2021: recorded two saves and a 66.0 percent save percentage in the 3-1 win over RGV on 11/13...made his SAFC debut, starting and keeping a clean sheet in the conference quarterfinal win over San Diego on 11/5...joined on emergency loan from Indy Eleven on 11/4

INDY ELEVEN

missed most of 2018 recovering from a shoulder injury...experienced his first professional minutes with Indy Eleven in 2019 – beginning with a surprise early substitute appearance in Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup action on May 15...shut down Lansing Ignite FC for the final 70 minutes of a 1-0 win...Farr would go on to make 12 appearances (10 starts) in USL Championship action, starting 10 games and posting five clean sheets, 80 percent save rate and 0.66 goals against average...second stint in place of the injured Newton included the final three starts of the regular season and all three USL Championship Playoff contests...shut out New York Red Bulls II and Nashville SC and blanked Louisville City FC deep into stoppage time of the Eastern Conference Final

YOUTH/COLLEGE/INTERNATIONAL

attended Corban University, and earned minutes with Portland Timbers U-23 of USL League Two...Farr was a standout for the 2016 Corban University Warriors team that advanced to the NAIA National Tournament Round of 16 for the first time in program history...when he graduated in 2018, Farr ranked second in all-time NAIA career shutouts (44) and career goals-against-average (0.74).

Carter Manley joins San Antonio FC after spending the last two seasons with rival RGV FC...the former 2018 MLS SuperDraft pick had a career year in 2021, appearing in 33 matches (28 starts) with 2,629 minutes played, 49 clearances, 45 interceptions, 32 tackles, two goals and two assists...the defender has appeared in 12 matches with Minnesota United as well, across MLS and US Open Cup competitions... amassed 89 professional appearances in all competitions...also spent time on loan with the Las Vegas Lights of the USL Championship and Forward Madison of USL League One.

YOUTH/COLLEGE/INTERNATIONAL

attended Duke University for four years...made 58 appearances with the Blue Devils... named to 2017 All-ACC Third Team and 2018 All-ACC Academic Team.

2021: recorded his second assist of the season on 10/6 at ELP...was named the SWBC Man of the Match after he helped lead the club to a shutout victory on 9/11 at SLC... Taintor recorded a team-high five interceptions to go with 10 possessions gained and an 80 percent passing accuracy in the win...made his season debut with SAFC in his second season with the club after joining on loan in August...played 66 minutes in the 2-1 win over El Paso on 8/28...helped lead the defense to a win on 11/3 over RGV after adding a tackle and a shot in 90 minutes...was named the SWBC Man of the Match after recording three tackles and helping keep a shutout on 11/5 vs. San Diego.

2020: with SAFC in 2020, the defender appeared in 15 of the club's 16 regular season matches, compiling 1,470 minutes, 68 clearances, 42 aerial duels won and 23 interceptions...Taintor also played all 120 minutes of playoff competition for the team

CAREER

prior to 2020, the defender spent the previous two seasons with Sacramento...from 2018-19 with the Republic, he made 64 appearances (61 starts) between the regular season and playoffs, amassing 5,373 minutes played while adding three goals, three assists, 258 clearances and 146 duels won...originally drafted by Toronto FC in the third round (59th overall) of the 2016 MLS SuperDraft...Taintor signed with Toronto's USL Championship affiliate where he made 47 appearances in two seasons from 2016-17...the Connecticut native was the club captain for Toronto FC II in 2017 and scored three goals for the Canadian side over the course of his time there

YOUTH/COLLEGE/INTERNATIONAL

Taintor attended Rutgers University and played collegiate soccer from 2012-15, earning NSCAA Second Team All-Midwest Region and Second Team All-Big Ten Conference honors.

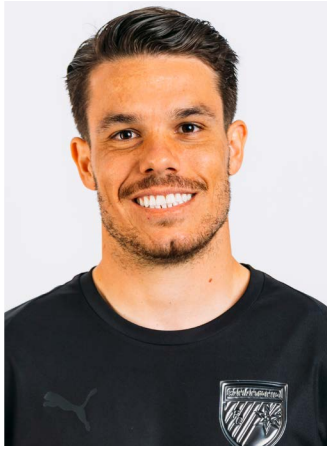

In 2021, Garcia led the Bold in blocks (17) and interceptions while ranking second in clearances.

