Derrick Alston enters his first season as head coach.

Ivan Rabb joined Westchester Knicks as a Two-Way player. Kadeem Allen returns as a Two-Way player.

Westchester received Amir Hinton, Lamar Peters, VJ King and Kenny Wooten as affiliate players.

Westchester has won at least 28 games in three of its five seasons, last season going 29-21.

Since its inception, Knicks have gone 3-2 in openers, 6-4 in first two games and 11-4 through first three contests.

Tyler Hill became the Knicks highest draft pick (RD 1 Pick 4) since Jimmer Fredette was selected second overall in 2015.

Zak Irvin, Kadeem Allen, Kenny Wooten, VJ King, Amir Hinton, Lamar Peters and Andrew White III each participated with the New York Knicks in Summer League.

Despite Irvin being with Westchester the last two seasons, he participated in his first Training Camp earlier this season.

Irvin started 30 of the 32 contests he appeared in averaging 11.8 points and a team-leading 8.6 rebounds in 2018-19.

Irvin concluded the 2018-19 postseason tied for third in the NBA G League with 11.0 rebounds per game.

DERRICK ALSTON / HEAD COACH

On August 20, 2019, former Westchester Knicks assistant coach, Derrick Alston, became the franchise's fourth head coach in team history and succeeded Mike Miller who joined the New York Knicks coaching staff.

"I am grateful for the opportunity to become the new head coach of the Westchester Knicks and to continue the development of our young and talented players, both on and off the court," Alston said. "I want to thank Steve Mills, Scott Perry, Craig Robinson and the entire Knicks organization for this opportunity and continued support. I'm eager to get started."

"Derrick has been an integral part of this organization and what we are building in both New York and Westchester," said Craig Robinson, vice president of player development and Westchester Knicks general manager. "His appointment, after an extensive search, is a continuation of the development and success our players have enjoyed. Derrick has a unique vantage point and knows from experience the process of developing into an NBA player. His experience combined with his natural teaching ability and leadership skills make him the ideal coach to carry out the Westchester Knicks vision."

Alston spent the last four seasons as an assistant for Westchester helping guide the franchise to a 108-92 (.540) record. Alston helped Westchester capture its first-ever postseason victory last season.

Before joining the Knicks organization, Alston served as a player development coach with the Houston Rockets for three seasons. He played four years at Duquesne University and was named First Team All-Atlantic 10 in 1994. Selected 33rd overall in the 1994 NBA Draft by the Philadelphia 76ers, Alston spent two seasons with the team (1994-1996) and signed with the Atlanta Hawks prior to the 1996-97 season. Alston played two games with the Hawks in 1996 before moving overseas, spending the next 15 years playing for 13 different teams across six countries. In 1999, he led FCB Barcelona to the Spanish League title while also taking home the Finals MVP award.

Alston graduated from Hoboken High School in Hoboken, N.J. in 1990. Born on August 20, 1972 in the Bronx, N.Y., Derrick and his wife Robin are proud parents of Derrick Jr. and Avery.

WHERE WE LEFT OFF

March 29, 2019 – The no. 3 Westchester Knicks (30-22), the official NBA G League affiliate of the New York Knicks, were unable to combat no. 2 Lakeland Magic's (33-18) perimeter shooting in the 2019 NBA G League Playoffs Eastern Conference Semifinals and fell 104-91 Friday evening at RP Funding Center.

While the hosts shot 39.5-percent from distance, the Knicks had just two of their 14 tries see the bottom of the net. The Magic also took better care of the rock considerably, committing just seven turnovers contrasting Westchester's 19 miscues. Subsequently, the Magic gave up just eight points off of turnovers while the Knicks sacrificed 29.

Sekou Wiggs led the Knicks with 23 points setting a new career-high for the guard. Wiggs also grabbed a team-high 10 boards and added a pair of assists. Two-Way Player Isaiah Hicks scored 16 points on 88.9-percent to also compliment 10 rebounds.

For Lakeland, Amile Jefferson registered 21 points and 11 rebounds. BJ Johnson put up 20 points and drained a game-high four triples. Braian Angola-Rodas led on the evening with four assists.

On February 28, 2019 the Westchester Knicks (25-18) endured a franchise first triple-overtime battle at the Greensboro Swarm (21-20) but fell, 122-116, Thursday afternoon at The Fieldhouse.

MIKE MILLER EARNS 100th VICTORY

On February 8, 2019 the Westchester Knicks (21-16) topped the visiting Canton Charge (12-22), 112-96, behind a career-high performance from Devon Baulkman Friday evening at Westchester County Center. With the win, then-head coach Mike Miller earned his 100th career victory.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

On February 11, Billy Garrett was named the NBA G League Player of the Week as announced by the league Monday afternoon. In a 2-0 week for Westchester, Garrett averaged a team-leading 30.0 points on 51.2-percent shooting, 3.5 rebounds, 7.0 assists, 1.5 steals and drained four triples.

