



WEEK 6 PREVIEW AGAINST NEW ENGLAND FREE JACKS

Old Glory Hopes to Break the Schneid Against New England

When Old Glory DC takes the pitch on Sunday at Segra Field against New England Free Jacks, it will look to break a two-game losing streak and get back to 0.500 with a win. Both teams are coming off close losses, but DC has something to prove to itself, its fan base, and the league. The action unfolds Sunday at 3:30 pm EST in Leesburg, Va., and will be broadcast on Fox Sports One. The match will be streamed on The Rugby Network only in Canada and Internationally. Additionally, this weekend is the first of Old Glory's themed days with a Celtic and Club Heritage Celebration. More about the gameday experience is below.

The 38-34 loss to New York last weekend was disappointing, but head coach Andrew Douglas



knows his team is on the right trajectory. "Two lost lineouts, two lost scrums, three silly penalties in the last ten minutes of a tight game. If you make those types of errors, we are not going to cross the line. We have to be better with closing that down. We created opportunities. We just didn't capitalize."

The loss was not for nothing, as the team had its best offensive output of the season, with 34 points and five tries. One of the biggest contributing factors was going for the try instead of points on penalties.

"As you saw, we're going for more lineout drives than penalties to score. It paid off for us on the weekend," Douglas added. "Our forwards are better and stronger, and, although we didn't get it right all the time, we scored two tries from close-in plays with lineouts. I think it's going to be a real

weapon for us."

With New England on deck this Sunday, Old Glory has signed Thomas Morani and Osea Kolinisau to bolster the depth and experience of the backline. Morani, an Argentinian midfielder who cut his teeth playing outsidecenter for Top 12 side CUBA, is on a short-term loan from the Houston SaberCats. Kolinisau, the captain of the Olympic Gold Medal Fijian 7s side, has played the last three years with Houston and will help in the back three.

"It's going to be a pretty tight game based on lineups," Douglas said. "Danny and Jason play a massive part in making sure our game is well-managed, we are driving across the park, and playing in the right parts of the field. It will be a good test against New England. I think the game will be won upfront, to be honest. It's whoever is controlling territory and possession is generally the team that is going to come out on top, especially with teams with similar outlines."

As for Sunday's opponent, the Free Jacks have had a roller-coaster season with a loss to LA, a shutout over Houston, and a pair of one-point decisions where they split the results. This past weekend, New England played in a rain-soaked mess at NOLA and lost 30-29. It was a contentious match that saw six lead changes. Ultimately, it came down to who had the ball last, and the Gold came out on top.

"[New England] is a structured side, organized, and has threats across the board," Douglas stated. "The likes of Beaudein Waaka and Dougie Fife are dangerous players and also have good ball-carrying back rows in Joe Johnston and the Canadian captain Josh Larsen... They are pretty tidy and bring the heat on defense with their line speed. We have to be aware of that probably more so than the last two weeks."

Like Old Glory's halfback tandem, the Free Jacks have a skillful duo in John Poland and Harrison Boyle. Poland isn't afraid to scrap it up, and Boyle was very busy against NOLA in week 5. Outside



center Poasa Waqanibau is a big hitter on defense, and Tera Mtembu is just getting his feet wet with the club. New England actively finds creative ways to utilize Fife's talents on the wing as he is among the MLR league leaders with five tries.

In the forwards, eightman Wian Conradie leads by example with 14 carries for 67 meters and 14 tackles versus NOLA. Captain Josh Larsen and lock Jackson Thiebes are beasts on defense with 13 tackles each last week. New England will be without flanker Joe Johnston who is serving the final game of his suspension.

The keys to the game for Old Glory will be to score first, avoid a slugfest, work on ball retention, go for tries more than penalties, and execute when it matters most. For the Free Jacks, they need to slow down the ball, take advantage of the younger players in the back three, and use their experience to their benefit.

Sunday marks the first themed day, Celtic and Club Heritage

Celebration, at Segra Field. When the gates open at 1:30 pm, Old Glory invites its fans in celebrating their own rugby clubs by wearing their club jerseys and t-shirts, celebrate our partners in the Scottish Rugby Union across the pond with SRU gear, or more generally represent with Irish, Welsh, or other Celtic-themed rugby kits. Scottish Rugby jerseys will be available for purchase along with a limited-edition Old Glory DC Celtic-inspired shirt, and bagpipers will perform during pre-game and at halftime. Players and clubs are encouraged to bring their banners and club flags to the stadium.





Head Coach Andrew Douglas names the 23-man squad to face New England Free Jacks this today at 3:30 PM Eastern. Flanker Mungo Mason and center Thretton Palamo will co-captain the team this season. Thomas Morani, Osea Kolinisau, and Cory Daniel will earn their Old Glory and Major League Rugby caps.

The forward pack remains unchanged with familiar faces. The faithful front row consists of Jamie Dever, Mikey Sosene-Feagai, and Stevey Longwell. Locks Tevita Naqali and Stan South see the start at second row. Jamason Fa'anana-Schultz, Cal-



lum Gibbins, and Mungo Mason will safeguard and ambush at back row.

Danny Tusitala and Jason Robertson will continue to renew the connection that set the MLR aflame last season. Thomas Morani and Thretton Palamo will duet in the center. Utility back Renata Roberts Te-Nana and Olympian Osea Kolinisau start at wing. Fullback Mike Dabulas will stand at the last line of defense.



Salad Days

Nothing heralds the arrival of spring like the bright flavors of crisp, crunchy salads. Take a gander at some of our favorites and toss up something fabulous.

