COACHING CAREER

- Is in his sixth season as the D-backs' manager (337-371; .476) and his 22nd in a managerial or coaching capacity in professional baseball.
- Entered the season tied with Bob Melvin (337) for the second most wins by a manager in franchise history and trailing Kirk Gibson by 16 victories.
- Honored with the Tommy Lasorda Managerial Achievement Award in 2019.
- Named the 2017 BBWAA NL Manager of the Year, the third D-backs manager to earn the honor, joining Bob Melvin (2007) and Kirk Gibson (2011).
- Was the seventh person to garner the honor in his first season as a manager: Hal Lanier in 1986 (Astros), Dusty Baker in 1993 (Giants), Joe Girardi in 2006 (Marlins), Matt Williams in 2014 (Nationals), Jeff Banister in 2015 (Rangers) and Dave Roberts in 2016 (Dodgers).
- Spent 4 seasons (2013-16) in the Red Sox' organization as the bench coach under John Farrell...was the first base coach on Farrell's staff with the Blue Jays from 2011-12.
- Acted as Boston's interim manager for 48 games from Aug. 14, 2015-end of the season while Farrell was on medical leave...guided the Red Sox to a 28-20 record.

HECKUVA RUN

- With a loss on Opening Day 2019, he had a losing record (0-1) for the first time in his career.
- His 324-game streak at or above .500 was the fourth-longest such streak by a Major League manager to start their career (see right).


HOW IT HAPPENED

- Named the club's eighth manager on Nov. 4, 2016.
- Met D-backs general manager Mike Hazen, who was an intern in Cleveland's baseball operations department, in 2001 at Spring Training when he was the Indians' Roving Coordinator...the duo also worked together in Boston from 2013-16.

- Guided the D-backs to a second-place finish in the NL West (93-69), and a Wild Card win over the Rockies.
- His 93 wins were the most by an Arizona manager in his first 162 games, 1 more than Bob Brenly's 92 in 2001, and were 24 more than their total of 69 in 2016, the second-largest win difference in the Majors behind the Twins (26), and fourth-best increase in franchise history.



- A basketball enthusiast, he shoots around almost every morning at his house...on the road, he organizes games for the coaching and support staff, which has included visits to: Marquette University, University of Kansas, UCLA, Minnesota Timberwolves, Brooklyn Nets and Houston Rockets.



- Served as the assistant basketball coach for his son, Connor's, high school basketball team at New Way Academy in Phoenix for the 2018-19 season.

'SPARK'ING A CAREER

Cites Hall of Fame former Tigers manager Sparky Anderson as the biggest influence on his managerial career:

"...one of the things Sparky taught me from Day 1: Your family, your parents are the people that are going to be around to support you, they need to love you the most," Lovullo told the *Detroit Free Press*. "My thoughts and strategies of how I get to know the players on that level first...Having conversations beyond the game and asking about parents, children, understanding how important families are."

DOWN ON THE FARM

- Owned a 661-609 (.520) record in 9 seasons as a Minor League manager in the Indians (2002-09) and Red Sox (2010) systems...guided his clubs to 4 postseason appearances and 2 league championships.
- Earned both *Baseball America* Double-A and Eastern League Manager of the Year honors after leading Akron to the EL Championship in 2005...named Carolina League Manager of the Year in 2004 after leading his club to the title.

PLAYING CAREER

Played in 303 games over 8 Major League seasons with the Tigers (1988-89), Yankees (1991), Angels (1993), Mariners (1994), A's (1996), Indians (1998) and Phillies (1999), he hit .224 with 15 homers and 60 RBI...concluded career with a season in Japan for the Yakult Swallows in 2000...selected by Detroit in the fifth round of the 1987 draft.

WHAT'S IN A NUMBER?

As a Minor League manager from 2002-10, wore jersey No. 11 to honor Sparky Anderson, his first Major League manager...has worn No. 17 since joining the Red Sox in 2013, a reference to his wife's birthday (Dec. 17).

LET'S GO BUFF-A-LO

- Was inducted into the Buffalo Baseball Hall of Fame on July 20, 2003.
- Played for the Buffalo Bisons for 3 seasons (1995, '97-98).
- Helped lead the 1997 club to an American Association title and was named Most Valuable Player of the Championship Series...won the Frank J. "Fremo" Vallone Community Service Award in each of his 3 seasons.
- Also managed the Bisons from 2006-08, going 214-212 (.502) in 3 seasons.