TRIPLE-DOUBLE

On March 7, 2019, Kadeem Allen of the Westchester Knicks (27-18), became the second player in franchise history to record a triple-double in a 127-118 win over the Windy City Bulls (27-18) Thursday afternoon at Westchester County Center. Allen, who is a Two-Way Player, registered 16 points on 54.6-percent shooting, a career-high 12 rebounds and 12 assists. His triple-double performance is just the fifth of its kind in Westchester Knicks history.

2018-19 ALL-NBA G LEAGUE DEFENSIVE TEAM

On April 3, 2019, Two-Way Player Kadeem Allen of the Westchester Knicks, was named to the 2018-19 NBA G League All-Defensive Team as announced by the league office Wednesday afternoon.

In 39 games played, Allen, 6'3, 200, ranked top-20 in the G League in steals per game (1.5). His season-high stood at four steals which he registered at Long Island (12/20).

His 5.5 rebounds per game ranked top-30 but top-10 among guards who appeared in at least 39 contests. His 1.1 offensive rebounds slotted him 12th among guards who appeared in at least 39 games.

FRANCHISE RECORD BLOWOUT

On November 23, 2018, the Westchester Knicks (7-3), downed the visiting Wisconsin Herd (1-7), 131-75, Friday night at the Westchester County Center. The 56-point margin of the victory set a franchise record while it also marked the first time a team won by 50-plus points since the Raptors 905 dominated Texas, 136-80 on February 5, 2016.

Luke Kornet netted a game-high 25 points on 57.1-percent shooting. The forward also swished five triples on a 71.4-percent shooting clip. New Orleans Flex Assignee Kenrich Williams notched a double-double comprised of 15 points and 13 rebounds, including three on the offensive glass.

KNICKS' WIN MAKES HISTORY

On December 5, 2018, the Westchester Knicks (12-3), topped the visiting South Bay Lakers (6-8), 103-89, on Wednesday evening at the Westchester County Center. The win makes seven straight-setting a new franchise record.

New Orleans Pelicans Two-Way Player Trevon Bluiett netted a career-high 29 points on 62.5-percent shooting.

The reserve drained a game-high five triples on 45.5-percent shooting. Affiliate player Kadeem Allen reached double-figures for the third consecutive game tallying 19 points. Pelicans Flex Assignee Kenrich Williams added 12 points and 10 rebounds off the bench.

FIRST PLAYOFF VICTORY

On March 27, 2019, the Westchester Knicks (30-21), ended the Windy City Bulls' season (27-24), 95-82, in the first round of the 2019 NBA G League Playoffs, Wednesday evening at the Westchester County Center. The postseason win was the first for the franchise.

Billy Garrett (20 points, 12 assists), Jameel Warney (20 points, 14 rebounds) and Zak Irvin (19 points, 14 rebounds) all earned a double-double in the win. New York Knicks assignee, Luke Kornet, added 14 points and nine boards.

OFF SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

MILLER NAMED TO NEW YORK KNICKS COACHING STAFF

The New York Knicks announced August 19, the addition of Westchester Knicks head coach Mike Miller to the Knicks coaching staff. Miller joins the Knicks after four seasons (2015-19) with the Westchester Knicks, the NBA G League affiliate of the New York Knicks.

Miller, 55, joined Westchester as the third head coach in franchise history on October 6, 2015. Miller compiled a 108-92 (.540) record with the team. In 2017-18, Miller guided the Knicks to a franchise-record 32 victories as Westchester finished with the best record in the Eastern Conference and earned the Atlantic Division title for the first time in franchise history. He was named 2017-18 NBA G League Dennis Johnson Coach of the Year.

DERRICK ALSTON NAMED WESTCHESTER KNICKS HEAD COACH

The Westchester Knicks, the official NBA G League affiliate of the New York Knicks, named Derrick Alston as the team's new head coach on August 20. Elevated from assistant coach, Alston becomes the fourth head coach in team history and succeeds Mike Miller who recently joined the New York Knicks coaching staff.

"I am grateful for the opportunity to become the new head coach of the Westchester Knicks and to continue the development of our young and talented players, both on and off the court," Alston said. "I want to thank Steve Mills, Scott Perry, Craig Robinson and the entire Knicks organization for this opportunity and continued support. I'm eager to get started."

"Derrick has been an integral part of this organization and what we are building in both New York and Westchester," said Craig Robinson, vice president of player development and Westchester Knicks general manager. "His appointment, after an extensive search, is a continuation of the development and success our players have enjoyed. Derrick has a unique vantage point and knows from experience the process of developing into an NBA player. His experience combined with his natural teaching ability and leadership skills make him the ideal coach to carry out the Westchester Knicks vision."

Alston spent the last four seasons as an assistant for Westchester helping guide the franchise to a 108-92 (.540) record. Alston helped Westchester capture its first-ever postseason victory earlier this year.

