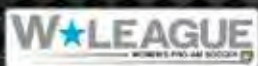

When USL launched its outdoor program in 1989, there were only 19 professional soccer teams in the country and no organized lower divisions for the sport. That eight-team USL outdoor league has grown into the 65-team Premier Development League while USL has developed into one of the most sophisticated sports organizations in the U.S. and Canada. Today, USL oversees the development of players, coaches, referees and administrators that participate in six different leagues that encompass more than 100 men's and women's franchises and more than 500 youth teams.

Always a pioneer in the sport, USL officially launched the W-League in 1995 – long before women's professional soccer was born – after a successful trial run during the summer of '94. The elite women's league featured U.S. National Team players as well as some of the top collegiate players in the country.

The rate of W-League expansion and the desire among many owners to take their teams to new heights led to the creation of the W-1 and W-2 leagues beginning in 1998. W-1 consisted of many of the league's clubs that were successful on and off the field with W-2 featuring new and rising franchises.

In 1999 the Raleigh Wings became the first W-League team to repeat as champions when they battled back from two goals down to sneak past the previously undefeated Chicago Cobras in a shootout. The victory capped a 13-1 regular season and gave the Wings an all-time record, including postseason games, of 32-1 in their brief two-year history.

The storylines spilled into the offseason with the 2001 launch of the professional Women's United Soccer Association, which drafted 66 W-League players in the inaugural draft and 11 more in its supplemental draft.

The 2001 season was a landmark year for the W-League, despite the advent of the Women's United Soccer Association. Although a large number of players moved on to WUSA, a new crop of equally talented ladies joined the fray. Two defending champions took to the field in 2002 as the W-League saw its W-1 and W-2 divisions unify to form a single league once again.

The Canadian Women's National Team took a giant leap forward with its stunning run at the 2003 FIFA Women's World Cup, and leading the way were 16 players with W-League experience on the roster of 20, including 11 who played with the three Canadian franchises in 2003. Ottawa Fury goalkeeper Taryn Swiatek grabbed the starting spot in the second game and never let go, posting one brilliant performance after another as Canada reached the semis.

Three of Canada's four goal scorers were W-League alumni as USL Hall of Famer Charmaine Hooper tallied twice, Vancouver Whitecaps 16-year-old phenom Kara Lang also found the back of the net twice and former Whitecap Christine Sinclair finished tied for the team lead with three goals. Three consecutive one-loss seasons came to disappointing ends for the Vancouver Whitecaps leading into 2004. The Whitecaps responded by refusing to lose at all in 2004, running the table with an unbeaten 13-0-1 record en route to the playoffs and the W-League Championship, becoming the first Canadian team to win a W-League title and the first to win a senior league championship since the Montreal Impact won the A-League in 1994.

In 2006, Super-20 Women was launched as the premier U-20 adult-amateur women's league in North America, providing the necessary platform for top 17- to 20-year-olds in the United States and Canada to compete at an elite level. In 2013 the league was rebranded as W-20 and restructured to also serve as a reserve system for professional and senior adult-amateur women's teams.

In 2009 the United States saw the second incarnation of professional women's soccer in Women's Professional Soccer (WPS) form. After three thrilling yet tumultuous seasons, WPS shut its doors following the completion of the 2012 Olympic Qualifiers.

Entering 2013 North America saw the third professional women's soccer league launched, the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL), and with the management of U.S. Soccer NWSL will be the home to U.S., Canadian, Mexican and other national team stars. Fittingly, the W-League and W-20 continue to offer superior competition and be the development ground for the next professional soccer players throughout North America.

The dedication USL has shown to the women's game through the W-League has paid off for not only the U.S. and Canadian Women's National Teams, but also for players from other countries. At the 2011 Women's World Cup in Germany, 62 former W-League players took to the field, including the United States' Abby Wambach, Christie Rampone and Alex Morgan, Canada's Christine Sinclair and Japan's Homare Sawa, who was named the FIFA Women's World Player of the Year after leading her nation to victory. Additionally, the 2012 London Olympics saw 33 current and former W-League players earn medals. In January of 2013 the NWSL Draft featured 17 former W-League players, including No. 1 selection Zakiya Bywaters of the LA Strikers.

## EXPANDING INTERNATIONAL HORIZONS

USL has long been a leader when it comes to international influence of players, clubs, and executives in North America. Given the organization's unique landscape of clubs from the youth to professional ranks, USL provides many opportunities for foreign clubs to develop affiliations and partnerships with its franchises.

Identifying talented players and creating new commercial opportunities is a priority for clubs around the world, and USL provides clubs the best platform to connect these opportunities with clubs that desire to have a presence in North America.

In 2008, USL embarked on an international development initiative to connect USL clubs with foreign counterparts. As part of this initiative, USL partnered with Beswicks Sports, the specialist sports division of the United Kingdom-based legal group Beswicks. As USL's representative in the UK to broker partnerships between British football clubs and USL franchises, Beswicks Sports has been able to open up new avenues for clubs from across the Atlantic to make new professional partnerships.

The partnership with Beswicks Sports paid immediate dividends for USL, formalizing affiliations with English clubs such as Burnley and Stoke City FC. In addition, Beswicks was integral to the hiring of former West Ham United player Anthony Hudson when he took the coaching reins at Real Maryland FC of the USL Second Division for the 2009 season.



