



A MESSAGE FROM THE COMMISSIONER

In the three years since its inception, the Senior PGA TOUR has realized dramatic strides, its schedule having practically doubled in size with each succeeding year. In 1980, the first year of Senior PGA TOUR competition, we began with just two co-sponsored events, then grew to five in 1981, to nine in 1982, and we'll contest 14 in 1983.

Counting the other approved championships — the USGA Senior Open and Liberty Mutual Legends of Golf — this year's calendar will encompass 16 official tournaments. Our third "approved" event, the PGA Seniors' Championship, will not be held this year due to Ryder Cup activity at the PGA National Golf Club but the event will return to the schedule in 1984. Also, there remains a handful of unofficial senior tournaments very attractive to our players.

Our mission now would be to polish the product: improve the purses, build on our brief tradition and present the public with the finest senior competition, and on the best courses that we can possibly provide.

Of last year's nine co-sponsored events on the Senior TOUR, eight return to the 1983 schedule, indicating a solid core of success and also the vigor of our very capable tournament sponsors.

Five of the seven new events fall at the start of the 1983 schedule, to be contested in the period of March through June. But one of those early newcomers, the hugely popular Liberty Mutual Legends of Golf, is enjoying its sixth year of competition in Austin, TX.

Also new to the schedule is the Senior TOURNAMENT PLAYERS CHAMPIONSHIP to be played June 9-12 at Canterbury Golf Club in Cleveland, site of the 1973 PGA Championship. It is our intention to pattern the Senior TPC after the one contested on the PGA TOUR, making it our "showcase" event of the year.

Other newcomers are the Daytona Beach Classic, the Hall of Fame Tournament in Pinehurst, the Gatlin Brothers Classic in Reno/Sparks, NV, the Citizens Union Bank Classic at Lexington, KY, and the United Virginia Bank event at Richmond.

Total purses for the 1983 Senior PGA TOUR will exceed the \$3 million mark, reflecting nearly a 100% increase over last year. We count that dollar figure as only one measure of increasing success.

As the Senior TOUR continues to expand into still more portions of North America, we are confident that public enthusiasm for senior pro golf will build proportionately.

VANTAGE SCOREBOARDS

In an age when the revenue from video games could just about wipe out the national deficit, very little in the way of technology surprises us anymore. Grade school children sit with assurance at computer consoles. Psychological studies are commissioned on the soothing effects of Pac-Man on the business executive. And E.T. really CAN phone home.


Nevertheless, the electronic Vantage Scoreboard systems that travel the PGA TOUR are indeed a phenomenon. Not only do they bring status reports, current scores, biographical and statistical information, special reports and messages to players and fans spread out over many acres, but they also survive a gamut of weather conditions as well as the vagaries of travel as the two systems leapfrog around the nation.

Each of the two systems contains 20 scoreboards, one "big board" for the 18th green, two Digital PDP computers, scoring terminals for each green, a 1,000-pound capacity crane, 30,000 feet of cable and all the necessary lesser hardware. It all fits neatly into custom-designed trailers that also house the computer room in the forward end, and the trailers are pulled along the nation's highways by Peterbilt tractors with turbocharged diesel engines.

Since introduced to the TOUR in 1981 through the sponsorship of the R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Company, the Vantage Scoreboards have amazed millions of spectators with the speed and accuracy of the information provided, and more is planned in 1983. As the Vantage Scoreboard computers are made compatible with the TOUR's on-site statistical computer and the main computer system at TOUR headquarters, the scoreboards will be providing more up-to-date information on players' statistical standings, how particular holes are playing in relation to par, and a wealth of other information that will add to the enjoyment of attending a PGA TOUR event.

As part of its ongoing commitment to golf, R.J. Reynolds will also continue to bring the Vantage World of Golf display to tournament cities prior to TOUR events and on-site during the event itself. This modern exhibit includes information and displays on the origin of golf, leading players and tournaments, a film on the PGA TOUR, details on the manufacture of modern golf equipment, a putting green for public use and much more.

The Vantage Scoreboards and the Vantage World of Golf are major components of the PGA TOUR's commitment to attract new interest in the game and to make professional golf the world's greatest spectator sport.



