


It is a great pleasure for me to welcome you to the 2019 season of Class Double A baseball! We are celebrating our 55th season this year of the "Modern Era" of the Southern League which began in 1964. We are proud of our history over the last five decades, and we are also excited about our future.

On Wednesday, May 29, we will be on hand at Rickwood Field for this year's Classic where Birmingham will host the Montgomery Biscuits at 12:30 p.m. CDT. The special quest of honor this year will be Lou Piniella.

The Biloxi Shuckers will host their first All-Star Game at MGM Park on June 18. Festivities on June 17 will include a FanFest, Player Autograph Sessions, and Home Run Derby. On game day, the Shuckers will host a luncheon and recognize the 2019 class of the Southern League Hall of Fame. The game will commence at 6:35 p.m. CDT. Please visit our Facebook page and website for further details.

We recently added four new names to our Hall of Fame for 2019 including: former Knoxville/Tennessee Smokies pitcher Roy Halladay; former Chattanooga Lookouts infielder & manager Sal Rende; and former Jacksonville Expos outfielder Larry Walker. Additionally, the panel of 34 voters elected Joe Engel to our Hall of Fame via the league's Special Consideration Ballot. This marks our 6th annual class of inductees.

The 2018 Post-Season included several exciting games as division winners Montgomery and Jackson clashed in five games before Jackson won the series 3-2; and Biloxi bested Pensacola in a 3-1 series. After Biloxi bested Pensacola in a 3-1 series and Biloxi bested Biloxi bwon the first game in the Championship Series by 7-0, hopes ran high for the Shuckers, but it was not to be. Jackson fought back to win the next three games with 7-3, 12-7 and 3-2 scores over Biloxi. The final game in Biloxi was a real nail-biter, as the winning run didn't come until the end of the 9th inning. For his efforts during all four games, Domingo Leyba from Jackson was crowned the MVP of the Championship Series.

2019 marks the "Farewell Season" for our Mobile BayBears, who opened in Hank Aaron Stadium in 1997. New ownership decided to relocate to the North Alabama area, and will commence play in a new stadium in Madison, AL in 2020 as the Rocket City Trash Pandas. The BayBears had a great run in Mobile, and still have plenty of exciting events and promotions planned for this season. The Southern League appreciates the City of Mobile for being home to the BayBears since 1997, and I would like to sincerely thank all of the players, staff and loyal fans who populated Hank Aaron Stadium through the years. Thanks for the many memories we will have of you, Azalea City!

This season will again usher in many new faces on our teams - all hopeful of one day playing on Major League diamonds. There have been a few managerial changes during the off season, and a few changes in our front offices, as well, but our "product" remains the same - quality service, concessions and entertainment, plus some of the best baseball you will see around the Southeast this summer!

My mission is to promote Minor League Baseball as one of the most fun, family-oriented, and reasonably priced activities available, and to encourage folks to join the Southern League community by attending baseball games at our ballparks as often as possible. ## SOUTHERN LEAGUE 2019 PROFILES



The Southern League elected Lori Webb as president on July 18, 2012. She holds the distinction of being the first female league president in the history of Minor League Baseball. As league president, Webb serves as Chairman of the Board of Directors and as an ex-officio member and chairman of all league committees. She is also the Secretary and Treasurer of the league.

Webb began her career with the league in 1994 as the Executive Assistant to the President. In October 2000, she was promoted to Vice President-Operations and appointed as the league's Corporate Secretary and Treasurer. Webb is responsible for monitoring the compliance of the clubs and the league with Minor League Baseball and Major League Baseball, supervising the day-to-day operations of the league office, and administering the league's financial, legal and business transactions.

She also oversees the Southern League's umpiring program and acts as liaison between the league and Minor League Baseball-Umpire Development (MiLB-UD). As a member of the Council of League Presidents, Webb serves on both the MiLB-UD Committee and the Revisions & Amendments Committee.

