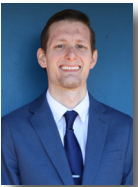


JOHNNY TRIBBETT, TICKET OPERATIONS COORDINATOR

His favorite teams are the Chicago Cubs, LA Lakers (more specifically whatever team LeBron James is on), and the Denver Broncos.

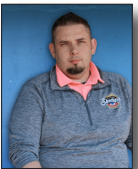
CHRIS, PHARIS CORPORATE PARTNERSHIPS COORDINATOR

THOMAS ZINZARELLA, BROADCASTING AND MEDIA RELATIONS ASSISTANT

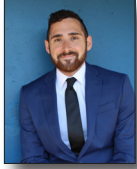

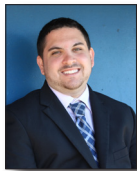

Lyons was born and raised in Biloxi, MS - a 1978 graduate of Biloxi High School and a

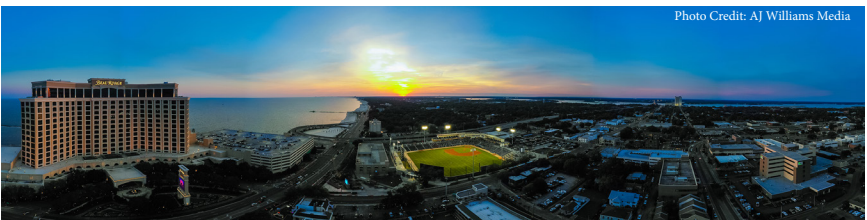

SHUCKERS LOGO, NAME, MARKS & MASCOT

The Biloxi professional baseball team revealed their identity on November 24, 2014, as the Biloxi Shuckers took center stage during a ceremony inside Biloxi's historic Saenger Theatre.

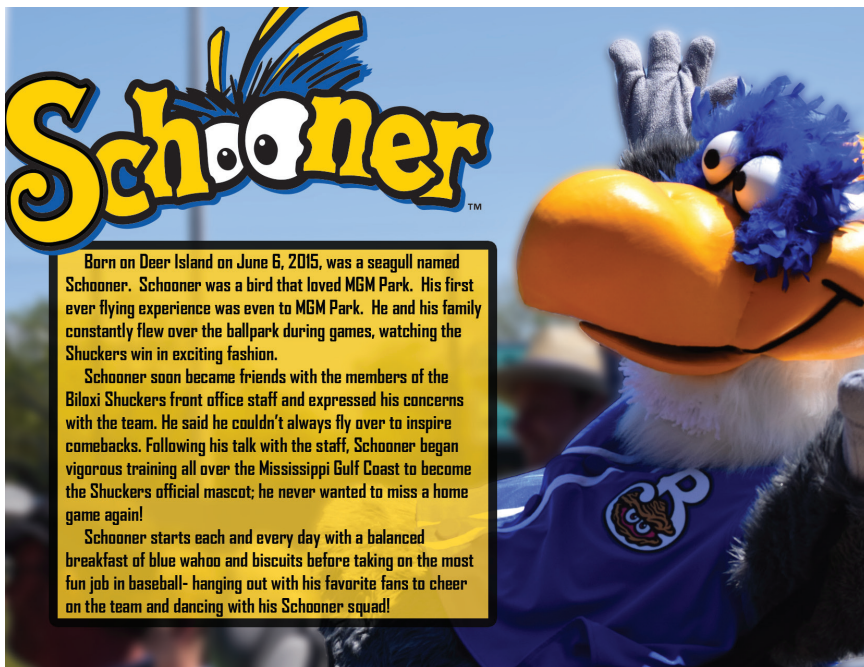
The team name was selected after nearly 60,000 votes were cast during a month-long "Name the Team" contest yielded six finalists.

A tenacious oyster is the centerpiece of the identity, seen in the club's primary logo and home and alternate caps. The letters "BS" make up the road cap designation. The batting practice cap features the historic Biloxi Lighthouse resiliently rising above storm waters. Gulf Blue, Sand, Coral and Black make up the club's official colors, paying tribute to the Gulf Coast. The Shuckers are the first professional sports team to use this color combination. The logos and color scheme are seen throughout the home of the Shuckers, MGM Park.

LOGO CREATORS

The Shuckers' look was brought to life by Brandiose, an industry leader in team identity creation. The development process began in March 2014 when Brandiose's partners Jason Klein and Casey White met in Biloxi with fans, staff and community members to learn about the stories, history, and personality of Biloxi.

"Biloxi is one of the most resilient cities in America," said Klein. "Our goal is to integrate Biloxi folklore in the Shuckers brand, and to create the most legendary entertainment experience on the Gulf Coast."



Born on Deer Island on June 6, 2015, was a seagull named Schooner. Schooner was a bird that loved MGM Park. His first ever flying experience was even to MGM Park. He and his family constantly flew over the ballpark during games, watching the Shuckers win in exciting fashion.

Schooner soon became friends with the members of the Biloxi Shuckers front office staff and expressed his concerns with the team. He said he couldn't always fly over to inspire comebacks. Following his talk with the staff, Schooner began vigorous training all over the Mississippi Gulf Coast to become the Shuckers official mascot; he never wanted to miss a home game again!

Schooner starts each and every day with a balanced breakfast of blue wahoo and biscuits before taking on the most fun job in baseball- hanging out with his favorite fans to cheer on the team and dancing with his Schooner squad!

MGM PARK

Featured by Southern Living and Forbes as one of the top ballparks in the country, MGM Park opened its gates for the first time on June 6, 2015. The newest jewel in the Mississippi Gulf Coast's crown combines sports and entertainment perfectly, providing fans with the ultimate hospitality experience. After more than a decade of efforts, the Mississippi Gulf Coast finally had

its Minor League Baseball facility. Located just across Highway 90 from the Gulf of Mexico, MGM Park's capacity is 6,067 and features a boomerang-shaped grandstand, allowing fans to be closer to the action than at most parks. MGM Park's suite level contains eight suites on the first base side and four suites on the third base side. Each suite has outdoor seating for 12 guests and an overall capacity of 20. Party Decks are at each end of the suite level, offering capacity for up to 55 guests. Guests can enjoy the game from patio tables or stadium seating. The Kloud 7 Sky-Box is located between suites 10 and 11, featuring an indoor-outdoor experience, fully stocked cash bar and all-you-can eat buffets. The blue waters of the Mississippi Sound, the inlet of the Gulf in Biloxi, can



also be glimpsed on the horizon from the third base side of the suite level. The backdrop is the majestic Beau Rivage, which has been the state of Mississippi's tallest building since the casino opened on March 16, 1999. MGM Resorts International, the parent company of Beau Rivage and owner of the land on which the ballpark stands holds the naming rights of the ballpark. The name of the ballpark was officially announced on September 24, 2014.

The exact plot of ground designated for the ballpark has a storied history. Biloxi's original resort hotel, the Buena Vista, was located where MGM Park now stands. It had five stories and 200 rooms and was constructed in 1924. Hurricane Camille in 1969 dealt massive damage to the structure and the grand facility never recovered. To commemorate the fact that MGM Park was built on the very site of this grand hotel, the beer garden down the ballpark's third-base line is dubbed the Buena Vista Beer Garden.

MGM Park is the fourth ballpark to ever host professional baseball games in Biloxi. The first was Point Comfort Park, although it was used for just part of the 1908 season by the Gulfport-Biloxi Sand Crabs of the Cotton State League. Biloxi Stadium, which opened in 1928, was the spring training home of the Washington Senators from 1930-1935 and the Philadelphia Phillies in 1938. In 2003, two games were played at Hollis Field, a high school facility, between the Pensacola Pelicans and Baton Rouge River Bats of the independent Southeastern League. None of the three ballparks that hosted professional baseball in the past in Biloxi still stand.

Founded in the late 17th century by French explorers, Biloxi has a population of 44,578 and is the home of Keesler Air Force Base. Stadium Features: Located off of Highway 90 and Interstate 110, adjacent to Beau Rivage Resort & Casino, MGM Park is within walking distance of downtown Biloxi and beaches of the Gulf Coast. There are 2,500 hotel rooms in a two-block radius and MGM Park is located three miles from I-10. MGM Park is home to the Biloxi Shuckers, Double-A affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers, and hosts concerts, festivals, and other outdoor events.

THE SHUCKERS



MIKE GUERRERO, MANAGER

Guerrero begins his sixth season as Shuckers manager in 2022. Previously, he spent two seasons as the Brewers First Base Coach and Infield Coach from 2014 to 2015.

Guerrero has managed at every level in the Minor Leagues, going 1313-1153 (.532) over 23 seasons, with all but one season coming with the Milwaukee Brewers organization. Heading into the 2022 season, Mike's 1,313 regular-season wins are the 11th most among active Minor League Managers. He earned his 1,000th career victory on July 14, 2016. Mike was named the 2018 Southern League Manager of the Year, his third overall Manager of Year honor. The skipper led the Shuckers to a franchise best regular-season record of 82-57 in 2019, earning a trip to the Southern League Championship Series for the second consecutive year. Overall, Guerrero has compiled a 315-258 record with the Shuckers, leading the team to a winning record in his first four seasons in charge.

Mike served as Manager for two seasons at Triple-A Nashville in 2012-13 prior to joining the Major League coaching staff. In 2013, he earned the Mike Coolbaugh Award, presented to an individual who has shown an outstanding baseball work ethic, knowledge of the game and skill in mentoring young players on the field.

Guerrero began his managing career in the Blue Jays organization in 1995 in the Dominican Summer League. He won the 2001 Dominican Summer League championship and qualified for the playoffs five times (1995, 2000, 2001, 2007, 2009). He also gained additional managerial experience in 2008 with the Oahu Canefires of the Hawaiian Winter League and in 2010 with the Surprise Rattlers of the Arizona Fall League. He has also managed in the Dominican Winter League.

The former Minor League infielder spent nine seasons with Milwaukee (1987-92, '94-95) and Kansas City (1993) organizations. He collected a .242 career batting average over nine seasons as a middle infielder.

Mike and his brother, Sandy Guerrero, were born into a baseball family. His father, Epy, was a renowned scout in the Dominican Republic who unearthed over 50 Major League players for the Astros, Yankees, Blue Jays and Brewers. Mike was named after former Major League pitcher Mike Torrez, who was a friend of his father. His uncle, Mario Guerrero, was a Major League infielder with Boston (1973-74), St. Louis (1975), California (1976-77) and Oakland (1978-80).