More recently, Beswicks helped broker the deal that led to UK-based VisionPro Sports Institute's 2011 partnership with USL, resulting in plans for a boys academy and the announcement of new teams in USL PRO, the PDL, the W-League and the Super-20 League.

"Forming strategic partnerships with European professional clubs is something we recognize is vital to our growth in the future, at the league and club level," USL Senior Director of International Development Francisco Marcos said.

"The interest levels in USL and its various leagues have never been higher throughout Europe," said Gary Mellor, partner at Beswicks. "European clubs recognize that USL provides them with unequalled access to North American young talent as well as the opportunity to forge strategic partnerships and the commercial opportunities that follow."

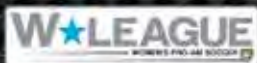
## NUROCK SOCCER HOLDINGS

## **ALEC PAPADAKIS – CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER**

As Chief Executive Officer of USL, Papadakis serves as USL's top executive as well as a managing owner. Also the Chief Executive Officer and Managing Partner of NuRock Soccer Holdings, Papadakis has 35 years of domestic and international experience as a franchise attorney.

As a player in the North American Soccer League for the Atlanta Chiefs and the Boston Minutemen, Papadakis had a long, successful career in the United States at the collegiate and professional level, earning numerous accolades. He played in Atlanta for three seasons, the first two with the Chiefs and the third with the Apollos, appearing in 39 games. He finished his career with the Boston Minutemen in 1974. His teams captured conference regular season championships in 1971 and 1974.

Papadakis attended Hartwick College (New York) where he was a three-time First Team All-American. He received his law degree in 1976 at the University of Akron, where he also served as an assistant soccer coach.



## **TIM HOLT – PRESIDENT**

Tim Holt joined USL in 1999 originally serving as the A-League & Super Y-League Operations Director. He added the responsibilities of overseeing the operations of all USL senior leagues in 2002 and was named Vice President in 2004. Holt became President following the acquisition of USL by NuRock Soccer Holdings in 2009.

Holt's numerous responsibilities include the day-to-day management of USL business operations, developing and implementing the strategic plan for all USL leagues, the supervision of compliance with league regulations and policies, franchise relations, personnel management and regular communication with the leadership of the US, Canada, Bermuda and Antigua & Barbuda Federations. During his period of leadership with USL, the organization has become the largest system of elite soccer leagues in North America.



Holt served on the US Soccer Federation (USSF) Board of Directors from 2003-06, and is currently Co-Chairman of the Lamar Hunt US Open Cup Committee. Holt also serves USSF as a member of its Professional Council and has been a member of its Credentials and Open Cup Disciplinary Committees. From 2005-09, he was the Men's Professional Representative on the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Board of Directors. In 2006, Holt was named one of Soccer America's 'Rising Stars,' recognizing the top American soccer executives under the age of 35, and has an extensive network of relationships at all levels of American soccer.

A native of suburban Philadelphia and product of the respected FC DELCO youth club in eastern Pennsylvania, Holt is a member of the Radnor (PA) High School Soccer Hall of Fame and still ranks amongst the school's all-time top leading scorers. Holt graduated from Penn State University with a BS in Management and went on to earn his Masters Degree in Sport Administration at Florida State University.

## AMANDA DUFFY – SENIOR DIRECTOR, W-LEAGUE & W-20

Duffy took over as senior director of the W-League in September of 2010 after three seasons managing the operations of USL Second Division while also overseeing the operations of USL First Division in 2008. The former W-League player helped guide the Hampton Roads Piranhas to their only league championship as well as 21-game undefeated and 23-game unbeaten streaks. She also played with the Raleigh Wings and Central Florida Krush, and amassed an overall 51-7-3 W-League. Duffy also spent time with the Carolina Courage of WUSA before ending her playing career after one season with Danmarks IF in Sweden. An East Carolina University graduate, Duffy concluded her college career as the leader in career goals and single-season goals as well as career points, and received honors from NSCAA, Soccerbuzz and Conference USA before serving as a graduate assistant coach for the program and earning her Masters Degree in Sports Management. In 2012 she became the first women's soccer player inducted into the ECU Athletics Hall of Fame.



## TEAM SERVICES STAFF

### CASEY ARMSTRONG – DIRECTOR, CREATIVE SERVICES

Armstrong joined USL in March, 2010 after three years as a creative designer for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers. She manages and designs USL print and graphics projects while working with team marketing and communications representatives to provide enhanced support and guidance for all team creative projects. She has also developed style guides and templates for team use in operations, marketing and communications, and assists expansion franchises in brand creation. Prior to joining the Buccaneers Armstrong served as senior graphic designer for Westgate Resorts. A graduate of the University of Central Florida (Graphic Design), Armstrong founded Jet Set Designs in 2003.



### ELIZABETH EASTMAN – PLAYER REGISTRAR & AGM COORDINATOR

A graduate of Sacred Heart University's John F. Welch College of Business (Fairfield, CT), Eastman joined the USL staff in 2011. She earned a Bachelor of Science in both Sport Management and Business Administration at Sacred Heart, and was a John F. Welch Scholar, Gold Medal recipient in Sport Management, and a member of the NCAA Division I women's soccer team and women's softball team. Eastman previously worked with the American Hockey League's Bridgeport Sound Tigers, the U.S. Soccer Federation's Referee Program, and Sacred Heart University's Athletics Department.



