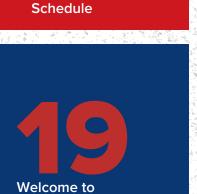

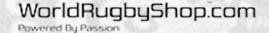

PROFESSIONAL RUGBY IN WASHINGTON, DC

Old Glory DC is a professional rugby team based in the District of Columbia and officially joined Major League Rugby (MLR) in 2018 and entered its first season in 2020. Playing its home games at Segra Field in Leesburg Virginia, Old Glory will compete in MLR's Eastern Conference against teams from Atlanta, New England, New Orleans, New York, and Toronto, as well as play games against Western Conference teams Austin, Dallas, Houston, San Diego, Seattle, and Utah.

The Old Glory ownership team is led by DC natives and life-long rugby players Paul Sheehy and Chris Dunlavey and includes the Scottish Rugby Union, represented on Old Glory's board by the SRU's COO Dominic McKay. The organization seeks to grow the sport of rugby in the region through community engagement, by promoting an alternative path for personal development through sport, embracing the unique values of rugby: respect, determination, diligence, teamwork, and commitment.

WHY OLD GLORY DC?

Old Glory is a nickname for the flag of the United States. The original "Old Glory" was a flag owned by the 19th-century American sea captain William Driver (March 17, 1803 – March 3, 1886), who flew the flag during his career at sea and later brought it to Nashville, Tennessee, where he settled. Driver greatly prized the flag and ensured its safety from the Confederates, who attempted to seize the flag during the American Civil War. In 1922, Driver's daughter and niece claimed to own the original "Old Glory," which became part of the collection of the Smithsonian Institution, where it remains at the National Museum of American History.

After considering hundreds of options proposed by our fans and advisors, we have selected a name and logo that speak to our region's patriotism and the unique role of our home city as the nation's capital. Old Glory DC will be known for valuing the traditions of rugby, but also for our appreciation of the strong connections between the Mid-Atlantic rugby community and our military personnel and their families. Beyond that, our name is a nod of respect to so many of our corporate partners, whose missions are to serve the people and agencies who serve all Americans.

"The response to our Name the Team challenge was incredible, with close to 1,000 fans participating," Co-owner Paul Sheehy said. "We had so many great names to choose from, but in the end, we felt we had to choose a name that could only really work in Washington, and that is inclusive of all of the diverse members of our community."

"And we think our fans will see the deeper meaning," Co-owner Chris Dunlavey added. "Yes, it's a flag, but Old Glory has been places. It's battle-scarred. It's weather-beaten. But still it flies proud. It symbolizes all the strength, resilience, commitment, and substance over style that are the hallmarks of rugby and, for that matter, the American character."

Cryoconcentrated Coffee Martini

Servings: 4 / Prepping time: 10 minutes / Cooking time: 5 minutes (excludes sous-vide cooking)

Method

For the Cryo Coffee Concentrate:

Pour coffee grounds and water in a sous-vide pouch and seal. Cook at 181°F (83°C) for 6 hours.

After cooking, place a cheesecloth and coffee filter over a sieve and pour contents of the pouch into the sieve, separating the leftover grounds from the liquid.

Place the liquid in the refrigerator for about 30 minutes until it cools to 43°F (6°C). Once fully drained and cooled, place the liquid into a sous-vide pouch and seal. Place in the freezer for at least 3 hours, laying down as flat as possible.

Remove the pouch from the freezer, and without breaking the pouch, crush contents with a mallet or a saucepot without breaking the pouch until it forms a slush-like consistency. Next, place the frozen contents in a fine strainer over a mixing bowl to capture the liquid extract.

Leave the frozen coffee at room temperature for 2 hours to extract. The ice should remain in the strainer while the extraction is in the bowl.

For the Cryo Coffee Martini:

Mix the cryo coffee concentration from the bowl, Kahlua, and vodka in cocktail shaker with ice.

To Serve:

Strain into martini glass and garnish with a sprig of mint, if desired.

Cryo Coffee Concentrate

34 C coffee grounds, French roast

4 C cold water

Cryo Coffee Martini

4 fl oz cryo concentrated coffee extract

4 fl oz vodka (Grey Goose is recommended)

Bean Scene

Coffee's too good to confine to a cup. Celebrate buzzworthy beans from across the globe with these coffee-centric sous vide recipes.

Wine experts wow us with their ability to discern passion fruit or wet concrete after getting nosedeep in a glass of Sauvignon Blanc. But what about coffee experts? Just like grapes, coffee varieties have incredibly nuanced flavor profiles that beg to be analyzed and explained, and when they are, environment comes up a lot. That's because "terroir," as it's called by wine and coffee professionals, can make a bean harvest taste acidic or floral, bright or earthy. It's the reason coffee grown in Brazil can seem nutty while coffee from Indonesia often boasts smoky undertones.

