured QB Brett Favre, 1,000-yard rusher RB Ahman Green and 1,000-yard receiver WR Donald Driver.

He spent the two seasons (2004-2005) before his appointment in Green Bay on the staff of the Atlanta Falcons. After serving as tight ends coach in 2004, he was promoted to offensive line coach in 2005. Under Jagodzinski's direction, the Falcons led the NFL in rushing with 2,546 yards in 2005 while RB Warrick Dunn rushed for a career-high 1,416 yards on his way to the Pro Bowl. Falcons TE Alge Crumpler was voted to the Pro Bowl after leading all NFL tight ends with a 16.1-yard per-catch average.

Prior to joining the Falcons, Jagodzinski spent five years (1999-2003) as the Packers' tight ends coach and was instrumental in launching the career of three-time Pro Bowl TE Bubba Franks.

Jagodzinski's initial stint in the NFL came after 14 years as a college coach, including two successful seasons (1997-1998) as offensive coordinator at Boston College. During his two seasons in Boston, his offenses averaged more than 400 yards per game as the Eagles allowed the fewest sacks in the Big East, going from last to first in 1997. Jagodzinski also coached Seahawks All-Pro QB Matt Hasselbeck during his 1997 senior season at Boston College.

Before leading the offense at Boston College, Jagodzinski served on coaching staffs at East

Carolina (1989-1996), Louisiana State (1987-1988), Northern Illinois (1986), and the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater (1985), his alma mater. Jagodzinski was a three-year starter and four-year player (1981-1984) at fullback for the Warhawks, while earning a B.S. degree in education at Whitewater in 1985.

Jagodzinski attended West Allis (Wisconsin) Central High School, where he played football and baseball, earning all-conference honors in football and participating in the Shrine game, the state's all-star contest, following his senior season. Born October 12, 1963, in Milwaukee, Jagodzinski and his wife, Lisa, have five children: Josh, JoAnne, Jessica, Jacqueline and Jennifer.



Rick Mueller General Manager

Mueller was a key contributor in the success of the UFL "Premiere" season as his guidance and expertise helped assemble a league of talented coaches and players demonstrating high quality football. In 2010 he became General manager of the expansion team Omaha Nighthawks.

Prior to coming to the UFL, Mueller was Vice President of Player Personnel for the New Orleans Saints where his role ranged from evaluating current

and future NFL free agents to studying college prospects and supervising and coordinating the organization's college and pro scouts.

In eight seasons in New Orleans, Mueller helped shape the club's last seven drafts and freeagent classes, which formed the foundation of a team that in 2006 captured the NFC South title and advanced to the NFC Championship Game. Mueller arrived at the Saints following a six-year stint with the Jacksonville Jaguars, where he was instrumental in their rapid rise from expansion franchise in 1995 to AFC powerhouse.

In 13 NFL seasons, the teams that Mueller has helped build have compiled a record of 111-97 and earned six playoff appearances – including advancing to three conference championship games.

From 1996-99, Jacksonville captured two AFC Central Division titles and played in a pair of conference championships. Mueller served as the Jaguars' Director of College Scouting in 1998-99 and was in charge of his initial college draft in 1999. Prior to being promoted, Mueller was Jacksonville's college scout for the Western United States.


In 1993, Mueller was Director of Player Personnel and wide receivers coach for the CFL

Sacramento Gold Miners. In the spring and summer of 1992, he was defensive assistant and special teams coach for the World League's Sacramento Surge as they posted an 8-2 record and captured the World Bowl.

Mueller was a graduate assistant at Washington State University from 1990-92 where he served as quarterbacks coach, head junior varsity coach and recruiting coordinator.

A graduate of the University of Puget Sound (Wash.), Mueller was a three-year starter at quarterback. He graduated with a degree in communications in 1990 and also attended graduate school, studying communications while coaching at Washington State from 1990-92.

Mueller and his wife, Andrea, have twin sons, Chase and Rhett, and a daughter, Emry.



Rick Lantz

Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers

Lantz has spent 38 years coaching major college football, 30 of which have been spent as a defensive coordinator. Since 2007, he has been consulting for head coaches at the college level, helping them to "Lead Their Teams" and to develop effective "Coaches Performance Standards."

Lantz's first coaching position was as the head coach of Bridgton Academy (Maine) in 1964 before he became an assistant coach at Boston University

from 1965 to 1967 and then at the United States Naval Academy from 1971 to 1976. Lantz was defensive coordinator at the University of Buffalo from 1968 to 1970, and then held the same position at the University of Miami from 1977 to 1980 and Georgia Tech from 1982 to 1983.

Lantz was the defensive line coach at Notre Dame for a year before being named the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at the University of Louisville, where he remained from 1986 to 1990. He was defensive coordinator at the University of Virginia from 1991 to 2001, and returned to the Naval Academy as the interim head coach in 2001.