OTHER ACHIEVEMENTS: Member of Ryder Cup team in 1955 and 1961, also serving as captain in '61 . . . PGA Player of the Year in 1961 . . . Among top 60 money winners eight times . . . Won 17 state and regional titles, most of them in California.

After turned pro in 1942, worked in war plant until served in U.S. Army for 14 months in 1944-45, then built a driving range before joined PGA TOUR full-time in 1948 . . . Played Tour full-time through 1962 . . . Playoff victories were in 1953 Azalea (over Chandler Harper) and in 1961 PGA over Don January at Olympia Fields, IL . . . No one at Olympia Fields will forget final day of regulation when he finished birdie-par-birdie to tie companion January, sinking respective putts measuring 25, 40 and 52 feet . . . Then won playoff by one stroke with a 67 . . . Renowned putting teacher of last decade or so, having helped Tom Watson in 1976, before Watson won four straight money titles on PGA TOUR . . . One of few to play all 11 official events on 1982 Senior Tour, and at age 66 played very steadily, with only three rounds above the 70s . . . In contention in PGA Seniors last December, even with par going to 13th hole of third round, but finished 10 over while January won at par 288 . . . On playing the Senior PGA TOUR: "I thoroughly enjoy playing and practicing, and I think the senior events have revitalized a lot of players who had let their games slide."

First Tour victory, in 1964 Cajun Classic, Lafayette, LA, resulted from 65-67 in final two rounds in freezing weather; won by four shots . . . Eleven Tour triumphs recorded in 11 different years; won only Phoenix Open twice . . . Only he and Jack Nicklaus won at least once a year in eight-year span, 1967-74 . . . Although not eligible for senior events until spring of 1981, already holds most official Senior Tour titles, six . . . Last July, won Senior Open at very exacting Portland (OR) GC by four shots, closing with seven birdies and one three-putt bogey for a 65 . . . Won Suntree in October with four straight 66s, five strokes in front of Don January . . . Skipped only Merrill Lynch on 1982 official circuit, and only bad finish (T33 at Syracuse) result of dose of virus that week in August . . . On playing as a senior: "It's like a new career . . . while renewing old friendships in the gallery and with the other players."

In late 1950s was practically uncontested longest hitter on Tour . . . In 1982 as a senior, was three under par and two shots from lead after three rounds at Denver, but closing 75 bumped him back to T9, which remained his top finish of the year . . . Best round of year was closing 5-under 67 at Merrill Lynch/Golf Digest at Newport, RI, for 24th place . . . Says greatly enjoys Senior Tour: "It means an awful lot to us, because the people still recognize the older guys."



Didn't join Tour until age 32, after spending four years in Army in World War II and 10 years in construction work . . . One of classic swingers of golf club in game's history, but bothered all his life with arthritis in upper back . . . Best remembered exploits included first victory, in 1951 North & South, when beat Cary Middlecoff by three shots, and 1958 U.S. Open at Southern Hills, Tulsa, when beat Gary Player by four in 95-degree heat during double-round final day . . . In June, 1981, moved to Evening Shade, AK, 130 miles north of Little Rock, at least partly because of outdoor sports in Ozark Mountains . . . In 1982 as senior, withdrew after two rounds at Peter Jackson and didn't play again, because of back miseries . . . Hopes to play more in 1983, but . . . "I've already won all the senior golf tournaments . . . I'm not going to play unless I can win."



Among top 60 money winners 1951-69 and 1971, leading in 1952 and 1955 . . . Member of PGA Tournament Committee 1958-60 . . . Won Canada Cup 1952 (with Jim Turnesa) and World Cup 1968 (with Lee Trevino) . . . Inducted in PGA Hall of Fame 1974 and World Golf Hall of Fame 1982.