Here, we've outlined the essence of several coffee varieties, and crafted a few sous vide recipes to showcase global flavors that'll fit perfectly on your holiday table.

COLOMBIAN

You wouldn't expect roasted beans to taste like ripe fruit, but Colombian coffee varieties do. Colombia has two four-month coffee harvest seasons due to its proximity to the Equator, which may account for its coffee's fresh and juicy taste year-round.

HONDURAN

Most Honduran coffee is nutty and mild—the right profile for blending with other varieties. Recently though, specific "microlots," or small harvests, have affirmed Honduras as a standout among Central American coffee growers. Some varieties have a syrupy body, and flavors can range from apricot to green tea.

INDONESIAN

Indonesia's coffee is resoundingly earthy—Sumatran coffee especially. Experts have called coffee from the island of Sumatra "meaty," "stouty," and "smoky." Flavor profiles are also shaped by the harvest's climate



zone, which can be either above or below the Equator in Sumatra.

ETHIOPIAN

Ethiopia is Arabica coffee's hub. It grows naturally there, so coffee varieties are diverse and easier to cultivate. While biodiversity results in sprawling flavor differences between varieties, processing can impart either a dense, fruity flavor or dry, floral flavor in a single variety.

GUATEMALAN

Like lots of Central American coffee, Guatemalan coffee is both acidic and fruity. Its flavor echos the tart-sweet taste of apple and coexists with a chocolatey smoothness—inspiring many coffee connoisseurs to describe it as "balanced."

KENYAN

Kenya's coffee is highland-grown and is often touted as a favorite of coffee aficionados. Two popular varieties, SL-34 and SL-28, were developed by Scott Labs for the Kenyan government to resist drought and other environmental factors. They deliver the most gobsmacking combination of tang and sweet—similar to black currant or tomato.

BRAZILIAN

It's all about the process with Brazilian beans. Coffee from Brazil is either "natural" (dried with the coffee cherry attached to the seed) or "pulped natural" (dried with some of the inner mucilage caramelizing around the bean). As a result, the coffee boasts a warm sweetness—delicious in espresso blends.