MANAGERIAL CAREER

- Managed the Rangers from 2015-18, going 325-313 (.509)...won 2 American League West division titles (2015-16).
- Was the fourth manager to win a division crown in each of his first 2 seasons (since division play in 1994).
- Named the 2015 AL Manager of the Year after going 88-74 (.543) and posting a 21-game improvement from 2014 (67-95)...was the first AL manager to win the award with no previous Major League managerial experience.
- Finished second in the 2016 Manager of the Year voting after guiding the Rangers to a 95-67 record.
- Combined to go 299-330 (.475) in 5 seasons as a Minor League manager in the Pirates' system (1994-98).

COACHING CAREER

- Worked in a variety of positions with the Pirates from 1993-2014, '19-20, including bench coach from 2010-14 and Special Assistant, Baseball Operations from 2019-20.
- Named the Pirates' interim bench coach on Aug. 8, 2010 and was officially named to the role on Nov. 24.
- Spent 8 years (2003-10) as Pittsburgh's Minor League Field Coordinator after serving as the Pirates' Field Coordinator (1999-2002).
- Was a player/coach with Double-A Carolina in 1993.

- Singled in his lone Major League plate appearance as a pinch hitter with the Pirates on July 23, 1992 vs. Braves.
- Pinch hit for D-backs Minor League Pitching Coach Doug Drabek.
- Missed the following season (1993) due to right elbow surgery.



FAMILIAR FACE

Worked closely with Mike Fitzgerald, D-backs vice president, research & development & assistant GM, with the Pirates from 2012-14.

"Once we gathered numbers, it came back to 'How do you translate it to players?'" Banister said. "The answer is you keep it simple."

- Battled bone cancer and osteomyelitis (an infection of the bone or bone marrow) starting as a sophomore in high school and lasting throughout his professional career.
- Originally injured his left ankle while playing baseball, and during an examination of his slow healing injury, he was diagnosed with bone cancer.
- An infection of his left leg led to the development of osteomyelitis, which spread from his ankle to just below his knee and nearly led to having his leg amputated.
- Underwent a total of 7 operations on his left ankle and leg in 1980.

- Broke 3 vertebrae in his neck in a home plate collision at Lee College in 1983 and was paralyzed from the neck down for 10 days.
- Was not scheduled to play and was inserted when a Yankees' scout told his coach he hoped to see Banister catch.
- Doctors said he may never walk again and underwent 3 surgeries on his back and learned to walk again during the 1984 season.
- Entered the hospital weighing 225 lbs. and was discharged at 139.
- Recovered from the injury and was named a 1985 Junior College All-American and then transferred to the University of Houston.

- Married to Karen...has 2 children: Alexandra and Jacob.
- Son, Jacob, plays baseball at Northern Colorado University.
- Was the first recipient of the Gilda Radner Courage Award (1991-92)...received the "Pride of the Pirates" award in 2011.

- Ragnar is a long-distance, overnight running relay race in different geographic locations throughout the year.



- He and his wife, Ali, own horses in the Phoenix area and enjoy riding them in their free time...while with the Giants, he would tow his horses with him to Spring Training each year from North Carolina to Scottsdale.

- On Opening Day 2015, he rode a horse around the warning track at Oracle Park to raise the 2014 World Series banner in center field.
- Growing up, his family owned horses, so he learned to ride at a very young age.

- Is named after Corey Pavin, the 1991 PGA Tour Player of the Year and 1995 U.S. Open winner.

After serving as President of Gary Player Enterprises from 2000-07, his dad, Tim, switched to medical sales so that he could have more time to watch Pavin play baseball.



WAH-HOO-WAH

- Played 3 seasons at the University of Virginia (2015-17), batting .325 with 41 doubles, 6 triples, 28 home runs, 178 RBI and 100 walks in 187 games...was teammates with Jake McCarthy from 2016-17
- Helped lead the Cavaliers to a College World Series title in 2015, hitting .302 with 7 RBI in the NCAA Tournament... hit a game-tying, 2-run home run off Walker Buehler and then a go-ahead, and eventual game-winning, single in the series-clinching Game 3 win over Vanderbilt.
- In 2015, led UVA in hits (83), becoming the first freshman in school history to do so since 1984.
- Earned First-Team All-ACC honors as a junior in 2017 and was a semi-finalist for the Golden Spikes Award after a season in which he had more home runs (13) than strikeouts (12).
- After being drafted in 2017, he made a "significant commitment back to the baseball program" at Virginia.

"I didn't ask him for that," Brian O'Connor, University of Virginia's head baseball coach, told the *Arizona Republic*. "And I'm sure his parents didn't ask him to pay off their mortgage, either. But he's a very giving, gracious, thoughtful person."

- After the conversation, he went straight to the team's strength and conditioning coach and began working on a plan to transform his body and dropped nearly 40 pounds.

"Every time I see that scout, I thank him," Straily said. "It was hard to hear, but I knew he would never say that to someone he didn't believe had a shot. It inspired me. That moment changed my life."






