

PROFESSIONAL RUGBY IN WASHINGTON, DC

Old Glory DC is a professional rugby team based in the District of Columbia and officially joined Major League Rugby (MLR) in 2018 and entered its first season in 2020. Playing its home games at Segra Field in Leesburg Virginia, Old Glory will compete in MLR's Eastern Conference against teams from Atlanta, New England, New Orleans, New York, and Toronto, as well as play games against Western Conference teams Austin, Dallas, Houston, San Diego, Seattle, and Utah.

The Old Glory ownership team is led by DC natives and life-long rugby players Paul Sheehy and Chris Dunlavey and includes the Scottish Rugby Union, represented on Old Glory's board by the SRU's COO Dominic McKay. The organization seeks to grow the sport of rugby in the region through community engagement, by promoting an alternative path for personal development through sport, embracing the unique values of rugby: respect, determination, diligence, teamwork, and commitment.

WHY OLD GLORY DC?


Old Glory is a nickname for the flag of the United States. The original "Old Glory" was a flag owned by the 19th-century American sea captain William Driver (March 17, 1803 – March 3, 1886), who flew the flag during his career at sea and later brought it to Nashville, Tennessee, where he settled. Driver greatly prized the flag and ensured its safety from the Confederates, who attempted to seize the flag during the American Civil War. In 1922, Driver's daughter and niece claimed to own the original "Old Glory," which became part of the collection of the Smithsonian Institution, where it remains at the National Museum of American History.

After considering hundreds of options proposed by our fans and advisors, we have selected a name and logo that speak to our region's patriotism and the unique role of our home city as the nation's capital. Old Glory DC will be known for valuing the traditions of rugby, but also for our appreciation of the strong connections between the Mid-Atlantic rugby community and our military personnel and their families. Beyond that, our name is a nod of respect to so many of our corporate partners, whose missions are to serve the people and agencies who serve all Americans.

"The response to our Name the Team challenge was incredible, with close to 1,000 fans participating," Co-owner Paul Sheehy said. "We had so many great names to choose from, but in the end, we felt we had to choose a name that could only really work in Washington, and that is inclusive of all of the diverse members of our community."

"And we think our fans will see the deeper meaning," Co-owner Chris Dunlavey added. "Yes, it's a flag, but Old Glory has been places. It's battle-scarred. It's weather-beaten. But still it flies proud. It symbolizes all the strength, resilience, commitment, and substance over style that are the hallmarks of rugby and, for that matter, the American character."





Week 7 Preview Against Rugby ATL

Revitalized After the Bye, Consistency and Finish is the Focus Against Atlanta

Fresh off the bye week, Old Glory DC welcomes its Week 1 opponent, Rugby ATL, to Segra Field for a nationally televised clash on Sunday night. The 4-1 Ratlers are one of MLR's hottest teams after a convincing 29-14 victory over previously unbeaten Austin. Although DC didn't win in its last contest, Old Glory played its most complete game of the season before the bye.

Old Glory is focused on upsetting the top club in the Eastern Conference, with the team rested and healthy, and with new faces joining the fray. Kickoff will be at 7:00 pm Sunday on FS1, and tickets are available here.

OGDC will celebrate St. Patrick's Day at Segra Field as the gates open at 2:00 pm. The first of two curtain-raisers starts at 2:30 pm with Mary Washington University battling Bowling Green.



At 4:30 pm, Virginia Tech takes on James Madison as part of the Iron Vine Series Rugby Invitational. The MacMillan Pipe Band will provide the music the during pre-game and Celtic Harpist halftime, and Abbie Palmer will be on stage in the VIP Club House. The Beer Garden will be back by the Sheehy Showcase next to the north try zone for all fans.

The bye allowed the coaching staff to assess the first third of the season and put an optimum lineup on the field for Sunday. The arrival of Felix Kalapu gives the forward pack a boost and flexibility with increased depth. Another roster change is Jake Ilnicki replacing Jack Iscaro, who is out with a lower body injury.