Mike and his wife Larissa reside in Melbourne, Fla and the couple have two sons, Michael and Daniel. Mike was born in Santo Domingo, DR.

CHUCKIE CAUFIELD, HITTING COACH

Caufield begins his fifth season with the Shuckers and his second in the role of hitting coach. Before his time in Biloxi, the 35-year-old spent four seasons as a coach for the Brewers Class-A affiliate, the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers. He served in the same role with the Rookie-level Helena Brewers in 2013.

Caufield was drafted by the Brewers in the 39th round of the 2006 draft out of the University of Oklahoma. He was an outfielder for six seasons in the Brewers system (2006-2011) and finished his career with Fort Worth of the independent North American League in 2012. During his career, he accumulated a .266 batting average with 28 home runs and a .335 career on-base percentage. He spent three of his professional seasons (2009-11) with the Brewers' Double-A affiliate in Huntsville.



NICK CHILDS, PITCHING COACH



Childs enters his second full season both with the Shuckers and third in the Brewers organization as the pitching coach. A native of Cherry Creek, Colorado, Childs' coaching resume includes stints with the University of Northern Colorado (2019), Regis University (2017-2018), the University of Science and Arts of Oklahoma (2015-2016) and Colorado State University (2011- 2014).

While at UNC, Childs served as the teams associate head coach and pitching coordinator. During his time at Regis University, Childs guided the Rangers to top three rankings in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference in strikeouts (2nd), ERA (2nd), opponent batting average (3rd) and walks (3rd) during the 2018 season. He also coached RMAC Pitcher of the Year Brad Thoutt and had three pitchers named to the RMAC First Team All Conference. Additionally, the Rangers posted back-to-back seasons above .500 in 2017 and 2018, the first time Regis had been above .500 in consecutive seasons in 20 years.

As the pitching coach at USAO, Childs' pitching staff led the NAIA in strikeouts (603) and opponent batting average (.200) while ranking second in the NAIA in ERA (2.56). In his one season at USAO, the program set a record for wins in a season, won their first conference championship in school history and qualified for the NAIA World Series for the first time in school history.

Childs holds a Master's degree in Sports Administration from the University of Northern Colorado after first obtaining his Bachelor of Arts degree in Journalism and Technical Communication from Colorado State University.

MICHAEL O'NEAL, COACH



O'Neal enters his third season in the Brewers' organization and first as a coach with Biloxi. The Columbus, GA native was previously a development coach with the Class-A Advanced Wisconsin for the previous two seasons, 2020-21. Prior to joining the Brewers, O'Neal was an assistant coach at Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville from 2019-2020 and also worked as a pitching trainer for Driveline Baseball.

After pitching at Auburn University, O'Neal played professionally from 2014-2018, including spending the 2016 season in the Atlanta Braves system with Class-A Carolina and Double-A Mississippi.

J.J. REIMER, DEVELOPMENT COACH



Reimer joins the Shuckers coaching staff for 2022 as a development coach, primarily working with catchers.

MATT DEAL, ATHLETIC TRAINER



Matt Deal joins the Shuckers for the 2022 season for his first season with the club and eighth overall as an athletic trainer in the Milwaukee system. His first season in the organization came in 2015 with the Dominican Summer League Brewers and continued with the Arizona League Brewers in 2016.

Deal then went on to join the Pioneer League's Helena Brewers in 2017 and 2018, and spent the last two seasons with the Carolina Mudcats in 2019 and 2021.

SEASON CREDENTIALS

Biloxi Shuckers season credentials are issued only to legitimate news-gathering outlets who will cover the team on a regular basis.

All working media members must adhere to all Biloxi Shuckers Media Regulations while attending a Shuckers game. To obtain a 2022 season credential, please follow these directions:

Submit a season credential request to Garrett Greene, Media Relations Manager and Broadcaster (information below). A copy of the Shuckers' credential request can be found on the Biloxi Shuckers virtual press box at www.milb.com/biloxi/team/media.

List the first and last names of all members of your outlet who will require a season credential, including photographers.

Read and sign the 2022 Media Credential Application which includes the Biloxi Shuckers and MiLB Media Regulations and 2022 MiLB Season Release of Liability Waiver. Send a completed copy to ggreene@biloxishuckers.com prior to the first game you're covering. The completed form may be emailed or faxed. For outlets with multiple credentialed members, please have each member sign and print their name on the back of the sheet.

Per MLB Guidelines, members of the media may conduct interview on the field without wearing a mask if they are 'up-to-date' on their COVID-19 vaccination. Booster shots are required if five months have passed since a second dose of Pfizer or Moderna or two months have passed since the lone dose of the Johnson & Johnson. Media members that are not up-to-date on their COVID-19 vaccination will be required to wear a mask for on-field interviews and will not be permitted to indoor interview areas.

A member of the media relations staff will contact you when your season credential is ready to be picked up.

SINGLE-GAME CREDENTIALS

Biloxi Shuckers single-game credentials will be issued to legitimate news-gathering outlets that plan to cover the team on a limited basis, as well as area outlets making last-minute changes in coverage. All working media members must adhere to listed Biloxi Shuckers Media Regulations while covering a Shuckers game. To obtain a single-game credential in 2022, please follow these directions:

Submit a single-game credential request to a member of the media relations department (information below). You must submit your request at least 24 hours prior to the game you're covering.

List the first and last names of all members of your outlet who will require a single-game credential, including photographers.

Read and sign the 2022 Media Credential Application which includes the Biloxi Shuckers and MiLB Media Regulations and 2022 Season Release of Liability Waiver. Send the completed copy to a member of the media relations department prior to the game you're covering. The completed form may be emailed or faxed. For outlets with multiple credentialed members, please have each member sign and print their name on the back of the sheet.

Pick up your single-game credential at the MGM Park Will Call using a valid photo ID.

If your outlet is interested in covering a 2022 Shuckers' game at another Southern League stadium, please submit your request to a member of the Biloxi Shuckers media relations department. Arrangements will be made with other Southern League teams on a first come, first served basis.

MEDIA REGULATIONS

CREDENTIAL REQUESTS:

Single-game credentials must be requested through the Biloxi Shuckers media relations department at least 24 hours prior to the date your outlet is planning to attend. Only legitimate news-gathering outlets, at the discretion of the Biloxi Shuckers, will receive credentials. All credentials are non-transferable and should be visible at all times. Credentials will not be issued to anyone under 18 years of age. The Biloxi Shuckers reserve the right to revoke credentials at any time. Anyone seeking autographs, player memorabilia, personal photos, etc. will have their credentials revoked immediately.

ACCESS TO MGM PARK:

Location of the media entrance to MGM Park will be on the north side of the stadium off of Howard Avenue. Media members must have their credential in order to enter MGM Park. There is very limited parking available in the lot north of the stadium off of Howard Avenue.

CREDENTIAL PICKUP:

All media credentials will be available for pickup at Will Call at the MGM Park Box Office, located on the northeast side of the stadium near the corner of Caillavet and Howard Avenue.

CLUBHOUSE ACCESS:

Per Minor League Baseball regulations, both the home and road clubhouse are restricted areas for the 2022 season and as a result are OFF LIMITS AT ALL TIMES. Any change in policy will be communicated from the Shuckers Media Relations staff.

REQUESTING INTERVIEWS:

All requests for interviews with Biloxi Shuckers players, coaches or front office members should be booked through the media relations department. All requests are encouraged to be made at least 24 hours prior to the interview. No interviews are to be conducted while a game is in progress. No interviews may be conducted during a team workout, unless otherwise authorized. Interviews on gamedays are best conducted after the team takes batting practice. Media members that are fully vaccinated do not need to wear masks for interviews that are on the field. Video cameras are not permitted in the areas where players park or player entrances/loading dock areas. Interviews may be shot on the field or in the dugout if weather and player/coach availability permits. Starting pitchers will not be available for pregame interviews on days they are starting.

MILWAUKEE BREWERS REHAB ASSIGNMENTS:

Players on minor league injury rehab assignments for the Milwaukee Brewers will be made available to the media when possible with their schedule. All interview requests with rehabbing players must be authorized by a member of the Biloxi Shuckers media relations staff. In accordance with Major League Clubhouse policy, no starting pitcher will be made available for pregame interviews on the day they are starting.

VISITING PLAYER INTERVIEW REQUESTS:

All requests for visiting players should be organized in conjunction with that teams' media relations department. The Biloxi Shuckers media relations staff can help facilitate requests through other teams media relations departments.

FIELD/DUGOUTS:

Media members holding credentials that grant field access may be present in the foul territory/dugout areas up to 1 hour prior to the scheduled game. At no time are media members allowed to cross the foul lines into the field of play. Foul territory and dugout areas must be clear of ALL media exactly 1 hour prior to the start of the game unless a special request has been made to the Biloxi Shuckers Media Relations staff or college media relations staff.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/VIDEOGRAPHERS:

Photographers and videographers may utilize the on-field camera well next to the dugout on the first base and third base side of MGM Park. Space is limited, and all photographers/videographers must accommodate the space needs of the television camera operators and Biloxi Shuckers staff in this area. No photography is permitted on the field of play while the game is in progress. Special photo requests must be authorized by a member of the Biloxi Shuckers media relations staff.

PRESS BOX:

Limited space in the MGM Park press box (3rd floor) is available for WORKING MEDIA ONLY. Photographers and videographers may utilize the second and third rows of press row for editing. Game information, rosters, lineups and complimentary wired or wireless internet connection will be provided to you. A light pre-game meal is also offered approximately 90 minutes prior to game time in the press box lounge. There will be no cheering or rooting for either team at any point during the game. Individuals who violate press box rules will be removed and credentials revoked upon the discretion of the Biloxi Shuckers media relations department.





During the 2022 season, Shuckers fans will be able to catch all home and road games on the Biloxi Shuckers Radio Network. Coast Radio and WGCM-AM 1240 (FM 100.9) will yet again serve as the flagship radio station for the network.

WGCM 1240  WGCM AM-1240 was the first radio station on the Mississippi Gulf Coast and is the second oldest in the state.

Fans will also be able to listen to all games, home and road, for free on the Shuckers' website and by using the TuneIn Radio app on their mobile, desktop or home devices. Additionally, all games will be available in HD on MiLB.TV, a subscription-based service provided by Minor League Baseball.