YOUTH/COLLEGE/INTERNATIONAL

Garcia began his career in his home country of France with Colomiers, prior to playing for Guingamp, Sedan and Nimes from 2014-19...while with Nimes in 2017-18, Garcia helped get the club promoted to Ligue 1 of the French Football Federation for the first time since the 1992-93 season....overall in his professional career, Garcia has made 135 appearances while adding 10 goals from his defensive position.

2021: recorded his second assist of the season on 9/11 at SLC...returned from injury and played 45 minutes in the 2-1 win over El Paso on 8/28, recording three tackles and one chance created...returned from injury after missing six matches, playing 54 minutes and scoring his first goal of the season on 7/17 at COS...left the 5/29 match vs. RGV with injury after just 12 minutes...started and played 90 minutes while adding an assist in the 3-0 win against COS on 5/1...was named to the Team of the Week after the shutout win...recorded three tackles in the 3-1 win over RGV on 11/13

2020: finished the regular season with 14 games, 1,254 minutes played, two goals and one assist to go with 24 chances created...recorded four chances created and six tackles in the 3-2 win over RGV on 9/5...scored his first goal for the club and recorded a season-high 94.3 percent passing accuracy in the 4-0 win over OKC on 8/19...compiled six tackles and an 89.4 percent passing accuracy in 90 minutes during the 1-1 draw with ATX on 8/15...recorded a season-high four shots on 8/12 at TUL...Added his first assist of the season on 8/1 at ATX which created the winning goal...Recorded a join-team-high four key passes in the 1-0 win over RGV on 7/25...Recorded a team-high five key passes in his 90 minutes played on 7/19 at RGV...Started and played 90 minutes in his SAFC debut vs. Real Monarchs on 3/7/20...Signed with SAFC in January 2020 after spending the 2019 season with the Vancouver Whitecaps in MLS...Playoffs: played 120 minutes and created four chances in the quarterfinal loss to New Mexico

VANCOUVER WHITECAPS FC

2019: Spent the 2019 season with the Vancouver Whitecaps in MLS...compiled 812 minutes played in 18 appearances while adding one assist

CAREER

Prior to his time in Vancouver, the Brazilian spent two seasons from 2017-18 with Orlando City SC, making over 20 appearances between the first-team and the club's USL affiliate...has also made 45 appearances across parts of two seasons with the Fort Lauderdale Strikers (NASL) before being sold to the Tampa Bay Rowdies (NASL) in the middle of the 2016 season...made 14 appearances for Tampa Bay while adding one goal and one assist to close the season for the Rowdies...overall, he recorded nine goals and eight assists in 59 NASL matches with the two clubs... also spent time on loan with Belenenses of the Portuguese first division

Manneh joins SAFC after compiling 200-plus appearances as a professional in MLS, Europe, and Mexico....most recently, Manneh spent the 2021 season with Austin FC, making 16 appearances for the club last year...the 27-year-old has also made stops in MLS with the New England Revolution, FC Cincinnati, the Columbus Crew and the Vancouver Whitecaps....spent time with Pachuca in Liga MX and St. Gallen in the Swiss first division.

YOUTH/COLLEGE/INTERNATIONAL
Originally from Gambia, Manneh moved to the United States as a teenager and played youth soccer in Texas. After a spell with the Austin Aztex in USL League Two, Manneh was drafted by the Whitecaps in the first round (fourth overall) of the 2013 MLS SuperDraft. He would go on to make over 100 appearances with the Whitecaps, scoring 22 goals during his time there. Overall in his career, Manneh has amassed over 10,000 professional minutes, 34 goals and 19 assists while playing in both domestic and international club competitions.

Manneh has represented the United States at the full international level, receiving a January camp invite along with a callup for a friendly match against Paraguay in March of 2018.

Beckford joins SAFC after a strong season with the Colorado Springs Switchbacks in 2021...while with the Switchbacks, Beckford appeared in 29 matches (24 starts) in all competitions, compiling 2,039 minutes played to go with five goals, seven assists, 29 key passes and 45 successful dribbles... prior to his time in Colorado Springs, the 23-year-old spent the 2019 and 2020 USL Championship seasons with RGV FC, making 22 appearances for the Toros over the two years

YOUTH/COLLEGE/INTERNATIONAL
Beckford's professional career started in 2016 in his home country of Jamaica when he joined Montego Bay United...in addition to Montego Bay, Beckford has also played for Harbour View in Jamaica, piling up 38 appearances between the two clubs in just short of three seasons...overall in his professional career, Beckford has played in 89 club games (5,647 minutes) while scoring 19 goals.