Lantz's coaching career in the professional ranks began in 1981, when he spent a year as an assistant coach for the New England Patriots. In 2004, he spent two years as the head coach of the Berlin Thunder of NFL Europe, leading them to the World Bowl title in his first season. He took the Thunder back to the World Bowl the following year, where they lost narrowly to the Amsterdam Admirals. Lantz then moved to the Rhein Fire as head coach for the final NFL Europe season in 2007.

Lantz is a graduate of Central Connecticut University in New Britain, Connecticut, and also spent four years in the U.S. Marine Corps prior to becoming head coach at Bridgton Academy.



Kirk Doll

Special Teams/Linebackers

Before joining the Nighthawks' coaching ranks, Doll was special teams coordinator at Texas A&M for two years, having returned to the college ranks in 2008 and resuming a career that began at Wichita State in 1975. He spent three seasons with the Denver Broncos as the special teams coordinator, then linebackers coach.

Doll coached at Texas City High School from 1978 to 1979 before moving to Iowa State and then Tulsa, where he was offensive line coach from 1980 to 1984. He switched to the defensive side of the ball at Arizona State in 1985, where he helped the Sun Devils to the Rose Bowl.

During his first stint at Texas A&M, which came between 1988 and 1993, Doll reached five bowl games in six years, and his charges led the country in total defense in 1991. Doll moved to Notre Dame, working under Lou Holtz and Bob Davie and held a variety of positions, including coaching linebackers, special teams and kickers. From 1997 to 2001, he was the assistant head coach, and during his eight years in South Bend the Fighting Irish played in five bowl games.

Doll joined Nick Saban at LSU as assistant head coach and linebackers coach, helping LSU claim a share of the 2003 college football national championship.

Doll earned his BA from East Carolina and graduated cum laude from Wichita State in 1976.



Carl Hairston Defensive Line

Carl "Big Daddy" Hairston comes to Omaha having helped Jim Haslett and the Florida Tuskers to an undefeated regular season last year, before falling just short in the 2009 UFL Championship Game against the Las Vegas Locos.

Hairston became a college scout for the Arizona Cardinals, the club where he ended a successful NFL playing career, then became a scout for the Kansas City Chiefs in 1994.

Chiefs head coach Marty Schottenheimer made Hairston his defensive line coach, as the Chiefs posted a 13-3 record in 1995 and the Kansas City defense ranked third in the NFL with 47 sacks. Hairston rejoined the coach who had drafted him, Dick Vermeil, with the St Louis Rams, where he was defensive line coach from 1997 to 2000. During that time, he coached three different players to double-digit sack seasons, including Leslie O'Neal, who had a ten-sack performance, and helped the Rams to a Super Bowl XXXIV victory, with his unit compiling 57 sacks to tie for the league season high.

Hairston was an early mentor to defensive line juggernaut Jared Allen, helping him to 20 sacks in his first two years in the NFL before moving to the Green Bay Packers in 2006 as defensive ends coach.

As a player, Hairston starred at the University of Maryland-Eastern Shore and was taken in the seventh round of the 1976 NFL Draft by Vermeil's Philadelphia Eagles. He played for the Eagles until 1983, when he joined the Cleveland Browns, before playing one season with the Arizona Cardinals in 1989. He started 184 of 224 career games and amassed 1,141 tackles and 94 sacks. He started at defensive end in Super Bowl XV against the Oakland Raiders, which was one of 15 postseason games in which he played.



Ron Hudson Ouarterbacks

Hudson started his coaching career in 1972 with the University of California with wide receivers. He moved on to running backs at the University of Oregon in 1977 and UCLA in 1979 before getting his first offensive coordinator position with Notre Dame in 1994. He was at ND until 1985, and then worked as running backs coach at University of Illinois followed by guarterbacks coach at Ohio State. He then moved to Kansas State University

where he spent the next eight years, putting together a potent offensive attack. In all eight of his seasons at the school the team posted at least 10 wins, including going to six consecutive bowl games. Kansas State let NCAA Division I-A in offense during the 1998 season and set a school record for points scored with 610. In 2003, he joined the University of Kentucky for a very brief period as offensive coordinator before moving to the Hamburg Sea Devils of NFL Europe until the league shut its doors.



Roger Hughes

Wide Receivers

A native of Crawford, Nebraska, Hughes attended Nebraska Western Junior College on a basketball scholarship then transferred to Doane College in Crete, Neb., where he played football and golf before graduating in 1982.

Hughes' first job in coaching was also at Doane, where he coached for a year before starting graduate work at Nebraska, where helped the Cornhuskers to the 1984 Sugar Bowl and the 1985 Fiesta Bowl as a graduate assistant.

Hughes returned to Doane as offensive coordinator, then became running backs coach at the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater, and in his year there, helped his team to a conference championship and a berth in the NCAA Division II quarterfinals. His next stop took him to Cameron University in Oklahoma, where he spent three years as offensive coordinator and strength and conditioning, quarterbacks and offensive line coach.

In 1992, Hughes moved on to Dartmouth, where his offense helped the Big Green to the Ivy League Championship, and repeated the win in 1996. Under his guidance, the offense set single-game records for passing and total yardage in school history and he coached future NFL quarterback Jay Fielder. Dartmouth went 10-0, one of only four teams to do so in league history.

