

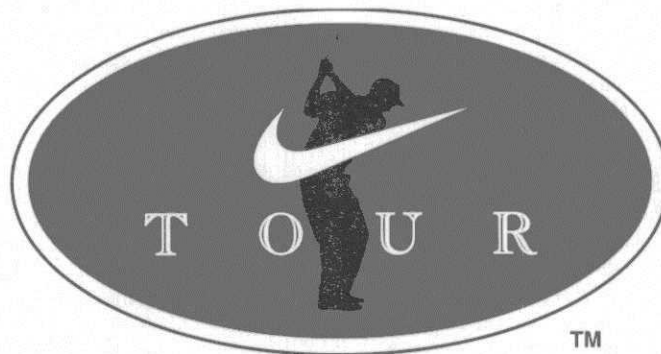

NIKE TOUR GETS NEW LOOK

A new-look NIKE TOUR logo was introduced October 19, 1996, replacing the original NIKE TOUR logo that had been in place since 1993.

"Nike believes that logos are a very powerful communications tool, and we think that the new logo is very appealing," said Rod Tallman, Director of Golf Marketing for Nike, Inc. "We feel the new logo is more contemporary and is more consistent with the changes we've made with our corporate logo."

Nike dropped the company name from its corporate logo and now uses only its familiar swoosh for a logo.

The new logo also is more practical for use by the NIKE TOUR tournaments.

"The new logo has been simplified, and from a practical standpoint it will be easier for tournaments to have the logo crested on their apparel," said Tallman. "It's fresher and will be much more appealing to consumers as they begin to see it on garments and hats."

"Nike is clearly an innovative, cutting edge marketer," said Leo McCullagh, Vice President of Marketing and Retail Licensing for the PGA TOUR. "It has always been our feeling that their marketing savvy and wherewithal would be good not only for the NIKE TOUR but for golf in general. The new logo is a very small but poignant example of this. They are always striving to be better."

A MESSAGE FROM Nike

THE PARTNERSHIP CONTINUES



In August 1996, Nike, Inc. Chairman and CEO Philip H. Knight faced the media and exclaimed, "Anybody who has questioned Nike's commitment to the game of golf ought to think again!"

Knight was, of course, referring to the news that Nike had come to terms with Tiger Woods, arguably the greatest amateur golfer ever.

But Knight just as easily could have been referring to Nike's allegiance to the game itself and the tremendously successful NIKE TOUR. The NIKE TOUR was founded in 1990, and Nike began its title sponsorship with the 1993 season.

The NIKE TOUR started as a collective effort to offer quality competition and raise money for local charities. It now has grown into a very competitive tour with high-quality players, many of whom are just a single stroke from joining the PGA TOUR.

Two graduates of the NIKE TOUR finished in the top 10 on the PGA TOUR money list in 1996. Tom Lehman, NIKE TOUR Player of the Year in 1991, was the PGA TOUR Player of the Year in 1996 with a record \$1,780,159 in earnings. David Duval, a 1995 graduate, finished 10th on the TOUR's 1996 money list.

Entering 1997, 21 former NIKE TOUR players have won on the PGA TOUR: Woody Austin, Guy Boros, John Daly, Ernie Els, Jim Furyk, Paul Goydos, Mike Heinen, Brian Henninger, Tim Herron, Greg Kraft, Tom Lehman, Steve Lowery, Jeff Maggert, Jim McGovern, John Morse, Clarence Rose, Mike Springer, Paul Stankowski, Mike Standly, Ted Tryba and Willie Wood.

Recognizing the top quality of players on the NIKE TOUR, the PGA TOUR Policy Board increased from 10 to 15 the number of positions on the final NIKE TOUR money list to earn PGA TOUR cards the following year.

"We believe in the spirit of competition as represented by the NIKE TOUR," said Knight. "Our focus, as it is in other sports, is leveling the playing fields and providing playing opportunities. We want to help the PGA TOUR continue to do the right thing for golf."

Purses on the NIKE TOUR have grown from \$3 million in 1990 to \$6.4 million in 1997. Additionally, charitable donations from the NIKE TOUR total \$9.5 million since 1990, with \$1.3 million raised in 1996 alone.

On a national level, charities that benefit from the NIKE TOUR are the Boys and Girls Clubs of America and Special Olympics. Local charities also benefit from each of the 30 tournaments throughout the year.

The NIKE TOUR will sport a new look this year as the original NIKE TOUR logo has been replaced by a more stylish design: fresher, simplified and more practical for TOUR officials and consumers alike.

The NIKE TOUR has experienced an increase in success since Nike became involved in 1993, and the partnership is set through the year 2000. Nike would like to acknowledge the players, corporate sponsors, media members and community groups throughout the TOUR for the continued growth and success of the NIKE TOUR.

A HISTORY OF THE NIKE TOUR

Even the most optimistic person couldn't have foreseen the success of the NIKE TOUR when it kicked off its inaugural season on Thursday, February 2, 1990, at 7:30 a.m. PST at Bakersfield (CA) Country Club.

The NIKE TOUR began under corporate sponsorship of the Ben Hogan Company as the Ben Hogan Tour. The idea of former PGA TOUR Commissioner Deane Beman, the NIKE TOUR was designed as a proving ground for up-and-coming golfers, as well as a place for PGA TOUR veterans to hone their skills as they prepared for the Senior PGA TOUR.

That first event was won by Mike Springer, who went on to win two more times that year and finish fourth on the money list. For the first two years of the NIKE TOUR, the top-five money-winners were awarded PGA TOUR membership. Beginning in 1992, the PGA TOUR Tournament Policy Board voted that, due to the success graduating players had on the PGA TOUR, the number would be increased to 10.

In 1990, Springer was joined by Jim McGovern, Dick Mast, Ed Humenik and leading money-winner and Player of the Year Jeff Maggert in the first graduating class.

However, the player who made the biggest impact on the PGA TOUR from the 1990 Ben Hogan Tour was John Daly, winner of the only Ben Hogan Tour Qualifying Tournament. Daly won the PGA Championship as a rookie and went on to finish 17th on the 1991 PGA TOUR money list. Since then he has added three more victories, including another major championship, the 1995 British Open.

It was on the 1991 Ben Hogan Tour that Tom Lehman first established himself as a top-flight player. After two nondescript years on the PGA TOUR in the early 1980s, Lehman won a tournament on the 1990 Ben Hogan Tour. But 1991 was the breakthrough season in his comeback. Lehman won three times that year and was the circuit's leading money winner. Graduating to the PGA TOUR in 1992, he has been one of the TOUR's most spectacular performers over the past five seasons. In 1996 he won the British Open and THE TOUR Championship on his way to a single-season earnings record with \$1,780,159 and PGA TOUR Player of the Year honors.

Californian John Flannery was the dominant player on the 1992 Ben Hogan Tour, winning three times and leading in earnings with \$164,114. Flannery's successful campaign made him the Ben Hogan Tour's third Player of the Year.

The big news of 1992 didn't happen on the golf course. It was announced on August 26, 1992 that Nike, Inc. would take over sponsorship of the Ben Hogan Tour beginning with the 1993 season.

A HISTORY OF THE NIKE TOUR (continued)

Sean Murphy was the star of the 1993 NIKE TOUR. He set records for wins in a season with four, career victories with five and single-season earnings with \$166,293.

While Murphy was busy setting records, his fellow NIKE TOUR alumni were busy making names for themselves on the PGA TOUR. Daly already had collected his second career win in the 1992 B.C. Open, and others were beginning to earn their own hardware. McGovern, Mike Standly and Maggert all collected PGA TOUR titles in 1993, while Springer and Greg Kraft each grabbed an unofficial win.

Since 1994, a minimum of six NIKE TOUR alumni have won each year on the PGA TOUR, including Lehman and Daly's three combined major championships.

The NIKE TOUR Championship also was established in 1993 as a climax to the season. Rookie David Duval won the first NIKE TOUR Championship, which features the top-50 money-winners during the year.

On the 1994 NIKE TOUR, Chris Perry showed that consistency has its own rewards. Although six players collected multiple victories that year to Perry's lone title in the NIKE Utah Classic, his peers recognized his consistent strong play over the course of the season by selecting him NIKE TOUR Player of the Year. Perry upped the single-season earnings record to \$167,148 and collected 10 top-10 finishes. He made every cut that season, and began 1997 with a current streak of 31 consecutive finishes in the money.

The 1994 NIKE TOUR season saw a number of firsts. In June, Tommy Armour III became the first player to win back-to-back tournaments when he captured the NIKE Miami Valley Open and NIKE Cleveland Open in consecutive weeks. Jerry Haas accomplished the same feat later in the year, when he won the NIKE Tri-Cities Open and followed it with a victory in the NIKE Sonoma County Open.

During the second round of the 1994 NIKE Shreveport Open, Omar Uresti set a record with nine consecutive birdies that stands not only as the NIKE TOUR standard, but also is better than the records on the PGA TOUR, Senior PGA TOUR and PGA European Tour.

In May, Vic Wilk became the only lefthander to win a NIKE TOUR event when he was victorious in the NIKE Knoxville Open.

Jerry Kelly continued the trend of the leading money-winner setting an earnings record in 1995, when he earned \$188,878 to better Perry's year-old mark. Besides winning twice, Kelly posted 15 top-10 finishes.



A HISTORY OF THE NIKE TOUR (continued)

Celebrated amateur Allen Doyle played the NIKE TOUR after turning professional in the spring of 1995. Doyle won his second event, the NIKE Mississippi Gulf Coast Classic, and added two more titles on his way to a second-place finish on the money list. In 1996 he was the oldest rookie in PGA TOUR history at age 47.

The 1995 season also saw Franklin Langham set the record for earnings in a single season without a victory. Langham earned \$158,990.

Hugh Royer III won twice in 1995, making him the only player in NIKE TOUR history to have multiple victories in two separate seasons.

Early in 1996, there was big news off the golf course as Nike and the PGA TOUR announced that their agreement for sponsorship of the NIKE TOUR had been extended through the year 2000.

Stewart Cink was the story of the 1996 NIKE TOUR season. The 1995 College Player of the Year became the only NIKE TOUR player to earn more than \$200,000 in a season when he made \$251,699. Cink won three times, including the season-ending NIKE TOUR Championship, and collected 14 top-10 finishes in only 21 events.