In 2001, Minor League Baseball recognized Webb for her dedication and contributions to the league by selecting her as the winner of the Rawlings Woman Executive of the Year Award. In 2004, Webb was presented with the inaugural Southern League Woman of Excellence Award. She was selected for this award again in 2010. Webb was the recipient of a Presidential Citation in 2011 for "excellence in leadership in the Southern League," presented by Pat O'Conner, President of Minor League Baseball. Webb was most recently honored by Sports Business Journal in 2013 when she was selected as part of the third annual class of "Game Changers – Women in Sports".

Prior to being hired by the Southern League, Webb held several administrative positions in the franchising, publishing, and medical fields. A native of Seneca Falls, New York, Webb graduated from the Central City Business Institute in Syracuse, NY. She currently resides in Marietta, GA with her husband, Jim. Together they have three children and four grandchildren.



The Southern League announced the hiring of Media Relations Director Michael Guzman on January 9, 2018. Entering his second season with the league office, Guzman will oversee all communications efforts for the league including both press release distribution and social media, as well as the creation and distribution of the preseason media guide. Additionally, he will serve as a liaison for transactions between the league office and its 10 member clubs while also assisting with the selection of awards and All-Star teams.

Guzman spent the 2017 baseball season with the Charlotte Knights, Triple-A affiliate of the Chicago White Sox. In 2016, he was named Media Relations Manager for the Birmingham Barons. While with Birmingham, the Barons front office was named Southern League Organization of the Year and hosted Minor League Baseball's Promotional Seminar.

A native of Carol Stream, IL, Guzman graduated from IUPUI in 2016 with a degree in Sports Journalism.



On July 27th, 2013, The Southern League of Professional Baseball Clubs announced the creation of the Southern League Hall of Fame, recognizing individuals for their accomplishments and contributions to the League on the field of play or in an administrative role.

Coinciding with the 50th anniversary of the modern Southern League in 2014, the first Hall of Fame Class was inducted at the 2014 Southern League All-Star Game in Chattanooga, Tennessee.





"We chose the Montañas name, and our colors, to pay homage to the two mountains **D E** that shape Chattanooga," said Lookouts




President Rich Mozingo. "This initiative is a great way to celebrate the cultural diversity of our city."

"Plans are well underway for the 2019 Rickwood Classic. Not only do we anticipate a great game between Birmingham and in-state rival Montgomery, but our fans will also have a chance to meet former New York Yankees great, Lou Piniella. We are all looking forward to May 29th."

Piniella was named the 1969 American League Rookie of Year and played 16 seasons with the Baltimore Orioles, Cleveland Indians, Kansas City Royals, and New York Yankees. He would make one All-Star team and compile 1,705 hits, 102 home runs, and 766 RBIs during his on-field career. Upon retiring Piniella would begin his managerial career, which spanned 23 years and included three Manager of the Year awards. In 1990, Piniella would lead the Cincinnati Reds to a four-game sweep of the Oakland Athletics; winning his first World Series as a manager and his third title overall. In 2001 Piniella would lead the Seattle Mariners to 116 wins, tying the 1906 Chicago Cubs for the most victories in a single season.

"Rickwood Field is not only a Birmingham treasure, but a national one as well," said Levy's Fine Jewelry manager Todd Denaburg. "We are incredibly lucky to have the community realize this and preserve it as opposed to simply tearing it down like so many other past Birmingham treasures. It is an honor to be associated with the Rickwood Classic and to help keep this wonderful tradition going."

On Monday, September 2, 2019 the sun will set on the Mobile BayBears and the team will take the field under the bright lights of Hank Aaron Stadium for their final regular season game.

The franchise will relocate to Madison, Alabama ahead of the 2020 Southern League season; continuing a history that is now more than five decades in the making. Before making their way to the South Alabama bay in 1997, the club operated as both the Port City Roosters (1995-96) and Nashville Xpress (1993-94) for a pair of seasons. Prior to that, the team called Charlotte, North Carolina home; identifying as the Knights (1988-92) and Orioles (1976-87). The franchise originated as one of the Southern League's original eight clubs, operating as the Asheville Tourists for seven years (1964-66, 1968-71) and the Asheville Orioles for another four (1972-75).