### BRAD FREEMAN – CONTROLLER

Freeman joined USL as controller in 2011 and oversees all accounting, human resources and IT functions for the organization. After graduating from Florida State University, Freeman joined Vestal & Wiler in Orlando then later Deloitte & Touche in Tampa where he serviced clients in the manufacturing, real estate development, utilities, hospitality, and insurance industries. Freeman later became the Florida Controller for Anthony & Sylvan Pools, a national manufacturer of pools.





## CHRIS KEENEY – REGIONAL REPRESENTATIVE, SOUTHWEST

Respected soccer executive Chris Keeney was named USL's Southwest Regional Representative in May, 2012. Keeney is Founder and CEO of A3 Sports Consulting, which serves as a USL-endorsed team services agency. In his role with USL, Keeney works and collaborates with local and regional soccer organizations and businesses to support, promote and grow the USL pyramid of development at all levels through grassroots efforts. Currently managing partner of FC Tucson of the USL PDL, Keeney is a 17-year veteran of professional sports having previously worked for the Columbus Crew, Real Salt Lake and D.C. United of the MLS and the NFL's Houston Texans. Keeney received his MS in Marketing from Florida State University in 1992 and an MBA from George Mason University in 1996.



## PETER MELLOR – NATIONAL TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

A former professional goalkeeper and longtime member of the U.S. National Team coaching staff, Mellor became USL's first national technical director in February of 2010. A staff coach with the United States Soccer Federation since 1992, Mellor manages the technical aspects of USL's player development programs and assists USL teams in scouting, development and advancement of players. A professional goalkeeper for two decades, Mellor played 17 years in the top three tiers of English professional soccer with Manchester City, Burnley, Fulham, Hereford United and Portsmouth, as well as a stint playing in the NASL in 1981 for the Edmonton Drillers. He also served as the England U-23 National Team goalkeeper from 1969-70. Mellor also played for Fulham against West Ham in the prestigious 1975 FA Cup Final at Wembley stadium in London England.



Mellor's acclaim in the USA, however, is for his coaching. He joined the U.S. National Team staff in 1992 and became one of the foremost goalkeeping instructors in the United States. He has worked with every level of the US Men's National Team program and was an assistant and goalkeeping coach with the U17 residency program from 1999-2003, and was an assistant coach for the 2000 USA Men's Olympic Team which finished fourth in Australia. In 2003 Mellor then moved on to an assistant coach position with Real Salt Lake (MLS).

## NICHOLAS MURRAY – COORDINATOR, COMMUNICATIONS

Murray joined USL in 2010 from The Tampa Tribune, where he spent eight years as both a freelance sports reporter and staff member. While there he served as the beat writer for the USSF Division 2-Pro League while also being the lead writer for prep soccer and an assistant editor. Murray has covered multiple Florida high school championship games, SYL North American Finals and Disney Soccer Showcases. He also covered the 2009 NCAA Division II Men's and Women's Final Four. Murray has contributed to ESPN HS, and had his work has appeared in the Newark Star-Ledger, the Daytona Beach News-Journal, the Austin American-Statesman, the Miami Herald, the Fort Lauderdale Sun-Sentinel and the Manchester Evening News (England).



## NICK PAPADAKIS – DIRECTOR OF COMMERCIAL SERVICES

Papadakis joined USL in 2012 and is manages all purchasing of equipment and merchandise at USL events. He is also responsible for managing, negotiating and arranging housing for all teams and guests attending USL events. Papadakis graduated from Hartwick College in Oneonta, New York where he excelled in soccer, was twice named an All American and was inducted into the school's soccer hall of fame. He is also a member of the Winnipeg, Canada sports Hall of Fame. After college Papadakis played seven years professionally with the Atlanta Chiefs and also played for the Canadian National Team. In 1976 he opened a soccer retail store in Atlanta, Georgia and by 1985 the company had grown to one of the largest soccer retail outlets in the country with 33 company and franchise stores.



## JAY PREBLE - DIRECTOR, COMMUNICATIONS

Preble joined USL as director of communications in 2010 after 13 years in a similar role with the Tampa Bay Lightning of the National Hockey League. He oversees the development of strategic communications plans for all USL leagues and teams as well as USL's team services plan to increase media relations efforts. He also serves as USL's main contact for national and international media. A 1992 graduate of the University of South Florida (Mass Communications/Public Relations), the South Florida native also previously worked as a sports writer for The Tampa Tribune and The Associated Press. He is a board member for Countryside High School Girls Soccer, and serves as a volunteer PR representative for Chargers SC in Clearwater, Fla.



## STEVEN SHORT - DIRECTOR, LEAGUE GROWTH & PARTNERSHIPS

Short joined USL in 2010 and is focused on driving USL's expansion into current and new markets. In addition to league growth, Short is also responsible for effectively partnering with external businesses in order to promote USL. A native of Louisville, Kentucky, Short previously served as a marketing assistant with multiple organizations including the University of Tennessee Athletic Department and Electronic Arts, and served as an event management intern with Disney Sports Attractions. He is a graduate of the University of Tennessee where he earned a Master of Science in Sport Management ('05) and a Bachelor of Science in Communications and Public Relations ('03).