With the team as healthy as it is, it gives the coaching staff more options. "At the root of it, it gives us more competition," Renata Roberts-Te Nana said. "Healthy competition is going to be massive.

Whatever game plan we feel like we want to use this week, we have the tools necessary to do that. Whether we want to be more crash and bang or watching out for the high balls, we got the skillset and everyone available now to execute the game plan that Coach Douglas wants."

In the forwards, Ilnicki, Rob Irimescu, and Kyle Stewart will line up in the front row. Api Naikitini and Stan South are your locks with Kalapu, Cory Daniel, and Luke Campbell manning the back row. Mo Katz, Dante Lopresti, Dom Bailey, Fintan Coleman, and Will Vakalahi will be the impact subs.



Consistency breeds success as the coaching staff will roll out the same backline starters as the Legion match. Captain Danny Tusitala and Rohan Saifoloi are the halfbacks and Junior Sa'uand William Talataina will man the centers.

Peni Lasaqa and Doug Fraser are the wings with Roberts-Te Nana completing the back three at fullback. Mike Dabulas, Owen Sheehy, and John Lefevre are the covers on the bench.

With the bye in the rearview, Old Glory is focused on the next challenge with Rugby ATL on Sunday. After playing its best game of the season at San Diego, DC knows it needs to finish plays and, ultimately, play a full 80 minutes to beat a team like Sunday's opponent.

While building on the positives from the San Diego match, the impetus is clear. "We're going to have to finish," head coach Andrew Douglas said. "We had enough opportunities to score and win the game, but we didn't take those opportunities. We need to be more ruthless in the 22 and finish. We got ourselves in good parts of the field and just didn't complete."

Roberts-Te Nana added, "When the opportunity arises, we just have to be able to call for the ball where we are literally slowing everything down to a halt [inside the 22]. We are letting the defense set and wait for the perfect picture where sometimes you just got to beat them with speed. So this week, we have to play lightning quick, but with a lot of precision."

Old Glory DC hung tough against Atlanta in Week 1 for 55 minutes until it fell apart. The Ratlers return a physical forward pack led by Johan Momsen and Matt Heaton. ATL was without Kurt Coleman, Joaquín de la Vega Mendía, Duncan and van Schalkwyk last weekend against the Gilgronis, but the trio of Martini Talapusi, Harley Davidson, and Austin White filled in exceptionally. The center combo of Will Leonard and Rvan Nell is lethal and attracts a lot of attention.

"We know we can compete with Atlanta," Douglas said.

"Our set-piece was pretty good in that first game, and when we were connected defensively, we were good. We have to be in the game for a longer period of time than we were. We have to be more consistent in our approach both on offense and defense."

"In everything we do, we have to do it quickly, efficiently, and try to run these boys around the field," Roberts-Te Nana said. "They like to be brutal and fast and are quite robotic in what they do. As long as we are on the same page, if we play heads-up rugby, we'll be alright. Expect a really fast game. High intensity."

After five straight losses, Old Glory has had to do some serious soul-searching over the bye. "We've had to take a deep, hard look at ourselves and make sure we're all doing it for the right reasons," Roberts-Te Nana stated.

"We have to trust each other and know that all of the pieces are there. The team, coaches, and owners are there, and we have to put out that performance and create that hope to win a game. Build on it because winning becomes a habit."

With the trust, belief, and health on their side, OGDC needs to fight and keep fighting until the final whistle. "We need to stay in it the whole game for however long it takes to win this game. We need to be in the game laserfocused the whole time. We can't switch off like we did the first time at 55 minutes and think that's going to do the job. From the first kickoff to the last whistle, everyone from #1 to #23 with coaches included has to be on their game without switching off," Roberts-Te Nana concluded.

Bean Scene

Coffee's too good to confine to a cup. Celebrate buzzworthy beans from across the globe with these coffee-centric sous vide recipes.