Garrett Greene begins his fourth season and fifth year as "The Voice of the Shuckers." A native of Arlington, TX, Garrett spent 2017 as the Director of Broadcasting and Media Relations for the Helena Brewers, the Milwaukee Brewers Advanced-Rookie Affiliate in the Pioneer League. While in Helena, Garrett saw a wave of players that Shuckers' fans can expect to see come through Biloxi this season. He previously worked for the St. Paul Saints as a Broadcasting and Media Relations Assistant, broadcasting games alongside 2016 Ballpark Digest Broadcaster of the Year Sean Aronson.



Prior to joining the ranks of professional baseball, Garrett worked as a play-by-play broadcaster for college and high school sports in the Austin area. He was also part of the staff of 104.9 FM The Horn in Austin, working as a talk show host, studio host, producer and board operator. Garrett earned his Bachelor of Journalism from the University of Texas at Austin in 2013.



Thomas Zinzarella begins his first season with the Shuckers organization as the Media Relations and Broadcast assistant in 2022. He was previously the Director of Broadcasting and Media Relations for the Billings Mustangs in the Pioneer League. Before Biloxi, Thomas was a freelance sports broadcaster calling various sports in New England for College of the Holy Cross, UMass-Lowell, and Merrimack College.

Thomas graduated from Providence College in 2021 with a Bachelor of Arts in Sports Media. During his four years in college, Thomas covered high profiles events such as the Big East Tournament, the NCAA Frozen Four, the New England Patriots, and other college and high school sports in the area. He got his start in baseball as a broadcast intern for two summers in the prestigious Cape Cod

Baseball League.

Home Runs:

The following on-field actions will be considered home runs:

- Batted ball flies over the first (lower) 8' outfield fence.
- Batted ball strikes the scoreboard, scoreboard netting, batter's eye or outfield light pole.
- Batted ball strikes foul pole above outfield fence level.

Dead Ball vs Live Ball:

The following on-field actions will be considered dead balls:

- Any ball going into the dugout is dead.
- Any ball lodged in, on or behind the backstop netting is dead.
- Any ball lodged in, on or around the bullpen benches is dead.
- Any ball lodged under, on top of, behind or inside the tarp is dead.

The following on-field actions will be considered live balls:

- Any ball bouncing off the tarp.
- Any loose ball in the bullpen.
- Any thrown ball hitting the dugout rails or dugout netting and rebounding onto the field.
- Any ball that lands in the space between the foul pole and the outfield wall.

Fly Balls:

The following on-field actions will govern fly balls:

- If a player catches a fly ball in the dugout one foot must remain on the dugout's top step/field level.
- Players may lean across the tarp to catch a fly ball, however players must not sit upon, step on or use the tarp as an aid in catching the fly ball.

BASEBALL TERMS OF INTEREST

Assists: An assist shall be credited to each fielder who throws or deflects a batted or thrown ball in such a way that a putout results, or would have resulted except for a subsequent error by any fielder. Only one assist and no more shall be credited to each fielder who throws or deflects the ball in a run-down play which results in a putout, or would have resulted in a putout, except for a subsequent error.

Batting Average: Divide the numbers of hits by the number of official at-bats.

Batting Title Qualifications: To qualify for the Double-A South batting or slugging title, a player must have a minimum of 372 plate appearances (the equivalent of 2.7 plate appearances for each of the 138 scheduled games). However, a player with fewer than the required number of plate appearances whose average would be the highest if he were charged with the required number of official at-bats shall be awarded the batting championship.

Consecutive-Game Hitting Streak: A consecutive-game hitting streak shall not be terminated if all of a player's plate appearances result in a walk, hit batsman, defensive interference or a sacrifice bunt. The streak shall terminate if the player has a sacrifice fly and no hit.

Consecutive-Game Playing Streak: A consecutive-game playing streak shall extend if the player plays one half-inning on defense, or if he completes a time at bat by reaching base or being put out. A pinch-running appearance shall not extend the streak. If a player is ejected from a game by an umpire before he complies with the requirements of this rule, his streak shall continue.

Day or Night Game: Any game scheduled to start after 5:00 p.m. is considered a night game. A game scheduled to begin before 5:00 p.m., which is delayed by rain or any other reason, is still considered a day game. However, both games of a two-night doubleheader will be considered night games.

Designated for Assignment: When a player is taken off a Major League roster and is designated for assignment, such player must be released, traded, or his contract assigned within 10 days of the notice given.

Designated Hitter Rule: Beginning in 2022 in the Southern League, a universal designated hitter will be used regardless of affiliation.

Earned Run Average: Multiply the number of earned runs by nine; take the resulting number and divide it by the number of innings-pitched.

Earned Run Average Title Qualifications: To qualify for the Double-A South ERA crown, a pitcher must have the lowest earned run average after at least 111 innings-pitched (the equivalent of 0.8 multiplied by the number of scheduled games- 138).

Fielding Average: Divide the total putouts and assists by total putouts, assists and errors.

Free Agency: If a player has six years of Major League service, he is eligible for free agency. A player has 15 days from the first day following the World Series to file for free agency. A player is also eligible for free agency if he has played seven seasons or more in the Major or Minor Leagues and is not on a Major League team's 40-man roster as of October 15.

Injured List: In the Minor Leagues, players placed on the injured list must remain there a minimum of seven consecutive days. There is no limit to how many players can be on the injured list at one time and those on the injured list do not count toward the team's roster limit.

Magic Number: Determine the number of games yet to be played, add one, then subtract the number of games ahead in the lost column of the standings from the closest opponent.

Major League Rehabilitation: A Major League player may be assigned to a minor league affiliate for the purpose of injury rehabilitation for a maximum of 20 days for non-pitchers, and 30 days for pitchers. The player continues to receive his Major League salary. Any service with the minor league club shall be deemed Major League service. Rehabilitation assignments do not count as optional assignments. Players on rehabilitation assignment do not count against a team's roster limit.

On-Base Percentage: Take the total number of hits, walks, and hit-by-pitches and divide by the total number of at-bats, walks, hit-by-pitches, and sacrifice flies. Times awarded first base on interference or obstruction are not figured into on base percentage.

Options: An optional assignment of a player contract shall be permitted for not more than three seasons between Major League and Minor League clubs. Players optioned for less than a total of 20 days in one season, shall not be charged with an optional transfer. Players who, prior to the start of the season, have been credited with less than five seasons in professional baseball, shall be eligible for a fourth optional assignment, without waivers, during that season. New in 2022, players can be optioned five times in a season. A player optioned six or more times must be placed on waivers after each ensuing option.



Player Limits: In Class Double-A in 2022, rosters will have 28 active players for the duration of the entire season. Players on the injured list or on rehabilitation assignment do not count against the 28-man active roster. In the Major Leagues, rosters are 40 until Opening Day, at which time they decrease to 26 players. Teams are limited to carrying 13 pitchers during this time. On September 1 through the end of the regular season, Major League rosters increase to 28 active players with a limit of 14 pitchers.

Recalled: When a player is on a Major League team's 40-man roster and added to the team's 26-man active roster during the season from the Minor Leagues, he has been recalled. If a player is not on the Major League 40-man roster, the Major League club must purchase his contract from the Minor League team and add him to its 40-man roster.

Rookie Qualifications: A player shall be considered a rookie unless; he has exceeded 130 at-bats or 50 innings-pitched in the Major Leagues or accumulated more than 45 days on the 26-man active roster of a Major League club or clubs. Time in military service and time on the injured list is excluded.

Rule 5 Draft: A player not on a Major League 40-man roster as of November 20 is eligible for the Rule 5 Draft if the player was 18 years of age or younger when he first signed a professional contract and this is the fourth Rule 5 Draft held since he signed. Or if the player was 19 years of age or older when he first signed a professional contract and this is the third Rule 5 Draft held since he signed.

Save Rule: Credit a pitcher with a save when he meets all three of the following conditions:

- He is the finishing pitcher in a game won by his club; and
- He is not the winning pitcher; and
- He qualifies under one of the following conditions:
 1. He enters the game with a lead of no more than three runs and pitches for at least one inning; or
 2. He enters the game, regardless of the count, with the potential tying run either already on base, at bat, or on deck, or
 3. He pitches effectively for at least three innings.

No more than one save may be credited in each game.

Slugging Percentage: Divide the total bases of all safe hits by the total number of at-bats.

Suspended Game: In the Southern League, any regular season game that is called before it is completed or is called at any point with the score tied shall become a suspended game. In accordance with Official Rule 4.12 (c), a suspended game must be resumed and completed from the exact point of suspension and must be played the number of innings it was originally scheduled to include. If the suspended game is called before becoming a regulation game (before the fifth inning), the regular game following the suspended game shall be a seven-inning game. If the suspended game is called after becoming a regulation game (from the fifth on), the regular game following the suspended game shall be a nine-inning game. Attendance reporting from suspended game shall reflect the number of fans present when the contest started, not when it was completed and does not qualify as a lost opening.

Waivers: If a player placed on Major League waivers is not claimed by another team after two (2) business days after waivers have been requested, the player has "cleared waivers" and the team has secured waivers for the remainder of the waiver period. The team then can send him to the Minor Leagues, trade him to another team prior to the Trade Deadline, or do nothing at all. After the trade deadline, players may still be placed and claimed on outright waivers, but trades are no longer permitted after that date (August 2). If a player does not clear waivers- he is claimed by another team or teams- the club requesting waivers may withdraw the waiver request. If the club does not withdraw the waiver request, the player's contract is assigned as follows: If only one claim is entered, the player's contract is assigned to the claiming club; if more than one club in the same league makes a claim, the club currently lower in the standings gets the player; if clubs in both leagues claim the player, preference shall always go the club in the same league as the club requesting waivers.

Winning Pitcher: The starting pitcher will be credited with the win only if he has pitched at least five complete innings and his team not only is in the lead when he is replaced, but remains in the lead the remainder of the game. When the starting pitcher does not meet the preceding criteria and more than one relief pitcher is used, the victory shall be awarded on the following basis:

- When, during the tenure of the starting pitcher, the winning team assumes the lead and maintains it to the finish of the game, credit the victory to the relief pitcher judged by the scorer to have been the most effective.
- Whenever the score is tied, the game becomes a new contest insofar as the winning and losing pitcher is concerned.
- Once the opposing team assumes the lead, all pitchers who have pitched up to that point are excluded from being credited with the victory except the current pitcher.
- The winning relief pitcher shall be the one who is the pitcher of record when his team assumes the lead and maintains it to the finish of the game.



