Our teams will always reflect this new reality and our stadiums will warmly welcome all who wish to attend our matches. Our team owners also believe in their local communities, recognizing that fan loyalty is a privilege to be earned over time by consistent hard work

on and off the field, respect for the sport and our fans, and a willingness to listen to what our fans are saying.

We are equally committed to our role in the development of the sport in North America. The NASL is proud to give professional players a chance to play in meaningful games while fine tuning their skills and athleticism, and also to provide professional coaches and referees with the opportunity to improve their own abilities and knowledge of the game. At the same time, we want to offer the amateur players in our communities an aspirational example of the sport being played at an even higher level.

We are certain that our sport – whether one calls it soccer, football or fútbol – will reach even greater heights over the years to come, and the NASL intends to be at the forefront of that trend. Our league promises to be competitive, entertaining and innovative – while remaining true to the sport we love.



ABOUT THE NASL

The new North American Soccer League (NASL) was officially founded in November 2009 when a group of 2nd division men's professional soccer team owners banded together to form North American Soccer League, LLC for the purpose of creating a team-owned and operated professional soccer league in the United States, Canada and Puerto Rico.

In February 2011, the NASL received provisional recognition from the United States Soccer Federation as the exclusive second division men's professional league (D-2) and the inaugural season kicked off on the evening of April 9, 2011, with games in Cary, North Carolina; Atlanta, Georgia; Fort Lauderdale, Florida; and St. Petersburg, Florida.

The NASL is an eight-team league featuring a fully-balanced schedule in which each of the eight teams plays the other seven league members four times (twice at home and twice on the road) during the regular season. The regular season is followed by playoffs featuring the top six teams in the points standings and culminating in a two-game, total goals series for the NASL championship.

The NASL member teams are: Atlanta Silverbacks, Carolina RailHawks, FC Edmonton, Fort Lauderdale Strikers, Minnesota Stars FC, Puerto Rico Islanders, San Antonio Socrpions(replacing Montréal Impact) and Tampa Bay Rowdies. The Montréal Impact have been admitted to Major League Soccer (MLS) beginning with the 2012 season. On June 20, 2011, the NASL announced its expansion into Ottawa, Ontario, pending the completion of renovations to Lansdowne Park.

The NASL recieved official Division 2 sanctioning from the USSF on March 2,

2012. The vote of the national council was unanimous.

Every NASL team represents a metro market area not served by a team from the U.S. and Canada's officially-recognized first division, MLS, and thus sits at the top of the men's professional soccer "pyramid" in their home market. Each of the NASL teams play their home games in stadiums (with capacities ranging from approximately 5,000 to 15,000) that allow fans to experience the games in a uniquely intimate setting.

The NASL operates on traditional business practices employed by most of the major national soccer leagues throughout the world. Each team within the league is responsible for its own player investment and development, and is free to scout, trial, sign and transfer players as it wishes in the best interest of the individual team. While there are limits to the size of the active rosters for each team (30) and the number of foreign players permitted per team (7), the league does not impose a salary cap on its members.

Approximately 200 soccer players are currently on the NASL's team rosters, and their backgrounds as players are as diverse as their nationalities. On opening day of the 2011 season, the youngest player in the league was 18 and the oldest was 39. Several have experience playing in Europe and Latin America's first divisions, as well as at the national team level, while others have MLS experience here in North America. Yet many NASL players are in the early stages of their professional careers, and using the league as a stepping stone to higher professional leagues. While the clear majority of the players hail from the U.S. or Canada, 30 other nationalities were represented on opening day rosters.



ABOUT THE NASL

Although the NASL shares its name with the league that operated throughout North America during the period of 1968-1984, there is no official tie to the business structure of the now-defunct NASL. However, with six of the new NASL teams operating in cities with a rich memory of past glory of the former NASL there is more than a hint of the former NASL's heritage to be found in the new NASL of today. Three examples being the Joma match ball whose design was inspired by the ball in play some 40 years ago, and the Fort Lauderdale Strikers and Tampa Bay Rowdies franchises whose names and jerseys are virtually identical to those of the teams that graced the pitch in the late 1970's and early 1980's and featured George Best, Rodney Marsh, Nene Cubillas and Gerd Müller, among others.