Michael Christie also was dominant in 1996, collecting three wins. In his victory in Greenville, SC, Christie matched the NIKE TOUR record for most strokes under par in a 72-hole tournament. He matched the 54-hole tournament record when he won the NIKE Utah Classic. Christie's win at the NIKE Permian Basin Open, his second of the year, ended a NIKE TOUR-record streak of 22 different winners to start the season.

P.H. Horgan III, seventh on the money list, and Skip Kendall, ninth, joined Olin Browne and Sean Murphy to finish in the top 10 of the money list twice.

Following the conclusion of the 1996 NIKE TOUR season, the PGA TOUR Policy Board passed two items relevant to the NIKE TOUR.

Beginning with the current season, the number of graduates from the NIKE TOUR money list will increase from 10 to the top-15 players on the 1997 NIKE TOUR money list.

Also new in 1997 is the "Battlefield Promotion" rule, which states that any NIKE TOUR player, upon earning his third victory in a single season, immediately earns a PGA TOUR card and will be placed in the category consisting of Qualifying Tournament graduates from the previous year.

Commissioner Tim Finchem said these actions were further indication of the success and growth of the NIKE TOUR and credited the success of former NIKE TOUR players on the PGA TOUR for those actions.

PGA TOUR POLICY BOARD

The PGA TOUR Policy Board establishes goals and policies for the operation of the PGA TOUR. The nine-member Board is composed of the following:

Four Player Directors elected by the PGA TOUR membership. A Player Director also serves as Vice President of the PGA of America.

Four Independent Directors, representing the public interest. One serves as Chairman of the Board.

One PGA of America Director, who is a national officer of the PGA of America.

A Players Advisory Council consults with the Policy Board.

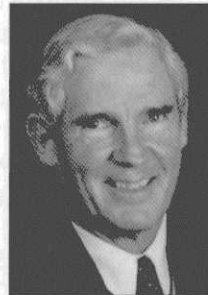

Timothy W. Finchem became the third Commissioner in PGA TOUR history on June 1, 1994.

Finchem, 49, succeeded Deane R. Beman, who had served as Commissioner for 20 years. The late Joseph C. Dey was the first Commissioner of the PGA TOUR, serving from 1969 until 1974.

A 7-handicapper, Finchem combines a love of the game and a respect for its traditions with a vision that will carry the PGA TOUR successfully into the future. In 1995, he oversaw a restructuring designed to prepare the TOUR to move forward into the 21st century and expand golf's international horizons.

A graduate of the University of Virginia School of Law, Finchem began his career as an associate of the Norfolk, VA law firm of Babalas & Ermlich in 1973 and became a partner in the firm of Croshaw, Finchem and Williams in Virginia Beach, VA in 1976.

Finchem served in the White House as the Deputy Advisor to the President for Economic Affairs in 1978 and 1979, then became National Staff Director of the Carter-Mondale Presidential Campaign in 1980.

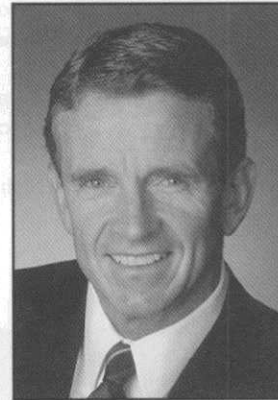
In 1981, Finchem became President of Beckel, Finchem, Torricelli and Associates before becoming co-founder of National Strategies and Marketing Group, a Washington, DC consulting and marketing firm, in 1984. He was a consultant to the PGA TOUR while with NSMG.

Finchem joined the TOUR staff as Vice President of Business Affairs in 1987 and became Deputy Commissioner and Chief Operating Officer in 1989.

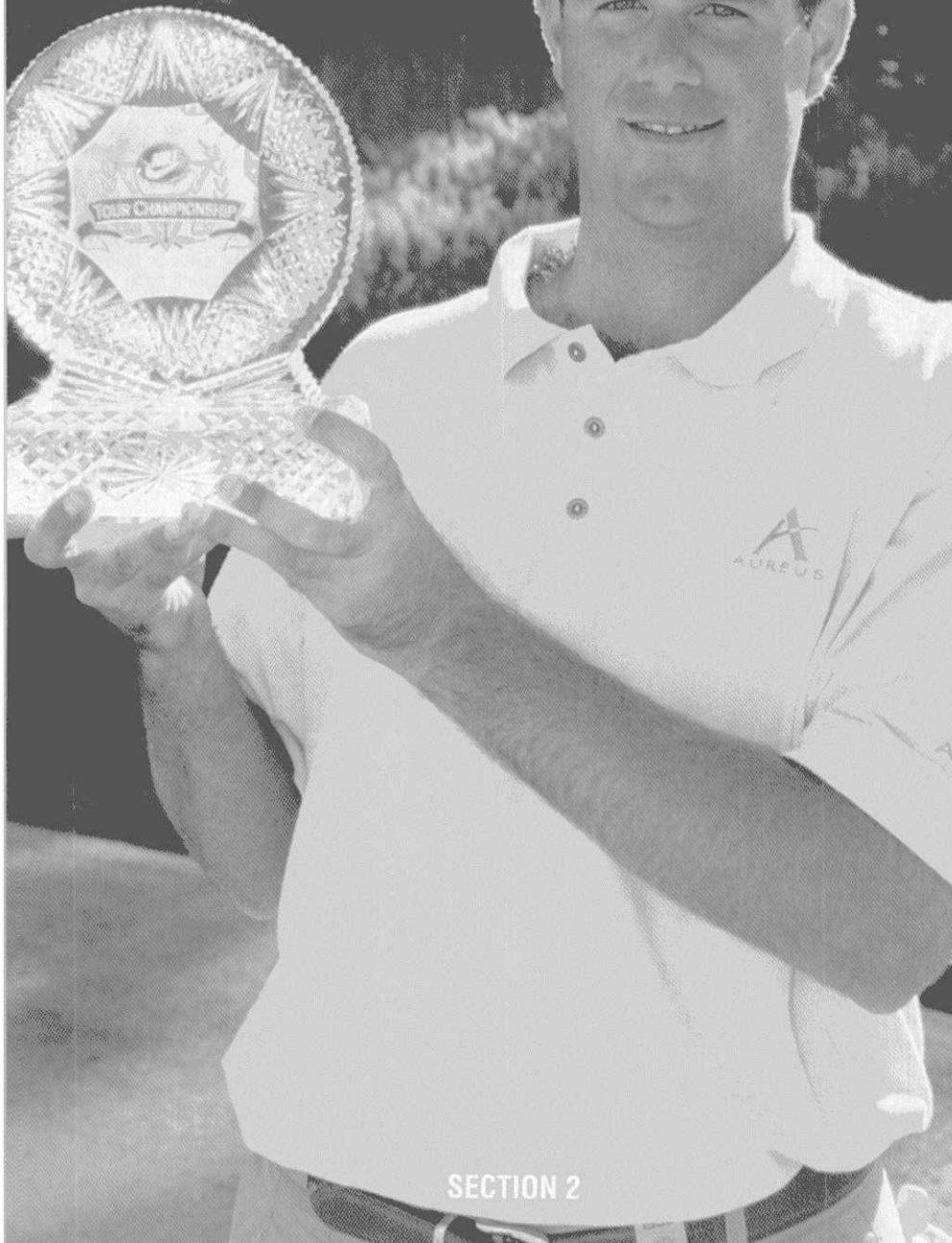

He attended the University of Richmond on a debate scholarship and received his Bachelor of Arts degree from the school in 1969. Stewart Cink began the 1996 season as a non-exempt member and became NIKE TOUR Player of the Year. After losing a playoff at the season-opening event in San Jose, Cink went on to post three wins, including the NIKE TOUR Championship, and shattered the single-season earnings mark with \$251,699. In doing so, he became the first to earn more than \$200,000 in a NIKE TOUR season.

3. Top 40 & Ties from Qualifying Tournament

If not eligible for the PGA TOUR event in the same week, the Top 40 finishers and ties from the previous year's Qualifying Tournament and those finishing sixth through 10th on the previous year's NIKE TOUR Official Money List. NOTE: In the event an unusually high number of such players commits to an event, adjustments will be made as follows:

a) Fields will be increased as necessary, up to a maximum of 156 or such other number permitted by available daylight;

b) Exempt players from Open Qualifying and PGA Section categories will be reduced on an alternating basis, beginning with the eighth PGA Section player and then the 14th Open Qualifier, etc., until four spots are reduced from each category; thereafter, an additional six Open Qualifying spots will be reduced (neither category will be reduced to fewer than four players)

c) NIKE TOUR exempt players within the Top 70 (available) category will be made non-exempt from the last player in the category upward.

4. PGA National Office Selections

Five members of the PGA selected on a competitive basis by the PGA National Office.

5. Open Qualifying

Fourteen (14) low scorers at open qualifying.

[NOTE: The final number of Open Qualifying spots will be determined as of the commitment deadline on the Friday preceding the tournament. If necessary to accommodate commitments from fully exempt player categories, the number of Open Qualifying spots may be reduced from 14 to a floor of four (4).] In 72-hole tournaments, PGA Sections conducting the open qualifying competitions will be required to conduct them at a site other than the tournament site.

6. Host PGA Section Selections

Eight members of the PGA Section in which the event is held, selected on a competitive basis by such host PGA Section.

7. Sponsor Exemptions

On invitation of the local tournament, a maximum of two players, including amateurs with USGA handicaps of two (2) or less. On invitation of Nike, Inc., three additional players.

8. Top Finishers from Previous Year

If not otherwise exempt, players finishing 11th to 25th on the final official NIKE TOUR money list from the previous year.

9. Top 25 Finishers from Previous Event

11. PGA TOUR Members Age 40-49

If needed to fill the field, PGA TOUR members ages 40-49 who are eligible for PGA TOUR open events pursuant to PGA TOUR Tournament Regulations, in the order of their eligibility into PGA TOUR open events.

12. PGA TOUR Members Not Exempt for the Current PGA TOUR Event

If needed to fill the field, PGA TOUR members who are not eligible for the PGA TOUR event occurring simultaneously with the NIKE TOUR event, and who are eligible for the PGA TOUR open and invitational events in accordance with Sections A.1(a) through (f) of Article III of the PGA TOUR Tournament Regulations, in the order of their eligibility for the PGA TOUR open events.