MEDICAL GLOSSARY

AC Joint: Acromioclavicular joint of the shoulder where acromion process of the scapula and the distal end of the clavicle meet; most shoulder separations occur at this point.

Anterior: In front of; the front surface of.

Anterior Cruciate Ligament (ACL): A primary stabilizing ligament within the center of the knee joint that prevents hyperextension and excessive rotation of the joint. A complete tear of the ACL necessitating reconstruction could require up to 12 months of rehabilitation.

Anti-inflammatory: Any agent which prevents inflammation, such as aspirin or ibuprofen.

Arthrogram: X-ray technique for joints using air and/or dye injected into the effected area; useful in diagnosing meniscus tears of the knee and rotator cuff tears of the shoulder.

Arthroscopy: A surgical examination of the internal structures of a joint by means of viewing through an arthroscope. Arthroscopic procedure can be used to remove or repair damaged tissue or as a diagnostic procedure in order to inspect the extent of any damage or confirm a diagnosis.

Bone Scan: An imaging procedure in which a radioactive-labeled substance is injected into the body to determine the status of a bone injury. If the bone at the injury site takes up the radioactive substance, the injury will show a "hot spot" on the scan image. The bone scan is particularly useful in the diagnosis of stress fractures.

Cartilage: Smooth, slippery substance preventing two ends of bones from rubbing together.

Cat Scan: Use of a computer to produce a cross-sectional view of the anatomical part being investigated from x-ray data.

Concussion: Jarring injury of the brain resulting in dysfunction. It can be graded as mild, moderate or severe depending on loss of consciousness, amnesia and loss of equilibrium.

Deltoid Muscle: Muscles at the top of the arm, just below the shoulder, responsible for shoulder motions to the front, side and back.

Disc: A flat, rounded plate between each vertebrae of the spine. The disc consists of a thick fibering which surrounds a soft gel-like interior. It functions as a cushion for the spinal column.

Epicondylitis: Inflammation in the elbow due to overuse.

Femur: Thigh bone; largest bone in the body.

Fibula: Smaller of the two bones in the lower leg; runs from the knee to the ankle along the outside of the lower leg.

Fracture: Any breach of continuity of a bone. Types of fractures include simple, compound, comminuted, greenstick, incomplete, impacted, longitudinal, oblique, stress, and transverse.

Inflammation: The body's natural response to injury in which the injury site might display various degrees of pain, swelling, heat, redness and/or loss of function.

Labrum: An edge, rim, or lip-shaped structure found in the shoulder joint.

Lateral: To the outside of the body.

Ligament: Band of fibrous tissue that connects bone to bone, or bone to cartilage and supports and strengthens joints.

Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI): Imaging procedure in which a radio frequency pulse causes certain electrical elements of the injured tissue to react to this pulse and through this process a computer display and permanent film establish a visual image. MRI does not require radiation and is very useful in the diagnosis of soft tissue, disc, and meniscus injuries.



Medial: To the inside of the body.

Meniscus: Crescent shaped cartilage, usually pertaining to the knee joint; also known as “cartilage.” There are two menisci in the knee: medial and lateral. These work to absorb weight within the knee and provide stability.

Metacarpals: Five long bones of the hand running from the wrist to the fingers

Metatarsals: Five long bones of the foot running from the ankle to the toes

Posterior: At the back part, or rear of the body.

Posterior Cruciate Ligament (PCL): A primary stabilizing ligament of the knee that provides significant stability and prevents displacement of the tibia backward within the knee joint. A complete tear of this ligament necessitating reconstruction could require up to 12 months of rehabilitation.

Quadricep Muscles (“Quads”): A group of four muscles of the front thigh that run from the hip and form a common tendon at the patella; they are responsible for knee extension.

Rotator Cuff: Comprised of four muscles in the shoulder area that can be irritated by overuse. The muscles are the supraspinatus (most commonly injured), infraspinatus, teres minor, and subscapularis.

Shin Splint: A catch-all syndrome describing pain in the shin that is not a fracture or tumor, and cannot be defined otherwise.

Sprain: Injury resulting from the stretch or twist of the joint and causes various degrees of stretch or tear of a ligament or other soft tissue at the joint.

Strain: Injury resulting from a pull or torsion to the muscle or tendon that causes various degrees of stretch or tear to the muscle or tendon tissue.

Stress Fracture: A hair-line type of break in a bone caused by overuse.

Tendon: Tissue that connects muscle to bone.

Tendinitis: Inflammation of the tendon and/or tendon sheath, caused by chronic overuse or sudden injury.

Tibia: Larger of the two bones of the lower leg and is the weight-bearing bone of the shin.

Transverse Process: Small lateral projection off the right and left side of each vertebrae that functions as an attachment site for muscles and ligaments of the spine.

Ulnar Nerve: Nerve in the elbow commonly irritated from excessive throwing.

Ultrasound: An electrical modality that transmits a sound wave through an applicator into the skin to the soft tissue in order to heat the local area for relaxing the injured tissue and/or disperse edema.



PACE OF GAME REGULATIONS

These procedures are designed to improve the "pace" at which games are played by using on-field timers as set forth below (the "Pitch Timer" or "timer"). There shall be at least one timer in the outfield, and two timers behind home plate between the dugouts.

A. Inning Breaks and Pitching Changes. Following an inning break or pitching change, the batter must enter the batter's box at a time certain, and the pitcher must throw a pitch at a time certain, described below:

(1) Time of Break. The timer will count down from 2:15, as follows:

TIME REMAINING	ACTIVITY
30 seconds	Last warm-up pitch shall be thrown Batter walk-up music shall begin
20 seconds	All stadium PA announcements shall end PA shall announce the batter On-field entertainment must be complete and off the field Batter walk-up music shall stop
9 seconds	Batter must be in the box alert to the pitcher
0 seconds	Deadline for pitcher to begin motion for first pitch

As described above, the batter shall enter the box and become alert to the pitcher with at least 9 seconds remaining. The pitcher shall be permitted to begin his motion for the first pitch as soon as the batter steps into the box and is alert to the pitcher.

(2) **Warm-Up Pitches.** The pitcher may take as many or as few warm-up pitches as desired prior to the inning but shall begin his motion to deliver his final warm-up pitch with at least 30 seconds remaining in the inning break/pitching change timer. Pitchers will not be guaranteed eight warm-up pitches. The umpire shall stop the pitcher from throwing warm-up pitches at that time unless the umpire determines that an exception (as described below) applies. If the final warm-up pitch is not delivered prior to the timer reaching 40 seconds, umpires shall signal for the last warm-up pitch.

(3) **Walk-Up Music/In-Stadium Promotions.** In order to ensure the prompt resumption of play, it is important for Clubs to ensure that all entertainment has been completed, including all loudspeaker or microphone announcements or presentations, by the time the timer reaches 20 seconds. In addition, all on-field entertainment personnel must be completely off the field, and all field-entry gates closed and secured, by this time. Nothing contained herein is intended to interfere with the ability of the Club to play rally music or other sound effects that would otherwise be played during the course of a game. The playing of walk-up music will be monitored and Clubs that play walk-up music after these times will be disciplined. The maximum amount of time the music can be played for at bats within an inning will be 10 seconds.

(4) **Start of Timer.** The timer shall start on the last out of an inning for an inning break. In the event that a new pitcher is entering the game at the start of an inning, the pitching change timer shall begin as soon as the relief pitcher crosses the warning track (or otherwise leaves the bullpen area in the case of a bullpen located on the playing field) to enter the game. In the case of a position player entering the game as a pitcher during an inning, the timer shall start upon the first notification of the switch from the Manager or Coach.

The pitcher should stop throwing warm-up pitches and immediately leave the bullpen when signaled by the umpire. If the pitcher does not leave the bullpen promptly when signaled, the umpire shall signal for the timer to start. If the umpires initiate a foreign substance check of the pitcher taking the mound, the clock should be paused and resume once the check is complete and the umpire signals for the clock to resume.

For inning breaks during which God Bless America or any patriotic song is played in which all action in the ballpark stops (similar to the National Anthem), the timer will begin at the conclusion of the song. An extension to the inning break for other events may be approved by the Commissioner's Office; provided, however, that the timer must start in accordance with these Regulations and the duration of such break shall not exceed 2:45.

(5) **Special Circumstances.**

(a) **Administrative Tasks.** If the umpire exchanges baseballs or performs other administrative tasks, the clock should be reset if the umpire completes their tasks with less than 14 seconds (bases empty) or 18 seconds (runners on) remaining on the timer. In these instances, the clock should be reset to 14 or 18 seconds when the pitcher is in possession of the ball and the catcher and the batter are in the dirt circle surrounding home plate.

(b) **Defensive Signals.** If the catcher leaves the catcher's box to give defensive signals after the final warm-up pitch, the timer shall stop (blank screen) and be reset to 14 seconds (bases empty) or 18 seconds (runners on) when the catcher starts to return to his position and the pitcher is in possession of the ball. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Field Timing Coordinator ("FTC") should not reset the timer if there is more than 14 seconds (bases empty) or 18 seconds (runners on) on the timer when the catcher starts to return to his position and the pitcher is in possession of the ball.

(c) **Other Special Circumstances.** If there is a delay in normal activities (e.g., injury or other medical emergency, equipment issues, playing field or grounds crew issues, pitcher or catcher finishes an inning on base or at bat and the umpire believes the player requires additional time, etc.), the umpire may waive off the timer. In these circumstances, the umpire should signal for the timer to be reset to 14 seconds (bases empty) or 18 seconds (runners on) when the umpire determines that play is ready to resume.

(d) **Operator Error.** If the operator does not start the timer at the appropriate time, the umpire shall signal to the operator to reset the timer and start again immediately.

B. Timer Between Pitches and Timer Between Batters

(1) **14- or 18-Second Timer Between Pitches.** Except for the first pitch of an at-bat, the Pitch Timer will count down from 14 seconds with no runners on base and 18 seconds with runners on base. The batter must be in the box and alert to the pitcher with at least 9 seconds remaining. The pitcher shall be permitted to begin his motion for the first pitch as soon as the batter steps into the box and is alert to the pitcher. After each pitch of an at-bat in which the ball remains alive and in play, the timer shall start when the pitcher has possession of the ball and the catcher is in the dirt circle surrounding home plate. The timer shall stop (blank screen) when the pitcher begins his windup motion or begins his motion to deliver the pitch from the set position.