## DAVID WAGNER - LEGAL COUNSEL & PRO LEAGUES OPERATIONS DIRECTOR

## ABOUT THE U.S. SOCCER FEDERATION

As the governing body of soccer in all its forms in the United States, U.S. Soccer has played an integral part in charting the course for the sport in the USA for 100 years. In that time, the Federation's mission statement has been clear and simple: to make soccer, in all its forms, a preeminent sport in the United States and to continue the development of soccer at all recreational and competitive levels.

U.S. Soccer is celebrating its Centennial in 2013, and over the course of a century the sport's exponential growth has been nothing short of remarkable.

From a viewership standpoint, nearly 20 million Americans watched the Round of 16 match at the 2010 FIFA World Cup on television. Soccer-specific stadiums have opened their doors to resounding success. The National Training Center in Carson, Calif., in its 10th year of existence, has been a valuable facility for all levels, including the U.S. Soccer Development Academy, which kicked off at the state-of-the-art complex with much fanfare in 2007.

In 1989, the U.S. Men's National Team had not played in a World Cup in 40 years and the U.S. Women's program was in its early stages. U.S. Soccer was playing games in small stadiums that did not reach capacity, few matches were televised, soccer-specific stadiums were yet to be created and there were no high-level professional outdoor leagues.

Since that time, the state of U.S. Soccer has evolved significantly. Entering 2013, the U.S. MNT played in six consecutive FIFA World Cups and advanced to the quarterfinals at the 2002 event. U.S. Soccer is a world leader in women's soccer at every level, and the U.S. WNT has won two FIFA Women's World Cups and four Olympic Gold Medals – an accomplishment that no other country on the men's and women's side has reached in Olympic competition. The United States has also hosted three World Cups with the support of its members and strong organizational abilities.

Professionally, Major League Soccer continues to grow in popularity and prestige with 19 teams throughout North America, as well as increasing attendance and viewership. Also of significant importance, MLS features 14 clubs competing in 13 soccer-specific stadiums. On the women's side, the U.S. Soccer Federation is administering the launch of the National Women's Soccer League in 2013. U.S. Soccer is subsidizing the salaries of up to 24 U.S. WNT players while the Canadian Soccer Association and Federation of Mexican Football are doing the same for up to 16 players.

From a coaching standpoint in the United States, more classes are continually being offered around the country, and the number of licensed, well-educated trainers and managers is larger than ever. The education level among coaches has been tailored to match the expanding pool of talent in the U.S.

U.S. Soccer continues to set positive trends for referees in CONCACAF, with reinvigorated focus on education and training, including the realm of professional referees. In 2012, U.S. Soccer and MLS created the Professional Referee Organization (PRO) to manage the referee program in professional soccer leagues in the U.S. and Canada. The creation of PRO has been designed to increase the quality of officiating in U.S. and Canadian professional leagues, develop more professional quality officials at a younger age and develop officials who will represent the United States and Canada in FIFA competitions.

Participation in soccer continues at high levels among both youth and adults, with more than 4.3 million registered players among the 24 million participants in the sport, according to the FIFA Big Count.

## OTTAWA CAPTURES FIRST W-LEAGUE TITLE

The Ottawa Fury gave up a second-minute goal and then spent all of 88 minutes searching for the equalizer in the 2012 W-League Championship.

They found it at the death. Ashley Seal pounced on the rebound as Pali Blues goalkeeper Anna Maria Picarelli could only parry away Katrina-Lee Gorry's free kick, and Seal made no mistake from close range, tying the game at 1-1 moments before the final whistle. After overtime, Ottawa goalkeeper Jasmine Phillips made two diving saves during the penalty kicks to lift the Fury to their first W-League title.

The W-League Championship kicked off on a sunny Sunday afternoon at Algonquin College Soccer Complex and it didn't take long for Pali to edge its way in front as Nikki Washington fired from long range to put the Blues up 1-0 in just the second minute of play. Washington was held out of action during Friday's semifinal and she made an immediate impact on Sunday afternoon. Sarah Huffman played Washington down the right side and she struck a brilliant shot from distance, beating Phillips and into the far netting.

The Blues came into the game searching for their third W-League title while the perennial power Fury were back in the championship game for the second consecutive season.

The Blues continued to press forward early, picking out 2012 Rookie of the Year Lynn Williams at every opportunity. Williams was a constant threat to the Fury back line in the first half with her size and speed despite recovering from a pulled hamstring. Less than 15 minutes into the first half and down a goal, Fury head coach Dom Oliveri brought on 2011 W-League MVP Mallory Outerbridge to boost the attack.

"We felt that we played ourself into the game," Oliveri said. "I think we were very, very nervous and it showed in the first 15 minutes. The message was keep going, keep going. We knew we could break them down if we kept playing. All credit to the players. They gave a great performance."

Ottawa settled nicely with the change and came close to knotting the game at 1-1 as Leni Kaurin played Outerbridge through but couldn't quite keep the ball from going beyond the touch line and the threat came to a halt.

Continuing to press forward, Outerbridge came close for the Fury in the 27th minute. Tina Romagnuolo found Outerbridge with a lovely weighted through-ball behind the Pali defense only to have Cammi Levin come across to break up the shot.

Seven minutes before the halftime whistle Outerbridge had the best chance for the Fury in the first half. Lisa-Marie Woods worked her way into the box and squared across frame past Picarelli to Outerbridge. With an open net in front of her, she couldn't redirect on frame and hit the post, leaving the Pali back line free to breathe a sigh of relief.