Additionally, Beckford has represented Jamaica at the U-17, U-23 and full international levels...the midfielder made full international debut in January of 2022 in a friendly match against Peru.

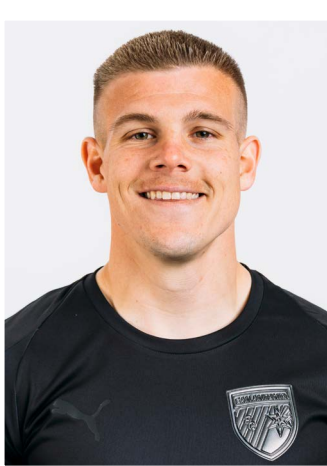

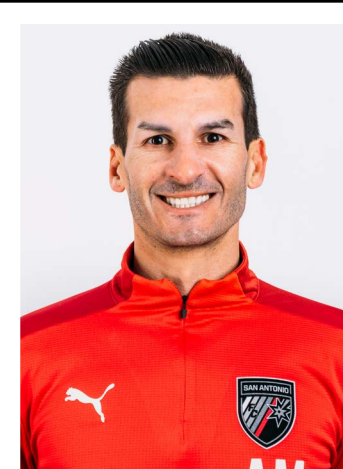

In the postseason, SAFC advanced to the USL Championship Western Conference Final for the first time in club history. The club would fall to the eventual champion Orange County SC in penalty kicks.

In 2020, after being named the second head coach in team history, Marcina led the club to a 10-3-3 record and a first place finish in Group D, earning the second playoff berth in team history. The club's 11-game unbeaten streak to start the season is the second-longest in team history, and Marcina earned USL Championship Coach of the Month honors for August of 2020.

While Marcina was with the first team as an assistant coach in 2019, the players scored a club-record 62 goals and compiled a 9-2-6 home record.

The Canada native previously spent over five years as a head coach in the North American Soccer League and USL League Two, most prominently with the San Antonio Scorpions in the NASL. The 40-year-old was with the Scorpions organization for each of the four seasons in its existence, starting as an assistant coach prior to being promoted to head coach during the 2013 NASL Season. In 2014, Marcina led the Scorpions to an NASL Championship after defeating the Fort Lauderdale Strikers in the Soccer Bowl at Toyota Field.

Following his time with the Scorpions, Marcina spent part of the 2016 season as the head coach of Rayo OKC (NASL), compiling a 6-5-5 record in 16 league matches. Marcina then spent the 2018 season with the Des Moines Menace (USL League 2), during which he led the club to a regular season title with an unbeaten 13-0-1 record. Overall, Marcina has compiled a 58-39-24 record as a head coach in all competitions.

In addition to his head coaching experience, Marcina spent the 2012 and part of the 2013 NASL seasons as an assistant coach with the Scorpions under Tim Hankinson, helping to lead the team to a first-place finish in the regular season in 2012 before bowing out of the playoffs in the semifinals. Marcina took over as interim head coach in 2013 before taking over full-time prior to the start of the 2014 season.

Prior to his time as a coach, Marcina enjoyed a successful playing career in which he featured for 13 clubs across seven countries in the span of seven years, scoring 73 goals in 185 professional appearances. Playing as a striker, Marcina began his career with the Ottawa Wizards (CPSL) in 2002 before making a move to Europe, where he played for Greek powerhouse PAOK Thessaloniki as well as clubs in Iceland, Germany, Denmark, and New Zealand before returning to play in the United States and Canada. Marcina officially retired from playing professionally in 2010.

He currently resides in San Antonio with his wife Melissa and two children.