(2) **30-Second Timer Between Batters.** The Pitch Timer will count down from 30 seconds for the first pitch of a plate appearance (except for the first batter after an inning break or pitching change, which will use the inning break timer described in Section A above). The batter must be in the box and alert to the pitcher with at least 9 seconds remaining. The pitcher shall be permitted to begin his motion for the first pitch as soon as the batter steps into the box and is alert to the pitcher. For the first pitch of a plate appearance, the timer shall start at the conclusion of the prior play, as indicated by the umpire's final signal of "safe" or "out", or other clear indication that the play has concluded. In the event that the batter-runner ends an at bat on second base and needs to hand his protective equipment to a base coach or bat boy/girl, the timer should start when the batter-runner hands his equipment to the coach or bat boy/girl. The timer shall stop (blank screen) when the pitcher begins his windup motion or begins his motion to deliver the pitch from the set position.

(3) **Batter Requesting "Time".** During each plate appearance, a batter shall be allowed to request "time" only once. If the umpire grants "time," the batter shall not be permitted further requests during that at-bat. When "time" is called the timer shall stop (blank screen) and restart at 14 seconds (bases empty) or 18 seconds (runners on) when the pitcher is in possession of the ball and the batter is in the batter's box.

(4) Pickoffs and Step Offs.

(a) **Runners On.** If the pitcher makes a pickoff attempt at any base, feints a pickoff, or otherwise steps off the rubber (collectively a "Disengagement") with at least one runner on base, the Pitch Timer shall stop (blank screen). Following a Disengagement in which the ball remains alive and the batter remains at bat, the Pitch Timer shall restart to 14 seconds (bases empty) or 18 seconds (runners on) when the pitcher has possession of the ball and the catcher is in the dirt circle surrounding home plate. Following a feint of a pickoff or a step off with no subsequent attempt on a runner, the 18-Second Pitch Timer shall restart immediately. The pitcher shall be limited to a total of two Disengagements per plate appearance while there is at least one runner on base. A pitcher may attempt additional Disengagements in the same plate appearance. However, if the defensive team does not record an out during the ensuing play and all runners safely return to the originally occupied bases, the result is a balk. The two-Disengagement limit shall not reset until the following plate appearance even if a stolen base, caught stealing, pickoff, or balk occurs.

If the defensive team (i.e., the pitcher, catcher or other defensive player) requests and is granted time by the umpire, a Disengagement shall be assessed to the pitcher. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a Disengagement shall not be assessed for a mound visit initiated by the coach or manager, if the request for time is prompted by an injury, because a foreign object has entered the playing field (e.g., errant throw from a bullpen, object from the stands, etc.), or if the pitcher steps off to appeal under Rule 5.09(c).

(b) **Bases Empty.** There shall be no limitation on the number of times a pitcher is permitted to step off the rubber while the bases are empty; but, unless the umpire grants "time," a step off without runners on base shall not restart the Pitch Timer.

(5) **Defensive Signals.** If the catcher leaves the catcher's box to give defensive signals during a 30-Second Timer Between Batters, the timer shall stop (blank screen) and be reset to 14 seconds (bases empty) or 18 seconds (runners on) when the catcher starts to return to his position and the pitcher is in possession of the ball. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the FTC should not reset the timer if there is more than 14 seconds (bases empty) or 18 seconds (runners on) on the timer when the catcher starts to return to his position and the pitcher is in possession of the ball. The catcher leaving the catcher's box to give defensive signals during a 30-Second Between Batters timer will not be counted as a Disengagement by the pitcher.



(6) **Dead Balls.** Following an umpire's call of "time" or if the ball becomes dead, the timer shall stop (blank screen) and be reset to 14 (bases empty) or 18 (runners on) seconds when the pitcher is in possession of the ball on the dirt of the pitcher's mound, the catcher and the batter are in the dirt circle surrounding home plate, and play is ready to resume. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if there are runners on base, the timer shall not restart until the runners have returned to their original bases.

(7) **Special Circumstances.**

(a) **Administrative Tasks.** If the pitcher requests a new baseball or the umpire requests additional baseballs from the dugout, or performs other administrative tasks, the clock should be reset if the umpire completes his tasks with less than 14 seconds (bases empty) or 18 seconds (runners on) remaining on the timer. In these instances, the clock should be reset to 14 seconds (bases empty) or 18 seconds (runners on) when the pitcher is in possession of the ball and the catcher and the batter are in the dirt circle surrounding home plate.

A pitcher's request for a new baseball must come with more than 9 seconds remaining on the Pitch Timer, and such a request will not be counted as a Disengagement.

(b) **Operator Error.** If the operator does not start the timer at the appropriate time, the umpire shall signal to the operator to reset the timer and start again immediately.

C. **Enforcement.** In order to enforce these Pace of Game Regulations, the following penalties shall apply.

(1) **Batters/Automatic Strike.** Batters should not delay entering the batter's box to gain an undue advantage. If the batter does not enter the box and become alert to the pitcher with 9 or more seconds remaining on the Pitch Timer, the ball is dead immediately. The batter will be adjudged to have violated the rule and the umpire shall award a strike without the pitcher having to deliver the pitch. No runners may advance.

(2) **Pitchers/Automatic Ball.** Pitchers are expected to begin the motion to deliver the pitch as soon as the batter enters the box and becomes alert to the pitcher. If the pitcher does not begin his motion to deliver the pitch or attempt a pickoff (or other permissible Disengagement under Regulation B(4)(a)) prior to the Pitch Timer reaching "0", the pitcher will be adjudged to have violated the rule and the umpire shall award a ball without the pitcher having to deliver the pitch. The ball is dead, and no runners may advance, unless the ball awarded by the umpire is the batter's fourth ball in which case the batter is entitled to advance to first base under Rule 5.05(b)(1).

D. **30-Second Mound Visit Timer**

(1) Mound visits (as defined in OBR 5.10(m)) without a pitching change shall be limited to five per team, per nine innings. For any extra-innings played, each team shall be entitled to one additional non-pitching change mound visit per inning. For the avoidance of doubt, a manager or coach trip to the mound to meet with the pitcher shall constitute a visit. A player leaving his position to confer with the pitcher, including a pitcher leaving the mound to confer with another player, shall also constitute a visit, regardless of where the visit occurs or the length of the visit.

(2) The timer shall operate during mound visits initiated by a manager or coach. The timer will be set at 30 seconds and will begin counting down when the manager or coach crosses the foul line.

(3) The home plate umpire will proceed to the mound when the timer reaches 10 seconds. Unless the manager or coach signals for a pitching change, he must leave the mound when (or before) the timer reaches 0 seconds.

(4) If the manager or coach has not left the mound or signaled for a pitching change by the time that the timer reaches 0 seconds, the home plate umpire shall break up the mound visit and direct the manager or coach to return to his dugout or signal for a pitching change.

(5) The home plate umpire shall have discretion to grant a brief window of additional time to a manager or coach whose trip to the mound was slowed by a bona fide physical ailment or other special circumstance (e.g., medical condition, player requiring a translator). In addition, the timer shall not operate when a doctor or trainer accompanies the manager to evaluate a bona fide medical issue.

(6) In the case where a manager or coach signals for a pitching change, the timer will stop, the procedures for measuring the pitching change break will begin, and the manager or coach may remain on the mound for the duration of the change.

(7) In the case where there is no pitching change, the timer shall stop (blank screen) when the manager or coach leaves the dirt circle surrounding the pitcher's rubber concluding his visit to the mound. (See OBR 5.10(l)). The 14 or 18 second timer shall commence when the pitcher is in possession of the ball on the pitcher's mound, the catcher and the batter are in the dirt circle surrounding home plate, and play is ready to resume.



PACE OF GAME REGULATIONS

E. Miscellaneous Pace of Game Procedures

(1) **Circumvention.** If an umpire judges that a player or coach of the defensive team is intentionally circumventing these Regulations, the umpire shall award a ball. If an umpire judges that a player or coach of the offensive team is intentionally circumventing these Regulations, the umpire shall award a strike. Following the award of such a ball or strike, the ball is dead, and no runners may advance, unless the ball awarded by the umpire is the batter's fourth ball in which case the batter is entitled to advance to first base under Rule 5.05(b)(1).

(2) **FTC Reporting.** After each game the FTC shall report any violations of these Regulations to Major League Baseball.

(3) **Mechanical Failure.** Should the outfield timer or both home plate timers fail, all timers should be turned off and the base umpire should keep time with a stopwatch without applying any of the penalties described herein. Provided that the outfield timer and one of the home plate timers are functional, time shall be kept for the game. Should the timers be repaired during the game, the use of the timer will continue at the beginning of the next full inning.

(4) **Protest.** Application of the timing rules contained herein may not be protested.

(5) **Pinch Hitters.** Public address announcers may not announce a pinch hitter until signaled, but umpires have been instructed to be alert for lead-off pinch hitters in the on-deck circle, in order to have such batters announced on time. Whenever possible, pinch hitters should warm up prior to going to the on-deck circle. If possible, the pinch hitter should be in the on-deck circle while the preceding hitter is at bat.

(6) **Pre-Game Meeting.** Umpires must arrive at home plate for the ground-rules discussion early enough to start the game at the appointed time. A member of the home Club must provide the umpire room attendant with a pre-game timing schedule that includes actual first pitch time for each game.

(7) **Warm-Up Catcher.** Each Club must have a backup catcher available between half-innings to warm up the pitcher if the game catcher has not finished putting on the protective equipment when the pitcher is ready to begin his warm-up.

(8) **Bat boys/girls.** Batboys/girls must have a second bat readily available in the event a hitter breaks a bat, or the bat goes into the stands during play. The bat must be dressed and ready for game use.

(9) **In-Game Entertainment.** Between-inning entertainment must conclude and participants must leave the field with no fewer than 20 seconds remaining in the inning break. Before the season begins, each Club should ensure that it has carefully timed all between-innings entertainment pieces, including any on-field races or contests, so that they end no later than 20 seconds remaining in the inning break. After an out is recorded with no one on base, the public address announcement introducing the next batter should be made not later than when the ball reaches an infielder as it is being thrown around to the pitcher. Any music clip used to introduce a batter should start immediately after the public address announcement and should stop when the batter reaches the dirt cut-out surrounding home plate. Music clips between pitches should be limited in order not to encourage the hitter to leave the batter's box.

(10) **Umpire Authority.** Except as explicitly modified herein, nothing contained in these Pace of Game Regulations is intended to modify or otherwise restrict the duties or authority of the umpires to manage the conduct of the game in accordance with the Official Baseball Rules.