Two minutes into the second half Washington almost doubled the Blues' advantage. Elizabeth Eddy played across the box with the ball somehow finding its way

through to Washington on the opposite side. Firing low on frame the Ottawa defense cleared off the line to safety.

As in the first half, Pali came out on the front foot with the Fury weathering the storm to hit back with their own wave of pressure. Woods had the first chance as Kelly Conheeney laid it off to her just outside the box but the shot sailed over Picarelli's crossbar. Moments later, Outerbridge was again at the center of the action, chesting down Woods' cross only to volley over the goal.

Ottawa pushed forward at every opportunity yet couldn't create clear scoring opportunities as the Pali back line was organized and incisive. With the Fury committing so many players forward Pali found space in the counterattack and in the 81st minute Eddy found space in the box but neither Bogus nor Tangorra could get a touch and Phillips saved.

With moments remaining in regulation Woods stepped up to take the free kick just outside the box. Her shot fired past the wall and through to Picarelli who palmed away. Seal collected and fired home to knot the game at the death, sending the W-League Championship into extra time.

Riding the wave of momentum the Fury crashed forward in the first 15 minutes. Gorry almost put the Fury up in the 96th minute with a shot from 30 yards out rattling the crossbar. Pali held firm, though, and snuffed out the Fury attack taking the game to the short intermission. After the break Pali came out on the front foot with Andrews and Lytle both testing Phillips. After 120 minutes, however, the game remained 1-1 and headed to penalty kicks.

Fury youth product Jasmine Phillips made two diving saves and closed out the game 2-1 (4-3) as the Fury won their first W-League Championship in front of their home fans. It was the perfect ending to the script, which began 13 years ago for Fury owner John Pugh.

"It's been a long run," Pugh said. "This is the fourth time [in the championship game] and to do it in front of our own fans and to do it in the manner that we did where we had to come from behind after giving up the early goal... it's unbelievable. It's something this club has strived to do for 10 seasons and finally it's all come true."

"This just means a ton and so much for the club," Oliveri added. "We've had such a great program for so long. We've been in the finals four times and managed to win one. This is great for the club and John Pugh, who's given a great opportunity here to do so many things."

After coming so close for so long the Ottawa Fury have now etched their name in the history books in what was a thrilling finish to a fantastic 2012 W-League season.

## ABOUT W-20

Making its debut in 2013, the W-20 league is a rebranding of the premier North American under-20 women's league, previously known as the Super-20 Women. W-20 will align operationally with the W-League and will benefit from the established infrastructure of the first and longest standing women's league in North America, which emphasizes quality ownership, league standards and player development.

Amanda Duffy, senior director of the W-League, will serve in the same role for W-20, and the leagues will share an online home when a new website is unveiled prior to the kickoff of the 2013 seasons.

W-20 will be committed to providing a stabilized platform to aid competitive players from the youth level to the adult-amateur and professional levels. It will also provide a reliable competition structure for these higher level women's teams to utilize for young players requiring increased exposure and development opportunities.

W-20 will also help to maintain consistency in the soccer calendar by operating simultaneously with the W-League, allowing for player promotion opportunities for those ready to play at a higher level.

W-20 currently features six teams that serve as reserve teams for W-League clubs, including the Carolina Elite Cobras, the Dayton Dutch Lions, FASA (Fredericksburg Impact), the Ottawa Fury, the Toronto Lady Lynx and the Washington Spirit Academy (Washington Spirit Reserves). The Washington Spirit Reserves of the W-League serve in the same capacity for the Washington Spirit of the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL).

The 2013 W-20 season features 23 teams aligned in four regional divisions - North Atlantic, Midwest, New England and South Atlantic - playing 8-10 regular season matches from May through July, with a national championship set at IMG Academy in Bradenton, Fla.

The Northern Virginia Majestics will travel to face Reading United AC on Saturday, May 18 in the rebranded league's inaugural matchup. The Washington Spirit Academy, which reached the 2012 Women's Super-20 League final as the D.C. United Women, opens its season on June 8 when it hosts Keystone Athletic SC in another important North Atlantic Division matchup.

The regular season closes on Sunday, July 14 when the Carolina Elite Cobras host Southern Soccer Academy and Lake Norman SC travels to face Triangle FC.

# 2012 SUPER-20 WOMEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP

## RAPIDS TAKE 2012 WOMEN'S S20 TITLE

The Colorado Rapids advanced from Group A by scoring three goals per game, but managed to win the 2012 Super-20 League North American Finals championship with a 1-0 win against D.C. United Women at IMG Academy.

The Rocky Mountain Division club kept its second clean sheet of the tournament in defeating D.C. United, thanks in part to strong performances by tournament Most Valuable Player Karisa Price and Safe Hands Award-winner Hannah Clark, the top goalkeeper.

The early morning start did not seem to faze either side. The Rapids were on the front foot early on and D.C. United held well. In only the first minute, Price earned a corner. She then attempted a bicycle kick when the service came her way, but misfired and D.C. cleared.

United did not have many chances in the opening 20 minutes. Price drew a foul not far from the area in the 13th minute and was one of three players to be denied on a rebound by the D.C. United goalkeeper after she fumbled the attempted free kick.