13. Life/Past Champion Members of PGA TOUR

If needed to fill the field, Life Members and Past Champions of the PGA TOUR, even if eligible for the PGA TOUR event occurring simultaneously with the NIKE TOUR event, in order of the total number of PGA TOUR cosponsored and approved tournaments won, excluding team or other events not conferring official victory status.

14. Special Temporary Members of PGA TOUR

If needed to fill the field, PGA TOUR Special Temporary Members, even if eligible for the PGA TOUR event occurring simultaneously with the NIKE TOUR event, in the order in which such players have qualified for such Special Temporary Membership on the PGA TOUR.

15. PGA TOUR Team Championship Winners

If needed to fill the field, winners of PGA TOUR cosponsored team championship tournaments, even if eligible for the PGA TOUR event occurring simultaneously with the NIKE TOUR event, in the order of total number of team championship tournaments won.

NIKE INLAND EMPIRE OPEN NOTES

Last year marked the first time the NIKE Inland Empire Open was able to complete 72 holes as scheduled. In both 1994 and 1995, weather shortened the event to 54 holes. Weather was a factor at the site of the 1996 Monday qualifier, however. When players arrived at Sun Lakes CC, they found the course unplayable due to snow. The Monday qualifier was moved to the Moreno Valley Ranch GC, host course for the tournament.

Jim Estes became the third consecutive NIKE Inland Empire Open champion to collect his first NIKE TOUR victory in that tournament. Estes defeated **Rob Moss**, who was bidding to become only the second lefthander in NIKE TOUR history to win, by one stroke.

Moreno Valley Ranch GC is the site of two of the toughest holes on the NIKE TOUR. The 465-yard, par-4 10th hole ranked as the seventh toughest hole in 1996, while the 474-yard, par-4 14th ranked 14th.

When **Ron Stockton** played in last year's NIKE Inland Empire Open, his family became the first to play on all three TOURs simultaneously. Father **Dave Stockton** tied for fourth in the Senior PGA TOUR's FHP Health Care Classic, while older brother **Dave Stockton, Jr.** missed the cut at the PGA TOUR's Doral-Ryder Open.

Dustin Phillips recorded a rare double-eagle in the first round of last year's NIKE Inland Empire Open. Phillips holed a 3-wood from 237 yards on the 12th hole for the first of three double-eagles on the 1996 NIKE TOUR. **Rick Cramer** (NIKE Shreveport Open) and **Pat Bates** (NIKE Gateway Classic) also had double-eagles.

NIKE MONTERREY OPEN NOTES

History bodes well for the champion of the NIKE Monterrey Open. All four previous winners finished in the top-10 on the money list to advance to the PGA TOUR the following year. Olin Browne finished seventh on the 1993 money list, Scott Gump second in 1994, Stuart Appleby fifth in 1995 and David Berganio, Jr. fourth in 1996. For tournaments with more than three years of play, only the NIKE Upstate Classic (formerly NIKE Greater Greenville Open) also can make that claim.

***Rafael Alarcon**, of Guadalajara, Mexico, has finished second each of the past two years in the only NIKE TOUR event held in his homeland. Alarcon lost a six-hole playoff to **Stuart Appleby** in 1995 and tied for second with three other players, one stroke behind **David Berganio, Jr.**, last year.*

***Olin Browne** delivered his victory speech in Spanish following his win in 1993. Browne's father is a native Chilean and the family often speaks Spanish in their home. Olin's five-stroke, come-from-behind win equaled the biggest comeback on the NIKE TOUR that season.*

***Chris DiMarco** was the only player to post back-to-back eagles in 1993, when he performed that feat at the NIKE Monterrey Open. Only six other players have matched that rarity in NIKE TOUR history.*

NIKE LOUISIANA OPEN NOTES

Paul Stankowski became the first player to win a NIKE TOUR and PGA TOUR event in the same year when he accomplished the feat in consecutive weeks. Not eligible for THE PLAYERS Championship, PGA TOUR member Stankowski competed in and won last year's NIKE Louisiana Open. The next week, he got into the field as the sixth alternate and won the PGA TOUR's BellSouth Classic.

Sean Murphy posted scores of 64-63 in the second and third rounds of this tournament in 1996. That 17-under-par aggregate was the lowest consecutive rounds total of the year. Murphy's 18-under-par 198 after three rounds was the lowest opening-54 hole score last year. However, Murphy was unable to hold off the charging **Paul Stankowski**, who shot a final-round 67 while Murphy closed with a 75.

Stan Utley's final-round 62 led to his victory in 1995 and is the second-lowest closing score by a winner in NIKE TOUR history. **Jeff Woodland** holds the record with a 12-under-par 60 in winning the 1991 Dakota Dunes Open.

Twenty players had two eagles in the same round in 1996, and three of them accomplished that feat at the NIKE Louisiana Open. **Tim Simpson** and **Jeff Julian** each had two in the third round, and **Matthew Lane** had two eagles in the final round.

The NIKE Louisiana Open is one of the few tournaments to never require a playoff to determine its champion. Only once has the winning margin been one stroke, that coming in 1992 when **Sean Murphy** edged **Tony Grimes**. The margin was two shots from 1993-95 and four strokes last year.

The NIKE Louisiana Open is one of three tournaments to raise its purse to \$300,000 in 1997, joining the NIKE Dakota Dunes Open and the NIKE TOUR Championship as events with the largest purse of the year.

The toughest hole at Le Triomphe CC last year was the par-4, 452-yard 13th hole. It played .278 over par and was the 28th toughest hole on the NIKE TOUR. As a course, Le Triomphe CC ranked as 28th toughest, playing at .974 under par.

NIKE SOUTH CAROLINA CLASSIC NOTES

The CC of South Carolina was the third toughest course on the NIKE TOUR, with scores averaging 73.369 on the 7,159-yard, par-72 course. The fourth- and fifth-toughest holes for the year were found here. Ranking fourth at .373 over par was the par-3 16th hole, while the par-4 18th hole ranked fifth on the year at .369 over par. The CC of South Carolina and Philmont CC (NIKE Philadelphia Classic) were the only courses with two holes in the 10 toughest last year.

*The first two champions of this event, **Tom Lehman** in 1991 and **John Flannery** in 1992, went on to Player of the Year honors in the year in which they won in Florence. Of the other four winners, only **Jerry Foltz** failed to advance to the PGA TOUR in the year following his win. **Hugh Royer III** and **Dave Rummells** each finished in the top 10 on the NIKE TOUR money list, and **Charlie Rymer** got his 1995 PGA TOUR card at Q-School.*

The NIKE TOUR cuts to the low 55 players and ties after two rounds. The NIKE South Carolina Classic, NIKE Tri-Cities Open and NIKE Olympia Open were the only three events last year to cut at exactly 55 players.

***Ben Bates** recorded two eagles in the opening round of the 1996 NIKE South Carolina Classic, a feat that was accomplished by only 20 players last year.*

Tommy Tolles earned his 1995 PGA TOUR card at Q-School, while **Jerry Kelly** and **P.H. Horgan III** each finished in the top 10.

Jerry Kelly used the momentum from his first NIKE TOUR win here in 1995 to finish atop the NIKE TOUR money list and earn Player of the Year honors. Kelly later won his second tournament at the NIKE Buffalo Open.

Each of the first three NIKE Alabama Classics has seen a close finish. **Jerry Kelly** defeated **Buddy Gardner** in a playoff in 1995, while the margin of victory for **Tommy Tolles** (1994) and **P.H. Horgan III** (1996) was a single shot.

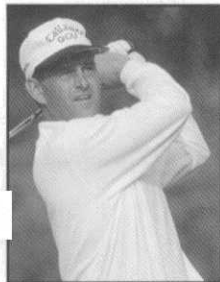

NIKE SHREVEPORT OPEN NOTES

The NIKE Shreveport Open has been a part of the NIKE TOUR since 1991, the second year of the TOUR. In its six-year history, five of the players who have finished runner-up in the tournament have gone on to earn PGA TOUR membership the following year. **Skip Kendall**, 1992 runner-up, went on to finish as co-medalist at the PGA TOUR Qualifying Tournament later that fall. The next four runners-up, **Bob May**, **Pat Bates**, **Chris Smith** and **Joe Durant**, all finished in the top 10 on that year's NIKE TOUR money list.

Southern Trace CC was site of one of the longest birdie binges in professional golf history. During the second round of the 1994 tournament, **Omar Uresti** birdied nine consecutive holes, bettering by one the longest streaks ever recorded on the PGA TOUR, Senior PGA TOUR and PGA European Tour. In last year's tournament, **Joe Durant** ran off the second-longest streak in NIKE TOUR history when he birdied seven consecutive holes.

When **P.H. Horgan III** was disqualified for signing an incorrect scorecard for Saturday's third round last year, **Tim Loustalot** went from preparing for a playoff with Horgan to the 18th green to receive his trophy and winner's check. Horgan recovered from the incident to retain his status in the top 10 on the money list and returned to the PGA TOUR in 1997.

Southern Trace CC was ranked as the sixth-toughest course on the 1996 NIKE TOUR. The 6,916-yard, par-72 layout played to an average of 73.087.

That affair took eight holes before Lehman emerged victorious. Since then, there has been a seven-hole playoff and two that lasted six holes on the NIKE TOUR.

The NIKE Mississippi Gulf Coast Classic moved 40 miles east on Interstate-10 to Gautier, MS and Mississippi National GC in 1996 after six years at Windance CC in Gulfport. Mississippi National is the former Hickory Hills Resort.

Joe Durant's one-stroke victory over **Dave Rummells** and **Brett Quigley** went against the character of the tournament. In five of the six previous years, it took a playoff to determine a winner—more playoffs than any other tournament on the NIKE TOUR.

Jim Furyk won his first professional tournament at the 1993 NIKE Mississippi Gulf Coast Classic. **Furyk** has been one of the more successful NIKE TOUR alums, winning PGA TOUR events each of the past two years.