As any food lover knows, salad is so much more than a mound of greens on a plate. Depending on the ingredients, salads can serve as appetizers, main courses, and when made with fruit, dessert. They're the ideal creative medium for cooks who delight in nutritious foods—and especially satisfying for those of us who grow our own vegetables. In fact, perhaps more than with any other recipe, fresh produce matters when you're making salads, and if you can get to your local farmers' market to buy your ingredients, all the better.

POACHED EGG SALAD WITH LEEKS AND MUSTARD VINAIGRETTE

This simple recipe ingeniously pairs sous vide eggs (the best way to cook eggs, we think!) with steamed leeks. It also calls for homemade croutons made from a sourdough bread and a simple Dijon mustard vinaigrette. To serve, combine the leeks with fresh radish (for a hit of crisp zestiness) and top with the eggs and croutons. Sophisticated and absolutely delicious.

WOOD SKIN HALIBUT & CHICKPEA SALAD

A main course dish that's light and flavorful, this recipe conjures up a Middle Eastern mood thanks to fiery harissa and fresh lemon. You'll need cedar paper for this recipe, soaked in white wine and placed with the halibut in a sous vide bath for 17 minutes. The fish is then quickly seared on a non-stick pan. Chickpeas, first soaked overnight, also get the sous vide treatment, and are later tossed with cucumber, fresh parsley, mint, and a harissa vinaigrette. The combination of ingredients is delightful.



MICHEL RICHARD'S TUNA & COMPRESSED WATERMELON SALAD

Pay tribute to the late, great Michel Richard with this inventive salad. Here, compressed watermelon (you'll need a vacuum sealer) is paired with raw tuna for a simply elegant presentation. These main ingredients shine bright on the palette thanks to a yuzu vinaigrette. All ingredients for the vinaigrette dressing are commonly found in the pantry, with the exception of yuzu juice and xanthan gum. Garnish with scallions, sesame seeds, Bibb lettuce, and green tobiko for next-level wow.



GRILLED SALAD WITH BEER-HONEY VINAIGRETTE AND GOUDA SPREAD

Impress your taste buds—and any guests—with this flavorful salad. Belgian endive, romaine lettuce, and fennel are prepared to perfection thanks to 45 minutes in a sous vide circulator and 6 minutes on a grill. Served with a fantastic beer-honey vinaigrette and a homemade Gouda spread—that's also prepared through sous vide—it's a winning salad that works any time of year.

AS A CYBERSECURITY PROFESSIONAL, WHAT HAVE YOU LEARNED FROM RUGBY?



Rules of Rugby 15

Two teams of 15 players have 80 minutes to advance the ball past their opponents' side of the field (pitch) and touch it to the ground for a score worth 5 points (try). Participants may only pass the ball backwards or sideways with no blocking allowed; using a variety of phases such as lineouts, mauls, rucks and scrums to retain possession during play. Rugby is unique in that play is continuous even after players are tackled on the field. Kicking is the only method by which both teams may move the ball forward.

After each try, worth 5 points, the scoring team is allowed an opportunity to kick the ball through the posts for an additional 2 points (conversion). Certain penalties also earn the non-offending team a kick through the posts, worth 3 points (penalty) if made. At the conclusion of the match, the team with the most points wins.

Loose Play

MAUL A maul occurs when a player carrying the ball is held by one or more opponents, and one or more of the ball-carrier's teammates bind on the ball-carrier.

BUCK A ruck happens when one or more players from each team, who are on their feet and in contact, close around the ball on the ground. Once a ruck is formed, players can't use their hands to get the ball, only their feet.

THE SET PIECE

The set piece is a means of restarting the game.

SCRUM A contest for the ball involving eight players who bind together and push against the other team's eight for possession of the ball.

LINE-CUT Looks somewhat like a jumpball in basketball, with both teams lining up opposite each other, but one team then throws the ball down the middle of the tunnel.

WHY DID THE WHISTLE BLOW?

OFFSIDE Rugby's affside law restricts where on the field players can be, to ensure there is space to attack and defend. In general, a player is in an offside position if that player is further forward (nearer to the opponents' goal line) than the teammate who is carrying the ball or the teammate who last played the ball. Being in an offside position is not, in itself, an offence, but an offside player may not take part in the game until they are on-side again. If an offside player takes part in the game, that player will be penalized.

FORWARD PASS OR KNOCK ON Sometimes an attack which seems to be heading towards the try line will be stopped by the referee's whistle. If a pass has gone forwards, or a handling error has resulted in a knock-on, a scrum will have been awarded to the non-offending team.

FAILURE TO RELEASE PLAYER OR BALL After a tackle, the tackler must immediately release the ball carrier, and the ball carrier must immediately release the ball. Failure on either of these counts limits a fair contest for possession. If release does not occur within a reasonable time frame, the referee will award a penalty to the

FAILURE TO ROLL AWAY Any players on the ground when a ruck or maul is formed must immediately roll away from the ball, so as to allow continuity of play for the team in possession. Failure to do so will result in the award of a penalty to the non-offending team.

JOINING RUCK/MAUL FROM THE SIDE When joining a ruck or maul, all players must do so from behind the feet of the last teammate. If they join from the side, they are in an offside position and taking part in the game, then this will immediately be penalized, then a penalty will be awarded to the apposing team.


UN-PLAYABLE BALL IN RUCK OR MAUL. If the ball becomes un-playable in a ruck or maul, e.g., underneath players on the ground, but neither team is at fault, the referee will award a scrum to the team who was in possession before the ruck or maul was formed.