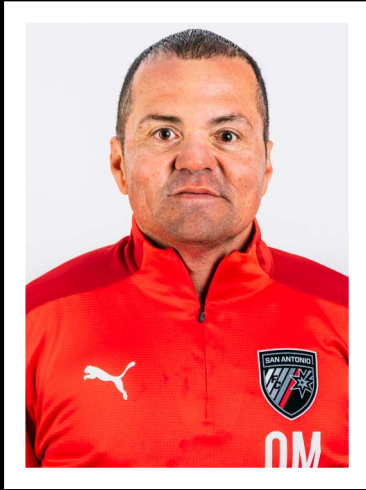

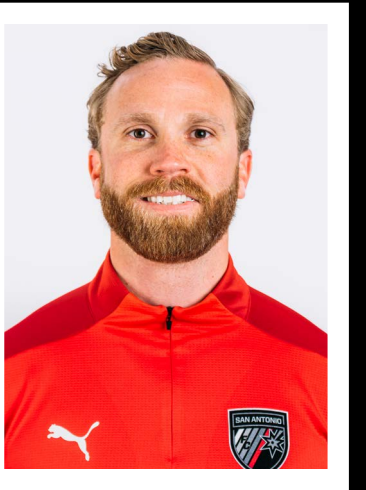
JESSE LOWRANCE

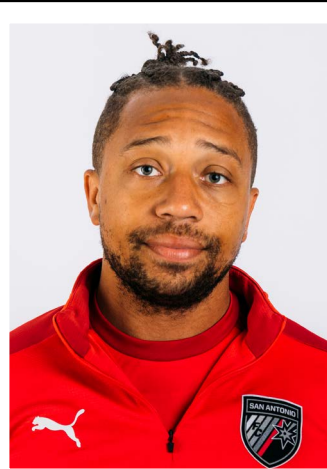

Peter J. Holt becomes the third member of the Holt family to serve as Chairman of Spurs Sports & Entertainment, continuing the Holts’ 23-year leadership of the organization. He succeeds Julianna Hawn Holt who held the position of Chairwoman and Co-CEO for three years, after taking over for Peter M. Holt who led the Spurs ownership group for 20 years. Under the Holt family’s leadership, the Spurs have become one of the premier franchises in North American sports, capturing five NBA titles (1999, 2003, 2005, 2007 and 2014) while qualifying for the NBA Playoffs for 22 straight seasons. The Holts joined the ownership group of San Antonio Spurs, LLC in 1996. Spurs Sports & Entertainment owns three professional sports franchises – the San Antonio Spurs, San Antonio FC (USL Championship) and the Austin Spurs (NBA G League). In addition, SS&E manages the day-to-day operations of the AT&T Center and Toyota Field. Under the Holts’ watch, the organization has grown to over 400 full-time and nearly 800 part-time employees. Holt is the great-great grandson of Benjamin Holt, who introduced the first practical track type tractor in 1904 and is a founder Caterpillar®, Inc. Holt and his sister, Corinna Holt Richter, have owned and managed HOLT CAT since 2017. Now the largest Caterpillar dealer in the country, with over 2,700 employees and more than 50 locations throughout Texas, HOLT CAT is a fifth-generation family-owned business headquartered in Southeast San Antonio. Holt serves as CEO and General Manager of HOLT CAT. Holt is passionate and focused on improvement in youth opportunities expressed by his involvement on the Board of SA Works and the University of the Incarnate Word. He participates on the Executive Committee of the United Way of San Antonio and Bexar County and is actively involved in United Way fundraising activities. He is also committed to wildlife conservation efforts and serves on the Executive Committee of the Texas Wildlife Association. Holt graduated from the University of the Incarnate Word in San Antonio with a bachelor’s degree in business administration. He resides in San Antonio with his wife, Lauren Kate, and their daughters, Ha-zel, Penny and Tippit.



CEO

R.C. was named CEO for Spurs Sports and Entertainment in July of 2019. In his current role he leads the business operations for all sports franchises owned and operated by Spurs Sports & Entertainment which includes the San Antonio Spurs (NBA), the Austin Spurs (NBA G-League) and San Antonio FC (USL Soccer) as well as the operations of the AT&T Center and Toyota Field. Prior to being named CEO Buford held the role of president of sports franchises from 2008-19. He served as the general manager of the Spurs while overseeing the sports administration for the other teams in the SS&E family. He has twice been named the NBA's executive of the Year in 2014 and 2016. R.C. started his professional career as an assistant coach at the University of Kansas in 1983. During each of his five seasons at Kansas, the Jayhawks participated in the NCAA Tournament. Buford was on the coaching staff for the team that won the 1988 NCAA Championship as well as the 1985–86 squad that advanced to the Final Four. In the summer of 2008 R.C. made the move to the NBA joining the Spurs as an assistant coach on Larry Brown's staff (other assistants on that staff included Gregg Popovich, Alvin Gentry and Ed Manning). He spent four seasons as an assistant with the Spurs, helping win back-to-back Midwest Division Titles (1990 and 1991). In the summer of 1992, Buford joined the Los Angeles Clippers as the first assistant for Coach Brown (the Clippers earned a spot in the 1993 Playoffs). He later served as an assistant coach at the University of Florida during the 1993-94 season (the team advanced to the Final Four for the first time in school history). In the Summer of 1994, R.C. returned to San Antonio (hired by Gregg Popovich) as the team's head scout. In the summer of 1997 he was elevated to Spurs director of scouting and was eventually promoted to vice president/ assistant general manager in the summer of 1999. In 2002 was named the Spurs general manager. R.C.'s collegiate experience included playing basketball at Texas A&M University and Oklahoma State before receiving his degree from Friends University. He is involved in the NBA Basketball Without Borders Africa Camp and in 2015, he became an advisory board member for Fuqua/Coach K Center on Leadership & Ethics (COLE) at Duke University. He currently serves on the Board of Directors of PeacePlayers International. His wife, Beth, is a former player on the LPGA Tour and are both active with the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation. They have a son, Chase, and a daughter, C.C. In 2004, they welcomed Alexis Wangmene from Cameroon and in 2007 welcomed Samer Jasser, from Israel, to their family. Wangmene met the Bufords during the Basketball Without Borders program in Johannesburg and Jassar was introduced to the Bufords through PeacePlayers International.