As part of their sendoff season in Mobile, the BayBears will have five bobblehead giveaways: Paul Goldschmidt (May 11), Max Scherzer (May 25), Justin Upton (June 8), Jake Peavy (June 22) and mascot Bay B. Bear (July 27). Fans can also purchase Farewell Season caps, shirts, baseballs, and more in person at the Swinging Bear Gift Shop at Hank Aaron Stadium or online at baybears.milbstore.com.

When we look back in the record books, the Mobile BayBears will be defined by success. Entering their final season of play the BayBears boast four titles and eight playoff appearances across 22 seasons in the Southern League. Of all 20 clubs in modern history (since 1964), the BayBears .600 playoff win percentage (30-20) currently ranks second all-time.

#### CHAMPS: MARZILLI'S LATE PINCH-HIT DOUBLE GIVES JACKSON A SOUTHERN LEAGUE TITLE

BILOXI, MS - The Jackson Generals, Double-A affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks, used a ninth-inning rally to beat the Biloxi Shuckers and win the 2018 BC® Powder Southern League Championship Series with a 3-2 victory at MGM Park. The triumph gives Jackson their third trophy as a Southern League franchise, their second title in three seasons, and their first crown as an affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks.

SOUTHERN LEAGUE 2019 2018 CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES RECAP

Facing Southern League All-Star closer Nate Griep (0-1, 9.00 ERA) with the game tied 2-2 in the top of the ninth, Jackson made their move. After an inning-opening strikeout by Rudy Flores, Generals third baseman Marty Herum fouled off an 0-2 pitch from Griep and bopped a single up the middle to put the tying run on base. Griep fought back to record his second strikeout of the inning, setting down Jay Gonzalez on six pitches to bring up catcher Dominic Miroglio. The Jackson backstop, a playoff revelation, lined his 15th postseason hit into center field and moved Herum into scoring position at second base.

With the title hanging in the balance, Jackson skipper Shelley Duncan put his trust in 27-year-old veteran outfielder Evan Marzilli to pinch-hit for shortstop Galli Cribbs. Marzilli, a two-time college national champion at the University of South Carolina, stepped to the plate with no previous at-bats against Griep during the regular season. Griep had gone 13 appearances without giving up an earned run and had worked 16 scoreless innings since allowing three runs at Jackson on July 27. Marzilli put that history aside and made some of his own.

On a first-pitch changeup, Marzilli ripped a double just inside the first base bag, scoring Herum from second base to catapult the Generals in front, 3-2. Miroglio was tagged out at the plate after trying to score from first base, sending the game into the final half-inning with Jackson needing three outs to seize the trophy. The game-breaking hit marked Marzilli's second consecutive at-bat with a run-scoring double, bearing resemblance to his Game 3 plate appearance in the eighth inning which also scored Herum.

For the fourth time in the playoffs, Jackson closer Kevin Ginkel (S, 1) entered with the Generals on top. The reigning Southern League's BC ® Relief Pitcher of the Month needed only three batters to seal the victory, coaxing a groundout from Keston Hiura and a strikeout by Lucas Erceg for the frame's first two outs. Weston Wilson bounced a full-count offering to Herum at third base, and Herum's successful toss across the diamond to Flores sent the two corner infielders rushing toward each other for a leaping embrace at the mound as their teammates poured out of the dugout to join the celebration.

Knowing a victory would equal a banner, Jackson right-hander Emilio Vargas bounced back from a rough outing in the North Division Series against Montgomery with a strong start on the hill. The 22-year-old Dominican pitched five innings against a loaded Biloxi lineup that featured five of the Milwaukee Brewers top prospects. Vargas worked quickly and gave up only one earned run, a solo home run by Troy Stokes Jr., in the fourth inning. He finished his day with eight strikeouts and no walks on 76 pitches, facing just three batters over the minimum before turning the game over

Miguel Aguilar entered in relief with a 2-1 sixth inning lead, but allowed his first earned run since August 18 as Biloxi would tie the game on an RBI single from Keston Hiura which scored Stokes Jr. Michael Blazek (W. 1-0) followed with two scoreless frames, allowing the Generals to enter the ninth inning deadlocked with the South Division champs.