After eight successful years with Dartmouth, Hughes became head coach at Princeton in 2000. During his 10 years at Princeton, three quarterbacks placed in the top six all-time passing and he became the only coach in the history of Ivy League football to improve a team by at least two wins in three straight seasons.

He guided Princeton to the 2006 lvy League title despite starting both an entirely new offensive line and linebacker corps. His offense finished first in the lvy League in both passing yards and total yards, and senior quarterback Jeff Terrell became Princeton's first Bushnell Cup winner (lvy League Player of the Year) since 1995. Hughes was runner up for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.



Michael Ketchum

Offensive Line/Quality Control

Ketchum comes to the UFL with a wide array of sporting experience, which has no doubt helped him adapt to the changing conditions in football. He was a four-year starter at the University of the South from 1996 to 1998, while at the same time being very involved with the school's rugby program. Furthermore, he was a two-year letterman in high school with their varsity wrestling program.

Upon graduating, Michael took a job as a graduate assistant coach at Cumberland University, where he worked with the offensive tackles and tight ends and wide receivers. While there, he also had many other duties associated with the football program that included equipment and field management, student-athlete supervisor and strength and conditioning assistant. During the 2001 season, he was given more responsibility and joined the offensive coaching staff to break down opponent game film. His experience in the video room led him to join the Vanderbilt University program, where he served as video coordinator, where he was involved and managed all aspects of the football video department until 2002. Michael joined the University of Iowa football program thereafter as a graduate assistant coach on the defense. Michael helped the Hawkeyes to victories in the 2004 Outback Bowl against Florida and the 2005 Capital One Bowl against LSU. During the 2005 season, the Hawkeye defense ranked sixth nationally in rushing defense, sixth in turnover margin and 11th in total defense.

Michael got his BA from the University of the South in 1999 before getting his Masters in Organizational and Human Relations Management.



Patrick Madden

Defensive Backs/Quality Control

Madden started his coaching career directly on the heels of his graduation from Wesleyan University. From 1999 to 2000, he was assistant secondary coach at the school. Thereafter, he spent five years coaching at Columbia University. For the first three, he was the assistant secondary coach, after which, in 2004, he became the defensive assistant, and in 2005, had the secondary coach and special teams coordinator tasks added to his routine.

From there, he became a graduate assistant at Boston College, where he was responsible for

scouting both the opposition as well as analyzing the Eagles players as well as running special teams and offensive scout teams and working with the linebackers. In 2009, he was recruited to join the University of New Hampshire staff to work with the strong safeties and outside linebackers.

Patrick has a Bachelor of Arts degree in American Studies from Wesleyan University.



Vince Marrow Tight Ends

Marrow comes to the UFL with a wealth of experience both as a player and as a coach. He started his playing career at Youngstown State before transferring to the University of Toledo in 1991, where he was second-team all MAC at tight end. He then declared for the 1992 NFL Draft, where he was taken by the Buffalo Bills in the 11th round.

He played for the Bills for three years, including being part of the teams that went to the Super Bowl in 1993 and 1994, before moving to the Carolina Panthers for a year in 1995. He then spent a year with the New York Jets, two years with the Chicago Bears and finally two years with the San Francisco 49ers. After that, while it was the end of his NFL career, it was not the end of his playing career. Vince crossed the Atlantic and won first-team all-league honors with the Frankfurt Galaxy of NFL Europe in 1998. After two years with the Galaxy, Vince returned to America and played in the only year of the XFL with the Orlando Rage.

After his playing career ended, Vince spent some time coaching summer camps at Ohio State University as well as in the state of Florida, while also spending time doing some middle school coaching in Ohio. He then moved back to Europe and spent three years coaching tackles and tight ends for the Berlin Thunder and Rhein Fire until the league shut its doors in 2007. On the back of those endeavors he returned to his college home, the University of Toledo, and became the tight ends coach there.

Vince graduated from the University of Toledo with a degree in Criminal Justice before declaring for the draft in 1992.



Wardell Smith

Running Backs

Smith has been familiar with the running back position from a young age. Dating back to when he was a three year letterman at E.E. Smith High School in North Carolina. His success there propelled him to four years of great success at East Carolina University, where he became the all-time leading rusher with 3,745 yards and three All-American seasons in his four years there from 1991 to 1995. Upon completion of his time at East Carolina, Wardell spent two years in the CFL, the first with the Shreveport Pirates in 1995, and the second with the Hamilton Tiger-Cats in 1996.

Wardell returned to East Carolina, where he spent a year as a graduate assistant in the Athletic Student Development Office, where he spent his time trying to help maximize the learning of the student athletes at ECU. He then took his first coaching job at Illinois State University, where he was running backs coach until 1999. His success at ISU spring boarded him to the same position at the US Military Academy at West Point, where he spent four years. He then spent a year at University of Louisiana-Monroe, before returning to East Carolina to take over the running backs there.

Wardell graduated with a degree in Exercise Sports from ECU in 1997.