Rick Pych is entering his 29th season with Spurs Sports & Entertainment. After serving the past 11 years as the helm of SS&E, he is transitioning into a strategic advisory role as part of an overall succession plan. As President & CEO Pych led the business operations for all four sports franchises owned and operated by Spurs Sports & Entertainment which includes the San Antonio Spurs (NBA), the Austin Spurs (NBA G League), and San Antonio FC (USL Championship) as well as the operations of the AT&T Center and Toyota Field. He also oversaw all corporate business and new initiatives on behalf of the organization and its ownership group. Pych has had a long career of financial and business management experience in public accounting, banking, real estate, and sports and entertainment. He was initially named the Spurs chief financial officer in 1993 and was promoted to executive vice president in 2000. In 2008, he was named president of business operations and took over as president and CEO in 2016. In 1995 Pych started a development, financial and operating study for a new multi-purpose arena that eventually led to the new home for the Spurs, the AT&T Center. He was named the chief development officer for the AT&T Center in 1999 and oversaw a successful county referendum campaign that provided public funding to build the AT&T Center. In 2008, he led a second referendum that provided funds for additional improvements to the AT&T Center. Pych directed all aspects of the AT&T Center development projects as well as the 2015 renovation. During his time with SS&E Pych led the organization's efforts to expand its footprint in South Texas. In 2002 he negotiated the purchase of an American Hockey League (AHL) affiliate and in the summer of 2007 led the negotiations to purchase the NBA G League team in Austin, the Austin Spurs (formerly Austin Toros). Pych oversaw the process to bring professional soccer to San Antonio as SS&E was successfully awarded a USL expansion franchise in December 2015 and launched San Antonio FC, which began play in April 2016. Pych currently serves as an alternate governor on the NBA Board of Governors. He's an ongoing member and past chairman of the AHL Executive Committee as well as a member of the AHL Board of Governors. An active member in the San Antonio community, Pych is a past member of the Board of Directors of the San Antonio Sports Foundation dating back to 1989 and was part of the team that brought major sporting events to San Antonio, including the U.S. Olympic Festival in 1993, the 1995 National Senior Olympics, the 2002 NCAA Women's Final Four and the 1998, 2004, and 2008 NCAA Men's Final Four. He's served on the Executive Committee and was Vice Chair of the Board of Trustees of VIA Metropolitan Transit. Pych currently serves as Vice Chair of the Executive Committee of Centro Partnership San Antonio. His past board positions include the Executive Committee and Board of the San Antonio Economic Development Foundation, the Board of the San Antonio Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone, Executive Committee and Board of the Boys and Girls Clubs of San Antonio, and mentor in the InspireU Program of Big Brothers Big Sisters of South Texas. He holds a degree in accounting from Fairfield University and is a CPA.

Tim Holt serves as Managing Director of San Antonio FC (SAFC), where he is responsible for overseeing all aspects of the Spurs Sports & Entertainment owned professional soccer club. SAFC is entering its seventh season in the USL Championship and hosts its games at the purpose-built Toyota Field.

Holt arrived in San Antonio in January 2016 after a stint at Orlando City SC which he joined during its inaugural Major League Soccer (MLS) season as Vice President of Development. His immediate impact with the highly successful expansion team was marked by expansion of both the club and brand through the creation and launch of two new professional soccer franchises, Orlando Pride of the NWSL & Orlando City B of the USL. Additionally, he played a leadership role on behalf of the club within the local organizing group (along with the City of Orlando & Central Florida Sports Commission) which successfully delivered the prestigious 2016 Copa America Centenario for Orlando. Holt also represented Orlando City on the Florida Sports Foundation Board of Directors, and as Board Chairman for OCYS, Orlando City's 2,000+ member local youth soccer club.