At the plate, Kevin Medrano started the game with an early bang by whacking a two-run homer off the top of the right field wall to give the Generals a 2-0 lead in the top of the first inning. BC® Powder Southern League Championship Series MVP Domingo Leyba had a quiet night on Saturday following a 4-for-6 effort in Game 3, ending the playoffs with a 14-for-40 mark at the plate and a league-best 11 RBIs. Vargas collected his first professional hit with a line-drive single to right-center field in the second inning. Miroglio went 2-for-4 to complete a dazzling playoff run in which he hit a league-high .484 (15-for-31) with nine runs scored and 7 RBIs.

For Duncan the 2018 Southern League title is his first championship shared with hitting coach Vince Harrison; and his second trophy shared with pitching coach Doug Drabek and bench coach Javier Colina, Duncan, Drabek, and Colina won the 2015 Northwest League title while guiding the Hillsboro Hops, a team that featured 2018 Generals players Galli Cribbs, Jared Miller, Tyler Mark, Justin Donatella, Kirby Bellow, Raymel Flores, and Jose Queliz. The Generals are the only Arizona Diamondbacks affiliate to win a league championship in 2018.



#### 2018 SOUTHERN LEAGUE ALL-STAR GAME REVIEW

BIRMINGHAM, Alabama -- Tyler Marlette kept a sellout crowd of 8,500 fans from experiencing a draw in the Southern League All-Star Game on Tuesday night. But it was Zach Gibbons who stood above the flock of talent and left with BUSH'S® All-Star MVP honors.

The Mississippi first baseman took the first pitch he saw from Chattanooga's Todd Van Steensel in the top of the ninth inning of a tie game and drove it 356 feet over the right-field wall. And the Mobile outfielder capped his four-RBI game with a two-run single soon after en route to a 9-5 victory for the South Division.

"It was great. When I hit it, I didn't think it was going to stay fair, then it hit the foul pole and then I kind of blacked out," Marlette said with a laugh. "That last at-bat, I was just trying to hit it as deep as possible."



It marked the 25-year-old's lone hit of the game, but he's been solid for the Braves with a .285 average, six home runs and 22 RBIs in 62 games. Coming into this game, he had hit safely in seven of his last

"I got four at-bats. Those first three I kind of struggled a little bit," Marlette said. "But I just kept telling myself to look for a fastball and put a good swing on it."

Gibbons entered the contest as a defensive substitution in the sixth inning and didn't let up until the contest ended, going 3-for-3 and scoring three times. In fact, he was the first player for the South to pick up a hit, grounding a single to right field in the seventh. Fifth-ranked Reds prospect Shed Long promptly followed with a homer to right to tie the score, 2-2.

"Right when I came into the game, the guys were like, 'You need to get a hit,'" Gibbons said. "It was cool to break that up."

The 17th-round pick out of the University of Arizona lined a two-run single to right in the eighth before coming through in the clutch again with his drive to center in the ninth. The Angels prospect amassed a .280 average with 24 RBIs this season.

The North squad was led at the plate by Ryan Boldt, who went 2-for-4 with two RBIs. The Biscuits right fielder has 31 RBIs this season with a slash line of .278/.356/.449.

Starter Taylor Widener (Jackson) and Dane Dunning (Birmingham) tallied two strikeouts in a perfect inning apiece for the North. Genesis Cabrera (Montgomery), Omar Bencomo (Chattanooga), Thomas Hatch (Tennessee) and Ryne Harper (Chattanooga) each followed with a hitless frame.

Actor Dennis Quaid, star of the 2002 film The Rookie threw out the first pitch at the 44th sellout in the history of Birmingham's Regions Field. Many were rooting for Long, who had a homecoming of sorts. The Pensacola second baseman was born in Birmingham and attended Jacksonville High School about an hour east of the city.

"It's a blessing to be able to play at this level in front of all my family, right at home," said Long, who also doubled in a run and walked. "It's definitely one of the most, if not the most, special moments in my career."

#### Zack Collins Wins Home Run Derby

Birmingham catcher takes crown on home field

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. — With a powerful swing and the home crowd behind him, Birmingham Barons catcher Zack Collins won the 2018 Southern League Home Run Derby, presented by Adamson Ford, on Tuesday night at Regions Field.