F. **Batter's Box Rule.** Any Playing Rules which are otherwise inconsistent with these pitch timer regulations, including, e.g., OBR 5.04(b)(4), shall not apply.

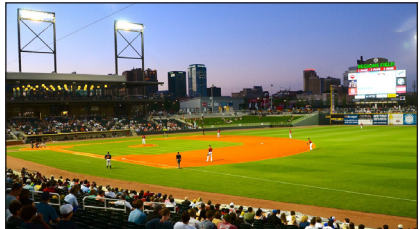

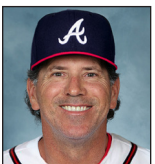

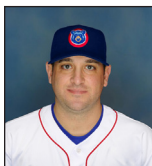

Orlando Arcia - Brewers Minor League Player of the Year

In the Shuckers inaugural season, Arcia finished in the Top 5 in the Brewers' organization in batting average (.307), RBI (69) and stolen bases (25). The shortstop was also named a Southern League Mid-Season All-Star, Postseason All-Star and the Southern League Player of the Week for the week of June 1. Additionally, Arcia collected the MiLB Rawlings Gold Glove for shortstop, was named a MiLB Brewers' Organizational All-Star and was named the MiLB.com Staff Choice for Breakout Prospect. Arcia also became the first Shuckers' player to participate in the MLB Future All-Stars Game at Great American Ballpark.



Jorge Lopez - Brewers Minor League Pitcher of the Year

Lopez dominated the Southern League in his first season at Double-A, going 12-5 with a 2.26 ERA in 24 starts for the Shuckers. The righty finished second in the league in ERA, WHIP (1.10) and batting average against (.205), tied for first in wins and third in strikeouts (137) en route to the Southern League Most Outstanding Pitcher Award. Similar to Arcia, Lopez was named a Southern League Mid-Season All-Star and a Postseason All-Star, while collecting honors as an MiLB Organizational All-Star, a Baseball America Double-A All-Star and a Baseball America Minor League All-Star. In the Brewers' organization, Lopez set the pace in wins and finished second in ERA and strikeouts.

Brandon Woodruff - Brewers Minor League Pitcher of the Year

Woodruff started his season with High-A Brevard County but made his impact with Biloxi in 2016, making 20 starts with the Shuckers. In the Brewers' organization, Woodruff led all pitchers in ERA (2.68), wins (14) and strikeouts (173). The Tupelo, MS native also led the Southern League in WHIP (1.04) and batting average against (.211) while finishing third in ERA and fourth in strikeouts. Along with being named the Brewers' Minor League Pitcher of the Year, Burnes was named a MiLB Organizational All-Star, a Baseball America Double-A All-Star and a Baseball America Minor League All-Star.

Corey Ray - Brewers Minor League Player of the Year

The Brewers' Minor League Player of the Year award was just one of the many accolades that Ray earned after his breakout season in 2018. During the year, Ray led the Southern League in home runs (27), stolen bases (37), doubles (32), extra-base hits (66) and total bases (254), while finishing second in slugging percentage (.477) and runs scored (86), third in hits (127) and fourth in RBI (74). Ray became the first player in Southern League history to lead the league in both home runs and stolen bases as part of his Southern League MVP season that also featured a Mid-Season All-Star nod, a Postseason All-Star honor and Southern League Player of the Month honors in July. The former fifth-overall pick also led the Brewers' organization in home runs and stolen bases while finishing second in RBI and was named an MiLB Organizational All-Star.



Zack Brown - Brewers Minor League Pitcher of the Year

Brown pitched his way to the top of the Southern League leaderboard and the Brewers' organization with a breakout season in 2018. The righty led the Brewers' organization in ERA (2.40) and finished third in strikeouts (119) despite missing almost a month with a high-ankle sprain. He took home the Southern League Most Outstanding Pitcher Award after leading the league in ERA and winning percentage (.900) while finishing second in WHIP (1.04) and batting average against (.207). He was named the Southern League Pitcher of the Week after throwing a complete game shutout on June 15, and also was named a Mid-Season All-Star, a Postseason All-Star, an MiLB Organizational All-Star and a Baseball America Double-A All-Star.

2019



Trent Grisham - Brewers Minor League Player of the Year

Trent Grisham's incredible 2019 started in Biloxi and ended in Milwaukee playing right field for the Brewers. The 2015 first-round pick found his swing in late May, starting with a 4-for-5 performance against the Mobile BayBears on May 26. Grisham set a franchise record with four walks in a game on June 1, and tied a Shuckers' franchise record by homering in four straight games from May 31 to June 3.

Over his final 20 games with the Shuckers, Grisham slashed .342/.479/.822 with seven doubles, two triples, eight home runs and 25 RBI, walking 20 times while striking out just eight. He reached base safely in 19 of those 20 games and hit safely in 15 of them. He was named a Southern League Midseason All-Star and started in centerfield at MGM Park in the All-Star Game on June 18 before a promotion to Triple-A San Antonio. Grisham continued his hot hitting at San Antonio, slashing .381/.471/.776 in 34 games with eight doubles, three triples, 13 home runs, 30 RBI and 37 runs scored. Grisham was named the Brewers' Minor League Player of the Month in May, June and July before earning a promotion to Milwaukee on August 1. Despite playing with the Big League club for the last month of the season, Grisham led the Brewers' Minor League system in home runs (26), finished second in extra-base hits (54) and total bases (223), third in walks (67), tied for fourth in RBI (71) and fifth in runs scored (71).

2021



Ethan Small - Brewers Minor League Pitcher of the Year

Ethan Small was assigned to the Shuckers to begin the 2021 season and in his first start at MGM Park he authored the first five innings of Biloxi's first nine-inning no-hitter. After finishing May with a 4.24 ERA, Small kicked it into another gear in the month of June, tossing 10.2 scoreless innings across two starts, allowing just three hits and striking out 19 batters. He then tied the Shuckers' franchise record with 12 strikeouts across 6.2 innings on June 12 against Mississippi. In his final start with the Shuckers, Small hurled seven scoreless innings and allowed just three hits and one walk while registering nine strikeouts. The lefty was promoted to Triple-A Nashville, and despite a finger injury, made nine appearances and pitched to a 2.06 ERA with the Sounds. All told, Small went 4-2 with a 1.98 ERA in 18 starts and was selected to the MLB All-Star Futures Game along with earning Brewers' Minor League Pitcher of the Month honors in June.

A pretty good omen for what was to come in the remaining 137 games. Catcher Adam Weisenburger collected the first hit in franchise history with a single in the top of the second inning. The Shuckers wrapped up the historic win and recorded their first of what would tie for a league-best 14 shutouts of the 2015 season.

APRIL 9TH - JUNE 5TH - A 54-GAME ROAD TRIP

The most iconic portion of the 2015 season was probably the historic road trip. The Inaugural Biloxi Shuckers endured a seemingly endless 58-day, 54-game, eight-city road trip that spanned 2,800 miles. The historic road trip was chronicled by numerous publications, which included ESPN. The Worldwide Leader in Sports dedicated time on Sports Center, Baseball Tonight and nine pages in an August edition of ESPN The Magazine to the Shuckers.



The Shuckers won over 60% of the games while on the road (33-21).



The team traveled from Pensacola to Mobile, back to Pensacola, to Huntsville, Jackson (TN), back to Huntsville, then Chattanooga, Birmingham and finally ending up in Biloxi on June 6. Over the 2,800-mile pilgrimage 32 players suited up for the Shuckers.

JUNE 6, 2015 - THE FIRST GAME AT MGM PARK

It was one of the most historic days for Biloxi, and for that matter, Minor League Baseball. The Shuckers came off the road on June 5th – winning an extra-inning game in Birmingham - loading the bus to Biloxi for the first time since the brief visit on April 14. The Shuckers arrived just before 4 am and would have a full day of ceremony, which served as an end to the 54-game road trip, but beginning of what no one could of ever expected.



The team began their day around 11 am and was part of the GameDay Experience with Biloxi Main Street, including a parade to their new home. The pregame festivities featured Southern League President Lori Webb, Brewers General Manager Doug Melvin, Minor League Baseball President Pat O’Conner, Mississippi Governor Phil Bryant and many more. ESPN concluded their features of the club on this date and the final piece could not have been scripted any better.



MGM Park opened its gates for the first time on June 6, 2015 as



Tyler Wagner threw the first pitch to Mobile’s Jack Reinheimer at 7:07 p.m. CT. The Shuckers fell behind by a run in the top of the 14th inning, but Nick Shaw followed a single by Parker Berberet with one of his own, scoring pinch runner and pitcher Brent Suter from second base. Suter took a detour around third base coach and skipper Carlos Subero, but the grinning southpaw eventually scored. Let the celebration begin!

After the season, MiLB.com writers and readers named the Shuckers’ homecoming its 2015 “Game of the Year”, earning the MiLB by award. Out of over 20,000 games played around Minor League Baseball in 2015 – that was the pinnacle.

SOUTHERN LEAGUE RECORD 10 SHUCKERS PLAY IN ALL-STAR GAME

The Shuckers made history with a league-record 10 participants in the Southern League All-Star Game on June 23 at Riverwalk Stadium in Montgomery, AL. Relievers Austin Ross (2/3 IP, 2SO), Damien Magnifico (1/3 IP, 3R, 4H, SO) and 80% of the starting rotation, Brooks Hall (2/3 IP, 2 SO), Hobbs Johnson (2/3 IP, BB), Jorge Lopez (IP, 2H, R, BB, 2SO) and Tyler Wagner (IP, 2H). Position players Orlando Arcia (0x3, BB), Michael Reed (0x2), Nick Ramirez, 0x3, BB), Adam Weisenburger (1x1) played.



Despite a 9-0 walloping that the North put on the South, the 10 Shuckers broke a Southern League record for participants from one club in an All-Star Game. Kyle Wren and Jaye Chapman were named All-Stars, but had been promoted. The 12 selections tied the 2011 Tennessee Smokies for most since Division vs. Division formatting began in 1999.

The Shuckers clinched the first half South Division title on June 14 at Trustmark Park in Pearl after a 9-0 rout of the Mississippi Braves. The Shuckers won three-straight games against the Braves to clinch what was the clubs sixth straight series. Biloxi outscored their inter-state rival 22-2 and pounded out 42 hits. The Shuckers clinched with six games remaining in the first half and joined only the Double-A Corpus Christi Hooks (HOU) of the Texas League as the first teams in Minor League Baseball to clinch a title in 2015.