Price was willing to shoot from just about anywhere, it seemed, and for good reason. Her four goals going into Sunday's game were tied for the tournament lead along with D.C. United's Stephanie Hamilton. Price's shot from distance in the 17th minute went just wide of the post, giving the 'keeper something to think about.

Price's next effort came in the 25th minute. She received a pass out wide on the right side of the field and cut inside to unleash a fierce shot that missed the top of the crossbar by less than a foot. In the 26th minute, Price and Anna Evans combined in the DC box with a neat passing play and Evans found the time to put a shot on net.

Despite the United goalkeeper getting a hand to it, the effort reached the back of the net and the Rapids had the desired lead.

It did not take long for the Mid Atlantic Division club to get their next opportunity. Jenna Shaddock sent a cross into the box after the restart that was bungled into the Colorado goalkeeper by her own defender. It was eventually cleared. Evans had a chance much like the one that led to her goal to extend her team's lead, but her shot from the top of the box missed the net.

The Rapids could not sit on their lead against a team that advanced out of Group B with all nine points from three games. Price pounced on a loose, bouncing ball 35 yards from goal and struck a menacing volley that dipped and was earmarked for the back of the net before the United goalkeeper jumped to push it over the crossbar.

DC United had the last opportunity of the half from a corner, but Colorado dealt with it and took the 1-0 lead into the locker room.

Lindsey Lane, wearing the number 10 shirt for DC United, attempted to get her side back into the contest in the 53rd minute with a shot from outside the box that narrowly missed the net. In the 58th minute, United defender Mónica Mendes stood over a free kick and assessed her options. Instead of playing a ball into the box for one of her teammates, she took the opportunity to shoot. Unfortunately, her shot was not on goal, but it did graze the top of the net.

The Finals MVP was everywhere on Sunday, much like her performances in group play. Price ran down every loose ball in the attacking third and used her skill to keep possession when closed down by multiple opponents. In one instance, she flicked the ball over her head and ran around her defender at midfield. The play did not lead to a scoring opportunity, but it showed the little things that she could do on the field.

"I've been watching her all week," USL National Technical Director Peter Mellor said. "I expected her to fall over when the whistle blew at the end of the game, but here she is dancing around."

DC United failed to create any concrete openings in the final quarter of an hour, and the Rapids held on for the win and the championship.

"We've got a lot of character and spirit and never quit," Colorado Rapids Coach Daniel Clitnovici said of his team after the game. "We knew it wasn't going to be an easy game. They're a tough team with a big club and you're always going to expect quality."

"[Karisa Price is] a fantastic player. She's got a lot of heart and she's exactly the type of player that's going to be successful."

After the game, both teams were awarded their medals and the Rapids were given their championship trophy. Price and Clark were given their respective awards, as well, and D.C.'s Hamilton was awarded the Golden Boot Award as top scorer in the Finals. Her hat trick and one assist against TSF Academy on Saturday brought her total to four goals and two assists.

# RULES

## AFFILIATIONS

USL is directly affiliated with the United States Soccer Federation (USSF), United States Adult Soccer Association (USASA), the Canadian Soccer Association (CSA), the Antigua & Barbuda Football Association (ABFA) and the Bermudan Football Association (BFA).

## ROSTERS

W-League rosters may consist of a maximum of 26 players, with 18 designated for each game. The

W-League are permitted a maximum of eight (8) foreign players on rosters.

## ROSTER FREEZE

Each USL senior league has a Roster Freeze Date after which no team may register any new players. For 2013, the W-League date is July 10.

## TRANSFER WINDOWS

From the 2011 season and until further notice, FIFA will not register player transfers that take place outside of the following transfer windows:

- January 15 through April 15 (primary window)
- July 15 through August 14 (secondary window)

## AMATEUR PLAYER DEFINITION

An amateur player is defined by the following: A player who does not receive payment for playing soccer and who has signed an amateur registration form with U.S. Soccer or Canadian Soccer Association. Amateur players may be reimbursed for certain expenses as allowed by USSF/CSA/NCAA rules.

## POINT SYSTEM

The standard FIFA (3-1-0) system awards three points for a regulation or overtime victory. In the case of a tie, each team will be awarded one point.

## GAME CLOCK

All games are comprised of 90 minutes

(two 45-minute halves). No overtime is utilized.

## LAWS OF THE GAME

USL adheres to all the Laws of the Game as dictated by FIFA, soccer's international governing body.

## SUBSTITUTIONS

Six (6) will be allowed in the W-League with no re-entry.

## STANDINGS TIEBREAKERS

The breaking of ties in the final league standings, playoffs and finals is accomplished by applying the following criteria, listed in order of importance: The following two guidelines will be followed during the implementation of USL tiebreakers for all ties involving three or more teams:

- 1) The tiebreaker will determine the winner first.
- 2) The tiebreaker will continue to be followed in order to determine the ranking of the remaining teams without restarting from the beginning.
  - 1) Head-to-head record based on total points in league games
  - 2) Total wins in league games
  - 3) Goal difference in league games
  - 4) Goals scored in league games
  - 5) Total points within smallest grouping. If number of games is unequal, then point percentage will be used.
  - 6) Ranking based on points earned against top four group finishers. This tiebreaker will not be used if four or fewer teams comprise the group. If number of games is unequal, then point percentage applies.
  - 7) Point percentage outside/smallest division or conference in League games
  - 8) Total points in all regular season and Open Cup Qualifying games combined. If number of games is unequal, then point percentage applies
  - 9) FIFA Fair Play – Team with fewest disciplinary points in League games. (If number of games is unequal, points will be divided by games played to arrive at a common basis for comparison.)