Prior to his time with Orlando City, Holt served as an executive with the United Soccer League (USL) since 1999 including as its President from 2009-2015. In the previous decade, Holt served USL in the various capacities of Executive Vice President, Chief Operating Officer, and Director of Pro League Operations. Holt was a key figure in establishing the affiliation partnership between the USL and MLS that has become the critical platform for professional player development in the United States and Canada. Under the period of his leadership, the USL blossomed into the largest system of elite soccer leagues in North America with over 100 franchises and several hundred youth team members.

Holt has been repeatedly recognized as one of the leading executives in domestic soccer including having been named one of Soccer America's 'Rising Stars' in 2006 recognizing the top American soccer executives under the age of 35, as well as being recognized by SI.com in 2013 as one of "The 50 Most Powerful People in U.S. Soccer." Throughout his career, Holt has been active within the US Soccer Federation leadership serving numerous years on its Board of Directors, Lamar Hunt US Open Cup Committee, Professional Council, Appeals Committee, and Credentials Committee. Additionally, he is a long-time member of the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) and served as the Men's Pro representative on its Board of Directors until 2010.

As a youth player, Holt was part of the respected FC DELCO youth club in suburban Philadelphia where, upon graduating from Penn State University, he returned to work for the club in the mid-1990s launching, coordinating, and operating a 200+ team annual national youth soccer tournament. As a scholastic player at Radnor High School (PA), Holt still ranks amongst the school's all-time top leading scorers and is a member of the Radnor Soccer Hall of Fame. 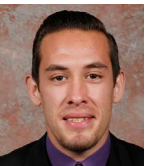

Regular Season Structure

The 2022 USL Championship season will see every team will play each of its conference foes twice – once at home, once away. For Eastern Conference clubs, the remaining eight games will be against interconference opponents – four at home, four away. For Western Conference clubs, the remaining 10 games will be against a combination of interconference and intraconference opponents – five at home, five away.

2022 USL Championship Playoffs

At the conclusion of the regular season, the top seven teams in each conference will qualify for the 2022 USL Championship Playoffs. The first overall seed in each conference will receive a bye to the Conference Semifinals of the playoffs.

The bracket will be reseeded following the Conference Quarterfinals to ensure the first overall seed in each conference plays against the lowest-seeded remaining opponent.

The USL Championship Playoffs will remain a single-elimination format, culminating in the 2022 USL Championship Final on Sunday, November 13.

SAFC PRO ACADEMY

In April of 2016, San Antonio FC launched the SAFC Pro Academy - a youth development program for the area's elite boys players which started with a 2004 birth-year team this season. In June of 2016, the club named Nick Evans as the first SAFC Pro Academy Director in team history. The academy has expanded to five teams at the U-12, U-13, U-14, U-15 and U-17 levels. The academy teams compete in MLS Next.

In 2018-19, The SAFC Pro Academy coaching staff was named the U.S. Soccer Development Academy (DA) Central Conference Boys Coaching Staff of the Year. SAFC was honored alongside NYCFC and LAFC of Major League Soccer

In February of 2019, San Antonio FC signed its first full-time academy product to a first-year contract when midfielder Leo Torres signed a professional deal.

The objective of the San Antonio FC Development Academy program is to identify and train the best players in the San Antonio market on a pathway to become a homegrown player for the SAFC professional team, national teams, and/or opportunities in college soccer. In addition to developing skilled and dynamic soccer players, key components of the program include each player displaying excellent personal character, becoming actively involved in community activities, and focusing on academic performance. The SAFC Pro Academy is structured to be a collaborative initiative between all local youth clubs and organizations in the San Antonio community by the opportunity to be an active part of the player identification process, as well as providing recognition and benefits to such participating clubs.

SAFC Pro Academy teams are fully-funded at no cost to players selected. This program is part of the professional club's strategic plan of establishing a nationally-respected youth academy.

JUAN LAMADRID

Juan Lamadrid is in his seventh season with SAFC as the First Team assistant/goalkeeper coach, as well as Pro Academy Director. During his second season with the club, Lamadrid was promoted to SAFC Goalkeeping Director as well as an SAFC Pro Academy coach. While with San Antonio FC, Lamadrid oversaw the 2017 Goalkeeper of the Year in Diego Restrepo.