The first half title earned MiLB.com’s midseason MiLB by Award for “Midseason Team of the Year”.

ARCIA BECOMES MINOR LEAGUE BASEBALL'S BREAKOUT PROSPECT

No player in baseball improved their stock more than Biloxi Shuckers shortstop Orlando Arcia. In December, Arcia was named "Breakout Prospect" of the Year by MiLB.com and is now rated as the 6th-best prospect in all of baseball according to MLB.com. Arcia was named the 2015 Brewers Minor League Player of the Year and was the recipient of the Rawlings Minor League Gold Glove Award® for excellence in defense at shortstop.



Arcia finished the 2015 season with the Shuckers batting .307/.347/.453 with 37 doubles, seven triples, 8 homers, 69 RBI and 25 stolen bases in 129 games. The 21-year-old finished his campaign leading the Southern league in doubles and ranked among the leaders in several categories including at-bats (2nd, 512), total bases (2nd, 232), extra-base hits (3rd, 52), RBI (4th), batting average (5th), slugging percentage (5th) and runs (5th, 74). He set new career-highs in almost every hitting category including runs, hits, doubles, triples and home runs.



He was named both a midseason and postseason Southern League All-Star in 2015. Arcia was honored with the League's Player of the Week award for May 25-June 1 when he batted .400 (10-25) with 6 runs, 5 doubles, a homer, 5 RBI and 2 walks in 6 games. In addition, he was selected to represent the World Team in the 2015 Futures Game at Great American Ball Park in Cincinnati. Arcia is also ranked as the top prospect in the Milwaukee Brewers organization according to MLB.com.

He was also named the Southern League Player of the Postseason by MiLB.com after going 12-for-30 with 7 extra-base hits and 10 RBI in eight games.

SUBERO, LOPEZ EARN YEAR-END AWARDS

2015 Shuckers manager Carlos Subero was named the 2015 Southern League manager of the year and guided the Shuckers to a league-best 78-59 record, South Division title and berth in the Southern League Championship series. In early December the Brewers announced that Subero would join Craig Counsell's staff in Milwaukee as first base and infield coach.



Right-handed pitcher Jorge Lopez went 12-5 with a 2.26 ERA in 24 starts for the Shuckers in 2015 and was named the Southern League's Most Outstanding Pitcher and Brewers Minor League Pitcher of the Year. His 2.26 ERA was only behind teammate Tyler Wagner for the league-lead. The Cayey, Puerto Rico native struck out 137 batters, while walking 52. After going 5-2 with a 3.02 in 12 starts in the first half, the 22-year-old went 7-3 with a 1.59 ERA in his final 12 starts of the year. He finished his campaign tied for the league-lead in wins, placed third in strikeouts and led the league in WHIP (1.10), batting average against (.205) and fewest baserunners per nine innings ratio (10.05).



Lopez was named Brewers Minor League Pitcher of the Month for each of the final three months of the season.

SIX SHUCKERS PROMOTED TO MILWAUKEE AFTER CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES

Biloxi pitchers Yonathan Barrios, Adrian Houser, Jorge Lopez and Tyler Wagner joined infielder Yadiel Rivera and outfielder Michael Reed etched their names in Shuckers' lore as the first six to be promoted to the majors. Wagner became the first and the answer to the trivia question: Who was the first Biloxi Shucker to debut in the majors? His MLB debut was somewhat forgettable, giving up a first inning long ball to Paul Goldschmidt and suffering through a 3.2 inning performance, yielding five runs. But, the Brewers won a 17-inning marathon over Arizona, 7-6 and Wagner was immediately optioned back to the minors. Not 12 hours removed from the final game on September 21, the bus swung by Chattanooga's airport, dropping off players who were headed abroad and the six headed for the bigs. The "Biloxi 6" joined the Brewers on the road in Chicago.



Less than 24 hours removed from losing in the Southern League Championship, the "Biloxi 6" were at Wrigley Field, full fledged major league baseball players.

The first of the debuts would come two days later, and from Yadiel Rivera. He started as short and in the top of the second inning against All-Star Michael Wacha, he worked an 11-pitch at-bat and eventually singled through the left side of the infield.

The next debut and third for the Shuckers was reliever Yhonathan Barrios in the eighth inning of the same game. The right-hander acquired by Milwaukee on July 23 struck out Matt Carpenter with an 87 mph changeup.

In two games against the Cardinals, Barrios struck out five over 2.2 shutout innings, 3 hits and no walks.

On September 26th, five Biloxi Shuckers appeared in Milwaukee's 5-1 loss to the Cardinals at Busch Stadium. Wagner started the game and struggled through 4.0 innings, giving up 5 earned runs on 6 hits, 4 walks and no strikeouts, suffering the



loss. Wagner, Barrios, Reed, Rivera and Houser would make an appearance.

In three MLB starts, Wagner, who was the Southern League ERA Champ at 2.25, is 0-2 with an 7.24 ERA, 7 walks and 5 strikeouts in 13.2 IP.

The fourth Shucker to debut and second position player was Reed. The 22-year-old from Cedar Park, TX made the of his pinch-hit opportunity with nobody out in the sixth, doubling off of lefty Jaime Garcia.

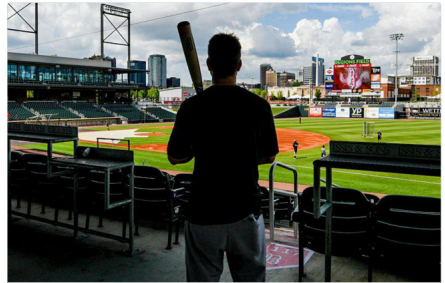

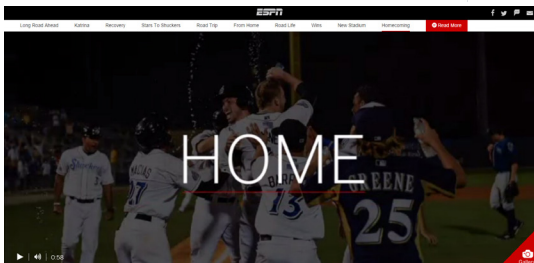

BILOXI PRO BASEBALL HISTORY



Front Office

The 2015 relocation of the Huntsville Stars to Biloxi marked the arrival of the first professional team in the area in almost 90 years. While minor league records were not as exhaustive then as they are today (and many physical documents were lost during Hurricane Katrina in 2005), local historians have been able to piece together the story of Biloxi baseball through newspaper archives and eyewitness accounts.

The Shuckers

The history of baseball in the Biloxi area dates back to at least 1892, when amateur teams were first recorded to have played the sport. The first professional baseball team arrived in 1906 as the **Gulfport Crabs**, an entrant in the Class D Cotton States League. As the lowest level in the minor league system, Class D teams were limited to 14 players, including a player-manager, and required their pitchers to play other positions. The Crabs likely played on a large plot of land bound by 12th Street, 38th Avenue, 15th Street and 42nd Avenue in Gulfport, just south of the present-day Milner football stadium.

Media Information

After two years of low attendance in Gulfport, half of the team's stake was sold to a group from Biloxi. As a consequence, the team spent the 1908 season split between Gulfport and Biloxi as the **Gulfport-Biloxi Sand Crabs**. When in Biloxi, the team played at Point Comfort Park (bound by Oak and Maple Streets on the east and west, and 8th and 9th Streets on the south and north). Though the move helped increase attendance, the Cotton States League folded before the 1909 season and Biloxi was once again left without a team.

Milwaukee Brewers

While there was no permanent baseball in Biloxi for many years, several teams visited the area for Spring Training. The **Detroit Tigers** prepared for the season in Gulfport from 1913 to 1915, and the **Atlanta Crackers** of the Southern Association trained in nearby Bay St. Louis.

2021 in Review

By 1922, the Cotton States League had been revived and in 1926 the Brookhaven (MS) Truckers moved to the Coast area to become the **Gulfport Tarpons**. The new franchise played on the same grounds in Gulfport, which had by then been built up to a fairground that seated 2,500 spectators. Despite the improved accommodations, Gulfport's population was simply too small to support a team. Ownership once again proposed an agreement with Biloxi to split the team, but Biloxi instead devoted their baseball funds toward the creation of a new facility in the hopes of attracting Spring Training teams. The Tarpons moved to El Dorado, Arkansas to become the Lions before the 1929 season. Economic stress brought about by the Great Depression caused the Cotton States League to fold once again in 1932.

Opponents

After its final brush with full-time professional baseball, the coast area became a frequent Spring Training site for several Major and Minor league teams in the days before the Cactus and Grapefruit Leagues. The **Baltimore Orioles** and **Albany Senators** of the International League called Gulfport their southern home, as did the aforementioned Atlanta Crackers. The new stadium in Biloxi, built on Naval Reserve land populated with oak trees for ship construction, hosted the Casey Stengel-managed **Toledo Mud Hens** (American Association) for its first two springs. Joe Cronin and the major league **Washington Senators** (American League) occupied Biloxi Stadium for the next six springs, including their pennant-winning 1933 season (The last pennant for any D.C. baseball team until the 2019 Washington Nationals World Series Title). The **Milwaukee Brewers** of the American Association, market predecessors of the current Shuckers parent club, trained in Biloxi in 1937 before the **Philadelphia Phillies** (National League) closed out the Spring Training era in 1938. In 1941, the land surrounding Biloxi Stadium was claimed by the Department of War for the construction of Keesler Air Force Base.

Shuckers History

Several semi-pro teams kept baseball alive in Biloxi, Gulfport and D'Iberville in the years that followed, and Biloxi hosted the Southern Negro League's **Biloxi Dodgers** from the 1940s to the 1980s. After the turn of the 21st century, an effort spearheaded by Biloxi native and former MLB catcher Barry Lyons scheduled regular exhibition games between local teams in order to generate interest in a revival of professional baseball.

Biloxi Pro Baseball

Though preliminary efforts to move a Southern League franchise to Biloxi were put on hold after the devastation of Hurricane Katrina, allocation of funds from a BP response grant following an oil spill allowed for the construction of a state-of-the-art stadium in downtown Biloxi. With a home in place, the sale of the Huntsville Stars to food services executive Ken Young on December 18, 2014 brought a team to MGM Park and began a new era of Biloxi baseball. An exciting 2015 season saw the **Biloxi Shuckers** reach the Southern League championship and 2016 was highlighted by an exhibition game against the **Milwaukee Brewers**, the first visit by an MLB team since 1937. Moving forward, the Shuckers will honor their history while looking to make history of their own.