"I felt good out there during the first round. I took my time and got the jitters out," Collins said. "Once I was in the championship round I was feeling good and got in a groove and it was great to win it."

The derby began quietly, with Jackson Generals outfielder Jamie Westbrook and Pensacola Blue Wahoos outfielder Aristides Aquino each hit one home run in the opening round. Jackson's Rudy Flores took the early lead with a pair of long balls, only to be matched by Mississippi Braves first baseman Tyler Marlette one batter later. After Jackson's Galli Cribbs finished with one home run, the stage was set for the hometown catcher.

Hitting last in the opening round, Collins launched three home runs over the right field wall to secure a spot in the final round.

Tied at two homers each, Marlette and Flores competed in a five-swing tiebreaker to see who would advance to the finals. Marlette went deep with two of his five swings, and that proved to be enough as Flores hit one over the fence and nearly connected on his last swing, but it wasn't enough as the M-Braves slugger advanced to the final.

The final didn't start smoothly for Marlette, as he only homered once over his first 10 swings. Down to his last out, the Mississippi team leader in home runs knocked three straight over the left field fence, finishing with four to set the bar for Collins.

"It didn't matter if he hit 10 or one, I still had to go up there and perform," Collins said.

Birmingham's star did just that, needing just two outs to hit five long homers to right, including a few off the roof of the batting cage beyond the bleachers, to clinch the victory. It's one the White Sox No. 9 prospect according to MLB.com plans to savor.

"It really felt good to win it. I've been in a bunch of home run derbies in my lifetime, but this is the first one I've been able to win," Collins said. "Being the first All-Star Game at Regions Field and having the home fans in Birmingham here makes it even more awesome."

#### **COREY RAY** MOST VALUABLE PLAYER



After appearing in 135 games across his first Southern League season, Biloxi Shuckers outfielder Corey Ray was named the league's Most Valuable Player. The Chicago, Illinois native etched his name in the record books by becoming the first player in modern history (since 1964) to lead the Southern League in both home runs (27) and stolen bases (37) at season's end.

Ray, 24, paced all qualified hitters in a number of offensive categories including extra-base hits (66) and total bases (254). He also ranked among the league's best in hits (127, 3rd), runs scored (86, 2nd), and RBI (74, 4th).

A lightning rod atop Biloxi's lineup, Ray finished tied for the league lead with 32 doubles and fourth among all batters with seven triples. He averaged a home run every 19.7 at-bats, the second highest clip in the league, and completed his 2018 campaign with a .477 slugging percentage.

Following a Southern League midseason All-Star selection in June, Ray was named the Southern League's Player of the Week on July 22 and its Player of the Month for July.

This past offseason, the Milwaukee Brewers named Ray their Minor League Player of the Year. He enters the 2019 season listed as Milwaukee's no. 2 overall prospect according to MLB Pipeline. The Brewers selected Ray fifth overall in the 2016 MLB Amateur Draft out of the University of Louisville.

#### **ZACK BROWN** MOST OUTSTANDING PITCHER



Following his first Southern League season, Biloxi Shuckers RHP Zack Brown was named the Southern League's Most Outstanding Pitcher. Brown was the ace of a pitching staff that led the league with an impressive 3.47 team ERA.

Biloxi finished the year 20-2 as a club when Brown took to the mound, and posted an astounding 19-2 record across Brown's 21 starts last season. Brown, 24, completed his 2018 campaign with a 9-1 record and paced all qualified pitchers with a 2.44 ERA (34 ER/125.2 IP). He also finished second among Southern League starters with a 1.04 WHIP and a .207 opponent batting average; allowing only 9.91 baserunners per nine innings pitched.

On June 15, with the Shuckers eyeing a first half South Division title and an automatic playoff berth, Brown got the ball and tossed a complete game one-hit shutout to bring Biloxi back the postseason. Thanks to his eight strikeouts recorded and no walks surrendered. Brown posted a game score of 93; a performance bested only twice in the major leagues this season (Gerrit Cole's complete game, one-hit, 16 strikeout performance on May 4 and Sean Manaea's no-hitter on April 21).