WESTCHESTER KNICKS ANNOUNCE 2019-20 COACHING STAFF ADDITIONS

The Westchester Knicks, the official NBA G League affiliate of the New York Knicks, and first-year head coach Derrick Alston, announced the hiring of Lisa C. Willis and Allen Deep as assistant coaches on October 28.

"The Westchester Knicks continue to be a vital part of our player development program at the New York Knicks," said Steve Mills, President, New York Knicks. "Today, we've added two talented coaches who will improve our players' skills both on and off the court."

Willis comes to the Knicks following the completion of the NBA's Assistant Coaches Program (ACP), a program formed by the NBA G League's Player Development department, providing an educational conduit for former NBA, WNBA and NBA G League players to coaching and front office opportunities. Current Westchester assistant, Keith Bogans, is also a product of this initiative.

A former fifth overall pick in the 2006 WNBA Draft, Willis played her first two seasons with the Los Angeles Sparks before spending time with the New York Liberty (2007-08). At UCLA (2002-06), the Long Beach, Calif. native was recognized as the nation's best defender by ESPN's Nancy Lieberman. She later graduated as the Bruins' all-time three-point leader and second all-time in then-PAC-10 history and ranked ninth all-time in scoring.

Deep arrives to Westchester by the way of the Maine Red Claws, the official NBA G League affiliate of the Boston Celtics. During his time, two players received an NBA Call-Up including current Knick, Andrew White III, who spent time with the Atlanta Hawks in 2018.

A graduate of Indiana University of Pennsylvania (2008) and the University of Akron (2017), Deep also serves as Support Staff/Player Development Assistant for USA Basketball and has since 2016.

"I am very excited to welcome Allen and Lisa to our Westchester Knicks family," head coach Derrick Alston began. "Lisa has had the benefit of playing professionally and winning at the highest levels. Given Lisa's acumen for the game, there is no doubt in my mind that her transition to the sideline will be seamless."

Alston continued, "Deep has shared spaces with some of the NBA's most esteemed coaches and has experience developing high level guys. Deep also has a great understanding of the NBA and G League landscape and will be a valuable asset for our organization as we continue to develop the next crop of potential NBA players!"

KNICKS TRADE RETURNING RIGHTS, DRAFT PICK FOR ANDREW WHITE III

On August 29, the Westchester Knicks, the official NBA G League affiliate of the New York Knicks, traded the returning player rights to Billy Garrett and its 2019 NBA G League Draft second round pick to the Maine Red Claws in exchange for the returning player rights to Andrew White III.

Most recently, White III, 6'7, 210, competed with the New York Knicks' summer league team. Across four games, he averaged 3.8 points on 40-percent shooting, 0.8 rebounds and 0.3 assists in almost nine minutes.

Going undrafted in the 2017 NBA Draft out of Syracuse (2016-17), Nebraska (2015-16) and Kansas (2012-14), the forward spent the last two seasons with Maine, the NBA G League affiliate of the Boston Celtics, the Atlanta Hawks and then-affiliate Erie Bayhawks.

In 2018, White III signed a two-way contract with Atlanta. On February 14, he made his NBA debut, scoring a team-high 15 points in 17 minutes off the bench in a loss to Detroit. In 15 games with the Hawks, he averaged 4.6 points, 2.3 rebounds and 0.4 assists.

With the Red Claws last season, White III started 40 of the 50 games he appeared in averaging 12.9 points on 42.6-percent shooting, 3.8 rebounds, 1.0 assist, 0.5 steals and 0.3 rejections. Knocking down 2.4 triples a game, he shot 37.6-percent from downtown.

KNICKS RECEIVE RETURNING RIGHTS TO JJ MOORE FOR PAUL WATSON

On October 15, the Westchester Knicks, the official NBA G League affiliate of the New York Knicks, announced it acquired the returning rights to JJ Moore and the 2019 NBA G League fourth overall pick from the Raptors 905 in exchange for the returning rights to Paul Watson and the 22nd pick in the third round.

JJ Moore, 6'6, 215, last appeared in the G League in 2017-18. Last season, he exhausted one year of his returning rights previously owned by Raptors 905 (originally traded from Long Island Nets) playing for CD Las Animas and Asociacion Deportiva Atenas. Concluding the 2018-19 season with Atenas, Moore averaged 12.5 points on 40.9-percent shooting, 1.2 rebounds and 1.3 assists per game.

Across two seasons (2016-18) with the Long Island Nets, Moore averaged 10.9 points on 46.4-percent shooting, 2.7 rebounds and drained 30.3-percent of his perimeter looks. In 2017, Moore competed in the NBA Summer League with the club's NBA affiliate, the Brooklyn Nets.

The Brentwood, NY native averaged 7.9 points and 2.6 rebounds over his four-year collegiate career with Pittsburgh (2010-13) and Rutgers (2013-14).