The NASL, serving as this region's second division, does not have a system of relegation

and promotion with the officially recognized first (MLS) and third (USL Pro) divisions, nor is there an official working relationship between MLS and NASL. However, in addition to the Montréal Impact, a number of recent second division men's professional clubs have gone on to compete in MLS after successfully building a team and fan base at the NASL level. The current MLS clubs Seattle Sounders, Portland Timbers, Vancouver Whitecaps and now Montréal Impact all played D-2 soccer prior to entry into MLS. Player movement between the leagues is facilitated by a strong working relationship at the team levels, and the NASL is also working with MLS at the league level to employ standards designed to foster player health and safety.





COMMISSIONER/BOARD OF GOVERNERS

David Downs is serving his second season as the NASL Commissioner, having presided over the league's inaugural campaign in 2011. As Commissioner, Downs is responsible for enforcing league rules and regulations; managing the league's Miami headquarters and its staff; overseeing the marketing of the league; developing and executing the NASL's expansion campaign; and representing the league in its relations with the media, fans and appropriate governing bodies. Downs reports to the NASL Board of Governors, who hired him on March 21, 2011.

Previously, Downs worked as Executive Director of the USA Bid Committee Inc., the organization created by the U.S. Soccer Federation (USSF) to participate in the bidding process to host the FIFA World Cup™ in 2018 and 2022. Under Downs' leadership, the USA Bid Committee achieved several milestones while increasing awareness and interest in the sport domestically.

Prior to his service as the Executive Director of the USA Bid Committee, Downs was President of Univision Sports. In that role, he was responsible for acquiring the television rights and supervising the production of all sports programming for the three networks in the Univision Communications Inc. family.

Downs joined Univision from ABC Sports. During his career at ABC, Downs rose to Senior Vice President of Programming. He was instrumental in the successful negotiations to

secure the U.S. television rights to the World Cup beginning with USA '94, as well as countless other major sporting events including Big Ten and Pac-10 college football, the PGA Tour and the Indianapolis 500.

Downs has been involved with soccer in North America for several decades, as a college player, a licensed youth coach, and as the parent of two soccer-playing children. He also currently serves on the board of the USSF Development Academy club FC Westchester.

The NASL is owned and operated by its member teams through the Board of Governors ("Board"). The Board consists of a representative of each member team and is chaired by Aaron Davidson. The Board oversees the League rules and regulations and governs the expansion and commercial strategy of the League. The Board also oversees the functions of the League Office.

COMPETITION FORMAT



RULES & REGULATIONS

Structure: The eight active NASL teams compete in one table consisting of all 8 teams, the Atlanta Silverbacks; Carolina RailHawks; FC Edmonton; Fort Lauderdale Strikers; Minnesota Stars FC; Puerto Rico Islanders; San Antonio Scorpions and the Tampa Bay Rowdies.

Schedule: Each team will play a 28-game regular season schedule. Each team will play 14 home and 14 away games. Each team will play each of the other 7 NASL teams twice at home and twice away.

Point System: Teams will receive three points for a win, one point for a tie and zero points for a loss.

Referees: All referees for NASL matches played in the United States are nationally certified referees assigned by the Professional Referee Organization (PRO). The Canadian Soccer Association (CSA) assigns referees for all matches played in Canada. The Federación Puertorriqueña de Fútbol (FPF) will assign referees for all matches played in Puerto Rico.

Game Clock: The official game time for all NASL games will be managed on the field by the referee. If necessary, the referee may also allot extra time (a.k.a. 'stoppage time') at the end of each period (first half, second half, and if applicable, first overtime period and second overtime period during playoff games) to allow for injuries, time-wasting or other disturbances.

Note: The stadium clock will display the time from 0:00 to 45:00 and from 45:00 to 90:00 (plus stoppage time where applicable in each half). For statistical purposes, the minutes for goals, substitutions, yellow cards, etc., will be listed from the first minute until the 90th minute. A goal scored at 15 minutes 10 seconds will be listed as having been scored in the 16th minute.