Michael Christie's winning 22-under-par 266 at the 1995 NIKE Carolina Classic was the lowest 72-hole score of the year and one shot off the NIKE TOUR record. The record at 23-under-par is shared by Christie (in winning the 1996 NIKE Greater Greenville Classic) and **Tim Conley** (in winning the 1993 NIKE Knoxville Open).

Glen Hnatiuk became the sixth player to win tournaments in three separate years when he defeated **Craig Perks** to win last year's NIKE Carolina Classic. Hnatiuk added his victory in Cary, NC to wins in the 1992 Mississippi Gulf Coast Classic and 1995 NIKE Utah Classic.

NIKE UPSTATE CLASSIC NOTES

The tournament name was changed to the NIKE Upstate Classic for 1997, following its first five years as the Greater Greenville Classic. The change was made to reflect the tournament's growth to more of a regional event.

Michael Christie turned last year's NIKE Greater Greenville Classic into quite a homecoming. The Greenville native shot a final-round 63 to equal the NIKE TOUR record for a 72-hole tournament at 23-under-par 265. Christie shares that record with **Tim Conley**, who won the 1993 NIKE Knoxville Open with a 23-under 261. Christie also shares the record for lowest score in a 54-hole event at 20-under par in winning the 1996 NIKE Utah Classic.

Only one playoff has been required to determine the winner of this event, that coming in 1995 when **David Toms** defeated **Tom Scherrer** with a birdie on the first extra hole. **Sean Murphy** defeated **Doug Martin** by a single shot in winning the 1993 event. Murphy, playing in the final group, came to the 72nd hole needing a birdie to tie Martin and force a playoff. He stunned Martin and the crowd by winning the tournament outright with an eagle on the final hole. That victory was Murphy's second of the year; he would go on to a NIKE TOUR-record four wins in a single season to claim 1993 NIKE TOUR Player of the Year honors.

The NIKE TOUR players have enjoyed their annual visit to Verdae Greens GC. The 6,798-yard, par-72 course saw the field average 71.026 per round last year. Of the 29 courses on the 1996 NIKE TOUR, Verdae Greens ranked as the 26th toughest.

Olin Browne's win at the 1996 NIKE Dominion Open propelled him past Sean Murphy into first place on the all-time NIKE TOUR career earnings list with \$371,092. Browne earned \$36,000 for his one-stroke victory over four players. A PGA TOUR member in 1996, Browne made his only NIKE TOUR start of the year here when he was not eligible for the Memorial Tournament, which was held the same week as this event.

Hugh Royer III's victory in the 1995 NIKE Dominion Open was one of his two that year. With two wins in 1993, Royer is the only player in NIKE TOUR history with two multiple-win seasons.

NIKE KNOXVILLE OPEN NOTES

The 1997 event marks the third year at Three Ridges GC following a five-year stay at Willow Creek CC. The 7,035-yard, par-72 course saw the players average 71.244 per round, ranking it as the 25th most difficult course of the 29 stops last year.

Eric Johnson, winner of last year's NIKE Knoxville Open, continued to play well after Knoxville and earned his 1997 PGA TOUR card by the slimmest of margins. Johnson finished 10th on the NIKE TOUR money list with \$103,929 to edge **Brent Geiberger** for the final PGA TOUR card by only \$112.

Tim Conley established the record for most strokes under par in a 72-hole event when he won the 1993 NIKE Knoxville Open with a 23-under 261 at Willow Creek CC. Conley's mark was tied in 1996, when **Michael Christie** won the NIKE Greater Greenville Classic (now NIKE Upstate Classic) with a 23-under 265.

Vic Wilk's win in 1994 made him the only lefthander to win a NIKE TOUR event.

Tom Scherrer's playoff win at the 1995 NIKE Knoxville Open was the first of three consecutive playoff appearances by Scherrer, a NIKE TOUR record. Following his win at Knoxville, Scherrer lost in a playoff to **David Toms** at the NIKE Greater Greenville Classic and to **Hugh Royer III** at the NIKE Dominion Open.

NIKE OZARKS OPEN NOTES

Stewart Cink earned the first of his three 1996 NIKE TOUR wins at Highland Springs CC in a three-hole playoff with **R.W. Eaks**. Cink later won the NIKE Colorado Classic and the NIKE TOUR Championship.

Last year's tournament was the second consecutive event to need a playoff to determine a winner. **Mike Schuchart** won the 1995 event in a playoff over **P.H. Horgan III** and **Stuart Appleby**.

John Connelly's course-record 61 in the opening round of the 1995 tournament was the lowest 18-hole score of the year on the NIKE TOUR in 1995.

Sam Randolph's three-stroke lead after the opening round at Highland Springs was the largest 18-hole lead last year. Randolph was unable to maintain the pace and finished tied for 10th, five shots behind **Cink** and **Eaks**.

NIKE DAKOTA DUNES OPEN NOTES

Gary Webb's playoff victory over **Chad Magee** in last year's NIKE Dakota Dunes Open marked the first time extra holes were needed to determine a winner in the events seven-year history.

In 1993 Dakota Dunes CC was played as a par-69, and the tournament was shortened to 68 holes, when flood waters from the Missouri River made the par-3, eighth hole unplayable for the week.

Dakota Dunes CC was the fifth hardest course on the 1996 NIKE TOUR, with the par-72 layout playing to a stroke average of 73.285. The 463-yard, par-4 ninth hole was second toughest on the entire NIKE TOUR with an average score of 4.386.

The NIKE Dakota Dunes Open set the NIKE TOUR record for charitable donations last year when it gave \$288,000 to local charities, an increase of \$132,000 over the tournament's 1995 donation.

From the "did you know?" department: The first two NIKE Dakota Dunes Opens were held at the old Dakota Dunes CC course, then known as the Boat Club Course. The clubhouse was in Sioux City, IA, but one had to cross a bridge into South Dakota to reach the course. The current site first served as host for the Dakota Dunes Open in 1992 and took the Dakota Dunes CC name upon completion. This explains the change in course yardage for the 1992 event. The original course, now called Two Rivers GC, often is the site of Monday open qualifying for the Dakota Dunes Open.

Each of the two previous winners of the NIKE Philadelphia Classic went on to finish in the top 10 on the NIKE TOUR money list to earn their PGA TOUR card the next year. **Sean Murphy** finished eighth in 1995 and **Brett Quigley** was fifth in 1996.

Brett Quigley just missed being the only wire-to-wire winner on the NIKE TOUR last year with his victory at Philmont CC. Quigley took the opening-round lead with a course-record 64. Quigley led by two shots after two rounds, but was tied for the lead after 54 holes with **Billy Downes**.

The toughest hole on the 1996 NIKE TOUR was the 440-yard, par-4 fifth hole, which played at .396 over par. Also in the top 10 among toughest holes was the 400-yard, par-4 11th, which ranked sixth at .366 over par.

Philmont CC ranked as the second-toughest course on the NIKE TOUR last year. The 6,496-yard, par-70 course played at 2.033 over par. Settindown Creek GC was the toughest course of the year, playing at .396 over par.

Hayes became the fourth consecutive former PGA TOUR member to win the NIKE Miami Valley Open when he defeated **Lee Porter** and **Greg Whisman** by two strokes in last year's event. **Emlyn Aubrey** (1993), **Tommy Armour III** (1994) and **Stan Utley** (1995) preceded Hayes in the winner's circle in Springboro.*

***Tommy Armour III** won this tournament in 1994, then the following week won the NIKE Cleveland Open, becoming the first player in NIKE TOUR history to claim consecutive events. That feat was equaled later that year by **Jerry Haas**, who posted back-to-back wins at the NIKE Tri-Cities Open and NIKE Sonoma County Open. No player has accomplished that feat since Haas.*

***Craig Kanada's** course-record 61 at Heatherwoode GC was recorded in the second round of the 1994 NIKE Miami Valley Open. Kanada's 61 equaled the lowest 18-hole of the year in 1994 and was matched by **J.P. Hayes** and **Woody Austin** in the 1994 NIKE Boise Open.*

***Emlyn Aubrey** made this tournament's first hole-in-one in the final round of the 1993 tournament. Aubrey used the momentum from that ace to coast to a four-shot victory. The only other aces in this tournament have been by **Jim Kane** in 1995 and **Ivan Smith** in 1996.*

After three years at Lake Forest G&CC, the NIKE Gateway Classic moves to the Missouri Bluffs GC in St. Charles, MO for 1997.

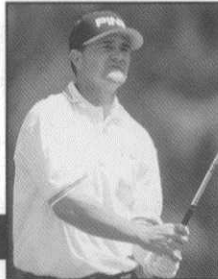

NIKE WICHITA OPEN NOTES

When **Rick Cramer** won last year's NIKE Wichita Open for his first NIKE TOUR victory, he had to hold off a hard-charging **J.P. Hayes**, who fired a final-round 10-under-par 62. Hayes began the day tied for 40th, eight strokes off the lead. He vaulted into a second-place tie with **Jimmy Johnston** and **Craig Kanada**, one stroke behind Cramer's winning total. Hayes' 62, the lowest score recorded during the 1996 season, was matched by three other players last year.

When **David Duval** won the 1993 NIKE Wichita Open in only his second NIKE TOUR event, he became the youngest winner of a NIKE TOUR event at age 21 years, nine months.

Tom Lehman's win in the 1990 tournament could have been seen as a sign of things to come. In 1991, Lehman was named NIKE TOUR Player of the Year after winning three times and leading the money list. Since then he has won four times on the PGA TOUR, including two wins in 1996 (the British Open and THE TOUR Championship). Lehman won the money title with a record \$1,780,159 and was named PGA TOUR Player of the Year for 1996.

David Toms' playoff victory over **E.J. Pfister** in the 1995 NIKE Wichita Open was the last playoff decided by an eagle on the NIKE TOUR.

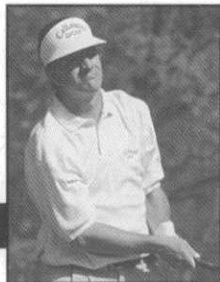

NIKE UTAH CLASSIC NOTES

Michael Christie matched the NIKE TOUR record for lowest score in a 54-hole tournament when he posted a 20-under-par 196 in winning last year's NIKE Utah Classic. He shares that record with **Jeff Woodland**, winner of the 1991 Dakota Dunes Open.