Joe Tresey Defensive Backs

Tresey began his coaching career more than 20 years ago as a wellrespected high school coach in Ohio. He spent time at Middletown, New Philadelphia and Mechanicsburg High Schools before taking Fredericktown High to Ohio's Division IV state semifinals in 1989.

From those successes, Joe decided to take the leap to the college level, and with his defensive coaching mindset, in 1995, Joe became the defensive

coordinator and secondaries coach at Otterbein College. He spent four seasons with the Cardinals before moving on to the Virginia Military Institute in 1999. During his three years at VMI, he took over the defensive coordinator duties as he had done at Otterbein, as well as becoming the recruiting coordinator for the team. For the next two years (2002 to 2003), he took over as secondary coach and defensive coordinator at Akron. He moved on to Georgia Southern to coach linebackers as well as take on the defensive coordinator duties. Under his tutelage, the Eagles ranked fourth nationally in total defense in 2004, as well as making it to the NCAA Division I-AA Playoffs in back to back years. From there, he moved on to Central Michigan University to coordinate the defense and work with the safeties for Brian Kelly (now head coach at Notre Dame), and in a very short span changed the fundamentals of the CMU defense, resulting in 29 turnovers and 31 sacks in 14 games in 2006. That achievement landed Joe the defensive coordinator role at the University of Cincinnati. In 2007, the Bearcats tied the South Florida Bulls for the national lead in turnovers and interceptions. Further, in 2008, Joe led a team that finished second in the Big East in scoring defense and rushing defense. Most recently, Joe was the defensive coordinator at the University of South Florida.

Joe graduated from Ohio State University with a Bachelor of Science in Education, and followed that with a Masters of Education in Sports Science from Ashland University.

Dennis Green

Head Coach & General Manager

In his first season as a Head Coach in the United Football League, Dennis Green led the California Redwoods to a 2-4 record and his team featured running back Cory Ross, who led the league in rushing with 462 yards.

As a head coach in the NFL, Green compiled a regular season record of 113– 94 with the Minnesota Vikings and Arizona Cardinals. His most successful season as a head coach was in 1998, leading the Vikings to an impressive

15-1 regular season record while setting the NFL record for most points (556) in a season (a record since broken by the 2007 New England Patriots with 589 points).

Green was an assistant coach under legendary NFL coach Bill Walsh at both Stanford University and the San Francisco 49ers, where he spent four seasons, winning a Super Bowl XXIII ring as the 49ers defeated the Cincinnati Bengals 20-16.

Green also found success at the collegiate level, holding assistant coaching positions at his alma mater the University of Iowa and the University of Dayton. Green was the 1982 Big Ten Conference Coach of the Year as head coach of Northwestern University, and was also the head coach of Stanford University from 1989-1992.

Green is currently President of Dennis Green Sports Marketing and Greenlight Sports Marketing and has taught an MBA Sports Management Class at San Diego State University. Green has also worked for Westwood One Radio as a color analyst for its Thursday night NFL broadcasts as well as for NFL playoff games.

For his on- and off-the-field efforts, the World Sports Humanitarian Hall of Fame named him 'Most Involved Coach'.

Green and his wife Marie have two children, Vanessa and Zach. They reside in San Diego, California. Green also has two adult children, Patti, a director of marketing, and Jeremy, a football information specialist.



Mike Kruczek

Offensive Coordinator & Quarterbacks Coach

Kruczek returns to the UFL as offensive coordinator of the Mountain Lions having served the California Redwoods in the same capacity last season.

Kruczek spent 22 years in the NFL, most recently with the Arizona Cardinals, and brings a wealth of experience as both a coach and former pro quarterback. He trained Matt Ryan (2008) and Brady Quinn (2007) for their respective NFL Drafts and Mountain Lions Daunte Culpepper rose to prominence under Kruczek who was his head coach at the University of Central Florida.

Kruczek, an all-America quarterback at Boston College and owner of two Super Bowl rings while a member of the Pittsburgh Steelers, joined the Arizona Cardinals after 19 seasons at the University of Central Florida (UCF), including six as head coach. In 2005, Kruczek's quarterbacks Kurt Warner and Josh McCown helped direct the Cardinals to the number one-ranked pass offense in the NFL (4,437 yards) and an eighth ranked overall offense. Warner and McCown combined to set new team records in first downs passing (224), net yards passing (4,437), gross yards passing (4,723), attempts (670) and completions (419).

While guiding UCF to a 36–30 record from 1998 to 2003 as head coach, Kruczek's passing offense finished among the top 10 in the NCAA three times (1998, 2001, '02). His 1998 squad, posting a school best 9–2 mark, featured senior quarterback Culpepper, who set more than 30 school records while becoming only the third player in NCAA history to pass for more than 10,000 yards and rush for more than 1,000 yards in a career.

Prior to his six seasons as the Golden Knights' head coach, Kruczek served for 13 seasons as the school's offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach during which time UCF led all NCAA Division II schools in scoring offense (1987), passing offense (1988), and advanced to the I-AA national semifinals (1990).