Wine experts wow us with their ability to discern passion fruit or wet concrete after getting nosedeep in a glass of Sauvignon Blanc. But what about coffee experts? Just like grapes, coffee varieties have incredibly nuanced flavor profiles that beg to be analyzed and explained, and when they are, environment comes up a lot. That's because "terroir," as it's called by wine and coffee professionals, can make a bean harvest taste acidic or floral, bright or earthy. It's the reason coffee grown in Brazil can seem nutty while coffee from Indonesia often boasts smoky undertones.

Here, we've outlined the essence of several coffee varieties, and crafted a few sous vide recipes to showcase global flavors that'll fit perfectly on your holiday table.

COLOMBIAN

You wouldn't expect roasted beans to taste like ripe fruit, but Colombian coffee varieties do. Colombia has two four-month coffee harvest seasons due to its proximity to the Equator, which may account for its coffee's fresh and juicy taste year-round.

HONDURAN

Most Honduran coffee is nutty and mild—the right profile for blending with other varieties. Recently though, specific "microlots," or small harvests, have affirmed Honduras as a standout among Central American coffee growers. Some varieties have a syrupy body, and flavors can range from apricot to green tea.

INDONESIAN

Indonesia's coffee is resoundingly earthy—Sumatran coffee especially. Experts have called coffee from the island of Sumatra "meaty," "stouty," and "smoky." Flavor profiles are also shaped by the harvest's climate



zone, which can be either above or below the Equator in Sumatra.

ETHIOPIAN

Ethiopia is Arabica coffee's hub. It grows naturally there, so coffee varieties are diverse and easier to cultivate. While biodiversity results in sprawling flavor differences between varieties, processing can impart either a dense, fruity flavor or dry, floral flavor in a single variety.

GUATEMALAN

Like lots of Central American coffee, Guatemalan coffee is both acidic and fruity. Its flavor echos the tart-sweet taste of apple and coexists with a chocolatey smoothness—inspiring many coffee connoisseurs to describe it as "balanced."

KENYAN

Kenya's coffee is highland-grown and is often touted as a favorite of coffee aficionados. Two popular varieties, SL-34 and SL-28, were developed by Scott Labs for the Kenyan government to resist drought and other environmental factors. They deliver the most gobsmacking combination of tang and sweet—similar to black currant or tomato.

BRAZILIAN

It's all about the process with Brazilian beans. Coffee from Brazil is either "natural" (dried with the coffee cherry attached to the seed) or "pulped natural" (dried with some of the inner mucilage caramelizing around the bean). As a result, the coffee boasts a warm sweetness—delicious in espresso blends.

Cryoconcentrated Coffee Martini

Servings: 4 / Prepping time: 10 minutes / Cooking time: 5 minutes (excludes sous-vide cooking)

Method

For the Cryo Coffee Concentrate:

Pour coffee grounds and water in a sous-vide pouch and seal. Cook at $181^{\circ}F$ ($83^{\circ}C$) for 6 hours.

After cooking, place a cheese cloth and coffee filter over a sieve and pour contents of the pouch into the sieve, separating the leftover grounds from the liquid.

Place the liquid in the refrigerator for about 30 minutes until it cools to 43°F (6°C). Once fully drained and cooled, place the liquid into a sous-vide pouch and seal. Place in the freezer for at least 3 hours, laying down as flat as possible.

Remove the pouch from the freezer, and without breaking the pouch, crush contents with a mallet or a saucepot without breaking the pouch until it forms a slush-like consistency.

Next, place the frozen contents in a fine strainer over a mixing bowl to capture the liquid extract.

Leave the frozen coffee at room temperature for 2 hours to extract. The ice should remain in the strainer while the extraction is in the bowl.

For the Cryo Coffee Martini:

Mix the cryo coffee concentration from the bowl, Kahlua, and vodka in cocktail shaker with ice.

To Serve:

Strain into martini glass and garnish with a sprig of mint, if desired.

Ingredients

Cryo Coffee Concentrate

% C coffee grounds, French roast

4 C cold water

Cryo Coffee Martini

4 fl oz cryo concentrated coffee extract

4 fl. oz vodka (Grey Goose is recommended)