Dan Bateman set the NIKE TOUR record for the best birdie-eagle streak when he played an eight-hole stretch in 9-under-par at the 1996 NIKE Utah Classic. Bateman began his streak with four consecutive birdies, added an eagle, then ran off three more birdies. The previous best was 8-under by **Tom Lehman** in the 1991 Reno Open and **Tommy Tolles** in 1993, also in Utah. The best on the PGA TOUR is 8-under-par over seven holes by **Al Geiberger** in 1977 and **Webb Heintzelman** in 1989.

Three players each had two eagles in the same round during last year's NIKE Utah Classic. **Brian Kontak** recorded his during the second round, while **Tad Holloway** and **Dennis Harrington** each had two in the final round.

Michael Christie and **Dennis Harrington** set the course record of 9-under-par 63 at Riverside CC last year. Christie's effort came during the second round, while Harrington's performance was in round three.

The NIKE Utah Classic is the lone remaining scheduled 54-hole event on the NIKE TOUR. Last year's trial of having a Saturday finish will not be repeated in 1997. This year's tournament returns to a Friday-Sunday schedule for the three rounds.

Gogel began 1996 as the 131st player out of 132 in the non-exempt member category after being disqualified at the 1996 Q-school. With such a low number, he was unable to get into tournaments to improve his playing status.

*The cream of the 1996 NIKE TOUR rose to the top at the NIKE Boise Open. **Matt Gogel** was the only top-five finisher at Hillcrest CC not to finish in the top 10 on the money list and advance to the PGA TOUR in 1997. **David Berganio, Jr.**, **Brett Quigley** and **Stewart Cink** all tied for second, while **Joe Durant** finished fifth. All four of those players were members of the NIKE TOUR graduating class of 1996.*

The NIKE Boise Open, a scheduled 54-hole event from 1990-1995, went to 72 holes for the first time last year. The lone remaining scheduled 54-hole event is the NIKE Utah Classic.

*Five of the seven former champions are current or former members of the PGA TOUR. Only **Ricky Smallridge**, the 1990 winner, and **Matt Gogel**, last year's champion, have not been members of the PGA TOUR during their careers.*

***J.P. Hayes** set the course record of 10-under-par 61 in the second round of the 1994 NIKE Boise Open, only to have **Woody Austin** tie his mark the next day. Austin since has enjoyed success on the PGA TOUR, being named Rookie of the Year in 1995 due in large part to his first PGATOUR win at the 1995 Buick Open.*

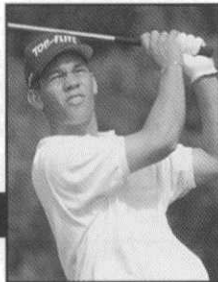

NIKE TRI-CITIES OPEN NOTES

The past two NIKE Tri-Cities Opens have had dramatically different finishes. In 1995, **Jeff Gove** came close to becoming the first player to win a TOUR event with an ace when his tee shot on the second playoff hole rattled the flagstick. Gove made his birdie putt to defeat **Franklin Langham**. By contrast, **Phil Tataurangi**'s six-stroke margin last year was the largest in 1996 and largest on the NIKE TOUR since **Mike Brisky** won the 1994 NIKE Texarkana Open by seven shots. The previous largest winning margin at the NIKE Tri-Cities Open was two strokes.

Steve Jurgensen made a Sunday charge to win the NIKE Tri-Cities Open in 1993. He began the day at four-under-par, three behind leader **Perry Parker**. Jurgensen played his first nine holes at two-over par, but caught fire over his final nine. He birdied seven of those nine, with pars on 11 and 17, and a streak of five consecutive birdies on the 12th through 16th holes.

Meadow Springs CC ranked as the 13th-toughest course on the NIKE TOUR in 1996. The 6,926-yard, par-72 course saw the field average 72.114 for the week. The toughest hole at Meadow Springs last year was the 216-yard, par-3 17th hole, which played to an average of 3.327. Of all the holes played on the NIKE TOUR, Meadow Springs' 17th ranked 13th. Two other holes appear on the 50 toughest on the 1996 NIKE TOUR. The par-3 eighth hole ranked 20th and the par-4 14th was 38th.

Why is this event called the Tri-Cities Open? It's held in an area comprised of three cities in Washington: Richland, Kennewick and Pasco.

Two of the four previous NIKE TOUR Championship winners have been top-10 finishers on the money list, thereby earning their PGA TOUR card. **Stewart Cink** was first on last year's money list and **Allen Doyle**, the 1995 winner, finished second on the money list following his victory. **David Duval**, who played in only nine NIKE TOUR events in 1993 and won the NIKE Wichita Open in addition to the NIKE TOUR Championship that year, finished 11th on the money list. **Mike Schuchart**, the winner in 1994, finished 17th on that season's money list.

David Duval has the only hole-in-one in NIKE TOUR Championship history. Duval aced the 177-yard, par-3 third hole at Pumpkin Ridge in the final round in 1993. Duval rode the momentum from the ace to a slim one-shot victory over **Danny Briggs** in this tournament's inaugural event.

David Duval, **Allen Doyle** and **Stewart Cink** all tasted victory prior to their wins at the NIKE TOUR Championship. Duval won the 1993 NIKE Wichita Open, while Doyle's earlier wins in 1994 came at the NIKE Mississippi Gulf Coast Classic and the NIKE Texarkana Open. In 1996, Cink won the NIKE Ozarks Open and the NIKE Colorado Classic prior to winning the NIKE TOUR Championship.

Mike Schuchart's win at the 1995 NIKE TOUR Championship kept alive a three-year streak of winning on the NIKE TOUR. Schuchart won the 1993 NIKE Panama City Beach Classic and the 1994 NIKE Ozarks Open. His streak was snapped in 1996, when his best finish was a fourth-place tie at the NIKE Miami Valley Open. The three-year winning streak, the longest in NIKE TOUR history, is shared by **Ted Tryba**, who claimed one event each year from 1990-92.

Jeff Brehaut is the only player to play in all four previous NIKE TOUR Championships. Beginning in 1993, Brehaut has finished T28, 49th, T14 and T24.

A record 1,153 applications were received, with 17 regionals held to reduce the field to 188 players for the final qualifying stage.

The final stage, normally six rounds and 108 holes, was reduced to five rounds. All-day rain Monday caused a suspension of play for the day at 10:00 a.m. With La Purisima GC unplayable and rains continuing on Tuesday, the tournament was cancelled and became a 90-hole event.

The top 40 and ties (a total of 49 players) received their PGA TOUR cards for 1997 and appear below. The remainder became members of the 1997 NIKE TOUR. For seeding purposes, ties were broken based on final-round score. Further ties were broken by matching cards, starting with the 18th hole of the final round.

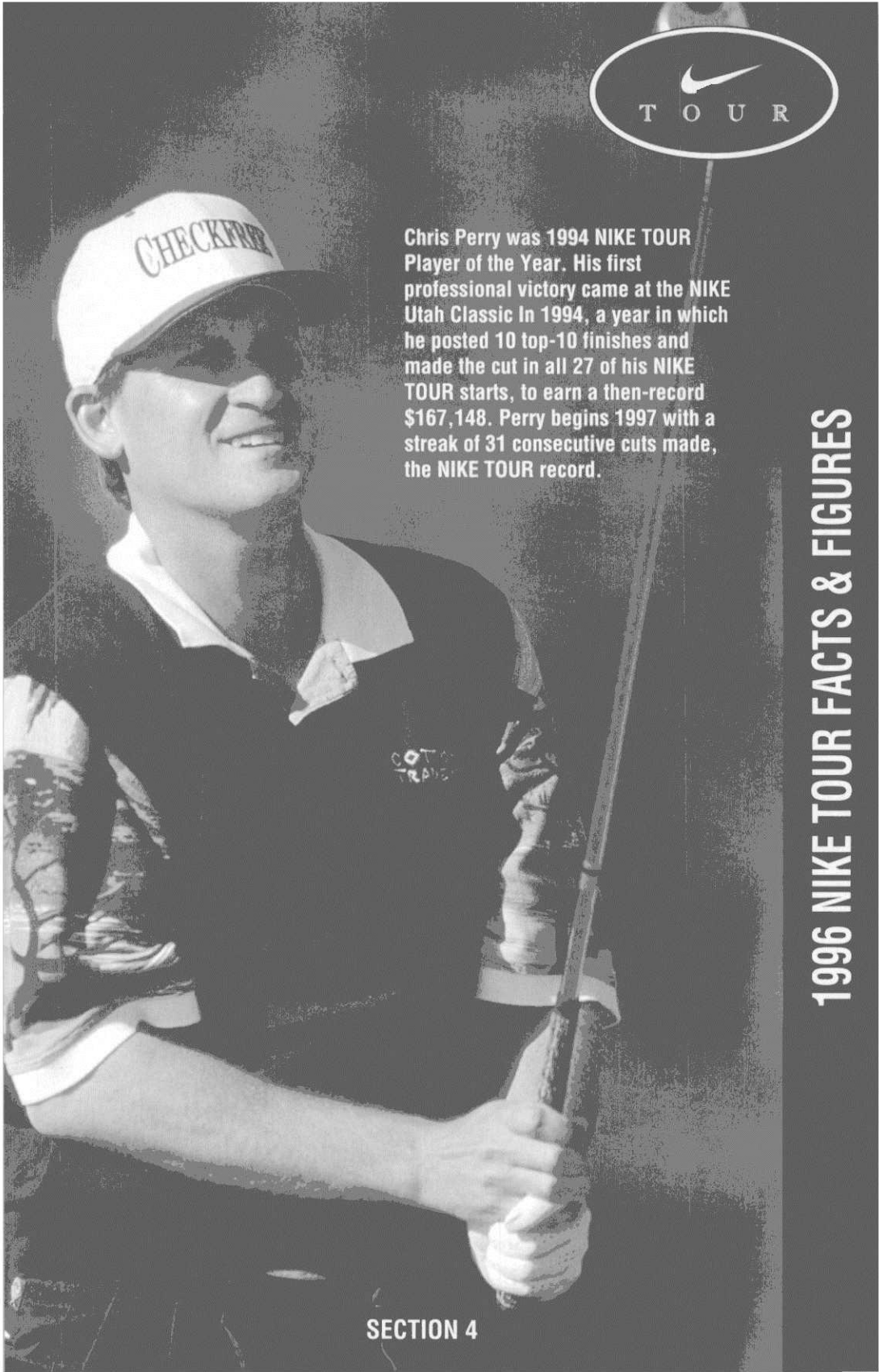

NIKE TOUR PARTNERS IN CHARITY

PGA TOUR tournaments have raised more than \$300 million for charity since the first donation was made in 1938. In addition, the three TOURS—PGA TOUR, Senior TOUR and NIKE TOUR—combined to raise more than \$37 million in 1996.