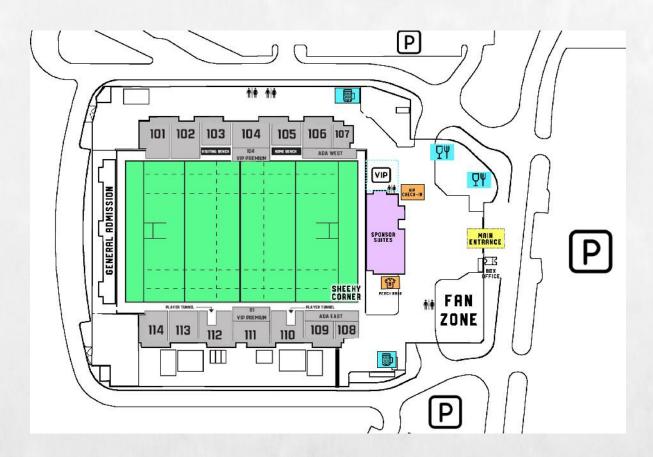


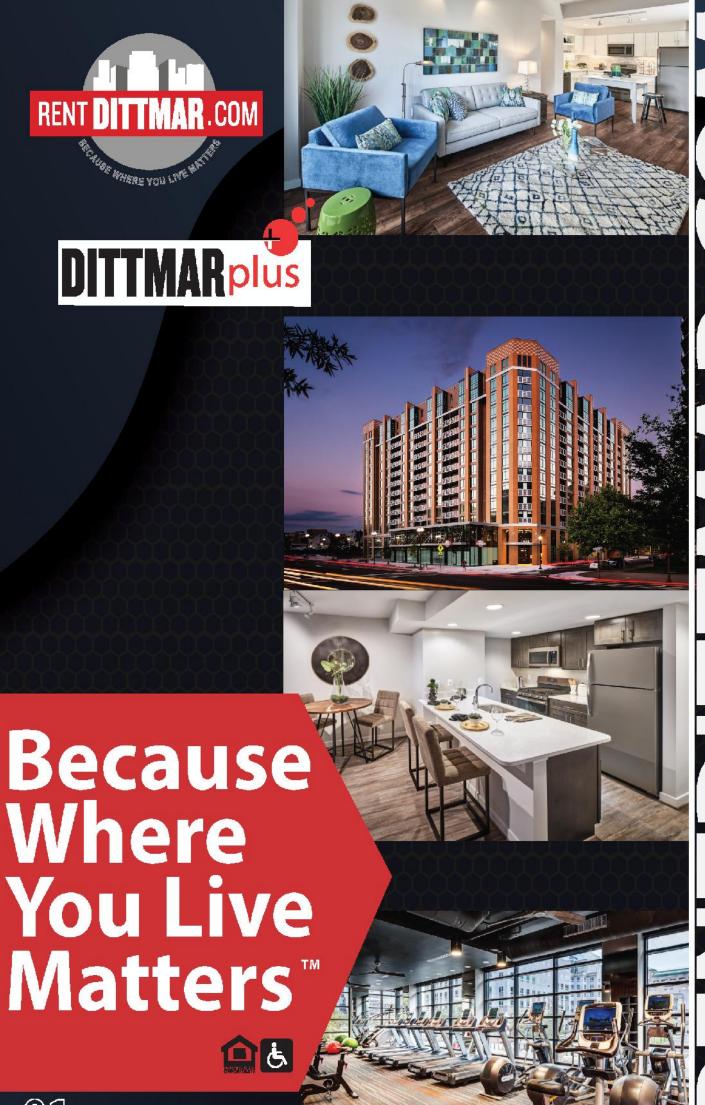

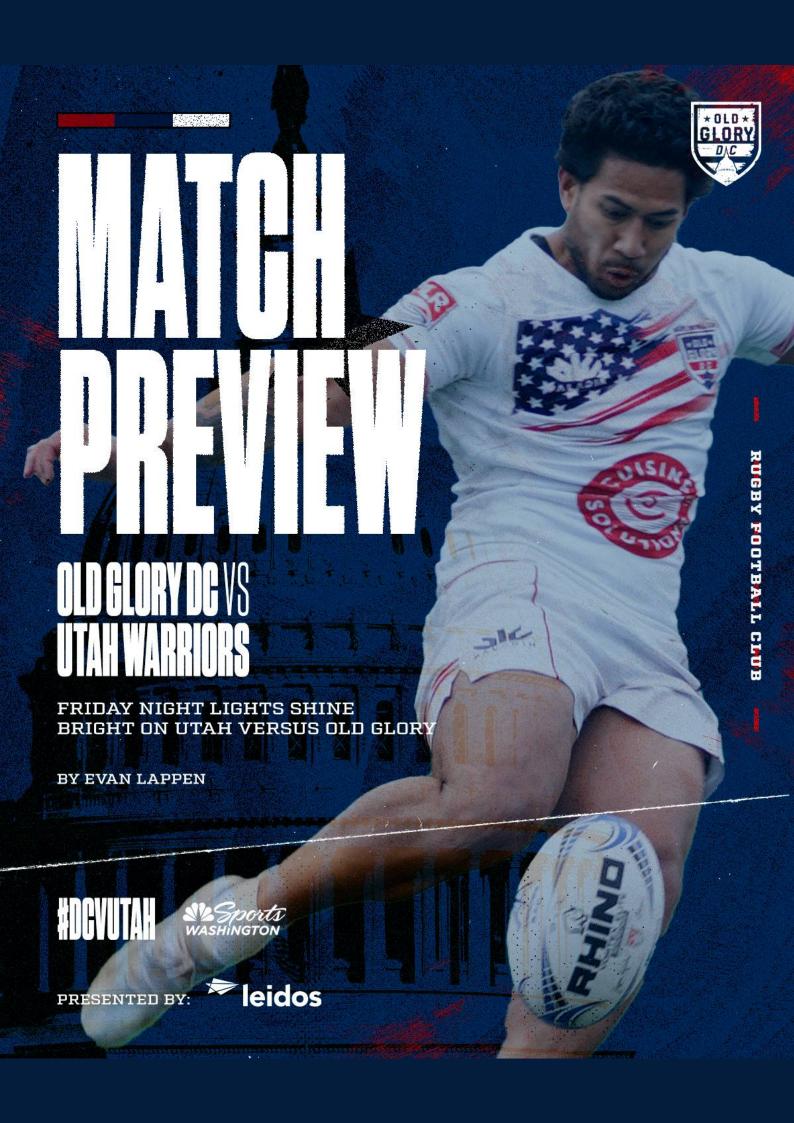

Week 11 Preview

Friday Night Lights Shine Bright on Utah Versus Old Glory

After a pair of close losses on the road, Old Glory DC is back at Segra Field on Friday night against the Utah Warriors. The visitors and OGDC share many similarities as both teams let their head coaches go midseason and are amid extended losing streaks. However, something has to break on Friday, and Old Glory is banking on the return of a few notable players to spur a victory. **Tickets** available are Ticketmaster and the game will be broadcast live on NBC Sports Washington and the Network at 8:00 pm on Friday.