Roster Composition: Each NASL team's full roster shall be no less than 20 and no more than 35 total players. Players can compete on a maximum of 2 teams per season.

Active Roster and Inactive Roster: At no time may any team name more than 30 eligible players on its Active Roster. Only players listed on an Active Roster are eligible to play in any game. Once a player is listed on a team's Inactive Roster, that player must remain on the Inactive Roster for at least 30 days. In order for a team to change a player from the Active Roster to the inactive roster or vice versa, the team must notify the NASL Registrar, in writing, at least 48 hours prior to the game for which the team intends for such change to take effect. The League Office will make the final determination on whether players are on each team's Active Roster or Inactive Roster for any game.

Domestic Players: A domestic player for teams based in the United States and Puerto Rico is either a U.S. citizen, a permanent resident (green card holder) or the holder of other special status (e.g. refugee or asylum status). A domestic



player for teams based in Canada is either a Canadian citizen, a permanent resident, or qualifies as a domestic player in the United States as set forth in the guidelines above.

International Players: Each team may list up to 7 non-domestic players on its roster.

Game Day Rosters: Each team may nominate 18 players from its Active Roster for a game day roster. Teams are allowed 3 substitutions per game.

Cautions and Suspensions: A player will be suspended for one game upon receiving his fifth yellow card – regardless of the nature of the infraction which resulted in his being awarded the yellow card. After a player has accumulated 5 yellow cards, he will earn an additional one-game suspension for each additional 3 yellow cards he accumulates. A player receiving two yellow cards in the same game will be suspended for the next game; however for the purposes of accumulated yellow cards he will be considered to have received just one red card. A player receiving a direct red card will automatically be suspended for the next game, and the NASL Disciplinary Committee has the power to suspend him for additional games depending upon the severity of the offense which led to the red card issued by the referee.

Card Suspensions: Red card and yellow card accumulation suspensions earned in regular season games will be served in that

player's next regular season game. Any suspension for yellow card accumulation earned in a player's last regular season game will carry over into that season's first playoff game for his team.

Any player who receives a red card in his team's last game of the season (NASL regular season match or during playoff games), will serve the one-game suspension during their next game (whether it comes during a playoff game, championship series game, or in the first regular season game of the following season). All card suspensions will, if necessary, follow a player to a new team.

Suspension Manipulation: Players suspended from NASL games (regular season and playoff games) that are called in for national team duty will have their suspensions held in abeyance until they return to their NASL team. Teams will be responsible for informing the League Office of a player's selection to national team duty. Failure to provide the League Office with such notice or to withhold the use of a suspended player when appropriate is subject to sanctions.



PLAYOFF FORMAT & QUALIFICATION

Playoff Qualification:

The top 6 teams in the league standings at the conclusion of the regular season will compete in the NASL playoffs.

Tie-breaking Procedure for Standings and Playoff Qualification:

The team with the highest position in the standings at the conclusion of the regular season will be the team with the greatest number of points (3 points for a win, 1 point for a tie, 0 points for a loss). In the event that two teams finish the regular season with an equal number of points, the following system will be used to break the tie:

- 1) The highest position shall be awarded to the team with the greater goal difference against all other teams during the regular season (goal differential).
- 2) If the teams are still equal in the standings, the highest position shall be awarded to the team scoring the greatest number of total goals against all other teams during the regular season (total goals).
- 3) If the teams are still equal in the standings, the highest position shall be awarded to the team with the best win/tie/loss record in regular season games against all other teams equal in points (head-to-head competition).

4) If the teams are still equal in the standings, the procedures described in this section shall be applied only to games played on the road by each team against all other teams during the regular season.

5) If the teams are still equal in the standings, the procedures described in this section shall be applied only to games played at home by each team against all other teams during the regular season.

6) If the teams are still equal in the standings, the highest position in the standings shall be determined by a toss of a coin.

7) The first tiebreaker in a three-way tie is also goal difference, if two teams are tied on goal difference, the next tie-breaker is goals scored.