Born March 15, 1953 in Washington, D.C., Kruczek earned all-America notice in 1975 as a quarterback at Boston College where he set several school passing and total offense records. He was selected in the second round of the 1976 NFL Draft by Pittsburgh and played in 29 games for the Steelers from 1976–79 and was a member of Super Bowl championship squads in 1978 and '79.

As a rookie in 1976, he stepped into the lineup for an injured Terry Bradshaw and led the Steelers to six consecutive victories en route to the AFC title game. The rookie mark stood until 2004 when Steelers quarterback Ben Roethlisberger started his NFL career by winning his first 13 starts. Kruczek concluded his playing career in 1980 with the Washington Redskins.

Kruczek, who owns a degree in marketing from Boston College, received his first coaching experience as quarterbacks coach under Bobby Bowden at Florida State from 1982–83, then spent one season (1984) as quarterbacks coach for the Jacksonville Bulls of the USFL prior to joining the staff at UCF.

Kruczek and his wife, Leigh, have two children.



Ricky Hunley

Defensive Coordinator & Linebackers Coach

Hunley returns as defensive coordinator of the Mountain Lions for a second UFL season. Hunley started his NFL coaching career through the NFL Minority Fellowship Coaching Program in 2002 as the defensive line coach for the Washington Redskins under Steve Spurrier, where he met Marvin Lewis. He became linebackers coach for Lewis and the Cincinnati Bengals from 2003 to 2007.

His college football coaching career included spells at the University of Southern California from 1992 to 1993, University of Missouri from 1994 to 2000 and the University of Florida in 2001.

As a linebacker at the University of Arizona, Hunley was the school's first consensus All-American, an honor he received two consecutive years. He is currently the only player from the University of Arizona to be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame.

Hunley went on to enjoy an NFL career with the Denver Broncos (1984–87), Phoenix Cardinals (1988), and the Los Angeles Raiders (1989–90). He stayed with the NFL even after playing his last game as the elected executive vice president of the NFL Players Association (1990-92).



Martin Bayless

Special Teams Coordinator & Defensive Assistant

Bayless is in his second season in the UFL with the Sacramento Mountain Lions having served as the defensive backs coach with the California Redwoods in 2009. He spent 2008 with the Minnesota Vikings as an assistant defensive coach after two years with the Houston Texans as the assistant defensive backs coach.

A former fourth-round selection of the St. Louis Cardinals in the 1984 NFL

Draft, Bayless was also a first-round pick by the Memphis Showboats of the USFL. During a 14-year NFL career, Bayless played in 192 games and started 153 games making 1,186 tackles, 11.5 sacks, and 12 career interceptions. A college football standout at Bowling Green, he was inducted into the school's Hall of Fame in 1989 and still ranks second in the NCAA record books for career interceptions with 27.

Bayless retired from playing in 1998 and then moved to the Buffalo Bills' front office as director of player development/special projects. He began his coaching career at Castle Park High School in San Diego and then at to the University of North Carolina as a coaching intern.

Bayless was defensive backs and special teams coach with the Barcelona Dragons and Amsterdam Admirals of NFL Europe for the 2003 season before joining the Carolina Panthers as defensive assistant for the team's Super Bowl XXXVIII season. Bayless also coached in Oakland, serving as special teams assistant for the Raiders from 2004-05.

He established the Martin Bayless Free Football Camp in 1986 in his hometown of Dayton, Ohio and more than 135,000 youths have since participated in the camps which span from Ohio to California. His camps have produced three Heisman Trophy Winners (Reggie Bush, Ricky Williams and Rashaan Salaam) and two first overall picks in the NFL Draft (Alex Smith and Dan Wilkinson). For his accomplishments both on and off the field, Bayless was voted San Diego Chargers NFL Man of the Year in 1990 and 1991 and the Kansas City Chiefs NFL Man of the Year in 1996 and was honored with the San Diego Hall of Champions' Ernest H. Wright Sr. Humanitarian Award.



DeChon Burns Defensive Line Coach

Before landing in Sacramento, Burns was the defensive line coach for the University of Texas-El Paso having served as the interim head coach at Texas Southern, where he had also been the defensive coordinator and defensive line coach.

Burns spent time coaching with the Washington Redskins in the NFL, the Florida Gators in College and Bishop Arnat and Beverly Hills High Schools.

At the University of Southern California he reached the 1989 Rose Bowl, but suffered a neck injury that ended his football career. Griffith served as the California Redwoods defensive assistant coach for the 2009 UFL season.

During a stellar 13 year-career the two-time Pro Bowl selection with the Minnesota Vikings amassed 1,324 tackles, 8.5 sacks, 5 forced fumbles and 27 interceptions, making him one of the greatest safeties to ever play the game.

Griffith was a walk on at San Diego State University where he quickly became an indispensable team member and a catalyst for the defensive unit. In the NFL he anchored Vikings' the defense for eight years and also spent three years with the Cleveland Browns and two years with the Arizona Cardinals.

After retiring he established Matador Enterprises, an umbrella company with diversified businesses including wholesale distribution, restaurant ownership and real estate development. He also stayed involved with football as a regular analyst on the set of the NFL Network and ESPN. Griffith hosts a San Diego Chargers post-game show on San Diego's NBC affiliate and has also has graced the sets of FOX Sports and NFL Europe.