**ROBERT J. GILKS, 78,
OLD BASEBALL STAR**

BRUNSWICK, Ga., Aug. 21 (AP)—Robert J. (Bobby) Gilks, former scout for the New York Yankees and a Southern Association manager, died at his home near here last night at the age of 78.

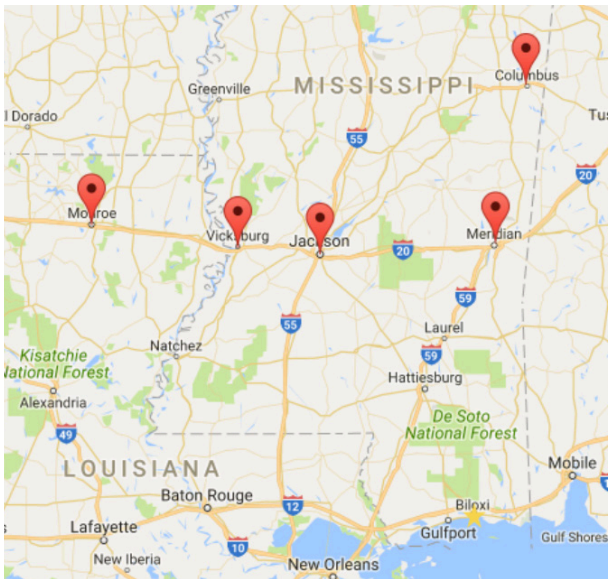
In 1903, 1904 and 1906 he piloted the Shreveport club of the Southern Association, and in 1914, the Montgomery team in the same league.

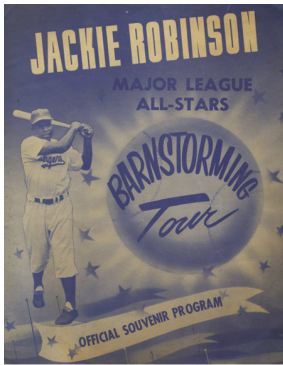
For many years Mr. Gilks was Southern section scout for the Yankees, being succeeded in 1923 by Johnny Nee, present scout. George Pipgras, noted Yankee pitcher and now an umpire in the American League, was one of the outstanding players signed by Mr. Gilks.

Mr. Gilks was one of the "Old Orioles," having played with Baltimore in the National League in 1892 and 1893 when John J. McGraw, Willie Keeler and Joe Kelley and Wilbert Robinson were breaking in as youngsters. One of his teammates was Bill Clarke, the veteran baseball coach at Princeton.

Before playing in Baltimore, however, Mr. Gilks had become famous as a pitcher and outfielder at Cleveland. He was the first outfielder to make the play—regarded then as most daring—of trapping a ball to gain a force play on the bases. He was so skillful at it that he figured in double plays on many occasions. He was also one of the first outfielders to make an unassisted double play.

Mr. Gilks was the first player to make two two-base hits with the bases full in one game, performing the feat on Aug. 5, 1890, at Cleveland. It has been equaled only three times in fifty-four years.





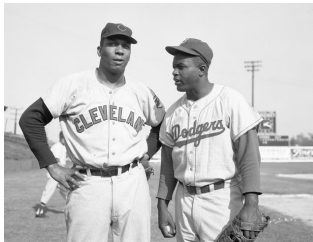
During the 1953 offseason, Jackie Robinson embarked on what would be his final barnstorming tour, and made a stop in Biloxi on November 2, 1953. The tour went through 32 cities across Virginia, North Carolina, Tennessee, Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana and Florida.

On the tour, Robinson played against a team of Negro League All-Stars. His team featured plenty of Major Leaguers, including 2022 Hall of Fame inductee Gil Hodges, Luke Easter and Al Rosen of the Cleveland Indians, Bobby Young of the Baltimore Orioles and Ralph Branca of the Detroit Tigers.

Robinson and his All-Stars got underway at 8 pm on November 2, 1953 at the Lee Street Diamond. It was estimated by the Sun Herald that over 9,000 fans turned out to see the contest. Luke Easter hit a two-run homer in the bottom of the first inning and Jackie Robinson drove in Gil Hodges in the bottom of the eighth inning to give his All-Stars a 6-5 victory.

Already a National League MVP and five-time All-Star by the time he passed through Biloxi, Robinson would help the Dodgers to their first World Series title two years later, defeating the New York Yankees in seven games in the 1955 World Series.

Along with being retired by every team in Major League Baseball, Robinson's number 42 is the only number retired for the Biloxi Shuckers.

Robinson Stars Edge Negro Nine 6 To 5 At Biloxi

Big Luke Easter of the Cleveland Indians blasted a home run, Gil Hodges of the Brooklyn Dodgers rapped a double off the boards, and Jackie Robinson drove in the winning run with a sharp single through the box Monday night as Jackie Robinson's All-Stars edged past the Negro League All-Stars 6-5, at Biloxi.

One of the largest crowds ever to witness any sport activity on the Biloxi High School athletic field turned out to the Lee Street diamond to see the Big Leaguers in action. An announcement informed the fans that over 9,000 were in attendance.

Playing without the services of Al Rosen of the Cleveland Indians who had been listed on the roster, but who had not joined the team because of a back ailment, the Robinson Stars exploded for four runs in the first frame and added single tallies in the sixth and eighth to eke out their 6-5 verdict.

The Negro stars opened the scoring in the top half of the hello frame when they pushed across two runs with the aid of only one hit. A hit batsman, a single, a fielders choice and two walks accounted for the runs.

But in the bottom half of the initial frame the crowd got its moneys worth when Luke Easter uncorked on a two-one pitch to send it sailing over the right field fence for a home run, the only four ply blast of the game.

Bobby Young, Baltimore Oriole (formerly St. Louis Browns) second baseman, had walked just prior to Easter's four master, so when Big Luke uncorked his powerful drive, the score was knotted at 2-2.

The Robinson squad went on to add two more runs in the first frame. Gil Hodges reached first on an error and scored on McNeil's double to right. McNeil later scored on Glenn's sharp single over second.

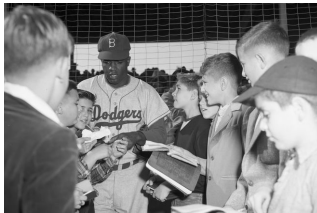
However, the Negro League stars caught up in the second frame when they pushed across two markers, and later took a brief lead in the sixth inning when they scored one more run.

Robinson's stars knotted the count in their half of the sixth with a single tally and scored the winning run in the eighth.

A fitting climax to the game came in the eighth when Hodges walked to open the inning, stole second, and scored on Robinson's sharp single through the box.

Entertainment was provided fans by King Tut, the Clown Prince of Baseball, who works with the Indianapolis Clowns during the regular season, and his sidekick, BeBop, a pocket size dwarf. Their antics provided the crowd with laughs when the game was progressing slowly.

Sidney Wasserman, road manager for the troupe, said that the Stars would probably make Biloxi a regular stop on the winter circuit in the future. He said that he was well pleased with the turnout and that Biloxi's ball diamond was as good as he had seen in the south.

BILOXI DODGERS (SOUTHERN NEGRO LEAGUE)

The Negro Southern League, sometimes known as the Gulf Coast Negro League, operated as a semi-professional league from 1936 to 1986, with league entrants from Mobile, Alabama to Jackson, Mississippi. The Biloxi Dodgers, Pascagoula Merchants, Moss Point Monarchs and Gulfport Angels represented the Coast area in the league.

The Biloxi Dodgers played their home games at Lee Street Diamond on the land currently occupied by the southern end of the Ray and Joan Kroc Corps and Community Center, generally playing doubleheaders on Sunday's between 2 pm and 8 pm. The Dodgers were owned by Roselle Horne, who ran and owned the Streamline Barber Shop. According to Roselle's daughter, Kay, "My dad ate and slept baseball. The barbershop was a hub to come and talk baseball."

Roselle had a color TV in the barber shop partially to bring in business but also so people could watch baseball on TV. Horne was a massive Los Angeles Dodgers fan, hence the reason for choosing the name for the Biloxi franchise. More than owning the team, Horne loved mentoring young men in the community and used the Dodgers to help do that.

Many former Dodgers' players went on to professional success. Lionel Antoine played for the Dodgers before going on to play tight end at Southern Illinois. He was drafted third overall by the Chicago Bears in the 1972 Draft and was converted to offensive tackle. He played for the Bears from 1972 to 1978, appearing in 68 games, including 39 starts. Nathaniel Puryear, a right-handed pitcher, went to Stillman College after playing with the Dodgers and was selected in the second round of the 1976 draft by Cleveland. Puryear would pitch in the Southern League on two occasions, starting 20 games for the Chattanooga Lookouts in 1978 before returning to Chattanooga in 1982. The righty actually concluded his career in the Brewers' organization, pitching for Class-A Stockton in the California League in 1983.

The Dodgers also featured Johnny Thompson, Randolph 'Kitty Kat' Peyton, Shelby Barnes, Ephron Lee, Stanley Buckley, Gary Dronet and Kevin Burdine and were led for most of their time by manager William Windham.

The Negro Southern League holds the unique distinction of being integrated in reverse. Some white baseball players, like former Braves and Cardinals scout Lefty O'Neal, played on teams that were predominantly black in a transition period after Jackie Robinson broke the color barrier. O'Neal detailed his experience with the Biloxi Dodgers in his book "Dreaming of the Majors – Living in the Bush," in which he said "I will forever be grateful to Mr. Horne the barber, who was willing to break the color barrier and allow us to play for his team. He saw talent and didn't worry about color... A part of me will always be at Main Street and Lee Street, in Biloxi, Mississippi, and the players and fans will always have a special place in my heart."

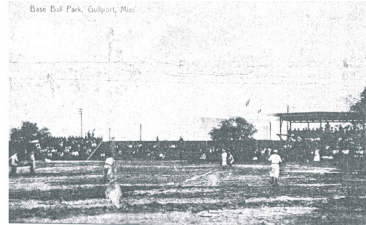

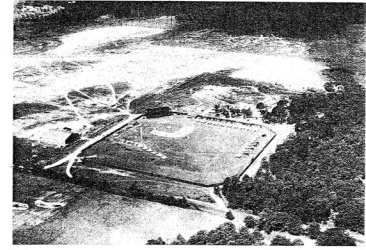