10) Lottery conducted by USL at league office Point Percentage: number of total points earned / maximum possible points (3 per game)

*\* Should more than two teams involved have played each other an UNEQUAL number of times, this tiebreaker will be skipped.*

*\* Group: term used to describe the primary unit in which a team competes (i.e. PDL – Southwest Division)*

*\* Point Percentage: number of total points earned / maximum possible points (3 per game)*

## SCHEDULES

Each team plays 10-12 games during the regular season.

## PLAYOFFS

The 2013 W-League season will see 10 teams advance to the postseason with one champion advancing from each conference to the 2013 W-League Championship presented by Nike. The three conference champions will

meet July 26-28 in a 'final four' format championship, which will also include a yet-to-be-determined host team. The semifinals will be played on Friday, July 26 with the winners meeting for the 2013 W-League Championship on Sunday, July 28.

- Central Conference Playoffs: The top three seeds from the Central Conference will advance to the Central Conference Championship.

- Eastern Conference Playoffs: The top two seeds from each division advance to the Eastern Conference Championship.

- Western Conference Playoffs: The top two teams meet in a conference championship match.

## SINGLE PLAYOFF MATCHES

During postseason play, single games tied after regulation will be followed by two 15-minute overtime periods played in their entirety. If still tied, FIFA kicks from the penalty mark are used to determine the winner.





# USL HALL OF FAME

## TEN SELECTED FOR USL HALL OF FAME

### THREE CLUBS ALSO HONORED

Ten men and women who have proven to be highly influential in North American soccer were chosen for induction into the USL Men's, Women's and MISL Hall of Fame wings in 2012. These individuals were recognized for helping to make USL and the MISL a success through the years because of their tremendous efforts and personal sacrifices made on behalf of the sport of soccer in North America. Additionally, three USL clubs were honored as 10+ Clubs after having completed 10 years in the PDL.

Honorees were chosen through a vote of current Hall of Fame members, USL teams and the USL Hall of Fame Committee.

## 2012 USL MEN'S HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

### Builder – Bill Rudisill, Wilmington Hammerheads

Rudisill oversaw some of the greatest successes in the Hammerheads' history as the club's owner, with Wilmington winning the USL Second Division championship in 2003, a year that also saw it reach the quarterfinals of the U.S. Open Cup. After the Hammerheads went on hiatus in 2010, he then returned to lead the club into USL PRO in 2011, which saw the Hammerheads average more than 4,000 fans a game, continuing his outstanding commitment to soccer in the Wilmington area. The success continued in 2012 as the Hammerheads reached the USL PRO Championship, falling against the Charleston Battery.



### Coach – Laurie Calloway, Des Moines Menace, Syracuse Salty Dogs, Rochester Rhinos

Calloway, the all-time wins leader for the Des Moines Menace, found success as a manager in USL at both the professional and PDL levels. The PDL Coach of the Year in 2002 when he led the Menace to an undefeated regular season, Calloway won an APSL title with San Francisco Bay in 1991 and also took the USL First Division's Syracuse Salty Dogs and Rochester Rhinos to the verge of championships in his time in the professional ranks. He spent 1996-97 in MLS as coach of the San Jose Clash.



### Player – Dustin Swinehart, Charlotte Eagles, Hampton Roads Mariners, Indiana Blast

One of the most enduring players in USL's professional divisions, Swinehart joined the Charlotte Eagles in 1998 after a season each with the Hampton Roads Mariners (1996) and the Indiana Blast (1997), and remained in Charlotte for 12 seasons, calling it quits in 2009. With the exception of two brief loans to the Richmond Kickers, Swinehart spent his entire professional career with the Eagles, tallying 125 career goals in 228 appearances. The Eagles reached the playoffs in all but one of Swinehart's seasons, capturing USL Second Division titles in 2000 and 2005 and reaching the final on four other occasions. Swinehart was named the MVP of the 2000 championship game, and in 2001, after the Eagles moved up to the USL First Division, he was named to the All-League First Team. He was named to the USL-2 All-League First Team in 2005, 2006 and 2008, and in 2008 he was also named the USL-2 MVP.







# USL HALL OF FAME

## 2012 USL WOMEN'S HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

### **Builder – John Pugh, Ottawa Fury**

In July 2002, Pugh acquired the Ottawa Fury Soccer Club and transformed a single W-League franchise into a club that boasts W-League, PDL, Super Y-League and academy teams along with several grassroots programs. Since Pugh took over the Fury, the W-League team has captured nine consecutive division titles, five conference championships and has made seven Final Four appearances with four trips to the Championship Game. The club captured its first championship at home in 2012. Internationally, more than 50 Fury players have been capped by their respective countries. In 2010, the Fury U17 Girls captured the Super Y-League North American Championship, highlighting the success of the Club's Youth Academy which has seen more than 85 players earn NCAA scholarships. Pugh is currently a member of the USL W-League Executive Committee, the OSA Technical Committee and was a member of the Site Organizing Committee for the Ottawa portion of the 2007 FIFA U20 World Cup.