Griffith became a presence in the entertainment industry with appearances on CBS' The Young and the Restless, in a music video with Vivica Fox and in Sony Pictures Hustle and Heat. Griffith has been featured in some of the biggest magazines in the country including on the cover of Heart & Soul and in the pages of DUB, Rolling Stone, VIBE, The Source, Sports Illustrated and The Sporting News.

He founded the Robert Griffith Foundation in 1998, which provides college scholarships to underprivileged high school seniors and organizes youth development programs to empower its participants, including mentoring, educational enrichment, organized sports and arts, as well as cultural initiatives. To date, his foundation has 30 graduates from colleges across the U.S.

Griffith also initiated the Viking Challenge which targets K-6th graders and challenges them in five areas of success: responsibility, non-violence, academic improvement, drug and alcohol abstinence and he carried over this program to the Cleveland Browns, where he briefly played.

Offensive Line Coach

Kehoe continues with the Sacramento Mountain Lions in the same offensive line coaching capacity he held with the California Redwoods last season.

Kehoe served as interim offensive line coach for Louisiana Tech and had a similar role at Ole Miss where he was also the team's assistant head coach.

Kehoe spent almost 27 years at the University of Miami, beginning with two seasons as a starting guard having transferred from Laney Junior College in Oakland, CA., and ending with four seasons as assistant head coach and offensive line coach.

Kehoe's tenure at Miami ranked among the longest of any Hurricane, a span during which he either played or coached for five head football In 20 seasons working with the offensive line at Miami, Kehoe produced six players who received first-team All-America honors, plus 18 more that went on to play professionally, 14 All-Big EAST honorees, one Outland Trophy winner and the 2002 Rimington Award winner.

Kehoe was on the staff of all five Miami football national championship teams. Two Heisman Trophy winners and six of Miami's eight 1,000-yard rushers passed or rushed behind the blocking of Kehoe's offensive linemen. His 2000 and 2001 units are widely considered among the finest offensive lines in recent college football history and the 2002 unit was considered the nation's finest by many observers.

A native of Conshohocken, Pa., Kehoe played on the 1979 and 1980 teams that returned the Hurricanes to national status with a victory in the 1980 Peach Bowl. After spending a year as a student assistant, Kehoe served as a graduate assistant coach from 1982-84. He ascended to full-time status in 1985 and worked with the offensive line since then. From 1992-94, Kehoe also tutored tight ends in addition to his duties with the offensive line. As a coach, Kehoe went to 21 bowl games with the Hurricanes.

Kehoe was inducted into the University of Miami Athletics Hall of Fame in 2002 and the Laney JC Athletics Hall of Fame in 2001. He earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in business administration from Miami and an associate's degree in general studies from Laney J.C. in 1979.



Bill Khayat

Tight Ends & Assistant Offensive Line Coach

Khayat comes to the Mountain Lions having spent three years as as the Washington Redskins offensive quality control coach, and also assisted with the tight ends.

In his role helping with the tight ends, Khayat contributed to the development of 2008 second round draft pick Fred Davis, as well as the emergence of 2008 Pro Bowl tight end Chris Cooley. Before going to the

Redskins in 2007, Khayat spent the previous three seasons with the Arizona Cardinals (2004-06) in the same capacity. During his time in Arizona, Khayat also assisted with the offensive line. Khayat spent four seasons at Tennessee State as the school's running backs coach and recruiting coordinator (2003) and tight ends coach and video coordinator (2000-02).

A standout tight end at Duke University from 1992-95, Khayat was twice named to the All-Atlantic Coast Conference second team, was an honorable mention All-America pick in 1994 and was named to the All-Carolina team that same year. Khayat became the first Duke tight end to lead the team in receptions in 25 years. He set the Hall of Fame Bowl game record with 11 receptions for 109 yards against Wisconsin.

After graduating from Duke, Khayat spent time in the NFL on the practice squads with Kansas City (1996) and Carolina (1997), and in 1998 played for the Barcelona Dragons of NFL Europe.

Khayat earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in biological anthropology and anatomy from Duke in 1995. He was on the Distinguished Dean's List at Duke and was named to the Academic All-ACC Football team.



Mike McDaniel Running Backs Coach

Mike McDaniel returns to the UFL with the Sacramento Mountain Lions after spending last season with the California Redwoods as running backs coach.

He spent three seasons as an offensive assistant for the Houston Texans, handling the quality control aspect of the offense. While with the Texans, McDaniel assisted Kyle Shanahan with the coaching of quarterbacks and wide receivers.

McDaniel spent the 2005 season as a coaching intern under Texans Head Coach Gary Kubiak, and spent his college playing career at wide receiver for Yale from 2001 to 04.

UFL Expansion

The United Football League plans to establish three further expansion teams and kickoff the 2011 season as an eight-team league. On June 21, 2010, the UFL board announced that the Hampton Roads region of Virginia is to host the league's sixth team.

