
MIKE STEED




CONNOR NARRON





He appeared in 6 total games with 4 starts and only covered 14 innings during that time. Owens finished the season with a 7.07 ERA and an 0-3 record with a small sample size as his season came to end after one month as he was placed on the injured list on June 10 and never returned after that.

AUGUSTA GREENJACKETS HALL OF FAME

2013 - TIM WAKEFIELD

Wakefield was voted into the inaugural class of the GreenJackets Baseball Hall of Fame. He was a member of the Augusta Pirates in 1989 and played both first and third base that season. After being told, "He would never make it past double-A as a first baseman," Wakefield began to work on becoming a pitcher by mastering the knuckleball.

2013 - PABLO SANDOVAL

Sandoval was voted into the inaugural class of the GreenJackets Baseball Hall of Fame. Signed by the San Francisco Giants as an undrafted free agent in 2004, Sandoval was a member of the GreeenJackets in the 2006 season. He played in 117 games as a first and third baseman, notching 116 hits, 49 RBIs and a .265 batting average.

2014 - BILL HEATON

In 1988, longtime baseball fan and U.S. Army Lieutenant Colonel (retired) Bill Heaton put together a partnership to bring baseball back to Augusta after it left in 1963 for 25 years. It was a huge undertaking, but he succeeded in securing a franchise in the reorganized South Atlantic League. He then got an agreement with the Pittsburgh Pirates to provide players and coaches and hastily built a no-frills ballpark named Heaton Stadium. The Augusta Pirates, in their second year, won the SAL title.

2014 - STAN SWANN

For as long as GreenJackets baseball has been in Augusta, Stan has been a fixture at the Ballpark. Stan is a season ticket holder and a member of the GreenJackets Diamond Club. Since 1995, Stan has been an active member of the Special Olympics GA – Augusta Stars. He enjoys bowling and his skills have won him countless gold medals. He is a true fan.

AUGUSTA GREENJACKETS HALL OF FAME

2015 - MADISON BUMGARNER

Drafted by the San Francisco Giants in the first round of the 2007 MLB Draft, Bumgarner was a member of the GreenJackets for the 2008 season. He started 24 games, finishing with a 15-3 record, 164 strikeouts, and a 1.46 ERA. He obtained the South Atlantic League pitcher's "Triple Crown." Behind his efforts, the Green-Jackets went on to win the Southern Division second-half title, the Southern Division Championship, and the SAL Championship.

2016 - ROBERTO KELLY

The former all-star outfielder managed the GreenJackets from 2005-2007. He guided them to a 285-157 record and two playoff appearances. During his tenure, he was known and beloved by his players as a great teacher of the game. In 2006, Kelly won the SAL Manager of the Year Award. He guided the GreenJackets to the best record in all of MILB in 2006 (92-47) and 2007 (89-51)

2017 - JON LESTER

Drafted by the Boston Red Sox in the Second Round of the 2002 MLB Draft out of high school, Lester pitched for the GreenJackets during the 2003 season. During his time with the GreenJackets, he posted a 6-9 record and a 3.65 ERA in 21 starts and 24 total appearances on the mound.

2018 - KEVIN YOUKILIS

Youkilis was drafted by the Boston Red Sox in the eighth round of the 2001 MLB Draft. Youkilis played for the GreenJackets from 2001-2002. In 20 games in a GreenJackets uniform, he batted 262 with 6 RBIs. In 2002, Youkilis would be named the Boston Red Sox Minor League Player of the Year.

2019 - SERGIO ROMO

Romo spent the 2006 season with the Augusta GreenJackets after being drafted by the San Francisco Giants in the 2005 MLB Draft. He helped the GreenJackets win the South Division second-half title, boasting a 10-2 record and a 2.53 ERA while racking up 95 strikeouts. The three-time World Series Champion was named an SAL mid-season All-Star during his time with the GreenJackets.





SRP Park in North Augusta, South Carolina, is the home of the Augusta GreenJackets. It is the center of North Augusta's growing and thriving downtown scene. SRP Park was voted Ballpark Digest's 2018 Ballpark of the Year and BaseballParks.com's Ballpark of the Year during the 2018 Inaugural Season.

During the Inaugural Season at SRP Park, the GreenJackets welcomed 255,155 fans, which was up 48 percent in attendance from the previous years at their old home, Lake Olmstead Stadium (Augusta, GA). This was also the highest attendance growth in all of professional baseball (MLB & MiLB). The team set a franchise record in single-season attendance as well as single-game stadium attendance. The GreenJackets were awarded the South Atlantic League's (SAL) nomination for the Charles K. Murphy Award during the Inaugural Season as well.

Located across the Savannah River from the edge of downtown Augusta in North Augusta, South Carolina, SRP Park is the centerpiece of the Riverside Village development (known formerly as Project Jackson). A modern mixed-use development with hotels, residential, office and retail. Riverside Village is an ambitious project undertaken by the city and investors.