Lamadrid was the goalkeepers coach of the San Antonio Scorpions of the professional North American Soccer League (NASL), since 2012. The Scorpions captured the 2014 NASL Championship under his leadership. With the Scorpions, Lamadrid coached MLS veteran Josh Saunders, US National Team Member David Bingham, and San Antonio native Matt Cardone.

Lamadrid was a part of the staff that was named the DA Academy Coaching Staff of the Year in 2018-19.

Coach Lamadrid has been a part of the Trinity University coaching staff since 2010, bringing with him a wealth of soccer coaching and playing experience. During his tenure, the Tiger teams have consistently produced some of the best defenses in the NCAA Division III.

Coach Lamadrid began his professional soccer career at age 17, playing Third Division with Soles de Hermosillo, Mexico. He played for six seasons in the Second Division with Coras del Tepic, Zacatepec, and Tampico Madero. In 1993, Coach Lamadrid moved up to the First Division and was a member of the Chivas Rayadas de Guadalajara for two seasons.

After finishing his playing career in 1996, Coach Lamadrid coached club and high school soccer in California. He was an assistant coach for Los Angeles Valley College, before moving on to CD Chivas USA San Bernardino Academy in 2006. Coach Lamadrid claims five international championships, as well as finishing second in the 2008 Copa Chivas International in Guadalajara.

Coach Lamadrid has scouted for USA Youth National Teams with the United States Soccer Federation, and has worked training camps with Boca Juniors USA.

He founded the Valley Youth Soccer Academy in Sun Valley, California. The academy trains and sends players to numerous professional teams, including Chivas Guadalajara, Tijuana FC, Pachuca, and Chivas USA Youth Development. The academy also prepares players for collegiate soccer.

TOYOTA FIELD

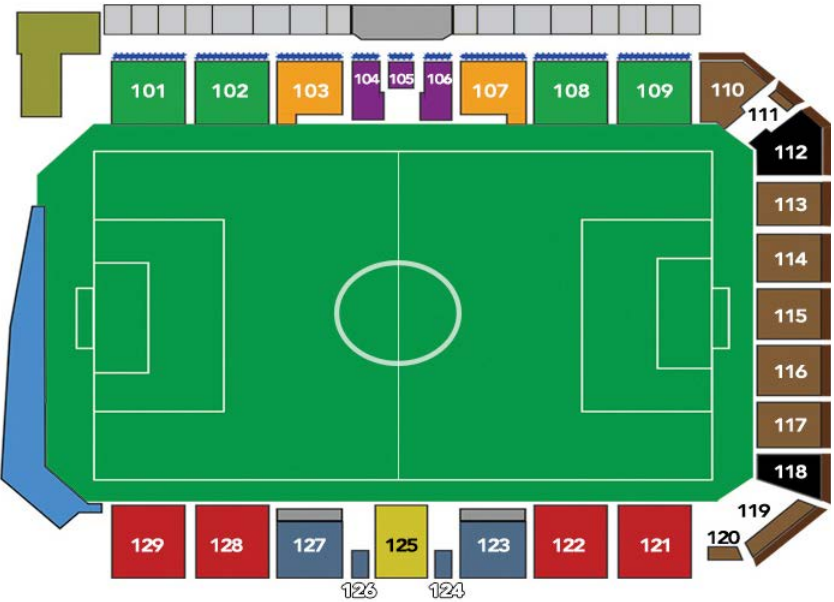
Toyota Field is a soccer-specific stadium in San Antonio, Texas, United States. Located next to Heroes Stadium, and adjacent to the STAR Soccer Complex, the facility opened on April 13, 2013. The stadium is the home of San Antonio FC and has a capacity of 8,250 for soccer matches. Toyota Motor Corporation currently holds the sponsor naming rights for the facility.

In November 2015, the City of San Antonio and Bexar County jointly acquired the stadium for \$18 million. Spurs Sports & Entertainment (SS&E) paid an additional \$3 million to Hartman, bringing the total purchase price of the facility to \$21 million. SS&E received an initial 20 year lease to operate the facility with a new professional soccer team. Toyota Field is the current host of USL club, San Antonio FC, that started play in April of 2016.

Toyota Field was originally owned and operated by S.O.A.R. Inc., a non-profit organization founded by San Antonio philanthropist Gordon Hartman. Construction of Toyota Field ran from February 2012 through April 2013. On April 13, 2013, the San Antonio Scorpions of the NASL started play at Toyota Field in a match against the Tampa Bay Rowdies.

Toyota Field was host of Soccer Bowl 2014.