UFL Commissioner Michael Huyghue said of the plans: "Like Omaha, which came on board as an expansion team in April and generated considerable excitement, this area of Virginia fits the ideal UFL model of having a passionate fan base that we believe deserves a professional football team."

Virginia native Ed Reynolds will serve as team President and will oversee operations on a day-to-day basis. Reynolds has been an integral figure at the heart of the UFL as Vice President, Administration & Special Assistant to the Commissioner since the league's inception.

"Any time you have a chance to take advantage of coming back to your home state is an opportunity to relish and look forward to," said Reynolds. "It is an exciting opportunity to create synergy and establish a great product like the United Football League in a market that is dynamic and ready for professional football."

In establishing a team management structure, Reynolds has brought UFL Senior Director of Strategic Planning Nick Rudd and Virginia-based public relations consultant John Castleberry on board with the Virginia expansion team.

Rudd is responsible for leading the league's investor strategy, which encompasses expansion and investment-related initiatives, and will manage the day-to-day strategic development of the Virginia team. He has worked alongside UFL Commissioner Michael Huyghue and COO Bill Peterson to build out the investor base in Omaha, Virginia and other potential UFL markets. Rudd was an investment banker before joining the UFL in 2009, and graduated from Columbia University where he was an All Ivy football player.

Castleberry has spent more than 20 years working as an award-winning broadcast journalist. He brings an extensive knowledge of the Virginia market and contacts within the media industry to benefit the expansion team's pubic relations endeavors.

The Virginia team will face the Florida Tuskers, Hartford Colonials, Las Vegas Locos, Omaha Nighthawks, Sacramento Mountain Lions and two additional expansion teams when the third United Football League season kicks off in 2011.

Ed Reynolds

Prior to joining the UFL for the 2009 season as Vice President, Administration & Special Assistant to Commissioner, Reynolds worked for twelve seasons with the National Football League in football operations and security.



In football operations he developed, implemented and administered the On-field / Pro-Line policies for all 32 teams and was responsible for all associated violation fines for players, coaches and teams. Reynolds developed and implemented the College Relations programs and the NFL high school

coaches of the week programs in all 32 markets.

Reynolds began his playing career in the NFL as a free agent with the New England Patriots in 1983. He was named team MVP in 1989 and led the team in tackles for three seasons before spending two years with the New York Giants.

While playing in the NFL, Reynolds served in the Army Reserves as an infantry officer / weapons expert. During his fifteenyear military career, he oversaw every aspect of training for the units in the 80th Division. He handled all weapons gualifications, raising scores by 60%. He also assisted in the improvement in PT scores by 75%. He operated Range operations and handled unit security procedures.

Reynolds is a graduate of the University of Virginia, is married to Pamela Dudley and they have four outstanding sons: Ed, Joseph, Ethan and Jason.

Doug Williams

General Manager

Doug Williams was the first African-American quarterback to start and also win a Super Bowl when he produced a Most Valuable Player performance as the Washington Redskins defeated the Denver Broncos in Super Bowl XXII.

Williams enjoyed a stellar college career at Grambling and just five games into his freshman year became the starting guarterback. He led the Tigers to an 11-1 record and the first of three Southwestern Athletic Conference championships during his four seasons as a starter as the Tigers had a 35-5 record overall. In 1977, he led the nation in touchdown passes, 38, and passing yards, 3,286.

He was named All-America guarterback by the Associated Press and was fourth in the Heisman Trophy voting. Williams was named the Black College Player of the Year twice. His career totals were NCAA records in passing yards, 8,411, total offense yards, 8,354, and touchdown passes, 93.

Williams was selected in the first round (17th overall) of the 1978 NFL Draft by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, a franchise that had never advanced to the playoffs until Williams arrived. In three out of the next four seasons the Buccaneers made playoff appearances, and in 1979 they played in the NFC Championship game.

Williams joined the USFL and played with the Oklahoma Outlaws who later became the Arizona Outlaws for four seasons until the league disbanded in 1986. Williams returned to the NFL in 1986 and signed with the Washington Redskins and led his team to an opening day victory over the Philadelphia Eagles. In Super Bowl XXII as the Redskins routed the Denver Broncos 42-10, Williams completed 18 of 29 passes for 340 yards and four touchdown passes and was named Super Bowl MVP.

In 1997 Williams returned to Grambling as head football coach, succeeding the legendary Eddie Robinson. His team went 10-2 in 2000, 11-1 in 2001, and won the championship of the Southwestern Athletic Conference both years.

He rejoined the Buccaneers as a personnel executive and in 2009 was promoted to the director of professional scouting. He and his wife, Raunda, have six children: Ashley, Adrian, Doug, Jr., Jasmine, Laura and Temessia.

The two teams played in the UFL's first-ever overtime contest after Florida kicker Matt Bryant hit a 27-yard field goal with 2:10 left in regulation to tie the game at 17. In overtime, Las Vegas nickel back Isaiah Trufant intercepted Florida quarterback Brooks Bollinger, setting up Locos kicker Graham Gano's game-winning 33-yard field goal 1:43 into the extra period.