After the season, Brown was named the Milwaukee Brewers Minor League Pitcher of the Year. He enters the 2019 season ranked as Milwaukee's no. 6 prospect according to MLB Pipeline. He was selected in the fifth round of the 2016 MLB Amateur Draft out of the University of Kentucky.

#### MIKE GUERRERO MANAGER OF THE YEAR



For guiding the Biloxi Shuckers to a sweep of the Southern League's split season, veteran manager Mike Guerrero was named the 2018 Manager of the Year. Under Guerrero's steady hand, the Shuckers paced the league throughout a majority of the year and reached the BC® Powder Championship Series after accumulating an 81-59 regular season record.

Guerrero, the Shuckers manager since the start of the 2016 season, has led Biloxi to a 224-192 record (.538 win percentage) over the course of his three years with the club. Over 20 years into his coaching career, Guerrero has compiled a career .536 win percentage (1,177-1,018) as a manager.

Prior to joining the Shuckers, Guerrero was a coach on the Milwaukee Brewers major league staff. For his work as manager of Triple-A Nashville in 2013, Guerrero received the Mike Coolbaugh Award. The honor is presented by Minor League Baseball to an individual who has shown an outstanding baseball work ethic, knowledge of the game and skill in mentoring young players on the field. Guerrero's first stint in the Southern League came when he served as manager of the Huntsville Stars from 2010-11. He is slated to return to Biloxi as manager of the Shuckers for the 2019 season.

### HISTORY

STRERN CONTROL OF THE STREET O



Billy Hitchcock, who helped pioneer the Southern League's development into the successful 10-team Double-A league it is today, has been the name attached to the circuit's championship trophy since 2004.

Hitchcock began his 10-year stint as Southern League President in August 1971, having been elected by league owners following the sudden death of his predecessor Sam Smith. League presidency represented just another baseball-related chapter in the life of Hitchcock, who had previously spent nine seasons (1942-53) as a major league infielder and parts of five more as a manager in the 1960s.


Almost immediately after taking over league operations from Smith's widow, Louise, Hitchcock began working with league general managers to modernize facilities. Focusing on affordable family entertainment, Hitchcock adopted the mantra still abided by Southern League franchises from Jackson to Jacksonville: "We've got to entertain the fans. Let's have fun."

Before his first full season as president in 1972, Hitchcock abolished the Dixie Association, a three-division joint venture between the Southern and Texas League. Knoxville became the Southern League's eighth team and paved the way for realignment into East and West Divisions. A playoff series between the two division leaders was created to crown a Southern League champion.

Hitchcock revised the playoff format again in 1976 with the addition of the regular season split schedule; providing a playoff series between the division champions of each half that determined the opponents in the Southern League Championship. Doubling the number of teams in postseason play resulted in a sharp increase in attendance, a staple of the Hitchcock era.

With the addition of expansion teams in Nashville and Memphis, the Southern League topped the one million mark in attendance for the first time in 1978. In fact, attendance increased from 434,274 in Hitchcock's first full year in the league to over 1.75 million in his final campaign.

After instituting several improvements that triggered an explosion of popularity in the Southern League, Hitchcock retired following the 1980 season. Even after his death at age 89 in 2006, Hitchcock's legacy remains an integral part of the Southern League's fabric. In 2014, he was named to the inaugural class of the Southern League Hall of Fame.

### OVERVIEW OF THE SOUTHERN LEAGUE

The history of the Southern League can be traced to 1885, when the original eight team Southern League was formed. Although the circuit folded in 1899, the Southern Association formed in 1901 and the South Atlantic League embarked upon its inaugural season three years later. After the Southern Association disbanded in 1961, the South Atlantic League was elevated to Double-A status in 1963. The circuit was renamed the Southern League the following year to correspond with its new classification. It was later decided that all Southern League records would date to the 1964 season.