NOTE: If two teams remain tied after another team with the same number of points advances during any step, the tie breaker reverts to step 1 of the two-team tie-breaking system



Playoff Format:

The 6 qualifying teams will be given seeds 1 through 6, with the top team in the standings receiving the number 1 seed.

The format of the Playoffs will consist of a Quarterfinal Round, a Semifinal Round, and a Final Round. The Quarterfinal Round will be a single game while the Semifinal and Final Rounds will each be a 2-game series with each team playing at home once and the team with the greater number of aggregate goals in both games winning each series.

The number 1 seed and the number 2 seed will receive a bye directly to the Semifinal Round, while the number 3 seed will host the number 6 seed and the number 4 seed will host the number 5 seed in the Quarterfinal Round.

For the Semifinal Round, the number 1 seed will be paired with the lowest-seeded team to qualify from the Quarterfinal Round and the number 2 seed will be paired with the highest-seeded team to qualify from the Quarterfinal Round.

The winners of each series in the Semifinal Round will meet in the Final Round. In the event of a draw in either Quarterfinal Round game, such game will progress to a 30-minute extra time period (the golden goal rule will not be in effect). If the teams are still locked in a draw following the extra time period, the winner will be determined by a penalty shootout.

In each Semifinal Round series and the Final Round series, if the teams are tied on the number of aggregate goals scored in the series at the conclusion of the second game, the teams will progress to a 30-minute extra time period. As in the Quarterfinal Round, the golden goal rule will not be in effect. If the teams are still locked in a draw following the extra time period, the winner of the series will be determined by a penalty shootout.

Cards in Playoffs:

All players will start the NASL playoffs with a zero yellow card total. A player receiving 3 yellow cards in separate games during the course of the playoffs will be suspended for his team's next game. Any suspension for yellow cards received in a player's last playoff game will not carry over into the next NASL regular season.



NASL OFFICIAL MATCH BALL

July 4, 2011, marked the launch of the NASL Official Match Ball manufactured by Joma. The custom ball incorporates the stars of the original iconic NASL ball, which represents the evolution of the branding of the NASL from 1968 through 2011. In 2010 and 2011, Joma was ranked as the leading sportswear company in Spain, and is the official outfitter for several leading clubs and national teams worldwide.



THE SOCCER BOWL

The *Soccer Bowl*, named to honor the heritage of the original NASL, is awarded each year to the League Champions, decided by the NASL Championship Series at the conclusion of the playoffs. The *Soccer Bowl* trophy was crafted in England and designed by 343RLP+ Creative. The inaugural NASL Champions and the first club to have their name engraved on the *Soccer Bowl* are the NSC Minnesota Stars.



REGULAR SEASON CHAMPIONSHIP TROPHY

Awarded to the team with the highest point total at the conclusion of the regular season, recognizing excellence over the duration of the season. The trophy was designed and crafted in England. The Carolina RailHawks were awarded the inaugural NASL Regular Season Championship Trophy.



2012 OUTLOOK



2012 OUTLOOK

2012 promises to be an exciting year around the NASL. Beginning on April 7th with our "Dome Opener", where the 2011 NASL Champion Minnesota Stars FC will host the 2011 Regular Season Champion Carolina RailHawks at the Hubert H. Humphry Metrodome in Minneapolis.

The NASL enters the 2012 season with a few notable changes. The 2011 Champion NSC Minnesota Stars have now become the Minnesota Stars FC, while FC Tampa Bay has reconnected with the region's NASL legacy and is now known as the Tampa Bay Rowdies. The league has bid farewell to the Montreal Impact who have moved to MLS, while the newest expansion team, the San Antonio Scorpions begin NASL play on April 7th.

Martin Rennie, who coached the Carolina RailHawks to the 2011 NASL Regular Season Championship, has moved to MLS to coach the Vancouver Whitecaps, while Colin Clarke has replaced him moving from Puerto Rico, where his former assistant Adrian Whitbread is now in charge. In Atlanta, former MLS MVP Alex Pineda Chacón takes the reins with the Silverbacks.