### **Coach – Nino DePasquali, New York Magic**

The man behind the bench for all 16 of the Magic's W-League seasons, DePasquali has led the club to the conference quarterfinals in 2002 and 2003 and the final four in 1998, and 1999. The Magic were division champions in 1998. A native of Roma, Italy, his professional career spanned more than 15 years having played for Roma and Brescia in Italy, Cologne in Germany, San Gallo in Switzerland and Real Betis in Spain. In 2005, he was inducted into the Hall of Fame for the Eastern New York State Amateur Soccer Association.



### **Coach – Charlie Naimo, Pali Blues, Central Jersey, Jersey Sky Blue, New Brunswick, NJ Wildcats**

Head coach of the Pali Blues, Naimo directed his squad to yet another title game in 2012, falling against Ottawa in the final. Naimo spearheaded the Blues to a cumulative 21-0-3 record in 2008 and 2009, capturing a pair of titles in the club's first two years without experiencing defeat. Naimo spent the 2007 season coaching Jersey Sky Blue of the W-League with the team finishing 12-2 in the regular season before falling to the Ottawa Fury in the conference semifinal. Naimo first put on the head coaching hat in 1998 with the New Jersey Splash, receiving W-League Coach of the Year accolades in 1999. After a stop with the New Brunswick Power, he took over a struggling New Jersey Wildcats club and orchestrated an entire reconstruction of the organization. In his three seasons with the team, Naimo compiled a 41-1 regular season record, leading the club to regular season titles in 2004 and 2006 while winning the W-League championship in 2005. In 2005 the Wildcats were named the USL Franchise of the Year, and Naimo won the W-League Coach of the Year award in 2006.



## 2012 MISL HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

### **Builder - Earl Foreman**

The driving force behind the creation of the MISL in 1977, Foreman served as the league's commissioner from 1978-85 and again from 1989-92. Along with Ed Tepper, Foreman introduced a league that featured six teams that played a 24-game schedule from December, 1978 to March of the following year. Under Foreman's leadership the MISL blossomed into a 14-team league averaging 9,000 a game with nationally televised games on ESPN and CBS.





## USL HALL OF FAME

### **Coach - Ron Newman, San Diego Sockers**

A member of the National Soccer Hall of Fame, Newman led the Sockers to eight MISL titles in nine years, posting a career regular season record of 286-158. His teams only lost one playoff series in nine years and carried an 80-37 playoff record. Newman won the 1987-88 MISL Coach of the Year award, and is credited with revolutionizing how the game was played.



### **Player - Hector Marinaro, Cleveland Crunch, Cleveland Force, Los Angeles Lazars, Minnesota Strikers**

Marinaro began his MISL career as a sparingly used defender for the Cleveland Force in 1983, and after brief stops with the Minnesota Strikers and Los Angeles Lazars, he became one of the MISL's great scoring stars upon his return to Cleveland in 1989. With the Crunch (renamed the Force in 2002), Marinaro tallied an amazing 1,099 goals in 533 games from 1989-2004. He led the MISL in scoring during the 1987-88 and 1991-92 seasons.



### **Player - Slavisa "Steve" Zungul, New York Arrows, San Diego Sockers, Golden Bay Earthquakes, Tacoma Stars**

The owner of nearly every MISL record thanks to a memorable 11-year career, Zungul, known as "The Lord of All Indoors," scored 652 goals and added 471 assists for a total of 1,123 points in 423 games. He added another 189 points in 77 playoff games while winning eight championships with the New York Arrows and San Diego Sockers. Named MISL MVP six times, Zungul also captured the championship series MVP nod four times. Amongst his most impressive feats are his 108-goal season in 1980-81, a 76-game point scoring streak from 1978-81, and scoring three goals in 37 seconds in a game in 1982.



## **2012 USL 10+ CLUBS**

### **BYU Cougars**

The BYU Cougars were a unique addition to the PDL in 2003, becoming the first team owned and operated by a university to join the league. BYU entered the PDL with a strong pedigree, having already dominated the Collegiate Club Soccer Championships for a decade, winning national championships in 1993, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, and 2001. The team enjoyed its best PDL season in 2007, posting a 13-1-2 record to claim the Northwest Division title before falling to Fresno in the Western Conference Final.

### **Fresno Fuego**

The Fuego have been one of the PDL's great success stories since joining the league in 2003, routinely packing thousands of fans into Chukchansi Park to always be at the top of the league's attendance rankings. On the field, the Fuego have never endured a losing season, compiling an impressive 96-45-23 mark, three division titles and a trip to the conference final in 2011.

### **West Virginia Chaos**

Founded in 2003, the West Virginia Chaos have provided West Virginia soccer talent with an opportunity for advancement for the past 10 seasons. Among the chaos alums who have moved on to play professionally is West Virginia native Chase Harrison of the Philadelphia Union. The Chaos are on the upswing recently, having put together back-to-back winning seasons in 2011 and 2012, narrowly missing out on a playoff berth this past summer.

"We are really excited to be developing the relationship between USL and NIKE, Inc. and

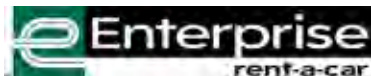
look forward working with USL and member teams to elevate the game of soccer in the U.S.," commented U.S. Soccer Sports Marketing Director, Joe Elmore.