For the curtain-raiser, the final match of the Iron Vine Security Shield Series between Mount St. Mary's and Mary Washington starts at 5:30 pm.

Victory Slips Away in Toronto

After an impressive showing against New York, Old Glory had the opportunity to secure its first win at Toronto. Unfortunately, the Arrows' defense stood tall in the final sequence of the match to win 32-27. DC scored more tries than Toronto, but the home team was better with the boot kicking two of three conversions and two penalties.

"We got to be better in our start." Head Coach Nate Osborne said. "That first six minutes was pretty horrible. We didn't touch the ball, and they scored ten points. Missed a lot of tackles. We fought like we always do to get back into the game, and then another little lapse before halftime allowed Toronto to score two tries. If you watched the last 20 minutes, we played some great rugby.

We want to take the momentum of that last 20 minutes into the [Utah] game."

Significant Injuries and Notable Returns to the Lineup

On the injury front, Mike Dabulas is out for the foreseeable future with a lower leg injury, and Dom Bailey left the last game with a shoulder issue. The good news is that Doug Fraser will be back after being cleared from a concussion and Api Naikitini is on the gameday 23 after a healthy scratch.

The major headline is the return of Jamason Fa'anana-Schultz and Felix Kalapu from suspension. Head coach Nate Osborne expects a big contribution from both players in the second half of the season.



"It's a big energy boost to get [Jama and Felix] back," Jack "They've Iscaro said. been phenomenal over the last few weeks in practice and gave us a tremendous look. They've been a big reason why we've been trending upwards. We're really excited to have them back in the lineup now and going out there with us. They are ready to get out and prove why they are out there."

In the forwards, Jack Iscaro, Rob Irimescu, and Jake Ilnicki will line up in the front row with Tevita Naqali and Stan South as the locks. Kalapu and Cory Daniel will man the flanker position while Luke Campbell earned the start at eightman. Fa'anana-Schultz, Kyle Stewart, Mo Katz, Fintan Coleman, Jack Carroll, and Worth/Naikitini are the backups in the forwards.

With Dabulas out, Renata Roberts-Te Nana moves back to fullback, with Peni Lasaqa and Junior Sa'u completing the back three. Captain Danny Tusitala and Rohan Saifoloi are the halfbacks, and Thretton Palamo and William Talataina will line up in the centers. Fraser and Danny Thomas are the impact subs in the backs.

Fresh Off the Bye, Utah Comes Cross-Country to DC

Much like Old Glory, the Utah Warriors came into 2022 with tremendous potential but have struggled throughout the season. A three-game slide mired the Warriors' first eight games to open the year, then a two-game

jolt of victory, followed by another three-match disappointment. The last test was a 40-25 home loss to San Diego that ultimately resulted in the release of the 2021 MLR Coach of the Year, Shawn Pittman. Utah has had the bye week to adjust to new interim head coach Brandon Sparks and will be hungry to turn the ship around.

"Utah is a very unpredictable team," Osborne said. "They can burn you from everywhere on the field if you are not careful. We know we have to match them physically, and if we can do that, we can dominate them. If you allow them to run at you and sit back and wait, they make you look silly. We're going to take it to them this week and come out swinging."

Fullback Mike Te'o leads the team with four tries, but the big question is whether Mika Kruse and Paul Lasike will make the trip to DC. Both were out against San Diego, and the bye week should help get them back on the field. Add in the front row of Olive Kilifi, Tuvere Vugakoto, and Angus MacLellan and the back row of Lance Williams, Bailey Wilson, and Jurie van Vuuren. Utah has the horses to compete with any team in the MLR. According to Iscaro, the game plan is simple but relies on execution. "We have to start faster, so we don't have to dig ourselves out of a hole. We have to be more disciplined and find a way to get points when we opportunities. We got to play defense crazy, too."

A Lot Left to Prove

"One of the teams is going to have to prove themselves this week," Osborne said. "It's easy to sit back and say we got a great team, but if you're not aiming up on the field, [it's all for not]. So the challenge this week is to make sure we aim up and want it more than them... We will be tight, be ready, and know our roles and responsibilities."

"We're trending upwards," Iscaro remarked. "To be unsatisfied with a very narrow loss to a good team like Toronto shows where are mindset is. Our record is what it is, but I think we're a good team, and we have a lot to prove."

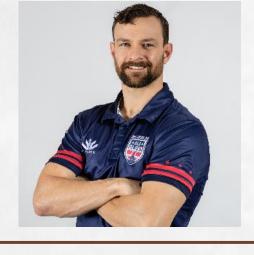