“The contributions TOUR events make to worthy local causes have put our organization in a unique position among professional sports,” PGA TOUR Commissioner Timothy W. Finchem said. “Our players and tournaments take a great deal of pride in the \$300 million milestone because it is evidence of a true commitment to help people less fortunate than ourselves.

“Putting something back into the communities in which our events are played is at the very heart of our structure. Golf is very successful, and we are happy to share that success.”

The PGA TOUR established a record one-year total of \$29.3 million in 1996. The previous single-season mark of \$25.2 million was set in 1995.

The NIKE TOUR began play in 1990, and more than \$9.5 million has been raised for charity since Mike Springer won the first event in Bakersfield, CA. Approximately \$1.3 million of that total was generated in 1996.

Finchem noted that \$164.3 million, more than half the PGA TOUR's \$300 million total, has been raised in the last seven years—the decade of the '90s.

“We believe the old saying that ‘success is a journey, not a destination’ is true when it comes to the TOUR and charity,” Finchem said. “We are pleased with what we have been able to accomplish for charity while also improving the earnings potential for our players, but we think more is possible in both areas.”

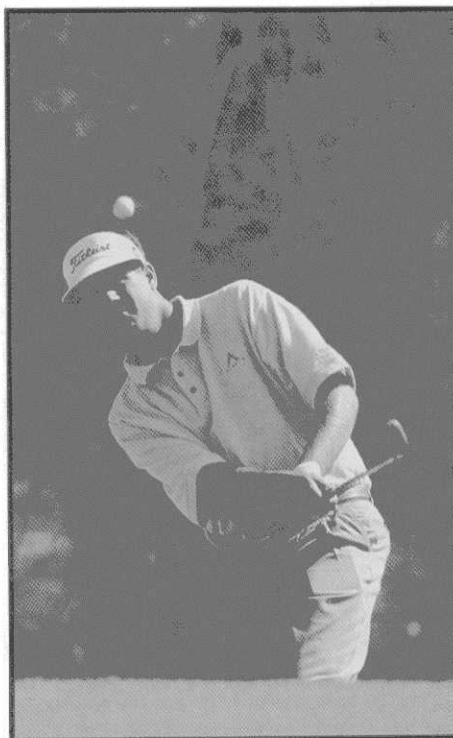

AUGUST

Michael Christie — Earned the first NIKE TOUR Player of the Month Award after winning his second title of the year at the NIKE Permian Basin Open. That win made him the season's first multiple winner, ending a streak of 22 consecutive tournaments with different winners to begin the 1996 season. Earlier in the month, Christie tied for second in the inaugural NIKE Omaha Classic.

SEPTEMBER

Stewart Cink — Became the first player in NIKE TOUR history to surpass \$200,000 in single-season earnings when he won the inaugural NIKE Colorado Classic. That victory allowed him to join Michael Christie as the season's only multiple winners. Also in September, Cink tied for second at the NIKE Boise Open, tied for ninth at the PGA TOUR's Buick Challenge and tied for 12th at the TOUR's Las Vegas Invitational.

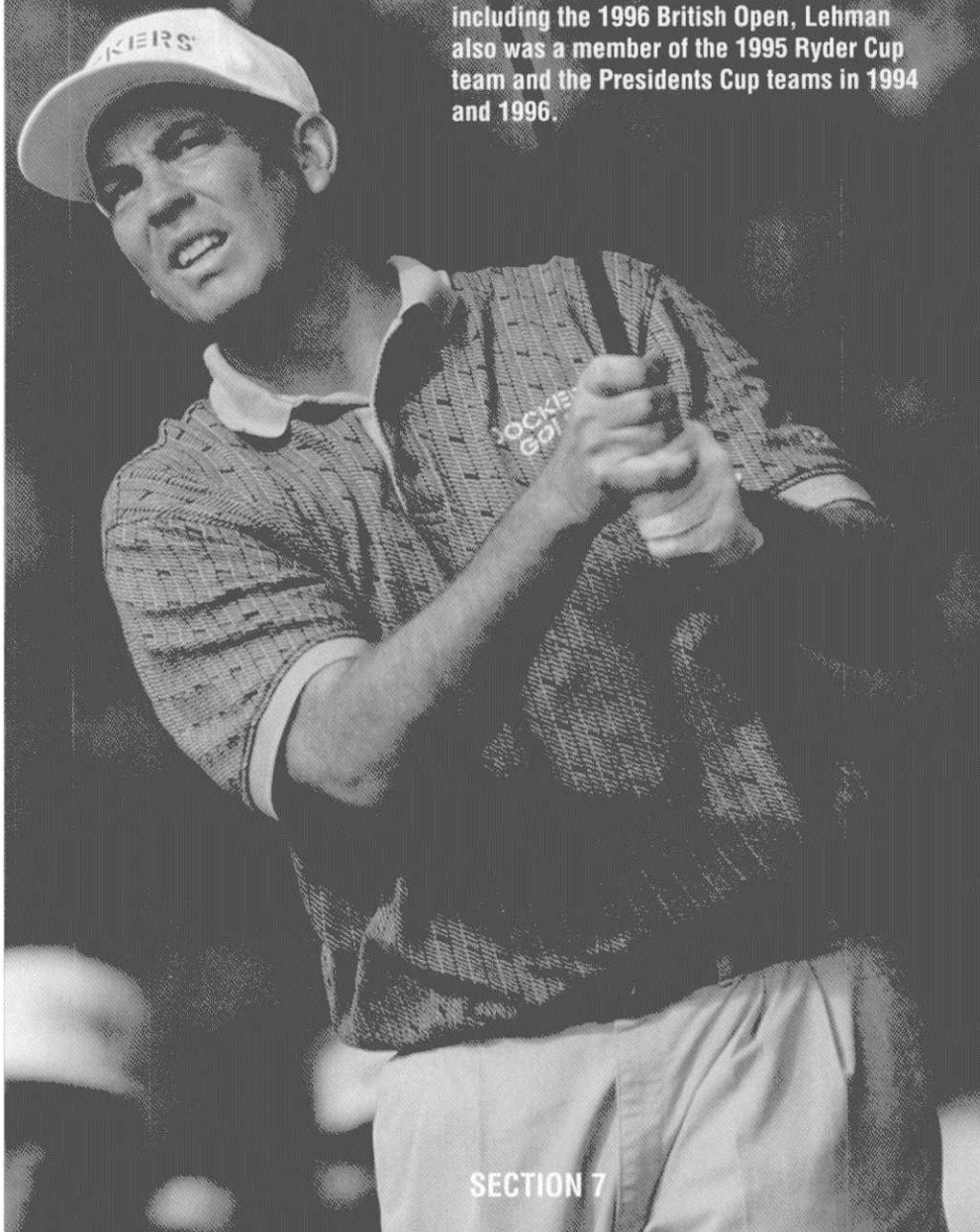

WORLD GOLF VILLAGE

The unified effort to establish an international shrine for golf moves closer to reality with ongoing construction of the World Golf Village and World Golf Hall of Fame in St. Johns County, FL.

Located on 240 acres along Interstate 95, 22 miles south of Jacksonville and eight miles northwest of St. Augustine, this ambitious project promises to have a major impact on several fronts when it opens in the spring of 1998.

The World Golf Village will become a premier tourism, business and golf destination. But its significance extends far beyond state lines. The World Golf Hall of Fame represents the first time in the game's history that all major golf organizations from around the world have joined together to honor the game's great players and contributors.

"The World Golf Village and Hall of Fame will bond the entire golf community through a shrine that appropriately reflects their common love and respect for the game and its traditions," says World Golf Village Executive Director Ruffin Beckwith.

At the heart of the complex will be the 75,000-square-foot World Golf Hall of Fame building, which will be the ultimate in sports museums and halls of fame. Designed by E. Verner Johnson and Associates of Boston, it will house more than 70 separate exhibits, utilizing the latest in technology for an exciting interactive experience. The exhibit design partner is Ralph Appelbaum Associates of New York, the world's premier exhibit design firm.

The Hall of Fame building also will include a 300-seat IMAX theater and, of course, a tribute to all inductees. Individuals previously enshrined at the World Golf Hall of Fame in Pinehurst, NC will be grandfathered into the new facility.

Three other avenues have been established by which professionals can be enshrined in the World Golf Hall of Fame: the LPGA Hall of Fame and the newly created PGA TOUR Hall of Fame and International Ballot, which will conduct annual elections. Johnny Miller became the first player elected through the PGA TOUR ballot last fall.

In addition, a Special Distinction category has been established for amateurs and others making significant contributions to the game.

Annual induction ceremonies will commence once the facility opens, promising to bring together dignitaries from throughout the golf world.

Additional amenities at World Golf Village will include a major hotel and conference center, 54 holes of golf and PGA TOUR-licensed Golf Academy, corporate and vacation villas, an upscale shopping area, spa, the new headquarters for PGA TOUR Productions and a Mayo Clinic facility.

But the World Golf Village is intended to be as much an educational experience as it is an attraction. This theme will be conveyed further once the World Golf Library and Resource Center opens in 1999. It also will be evident through the work of the World Golf Foundation, the charitable branch of World Golf Village, Inc., which will receive all proceeds, after operational expenses and reserves.

The World Golf Foundation's charitable mission, on behalf of the supporting golf organizations, is to introduce youth and minorities to the game, and through the golf experience promote scholastic achievement, community service and the values of honesty, integrity and sportsmanship.

The vision is to establish model programs that can be established in locales throughout the world that have not had exposure to the game.

The World Golf Foundation will review existing youth and minority golf programs to determine which models are most effective. "Through a fundraising effort, an endowment will be in place where we can add a certain number of these facilities every year and, over a period of time, begin to really impact youth and build in some educational components," explained Ruffin Beckwith, Executive Director of World Golf Village. "We hope to establish internships and scholarships whereby kids are rewarded, not necessarily for being a great player, but for academic commitment and exemplifying the values that golf represents."