We also welcome former Colorado Rapids and Tampa Bay Mutiny Head Coach Tim Hankinson to the league as he fulfills the same role with the San Antonio Scorpions.

In a significant rules change, this season overall goal difference will be the first tiebreaker to determine playoff positioning between those teams tied on points.





NASL CLUBS



ATLANTA SILVERBACKS



Founded in 1995 as the Atlanta Ruckus, Atlanta's professional soccer team became known as the Silverbacks in 1998.

The Silverbacks joined the North American Soccer League (NASL) for the 2011 season. The team plays at the privately funded and soccer-specific Atlanta Silverbacks Park which opened in 2006. The team is led by Head Coach Alex Pineda Chacón, a former Honduran International and Major League Soccer's Most Valuable Player in 2001.

The team's primary owners are Traffic Sports and Boris Jerkunica. Jerkunica, a self described serial "technology entrepreneur", was the co-founder of three successful software



companies, Software Builders, NetZip and Vocalocity.

The Silverbacks have created a local soccer pyramid with the men's professional team, a reserve team that competes in the National Premier Soccer League (NPSL), a women's team that competes in the W-League (and won the league championship in 2011), as well as youth camps and recreational adult leagues.

The RailHawks were a founding member of the North American Soccer League (NASL) and play their home matches at WakeMed Soccer Park in Cary, NC, which is considered to be one of the finest soccer-specific stadiums in the USA. The stadium has hosted multiple international friendly matches and several other major domestic soccer events. They are owned by a subsidiary of Traffic Sports USA.

Colin Clarke will lead the RailHawks into the 2012 NASL season coming from league rival Puerto Rico Islanders. In recent years, the RailHawks



have won the NASL Conference of the 2010 USSF D-2 Pro League and the 2011 NASL Regular Season Championship.

The club is managed by Curt Johnson, a Raleigh native and former General Manager of the Kansas City Wizards, who serves as President.

In their short history, the RailHawks have had a number of notable players including Caleb Norkus (former US Youth International), Brad Rusin (now with HB Køge of the Danish Superliga), Daniel Paladini (now with the Chicago Fire), Greg Shields (who played in the English Premier League) and Ronald Cerritos (70 caps for El Salvador).

FC Edmonton is the only Canadian team in the NASL, is owned by brothers Tom and Dave Fath.

Harry Sinkgraven is the Head Coach, along with assistants Hans Schrijver and Jeff Paulus and Goalkeeping Coach Tomasz Janas. In 2011, the team consisted of 12 players from Alberta, eight more Canadians, five Americans and just four imports. In its inaugural season in the NASL, FC Edmonton managed a 10-6-12 record, which was good enough for fifth place in the league and a berth into the quarterfinals.

With Edmonton's more than 30 years of professional soccer history but lack of a current pro team, brothers Tom and Dave Fath knew the timing was finally right for soccer to make a

triumphant return to the City of Champions. On February 9, 2010, the next generation of professional soccer in Alberta was born.

After a successful exhibition season in 2010, which featured matches versus teams such as Colo-Colo of Chile and Portsmouth FC of England, FC Edmonton took the field in their first official NASL season in 2011. The team completed a solid inaugural campaign, surprising the league by clinching 5th place and a playoff berth.

FORT LAUDERDALE STRIKERS



The Strikers enter the 2012 season after a successful 2011 campaign. The team reached the playoffs for the first time since its inaugural season in 2006 and advanced to the NASL Championship Series Final. 2011 was also their first season as the Fort Lauderdale Strikers, a name recalling the first incarnation of the NASL in the late 70s and early 80s. Like those first Strikers, the 2012 team will play its home games at historic Lockhart Stadium. The team is owned by Miami FC, LLC, a North American subsidiary of The Traffic Group.

The Strikers have been led by head coach Daryl Shore since the 2010 season. Shore's coaching staff includes Player/Assistant Coach Abe Thompson and

Goalkeeper Coach Ricardo Lopes. The team is managed by Tim Robbie, who also serves as team president.