Following three quarters which saw relatively little scoring (Florida led 7-3), the action picked up in the fourth quarter. Just 2:03 in the fourth, Las Vegas running back DeDe Dorsey scored on a 38-yard run to give the Locos their first lead of the game at 10-7. Just 2:29 later, Bollinger found wide receiver Frank Murphy for a 10-yard score to put the Tuskers back on top at 14-10.

Dorsey scored his second touchdown of the game, a 1-yard run, with 5:58 left in regulation to make it a 17-14 Las Vegas lead, setting up Bryant's game-tying field goal.

UNITED FOOTBALL LEAGUE MEDIA GUIDELINES



PRESS BOX

General information:

United Football League press boxes are for working media, technical staff and UFL staff only.

The Press Box area is a neutral zone; both home and visiting team management, personnel and media will refrain from bipartisan comments or cheering. Media must not wear team apparel in the press box. Violators may be asked to leave the Press Box area and/or have their credential privileges suspended and/or revoked.

Media will be seated in the press box at the discretion of the home PR representative. Media may be required to occupy auxiliary seating within the stadium seating area.

Media must supply their own computers and communication devices.

High-speed wireless Internet access will be available for media in the press box and, when possible, for photographers elsewhere in the stadium.

The Home and Visiting PR staff will be present on game day to accommodate the working media before, during and after games, and will offer necessary assistance.

The Press Box will be open and available to media two (2) hours before kickoff and will remain open until the last working media has left.

If the Press Box has television monitors that show the game feed, they will be in operation during the game.

Media will be provided with game statistics and relevant information.

The Press Box Announcer will announce all pertinent game information for the media via information broadcast in the Press Box only.

Post-game Procedure

Team PR staff will facilitate a media walk-down prior to a media locker access period with two minutes remaining in all games. Media will not have access to the field during play and must proceed directly to a designated holding area in advance of the open locker room period, or to the post-game press conference area.

Team locker rooms will be opened to the media 10 minutes after each game following a traditional cooling down period.

Still photography in the locker room is prohibited and media may be prevented from entering the locker room if carrying still cameras.

TV broadcast cameras are permitted in team locker rooms, but media are reminded to respect player privacy.

Cell phone and PDA use by members of the media is prohibited in the locker room, for calls, texting, emailing, and taking photographs or video.

Media must not request autographs in the locker room.

The respective team training rooms and officials locker room are strictly off limits to all members of the media.

Failure to comply with these policies may result in the immediate removal of media credentials and withdrawal of future credentials.

POST-GAME CONFERENCE

Home and visiting PR staff will bring their own head coach and one player per team to a post-game press conference approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the game.

The visiting team coach will have the option of holding the first post-game press conference.

Players attending the press conference will have played a significant role in the outcome of the game and will be selected at the PR director's discretion. Media may request a specific player, but the team is under no obligation to meet this request.

The team PR directors will dictate the length of the press conference.

Game officials will not be available at press conferences.

Questions regarding officiating must be directed to league PR staff, who may not be on site.

SIDELINE Access

Credentialed photographers and television crews will be required to wear a UFL-provided photo vest while on the sidelines.

Sideline access for UFL games is limited to photographers on assignment for recognized news and sports organizations and approved TV news crews.

Only authorized media and game personnel will be admitted to the sidelines.

Photographers must observe the direction of stadium and team officials and remain away from the field of play at all times.

Photographers must remain clear of the team bench areas.

Sideline and pregame and halftime locker room interviews are available only to UFL broadcast partners VERSUS, HDNet and NESN. All other media are prohibited from conducting sideline interviews or entering the locker rooms pregame or at halftime.

Television crews are allowed to access the field during the game to record footage for postgame broadcast only and must observe the direction of stadium and team officials and remain away from the field of play at all times.

Television crews must remain clear of the team bench areas and must not obstruct filming by official UFL broadcasters.

Post game, television crews may access the sideline for the purpose of stand up interviews only after every member of the respective teams' playing and coaching staff has left the field of play.

GAME BROADCASTING & INTERVIEWS

Television crews are permitted to record game footage for future broadcast at the discretion of the home public relations director.

Live broadcasting from within the stadium is not permitted on game day. Requests for team or player footage should be sent to Peter Lasser (video.request@ufl-football.com).

Programming requests and questions should be sent to Michael Trager (tragergroup@aol.com).

Broadcasters will receive details of a game satellite feed that will be made available to allow broadcasters to air up to two minutes of postgame highlights with proper credit.

Additionally, media outlets may post up to two minutes of game video highlights, which can be obtained via the VERSUS, HDNet or NESN broadcasts with proper credit.

UNITED FOOTBALL LEAGUE MEDIA GUIDELINES

All online footage should link back to UFL-Football.com and can only be used in editorial form and must not be used in a commercial manner.

The United Football League reserves the right to record all media interviews and utilize either the transcript of an audio file for its own use, only after any portion of that interview has appeared in print, broadcast, webcast and/or internet form.

Stock UFL photos are available upon request from each team PR Director.