Modest tie for 59th place at Pleasant Valley in 1977, and a check for \$493.75, finally pushed him over million-dollar mark in official career earnings, 14th player to do so at the time . . . Claims he should have won his first Tour event, 1950 U.S. Open at Merion, but finished 77-74 for ninth place . . . Finally won first Tour triumph at 1952 U.S. Open at Northwood CC in Dallas, and added 1963 Open at Brookline, MA (in playoff) and 1968 PGA Championship in San Antonio, latter at age 48 . . . Last year as senior, barely eight months after quintuple by-pass heart surgery (Dec. 20, 1981), placed fifth at Jeremy Ranch in August, then, in early December, lost PGA Seniors by only one stroke to Don January, concluding remarkable year . . . Was driving ball about 240 yards last fall, or almost as far as before surgery.

PGA TOUR MEDIA REGULATIONS

General Regulations

The following regulations are to be followed by *all* members of the Media:

1. Remain close up against gallery ropes in such a way as to appear to be a part of the gallery at all times. An ARM BAND is necessary.
2. Players are not to be distracted during play. DO NOT interview players or ask them to pose for photographs during their round.
3. DO NOT interview players or ask them to pose for photographs during their practice sessions prior to their round except by prior arrangement with the player.
4. Do not disturb players at their 18th green and/or scoring tent until after they have checked, signed and returned their scorecards.

Working Press Regulations

To avoid embarrassment to you and distraction to the contestants:

1. Do not walk or stand in playing areas.
2. Follow directions of marshals and other officials.
3. Do not interview during play. The leading players each day — and other requested — will be interviewed following their rounds in the Press Room interview area.

Tape Recorder Regulations

1. All tape recorder work should be done in the proximity of the Press Room and/or Clubhouse.
2. Tape recorders are *NOT* permitted in the locker room.
3. Tape recorders are *NOT* permitted within the playing area of the golf course.
4. If an interview is to be taped in the practice areas, either the range or the putting green, it must be done by prior arrangement with the player and up against the ropes and *NOT* in the middle of the areas where it could be distracting to other players.

PHOTOGRAPHY REGULATIONS

This Tournament is essentially for the players and spectators. Fair play requires that there be no noise or other distractions. The interests of all others must be subordinated to the players interests. The result of any one shot could decide the Tournament.

Only accredited photographers for RECOGNIZED NEWS MEDIA will be permitted to take pictures during the Tournament. Photography will be restricted to news use. Commercial and personal photography is prohibited (except that spectators may take pictures on practice days and during a Pro-Am).

The following regulations apply to accredited news and television photographers and motion picture cameramen as a condition of the privilege of taking pictures:

General — All Photographers

A photographer must not ask a player to pose during a round.

If a player or an official requests that no photographs be taken in a certain situation, the request must be honored immediately, without discussion.

A camera must not be pointed at a player about to make a stroke in any manner which might tend to disturb him or distract his attention.

At the 9th and the 18th greens, photographers must not approach, delay or distract a player until he has checked, signed and returned his scorecard to the proper official. Under the Rules of Golf, a player turning in an incorrect scorecard in stroke play may be disqualified.

Cameras are not permitted in the locker room.

PHOTOGRAPHY REGULATIONS (cont'd)

Still Photographers

Only still photographers to whom arm bands have been issued will be permitted inside gallery lines. They must station themselves immediately inside such lines, and not more than an ARM'S LENGTH FROM THE LINES, so as to blend into the gallery and appear to be part of the gallery. They must not take conspicuous positions in the open.

Any photographer who violates this regulation will forfeit the right to enter gallery lines and possibly to work at the tournament.

Close-up action shots are prohibited.

All pictures must be taken at appreciable distances, as far from the players as possible and from angles which are not acute to the line of play.

Pictures, even from a distance, may not be made until the player has completed his stroke. The photographer must not release his camera shutter until the shot is made.

Motion Picture/Videotape Photographers

Motion or videotape pictures may be taken only from *outside gallery lines* or from areas designated by the PGA TOUR. Motion pictures or videotape may be taken from such locations during a stroke.

Only modern equipment which makes a minimum of noise can be used. Motion picture cameras must be equipped with noise-deadening blimps or hoods.

Use of golf carts by news or television photographers is not permitted during play.

A maximum of two working camera crew members will be permitted per camera.

* * *

Difficulties will be avoided if photographers are fair and will treat players as they themselves would wish to be treated in similar circumstances.

The cooperation of all photographers will be appreciated.