Toyota Field was designed by San Antonio architecture firm, Pro Sports Developments (PSD), which is the sports entertainment division of Luna Architecture and Design.



STAR SOCCER COMPLEX



STAR SOCCER COMPLEX

STAR Soccer Complex is a 13-field facility adjacent to Toyota Field, catering to youth, adult and professional soccer. The complex is the home training ground for San Antonio FC and the SAFC Pro Academy.

In November 2015, the City of San Antonio and Bexar County jointly acquired STAR Soccer Complex along with Toyota Field for \$18 million. SS&E received an initial 20 year lease to operate the facility along with the stadium. STAR and Toyota Field are the current hosts of USL club, San Antonio FC, that started play in April of 2016.

STAR is used for all SAFC home training sessions and also is the home field of the SAFC Pro Academy. The complex also hosts organizational events for Spurs Sports & Entertainment and serves as the premier youth soccer training destination in San Antonio. STAR has also hosted major events such as the Copa Lonestar Tournament, the Defender's Cup, training camp for the American Alliance of Football and the Adidas Kick-Off Tournament.

CREDENTIALS

Preseason/Regular Season Matches

Media credentials are issued to working media only. Starting in 2022, all credentials will be distributed digitally via email. All credentials are non-transferable and any unauthorized use will subject bearer to ejection from Toyota Field and confiscation of the pass. NOTE: All personal items are subject to search upon entering Toyota Field. **Individual game credentials should be requested through the San Antonio FC Communications Department a minimum of 24 hours prior to game time or by 3 p.m. for all weekday matches.**

Media members covering SAFC on a regular basis will be issued full season credentials. Reserved seating requests should be made to the communications office 24 hours prior to match day by contacting the SAFC Communications Department at ppetri@sanantoniopc.com.

Single-game credentials will be issued on a space available basis. Credentials are good for admittance to the stadium, media workroom and postgame media areas.

ALL MEDIA MEMBERS ARE REQUIRED TO WEAR MASKS AND MAINTAIN SIX FEET OF DISTANCE THROUGHOUT THE 2022 SEASON.

ABSOLUTELY NO AUTOGRAPHS DURING THE MEDIA ACCESS PERIOD.

Interviews that need advance preparation or special accommodation should be arranged by contacting the SAFC Communications Department. This includes all live television interviews for pre- and post-game.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

All photographers are required to wear a photo bib and credential to gain field level access during play. The photography areas of Toyota Field are located behind either end line of the field. Photographers are prohibited from entering the sideline areas in front of or behind the team benches or in front of fans on the East sideline. In addition, photographers are asked to observe USL guidelines. For the 2021 season, photographers must wear a mask, and maintain six feet of separation.

MEDIA ENTRANCE AND PARKING

The media entrance is located at the Northwest entrance of Toyota Field. All media members must enter the building through this entrance. USL and SAFC season passes will be honored and single-game credentials will be allowed on a game-by-game basis.. The press doors open two hours prior to kick-off. For those media members who receive season parking privileges, the media parking is located in Lot 2 across from the Northwest entrance. Media covering SAFC on a game-by-game basis can request parking access along with their single-game credential.

MEDIA WORKROOM

The media workroom is located in the back of the press box, behind the operations booth and is only accessible with a valid credential. The room opens two hours prior to game time. The professional intent of the media workroom is to provide a working area for writers, photographers, broadcasters and game personnel. Family members and guests will not be admitted. Any abuse of the media workroom and/or press privileges will result in forfeiture of credentials. The media workroom is equipped with electrical outlets and Wifi access. For the 2021 season, anyone using the work room must wear a mask, and maintain six feet of separation.

MEDIA SEATING

Reserved media seating has been designated along press row in the outdoor seating section of the press box. All seats are reserved for each individual media member. Seating charts, if applicable, will be posted on display throughout the press box. Electrical outlets are placed on press row for your convenience. Statistics will be distributed at halftime and after the game. Media are asked to finish and file stories in the press area to facilitate changeover at Toyota Field. For the 2021 season, media members must wear a mask, and maintain six feet of separation.

USL MEDIA ACCESS POLICIES

Day of Game

Post-Game: For the 2022 season, postgame media access will occur remotely via Zoom sessions. Interested media will receive a link prior to the conclusion of the match. Following the game, the link will go live and media will have the opportunity to ask questions to select coaches and players. Media in attendance at Toyota Field can access the Zoom from their press area.

Off Day Access

Training: Please check with the communications staff regarding post practice Zoom availability.