The Strikers have several notable players in their history. In the 2006 season as Miami FC, the team featured Romario and Zinho, champions from the 1994 Brazilian World Cup team. The 2011 season included midfielders Bryan Arguez (pictured) and Gerson Mayen (both now with the MLS's Montréal Impact). Other notable players include Christian Gomez, Josh Saunders, and Diego Serna.





The groundbreaking ceremony for Scorpions Community Stadium took place on Wednesday, February 29, 2012.




TAMPA BAY ROWDIES

2011 IN REVIEW



2011 RECAP

The NASL's inaugural 2011 season culminated with the Minnesota Stars being crowned the league's first champions, defeating the Fort Lauderdale Strikers in the two-game NASL Championship Series after qualifying for the playoffs on the final day of the regular season.

The Stars, coached by former US National Team player and MLS Cup winner Manny Lagos, beat the Carolina RailHawks 2-1 in Cary on September 24 to edge the Montréal Impact by a single point and clinch the 6th and final playoff spot before a stiffened defense in front of keeper Joe Warren carried them through the playoffs to the title. The Stars' win over Carolina (they would beat them again in the semifinal series) was even more remarkable because of the regular season form of the RailHawks: they won the NASL Regular Season title and were led by Golden Ball winner Etienne Barbara and Head Coach Martin Rennie, whose own success led him to take over the reins of the Vancouver Whitecaps of Major League Soccer (MLS) in November 2011. The RailHawks dominated the regular season from start to finish, but enjoyed their best form during the first half of the year when they won 10 consecutive league games from May 1 through July 3.

Opening Day, April 9, produced four games each decided by a single goal, including the franchise debut of FC Edmonton who defeated the newly re-branded Fort Lauderdale Strikers (formerly Miami FC) 2-1 in front of 6,402 fans at Lockhart Stadium. That same night the Puerto Rico Islanders, led by Head Coach Colin Clarke, handed Carolina their only loss of the first months of the NASL season. And the Atlanta Silverbacks returned from a two-year hiatus and routinely drew crowds of over 3,000 to Silverbacks Park. The team grew in stature and confidence as the season wore on and featured contributions from the likes of former Mexican international Mario Pérez, Argentine International Lucas Paulini and striker Matt Horth. However, the story of the season's first month was FC Edmonton's successful start earning seven points from a four-game southeastern road trip, a remarkable feat for a first-year team.

In May, Puerto Rico successfully defended its CFU Caribbean Club Championship en route to their second-place finish in the NASL regular season. Nevertheless it was Carolina's Maltese international Etienne Barbara who claimed the majority of the headlines by securing his second successive Player of the Month award, scoring seven goals in the month.

Carolina continued to roll through the league in June, and Barbara's dominance was supplemented by increasingly effective performances from Pablo Campos and Jonny Steele. Meanwhile, in Minnesota, the Stars were playing well especially on the defensive end with a back-line anchored by Jack Stewart and Kyle Altman.

The League introduced a new game ball on July 4th, which paid homage to the iconic ball of the original NASL. Defender Brad Rusin, Carolina's captain, was transferred to FC Køge of the top division in Denmark in early July. During July and August, Puerto Rico and Tampa Bay both moved up the league standings, while MLS-bound Montréal began a major re-tooling of its roster after reaching the July 4th holiday just one point out of last place in the league. The Impact also released coach Marc Dos Santos in late June.

FC Edmonton qualified for the playoffs in early September. The Alberta-based club competed at a high level all season long with a roster that contained several home grown youngsters, including midfielder Shaun Saiko who made the NASL's Best XI. The NASL also bid farewell on September 24 to the Montréal Impact, who despite a late flurry finished 7th in the standings. After a successful two-decade run at the Division 2 level they joined Major League Soccer for the 2012 season and beyond.

The NASL playoffs in October saw the Fort Lauderdale Strikers live up to their name as Brian Shriver led an offense that produced 10 goals in the first three playoff matches before encountering the defensive-minded Minnesota Stars in the finals. By eliminating #3 Tampa Bay, #1 Carolina and #4 Fort Lauderdale in succession, the Stars upset three of the top four playoff seeds to claim the Soccer Bowl.