Central to the strategy for pgatour.com is that the web site should be a business opportunity that offers new sources of revenue while building the PGA TOUR brand, supporting tournament sponsors and enhancing the existing businesses of the PGA TOUR. With IBM and Anheuser-Busch as Foundation Sponsors of pgatour.com, the TOUR has launched a new business with guaranteed revenues.

Working in conjunction with Saltmine Creative and IBM, the TOUR has ensured that pgatour.com is a site with high quality image that features ease-of-use and state-of-the-art technology. The site is the exclusive online home for true real-time scoring with a dynamic interface for all tournaments on the PGA TOUR and Senior PGA TOUR. It houses the official site for the tournaments from all three TOURs with in-depth information 52 weeks of the year.

There is detailed information and insight from the players, with photos, text, audio clips and video. Weekly features focus on everything from rising talent to international golf. An extensive database puts statistics at the disposal of fans and the media when and how they want it.

But pgatour.com is not just information. It provides entertainment with games and contests. It provides service for individual tournaments and through PGA TOUR Travel. And fans are able to order PGA TOUR merchandise right from their home or office.

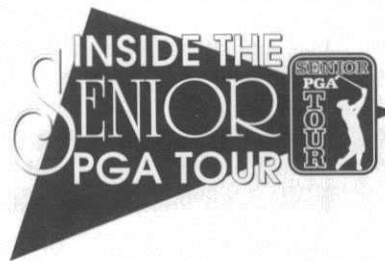
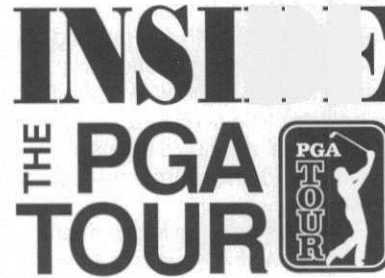


PGA TOUR Productions is the television, film and video production company of the PGA TOUR.

PRESENTS

NIKE TOUR MEDIA REGULATIONS

General Regulations:

The following regulations are to be followed by *all* members of the media:

1. An armband is necessary to walk inside the gallery ropes. Remain not more than an arm's length from the ropes, so as to blend into the gallery and appear to be a part of the gallery at all times.
2. Players are not to be distracted during play. Do not interview players or ask them to pose for photographs during their rounds.
3. Do not interview players or ask them to pose for photographs during their practice sessions before a round, except by prior arrangement with the player.
4. If an interview is to be conducted in the practice areas, either the range or the putting green, it must be done by prior arrangement with the player, up against the ropes and not in the middle of the areas where it could be distracting to other players.
5. Do not disturb players at their 18th green and/or scoring tent until after they have checked, signed and returned their scorecards. Media are not allowed in the scoring tent.

Working Press Regulations:

To avoid embarrassment to you and distraction to the contestants:

1. Do not walk or stand in playing areas.
2. Follow directions of marshals and other officials.
3. Do not interview during play. The leading players each day—and others requested—will be interviewed following their rounds in the Press Room interview area.

Tape Recorder Regulations:

1. All tape recorder work should be done in the proximity of the Press Room and/or clubhouse.
2. Tape recorders are not permitted in the locker room.
3. Tape recorders are not permitted within the playing area of the golf course unless written permission has been granted from the NIKE TOUR.

Weather Delay Guidelines:

1. During weather delay situations, no one other than players and essential staff will be permitted in the locker room. This means the media are not permitted in the locker room in such situations. However, whenever possible, arrangements will be made to provide players for interviews during such situations.
2. Fully accredited members of the news media will be welcome in the locker room at all other times to carry out their assigned duties. (Note: Cameras and tape recorders are not permitted in the locker room.)

PHOTOGRAPHY REGULATIONS

Photo credentials will be issued only to personnel on assignment from recognized and accredited publications or news services. Requests for credentials must be made by the appropriate news agency, not by the photographer. The NIKE TOUR reserves the right to refuse photo credentials in its sole discretion.

Photographic likenesses of PGA TOUR, Senior PGA TOUR and NIKE TOUR players and tournament courses may be used only by the news agency which the photographer represents. Any other use must be approved in advance in writing by PGA TOUR.

Commercial exploitation of player or course photographs without written consent of the players or courses and NIKE TOUR is prohibited.

A limited number of photo armbands (or photo bibs), which permit the wearer access inside the gallery ropes, may be issued. Photographers who do not have armbands or bibs must stay outside the gallery ropes. Photographic assistants will not be issued armbands.

Cameras may be used only by accredited media representatives who have been assigned photo credentials, and such use is subject to the following conditions:

1. Photographers with photo armbands must stay within one arm's length of the ropes at all times. Photographers without armbands are not permitted inside the ropes at any time.
2. The use of golf carts is prohibited at all times.
3. Photographers must not position themselves in the line of play. If requested to move by a player, his caddie or an official, the photographer will do so without delay or discussion.
4. No photograph shall be taken until a player has completed his stroke.
5. Players should not be asked to pose during a round.
6. Noise-free equipment must be used at all times.
7. Cameras are not permitted in the scoring tent or in the locker rooms.

The Photographer shall indemnify, defend and hold the Tournament and the NIKE TOUR and their respective officers, agents, representatives, successors and assigns harmless from and against any and all expenses, lawsuits, damages, costs and liabilities (including reasonable attorney's fees and expenses) incurred by, arising from, or in connection with (1) the unauthorized use of photographs taken by the Photographer, whether such unauthorized use is by the Photographer, the company designating the Photographer to use the credential on its behalf, or some third party to whom the photographs are distributed; (2) any injuries resulting from acts or omissions by the Photographer or some third party to whom the Photographer directly or indirectly distributed the material; (3) any cameras, wires, cables or other equipment brought to the premises by the Photographer, or (4) the use of any photographs of any matter other than coverage of the Tournament.

TELEVISION COVERAGE REGULATIONS

The PGA TOUR retains exclusive television rights (including but not limited to broadcast, cable, home video) to all events on the PGA TOUR, Senior PGA TOUR and NIKE TOUR. No live or tape-delayed broadcast of any portion of any PGA TOUR, Senior PGA TOUR or NIKE TOUR event is permitted without the prior written consent of PGA TOUR.

In most cases, play-by-play television rights have been sold for network broadcast.

Stations or networks that have not purchased the rights to originate play-by-play coverage of events from the PGA TOUR are permitted to broadcast highlights coverage of such events only under the following conditions:

1. Televised coverage shall not be in excess of three minutes of highlights daily from each TOUR (and six minutes total for all three TOURs) and may not purport to be live, play-by-play coverage from the course. Requests for expanded coverage must be submitted in writing to the PGA TOUR.
2. All highlights coverage must be part of regularly scheduled news and/or sports programs.
3. Highlights from any day's play may not be broadcast or used for any other purpose after seven days from the conclusion of play each day.
4. No action footage of any day's play may be broadcast until that day's live or tape-delayed coverage by the television network is concluded.
5. No footage may be inserted into any commercial announcement or sold to any other broadcast entity or agency.
6. As the exclusive rights holder, the PGA TOUR is the absolute owner of all footage shot at the tournament site (golf action or other footage) and may request copies of any footage shot at PGA TOUR, Senior PGA TOUR and NIKE TOUR events. Such footage will be provided to the TOUR at cost upon request.
7. The use of golf carts is prohibited at all times.
8. Only personnel with appropriate credentials will be allowed inside the gallery ropes, and they must stay within one arm's length of the ropes at all times. All support personnel must remain outside the ropes.

RADIO COVERAGE REGULATIONS

The PGA TOUR retains exclusive national radio rights to all events on the PGA TOUR, Senior PGA TOUR and NIKE TOUR.

No live or tape-delayed broadcast of any portion of any PGA TOUR, Senior PGA TOUR or NIKE TOUR event is permitted without the prior written consent of the PGA TOUR.

In some cases, play-by-play radio rights have been sold for network broadcast.

Stations or networks that have not purchased the rights to originate play-by-play coverage of events from the PGA TOUR are permitted to broadcast highlights coverage of such events only under the following conditions:

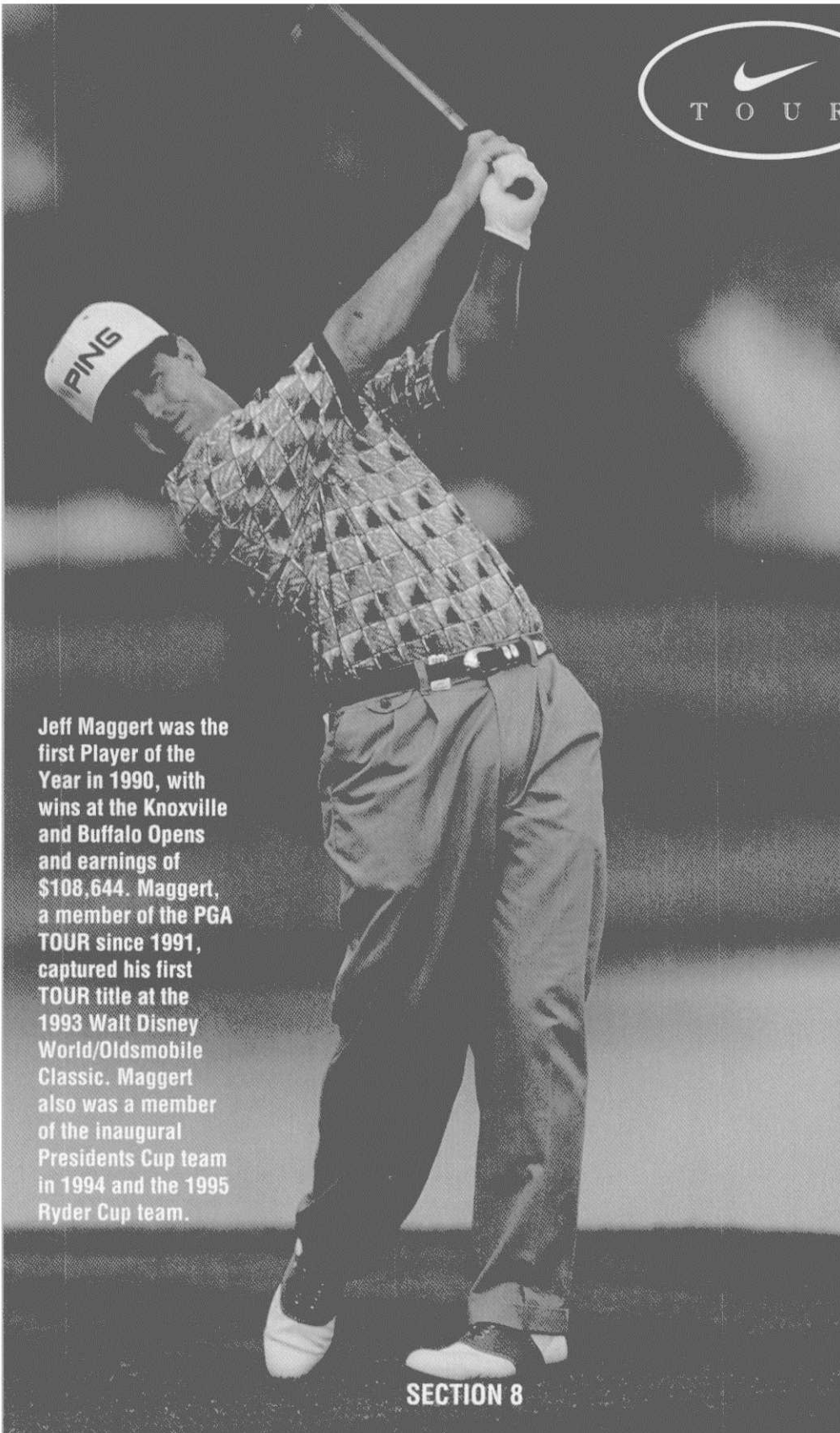
1. Coverage shall not be in excess of three minutes of highlights and may not purport to be live, play-by-play coverage from the course.
2. All highlights coverage must be part of regularly scheduled news and/or sports programs and may not be broadcast after seven days from the conclusion of play on that day.
3. As the exclusive rightsholder, the PGA TOUR may request copies of any coverage of PGA TOUR, Senior PGA TOUR and NIKE TOUR events. Such coverage will be provided to the TOUR at cost upon request.
4. The use of golf carts is prohibited at all times.
5. Only personnel with appropriate credentials will be permitted into the media center and locker room areas.
6. Radio broadcasters are not permitted inside the gallery ropes at any time.
7. Broadcasters are not permitted to talk to players during play or after the round until the player has signed his scorecard.
8. Tape recorders are not permitted in the locker room.

INTERNET SERVICE REGULATIONS

Media credentials will only be issued to personnel on assignment from recognized golf internet sites, as determined by the PGA TOUR in its sole discretion. Individuals representing multiple interests (such as a recognized golf magazine and an internet site) must be separately credentialed for each interest. If you are not specifically credentialed for an on-line service, you may not use any information obtained for that service.

The PGA TOUR retains exclusive broadcast rights (including but not limited to network, cable, internet, home video) to all events on the PGA TOUR, Senior PGA TOUR and NIKE TOUR. No live or tape-delayed delivery of any event is permitted without the prior written consent of the PGA TOUR. Scores and statistics may be distributed only in accordance with these regulations.

1. Coverage must be part of the news portion of the site and must not purport to be live, play-by-play, or real time coverage from the course.
2. Scoring information appearing on a site may be provided no sooner than thirty minutes after the actual occurrence of the shots.
3. Photographic images of PGA TOUR, Senior PGA TOUR and NIKE TOUR players may be used for legitimate news coverage only, and may only be used at the conclusion of the day's play. Commercial exploitation of these images without written consent of the players and the PGA TOUR is prohibited.



Jeff Maggert was the first Player of the Year in 1990, with wins at the Knoxville and Buffalo Opens and earnings of \$108,644. Maggert, a member of the PGA TOUR since 1991, captured his first TOUR title at the 1993 Walt Disney World/Oldsmobile Classic. OLIN BROWNE: ON WHY GOLFERS HELP THEIR COMPETITORS

Olin Browne entered the current season as career leading money-winner on the NIKE TOUR with \$371,092. A PGA TOUR member in 1997, Browne is not expected to play many NIKE TOUR events this year and likely will be passed by Sean Murphy, second on the money list with \$362,381 entering this seasons.

During the 1995 NIKE Wichita Open, Browne spoke about why professionals help one another. A putting tip Browne gave fellow professional Greg Whisman propelled Whisman to a third-round 64 at Wichita that moved him ahead of Browne in the standings. That followed assistance Whisman had given Browne earlier in the season.

Although Browne's comments were made two years ago, they remain pertinent.

"There's a camaraderie in this game and a kinship, because the game is so hard and there's no mercy. The difference between a really good round and a mediocre round is infinitesimal. And I think everybody works so hard, and it requires so much dedication, because misery loves company.

"Greg (Whisman) gave me a pep talk earlier in the year. I was playing a little conservatively. First of all, it's not my nature and, second of all, I'm not playing in the U.S. Open every week, and that's the kind of attitude I had. As soon as he talked to me, I went out and finished third that week.

"It's not a one-way thing. Everybody kind of looks at his friend and says, 'Hey man, I've played a lot of golf with you, and I've noticed that at the top of your backswing your right index finger is pointing behind your back, and whatever it is.'

"I don't think anyone would begrudge anybody else that level of play. If we can help each other, we oftentimes do.

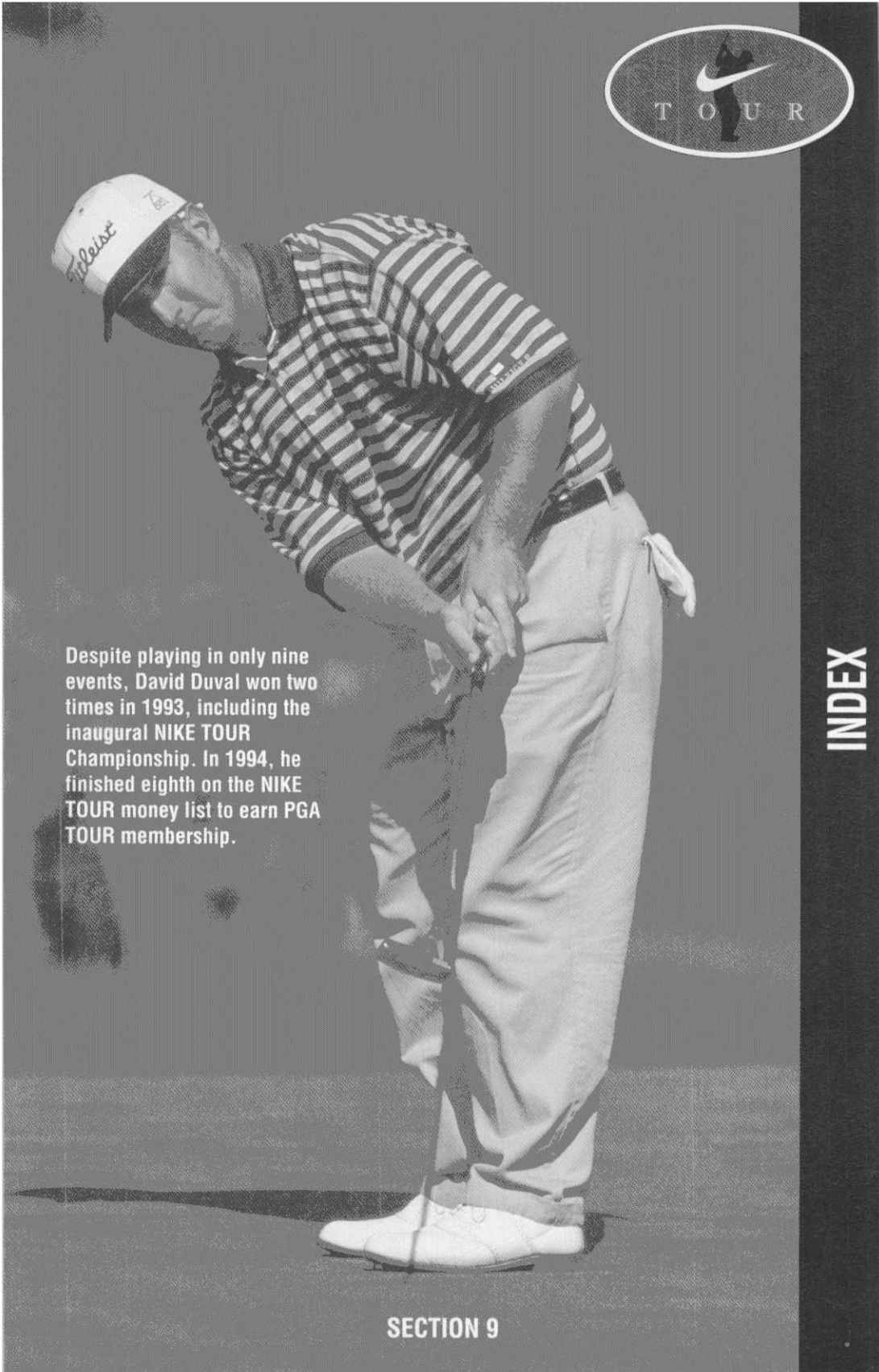
"There are guys who don't help others, but you'll find them in the corner eating lunch by themselves and playing practice rounds by themselves. There are also plenty of guys who admire the dedication it takes to play this game and are willing to step in and give each other a hand.

"That's what makes this game so great. They are the vast majority, I would say 95 percent. I played a practice round with Jack Nicklaus before Bay Hill in 1994, and he was trying to help me with my game. He was out there trying to get a feel for the golf course, and he said, 'You know, Olin, I spotted something in your swing. Here's what you need to work on.'

"Now here's the greatest player who ever walked, trying to hand me a little morsel of information that might help me in my career or help me that week. That's what makes the game so special. Everybody has a desire to get better, and we share that. It's kind of a common denominator."

Despite playing in only nine events, David Duval won two times in 1993, including the inaugural NIKE TOUR Championship. In 1994, he finished eighth on the NIKE TOUR money list to earn PGA TOUR membership.