### THE ORIGINAL SOUTHERN LEAGUE

The original Southern League was formed in 1885 during the early boom of minor league baseball. The league consisted of eight charter members: Atlanta, Augusta, Birmingham, Chattanooga, Columbus, Macon, Memphis, and Nashville. Henry W. Grady, the managing editor of The Atlanta Journal Constitution, was named the league's original president and ran it out of his newspaper office. The original schedule called for teams to play a 100-game season but only two teams reached that mark in 1885. The Atlanta franchise won the first Southern League crown with a mark of 60-31.

Ten other cities were affiliated with the original Southern League over the next 14 years: Charleston, Dallas, Evansville, Little Rock, Mobile, Montgomery, New Orleans, Pensacola, Savannah, and Shreveport. None of the 18 teams participated in every season; however, and the circuit became non-operational in 1891, 1892, and 1897.

Hall of Famers Fred Clarke, Joe McGinnity, and Kid Nichols were a few of the talented players who participated in the league's existence during the late 19th century.

With continuing financial problems and a lack of fan support, the Southern League fielded only four teams for the 1899 season. That campaign endured sporadic play and the midseason move of a franchise from Montgomery to Dallas. Mobile and New Orleans disbanded due to low attendance in June and the remainder of the season was subsequently canceled.

That midseason cancellation in 1899 marked the official end of the original Southern League. With not enough interest or support entering the following season, the league folded for good.

### THE SOUTHERN ASSOCIATION

In 1901, the Southern Association was formed to fill the void left by the original Southern League. There were eight franchises in its inaugural season: Birmingham, Chattanooga, Little Rock, Memphis, Nashville, New Orleans, Selma, and Shreveport. Reed W. Kent was named the first president of the Southern Association, but was succeeded by W. J. Boles and later J. B. Nicklin during the inaugural season. Nashville won the Association's first pennant by finishing the season with an 80-40 record.

The Southern Association was initially very popular. With 3:30 p.m. start times, games were often attended by both businessmen and children alike. But without the aid of stadium lighting, games also needed to be played quickly and averaged just an hour and a half in length.

Several baseball greats spent part of their careers in the Southern Association including Luis Aparicio, Burleigh Grimes, Rogers Hornsby, Joe Jackson, Harmon Killebrew, Eddie Mathews, Casey Stengel, and Pie Traynor. When Southern Association ballparks were vacant, notable Negro League stars such as Satchel Paige and Willie Mays played there.

The Southern Association maintained popularity until the late 1950s. But with the development of major league national radio and television broadcasts in addition to the beginning of network television programming, fans found alternatives to the ballpark. As a result, teams saw a sharp decline in attendance.

Diminished interest ultimately led to storied franchises in Memphis and New Orleans disbanding. With the Southern Association in financial crisis following its 1961 campaign, the Southern Association ultimately folded after 61 continuous seasons.

### THE SOUTH ATLANTIC LEAGUE

Founded by Charles W. Boyer and J.B. Lucy in 1904, the South Atlantic League initially consisted of six teams; the Augusta Tourists, Charleston Sea Gulls, Columbia Skyscrapers, Jacksonville Jays, Macon Highlanders, and Savannah Pathfinders. Each team in the new Class C league played at least 100 games in the inaugural season with just a miniscule 12-man roster limit.


The SALLY League - as it became known - advanced its classification to a Class B league in 1921 and was elevated to Class A status in 1946. Operations were suspended in 1931 due to the Great Depression, but the league reorganized five years later.

In 1953, Hank Aaron, Horace Garner, Felix Mantilla, Al Israel, and Fleming Reedy became the first players to integrate the SALLY League. Aaron paced the league in batting, hits, runs, RBIs, and doubles on his way to being named Most Valuable Player.

In addition to Aaron, Hall of Famers Ty Cobb, Bob Gibson, Goose Goslin, "Shoeless" Joe Jackson, Harmon Killebrew, Phil Niekro, Frank Robinson, Enos Slaughter, Willie Stargell, and Hoyt Wilhelm played during the 59 years of the SALLY League.

In the wake of the Southern Association's disbandment following the 1961 season, just 12 Double-A franchises remained to provide for 20 major league teams. South Atlantic League President Sam Smith led a drive to elevate the league to Double-A status. After Smith added Chattanooga and Nashville to the existing six-team league, the South Atlantic League began play as a Double-A league in 1963.

