The goal is to reinforce consistent application of our brand elements as we continue to build upon the strength of the Long Beach State brand. By providing the colors, logos, fonts and individual sport marks, we hope to make it more accessible and valuable to alumni, teams, and partners.



Consistent color usage is key to the LBSU Athletic program visual identity. Below are the color specifications for print and electronic applications.

BLAIR FIELD

One of America's best amateur baseball facilities, Blair Field in Long Beach is the home of Dirtbags Baseball and is located in Recreation Park at the corner of 10th Street and Park Avenue. Blair Field has been honored by Baseball America as one of the top 15 collegiate ballparks in the nation. The Blair Field logo should be used when referring to the ballpark in a graphic layout.



The Long Beach State Athletics official Go Beach font should ONLY be used for the words below. Each sport, department, and facility will have its own wordmark to be used as a logotype. These wordmarks are in graphic file form and should always be placed as a graphic to ensure uniformity. These words can be combined, if desired. ie. Women's Soccer, Long Beach State Athletics.

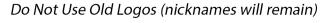

GO BEACH! A RALLY CRY

Former University President Robert Maxson, a four-time President of the Year in the CSU system, believed in the marketability of Long Beach State University as the only campus out of 340 NCAA Division I schools to have 'Beach' in its name. Maxson, who ended every public speech with 'Go Beach!', used this as a promotional vehicle during his time on campus. The saying was later carried forward by former President F. King Alexander and remains the University's main rallying cry.

WHAT IS A DIRTBAG?

The nickname of Long Beach State baseball team refers to the program's style of play and success against higher profile programs. The moniker was first coined for Coach Snow's first team in 1989 which was comprised of nearly all new players. Playing without a home field (LBCC, Cerritos JC and Blair Field), and practicing at a local all-dirt Pony Field, that team won its first 18 games and advanced to the program's first College World Series appearance. Then-infield coach Dave Malpass would take his infielders to the all-dirt field for their rigorous workout. The infielders would return to the regular practice field after their sessions covered in dirt. Thus the name Dirtbags was born. The name resurfaced again in 1993 when the 12-12 49ers rallied to win 34 of their next 41 games and finish three outs short of the National Championship game. The Dirtbags were once again a fan favorite at the 1998 College World Series as the country received a lesson in Dirtbag baseball.