Since the SALLY League long had been associated with the lower classifications of minor league baseball, the decision was made to rename the league. In 1964, the league took on the resurrected "Southern League" name. The South Atlantic League moniker was unclaimed until 1980, when a new Class A league was formed.





### **EVOLUTION OF THE SOUTHERN LEAGUE**

The modern Southern League began prior to the 1964 season with eight teams. Six teams from the South Atlantic League continued under the new Southern League including Asheville, Charlotte, Chattanooga, Knoxville, Lynchburg, and Macon. New franchises in Birmingham and Columbus rounded out the eight-team circuit. Sam Smith returned as President of the newly renamed league, which featured a 140-game schedule and an All-Star Game played at historic Rickwood Field. Since other leagues had contributed to the history of the Southern League, it was decided that the league would not maintain records prior to the 1964 campaign.

The early years of the modern Southern League were devoid of a playoff format but not excitement. The Birmingham Barons and Lynchburg White Sox provided fans with a thrilling race in the circuit's inaugural season, with Lynchburg winning the pennant by one game.

In the 1960s, Southern League fans were treated to the talents of Bert Campaneris, Vida Blue, Rollie Fingers, Reggie Jackson, Ferguson Jenkins, and Tony La Russa before they became famous on a national stage. Campaneris, Blue, Fingers, and Jackson helped the Oakland Athletics to three consecutive World Series titles in the early 1970s. La Russa managed them to another championship in 1989 before guiding the St. Louis Cardinals to a title in 2007.

Following Smith's sudden death in April 1971, former big league player and manager Billy Hitchcock assumed the Southern League presidency that August. Hitchcock led a rejuvenation of the Southern League that featured many improvements including stadium refurbishments and a concerted effort to make the league more family-friendly. Hitchcock's interests were rewarded with large increases in attendance throughout the league.

Many more great players marched through the Southern League en route to distinguished major league careers, with Eddie Murray, Dale Murphy, Alan Trammell, Lou Whitaker, and Tim Raines among the most notable. The Southern League's attendance soared past the one million mark in 1978 thanks to President Hitchcock's efforts and the abundance of budding stars in the league.

Jimmy Bragan succeeded Hitchcock as President in 1980 and presided over a host of new stadiums in the league including fields in Greenville, Huntsville, Birmingham, and Charlotte. With new venues and future major league stars such as Cal Ripken, Jr., Tom Glavine, Randy Johnson, Don Mattingly, Mark McGwire, Bret Saberhagen, and Terry Steinbach attracting fans, annual attendance steadily climbed toward two million in the 1980s.

Arnold D. Fielkow assumed the Southern League presidency in 1994 after Bragan's retirement and served until February 2000. Don Mincher (a former Major Leaguer and owner of the Huntsville Stars) then became interim President until he was formally elected to the position in the fall of that year. Mincher skippered the league until December 2011, when he retired due to health reasons. Steve DeSalvo, Vice President of the league, then served as interim president until July of 2012 when Lori M. Webb was elected President after having worked various positions in the league office since 1994. She has the distinction of being the first female league President in Minor League Baseball.

The 2015 season marked the inaugural campaign of the Biloxi Shuckers following a move from Joe W. Davis Stadium in Huntsville, where the franchise was known as the Stars from 1985-2014. With the addition of MGM Park, all 10 Southern League stadiums have now been built within the past 25 years.

Following the 2019 Southern League season, the Mobile BayBears franchise will relocate to the Tennessee Valley and rebrand as the Rocket City Trash Pandas. The *Trash Pandas* moniker was suggested by a local fan and voted on during a record-breaking "Name the Team" process. Rocket City will begin play in a state-of-the-art ballpark which is currently under construction in Madison, Alabama. The team will remain affiliated with the Los Angeles Angels until at least the 2022 season.

Thanks to modern facilities, creative promotions, fan-friendly environments, and a tradition of producing quality major league players, the Southern League has drawn over two million fans every season since 1991. As the Southern League enters its 55th season of continued play, we would once again like to thank our supporters for their dedication. It is because of your support that we can continue our mission of bringing professional baseball to fans across the Southeast for years to come.




